

We know that 25 of the 26 fishfarms in the Broughton Archipelago are sited in sensitive areas using Salmon Aquaculture Review criteria.

We also know that the Honourable John Fraser's Pacific Fisheries Resource Conservation Council recommended in a March 2001 advisory "Salmon Conservation in the Central Coast" that "salmon farms should not be sited in known salmon migration routes and holding areas because of the possibility of disease transfer in both directions and predation by farmed salmon on wild juveniles." (p.31)

Which leads me to our most recent and urgent concern: the outbreak of sea lice in the Broughton Archipelago. You have no doubt heard about our press conference expressing our concern about the high concentrations of sea-lice. Mr. Minister, the testing that Alexandra Morton has carried out is thorough. Despite the claims of Mr. Noakes that the sampling is only taken from the surface, may we point out that pink fry migrate in the surface water only.

Alexandra Morton notes that the closer samples are taken to a fishfarm, the higher the concentrations of sea lice on the pinks.

It is imperative that at the very least the six farm sites (some inactive) Fife Sound through Tribune Channel be removed immediately as this is the area with the highest concentration of sea lice.

On June 26, 2001 the Musgamagw Tsawataineuk Tribal Council Chiefs along with the BC Aboriginal Fisheries Commission called read out the following requirements:

In the Broughton Archipelago over 400 million young salmon will probably die as a result of an outbreak of sea lice. All evidence indicates that fish farms are the cause of this unprecedented outbreak.

To prevent this problem from getting worse and from happening again we request that:

1. All farmed fish be removed from the Broughton Archipelago immediately to prevent the worsening of the situation.

2. The Department of Fisheries and Oceans and the Provincial government send research scientist to the Broughton Archipelago immediately to conduct a comprehensive study before the salmon migrate to sea.

3. Research scientists from Norway, Scotland, and Ireland, where similar outbreaks have occurred, be brought in as advisors help governments address this problem.

4. The Auditor General review the circumstance surrounding this outbreak and determine if the Department of Fisheries and Oceans has failed to enforce the Fisheries Act by allowing salmon farming to infect wild salmon stocks.

5. The Provincial government stop any plans for allowing this industry to expand until science has proven that there is no risk of parasite and/or disease transfer from farmed salmon.

We look forward to working with you and hope to meet with you in the immediate future to discuss the best actions to take in protecting the wild stocks and the environment within our territories. I have also spoken informally with the Honourable Stan Hagan, Minister for Sustainable Resources about these matters. 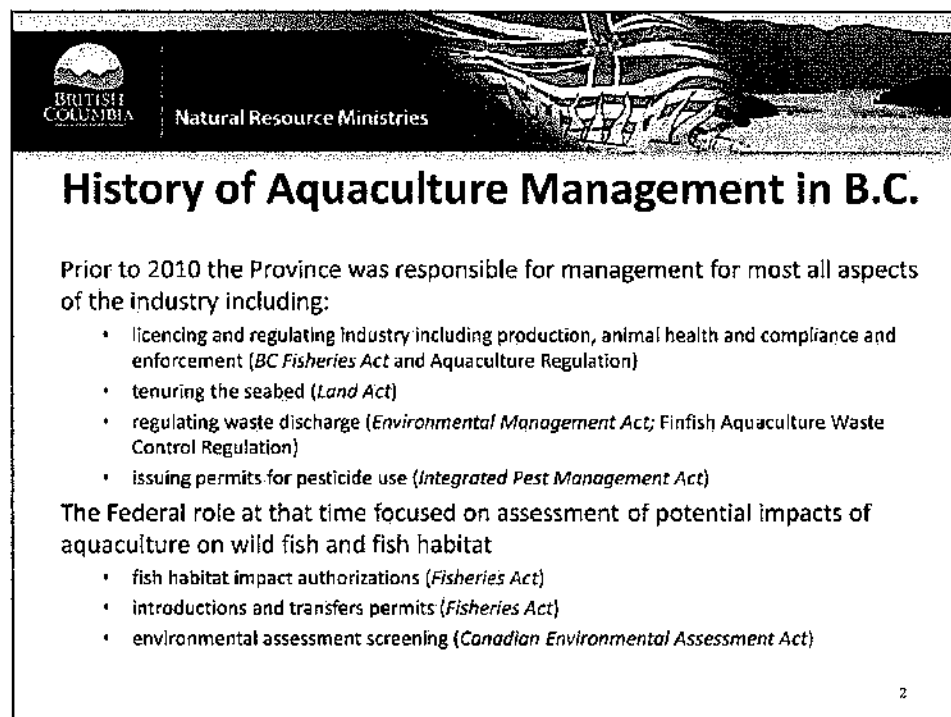
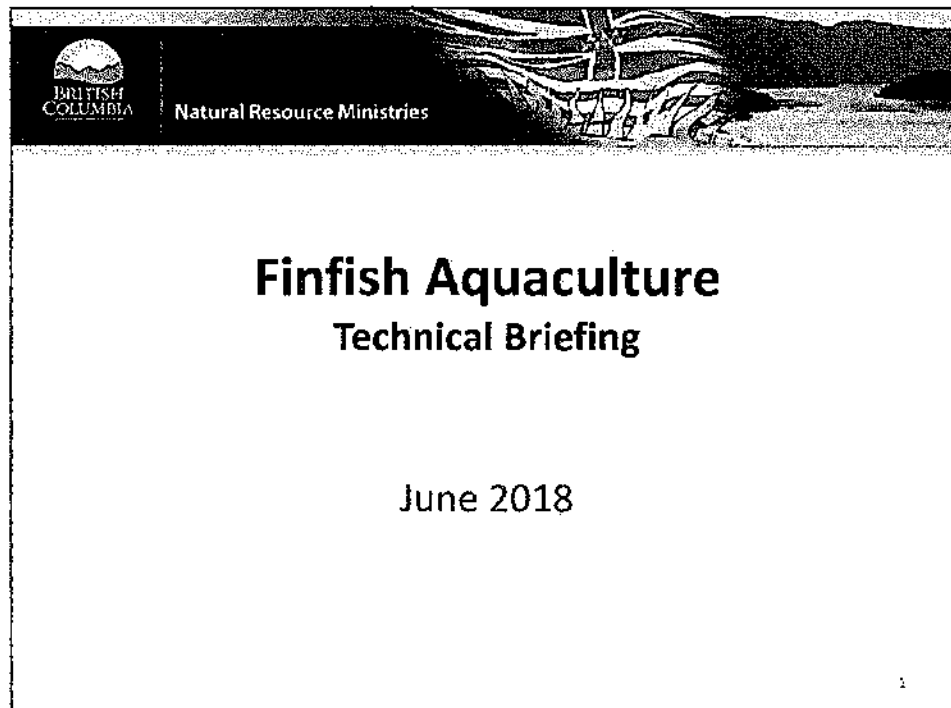

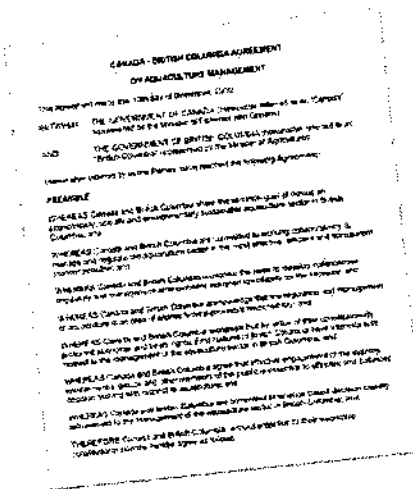
Hinkson Decision



British Columbia (Agriculture and Lands)* determined a fish farming operation was a “fishery” within the meaning of the s. 91 of The Constitution Act, 1867 which gives the Parliament of Canada exclusive legislative authority in relation to “seacoast and inland fisheries”.
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- Provincial government continues to dispose use of crown land (FLNRORD), develop strategic policy (AGRI) and regulate waste discharge and pesticide use (ECC).



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- Sets out the responsibilities of both governments with respect to the management and regulation of the aquaculture sector in B.C.;
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What do you need to operate in B.C.?

Provincial aquaculture policy announcement

2. demonstrate they have consent from relevant First Nations in the territories where they operate via industry / First Nations agreements; and,

Title: Meeting with Aquaculture Industry

Issue: BC intends to provide industry with advance notice of BC's upcoming announcement on changes to aquaculture policy.

Background: The B.C. salmon farming industry has been operating for more than three decades. In 2016, farm-raised salmon is B.C.'s highest valued seafood product (93,000 metric tonnes worth \$748M), contributes \$289M to provincial GDP and is the number one agricultural export (\$545M). About 70 per cent of the harvest is exported, primarily to the United States, followed by Japan, China and Hong Kong. Canada is the fourth-largest producer of farm-raised salmon in the world; the largest is Norway, followed by Chile and the UK. B.C. accounts for roughly half of all aquaculture production in Canada and approximately 60 per cent of farm-raised salmon production, representing between three and four per cent of the global supply.

There are currently 120 marine finfish aquaculture tenures across British Columbia. Their expiry dates are as follows:

- 20 expire in 2018 (17%)
- 5 expire 2019-2022 (4%)
- 26 expire 2023-2030 (26%)
- 38 expire 2031-2035 (32%)
- 5 expire 2035-2046 (4%)
- 26 are currently on month to month (22%)

In total, 51 tenures will be affected by upcoming policy changes (43% of the current total).

First Nations Considerations: Salmon farms are currently located in the traditional territories of at least 28 B.C. First Nations (taking into account overlap of territories). Twenty First Nations have economic and social partnerships in place with B.C. salmon farmers, accounting for approximately 78% of B.C. farmed salmon production. First Nations communities provide approximately 30% of the workforce on the farms of B.C.'s four largest salmon farming companies. There are several farms operating without agreements or consent from adjacent First Nations.

On January 30th, 2018 the Province invited five bands representing six First Nations (Dzawada'eunuw, Kwikwasut'inuxw-Haxwa'mis, Gwawaenuk, 'Namgis, and Mamalilikulla) from the Broughton area to a Ministers' meeting to discuss next steps relating to ongoing disputes with fish farms in the Broughton Archipelago. The Nations and Province agreed to move forward on a consent-based, government-to-government (G2G) process that identifies important issues and charts a path forward to reconciliation rooted in the implementation of the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP).

Gwawenuk First Nation has not participated since January 30. On May 28th 2018, the Dzawada'eunuw First Nation (DFN) filed a title claim with the Supreme Court of British Columbia over their territory and over shared territories in the Broughton area^{s.13;s.16}

The Province met with First Nations regularly since February 2018 and is close to finalizing the government-to-government consent based process along with recommendations on tenure replacements. First Nations viewed BC's overall proposal favourably^{s.13;s.16}, but sought accelerated removal of what they considered to be priority tenures as well as a requirement for no restocking

of sites. In total, 17 sites were identified, with four acknowledged for immediate action and the parties agreeing to working with Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO) and industry over a 90 day period on the remaining tenures, which would continue on a month to month basis (Appendix 1).

Discussion:

The BC salmon farming industry (Marine Harvest, Cermaq, and Grieg as well as the BC Salmon Farmers' Association) has been proactively seeking to engage with the province on the future of salmon farming in BC.

While the BC Salmon Farmers' Association participated in the Minister of Agriculture's Advisory Council on Finfish Aquaculture (MAACFA) and overall supported the report, the industry has expressed strong concern with recommendation 2.1 to "establish policy requiring industry to have agreements with a First Nation(s) affected by a net-pen aquaculture site as a condition of any new or replacement site tenure, and provide guidelines to industry for developing these agreements." The industry acknowledges that this is effectively in practice now for new sites, but has the opinion that applying it to tenure renewals would make it effectively impossible to negotiate agreements and would put significant investments at risk.

The industry has also indicated an interest in becoming involved in discussions with Broughton First Nations. The position of industry has been that if they can maintain some production in the Broughton they would be willing to entertain measures including: early exits from some sites, financial compensation to First Nations, funding for wild salmon projects, research and monitoring. Industry is also interested in shifting production from the Broughton to other areas of BC.

It is important to note that this meeting will include the three BC companies engaged in open-net pen farming of Atlantic salmon as well as the broader industry association. This announcement will also have implications for smaller companies engaged in open-net pen farming of pacific salmon. BC Salmon Farmers' Association can help with communications to their broader membership.

Suggested Response:

- I want to thank you for coming on short notice to meet with us.
- As you know, the province has been in discussions with Broughton First Nations about their long standing desire to remove salmon farms from their traditional territories.
- We have also been considering how to respond to the recommendations of the Minister of Agriculture's Advisory Committee on Finfish Aquaculture, in particular as they relate to salmon farms having agreements with First Nations.
- These discussions are happening within the context of government commitments both in terms of salmon farming as well as reconciliation with First Nations.
- We are balancing these issues with our knowledge of the employment created by your industry, not only in terms of your salmon farms but also the associated hatcheries, processing facilities and many ancillary businesses that support your sector.
- We are also recognizing that regulation of your industry and responsibility for fish health rests with Fisheries and Oceans Canada.
- Considering all of this, the province will be announcing on June 20th new policy requirements for salmon farming in BC:
- Effective in 2022, all new or renewed open-net pen salmon farms will need to:
 - 1. Have a federal license that assures protection of the health of wild salmon
 - 2. Meet provincial tenuring requirements; and,
 - 3. Have the consent of the First Nation whose territory they are operating in.
- Until that time, we will be directing our Statutory Decision Makers to allow tenures to roll-over on a month-to-month basis.
- We are also working with three Broughton First Nations on a government-to-government process to consider further early actions in the Broughton Archipelago. As part of that process, we will be engaging with industry as well as DFO.
- We recognize that in areas such as the Broughton Archipelago this will mean the eventual end of several of your tenures. We believe that the four years until 2022 is a reasonable time for this transition.
- I recognize that this is a difficult message for your industry. I do think that there are some areas that we should work together on going forward.

 - We are willing to consider opportunities for your businesses to increase production elsewhere either at existing sites or with new sites, providing they meet these new expectations.
 - We do still intend to keep in place the northern moratorium as well as restrictions on new sites in Discovery Islands, however if you have specific proposals in those areas we are willing to discuss them.
 - BC is interested in advancing closed containment technologies that could further reduce risks to wild salmon and build public credibility. I recognize your previous views on this, but would appreciate working with you on how we might be able to advance these new approaches in BC.

Appendix 2: Industry Proposal

BC Sustainable Aquaculture Pathway

Canada has a world class aquaculture industry on both coasts. On the one hand, we have expert advice that recognizes Canada's great potential and that recommends that we should grow production. On the other hand, we hear ongoing concerns that the industry might be posing an unacceptable risk to wild salmon.

We have heard that some Canadians have a desire for a land-based salmon farming sector. While there are some small facilities with small production, some say there is great potential. Industry and financial experts argue that the technology is in its infancy and has a long way to go before we see significant production, and this may not be in B.C. or Canada because we are far away from major markets.

We are told that some Indigenous nations do not want farms in their territories. But there are also Indigenous nations that want these farms.

These are complex issues, and there are many thousands of good jobs hanging in the balance. There is also great concern over the future that lies ahead for our wild pacific salmon.

We propose a comprehensive plan to undertake considerable work over the next four years that will provide answers regarding a future pathway for sustainable aquaculture in B.C.

We will answer key questions about the risk net-pen farms may pose to wild salmon. We are making a considerable investment in scientific capacity and research. We have developed an investment incentive plan to accelerate research and development on next generation aquaculture technology, particularly closed-containment aquaculture. We're also partnering with all salmon producers and fishers to make investments to continue to better understand all pressures on wild salmon stocks and enhance the habitat of our wild salmon stocks through a levy assessed to every salmon fisher or farmer on the west coast.

Proposed Pathway Forward

A pathway forward that addresses concerns, develops a new framework for involvement of Indigenous peoples, and seeks to create business certainty to foster investment and innovation in British Columbia.

1. Move forward with established processes in reviewing tenure renewal applications in the Broughton Archipelago. Going forward Provincial tenures should be renewed for a term no less than the term of the federal aquaculture license, i.e. in case of the upcoming renewal, tenures should last until at least June 30, 2022. Many of the concerns raised by First Nations are being addressed by scientific processes DFO has underway, or are addressed through farming conditions of licenses, which will be reviewed leading up to 2022 and should be consulted on.
2. Establish a tenure review process that facilitates moving tenures to areas where First Nations – Industry agreements exist or can be established. This would necessitate lifting the North Coast moratorium of the previous B.C. government. As part of this review, also consider the potential for

site consolidation, where a smaller number of high performing sites (environmental and production) may maximize production.

3. Industry, DFO and First Nations work to expedite science to address concerns particular to the Broughton area – possibly through risk assessment, or other research.
4. Invest in scientific research capacity (i.e. Salmon Centre of Excellence) and expertise to expedite answers to key questions, e.g. PRV.
5. With B.C. and interested First Nations, develop an innovation tenure policy that creates marine tenures that can be utilized to trial new technologies.
6. Government and industry to build on existing research regarding closed containment technologies (land and water) to better understand the particular challenges to deployment in B.C.
7. Develop an investment incentive package that drives investment in next generation aquaculture technologies – both water and land based.
8. Develop and launch, well before 2022, a world-leading information sharing portal to provide Canadians with access to information about the operations of the sector.

- 5 expire b/w 2035-2046 (4%)
- 26 are currently on mth to mth (22%)
 - See PPT for rationale
- Most farm sites (95) have an expiry of 2022 with the exception of those in the Discovery area (see PPT for others)

So – add the 20 that expire in 2018, plus the 5 (2019-2022) and the current sites that are on mth to mth (26) = 51 (43%) of exiting tenures would be affected by 2022 target.

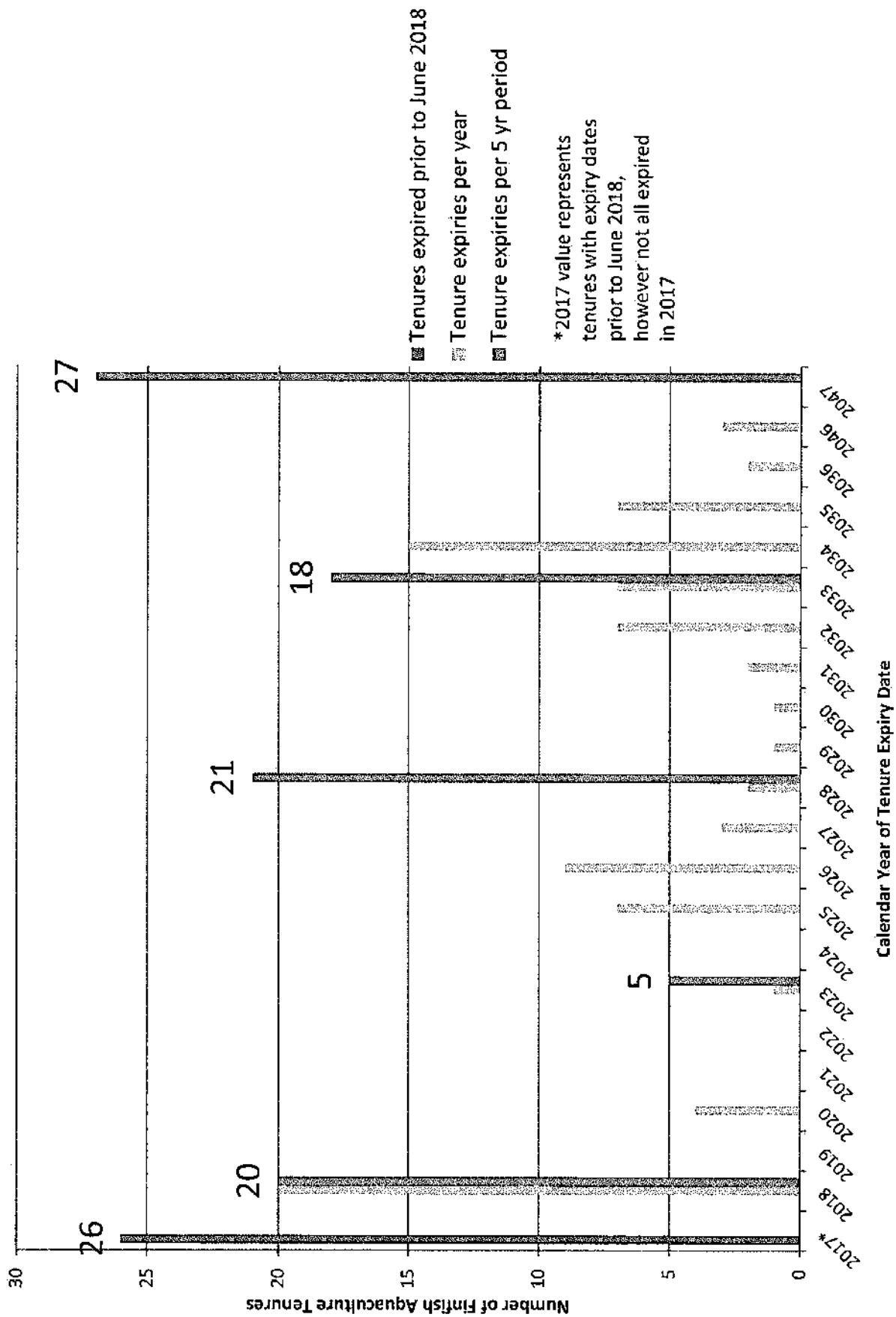

DFO licence expiry dates

Most farm sites (95) have an expiry of 2022 with the exception of those in the Discovery area

- Of those DFO licences expiring in 2022, all but three (3) expire on June 30, 2022:
 - 2 sites have DFO licences which expire on August 8, 2022 (central coast)
 - 1 site has a DFO licence which expires September 15, 2022 (North Vancouver Island)
- 21 farm sites in the Discovery area have annual DFO licences, which expire in December 2018
 - The expectation is that they will be replaced annually until 2020
 - The Cohen Commission recommended that licences were issued annually until 2020; therefore DFO did not implement multi-year licensing in this area.

Currently Expired Tenures

There are 26 tenures that are currently expired and on month-to-month tenancy:

- Five(5) of these expired sites are within the **Discovery Islands area**.
 - One additional site, which does not have a DFO licence, has an expiry date of May 2018 (known as Farside). Marine Harvest has plans to decommission this site to support an amendment to another farm site outside of this area (referred to as 'relocation' in the operational land use policy)
 - There are Four (4) expired tenures and two (2) amendment applications under active review. These applications have been held up in protracted consultation with K'ómoks Nation; however, staff are ready to make a decision imminently. Kwiakah First Nation strongly opposes fish farms in their territory; Kwiakah's territory overlaps two (2) of these decisions.
- Ten (10) farm sites are located on the **Sunshine Coast in shíshálh Nation territory**.
 - Grieg Seafood has submitted an application to increase tenure boundaries and production at two sites, and in return decommission two other tenures in this area (referred to as 'relocation' in the operational land use policy)
 - Most, if not all of the remaining sites have minimal if any production due to warm waters and problems with algal blooms.
 - shíshálh Nation and Grieg had discussions between 2014-2016, however, no agreement was come to. We expect shíshálh to oppose fish farming in their territory.
- One site is located in Quatsino Sound. There is currently an application for tenure replacement and a change to infrastructure being reviewed. Quatsino First Nation has provided a letter of support for the application.
- 3 additional expired tenures are under review by staff and have been held up in consultation with K'ómoks; however, staff are ready to make a decision imminently.
- The remainder of the expired tenures are not under active review by staff.

**British Columbia and First Nations agree on process to address finfish
aquaculture in the Broughton area**

The Kwikwasutinuxw Haxwa'mis, Namgis and Mamalilikulia First Nations and the Government of British Columbia have agreed on a consent based decision making approach to review and make recommendations on upcoming provincial tenure replacements for Atlantic salmon fish farms in the Broughton Archipelago.

This Agreement is consistent with the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples and reflects a shared concern to protect wild Pacific Salmon and the ecosystems upon which they rely. It also recognizes the key role of the Government of Canada in managing the aquaculture industry.

The Parties will now use the principles and structures set out in the Government-to-Government Agreement to review tenure decisions by considering the impact of fish farming in the Broughton on the environment and marine resources, Aboriginal rights and title, regional economic stability and industry operational requirements.
