Funding for BC's oyster farmers helping sector keep shucking

More than 100 oyster farmers from British Columbia's coastal communities replenished their stocks through the BC government and the BC Shellfish Growers Association's (BCSGA) efforts to help ensure BC oysters are available this summer and beyond.

"Living in B.C. means proximity to the ocean, delicious fresh shellfish, and a whole range of innovative and amazing chefs and recipes," said B.C. Agriculture Minister Lana Popham. "A visit to the BC Seafood Festival is a fun and tasty way to connect with the sustainably produced and harvested options from our waters, and offer more ideas and motivation to #BuyBC shellfish and seafood year round."

Farmers received up to \$10,000 each from the BC Oyster Recovery Fund to restock their beds with oyster seed. The restocking supported ongoing oyster production, as well as employment and economic activity in their communities. The Fund provided a total of \$860,000 in oyster seed support.

"There are endless ways to enjoy oysters grown by BC's farmers, whether served fresh or prepared by renowned chefs, BC oysters are sure to please. " said Darlene Winterburn, executive director of the BC Shellfish Growers Association. "Join us at the BC Seafood Festival and BCSGA gala dinner to eat, share and enjoy the best shellfish available anywhere."

About one third of the farms that received support through the Fund are in Baynes Sound, with others near Cortes Island, Okeover Inlet, Lemmens Inlet, Barkley Sound and Nanoose Bay.

"The Oyster Recovery Fund was seen as a positive step and concrete action towards recognizing the value of the shellfish industry by Minister Popham and the BC Government," said Erin Latham of K'awat'si Shellfish. "As a new shellfish farm and as a new business of the Gwa'sala-'Nakwaxda'xw First Nation, K'awat'si Shellfish is also developing a research program, as well as improving transportation to get our GwiGwi oysters to the local BC seafood market.

The B.C. Oyster Recovery Fund was announced in June 2018 to provides short-term relief funds to oyster growers to purchase oyster seed and support production continuity. The fund covered 75% of the cost of oyster seed purchased after January 1, 2018, to a maximum of \$10,000 per license holder.

Quick Facts:

- \cdot B.C.'s farmed shellfish harvest totalled 7,700 tonnes in 2017, and made more than 1/3 of the provincial shellfish harvest.
- · Oyster sales in B.C. represented about half of the shellfish aquaculture industry's value in 2017 and generated \$29 million in wholesale value.

You called yesterday asking about CFIA' s requirements on golden nematode. Here is our info:

- Two species of plant-parasitic nematodes, *Globodera rostochiensis* (golden nematode) and *Globodera pallida* (pale cyst nematode) are commonly referred to as "cyst nematodes". Both species feed on and produce cysts on potato roots, cause substantial damage to potato crops. They also feed on tomato, eggplant and other members of the Solanaceae plant family,
- In Canada, the golden nematode was first found in Newfoundland and Labrador and the central Saanich Peninsula (municipality of Saanich) on Vancouver Island in 1965. It was then detected in Quebec in 2006. The pale cyst nematode, was only found in Newfoundland.
- Both the golden nematode and pale cyst nematode are regulated federally. The golden nematode is regulated provincially under the BC Plant Protection Act.
- Golden Nematode Regulation (Reg. 253/79) prohibits the movement of soil and plants, or farm
 equipment with soil, either within the municipality of Saanich or from the municipality of Saanich to
 other parts of the province. The CFIA, under Directive 96-05, prohibits importation of all potatoes
 from infested areas of the United States.
- CFIA met with BC AGRI staff in November 2009/2010 to discuss both the impact of prolonged (over 40 years) PCN regulation on agri-businesses and the process involved in deregulating PCN-free geographical zones within PCN regulated areas.

The Partnership provides ongoing investments to support leading edge discovery and applied science, spur innovation, and promote international trade, while ensuring that producers continue to have access to Business Risk Management (BRM) programs.

The expert panel on BRM presented its recommendations and ministers agreed on a path forward that will ensure producers have access to risk management tools that meet their needs.

[Starting July 23rd, agriculture and industry groups can apply for funding under AgriRisk Initiatives for research and development projects. Funding will facilitate the development of private sector or industry management tools and encourage new and innovative risk management solutions.]

Topics at the meeting also included identifying areas for increased collaboration to streamline regulations, the recently approved cannabis legislation and what it means from an agriculture perspective, as well as the continued development of *A Food Policy for Canada*. In addition, ministers had the opportunity to hear about Indigenous agriculture activities currently underway in British Columbia.

A summary of discussion topics is available <u>online</u>. The next annual meeting of FPT Ministers will be held in Quebec City in July 2019.





Premier Horgan announced the report's publication while speaking at the North Pacific Anadromous Fish Commission (NPAFC)'s launch of the International Year of the Salmon.

"The report released today details the important role wild salmon play in B.C.'s eco-system and economy," said Lana Popham, Minister of Agriculture. "As we enter the International Year of the Salmon, we are committed to working in partnership with the federal government to help restore and sustain B.C.'s salmon population." NOT APPROVED

The report provides 14 recommendations that support the health, habitat and management of wild salmon as well as the sustainability of the wild salmon industry in British Columbia. It will be submitted to the legislative assembly's Select Standing Committee of Agriculture, Fish and Food in the coming weeks. The Select Standing Committee has been tasked with leading a public consultation process with British Columbians on the Advisory Council's report in the new year, which will inform the development of a renewed provincial approach to protecting wild salmon.

The Wild Salmon Advisory Council consists of 14 British Columbians who have a broad understanding of the role that salmon play within B.C.'s environment, for coastal and inland Indigenous communities, and local economies up and down the coast.

Feed BC is a strategic initiative led by the Ministry of Agriculture, in collaboration with the other government and industry partners, to increase the use of BC-produced and BC-processed foods in health care facilities, post-secondary institutions and other government-supported facilities.

Why is buying more BC food important?

Many British Columbians are asking for more local food to be used in publicly funded institutions, such as health care facilities, which procure large amount of foods for their patient foodservices.

A balanced diet supports patients' healthy recovery, and fresh and local foods are often looked at by patients as appetizing and healthy options for their meals and snacks.

Buying more BC food is good for the economy. Food production and processing in BC supports farming, preserves agricultural land and, employs more than 60,0000 British Columbians, which helps build and sustain healthy communities.

Reminder about apiary inspectors:

- Workshops/presentations and similar forms of engagement are only components of the overall delivery of support and services to the beekeeping community.
- Our inspection staff inspect close to 4,000 colonies each year at no cost to the beekeeper.
- Any suspect samples are submitted for laboratory diagnostics, even as far as DNA analysis <u>at no</u> cost to the beekeeper.
- Our comprehensive delivery of extension services is complemented with beekeeping courses of which one (the annual webinar course) is offered at no cost to the beekeeper.

B.C. Land Matching Program brings opportunities for young farmers

VICTORIA – New and young farmers throughout B.C. are seeing results and getting agricultural land into production, thanks to the support of regional Land Matchers and the B.C. Land Matching Program, delivered by Young Agrarians.

"The challenge for young and new farmers entering the agricultural industry is acquiring affordable farm land that they can farm," said Lana Popham, Minister of Agriculture. "Since

expanding the B.C. Land Matching Program last summer we've seen successful matches throughout the province, ensuring more B.C. farmland is in production and helping secure our farming industry and food security for future generations."

After launching as a pilot in Metro Vancouver in 2016, the program expanded across Southern B.C. in July 2018. Since 2018, the B.C. Land Matching Program has helped 19 new farmers and farming families connect with landowners in the province to sign farming agreements, with a total of 66 acres of B.C. land having been brought into or maintained in agricultural production. The Province has committed \$375,000 in funding to build on the success of the program for the 2019-20 fiscal year.

Land matchers assigned to Vancouver Island, Metro-Vancouver and the Fraser Valley, Okanagan and Columbia Basin have been working closely with farmers, landowners, local governments and agricultural organizations to help facilitate agreements between farmers and land owners.

Tucked away between orchards and wineries overlooking Powers Creek in West Kelowna, Popham visited Alpine Roots Farm to meet with farmer Eoin Carey and landowners John and Anne Whittall, as well as their land matcher Tessa Wetherill for a tour of their property, and to announce the results of the B.C. Land Matching Program, as well as additional funding for the program for 2019-2020.

The B.C. Land Matching Program is creating opportunities for young and new farmers by matching them to land owners looking to lease their land, and keep it, or get it into production. It is actively supporting access to farmland and encouraging farming production while increasing availability of locally grown foods for all British Columbians.

The land owners and the farmer signed their lease this past January, and farmer Eoin Carey and his family have already started to till the land for what will be a 2-acre market garden, selling to CSA members. They also plan to partner with local restaurants throughout Kelowna and the region and are excited to offer chefs the option of having them grow-to-order unique or hard to find varieties of produce.

For landowners John and Anne, both retired, this was an opportunity to see the agricultural land they own and steward in full production, while allowing them to keep the land's Farm Classification status, which will support them as they age in place on the land on a fixed income.

The B.C. Land Matching Program falls within Grow BC, a mandate commitment of the Ministry of Agriculture that supports young farmers and food producers who are looking for a career in B.C. agriculture and addresses major challenges for new farmers such as gaining access to land in regions around the province.

The B.C. Land Matching Program is part of the Province's larger New Entrant Strategy, a framework for increasing the number of new and young farmers working in B.C.'s agriculture sector.

BACKGROUNDER

The program is helping make connections for new and young farmers all over the province:

Okanagan:

- A three-year lease was completed for a 1.75-acre cherry orchard in the South Okanagan.
- A one-year lease agreement with three-year renewal option on 2.5 acres between landowners in West Kelowna and a new market gardener.
- A 20-year lease in Summerland for a new vineyard on 18 acres.
- A year to year lease agreement for a new flower farm on 0.6 acres in Central Kelowna, on ALR land.

Vancouver Island:

- A market garden was matched to 0.5 acres on a property outside Duncan on a rolling lease.
- An established 0.2-acre garden with housing in Saanich was matched to a farming couple with other sites already in production on the peninsula.
- 4-acres of a 7-acre property in Cobble Hill for a market garden was matched to a land seeking farmer with 8 years of experience at an incubator farm.
- A garlic farmer in start-up was matched to a 2-acre property in Saanich for a year-toyear rolling lease.
- An apiary was matched to an organic market garden farm in Metchosin for a year-toyear rolling lease.
- A cow, goat, sheep and chicken farmer was matched to 3 acres in Yellow Point.

Columbia Basin:

• A 10-year lease on 2.5 acres in Creston between a new farmer in start-up doing garlic production and a neighbouring landowner.

Metro Vancouver/Fraser Valley:

- A four-year lease agreement was completed for a farmer starting a 0.45-acre vegetable and apiary operation in Langley.
- An apiary in start-up was matched to a 20-acre property in Surrey with a temporary 6-month lease, and in negotiations for a 10-year leasing agreement.
- A farmer specializing in Japanese vegetables was matched and agreements completed for a total of 2 acres on two neighbouring properties in Surrey.
- ¾ of an acre on a 3-acre property in Burnaby was matched to a flower farmer.
- A land use agreement template was developed for a farmer with a 6-year lease on property in Burnaby to use with additional farmers on the land, a flower farmer and a mixed-vegetable farmer.
- A farmer with an apiary operation was matched to two properties in Abbotsford, approximately 0.25 acres of each property is allocated for bees.
- An existing flower farm business was matched, and an agreement completed for one acre in Richmond including the transfer of assets from the previous farmer.
- A five year lease agreement for a seed start-up and educational program was completed for 3 acres of a 20 acre property in Abbotsford.

More people to benefit from farmers' market program

VANCOUVER – The Province is further expanding the BC Farmers' Market Nutrition Coupon Program to help more lower income households in British Columbia access fresh, locally-grown, healthy food.

"Building up on last year's historic provincial expansion of the BC Farmers' Market Nutrition program, we are taking another step towards helping more families access nutritious, BC grown food. Over this year, another 700 individuals will receive the weekly coupon during the farmers market season," said Health Minister Adrian Dix.

"The BC Farmers' Market Nutrition Coupon program is widely supported across the province, given its positive impact on residents and growers alike. Increasing the number of participants in the program reflects its success in helping improving health outcomes and local economies," said Dix.

Expanding the program participants implements a proposal put forward by the BC Association of Farmers Market, who helps administer the coupon program across the province, to address program demand.

Quote from BC Association of Farmers' Markets

The coupon program budget increased by three quarters of a million dollars last year to raise the value of the coupon by nearly \$100, from \$240 per participant household to \$336 provided in weekly coupons for four months. 450 expectant mothers also joined the program. To add another 250 households this year, which will lead to approximately 700 individuals benefiting, the program is further receiving an additional \$212,000.

This year, the program will run from June 11, 2019 to November 3, 2019 at participating farmers' markets in 76 communities. It provides families, pregnant women and seniors who are already enrolled in nutrition and skills building programs, offered in selected communities, with coupons to help them purchase local food including vegetables, fruits, nuts, eggs, dairy, herbs, meat and fish.

The BC Association of Farmers' Markets is a provincially registered, non-profit association, which represents over 145 farmers' markets throughout the province. At member markets, the focus is on selling B.C. grown or processed farm-fresh foods and vendors must make, bake or grow the products they sell.
