I'm writing regarding the recent animal cruelty allegations against Cedar Valley Farms to see if criminal charges in alignment with either the BC PCA Act or the Federal Act 445.1 for the prevention of cruelty to animals will be filed against the farm owners and staff, who were seen abusing animals in the recently released videos.

The abuse seen in the videos is not in alignment with regular farm animal care and should not be protected by NFACC codes. WorkSafeBC should also be investigating these farms for unacceptable working conditions for staff witnessing the cruelty and abuse.

Unfortunately, this is not the first nor will it be the last case of farm animal abuse because there are limited consequences for abusers. None of these people should be allowed to ever work with farm animals since they have proven they don't take responsibility for the well-being of the animals in their care.

The majority of farm animals live in deplorable conditions, so to add physical abuse to their daily suffering is unconscionable. These animals are intelligent and feel pain and sadness as much as humans do.

I encourage you to take action in addition to removing their license, and to make examples of all those involved in order to deter future animal abuse. Also, the installation of surveillance cameras in all farm locations seems to be a reasonable request if no one has anything to hide.



Dear Minister Popham:

Re: Meeting Request to Discuss Oversight of Farmed Animal Welfare in British Columbia

I write to you on behalf of Animal Justice—Canada's leading national organization focused on improving legal protections for animals. We request the opportunity to meet with you to discuss your government's oversight of the welfare of animals on BC farms.

As you are aware, the BC SPCA has received lengthy video footage taken at Cedar Valley organic dairy farm in Abbotsford, British Columbia. Cedar Valley is owned by Cedarwal Farms. The BC SPCA is in the midst of investigating this matter and has characterized the footage as depicting "very serious instances of animal abuse." The BC Milk Marketing Board suspended the dairy license for Cedar Valley Farms, pending further investigation. Although the footage at issue has not yet been released publicly, this matter has already been the focus of national and local news coverage over the last week.

We appreciate the level of concern that you expressed in your public statement in response to the suspension of Cedar Valley's dairy license by the BC Milk Marketing Board. Unfortunately, this is not the first time that footage obtained from inside a BC farm has shown violent abuse and mistreatment of animals. In fact, footage from employee whistleblowers and others has repeatedly shown appalling conditions and abuse at farms.

For instance, in 2014, Mercy For Animals Canada ("MFAC") released shocking footage from Chilliwack Cattle Sales Ltd. – a dairy company in Chilliwack, British Columbia – showing employees kicking, punching, and beating cows on their faces and bodies with

canes, chains, metal pipes, and rakes, among other horrific acts. Following the release of this footage, the BC SPCA laid charges against the company and employees responsible for the abuse, several of whom pleaded guilty to animal abuse and faced fines and jail time. The veterinarian who was responsible for overseeing operations at Chilliwack Cattle Sales Ltd. when this exposé was released, 22 appears to be an owner of Cedarwal Farms.

In 2017, MFAC released footage obtained by an employee whistleblower showing horrific conditions at \$.3 Ltd. – a chicken catching company also located in Chilliwack, British Columbia. That footage showed, among other things, individuals kicking, beating, and throwing birds; chickens being smashed into walls and having their wings ripped off while still alive; and sexual abuse of birds. As a result of the exposé, several charges were filed against \$.3 Ltd., among others. In September, 2021, the company pleaded guilty to causing undue suffering to animals. 6

In 2019, PETA released eyewitness video from s.3 in Abbotsford, British Columbia which showed pigs in unsanitary conditions crammed inside tiny crates, pigs that were evidently injured, hobbled, or sick, and piglets suffering and dying beside their mothers. Because of the shocking nature of this footage, there was significant public outrage when authorities declined to lay charges against the facility, resulting in several protests. Those who entered the farm's premises as a part of the protests are now facing charges.

The Cedar Valley footage serves as one more example of the type of animal abuse that appears to be all too common in BC's animal agriculture industry. We urge you to improve government oversight of BC farms to protect the welfare of animals.

The BC SPCA — a donor-funded charitable organization — is responsible for enforcing the *Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act*, RSBC 1996 c. 372 (the "PCA Act"). It has operated under a complaint-based system, but because animals cannot report abuse themselves, in practice there are very few means by which abuse and mistreatment can be brought to the BC SPCA's attention when it takes place behind the closed doors of intensive livestock operations. Furthermore, the standards of care referenced in the PCA Act are themselves largely drafted by industry via the National Farm Animal Care Council ("NFACC") — a non-governmental organization largely made up of animal agriculture industry groups. Animal Justice was pleased to see the BC SPCA's

announcement that it would be conducting unannounced inspections of 12 farms and ranches this year, but with more than 6,000 farms across the province much more needs to be done to protect farmed animals.

As a result of public backlash following the \$.3 matter, the BC SPCA itself wrote to Deputy Agriculture Minister Tom Ethier expressing concern about the state of farmed animal welfare in the province. BC SPCA CEO Craig Daniell called for government mandated regulation and oversight to protect the welfare of farmed animals. He was clear that relying on the BC SPCA to regulate industry via its enforcement function is "a wholly unacceptable situation". In response to the recent Cedar Valley footage, Mr Daniell once again noted that "huge gaps in accountability...exist on commercial farms" that need to be addressed via significant government action. 11

Even unannounced, randomized inspections are unlikely to capture the full extent of abuse that occurs on farms when no one is watching. For instance, farm workers and operators that may beat or otherwise abuse animals are unlikely to do so in the presence of inspectors. Requiring constant video surveillance of farm operations would help ensure that this type of abuse is less of a regular occurrence.

Animal Justice is writing to request that the Ministry of Agriculture take action to implement proactive measures to prevent future abuse. In particular, we recommend the following:

- 1. Regular unannounced inspections of animal agriculture facilities;
- Requirements for large farms and slaughterhouses to install video surveillance systems to monitor conditions, with the surveillance feed accessible to the public;
- Legally binding standards of care to protect the welfare of farmed animals. These standards should be drafted based on the advice of independent experts rather than NFACC.

We would appreciate the opportunity to meet with you to provide further information on these measures and to discuss means of improving the oversight of farmed animal welfare in BC.

Dear Minister Popham,

I am outraged and sickened by video footage depicting horrific cruelty to dairy cows at Cedar Valley Farms in Abbotsford. Film was shot between June and October of this year. Cows were violently and repeatedly beaten with canes, wrenches, & pitchforks all over their bodies. They were dragged by heavy machinery. Newborn calves were ripped away from their mothers, while the mothers bellowed & chased after their babies. There was suffering due to botched euthanasia.

This cruelty is inconceivable. Without a doubt, farm employees were treating animals in contravention of the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act and "potentially" Canada's Criminal Code. The SPCA is preparing a case recommending charges to Crown counsel. If convicted, penalties must be severe.

Currently, there are no Canadian laws that govern commercial farm practices involving the welfare of animals although the National Farm Animal Care Council, a member-led organization of some industry officials, has voluntary codes pertaining to them.

However, there is no oversight, no transparency, and no surveillance cameras with a third-party auditing system on farms to ensure that proper animal welfare practices are being upheld. In fact, current "standard" practices are inhumane, and would not be tolerated if these same animals were categorized as "pets" or companion animals. Every time, secret video shows abuses to animals used for food. The public deserves to know what's going on. Why isn't there a proactive inspection and monitoring compliance system in place?

Furthermore, government must stop propping up the powerful and antiquated animal agriculture industry with funding such as subsidies or bailouts.

Leaving it to the industry to police itself is not an effective way to enforce animal welfare standards & prevent abuse. We have a broken system, with the fox guarding the henhouse.

I strongly urge government to pass new and updated animal welfare laws and practices. What happened to the **cows at the Vanderwal family's Cedar Valley Farms is unconscionable.**Sincerely,

The following news report comments that "BC Milk has confirmed there were multiple violations of the Code of Practice at this farm but there was no oversight, ... and that lack of oversight allowed a culture of abuse towards the farm's animals to develop."

In learning more about the mink fur industry, and animal farming in general, I have read through the NFACC codes of practice.

In describing these codes, you have publically stated:

"By accepting these codes of practice in their animal management practices, farmers and ranchers are making it clear that animals in their care are **being treated with the utmost care** and respect."

However, you know full well that these codes establish as standard practice the killing of foxes by anal electrocution using rectal probes and metal bite bars. And this despite their being multiple alternative forms of killing foxes that have been kept in a small cage their whole lives.

I'm writing regarding the recent animal cruelty allegations against Cedar Valley Farms to see if criminal charges in alignment with either the BC PCA Act or the Federal Act 445.1 for the prevention of cruelty to animals will be filed against the farm owners and staff, who were seen abusing animals in the recently released videos.

The abuse seen in the videos is not in alignment with regular farm animal care and should not be protected by NFACC codes. WorkSafeBC should also be investigating these farms for unacceptable working conditions for staff witnessing the cruelty and abuse.

Unfortunately, this is not the first nor will it be the last case of farm animal abuse because there are limited consequences for abusers. None of these people should be allowed to ever work with farm animals since they have proven they don't take responsibility for the well-being of the animals in their care.

The majority of farm animals live in deplorable conditions, so to add physical abuse to their daily suffering is unconscionable. These animals are intelligent and feel pain and sadness as much as humans do.

I encourage you to take action in addition to removing their license, and to make examples of all those involved in order to deter future animal abuse. Also, the installation of surveillance cameras in all farm locations seems to be a reasonable request if no one has anything to hide.




