

On July 11, 2014 Charlene Belleau sent an email to Chastity Davis, Co-Chair of the Minister's Advisory Council on Aboriginal Women (MACAW) resigning from the council. Ms. Belleau cited her responsibilities as recently elected Chief of Esk'etemc as preventing her from giving the council the attention it requires.

Ms. Belleau recommended that "MACAW look at young, energetic Indigenous women like Coola Louis, UBCIC representative of MMW (murdered and missing women) to replace me, she has a lot to contribute."

IV DISCUSSION:

Cross-reference Briefing Note 34789(Appendix 2) for history and recent decision on appointments.

Minister Rustad recently provided direction to appoint Chastity Davis as Chair and Barb Ward-Burkitt as new council member of MACAW using the original selection criteria and utilizing the Board Resourcing and Development Office to complete reference checks. The appointments will be made through a Ministerial Letter.

It is logical to proceed as above for the position available due to Charlene Belleau's resignation.

Selection of a candidate is required. Attached is a list of potential MACAW appointees.

Following the National Aboriginal Women's Forum in June 2011, the Minister of Aboriginal Relations and Reconciliation announced the creation of the Minister's Advisory Council on Aboriginal Women (MACAW).
 In November 2011, ten members were appointed to MACAW which is chaired by

 In November 2011, ten members were appointed to MACAW which is chaired by Wendy Grant-John. The Council is intended to provide advice to government on how to improve the quality of life for Aboriginal women across British Columbia (Appendix I: Terms of Reference and Appendix II: Membership).

In November 2013, all original members were reappointed for a second two-year term.
 Appointments were made through Ministerial Letters.

 Originally, Minister Polak engaged with Wendy Grant-John to select MACAW candidates based on the following criteria:

First Nation, Métis, urban and rural representation

Regional representation (based on the five Health Authorities)

Blder and Youlli representation

• Knowledge in the following areas: ending violence against Aboriginal women; children and families; education; health care; legal and justice system; mental health and addictions; homelessness and housing; Aboriginal language, culture, and arts; and, economic development

• Ms. Grant-John has indicated that she will be stepping down from her appointment before her second term concludes. Chastity Davis is the current co-chair.

IV DISCUSSION:

A new chair will need to be appointed by the Minister, preferably to coincide with Ms. Grant-John's resignation. Ms. Grant-John's intention has not yet been communicated to the Council.
