Hello.

On page six of the Child Care BC – Frequently Asked Questions document of February 20, 2018 the ministry states:

"Co-locating child care on school grounds is an option that many parents prefer. The Ministry of Children and Family Development will work with the Ministry of Education and school districts to explore new opportunities for co-location."

As I mention below the BC School Act already mandates school boards to make schools available to licensed child care providers. Co-location is written right into the Act under section 85.1.

Parents don't want a situation where their kids will sit in a class all day and then come 3pm they will sit in another class until their parents come to pick them up. At 3pm kids want to play. They should not be facing a situation where the ministry is planning on relegating them to a form of "detention" after each school day.

Section 85.1 is clear. Allow licensed child care providers access to schools so that they may provide the before/after school care that parents need.

The shortage of Before/After school care does not require any money to solve. The authors of the BC School Act had the solution and even included it in the ACT in section 85.1.

The ministry of education needs to address this urgent situation by instructing school boards to adhere to 85.1.

Thank you Lisa for your attention to this.

My fear is that the VSB is making this far more complicated than it needs to be and as a result the VSB is missing the intent of section 85.1.

Eighty-five point one <u>is not</u> instructing school boards to build new/additional accommodations. It is instructing school boards to make existing facilities available to licensed care providers. That's it.

The same facility that was accommodating the kids at 2:59pm is the same facility that is to be made available to those same kids at 3:01pm. That's it.

The way I envision 85.1 (and I sense the authors):

- Licensed care providers who have registered with the school will operate on school grounds

- Parents will decide which care provider they wish to place their child with. Parent will pay that provider directly.
- Each care professional will have up to six kids under their immediate care. That professional will decide where they will go and what they will do each day. I would assume most days will begin with them going outside (weather permitting). Before school, most kids want to run around. After school, most kids want to run around. Sometimes they may go to the gym, other times they may go to the library, other times they may work in a classroom. It would be up to the care professional.

Simple.

The VSB is just providing the facility. That's it. They are not creating more programs, they are not providing staff, they are not creating new designated child care facilities. Just the existing facility, as it is at 2:59pm.

There is no need for delay. There is no need to involve the provincial government. The school act is clear.

All the VSB has to do is make it known to licensed child care providers that school facilities are available to them. That is what 85.1 says and that is what parents need.

Thank you for your very sincere email regarding the challenges you have faced finding before/after school care for your \$.22 You are certainly not alone in this challenge and we are aware the current number of before/after school spaces do not meet the demand.

I'm in full agreement with you that schools are public assets and where we have space, we should try to accommodate before/after school care providers. Many of our elementary schools already offer before/after school care on site. As a board, we have identified childcare generally and before/after school care specifically as an issue we need to look at in the context of our facilities. We met recently with Minister Rob Fleming and engaged him discussion on how we can ensure our new and renovated schools incorporate space to accommodate before/after school care needs.

I know our Chair was following up with staff and committed to get back to you with more information. I will ensure that your concerns are shared with staff and trustees to inform our facilities discussions.

The current system is not working.

The solution is not more money. In fact the solution does not require any money at all. It only requires political will.

We need to open up all elementary schools to all before/after school providers and we need to do it now.

Right now only a select few providers are allowed to operate in the schools (I don't know who decides which providers are granted this preferred access and I don't really care). But these schools belong to the tax payers of the community and they need to serve the needs of the community. Right now this is not happening.

I certainly can't be the first person who has suggested this, so I will try to address what I can only imagine are some of the excuses for not moving ahead with this:

- 1. "Schools can't provide before/after school care for insurance reasons."

 That does not make any sense. Why it is these kids are perfectly safe and insured.
 - That does not make any sense. Why it is these kids are perfectly safe and insured from 9-3pm, but suddenly after 3pm it is far too dangerous to be on the premises. Every daycare provider has their own insurance and this would remain true if they were operating in school facilities.
- 2. "The municipality can't afford to provide before/after school daycare staff."
 - We're not talking about the municipality providing staff. Parents would be paying the care providers directly for their services. The municipality is only providing the school facility (for a small fee to the care provider). Remembering of course that these facilities belong to the tax payers and are intended to meet the needs of the taxpayers (in this case the parents). Parents would choose the type of provider they wish. Some providers my specialize in academics, others my focus on physical activities, some may have an emphasis on art and music. It doesn't matter, it is up to the parents to decide what type of before/after school care they want for their child. The municipality is simply providing the facility, that's it.
- 3. "This would result in undue wear and tear on the facilities."
 Nonsense. These facilities would be doing what they were designed to do, provide for kids! The fees charged to providers would help offset any "costs".
- 4. "The facilities are already contractually obligated to some other group at that time."

 Night classes don't start until the evening, boy and girl scouts can share the facility, etc.
- 5. "Teachers need the classrooms to prepare for the next day's lesson"
 - An English teacher does not need a classroom to prepare for a lesson. A math teacher does not need a classroom to prepare for a lesson. Before/After school care would only require a very few classrooms for the kids. Most kids are old enough to leave school on their own. It is only those kids needing before/after school care that would need a place to gather on those days when the weather does not permit them to go outside. Kids have been in class all day, they don't want to sit in a classroom anyways. They want to go outside and play with their friends.
- 6. "The schools have never been used for before/after school care before."

- 7. "The cleaning and maintenance staff have a contract to do their work starting at 3pm"

 That's just an excuse. There are groups using these facilities at the end of the school day now. How does that work for them?
- 8. "It is not my office's jurisdiction."

It doesn't matter if it is your jurisdiction or not, as far as the public is concerned you are seen to have a role in this. That is why you have received this email. Perception is reality.

Elementary schools need to be opened up now! There are thousands of parents stuck with no way forward.

The solution is simple. Please use your influence to make this happen.



In terms of clarification on what needs a consent form essentially it comes down to if it is an issue for a specific person and looking for assistance in getting information or fixing a problem then it needs a consent form. If it is just a general question with no specific people involved and it is understanding a general policy then it is not always necessary to have a consent form. It really does depend on each case and how in depth it is needed to go in getting information in order to assist the constituent. With this case the constituent had specific concerns regarding her childcare facility. 



Subject: Peace Valley: Need for Reconsideration and Reconciliation

Dear Premier Horgan and Cabinet,

As people who care about water, land and Indigenous law, we are deeply disappointed with the government's decision to proceed with Site C. While it is painful and difficult to speak out, it's in times like these when truthfulness and principled honesty are most needed. We will not be silent, and we hope our voices encourage more people to examine why this decision is a terrible mistake.

There are strong ethical, economic and environmental reasons to terminate the dam.

Upon careful analysis, the provincial government's arguments regarding Site C are not persuasive. This undermines public trust in our government's commitment to affordability, a robust climate change plan and meaningful reconciliation with Indigenous people.

Since the NDP was willing to cut 4.7 billion in revenue from bridge tolls from the province's coffers, without any word about accounting regulations or credit ratings, it should seriously examine why it is unwilling to absorb or restructure a smaller "debt" of 3 billion in order to show that it is serious about reconciliation, equity, affordability, and climate justice.

The assumption of endless growth based on mega dams to power fracking for LNG is the logic of a cancer. It is unsustainable and it will drive up our carbon emissions (including methane) at the very moment when we need to be reducing them. We need a plan for the future that builds locally resilient communities, strengthens food security and diversifies renewable energies across the entire province. The BC Utilities Commission (BCUC) Review confirmed that there is no current need for the electricity Site C would produce and that BC Hydro's forecasts have been consistently inflated for decades. Indeed, Independent Power Producers (IPPs) have been paid millions to **not** generate energy in BC. As we decarbonize our society, we can build out incrementally using distributed renewables, including geothermal. Public examination of the dam's cumulative environmental impacts and accountability processes is urgently needed.

As economist Marc Lee (and many others) pointed out to the BC Utilities Commission, "Completing Site C will lead to higher debt for BC Hydro and higher rates for all BC Hydro customers. This will increase energy poverty among BC's low-income households."

We agree with Seth Klein that "unconvincing economic justifications—and the fear-mongering of credit rating downgrades—[need to] be challenged, otherwise the precedent is set for more disheartening decisions down the road."

Moving forward, we call upon the government to:

- not engage in an expensive and morally questionable legal battle with the two First Nations whose territories are most directly impacted by the dam, and who are seeking an injunction. Not opposing their injunction would be a good first step to show that this government is serious about implementing the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous People.
- pause new contracts such as the billion-dollar contract going to companies including Aecon, which
 is being taken over by a Chinese-state-owned company, CCCC. In light of Aecon's takeover, we
 urge also this government to examine what the effects of investor rights and trade agreements are
 on the dam and on BC ratepayers.

- 3. consider recent developments in the price of alternative energy, which is decreasing substantially. At the rate that these trends are going, BC will spend billions more on Site C only to receive much less in return on investment. That investment could be more effectively directed in ways that generate more jobs and a more equitable social structure, as the NDP's PowerBC plan shows. PowerBC is a wiser way to move forward to cultivate energy democracy across the entire province. In contrast, Site C may prevent diverse, more nimble, less destructive community-based alternative energies from developing by flooding the market for such energy. First Nations who spoke at the BC Utilities Commission proposed alternatives to Site C that would produce comparable energy while having Indigenous consent. We need a better distributed, community-based economic plan in our journey toward a fossil-fuel free economy.
- 4. commit to a full-cost accounting analysis of Site C, in accordance with the NDP's Sustainable BC vision. Using full cost accounting, the high value of the Peace River Valley is recognized as much more than "zero," once you consider the worth of its carbon sinks (forests), fertile farmland, sacred Indigenous cultural sites, and multiple land uses. Even without predictably ballooning costs, the price of the dam is much higher than 11 billion, once we factor in the high reputational costs of not implementing UNDRIP, the loss of biodiversity and much more.
- 5. retain as much forest intact as possible, given we are in a time of impending climate destabilization and after a summer of terrible fires. They are a natural buffer, complex functional carbon sinks that we cannot afford to lose.
- declare the Peace River valley a strategic asset needed for provincial food security and use this
 asset's value to offset or restructure the debt arising from Liberal mismanagement, which can
 gradually be repaid back under the BCUC's schedule.
- 7. focus on remediation jobs to help us to transition to PowerBC. Better jobs are possible for our union brothers and sisters. As UBC's Program on Water Governance points out, there are more long term jobs generated by terminating Site C.

Environmental degradation poses a serious collective threat; it is not a luxury to consider this matter, but the necessary baseline if we are serious about addressing poverty in the long run. Clean water, clean air, reducing our carbon footprint: these are all simply required for our basic quality of life. We as a species need to respect the earth's natural laws and carrying capacity.

A future worth having is built upon meaningful reconciliation with Indigenous peoples, which leads to reconciliation with the land. In terms of climate action, everyone needs the forests and farmlands intact as much as possible **now**. Now is not the time to turn our remaining biodiversity into sacrifice zones. BC needs the Peace River valley for the greater good of the province.



Dear Minister:

We are writing to express the deep concern of Board Voice's member Boards with respect to the impact of the new Employer Health Tax on January 1, 2019.

While we understand that you have allowed for the next several months for consultation with the not-for-profit sector, the lack of clarity is an immediate planning and budgeting challenges. We urge you to provide such clarity in the very near term.

As you have heard from others in the not-for-profit sector the immediate and long-term impacts are of immense concern. Our sector receives, in very large part, its grant revenues from the Province. Not knowing if the Province will pay for this extra mandated cost, or provide an exemption is impeding the ability to enhance, the wellbeing of those we all serve. Board Voice is a network of volunteer board directors of community-based social benefit organizations from across the province. It was founded on the belief that board leadership is critical to supporting high-quality social services and to making our communities better places to live.

The not-for-profit community and community based social benefit organizations are vital partners to achieving the government's social priorities and along with volunteers, donors and grant providers make significant contributions toward enhancing the lives of BC's people. While the implementation date of January 2019 was intended to provide time to consult, the impact is now. Many member agencies are on the same fiscal year as the government. Currently, they are in the very final stages of finalizing their revenue and expenditure budgets for the 12 months ending March 31, 2019. The impact of the extra EHT cost, without knowing if the various provincial ministries will cover the EHT cost in the 4th quarter, is of critical importance right now. The governance fiduciary responsibility means social service agencies are facing serious risk today. Agencies with a fiscal year starting slightly later are also well into the planning phases for their next period.

We urge you to take action in the immediate term - to cover the financial revenue risk on mandated extra EHT compensation costs for the periods after January 1, 2019. Sincerely,

Dear Minister of State Chen, MLA Kang, MLA Chouhan, MLA Routledge and MLA Darcy,

My following comments are made with all due respect.

As a child care operator, I am experiencing a high level of frustration, and given the time that has passed since the Budget announcement, I need to share that frustration.

My frustration lies in the fact that, as a child care operator, we have been provided with no information regarding the initiatives announced in the Budget. Since the announcement, we have been inundated with emails from parents asking whether or not we are 'opting in' to the proposed programs. In one email, the parent provided a screen shot off the website, where it clearly directed parents to check with their child care provider as to whether or not they were 'opting in' to the program. My response to all of them has been, that as a child care operator, we have not been provided with any detailed information on the proposed initiatives and the logistics involved for operators to participate in the programs, and therefore, I cannot confirm our participation. This has been increasing frustrating for myself, and even more frustrating for the parents who are communicating with me.

I do not understand why a package for child care operators, detailing the proposed initiatives and the logistics involved in participating, was not distributed to child care operators as soon as the Budget was announced. This lack has put child care operators in a very difficult position, given that we are the front line connection to parents, and has increased the angst that parents are experiencing regarding the child care situation in this province. The longer our inability to provide information to parents goes on, the more stressful the situation becomes.

Will you please let me know when I can expect to be provided with detailed information on the new initiatives from the child care operator's perspective?

Subject: Free To Speak and Raise Our Children

Dear Policy Makers,

Today is International Women's Day, and a good time to reflect on "what women want":

A doctor in a walk-clinic I recently visited told me why people can no longer find a family physician to register with in BC. The reason, he said, is that most new medical school graduates are women, and women have changed the medical workplace. Many have children and family obligations and want to work part rather than full-time. They team up with other part-timers or work as locums in clinics, so that the walk-in clinic has replaced the family physician who keeps long office and hospital hours.

This evolution is due to the values women bring to the professional workplace, often considering "work-life balance" more important than income level. They have colonized medicine, law, academia and other professions and changed the culture within them, which seems more like the actions of a self-determining than an oppressed group. To say that "gender pay inequity" comes from female oppression is a distortion of people's actual life choices. It is also debatable that "getting more women into the workplace" is better for the economy. One could argue that the economy worked better when women stayed home to raise their own children: houses were affordable, food and gas cheaper, taxers lower, and a family could live well on one income plus Mom's top-ups. Raising your own kids wasn't considered anti-feminist. Why is child-raising a "job" when a daycare worker does it, but not when mothers do it at home?

Maybe the economy is better when people are happy. Some countries use a Happiness Index rather than a gross national product as the measure of success. The government mantra of "economic growth" ignores the fact that on a finite planet no economy can grow forever. Over-consumption and resource extraction eventually lead to depletion and scarcity -- and already have in many parts of the world. The mania for economic growth fundamentally threatens environmental preservation, and many women get more satisfaction from volunteering for ecological organizations than from their paid jobs. Other women and men value the opportunity to do creative work above the chance of higher salary.

S.22 . Not everyone monetizes feminism the way the Trudeau government does. Eco-feminism is feminism too, and full-time mothering of small children is not anti-feminist.

Some argue that, on the contrary, it's the devaluing of motherhood that's anti-feminist. We know that the best place for toddlers and pre-schoolers is their own home among their own possessions, and the best protection against life-long anxiety is sustained attention from thoughtful and imaginative parents, fathers and mothers both. Why are we surprised then that so many teens now end up on the streets, dropping out of school and leaving homes in which they never got to spend much time anyway? Where's home?

The Trudeau government seems to be saying that women's highest mission is "growing the economy", but what's the economic cost of high student drop-out levels, and of the mass homelessness we now see? This is not to say that women should be subjected to discrimination in the workplace, but that women and men both need to design their own life choices. When we 1950s baby-boomers were born, you'd never see a man pushing a baby buggy in the street, but now half those strollers are piloted by retired, elderly, grey-haired gentlemen -- grandpa liberty! Men as well as women have shifted their priorities. It's all about individual choice, and governments should promote that (as well as freedom of speech) instead of trying to socially engineer the public into one shared ideology.

The best thing we can wish for for women internationally, is access to higher education, which means getting a profession rather than becoming a life-long breeder from puberty on. All the world's ecological problems are insoluble as long as we fail to deal with human overpopulation. If only one child was born for every couple the overpopulation trend would reverse incrementally and exponentially. Better for women to have one or no children and bring them up at home, than many children who are juggled with careers meant to feed unsustainable economic growth and the tax coffers of governments.





With this in mind, we approached several facilities to inquire about wait lists and intake procedures. From what we found, wait lists were commonly over a year long. In some

cases, we found wait lists were almost at two years. Cost of daycare is always a concern; it is a major pressure on a families budget, but without doubt, the biggest concern right now amongst parents is availability. Daycare is expensive, because there are too few spots available for the demand.

It is with this in mind, that I am concerned over the recent announcements. The news media is suggesting that 86,000 families will get a child care benefit, 50,000 families will get reduced fees, and 27,000 families will have their fees virtually eliminated. However, the plans put in place by the government will create only 22,000 new spaces. From these numbers, it seems that there will be a greater pressure put on demand than supply, which will put an upwards pressure on fees and cause an even greater problem with availability. Anecdotally, I have spoken to daycare providers I know, and they have mentioned that they are going to take this opportunity to raise rates, especially in light of changes to minimum wage. For many families, this has the potential to wipe out any benefit they receive from the planned subsidies.

s.22 . In the ideal world, average wait time would be reasonable, even six months would be great. Solving for that first, before flooding the system with new demand, would have been a preferred approach. If solving for both was possible, than all the better, but availability really should be the priority. If indeed the government believes that more supply will be created than the anticipated extra demand, I would love to know what the plan will be and any information provided would be great,

We are writing to express the deep concern of Board Voice's member Boards with respect to the impact of the new Employer Health Tax on January 1, 2019.

While we understand that you have allowed for the next several months for consultation with the not-for-profit sector, the lack of clarity is an immediate planning and budgeting challenges. We urge you to provide such clarity in the very near term.

As you have heard from others in the not-for-profit sector the immediate and long-term impacts are of immense concern. Our sector receives, in very large part, its grant revenues from the Province. Not knowing if the Province will pay for this extra mandated cost, or provide an exemption is impeding the ability to enhance, the wellbeing of those we all serve. Board Voice is a network of volunteer board directors of community-based social benefit organizations from across the province. It was founded on the belief that board leadership is critical to supporting high-quality social services and to making our communities better places to live.

The not-for-profit community and community based social benefit organizations are vital

partners to achieving the government's social priorities and along with volunteers, donors and grant providers make significant contributions toward enhancing the lives of BC's people. While the implementation date of January 2019 was intended to provide time to consult, the impact is now. Many member agencies are on the same fiscal year as the government. Currently, they are in the very final stages of finalizing their revenue and expenditure budgets for the 12 months ending March 31, 2019. The impact of the extra EHT cost, without knowing if the various provincial ministries will cover the EHT cost in the 4th quarter, is of critical importance right now. The governance fiduciary responsibility means social service agencies are facing serious risk today. Agencies with a fiscal year starting slightly later are also well into the planning phases for their next period.

We urge you to take action in the immediate term - to cover the financial revenue risk on mandated extra EHT compensation costs for the periods after January 1, 2019. Sincerely,

On page six of the Child Care BC – Frequently Asked Questions document of February 20, 2018 the ministry states:

"Co-locating child care on school grounds is an option that many parents prefer. The Ministry of Children and Family Development will work with the Ministry of Education and school districts to explore new opportunities for co-location."

As I mention below the BC School Act already mandates school boards to make schools available to licensed child care providers. Co-location is written right into the Act under section 85.1.

Parents don't want a situation where their kids will sit in a class all day and then come 3pm they will sit in another class until their parents come to pick them up. At 3pm kids want to play. They should not be facing a situation where the ministry is planning on relegating them to a form of "detention" after each school day.

Section 85.1 is clear. Allow licensed child care providers access to schools so that they may provide the before/after school care

The shortage of Before/After school care does not require any money to solve. The authors of the BC School Act had the solution and even included it in the ACT in section 85.1.

The ministry of education needs to address this urgent situation by instructing school boards to adhere to 85.1.

My fear is that the VSB is making this far more complicated than it needs to be and as a result the VSB is missing the intent of section 85.1.

Eighty-five point one <u>is not</u> instructing school boards to build new/additional accommodations. It is instructing school boards to make existing facilities available to licensed care providers. That's it.

The same facility that was accommodating the kids at 2:59pm is the same facility that is to be made available to those same kids at 3:01pm. That's it.

The way I envision 85.1 (and I sense the authors):

- Licensed care providers who have registered with the school will operate on school grounds
- Parents will decide which care provider they wish to place their child with. Parent will pay that provider directly.
- Each care professional will have up to six kids under their immediate care. That professional will decide where they will go and what they will do each day. I would assume most days will begin with them going outside (weather permitting). Before school, most kids want to run around. After school, most kids want to run around. Sometimes they may go to the gym, other times they may go to the library, other times they may work in a classroom. It would be up to the care professional.

Simple.

The VSB is just providing the facility. That's it. They are not creating more programs, they are not providing staff, they are not creating new designated child care facilities. Just the existing facility, as it is at 2:59pm.

There is no need for delay. There is no need to involve the provincial government. The school act is clear.

All the VSB has to do is make it known to licensed child care providers that school facilities are available to them. That is what 85.1 says and that is what parents need.

The current system is not working.

The solution is not more money. In fact the solution does not require any money at all. It only requires political will.

We need to open up all elementary schools to all before/after school providers and we need to do it now.

Right now only a select few providers are allowed to operate in the schools (I don't know who decides which providers are granted this preferred access and I don't really care). But these schools belong to the tax payers of the community and they need to serve the needs of the community. Right now this is not happening.

I certainly can't be the first person who has suggested this, so I will try to address what I can only imagine are some of the excuses for not moving ahead with this:

- 1. "Schools can't provide before/after school care for insurance reasons."
 - That does not make any sense. Why it is these kids are perfectly safe and insured from 9-3pm, but suddenly after 3pm it is far too dangerous to be on the premises. Every daycare provider has their own insurance and this would remain true if they were operating in school facilities.
- 2. "The municipality can't afford to provide before/after school daycare staff."
 - We're not talking about the municipality providing staff. Parents would be paying the care providers directly for their services. The municipality is only providing the school facility (for a small fee to the care provider). Remembering of course that these facilities belong to the tax payers and are intended to meet the needs of the taxpayers (in this case the parents). Parents would choose the type of provider they wish. Some providers my specialize in academics, others my focus on physical activities, some may have an emphasis on art and music. It doesn't matter, it is up to the parents to decide what type of before/after school care they want for their child. The municipality is simply providing the facility, that's it.
- 3. "This would result in undue wear and tear on the facilities."
 - Nonsense. These facilities would be doing what they were designed to do, provide for kids! The fees charged to providers would help offset any "costs".
- 4. "The facilities are already contractually obligated to some other group at that time."
 - Night classes don't start until the evening, boy and girl scouts can share the facility, etc.
- 5. "Teachers need the classrooms to prepare for the next day's lesson"
 - An English teacher does not need a classroom to prepare for a lesson. A math teacher does not need a classroom to prepare for a lesson. Before/After school care would only require a very few classrooms for the kids. Most kids are old enough to leave school on their own. It is only those kids needing before/after school care that would need a place to gather on those days when the weather does not permit them to go outside. Kids have been in class all day, they don't want to sit in a classroom anyways. They want to go outside and play with their friends.
- 6. "The schools have never been used for before/after school care before."
 So?
- 7. "The cleaning and maintenance staff have a contract to do their work starting at 3pm"

 That's just an excuse. There are groups using these facilities at the end of the school day now. How does that work for them?
- 8. "It is not my office's jurisdiction."
 - It doesn't matter if it is your jurisdiction or not, as far as the public is concerned you are seen to have a role in this. That is why you have received this email. Perception is reality.

Elementary schools need to be opened up now! There are thousands of parents stuck with no way forward.

The solution is simple. Please use your influence to make this happen.

She is concerned that the current way the Child Care Operating Fund (CCOF) is set up disincentives childcare providers from offering spaces for younger children and holding a multi-age license. She operates a daycare that is in her home but in a separate area from her living area, she employs staff and holds a multi-age (not an in-home multi age)license. Because she runs a multi-age care program she is only eligible for the lower CCOF family rates. However if she stopped caring for the younger children she could change her license to a group care license without making any other changes to her daycare and she would then be eligible for the higher group care rates.

Please see attached letter from \$.2 describing the situation more fully and her request to make licensed multi-age programs eligible to receive group funding rates. While keeping family rates for licensed family multi age programs.







I am an Early Childhood Educator who operates a licensed Multi-Age Child Care Program in the Kootenays. In British Columbia, the Child Care Licensing Regulation defines the two types of Multi-Age Care Programs as follows:

"(g) Multi-Age Child Care, being a program that provides, within each group, care to children of various ages;"

"(h) In-Home Multi-Age Child Care, being a program in which the licensee personally provides care, within the licensee's personal residence, to no more than 8 children of various ages."

I operate a Multi-Age Child Care Program (not an "In-Home Multi-Age Child Care Program).

Multi-Age Care Programs are similar to Group Care Programs. Both Multi-Age and Group Care Programs can be operated in a licensee's home, but not in their living quarters. Licensees of these types of programs can hire qualified adults to care for the children in their programs. In both Multi-Age and Group Care Programs there must always be a certified Early Childhood Educator caring for the children.

The difference between Multi-Age Care and Group Care is as follows:

In Group Child Care Programs, the children are grouped together by age; under 36 months, 30 months to school age, or school age.

In a Multi-Age Child Care Program, children from birth to age 12 can attend the same program at the same time.

I have worked as an Early Childhood Educator in both Multi-Age and Group Child Care Programs since 2. In my experienced opinion it requires far more effort, and more staff, to provide the same quality of care for children in a Multi-Age Child Care Program versus a Group Child Care Program. This is because children of different ages have such diverse needs, compared to children in the same age group.

Different from Multi-Age and Group child Care Programs are In-Home Multi-Age Child Care and Family Child Care Programs. Both In-Home Multi-Age and Family Care Programs must operate within the licensee's living quarters, and the licensee is required to personally provide care to the children in their program. In Family Child Care Programs the licensee does not have to be a certified Early childhood Educator, but needs only to have completed the 20 hour Responsible Adult training. In-Home Multi-Age and Family Child Care Programs do not incur the expenses of hiring employees or maintaining a space separate form their living quarters. Family Child Care providers do not have to spend the time or money obtaining an Early Childhood Educator certificate or spend the money to hire someone with the same qualifications of an adult working in a Group Care or Multi-Age Care facility.

"Child Care Operating Funding (CCOF) assists with the day-to-day costs of running a licensed child care facility. This helps child care providers to:

Keep parent fees affordable

Provide fair salaries to child care staff

Maintain quality child care for the community"

The CCOF provides different rates of funding for Group Child Care and for Family Child Care. The rate of funding for Group Child Care Programs is higher than it is for Family Child Care Programs.

Group and **Multi-Age Child Care** Programs are both more expensive to run than In-Home Multi-Age and Family Child Care programs. This is because they are eligible to hire employees. The people they hire are required to have certain qualifications like an Early Childhood Educator Certificate, thus making them eligible to earn higher wages than an untrained individual. Hiring employees also causes higher overhead costs due to extra taxes and mandatory pay on statutory holidays.

Group and Multi-Age Child Care programs also have higher overhead because they are not run in the living quarter's of the licensee's home. They can be run in a separate part of the licensee's home, in which case the licensee still must pay extra to maintain a space that they would not be maintaining otherwise.

Family Child Care Programs have lower overhead costs. These programs must be run by a licensee in their living quarters, and the licensee is required to personally provide care for the children.

Because my child care centre is licensed as a **Multi-Age Child Care** Program and it is located in my home (although not in my living quarters), it is considered by the Child Care Operating Fund to be a Family Child Care Program. I am only eligible to receive Family Child Care Program funding rates, which are 2 to 3 times lower than what Group Child Care Programs receive.

I could easily change my license to a Group Child Care Program License and receive the Group Child Care Program funding rate from CCOF. However, there is a great need for childcare spaces for children under 36 months, and I want to continue providing this service to my community. I also think it's positive for siblings to be together during the day, when they are away from their parents.

I think he CCOF is an amazing program. However, I struggle to keep my parent fees affordable, pay my child care staff a fair salary and maintain quality child care for my community with the current funding I am receiving from the CCOF.

I think that my program should be eligible for Group Child Care Program rates, based on the fact that I have all the same overhead costs as many Group Child Care Programs do. I would like to change my status with the CCOF to Group instead of Family. I strongly believe that Child Care Programs licensed as **Multi-Age Child Care** programs should receive the same funding as Group Child Care Programs do. Please let me know if you will change my status.

I also became aware recently that Cowichan has the highest apprehension rate of children at birth, and this often has to do with no secure housing/unsafe housing. An ugly offshoot of the housing crisis? Other means need to be taken then removing a baby at birth. Additionally, the stats for children who end up in foster care are abysmal. the costs to our society are extreme, and i dont even include the monetary costs in my equations.

Please, I request a response to below questions:

- 1. What is being done to address this issue in Cowichan?
- 2. How are you working with families, and resourcing them, so they can keep their children?
- 3. Are children and youth receiving therapies and other resources, that take into consideration both the impacts of the original trauma, and the trauma resulting from being apprehended? In other words does MCFD address these children, and families trauma?
- 4. How are you working with our community to support families and children so that apprehension is not needed?

Your email of February 6, 2018, sent to the Honourable John Horgan, Premier, as well as other Cabinet Ministers, has been referred to me. The response has been drafted in consultation with the Provincial Office of Domestic Violence, and a copy will be provided to my fellow Cabinet Ministers who received a copy of your letter, in the event there are additional initiatives specific to their ministries that they would like to comment on.

Government recognizes how serious the issue of domestic violence is, and over the past several years there have been concerted efforts to develop strategies to address domestic violence, and increased funding to strengthen supports for those affected by domestic violence in British Columbia. The following list highlights some of those initiatives:

- The Provincial Office of Domestic Violence (PODV) was created in 2012 at the recommendation of the Representative for Children and Youth, and launched a three-year Provincial Domestic Violence Plan in February 2014. The plan was the result of public and anti-violence stakeholder consultations and led to a \$5.5 million dollar investment that included the development of almost 50 Integrated Case Assessment Teams that facilitate coordinated interagency risk identification, management and safety planning in high-risk family violence cases; programs and supports for both perpetrators and survivors of domestic violence in Aboriginal communities; direct services for perpetrators; and improved access to services and social housing for survivors in rural and remote communities.
- In March 2017, government provided additional one-time funding in excess of \$1.5 million for domestic violence supports, including funds to BC Housing to help with transportation

costs for women and children accessing transition and safe houses; funds to the Ending Violence Association of BC to create and support Interagency Case Assessment Teams; funds to the BC Association of Aboriginal Friendship Centres to deliver programs and supports to Indigenous communities; and funds to create training materials for domestic violence front-line workers.

• The Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General continues to support over 400 victim services and violence against women programs throughout British Columbia. Budget 2018 delivers on the Minister's mandate commitment and provides \$18 million over the next three years to better meet the demand for programs and services such as counselling, outreach, and crisis support for women and children who experience domestic violence, sexual assault and other crimes. This will begin in fiscal year 2018/19 with a \$5 million increase in annual funding for victim service and violence against women programs. This funding will continue through 2019/20 and increase to \$8 million in 2020/21.

There are also ongoing initiatives within the family court system to address domestic violence. For example, there is a collaborative cross-ministry initiative to monitor and improve the effectiveness of protection orders granted under the Family Law Act. One result of this project has been to implement a process whereby protection orders made when the respondent is not present in court are served by a contracted process server at no cost to the applicant. In addition, the Ministry of Attorney General is involved in a joint project with the Provincial Court to revise the current Provincial Court Family Rules. One aspect of the project is considering how screening for domestic violence might be more broadly implemented within the rules, and how to best support those families dealing with a risk of domestic violence through the family justice system. Meetings have taken place with numerous stakeholders including women's advocates, victim assistance and ending violence organizations, and more are planned. Also a broad public consultation will occur during which additional feedback will be solicited.

As you have pointed out in your letter, risk assessment and information sharing is a key to reducing risk for families dealing with domestic violence. As described above, one objective of the Provincial Court Family Rules Project is to introduce screening for risk of domestic violence for all families approaching the Provincial Family Court to address issues arising from separation and divorce. Families identified as being at risk would be connected with victim service and relevant community organizations. During the public consultation phase of the project, we will be seeking to engage with these organizations to identify how to strengthen the linkages between the family justice system and the crucial support and services these organizations provide to families.

For those families who have already been identified as experiencing domestic violence, the Protection Order Registry (POR) provides a confidential database that supports the enforcement of civil and criminal protection orders as a way for police and Crown to share information with other key partners and protect vulnerable victims. All criminal and civil court orders where there is a protected person including *Family Law Act* protection orders and *Child*

Family and Community Service Act protective intervention orders are registered in the POR and accessible at any time to police. Since December 2014, select staff in the Ministry of Children and Family Development have had access to the POR, enhancing child protection risk assessment and safety planning.

There are also broader scale initiatives to improve integration and information sharing. For example, the Fifth Justice Summit resulted in a recommendation to establish a ministry-led steering committee to improve information sharing and coordination across family, domestic violence and child protection proceedings. The ministry has established such a committee which is continuing to work on exploring ways to improve appropriate information sharing of key relevant information where family, criminal, and child protection proceedings intersect and this work involves engaging the courts on how best to do this. As well, in June 2016 a death review panel appointed under the *Coroner's Act* was assembled to analyse intimate partner violence related deaths and make recommendations to government. Three key areas to reduce future deaths were identified, one of which included improved information sharing. PODV has been the lead in working with cross-government and community partners to implement all of the recommendations made by the death review panel.

I can assure you that feedback like yours is important to government as we continue to address the issue of domestic violence and work to reduce the risk to women and children. I sincerely appreciate your comments and continued commitment in this issue and hope you will consider participating in future public consultation opportunities.

Our government is committed to making life more affordable for all British Columbians; tackling poverty and inequality; delivering quality services that meet people's needs; and, ensuring people from every background have the opportunity to reach their full potential.

With regard to home sharing rates, I know that CLBC has been reviewing the matter and has requested additional funding to provide rate increases.

I am committed to working with CLBC to assess how best to ensure a sustainable home sharing sector going forward. This is why I have asked CLBC to gather input from home share providers and their representative groups in the coming months to and provide me with recommendations for improvements in June. On your behalf, I have sent them a copy of your letter to be considered as part of their assessment. You may also be interested to know that my mandate from the Premier includes developing a poverty reduction strategy, and we are hard at work to meet this commitment. As you are likely aware, our government has already taken a critical first step with the \$100 increase in disability and income assistance monthly rates, which took effect on September 20, 2017.

The increase in assistance rates is just the start of the development of a comprehensive plan to lift British Columbians out of poverty, a strategy that will be supported through targets and timelines. The challenge of this strategy is to break the cycle of poverty. We are committed to making meaningful reductions in poverty over the coming years to meet that challenge. This is a cross-ministry commitment, and the strategy will address supports such as housing, child care, education, public safety and income.

Consultations on the poverty reduction strategy are underway, and we have been hearing from all British Columbians about how we can work together to reduce poverty. Your comments are welcome, and I encourage you to participate in a community meeting or to make a submission on the website before the end of March. All the relevant information about the consultation process can be found at https://engage.gov.bc.ca/bcpovertyreduction/.

Thank you again for writing and sharing your comments with me. I look forward to working with CLBC to identify improvements our government can make to ensure home share providers like yourself have the supports you need. Sincerely.

Thank you for your phone call and follow up email of February 28, 2018, addressed to the Honourable Shane Simpson, Minister of Social Development and Poverty Reduction, suggesting mandatory drug testing for income and disability assistance applicants in British Columbia (BC). Minister Simpson has asked that we respond on his behalf, and we are pleased to do so.

We appreciate receiving your comments and we would like to acknowledge your concerns regarding substance abuse in individuals receiving assistance. As you may know, the BC Employment and Assistance (BCEA) program is an income- and asset-tested program, intended to assist people temporarily while they find work and to support those with a disability who are not fully able to participate in the workforce.

Personal responsibility and self-reliance are key principles of the BCEA program, so the ministry encourages clients to manage their own affairs. The ministry is not in a position to monitor what clients spend their support funds on. However, in cases where there is evidence that clients have difficulty managing their financial affairs, the ministry may administer funds on their behalf, including making rent payments directly to landlords.

Additionally, to remain eligible for assistance, employable clients must actively search for employment or participate in an employment program. Recognizing that alcohol and drug dependency can be a significant barrier to sustainable employment and independence, the provincial government provides supports to clients with substance use problems so they can be responsible for their lives and move towards greater self-sufficiency.

For this reason, the provincial government is not considering drug testing as an eligibility requirement for the BCEA program at this time.

We would also like to bring your attention to a series of public consultations that we are hosting. As part of these consultations, British Columbians are invited to come and talk about how poverty can be reduced in the province. Ideas shared will help inform BC's poverty reduction strategy.

In regards to the first issue:

- Family development response is a child protection assessment.
- The primary goal is to inform and involve the parents in understanding and completing the steps of the assessment.
- The social worker works closely with the parent in accessing information from family members residing in the home, identifying key collateral people to interview, and developing supports to alleviate the presenting safety concerns.
- Should the presenting protection concerns be linked to possible mental health issues, \$.22 social workers will ask for a mental health collateral in order to ensure a fulsome assessment and support plan.

In regards to the second issue:

- Community members have a duty to report concerns when they believe a child may be at risk.

 These reports can be both observed reports as well as clinical reports.
- We assess each report based to determine if they present as a risk to the child based on the Sec 13 of our Child, Family, and Community Services Act.
- We work closely with Adult Mental health to support parents who have a presenting mental health concern.
- Adult Mental health services is a voluntary service and depends on the parents willingness both
 access the services and to follow through on the recommendations of the clinicians involved
 if they choose to proceed with services.

Thank you for your phone call and follow up email of February 28, 2018, addressed to the Honourable Shane Simpson, Minister of Social Development and Poverty Reduction, suggesting mandatory drug testing for income and disability assistance applicants in British Columbia (BC). Minister Simpson has asked that we respond on his behalf, and we are pleased to do so.

We appreciate receiving your comments and we would like to acknowledge your concerns regarding substance abuse in individuals receiving assistance.

As you may know, the BC Employment and Assistance (BCEA) program is an income- and asset-tested program, intended to assist people temporarily while they find work and to support those with a disability who are not fully able to participate in the workforce.

Personal responsibility and self-reliance are key principles of the BCEA program, so the ministry encourages clients to manage their own affairs. The ministry is not in a position to monitor what clients spend their support funds on. However, in cases where there is evidence that clients have difficulty managing their financial affairs, the ministry may administer funds on their behalf, including making rent payments directly to landlords.

Additionally, to remain eligible for assistance, employable clients must actively search for employment or participate in an employment program. Recognizing that alcohol and drug dependency can be a significant barrier to sustainable employment and independence, the provincial government provides supports to clients with substance use problems so they can be responsible for their lives and move towards greater self-sufficiency.

For this reason, the provincial government is not considering drug testing as an eligibility requirement for the BCEA program at this time.

We would also like to bring your attention to a series of public consultations that we are hosting. As part of these consultations, British Columbians are invited to come and talk about how poverty can be reduced in the province. Ideas shared will help inform BC's poverty reduction strategy.

Re: A Critical Issue

British Columbians with intellectual disabilities (ID) have lower life expectancies, live more sedentary lifestyles, and are hospitalized more frequently than the general population. This is not acceptable in BC given that there are solutions to this challenge. We must work together to change it and each Ministry identified here plays a key role in creating this change.

Studies have found that people with intellectual disabilities:

- Will die up to 13 years earlier if you are a male, and up to 20 years earlier if you are a female than their non-disabled peers.
- Are far more likely than the general population to develop a psychiatric disorder. 36%
 of children with ID are estimated to have a psychiatric disorder compared to eight
 percent of children without an ID.
- Are more likely to visit emergency rooms for psycho-behaviour issues rather than a medical concern, and visits are more likely to result in admission.
- Are significantly more likely to be sexually abused before their 18th birthday than their non-disabled peers.
- Are significantly less active than their peers without disabilities. One study found that children with ID were two to three times more likely to be obese than their nondisabled peers.
- Have little choice in their diets and that only seven to eight percent of adults eat balanced diets.
- Are likely to experience heightened side effects from both prescribed and illicit drugs.
- Are up to three times more likely to be hospitalized for ambulatory care-sensitive conditions than the general population.
- Are often prescribed multiple psychotropic medications concurrently to manage challenging or aggressive behaviour.

In BC, we spend billions of dollars on health services that do not meet the needs of individuals with ID, often causing substantial negative health consequences in the process. This is pressing given that expenditures for people with illness or disability account for 50% of all health system expenditures, with liabilities reaching \$5.2 billion (Ministry of Health, 2015). We also know that for those with medium and highly complex chronic conditions,

expenditure is expected to increase by 76% and 98% respectively by 2036 (Ministry of Health, 2015). Service expenditure on individuals with severe disabilities is expected to grow by 45% in the same time frame.

The following non-exhaustive list highlights current inefficiencies causing unnecessary expenditure and poor health outcomes

- A lack of adequate interventions for aggressive behavior increases reliance on ER rooms and inpatient facilities, as well as contributes to lower practitioner and caregiver retention rates
- Ambulatory Care-Sensitive (ACS) conditions, sometimes known as potentially
 preventable hospitalizations, are used as an informal measure of access to, and
 quality of, primary health services. While the rate at which British Columbians with ID
 are hospitalized for ACS conditions needs to be studied, in Ontario, they were found
 to be three times that of the general population
- An over reliance on pharmacological interventions not only increases health care expenditure, but also the rate at which Drug Related Problems are present in the population. Some estimates claim that DRP's are present in 80% of individuals with ID who are taking at least one psychotropic medication.
- Poor communication between health authorities and community organizations result in support networks being underutilized. One such example is the Special Olympics BC (SOBC) healthy athlete screenings which provide free specialized health screenings to any individual in the province with ID, regardless of their affiliation with SOBC.
- Increasingly lengthy lifespans of people with ID coupled with low activity rates and high levels of obesity result in increased utilization of public health services
- Increased funding for general anesthesia for individuals with ID at general anesthesia clinics around the province will reduce reliance on more costly specialized services

Clearly, the status quo must change. Individuals with intellectual disabilities in BC do not deserve health outcomes that compare with developing nations, yet that is what is happening. We can, and must do better. When we do, individuals with intellectual disabilities will live healthier lives, and there will be a savings to government. Please find attached a report that highlights the poor state of health faced by people with intellectual disabilities. We have met with many other individuals and organizations who feel that this situation is not acceptable, and who are willing to work to change it, but we need



Dear Ministers.

I write to you as a concerned citizen, a parent, and a grandparent with regard to the attempt by your government to adopt a new child care policy in this province.

So far, your attempts have been described by the media, and by the general public, as being in a chaotic, crisis situation.

Your government championed a platform of providing \$10 childcare in this province. Since the throne speech, your government has tried to wiggle out of that commitment by minimizing that promise and by labelling it as "branding."

That is a bit disingenuous considering the promises that were made during the election namely,

- 1. "Quality, accessible, and affordable child care" or "safe, secure, affordable childcare"
- 2.\$10 / day childcare
- 3.22,000 spaces in the next 3 years
- 4. to look into why there is a crucial shortage of ECE's in BC
- 5. to look into why there is currently a wait list of 12 -14 months to get kids into licensed childcare.
- 6. that rates would be covered through a tax on the wealthy

Right off the bat, one thing that concerns me is that your government has announced that "BC will begin by converting unlicensed spaces to regulated child care spots."

Hopefully that will that include proper screening, inspection, zoning?

If so, many of these unlicensed spots will shut down, causing yet a further burden on parents in finding affordable licensed daycare operators, and thereby adding more to the current wait times. On the subject of the newly adopted "Opt in or Opt out" policy, it seems to me that your government is hell bent on forcing current licensed operators into becoming non-profit entities making them entirely vulnerable and dependent on this government and it's current rudderless policies.

It is asking a lot from these operators, many of whom have invested their entire life savings...and more, in providing this essential service, and they are now being asked to risk it all by opting in, and placing their faith in the government.

It seems that the current "take it or leave it" offering by your government is nothing more than a simple and desperate attempt to satisfy an election promise, as opposed to crafting a well thought out long term strategy which would include **appropriate consultation with all affected parties**.

I know in advance that you are going to say that there was adequate consultation with all parties involved, but it seems that many of these parties still feel that they have been left out or overlooked and were not given a proper forum to consult with your government.

I've been advised that an internal poll was conducted on facebook with some 400 BC daycare providers who were were asked if they had been consulted prior to this policy being implemented by your government. That poll seems to indicate that none of these operators had been consulted.

Granted, some providers may feel intimidated in admitting that they had been contacted by the government with regard to this policy, but it would still appear that the majority have not been consulted.

Many of these parties, who have operated legally for many years, and have been properly regulated by the government of the day, have felt the sting of your rebuke, which has caused them to form their own association to try to fight for the rights of their kids, their staff, and the right to operate in a fair and competitive environment.

Licensed day-care providers try to provide;

- high quality, safe **learning environments** for pre-schoolers at a fair and competitive rate.
- ECE's that meet all government standards and comply with regulated student/teacher ratios.
- a competitive living wage and benefits for their employees, while building a long and sustainable service to the community for quality childcare.

Unintended Consequences of "Opt in - Opt out" will be;

- A burgeoning underground economy of unlicensed, unqualified operators.
 - These operators will run unregulated in areas not zoned for business use.
 - These operators may run their business contrary to certain building codes.
 - These operators will not declare income, or pay their fair share in taxes.
 - These operators are under no obligation in providing any sort of structured curriculum.
- Some parents may find it far more cost effective to turn to "Nanny's" which will generate further expense to the government in screening and monitoring.

This government has accepted that bullying has no place in society, yet by their own actions of late, they remind me of the mafia Don who says "you either do business with me for protection or maybe something might happen to you." This is not a preferred model for doing business.

So here is a little rough math to give you some more perspective;

Licensed daycare operators currently charge, on average, \$1,000 / child / month.

That works out to roughly \$50 per day, or \$5.00 per hour. (Interestingly enough, according to <u>care.com</u>, current "baby sitting fees" in the lower mainland are accepted at about \$15.00 / hour.)

So from this \$5.00 per hour, licensed daycare operators have to pay their staff a living wage, hopefully with benefits, they have to contend with grossly expensive rent unique to the lower mainland of B.C., they have to keep up with renovations and regular upkeep for wear and tear, and they have to provide supplies, furniture, and comply with various building codes.

In short, no one is getting rich over this, however, these licensed operators are providing a vital service to their communities while being responsible employers in providing a competitive income for their employees.

I don't think that your government wants to create an entirely new bureaucracy. The laws and regulatory rules and enforcement mechanisms are already there.

However, during this chaotic transition, I think it is vital for your government to sit down with these licensed operators to hammer out a blue print for an agreement to build this industry, to move forward, and to provide decent, affordable daycare for everyone, and to provide a competitive living income for qualified ECE's who are currently in very short supply.

In the recent Throne Speech it was announced that "This government's first and most urgent priority is to make life more affordable." It went on to say that "British Columbians are working paycheque to paycheque. Many cannot pay their bills without going further into debt."

Recently, a spokesperson for the Coalition of Childcare Advocates of B.C. Sharon Gregson commented that one of the biggest hurdles facing licensed operators is the fact that ECE's are among the lowest paid professionals in the province.

These ECE's are placed in a position of trust with our children and we should ensure that we screen, and encourage the right people to do this job, and to provide them with quality training and competitive wages and benefits that will ensure a stable environment for these operators and for the clients that they serve for many years to come.

Dialogue with all concerned parties seems to me to be the cornerstone in advancing this issue. I hope that you will reconsider your current stance, and take the opportunity to consult with the people that know this industry the best...your fully licensed daycare operators, their employees, and their clients.

Dear Premier Hogan,

As a parent of young children, I am distraught about childcare in our province.

One of the most troubling aspects of the roll out of this initiative, is the lack of information provided to daycare owners. The government has been telling parents to ask their daycare providers for information, and with only weeks to prepare for the opt-in, daycares were not provided with any answers. I know daycare owners who contacted the government repeatedly, and they were repeatedly told that "there is no information at this time". How completely frustrating.

Why is the government involving private daycares at all in this? It is creating a ton if extra work for no benefit to them. The administrative side to all of this is putting a huge burden on daycare owners.

I suggest that you bypass the middle man and provide the benefit directly to the families who need it.

Your goal is to create equal opportunity childcare. However, by putting the onus on daycare providers to opt-in, the government is creating a very unfair system. It is completely unacceptable to demand that daycare owners, who have poured their heart and soul into their private businesses, give up control over everything. The men and women who own respectable daycares are really proud of their businesses and they deserve to have the choice to pour extra funds into their programs. They deserve to be in control of keeping up with operating costs. They need to be in control of keeping their centres updated. Daycare centres should have the ability to keep their fees low and their wages high.

And what matters to me as a parent is **quality of care** for my child. I am not interested in sending my child to a government run daycare! I want to be able to choose a daycare that I love and I want my daycare to have control over how they run things. That is what impresses me about my children's daycare. They really CARE. Please don't take this away from them.

It comes down to quality spaces. As a parent I want to have my choice as to what kind of care I would like for my children.

At the present time there is already a staffing crisis in childcare. ECE's are already at the bottom of the wage barrel. Many daycares prize their ECEs and are very proud of them and want to treat them well. If daycare owners are forced to keep wages low, then they will lose their ECEs. Where are you planning on finding ECEs for your government run centres? There aren't even enough to go around as it is.

There is a big fear that you will take ECEs from private daycares and that those daycares may be **forced** to close.

Dear Mr Hogan

I write this letter to you today on behalf of myself and others who provide boots on the ground childcare every day. I am saddened and extremely frustrated that you have chosen to deliver this initiative in a a rushed manner that leaves me and my co-workers hanging with a contract riddled with holes that leave us with more questions than answers. Yesterday we spent an hour on a phone call with a few members of your team, including Minister Chen, and left with very few answers, and sadly a few more questions. I am asking you today to extend the deadline to opt in until the contract amendments are complete and we are able to read the final contract prior to signing, and give the parents retroactive subsidy if we opt in, it is the fair way to do this. Certainly you wouldn't sign such a contract, nor should we.

Aside from the contract issues, I would like to draw your attention to a few of the issues that plague our industry. I invite you to spend a day with me, with five preschool age children, and two school age children after school. It is a fun filled day, we play, we learn, we laugh, we love. Sounds wonderful doesn't it? For the most part, it is. It could be so much better.

If-

If the licensing officers were not so completely absorbed by regulations to the extent that they have lost sight of our agenda. Our goal is to keep the children safe, happy and engaged in a loving environment where they can prepare for school and life. We want them to feel safe and secure, confident and loved.

- -Are you aware that we cannot- within our current regulations, take the children to a movie without consent of our LO? Last week, four daycares that I am aware of made this request, one was approved and three were denied. Why? It's the discretion of the LO involved? This should be a matter between the parents of the children in care, and the caregiver.
- -Are you aware that if a parent sends a box of smarties to daycare, and requests that their child be given three smarties as a reward for peeing on the potty, we are not allowed to carry out this request? We would be violating a regulation in doing so?
- -Are you aware that we as caregivers are told to "be creative" when addressing our need to use a toilet, as we must, in order to comply with current regulations, never leave the children out of eyesight. Just imagine how this looks for us as caregivers. I work from 7am-5:15pm daily.
- -Are you aware that I am expected to serve the children a meal, dessert included, and let them choose what to eat and what not to? Is it not our role to protect the children from unhealthy choices? As a childcare provider I am required to "journal" every single food item that I offer very single child, every single morsel.

The list goes on and on, we are being regulated to the point that it has become absurd.

What I am trying to convey is that Family Daycares in particular need non-monetary support. We need a back to basics approach to providing care in a safe loving environment. We are being regulated to the point that we are burnt out from trying to find the balance. The very office that was put into place to provide support to us has become so focused on policy and regulation that they are failing to support us. We as owner/operators are less and less in control of our business, riddled with policies and regulations that are bordering on ridiculous, this is unfortunately causing some Family Daycare centres to close.

Please consider the issues that I mention. Family Daycare provides the majority of todays childcare, and we need the support of our government to become the best at what we do. The them and us mentality is driving people like myself out of this business.

group of social work students currently taking a class on policy development focused on the CFCSA. We are greatly concerned about Indigenous girls who are at a significant risk of experiencing sexualized violence while in the Province of British Columbia's

care. We would like to see culturally safe support services for Indigenous girls who experience sexualized violence while in care. Mary Ellen Turpel-Lafond's report

Too

Many Victims: Sexulaized Violence im the Lives of Children and Youth in Care identified that a draft of action steps to address the issue was to be developed and implemented by the Ministry of Children and Family Development by February 1, 2017. We have come to find that this recommendation has not been met. The First Nations Child

and Family Caring Societies of Canada have also identified the need for changes to occur in regards to both policy and support programs. Currently, there is no policy in place that is specific to Indigenous youth in care who experience sexualized violence.

A recent study found that Indigenous girls are four times more likely than non-Indigenous girls to experience sexualized violence while in the care of the Ministry (Turpel-Lafond, 2016, p. 36). These findings speak to the urgency of the need for federal policy

changes to address and ensure adequate access to support services for these vulnerable youth. Three key recommendations were identified by Turpel-Lafond to address and change the

current practices with Indigenous girls who experience sexualized violence while

in care. One of the specific recommendations is "to create and implement a broad strategy with adequate policy, standards, resources and training to address sexualized violence against Aboriginal girls" (Turpel-Lafond, 2016, p. 40). With the above in mind,

we pose this question to you: what is the plan to address this social issue and what has been done so far to rectify it? We look forward to hearing your response. Sincerely,

Thank you for your letter of March 21/18 with the attached copy of the Engineer's report. The main question which I have is "Can I rely on the government to regulate the level of Okanagan Lake to prevent a recurrence of the flooding of 2017?" At present, the answer is NO.

The report is very through and extensive with many recommendations, perhaps too many. The main failure in 2017 is identified as the change over from the manual snow course data collection in the Greystokes and Silver Star areas to AUTOMATED stations without allowance for overlap and calibration of the automated stations data. Garbage data in, garbage RFC predictions out. Has this been corrected for 2018? Improved upon? It is not more people in the department that are needed, it is more rigorous science by improved weather measurements. If more people actually do the collection of data as opposed to managing it, then yes, more staff are needed.

The Guidelines for the Okanagan Lake level specify a FULL POOL of 342.48 m., (yet stretch this up to 342.75m...why?) The 2017 lake reached a peak of 343.25m. or 0.77 m. above full pool. The guidelines specify a minimum allowable level of 341.5 m. so the tight range is supposed to be just under 1 metre. It seems to me that all the damage occurs when the lake level exceeds the full pool and only minimal damage happens when the lower limit is exceeded. My conclusion is that the levels are set too high and need to be reduced. My recommendation is to please reduce FULL POOL by 0.23m to 342.25 and the minimum level to 341.27. Penalties for failure to meet guidelines, regardless of the reasons, should include demotion or removal of water managers.

The outflow at the Penticton dam has a design of up to 78 m3/sec yet practical outflow is limited to 60 m3/sec. due to downstream damage. What improvements are being made to mitigate the downstream damage of allowing full outflow of 78? Money is needed here. Yours,

Thank you for your email of February 6, 2018 to Premier Horgan and Ministers Donaldson, Conroy, Beare and Heyman. I have been asked to respond on Mr. Donaldson's behalf.

As you may now be aware, the Province hired Associated Engineering Consultants to conduct an independent assessment of the Province's operation of infrastructure

during the flooding event of 2017. The report, entitled *Review of 2017 Flood Response:* Okanagan Lake Regulation System and Nicola Dam, was released on March 14, 2018. You can find it posted at the attached link:

The review assessed information and data, operational decisions, infrastructure, and communications to determine if the Province could have done anything differently that would have reduced the impact of flooding. It concluded that the flooding of 2017 in the Thompson Okanagan was caused by extraordinary weather conditions and that staff managed the systems appropriately and professionally. However, it also made 65 recommendations for improvements in the areas of data and information, operations, and organizational performance. The Province accepts the report and is taking action to address the recommendations.

With respect to your comments about managing the Okanagan Lake system in 2018, staff are also carefully monitoring snow and weather conditions and are actively managing lake outflows according to complex operating rules, plans, and procedures. The circumstances are very different in 2018 than in 2017; in 2017 snow levels were normal to slightly lower than normal which did not indicate the need for additional releases, whereas in 2018 snowpacks are higher than normal, prompting increased releases.

I apologize for the delay in response to your email, but believed that it would be appropriate to wait until the report was released before responding to you. I encourage you to read the report. Please feel free to contact me if you have any questions or require further information.

Attached please find a copy of a letter addressed to our Premier, John Horgan. I understand that each of you, as members of Cabinet, may have responsibilities in regard to the FLOOD activities outlined in my letter, and may be able to effect changes that I am recommending.

First of all, the control of the Penticton dam and Okanagan Lake levels needs to be taken out of the hands of officials in charge during 2017. Perhaps several new

officials could work as a team. This could be effected by you, Minister Donaldson.

Secondly, the area of Big White is in the constituency of Hon. Katrine Conroy. Katrine, I am a big fan of yours and remember how diligently you worked on other issue \$.22 . Floods in the Kettle

River drainage (where most Big White runoff flows) are a direct concern. Thirdly, changing weather patterns, and new rainfall/snow variations in the Environment may need to change parameters of how low Okanagan Lake is allowed to go in anticipation of major run offs. Impacts like the sport fishery for Kokanee may need increased stocking to maintain viability. Here you, Hon. George Heyman, can guide issues so that great human damage is not the result of fisheries protection. The other issue of Okanagan Lake as a reservoir for drinking water and irrigation water also affect decisions. Last year excessive flooding resulted in serious erosion and high particle pollution.

Finally, the issue of huge negative impact on tourism and recreation on Okanagan Lake are a direct impact of flooding. People who live beside the lake \$.22 find the experience very disheartening and destabilizing. Why live here with possible flooding looming? We need our confidence restored that you, our government, will exercise due diligence and control the lake level. It should NEVER breech full pool again and force lakeshore owners to hire their own crews of helpers to sandbag and install protection for docks, beaches and low lands like I had to do with 2000 sandbags, 24 barrels, and two huge barrier waterbeds. I did appreciate the help all the Forest fighters provided with sandbag filling but lets not make this an annual ritual.

Thanks again for your help on this matter. I've attached the HOOSC briefing notes, a letter from the HOOSC to the VSB and the VSB's subsequent response. I've also included a brief summary below, but the briefing note contains the most detailed overview of the situation.

- The VSB has issued a lease termination that will displace 40 preschool and 20 school-aged children operated by the Henry Hudson Out of School Care Society (HOOSC)
- HOOSC is operated in a building that was previously used as storage space but was converted in 2008 to be available for use in child care
- The VSB intends to repurpose the building for an additional classroom
- The VSB say that previous government enacted a policy which prevented the allocation of funding for portables until all available school space had been used up
- This policy did not exempt space used for child care and, as such, the VSB has declined to renew the HOOSC lease for next year
- Possible solutions include capital funding from MCFD for a portable for child care, while the current HOOSC space is used for classroom space

Last night, the board of the HOOSC voted to go through with notifying the families about the closure of the childcare spaces on Thursday March 29th if they do not receive any further instruction from the VSB or response from the Ministry.

I am an ECE in Prince Georges. 22

Please know that I was so excited to hear that child care was included in the budget to the tune of \$1 billion, and that parents were finally going to be getting the break that they need.

However, the more information that came out, the more the implications that became apparent, and the more concerned I have become. \$.22

I am very concerned for the future of childcare. The possibility of homogenized child care is too great with this plan. You are starting with the parents fees, which creates more demand. You are keeping fees down which leads to average programs, and will keep excellent staff away because stagnating the current fees means low wages. Increasing the demand right away by funding parents, and promising more spaces before you address the workforce puts the cart before the horse. Quality is already waning due to a staffing crisis. Creating a

demand in the short amount of time of 3 years will force daycares to hire more underqualified staff to get warm bodies into the classrooms. You have no plan for increasing wages, only to study them and work on creating a strategy. It sounds like you do not plan to raise wages anytime soon. This plan will create average child care with average funding. Homogenized child care.

I have written as essay that I hope you will read. There are 3 sections: The foundation problem, the resulting problems, and the fix.

Current Crisis Right Now!- Foundation Problems:

- 1. Foundation Problem. Part 1. Staffing crisis due to low wages. There are not enough certified, well-trained ECEs to fill all of the positions open in the province. Daycares in some areas of the province are close to shutting down due to the staffing crisis. Reason: Low wages attract fewer people to the profession. Low wages has two major consequences that result in lowered quality of care:
- a. Fewer people being attracted to the profession means fewer excellent candidates who are passionate and well-suited to this type of work are applying to ECE training schools. Fewer people applying to ECE training schools means fewer excellent candidates are being chosen for the programs. Fewer excellent candidates chosen for the programs means that, in order to fill seats, the ECE training schools are accepting more and more people who do not have the appropriate temperament and attitudes to work with young children. More and more people with poor aptitude and poor attitudes for child care are graduating and getting hired due to the desperate need for staff. This is lowering the quality of child care.
- b. Low wages attracting fewer people to the field (fewer qualified ECEs, in particular) means that there is a major staffing crisis province-wide. A major staffing crisis province-wide means that in order for daycares to keep their doors open and avoid putting their families into the situation of having no child care, they need to apply to Licensing for exemptions to hire less qualified staff to fill the ECE positions. This lowers the quality of child care.
- 2. Foundation Problem. Part 2. Staffing crisis due to high turnover and burnout.
- a. High Turnover. Passionate, nurturing ECEs are leaving the field because of low wages, thereby reducing the labour force. With wages such as \$16/hour, single parent ECEs have a difficult time making ends meet; working poor ECEs turn to the food bank; working poor ECEs are stuck not being able to upgrade their education to Infant/Toddler or Special Needs, which means there are fewer of those; working poor ECEs cannot afford RRSPs, or dental care for their children; ECEs need to rely on their spouses income to make ends meet, or even buy appropriate clothes for work, or have a holiday; working poor ECEs are teaching in preschools and daycares and loving your children every day. These ECEs leave the field that they love to find better paying jobs for their families.
- b. Burnout. It all becomes too much, and care providers leave the field. Why? Giving until it hurts; low wages; few benefits if any; working more- longer hours, few days off; giving even more- love, time, energy, money; no RRSP; little recognition- being considered a babysitter with an easy job; giving even more still; missing bill payments;... after a while, your feeling

personal satisfaction and love for the children is replaced by the realization that your "giving cup" is empty, and by the knowledge that your retirement is going to be harder than life is now, and you find yourself broke and emotionally exhausted. Another child care worker leaves the field.

- 3. Foundation Problem. Part 3. Staffing crisis due to not enough child care providers of all kinds.
- a. There are not enough dedicated, trained child care providers offering small, privately owned child care such as Family Child Care. ECEs and other people who run small businesses such as Family Child Care, In-Home Multi-Age Care, Preschool, Licensed Child Care, and After School Care struggle to serve families and keep their businesses open when their only source of revenue is parent fees. Parent fees must be kept as low as possible because they are already too high for families, and these child care owners know this and feel for the families. Keeping the fees as low as possible means that this is a labour of love and everyone working in the field knows that they are not there to make money. These are people who love children and who want to be of service to the community. They should not be forced to make the sacrifices that they must make, such as low staff wages, low wages for themselves, and overworking on weekends, overtime with no pay in order to run an excellent program. They all deserve to make enough money to improve their programs, to run high-quality programs, to pay staff well, and to make a decent living for such important work. Fewer people are choosing to open these businesses and keep them open due to the hardships they face.

Current Crisis Right Now!- Resulting Problems:

- 1. Resulting Problem. Part 1. Limited Spaces. The problem of limited spaces is not just because there is a lack of ECEs and providers as described above. It is also because there are not enough businesses. This section is about is about why there are not enough child care spaces, including for-profit and non-profit, and especially Infant/Toddler. (Note: "for profit" is a misnomer in child care. It should be called "break even.")
- a. Notoriously, child care businesses do not make money so business people do not go around opening daycares. Child care workers are nurturing, empathic people by nature and are notoriously bad at business. The combination of the personal traits of nurturing, empathic, business-oriented child care worker who is dedicated to sticking it out for the long haul is extremely rare. Therefore, too many new child care businesses close within about 5 years. Non-profit businesses often have the benefit of having accountants as well as a board of directors to deal with the non-profit fundraising and non-profit grants, which the "breakeven' business do not have access to. However, getting a non-profit business started is even more complicated. Low fees coming in and the complex nature of the business and all the Child Care Regulations can make child care a daunting business. Therefore, there are not enough child care spaces.
- b. Infant/Toddler Spaces- Limited spaces due to not enough trained staff. In addition to the staffing crisis mentioned above, there is the issue of Infant/Toddler (I/T) ECEs and Special Needs (SNE) ECEs. ECEs can obtain a diploma in ECE by completing one more year of school, thereby being certified I/T and SNE ECEs. The problem is that they often get paid about the same as or just \$1-2 more than a basic ECE. Since ECEs do not make much money, it is

difficult to go back to school once they are working as an ECE. The current bursary system through ECEBC requires you to pay about \$2000 per fulltime semester up front to your school, and then you will get reimbursed after the term ends. Plus you have your living expenses. But \$2000 per term is a lot of money for an ECE making \$16 with the prospect of making \$1-2 more. Plus when you will be making such a low wage, getting a student loan is a bad idea.

- c. Infant/Toddler spaces continued. I/T group spaces are about twice as expensive to provide as 3-5 year old child care but the reality is that their fees cannot be twice as much for parents to pay. So how do they make it work? In I/T group care, there is twice as many staff to pay (1 staff to 4 children, instead of 1 staff to 8 children in 3-5 year old care) and there are half as many kids (ie. families paying fees. Twelve children per daycare instead of 25 children in 3-5 year old group care) but the rent, overhead and supplies are not much different, often sharing a building. To be clear, that is twice as many staff to be paid, and half as many fees coming in. So infant/toddler group care fees should actually cost almost twice the fees of 3-5 year old daycare. If 3-5 year old daycare costs \$900, then I/T daycare should cost \$1800, but it does not. Because no one can pay that. Especially with more than one child. So how is it that I/T care is not as expensive as it should be? The fees are being subsidized by the workers' wages.
- 2. Resulting Problem. Part 2. Fee Crisis. Child Care Fees are too high for most parents to pay without hardship. The cost of providing child care, even with the workers wages subsidizing parent fees, has become more exorbitant. However, the reality of modern-day life is that most families need two incomes in order to even have a chance at a decent life and possibly even buy a home with a yard for their children, but too many people can hardly even afford a low-cost rental unit. In so many families, one parent must stay home with the children due to the cost of child care. Although staying home and raising your own children may be ideal for many parents, it may not be realistic for their family budgets. There are also many people who simply feel like they were made for their careers and would love to work, only as long as they can find excellent, loving, high-quality care for their child. Therefore, because of the necessities of modern-day life, excellent, loving, high-quality child care is essential, and must be made to be financially accessible for all.
- 3. Resulting Problem. Part 3. Quality. This is the most important issue that crowns them all. Providing excellent, loving, high-quality child care is extremely important; it is also extremely expensive. More expensive than most parents can pay. Even so, child care fees are forced to be lower than they should be.
- a. Start-up loans can be in the tens or hundreds of thousands of dollars. In order for a program to rent/buy an excellently suited space; outfit it with all of the requirements for Licensing; buy and maintain excellent equipment and furnishings; create appropriate décor to inspire early learning and a feeling of a home away from home for the children; buy and maintain all types of books, toys, learning materials, art supplies, science supplies, kitchen and baking supplies, special interest and theme-type supplies; recruit excellent, educated and passionate staff; keep the excellent staff by paying staff wages and benefits that reflect the incredible work that they do; create and follow a philosophy of curriculum and care that reflects the current research and cutting edge approaches to early learning and child development; and maintain paid professional development for yourself and staff to be able to do all of that mentioned, and maintain a top-notch, respected program where children thrive

and their love of learning is encouraged; their innate curiosity is preserved; their personal social, emotional, self-regulative, cognitive, and physical development are fostered; and they learn how to build and maintain relationships, all so that their self-concepts bloom and they have an excellent foundation to build their whole lives on. This... this all costs more than parents can pay. So some things have to go. Staff wages and benefits are one of the first things to go. Quality goes down.

b. Research shows how important high quality care is to the lives of children. The issues stated above: low wages leading to fewer suitable candidates being attracted and trained; more underqualified staff being hired to substitute for lack of ECEs; poor staff attitudes, skills and knowledge; lead to lower quality of care, everything mentioned above leads to lower quality of care for our children. Is that what we want?

How to Mitigate the Current Crisis and Create a Fantastic Future for Child Care:

- 1. Right now. Fair wages for such an important job, a job which lays the base for real people's entire lives, paid in full or in part by the government. This job has historically been considered "women's work" so low wages have been accepted. The wages need to get with the times. \$25 per hour for ECE. \$30/hour for Infant/Toddler ECEs and Special Needs ECEs. These wages are very reasonable when compared to jobs paying \$25-35, with equal or less training and responsibilities, that are "historically men's work" such as automotive and construction. Also ensure that the earnings of ECEs and trained providers running FCCs and IHMA keep up with these wages. Keep our ECEs in the field! Attract new ECEs to the field! This is the most important issue that is the foundation for everything else.
- 2. As more quality candidates are being drawn to the field of Early Childhood Education instead of Teaching or Nursing, the quality of ECE training needs to be addressed.
- 3. Excellent funding and incentives for opening both "break even" and non-profit child care facilities. This includes head start programs, preschools, after school care.
- 4. Funding high-quality child care for children age 0-12 years, including funding for parent fees, wages, and all of the needs of the programs to the proper degree to produce the desired results of sustained, excellent, high-quality care that eases the minds of parents, and opens the minds of children and prepares them for life.

In conclusion, to fix this crisis in child care, raise wages first. After a wonderful, strong, steady workforce is substantially on its way, well-funded child care spaces can be created to reduce the current strain on the system. Finally, when there are enough staff and spaces to handle increased demand that the last step will create, the parent fees need to be funded much

more fully than they currently are in order to sustain high-quality child care for all. These things need commitment not only from this government, but from all governments going forward.

This new plan put forth by the government is a terrific idea that needs to happen, but it is a terrible plan that completely misses the mark. It needs more time and proper consideration, for the sake of the children.
