I'm belatedly following up on some action items arising from the Minster's meeting with the Tricities task force on child care on Dec 21st.

I've attached the summary compiled by the task force and the specific items I noted down for follow up were:

- They are looking for us to share more clearly what the timeline is for changes to licensing of school age child care on school grounds. It wasn't totally clear from the meeting briefing note what was internal information on the HLTH timeline and what we could share publicly so the Minister committed to following up. (see attached for the original letter from tri-cities task force about licensing).
- 2. Another action item that is mentioned in the attached summary is a request for a best practices guide for local school districts who are looking to have school age child care on their school grounds (both for running their own or partnering with a non-profit). I realise that this is a bigger ask but something that resonated with the Minister as being important as we try to encourage more SDs to take on school age child care.
- 3. FYI only They request more information about the rapid renovation fund and I have sent that to them.

Hi folks,

I won't do a verbal pitch tomorrow as I already pitched these but I wanted to re-share our two spaces pitch docs as a gentle nudge that we'd love to get a confirmed date for these (direction so far has been that they will go after budget).

I'm also attaching updated regional breakdowns for each pitch, and a new suggestion we're looking for direction on about how to approach a province-wide NR for the spaces milestone.

Rapid Renovation Fund 500+ spaces Province-wide NR (plus one regional with Metis Nation)

- a. **timing:** ASAP post-budget needs to go out before the regional New Spaces Fund NRs as we are including these RRF spaces in our total count.
- b. what: We're suggesting a province-wide NR (plus one regional NR in Victoria with Metis Nation at their request, it would go out on the same day as the province-wide). We'll work with caucus for them to pitch the province-wide NR in their own communities rather than an individual NR in each region that got spaces.

2. 14 Regional New Spaces Fund NRs for 4,000+ spaces and 1 Wrap up Milestone Provincewide NR

- a. **timing:** ASAP post budget and after the Rapid Renovation Fund NR
- b. **what:** 14 regional NRs (staggered over a few days at the discretion of editors) and 1 wrap up NR
- c. **Looking for direction:** If there is interest in a province-wide NR about the new nearly 26,000 milestone (will already have been included in the budget), we are proposing we do this after the regional NRs and that as a new angle it could include talking about the fact that 11,000 of the previously funded spaces will be opening within the coming year. However, it will be too soon to provide details of when the next round of New Spaces funding will be opening and what the criteria to apply will be.

MEETING PURPOSE: Review CUPE BC's proposal for creating 10,000 new universal public child

care spaces using school-based delivery.

BACKGROUND:

- In early 2018, government released its aspirational 10-year <u>Childcare BC Plan</u> (2018 2028) to create a universal child care system in BC. Child care is a key government priority, as evidenced in multiple Ministers' 2020 Mandate Letters.
- As part of the first three years of Childcare BC funding, the Ministry of Education (EDUC) sought to identify up to 8 locations where school spaces existed, or where StrongStart BC was under-utilized, and convert those spaces into child care. To date, EDUC has provided start-up grants to 7 school districts (representing 8 locations) for innovative child care projects. Districts could apply to the Ministry of Children and Family Development (MCFD) for new spaces funding and for operating grants.
- These innovative projects included piloting various models of child care that were either
 offered directly by the school board or in partnership with a third-party licensee offering
 child care on school grounds.
- One of the pilots is referred to as the "Seamless Day." Modeled after Ontario's seamless day
 for 4- and 5-year-olds, the program is designed to create additional before- and after-school
 care using existing classroom space. Early Childhood Educators (ECEs) provide the care
 before- and after-school and support in-class instruction alongside the K/Gr 1 teacher.
 - In 2019/20, EDUC provided seed funding to pilot the seamless day in School District
 No. 53 (Okanagan-Similkameen) at Oliver Elementary (12 spaces).
 - In 2020/21, EDUC provided seed funding to pilot the seamless day in three more districts including SD 45 (West Vancouver) at Hollyburn Elementary (20 spaces), SD 46 (Sunshine Coast) at West Sechelt Elementary (24 spaces) and in SD 69 (Qualicum) at Errington Elementary (approx. 12 spaces).

- This seamless day pilot project is expected to provide government with valuable information to evaluate the model and to consider opportunities for scaling it provincially.
- The Canadian Union of Public Employees (CUPE) is campaigning for the integration of before- and after-school care into the school system using the seamless day model. See Attachment 1 for CUPE's Child Care Brief.

DISCUSSION:

- In August 2020, CUPE launched a public campaign promoting the seamless day in schools. It
 promotes direct grassroots engagement with school boards. For example, CUPE sent letters
 to school board trustees seeking their support. CUPE's campaign has started in advance of
 government's broader engagement with the sector. See Attachment 2.
- In February 2021, the BC Public School Employer's Association (BCPSEA) reached out to EDUC staff to discuss several questions that they had been fielding via CUPE related to child care on school grounds. A number of those questions centered on February 26, 2020 amendments to sections 85.1 85.4 of the School Act and subsequent Child Care Ministerial Order. Other questions pertained to the future state for child care in terms of the shared Ministers' mandate letters.

KEY MESSAGES:

- Over the coming year, I will be working with my colleagues to develop the transition strategy of integrating child care into the Ministry of Education in a thoughtful and effective way.
- To prepare for the move to the Education by 2023, we are ensuring school districts have the supports they need to increase capacity and play a stronger role in providing early care and learning services, including partnering with child care providers.
- We are committed to engaging with CUPE along with key stakeholders, rightsholders and
 partner groups, however, given the early days of this project and the need for further clarity
 on government's decisions and direction, it may be several months before an engagement
 strategy will be finalized.
- Consultation with district leadership and unions will be a priority to ensure we achieve this
 vision in the most seamless way possible, and we look forward to working with you in the
 months ahead.

Article 11 of the Support Staff Provincial Framework Agreement (PFA) states: "In support of the Province's Early Care and Learning (ECL) Plan, the parties will pursue collaborative opportunities for the K-12 sector to support effective transitions for care and learning from the early years to kindergarten e.g. before and after school care."

Welcome everyone and thank you for taking time out of your busy schedules to join us today. The Team and I are happy to have this opportunity to connect with you, share some updates and hear from you.

Budget 2021

The pandemic has shone a light on the fact that access to affordable, quality and inclusive child care is not simply good social policy, it's vital to B.C.'s economy. Through Budget 2021, more families will have access to affordable, quality, and inclusive child care. There were already scheduled increases for 2021/22 and 2022/23 for child care, and Budget 2021 is adding an additional \$233 million in base funding over three years. The base budget for child care in 2021/22 is now \$732 million; this includes \$54 million in new funding.

I would like to review a few of the highlights with you and give you an opportunity to share any questions you may have.

Health and Safety Grant

- Throughout the pandemic, child care providers have worked tirelessly to keep children, families, and staff safe.
- In December 2020, Health and Safety Grants were provided to nearly 4,500 child care providers including Prototype Sites.
- To support your continued important work, there will be an additional \$20 million under Budget 2021 in Health and Safety Grants to help ensure centres remain safe throughout the pandemic.
- These grants will help you cover the costs of additional health and safety equipment, enhanced cleaning procedures, or hiring additional staff to cover for staff who require temporary sick leave.
- The first Health and Safety Grants back in December 2020, were to help you with the initial costs you were facing due to the pandemic.

- Since that time, your enrolments have been steadily increasing as more families choose to re-enroll their children in child care since the onset of the pandemic.
- However, we know that some providers continue to struggle with increased costs due to the additional precautions required to operate safely in the pandemic.
- For that reason, there is additional funding under Budget 2021 to support those of you that may still need some support as you recover.
- We anticipate receiving more information on the HSG in the coming weeks and will share details with you as soon they become available.

Supported Child Development

- The Childcare BC 10-year plan for a universal and inclusive child care system ensures that system is welcoming to **all** children, including those with support needs.
- As you know Supported Child Development and Aboriginal Supported Child
 Development programs offer a range of consulting and support services to children,
 families, and child care centres, enabling children with support needs to participate in
 fully inclusive child care settings.
- Budget 2021 includes investments to help up to 2,000 more families access SCD and ASCD programs and increase the hours of support for children already enrolled to help ensure children with support needs can fully access, participate in and benefit from programming.
- There is still a long way to go to provide the inclusive child care families need—but progress is being made.

Aboriginal Head Start

- As you know, Aboriginal Head Start provides Indigenous-led, no-cost, culturally relevant, wrap-around early care and learning programs for Indigenous families.
- Like the Prototype Sites, Aboriginal Head Start also receives funding through ELCC Agreement, which created almost 650 Indigenous-led, no-cost child care spaces.
- Under Budget 2021, the Province is investing in ongoing funding to support an additional 400 Aboriginal Head Start child care spaces across the province.
- By increasing supports for Aboriginal Head Start programming, more Indigenous families will be able to access culturally relevant early learning and child care experiences.
- We are continuing to work with the federal government to continue to expand access to culturally responsive child care for Indigenous families.

Seamless Day Pilot – Ministry of Education

- The Seamless Day pilot program integrates before- and after-school care into the classroom, giving students a single location of care throughout the day.
- The initial Seamless Day pilot began in the Okanagan-Similkameen School District in 2018 and has since expanded to include four additional pilots in other school districts.
- Budget 2021 will expand the pilot program to an additional 20 schools across B.C.
- Through the pilot, children are supported throughout the day by an ECE, as well as by their teacher during regular classroom hours.

ECE Wage Enhancement

- To help child care providers pay their early childhood educators more without increasing parent fees the ECE wage enhancement will be doubled from the current \$2 and hour – bringing the total to \$4 an hour. Currently, we do not have details on the timelines.
- We know this program is of particular interest to you and your staff, so we commit to sharing the details of this initiative as soon as they become available

\$10aDay/Prototype Sites

- The item in the Budget that was most exciting for us to hear was the expanding of access to \$10-a-day child care. Budget 2021 increases the number of Universal Child Care Prototype Site spaces from about 2,500 to approximately 6,460.
- In the coming weeks we will be sharing further information regarding how the new \$10-a-day sites will be selected.
- We expect to announce the new locations for \$10-a-day child care this fall.
- If you saw the Federal Budget on April 19th, there was a substantial commitment to child care, so we are looking forward to working with our federal counterparts to further expand access to \$10-a-day child care.
- We are continuing to work closely with the Government of Canada to negotiate a new ELCC Agreement, which will help ensure the sustainability of these sites and we are also looking forward to more details about plans for a national child care strategy and how that can support our continued commitment to building a universal child care system here in B.C.

Prototype Same Site Space Inclusion

 The increase in spaces for \$10aDay child care in the Budget has also given an opportunity to allow for a limited number of spaces at current sites to be included in the program

- We are aware that during the life of the program some of your facilities have had some natural growth
- A Request for Information has gone out to Sites that identified on their renewal application that they had same site non-PT spaces so we can gather information on spaces that may be able to be added
- There are a limited number of spaces available for this phase and the spaces must be natural growth at the exact same location as your current PT spaces
- For those that received the Request for Information please complete the form and return before May 14th so the Team can begin to compile the information

Acknowledgment of COVID-19 Impacts

We also want to take a moment to acknowledge the continuing impacts of COVID-19 on your facilities, staff, and families

- Prototype Sites and their employees have been continuing to provide service in varying forms and methods during these challenging times to accommodate parents and children within the new health requirements
- Your sites were asked last summer to provide support for essential working parents
 requiring childcare during the pandemic, and then may have also been struggling to fill
 spaces due to changing work patterns in BC during COVID-19 which we know can be
 challenging and you are continuing to find ways to do this safely but we know exposures
 are still occurring
- This is of course, in addition to all the ways that COVID-19 has affected staff outside of work, in their personal lives, with parents, children and loved ones.
- We are very grateful for the services to the child care sector you continue to provide during these difficult and stressful times
- We would also like to ask that sites stay closely connected with their local Health Authorities in order to have support and Health Authority guidance as needed

- EDUC has not yet received confirmation on spaces from 4 school districts and used MCFD Provider Profile data in these cases
 - SD35 Langley
 - o SD68 Nanaimo-Ladysmith
 - o 072 Campbell River
 - 078 Fraser Cascade
- District staff provided information with varying levels of accuracy and confidence
 - Spaces varied dramatically from MCFD Provider Profile Survey
 - Some districts had difficulty understanding the licensing categories (reporting 0 spaces for whole categories of care despite MCFD's data indicating significantly more)
- District staff provided information in varying timeframes
 - o Immediately: staff had previously completed a district report on the topic, completed an annual review, or had no child care to report
 - o Quickly: staff called the few providers in the area and reported back
 - With support: staff were unsure who held the information, how to gather the information, and how to interpret the request

Opportunities:

- District staff expressed enthusiasm at the integration of child care into the broader learning environment and willingness to open child care with additional resources
- Boards who hold licenses for school age care were particularly challenged by the length, complexity, and redundancy of the licensing process
