

The Town of Sidney has recently learned that the District of Central Saanich wishes to conduct a community forum, involving the three Peninsula based municipalities, for the purpose of receiving feedback from the residents on how to best move forward with an amalgamation study. Prior to committing to any involvement in such a forum, the Town of Sidney is seeking a response and clarification from the Province as to what their expectations are, if any, from the Peninsula based municipalities along with the municipalities throughout the entire region regarding an amalgamation study or studies, and what approach the Province plans on taking with respect to funding and undertaking a study on the feasibility, costs and implications of amalgamation.

It is clear that the three Saanich Peninsula municipalities asked relatively similar questions, which garnered similar results from our respective electorates.

Should the District of Central Saanich petition the <u>Province to fund a cost/benefit analysis</u> of an amalgamation of Central Saanich, North Saanich and Sidney?

Yes: 3,588 (71%)

No: 1,489

While all three questions specified that the study was to be funded by the Province, each was silent on who would carry out the study. From the Town of Sidney's perspective, it would certainly impact the impartiality and credibility of an amalgamation study if the local governments themselves were to undertake it; nor do we have the expertise or the available resources to carry out such a study.

Accordingly, it is imperative that the Province provides a timely response to my request for clarity regarding the desired approach and process to be taken on the amalgamation study, so that the Town of Sidney can determine whether it is appropriate to collaborate with the District of Central Saanich and the District of North Saanich on the establishment of a set of Peninsula-specific terms of reference. To be clear, while we have no intention of carrying out the study ourselves, we are willing and eager to assist with an area-specific terms of reference for such a study.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor be directed to draft a letter to the Minister of Community, Sport and Cultural Development requesting that the District of Oak Bay be included in any meetings, discussions, or studies the Province may initiate regarding a governance review or amalgamation related to core Greater Victoria municipalities.

Some members of Council spoke in support of the motion, emphasizing that the intention of sending correspondence requesting participation meetings, discussions or studies regarding a governance review or amalgamation was to insure that the District of Oak Bay would be represented in any forthcoming studies.

A FRAMEWORK FOR COMMENT CAPITAL INTEGRATED SERVICES AND GOVERNANCE INITIATIVE

PURPOSE

Capital region citizens (through the 2014 referendum results) and local governments (through meetings with CSCD Ministers) have expressed a common interest in gathering facts about current service delivery, improving the understanding about service delivery best practices and exploring further the opportunities to better integrate service and governance.

The proposed Initiative will help facilitate a discussion among local governments in the Capital region toward identifying any potential opportunities to enhance the efficient delivery of service that citizens need. The Initiative will provide the opportunity for individual perspectives to be heard and may lay the groundwork for local governments to pursue options for greater integration of services and governance.

PRINCIPLES

Principles to guide the Initiative:

- Aim for efficiency there is only one taxpayer and it is the responsibility of all
 governments to ensure the most efficient and effective delivery of public services.
- Start with the facts a full understanding of current arrangements will be an important
 first step in positioning the region's local governments with respect to service and
 governance opportunities and challenges.
- Respect different views a structured conversation on governance and service
 integration provides a way for local governments to inform and hear from their public
 and key stakeholders, and enables <u>any</u> local government in the region to participate if
 they so choose.
- Supporting future choices the Initiative is not about reaching a specific, unilateral
 outcome; it is about understanding the opportunities for service and governance
 integration in order to help local governments make future choices.
- Collaboration is key success depends on local governments in the Capital area participating, being engaged and fully committed to this conversation with one another and with their citizens.

COMPONENTS OF AN APPROACH

Dear Minister Fassbender.

Thank you for meeting with the 13 mayors of Greater Victoria and sharing the resulting draft framework titled "Capital Integrated Services and Governance Initiative".

As mayor of the largest municipality in the Capital Region, and where the municipal ballot results were 88% in favour of local government reform, I appreciate the opportunity to comment on the approach outlined in the draft framework.

As mayors, we have a responsibility to demonstrate that we have heard the voices of people throughout the region, and any individual comments or suggestions otherwise by local elected officials undermines the potential benefit that can result from this initiative.

I trust my mayoral colleagues will agree that, despite the variety of referendum questions on the 2014 municipal ballot, there exists a strong groundswell of support among the electorate to examine local government services, and that it is imperative that we respond appropriately.

In that regard, it is important that we collectively recognize the extent to which our local residents have a sophisticated level of awareness and knowledge of local government services, or simply what's working and what's not working.

While it will be useful to identify and examine existing shared services (e.g. Greater Victoria Public Library), systemic problems in major service areas in our region must be frankly and openly acknowledged for this to be a fulsome and meaningful initiative.

Within that context, I offer the following comments:

- Consultation with the public and stakeholders must be organized by the Province through its facilitator/consultant, and not left to local councils.
- 2. The Province's consultant should play a proactive role rather than act as a mere facilitator, and she/he must be completely independent with no preconceived views on what form local government should take. For this reason, academics with clear published biases would be unacceptable to act as the consultant.
- All municipalities in the CRD must participate. Public opinion, various polls, and the referendum results all demand it.

- 4. The history of municipal cooperation or tack thereof, and the failure of the CRD Board to reach consensus on decisions that require compromise has resulted in the general public losing confidence in the ability of municipal leaders to put the interests of the entire region ahead of their own municipalities. How will the proposed "collaboration" and "continued conversations" differ from those stances adopted by local leaders in the past?
- 5. The role of the CRD and its effectiveness as a service provider in an environment of multiple municipalities must be included in the review. It is the "elephant in the room".
- 6. The timeline for completion of the study must be such that the electorate is able to vote on potential changes to local governance in a binding referendum on or before the 2018 municipal election. The electorate is expecting their referendum mandate to be acted upon; this is not an issue that will wane over time.

There is also an immediate need to communicate more information to the residents of Greater Victoria on the status of this initiative, as negative speculation tends to fill the void when other information is absent.

In closing, I am fully supportive of a governance review to commence as soon as possible, subject to my comments above, and thank you for the opportunity to review the draft framework.

Destination Marketing Implications of Greater Victoria Amalgamation Briefing:

Background:

 Please see the attached briefing note prepared for the Tourism Victoria Board of Directors meeting on January 30th, 2015.

The Tourism Victoria Board of Directors voted unanimously to support the amalgamation study
process, to support the principle of amalgamation and to work with partners to support placing
an moratorium on the creation of the new municipal/community Destination Marketing
Organizations while the municipal boundaries are under study.

Tourism Victoria supports the principle of alignment and efficiently in the Destination Marketing

system and partners with Destination BC on an ongoing basis.

The basic premise is that with such a small population base and lack of critical mass in
accommodation in each municipality, it does not make much business sense to create the
overhead to start marketing the "brand" of a municipality (e.g.- Colwood, North Saanich, Sidney,
etc.) when the boundaries of the municipalities are about to go under study.

Tourism Victoria will align with the process lead by the Province of British Columbia in terms of

geographic scope etc.

Next Steps:

 Initial briefing and discussion with Minister Yamamoto and staff to understand perspectives on the topic on February 10, 2015. Industry is keen to understand, if at an early conceptual level, how the amalgamation study will unfold.

There is long standing track record of many research studies which conclusively prove that
customers do not understand small artificially created place brands. Tourism Victoria will work
this summer to conduct a research study to conduct primary analysis of customers to the region
as to examine the degree to which they have unaided awareness of each municipality.

Tourism Victoria has already started to engage marketing partners and advocacy associations to

ensure there is broad support before proceeding too far. Initial responses:

Hotel Association of Greater Victoria: Already has a position supporting amalgamation. Believes that placing a moratorium on the creation of community DMOs in the Greater Victoria area while amalgamation is studied is a good idea.

Destination British Columbia: President & CEO Marsha Walden has been briefed and this
initial supportive e-mail response was received on February 3rd, 2015. "We are certainly
supportive of any efforts to reduce fragmentation and increase collaboration between
DMOs."

 Tourism Industry Association of British Columbia: Supportive in concept with initial discussions with Ian Robertson. Ian will work this issue up through his policy committees

and his Board of Directors promptly.

Hotel Association of British Columbia: Vancouver Island Board of Directors representatives are supportive. Meeting with James Chase in mid-February to discuss.

 Greater Victoria Chamber of Commerce: Supportive of one Destination Marketing Organization for the Greater Victoria region. Will run this issue through their Board of Directors quickly in order to signal support.

It is not expected that all conversations will be easy, but it respectful to go and discuss the merits of alignment and seek feedback and input.

In the fall of 2015, with broad support for a moratorium in place, the intention is to hold a
Greater Victoria tourism summit to discuss collaboration. We feel this work will help to create
some positive tension about working together and collaborating during the intervening period
while amalgamation is studied and prepared for municipal elections in 2014.

Request: As the Government of British Columbia considers its work on amalgamation, it ensure that that expected increased efficiency; alignment and impact of destination marketing in Greater Victoria are considered in the study. Furthermore, once sufficient primary research and industry support has been garnered, request that the Government of British Columbia use what levers it has at its disposal to place a moratorium on the creation of new Community Destination Marketing Organizations in the area being studied for amalgamation until the study is complete and voters in the Greater Victoria Region have exercised their democratic right to vote on the matter.
