Opioid guidelines

- Vancouver Coastal Health says it is developing a first-of-its-kind guideline as the health authority takes the lead in fighting opioid addictions.
- The guideline is aimed at improving physicians' knowledge of the many new treatments available for addiction to painkillers, in hopes of stemming the growing problem of fentanyl or other opioid overdoses.
- A health authority spokesman says doctors are advised to begin treatment with a range of new, less toxic opioid replacements before trying methadone, which is effective but has many side effects.
- The guideline also underlines the importance of recovery programs, recommending that initial treatment is not complete if follow-up care is absent.

Seniors care projections

RED FM - 3pm News

- Spending on seniors' health care across all provinces is projected to increase six fold by the year 2046.
- According to the latest finding from the Conference Board of Canada, that would be up to \$177b.
- VP of public policy Louis Theriault projects BC spending on seniors care will skyrocket from just over \$2b now to almost \$15b in three decades.
- The older seniors, the 85-plus, is growing more quickly in BC, which will make the overall growth in spending for seniors in BC among the fastest in Canada. In fact just Alberta is ahead.

Care home homicide

RED FM - 1pm, 2pm News

- For the third time in the past two years, the BC Coroner's Service has declared a death at an Interior seniors' facility a homicide.
- Eighty-four-year-old Emily Houston died on July 15, ten days after she was attacked by a fellow resident.

- Kamloops RCMP investigated but decided against charges.
- Houston's daughter, Nancy Bradley, says the woman who hit her mother was suffering from dementia, but that wasn't clear when she first got the bad call.
- Nancy Bradley: I was quite upset. I just thought she had fallen like they told me on the phone, that she fell because she wasn't using her walker. But when she told me right away when I saw her that this woman had actually punched her in the chest and then pushed her into this metal doorway, of course I was just beyond anger. I was furious.
- In August of 2013, 85-year-old Bill May was killed by his roommate in a Vernon residential care facility. Two months earlier, a resident-on-resident attack at the Overlander extended care facility in Kamloops resulted in the death of 79-year-old Jack Shippobotham.
- Bradley's calling on Kamloops Seniors Village and other care homes to increase their staff-to-resident ratios.

- The City of Vancouver's 2015 budget shows the VPD didn't fill 59 vacancies, in a bid to save money.
- The VPD's total budget is \$257 million.

Nurse shortage postpones surgeries

RED FM – 8am News RED FM – Harjinder Thind Show – 8:44am

- A shortage of about 30 operating room nurses at Vancouver General Hospital is being blamed for hundreds of surgery postponements over the next five months.
- A memo to hospital staff and surgeons says some operating rooms will close on a certain number of days each month, but the total number of postponed surgeries could be less than one per cent of the 30,000 cases performed each year.
- One per cent equates to 300 cases.
- The action means that patients scheduled or waiting for scheduled (non-emergency) operations, including such things as repair or removal of hernias, tonsils, thyroids, spines, skin, eyes, knees, shoulders, hips and gallbladders will have to wait longer.
- Vancouver Coastal Health spokeswoman Anna Marie D'Angelo says to minimize the number of postponements, we are relocating some VGH cases to UBC Hospital and some UBC cases to private surgery centres.
- She says there are 13 job postings for OR nurses at VGH but there are fewer postings than vacancies because it takes six months to train nurses for OR work.
- VCH refused to divulge what or how private clinics are paid.
- The host says on one hand the government is trying to shut down private clinics but at the same time it's paying private clinics for surgeries.
- According to the Canadian Institute for Health Information report, there were 1,307 nursing grads in 2013, compared with 1,534 in 2012.

BC Liberals' rule change protects staffers who destroy records

VICTORIA – Two days before last week's disclosure about deleted FOI emails on the Highway of Tears, the BC Liberals changed the rules to protect staff who destroy documents.

"It is very disturbing that minister's staff deleted information requested about missing women in British Columbia," said New Democrat leader <u>John Horgan</u>. "It strikes to the core of this government's integrity. Knowing that there are no criminal penalties for these actions is even more troubling."

Two days before the NDP revealed allegations by former executive assistant Tim Duncan that he had been directed to illegally destroy documents, the BC Liberals passed the new Information Management Act. Section 18 changes the law so that staff who improperly destroy documents will not face charges under the Offence Act.

"There are families in British Columbia looking for answers about their missing loved ones, and they want to know what action their government has taken," said local lawyer and Carrier Sekani Tribal Council Women's Advocate Mavis Erickson. "Where is the respect for people? If this was taken seriously, then breaking the rules would come with serious penalties."

"A government that removes penalties for hiding information is not trying to be open," said New Democrat FOI Spokesperson <u>Doug Routley</u>. "I spoke against this section in the legislature and tried to amend it. But the BC Liberals were apparently determined to take the teeth out of this law."

"Government's work should not be secret," said NDP democratic reform spokesperson <u>Gary Holman</u>. "As part of our democratic reform legislation, public servants would have a duty to document their actions and

decisions. It would also protect whistleblowers like Tim Duncan from the wrath of an embarrassed government."

 We recognize the public's desire to fully understand what took place in regard to the 2012 data breach and subsequent dismissals. That's why the matter was referred to the Ombudsperson for investigation.

- That investigation has begun, and given its broad scope, I expect all
 pertinent questions will be answered through that process on any
 issue the Ombudsperson feels is relevant to the matter at hand.
- As far as records management, it is an expectation that appropriate government documents and records be retained according to the appropriate retention schedule outlined in legislation.
- Government has asked David Loukidelis to advise government on how to address the recommendations from the most recent report of the Information and Privacy Commissioner, as well as FOI training for staff.
- We now need to let those processes unfold.

Secondary -- records already released:

- In fact a large number of documents have been made available through the FOI process and are publicly available online.
 - In total more than 40 packages of information comprising more than 4,500 pages have been released under FOI.
 - OF THIS NUMBER: 28 packages consisting of more than 2,000 pages are posted publicly on Open Information.

- For example, some of these packages may contain personal information, which cannot be posted online.
- In a review conducted last year, Ms McNeil reviewed thousands of pages of the records related to the investigation and termination process.
- Her review found that the documentation in the process didn't meet best practices from a labour relations and human resource management perspective and that better documentation is necessary. Government has addressed this finding to ensure the proper documentation of disciplinary decisions.
- The documents that Ms. McNeil reviewed, and a large volume of others, are being made available in their entirety to the Ombudsperson in support of the work he will undertake.
- Where we can make documents available through the FOI process, we have done so and will continue to do in accordance with the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act.

If asked why records have not been released already:

- We have released a large volume of records related to this matter already.
- I'm advised that government staff continue to process a substantial number of FOI requests – these are still underway.
- These are complex documents, reviewed by public servants to ensure government meets its obligations under the FOI Act.
- We understand the public's desire for clarity on this matter.
- The Ombudsperson has been tasked with a comprehensive review, with the full authority of his office.
- We are cooperating fully with that review.







Issue Alert - Terms of Reference for Loukidelis Review

In response to recommendations in Information and Privacy Commissioner Elizabeth Denham's recent report, David Loukidelis has agreed to advise government on how best to address them. Today, the terms of reference were made public.

Key Messages

- The focus of the work is to help government address the findings and recommendations dealing with records management.
- Mr. Loukidelis will provide the following services to Government:
 - Advice to Government in relation to records management and in particular the types of records that should be retained;
 - How best to improve records management training across the public service and political offices;
 - Identify how to implement an on-going process to review records management practices across government and ensure they are improved over time; and
 - Offer any additional recommendations or advice to government he deems appropriate in light of the Report's findings and recommendations.
- His advice and recommendations to government will be made public by December 15, 2015.
- The two recommendations that involve changes to existing legislation have been referred to the all-party Special Committee reviewing the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act.*
- Over the last five years government has responded to over 43,000 Freedom of Information requests.
- Government has retained almost one million boxes of records securely stored in its possession and every year an additional 40,000 boxes of records are created.
- Mr. Loukidelis will be paid up to \$50,000 for his work, plus expenses.

- Although BC Human Rights Tribunal has ruled in favour of Indo-Canadian veterinarians in a discrimination case, but the vets says it appears their governing body, the College of Veterinarians BC, is still bullying on them.
- A video recording has surfaced, showing the governing body didn't change its behaviour.
- It's has become a hot issue in the BC Legislature once again and Minister of Agriculture says he will do something in this case.
- Harry Bains, NDP MLA for Surrey Newton: (QP) This is the dithering and flip-flopping by this minister are the reasons why the college continues to engage in the same tactics that were found to be discriminatory. question to the minister is this. They have ignored the ruling of the tribunal. They have been ignoring the minister's direction. Tomorrow, if they try to ignore to do the right thing, to implement the tribunal's ruling.... What is the minister going to do to make sure that the laws of the land are enforced immediately?
- Norm Letnick, Minister of Agriculture: (QP) Indeed, if the member did his research properly, he would have found out that the complainant to the issue was getting support by the government through their lawyers that are appointed by government. So I ask the member to wait until tomorrow. Then, as all members of the House will see, we will do something if the college does not meet the decision of the Human Rights Tribunal.
- Indo-Canadian veterinarian Dr. Hakam Bhullar says now the ball is in the court of the BC government and only the government can solve the problem now.

- **Dr. Bhullar:** We have met with the College on the advice of the Minister after winning the case in the human rights tribunal on October 8. The college board members, on the one side trying to shake hand with us but at the same time they hired a top notch BC investigator against the Punjabi doctors to prepare another case against them. The investigator, Hudson Andrew, is pressurizing our former employees to give any statement against the Punjabi doctors and finally the doctors had a sting operation on the investigator. In the 55-minuite video, the investigator is using very abusive, racial and discriminatory language against the Indo-Canadian doctors. The HRT has delivered the ruling. It's crystal clear now and the minister of agriculture and minister of justice also have confirmed they agree to the decision. Now they want us again to sit with the racist body. We have started doubting if we are living in Canada of any other country. Not only the Punjabi doctors who are majority foreign trained, but the college is also discriminating with some of white doctors too.
- Bhullar says the college should be careful about practice standards and equipment the doctors have, not about how much they charge to their clients. He says not only the Punjabi doctors but many other doctors also charge fewer fees to clients and it's not an issue.
- Bhullar says they are hopeful that the minister will take an appropriate action against the college in the wake of racism.





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

News You Can Use: Increased Asset and Financial Gift Limits for People on Disability Assistance

Minister Stilwell was pleased today to announce significant changes to policies regarding assets and gifts for people receiving disability assistance in British Columbia. This change will remove more barriers to financial security for people on disability assistance.

Currently, people on Disability Assistance can have a maximum of \$5,000 in assets, or their assistance may be affected. As of December 1, 2015, that limit will be raised to \$100,000. For a couple or family where two people have the Persons With Disabilities designation, the asset limit will be raised from \$10,000 to \$200,000.

As well, Persons on disability assistance will be able to receive an inheritance or cash gifts without losing their assistance. The current policy only allows one-time cash gifts. The restrictions on the use of trust funds will also be eliminated.

These changes were requested during the Accessibility 2024 consultations, and government is responding in order to help people with disabilities save for the future.



CDRD Collaborating with University of Saskatchewan on a Blood Test to Diagnose Concussion

Testing of a protein biomarker that could contribute to a fast, effective and portable test for traumatic brain injuries, commonly known as concussions, is set to commence thanks to funding from the Centre for Drug Research and Development (CDRD) Saskatchewan Innovation Fund for research at the University of Saskatchewan (U of S).

"A meaningful, non-biased, and easy-to-use diagnostic tool is urgently needed," said Changiz Taghibiglou, the pharmacology researcher in the U of S College of Medicine who is leading the effort, together with collaborators from Harvard University and the University of Toronto. "This is true not only for mild traumatic brain injury, but also to guide treatment strategies in moderate and severe cases where current methods don't provide the physician with much guidance."

The test is based on protein biomarkers Taghibiglou's research team has identified as being closely associated with head trauma. Early studies indicate that high levels of one of these biomarkers, cellular prion protein (PrPC), show up in the blood soon after a concussion.

A test based on these biomarkers would detect a concussion early – perhaps even by paramedics at an accident scene or by a team physician on a sports field. This knowledge is critical, since patients can have few symptoms initially but still be at risk of dangerous complications or death if they don't receive proper treatment, or worse, get hit again before they are fully recovered.

"Saskatchewan has a rich history of innovation, and that history continues today, with advancements being made in energy, agriculture, and health care," Saskatchewan Minister Responsible for Innovation Jeremy Harrison said. "We are proud to support the CDRD Saskatchewan Innovation Fund that is investing in this important work, and look forward to many

more health and technology advancements that are to come."

Taghibiglou and his team have partnered with The Centre for Drug Research and Development (CDRD), Canada's national drug development and commercialization centre headquartered in Vancouver, BC. Together, they will put the new blood test through rigorous validation to see if results from the early research can be replicated.

"The prevalence of traumatic brain injury is underestimated in our society, yet generates huge direct costs to our healthcare system and long-term costs to patients and their families," said CDRD President and CEO Karimah Es Sabar. "We hope our work on this project will validate and expedite the research and make the blood test commercially available as soon as possible."

Innovation Saskatchewan, on behalf of the Government of Saskatchewan, is among the consortium of the province's leading innovation organizations that partnered with Canada's national Centre for Drug Research and Development (CDRD) to create a new \$2 million CDRD-Saskatchewan Innovation Fund. Other partners include the U of S College of Pharmacy and Nutrition, the Vaccine and Infectious Disease Organization – International Vaccine Centre (VIDO-InterVac) and Ag-West Bio Inc.

Taghibiglou's project, which will receive \$43,500, is the first to get backing through the fund, which supports development of health research innovations to the point where they can better attract investment to bring them to market and ultimately, help patients with new treatments.

- Premier Christy Clark and International Trade Minister Teresa Wat attended an event in Guangzhou to celebrate the 20th anniversary of sister-province relations between B.C. and Guangdong.
- Premier Clark also met with Guangdong Governor Zhu Xiaodan.
- (World Journal) Premier Clark and Premier Zhu released a joint-declaration on the 20th anniversary of sister-province relations between B.C. and Guangdong.
- They also signed an MOU on the cooperation on climate change and low carbon development.

Federal cabinet

Ming Pao A1-A6, Sing Tao A2/A4, World Journal A1/A2/B1

- Liberal Leader Justin Trudeau has been sworn in as Canada's 23rd prime minister by Gov. Gen. David Johnston.
- Three B.C. MPs have been appointed to the federal cabinet by Prime Minister Justin Trudeau today in Ottawa: Minister of Justice Jody Wilson-Raybould, from Vancouver Granville; Minister of Defence Harjit Sajjan, from Vancouver South; and Minister of Sport and Persons with Disabilities Carla Qualtrough, from Delta.
- There is no Chinese-Canadian MP appointed to the cabinet.
- (Ming Pao) British Columbia Premier Christy Clark is extending her congratulations to Prime Minister Justin Trudeau and his 30 cabinet ministers sworn-in this morning in Ottawa.
- In a release, Clark says she is pleased at B.C.'s strong representation on the front benches of the federal Liberal government, with three newly-elected Metro Vancouver MPs named to portfolios.
- Clark says she knows all three will be strong, passionate advocates for B.C.
- She says she is confident they will fight for provincial priorities such as a renewed Softwood Lumber Agreement, development of liquefied natural gas and the full inclusion of First Nations in the economy.
- The premier says she looks forward to working with Trudeau and his ministers to build a more prosperous country.
- (Sing Tao) Commentator Ken Tung says he's not surprised that no Chinese-Canadian MP is appointed to the cabinet.
- Tung says there's no Liberal MP in BC and although there are three in Ontario, but the competition there is fierce, adding experienced MP Arnold Chan is still recovering from cancer.

- Commentator K.K. Wan doesn't think it is racial discrimination that there's no Chinese in the new
 cabinet but he says it once again reflects the fact that Chinese-Canadians' voting rate has been low
 and they are not passionate in taking part in politics.
- (World Journal) Commentator B.C. Lee says it's a pity that there's no Chinese-Canadian MP appointed to the new cabinet.
- He says the number of Chinese-Canadians elected is relatively low, noting Chinese-Canadians should be encouraged to take part in politics so that more talents can be sent to Ottawa.

Massey Tunnel FOI Ming Pao A9, Sing Tao A8, World Journal B2

- Ian Robertson, a retired professional engineer, wanted to know how the government chose a bridge to replace the Massey Tunnel over the four other options that were on the table.
- Premier Christy Clark made the bridge announcement at the 2013 Union of B.C. Municipalities convention, but when Robertson filed a freedom of information request he was stunned with the response that "no records were located."
- Delta South MLA Vicki Huntington said she was also told there were "no records" after her office made an FOI request to the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure for ten years of records relating to the Massey Tunnel replacement project.
- There have to be provincial government records of conversations and various documents related to the multibillion-dollar Massey tunnel replacement project, says Richmond's mayor.
- Malcolm Brodie says common sense tells us that it's impossible that there are no documents in support of the proposal at various stages for the replacement to Massey Tunnel.
- (Sing Tao) MLA Vicki Huntington raised the issue in the legislature but Minister Amrik Virk avoided to answer the question directly.

Six B.C. issues await Trudeau Fairchild Radio News 8 am

- The Province asked local leaders for their assessments of Justin Trudeau's commitments to the West Coast.
- Trudeau promised to spend \$20 billion over the next 10 years on rapid transit, leading to hopes that long-delayed Metro Vancouver projects would finally get started.
- "It's a very discouraging situation," said Richmond Mayor Malcolm Brodie. "It's not a matter of federal or provincial commitments. It's a matter of how you raise the local government commitment."
- Richmond Mayor Malcolm Brodie read the party's 88-page platform closely and came away with a sense that housing is not at the forefront of their agenda.
- Brodie called social housing a "big worry." "Federal money is being reduced gradually. The pressure to provide additional funds should be raised," he said.
- Burnaby Mayor Derek Corrigan said providing low-cost housing is expensive, even for the federal government.
- Trudeau promised to legalize marijuana and regulate its use. Legalized marijuana is coming to Metro Vancouver, but indications are the concept will not be welcomed everywhere.

- Storefront sales of marijuana have never been permitted in Surrey, for instance, but in Vancouver they have been openly encouraged.
- Richmond Mayor Malcolm Brodie thinks there are reservations in his city.
- No matter what the local opinion is toward legalized pot, the law will have to be obeyed, said Burnaby Mayor Derek Corrigan.
- Trudeau promised to reopen the Kitsilano Coast Guard station.
- "Reopening the station is a dream come true, but we don't know the fate of the marine communication centres in B.C., which were also cut," said Sara Kalis Gilbert, daughter of the late Pieter Kalis, a longtime Coast Guard captain at Kitsilano.
- Trudeau said the country's energy approval process needs to be "based on science, facts and evidence and serve the public's interests."

Senior care cost World Journal B3

- The number of Canadian seniors requiring continuing care will rise by 71 per cent by 2026 and that will likely mean the provinces will face escalating costs to care for vulnerable people, according to a report from the Conference Board of Canada.
- The report suggests if the current level of continuing care is to be maintained, costs will rise from \$28.3 billion in 2011 to \$62.3 billion in 2026 and \$177.3 billion in 2046.
- As the baby boom generation ages, the number of people needing support could grow to 2.4 million in 2026 and 3.3 million in 2046. That will place great pressure on volunteer caregivers and greatly boost the demand for labour in the continuing care sector, the report says.
- The Conference Board recommends policymakers begin thinking ahead about the changes and begin innovating in the community care sector.

Foreign ownership debate World Journal B1

- UBC researcher Andy Yan released a study that looked at how many people with non-Anglicized Chinese names bought properties in three areas of the west side between September, 2014, and February, 2015, whether they got mortgages, and what they listed as their occupations.
- UBC law professor Margot Young said information about foreign capital is useful, but the ethnicity connected to that capital is not useful or relevant to Vancouver's problems with housing affordability.
- "It captures this discomfort some Canadians have with their Chinese neighbours. And there's a kind of hysteria, honestly, around the whole issue of housing prices."
- UBC geography professor David Ley has done extensive work in the city on the impact of "millionaire migrants" on Vancouver and its real estate, and he agrees.
- He said the circumstances in Vancouver make it seem like the issue is all about China. It makes him extra-cautious when writing about the situation.

Telus job cuts Fairchild Radio News 8 am, 10 am CHMB AM1320 News 9 am

- Wireless provider Telus Corp. is planning to reduce its workforce by 1,500 positions as it boosts dividend payments to shareholders.
- The Vancouver-based company said Thursday that the layoffs will save as much as \$125 million each year.
- At the same time, Telus told shareholders it would raise their dividend payments by 10 per cent, to 44 cents per share, starting in January.

Viaducts removal poll World Journal B2

- A new Insights West survey suggests that while one-third of residents support the demolition of the Georgia and Dunsmuir viaducts, 85 per cent are unsure the city will follow through with its promise to provide affordable housing in the area.
- About 70 per cent of those surveyed also believe the removal will increase traffic in the area, while 58
 per cent expect it will make it more difficult to get to BC Place Stadium.

Transit police now deployed to six major hubs in Metro Vancouver Sing Tao A8

- Transit Police spokesperson Anne Drennan says officers are now posted to six so-called "deployment hubs" along the Skytrain, Millennium and Canada lines.
- They're at Metrotown, Surrey Central, Waterfront, Bridgeport, Lougheed, Broadway and Commercial-Broadway.
- Drennan says officers are spread out throughout the entire system and it means officers can be centrally deployed and deployed more quickly, from these locations to incidents that happen within the area they're working in.
- There are 167 transit police officers in all.
- The Evergreen Line scheduled to open in fall 2016 but Drennan says there are no plans to hire more officers unless more cash comes in.

Airport intends to make expansion decision next year Ming Pao A10, Sing Tao A8, World Journal B3

The Vancouver International Airport terminal will reach full capacity in about five years, according to current projections, and officials say decisions in 2016 will play a big role in determining how the facilities are expanded to meet demand. The Vancouver Airport Authority said it will decide by the second quarter of 2016 how the passenger terminal will be expanded to increase its capacity from the current figure of 25 million passengers annually.

CAN THE NDP SAY YES?

Energy Minister Bill Bennett is calling on BC NDP leader John Horgan to keep his promise and reveal his energy scheme to create jobs now and in the future.

"When he was first elected leader, John Horgan said he would talk about the economy and jobs and that simply hasn't happened," says Bennett, the MLA for Kootenay East. "When the BC Liberals recently showed in the Legislature how vehemently the NDP opposes Site C, Mr. Horgan promised reporters he would unveil an energy plan. I'm fascinated to see it — as this party is on record against Site C, opposes independent power producers and is even against transmission lines. In the face of that negativity, I can't wait to see how the NDP will create an energy policy without actually saying yes to anything."

Bennett notes the NDP leader has been very successful in saying no, though.

"The Site C project, as it passes its 100th day of construction, will create 10,000 jobs and a decade of economic spinoffs for B.C. workers and businesses. It's never easy to say yes to economic development but we get elected to make positive decisions, to find ways to make projects work for the majority of people. Mr. Horgan has said in the past he supports the project but most recently says he does not. That's not the strong leadership B.C. needs," says Bennett.

Horgan also dismisses private renewable power from clean run of river, wind and solar technologies as "junk power" – even though the sector is now a \$50 billion industry.

And to top it off, he opposed the Northwest Transmission Line, which he characterized it as a "power line to nowhere". Without this nation-building project, the Red Chris mine would not be operating today with 350 workers and \$1 billion in investment and neither would Altagas have invested \$1 billion into their run of river projects that feed clean energy into the project. The Tahltan First Nation support this development because of the employment it has created for Tahltan and other people. To dismiss it as a power line to nowhere, shows just how out of touch Mr. Horgan is from working men and women.

"In just those three examples, the NDP has opposed 20,000 good-paying, community-building jobs," says Bennett. "These investments are important now for the jobs they create and for the jobs we will have by powering every part of the province."

"That's the difference between us and the NDP – we are prepared to make the difficult decisions and find ways to say yes for the benefit of the majority, while the NDP is constrained by their special interest internal politics and always end up saying no. So unless Horgan pulls a flip-flop on issues and goes against his caucus and his special interest lobbies, he will remain Dr. No when it comes to economic development," Bennett added.





Response below – let me know if anything else is needed.

->We are required to upgrade the mainframe early in the new year. Health believes CPIM will no longer function after the upgrade, and OCIO is working with Health to mitigate and migrate.

OCIO believes that there is a low risk that CPIM may fail after the upgrade. The low assessment is based on CPIM surviving several upgrades without incident. Also worthy of note the technology CPIM utilizes has been out of support for about 6 years. Low risk means that there exists a risk that CPIM may fail the upgrade.

Why/what are we upgrading in the mainframe? The mainframe Operating System that all applications depend upon is required to be at a current version to get support from IBM should issues arise. There dozens 3rd party software titles that are used on the mainframe – these all depend upon a current version of the operating system for their upgrades and again we can not obtain support for these titles unless they are current. Client applications then depend on a supported infrastructure to run their applications. Ontop of those dependencies security patches are made to current supported versions – in order to ensure security on this platform we need to remain current.

-> what won't work in CPIM?

We can only tell this once we upgrade....that being said we have made the offer to Health assist them to test CPIM in a non-production environment early in the new year to determine if we will have any issues with CPIM or not. Health is considering this offer – I would recommend we do perform the testing.

- > who's cost ?

All costs are Health's costs. It has been known for many years this was an issue and Health had previously struck a project to address this issue many years ago then shelved the project. I am not aware of the reasons for this.

Background: Reporter responding to our IB on National Technology Week (Nov. 1-7). Wants some more details.

Suggested Response:

* Technology is responsible for 6.5% of B.C.'s GDP. Everyone uses technology, so in a sense technology is responsible for 100% of GDP. In that context, what sort of companies are included in this figure, and/or how are you defining 'technology'? Is it just companies producing high-tech equipment, or??

- When calculating the overall 'Technology Industry' BC Stats uses the same guidelines as the federal government.
- This consists of a group of various types of occupations, businesses and activities listed under the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). For example:
 - o Radio, Television Broadcasting & Wireless Communications Equipment
 - Semiconductor and Other Electronic Components

- Software Publishers
- Environmental Consulting
- Aerospace Products and Parts
- Medical Equipment and Supplies
- The complete list includes about 40 different industry groupings the economic data from these groups are added together and that total equals approximately 6.5% of B.C.'s GDP.
- * Some of the most advanced next-generation quantum computers used by Google and NASA are designed and built in B.C. What sort of computers (and software too?) are developed and built in BC? How much of that is on Vancouver Island vs the mainland? Names of some of the companies? [Any photos?]
 - The world's most advanced commercial quantum computers are manufactured by D-Wave Systems, located in Burnaby.
 - A quantum computer is many times more powerful than a regular computer as it uses quantum bits which
 can have multiple values instead of the simple binary (on off) bits in traditional computers to make
 calculations.
 - It's like a jet engine versus a propeller engine for a plane.





- Nick Lang died in June after 5 days in government care while seeking treatment for a methanphetamine addiction.
- His father, Peter, says the review was highly inadequate.
- He says the person who did the review was a contractor and his paycheque depends on getting future contracts, so he's going to please whoever's signing his paycheque.
- Lang says he hopes an independent investigation will now take place to look into the circumstances of his son's death.
- He hopes a full-blown investigation by the province's Child and Youth Advocate, Mary Ellen Turpel-Lafond, can get to the bottom of his son's case.

Water restriction fines CHMB AM1320 News 8 am

- The water restrictions this summer across Metro Vancouver resulted in roughly 10,000 warnings and 1,500 fines.
- The fines varied among municipalities ranging from \$50 to \$500.
- The question now is, should the fines be bumped up next summer in hopes of better compliance.
- North Vancouver City Mayor Darrell Mussatto heads Metro's Utilities Committee and says at this point nothing is being ruled out.
- He says a better option might be having restrictions last longer by moving towards the earlier regulation dates in May and going longer into October.
- Mussatto says the public will have a chance for input before a final decision is made.

Funding for school upgrade Ming Pao A13

- Schools throughout the province are going to get revamped, updated and upgraded thanks to more than \$35 million in provincial funding, Education Minister Mike Bernier announced yesterday.
- Students, teachers and staff at schools throughout the province will benefit from a variety of improvements under the Province's Routine Capital Program.
- Announced in August as a \$20-million program, it was expanded with an extra \$15.3 million after districts brought forward a large number of projects where the life of the school could be extended.
- In total, 109 projects are being funded under the expanded Routine Capital Program. Projects were chosen based on need, priority and supporting student learning.

Hemlock Resort's \$1.5B all-season expansion plan gets approval World Journal B2

- A \$1.5 billion plan to create an all-season tourist destination at Hemlock Resort in the Fraser Valley has been approved by the B.C. government.
- The resort, north of Chilliwack, was bought in 2006 by the Langley-based Berezan Group, and the new five-phase plan is based on a collaboration between the developer, the province and the local Sts'ailes Band.
- The plan will see the resort's footprint increase from 350 hectares to more than 6,000 acres, and will see an additional 20,000 bed units and 23 lifts added over 60 years.
- The plan also includes waterfront development on Harrison Lake, to include a marina and a First Nations-themed village.
- Phase 1 will cost \$500 million and an estimated 1,153 full-time jobs will be created.

Nanaimo pot shops CHMB AM1320 News 10 am

- The Mounties in Nanaimo have ordered all four marijuana dispensaries to shut down in that city.
- In a letter that was posted on advocacy group Cannabis in Canada's website, the Mounties say the shops are operating illegally and have seven days to shut down, or else staff could face arrest.
- Matthew O'Donnell with the non-profit Phoenix Pain Management Society says RCMP are wasting taxpayers' money.
- O'Donnell says he and the other Nanaimo dispensary operators are meeting to figure out what to do next and fight the closures.
- So far no comment from Nanaimo RCMP.

 A Richmond man has been found guilty of the second degree murder of his mother and will return to BC Supreme Court in Vancouver next Friday for sentencing.

- Yuan Tang was originally charged with the first degree murder of Lian Jie Guo, after admitting to killing her with a hammer and stuffing her body in a suitcase before throwing it into the Fraser River in June of 2012.
- After eleven days of deliberations, the jury returned with the second degree conviction.
- Tang faces a minimum of 10 years behind bars before parole eligibility, but would have been sentenced to a mandatory 25 years in prison if he had been found guilty of the first degree murder charge.
- (Sing Tao) Richmond councillor Chak Au, who is also a mental health counsellor, says Tang's case
 indicates that the community should pay attention to the mental health issues of Chinese international
 students.
- Au says once the negative emotion built up is exploded, the consequence can be serious.

Hi Nick – as discussed, here is a summary of grants in lieu. Let us know regarding timing of provincial release.

The B.C. government will distribute approximately \$17.3 million in compensation for municipal property taxes to 56 communities around the province.

Grants-in-lieu of property taxes are distributed every November and reimburse municipalities for services that benefited government properties, such as municipally run sewers, roads and fire protection.

Grants are issued in accordance with the Municipal Aid Act and are payable on land owned by the provincial government such as courthouses, provincial government office buildings and warehouses.

Schools and hospitals are exempt from paying municipal property taxes and are not part of the grant-in-lieu calculation. Other provincial assets such as highways, forests, parks or land under the control, management or administration of a Crown corporation are also excluded from

compensation under the Act. BC Emergency Health Services is responsible for grants-in-lieu payments for ambulance stations.

Since 2002, the government of British Columbia has distributed more than \$237 million as grants-in-lieu to B.C. communities. A portion of the funds are paid by each community to its regional district, and both levels of local government use grants to help pay for local services.

This years' payment from the Ministry of Technology, Innovation and Citizens' Services is \$167,000 more than last year's total of \$17.1 million. The increase is attributed to a number of factors, including fluctuations based on property assessments as well as the sale and purchase of government properties around the province.



Hi Nick – as discussed, here is a summary of grants in lieu. Let us know regarding timing of provincial release.

The B.C. government will distribute approximately \$17.3 million in compensation for municipal property taxes to 56 communities around the province.

Grants-in-lieu of property taxes are distributed every November and reimburse municipalities for services that benefited government properties, such as municipally run sewers, roads and fire protection.

Grants are issued in accordance with the Municipal Aid Act and are payable on land owned by the provincial government such as courthouses, provincial government office buildings and warehouses.

Schools and hospitals are exempt from paying municipal property taxes and are not part of the grant-in-lieu calculation. Other provincial assets such as highways, forests, parks or land under the control, management or administration of a Crown corporation are also excluded from compensation under the Act. BC Emergency Health Services is responsible for grants-in-lieu payments for ambulance stations.

Since 2002, the government of British Columbia has distributed more than \$237 million as grants-in-lieu to B.C. communities. A portion of the funds are paid by each community to its regional district, and both levels of local government use grants to help pay for local services.

This years' payment from the Ministry of Technology, Innovation and Citizens' Services is \$167,000 more than last year's total of \$17.1 million. The increase is attributed to a number of factors, including fluctuations based on property assessments as well as the sale and purchase of government properties around the province.

Questions: What is the ministry's response to \$.22 call for better balance between the privacy rights of the deceased and the family's right to get info?

Suggested Response:

- The Ministry of Children and Family Development often deals with cases involving intensely
 personal information, and it is critical that we comply with the Freedom of Information and
 Protection of Privacy Act and the Child, Family, and Community Service Act to ensure we
 maintain the privacy of an individual's personal information.
- FOI requests are processed by trusted professional public servants, whose decisions and actions are guided by the Freedom of Information and Privacy Protection Act. Government strives to balance open government and personal privacy.
- If someone disagrees with a decision about the release of information, they can ask the Office
 of the Information and Privacy Commissioner to conduct a review of the decision to withhold
 information.
- The Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act is currently in a review cycle right now and we're confident the all-party special committee will work carefully to identify where the legislation can be updated. Once the committee's report is complete, Government will review the recommendations in an effort to continually improve the act.

Information we provided to Van Sun:

Section 5 of the Offence Act does not apply to the new Information Management Act.

- This is common legislative practice; most, if not all, BC legislation drafted in the last 20 years has excluded the application of section 5 of the Offence Act due to the sweeping and serious nature of the penalties.
- It is important to reinforce that this does not in any way remove other legal remedies the ability to discipline an individual who has knowingly removed or destroyed documents, including those subject to an FOI request.
- These actions include disciplinary sanctions, contractual penalties and, in extreme cases, criminal proceedings.

Additional background information:

• A 1985 Supreme Court of Canada ruling stated that it is unconstitutional to have a "no-fault offence" with a penalty of imprisonment, which in this context means that it wouldn't be appropriate to have every technical breach of the act be an offence that could result in such severe penalties.

Provided to reporter on Oct. 30/15

- On February 12, 2015, B.C. introduced new information management legislation to replace the 1936
 Document Disposal Act. The legislation received Royal Assent on May 28, 2015, and is scheduled to be brought into force in early 2016.
- The Information Management Act modernizes B.C.'s approach in a digital era and brings the Act to today's standards.
- The Information Management Act will:
 - Streamline approval processes for the retention and disposal of information.
 - Move government towards a digital-only storage environment.
 - Establish a Digital Archives to ensure the preservation of valuable government information and facilitate access by public (e.g., Open Data)
 - Establish a Chief Records Officer with authority to approve schedules governing the retention and disposal of government information, manage the digital archives and provide oversight.
 - Continue to govern the retention and disposal of court information as originally set out in the Document Disposal Act.
- Government consulted with the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner and strengthened the clarity and oversight of the new legislation.

Duty to Retain Records

The Information Management Act clarifies that information that documents key decisions as well as
information that documents or supports government's organization, policies, procedures, transactions and
operations must be retained in accordance with information schedules approved by the Chief Records
Officer.

 This will ensure that information is kept for an appropriate period of time for operational and accountability purposes and is available to the public, subject to limited exceptions, under freedom of information legislation.

Penalties

- There are no penalties in the Document Disposal Act.
- There have been no changes to the actions available to government in responding to the rare circumstance where an employee willfully disregards the requirements of the Act.
- These actions include disciplinary sanctions, contractual penalties and, in extreme cases, criminal proceedings.
- The new Information Management Act excludes coverage by section 5 of the Offence Act, which is common legislative practice. Most, if not all, legislation drafted in the last 20 years has excluded the application of the Offence Act.
- In the rare circumstance where an employee willfully disregards the requirements of the Act, government actions may include disciplinary sanctions, contractual penalties and, in extreme cases, criminal proceedings.





Hello Everyone,

I am pleased to attach a copy of the Capasiti report for your attention. We would appreciate keeping the report's contents internal within government.

The Premier's Technology Council (PTC) has been concerned for some time that the value of exports from BC's tech sector (cleantech, life sciences, software, hardware, telecoms, mobile devices, digital media and gaming) is being undercounted. In part this can happen because many of the tech sector's revenues come from software and services, which can be difficult to track.

To address this issue, the PTC commissioned research from Capasiti Consulting. Capasiti received information from 266 BC companies, representing 3% of the 9,000 tech sector companies in BC, 37% of the tech sector's employees and 20% of the sector's revenues.

The research shows that:

- BC's tech sector revenues are largely service driven, with 71% of total revenues coming from software and software services;
- Data from BC Stats shows that export revenues of the tech sector amounted to \$4.4 billion in 2013. However, the Capasiti research for the PTC indicates that tech sector export revenues range between \$7 billion and \$11.7 billion.
- Export revenues of \$11.7 billion amount to 55.7% of tech sector revenues, suggesting that BC's tech sector export performance is comparable to the 53% of export revenues enjoyed by all of BC's manufacturing businesses.

NDP op-ed by John Horgan: Premier Clark fails in her basic duty to public safety in Surrey World Journal B2 (November 8)

- Attempted murders, assaults, sexual assaults, robberies, even kidnappings no community should have to endure these kinds of horrific crimes. And yet this violence continues to rise in one of B.C.'s largest cities.
- The numbers released by the Surrey RCMP detachment earlier this month paint a grim picture a 40 per cent increase in violent crime over the previous year, including a near-tripling of attempted murders. By any reasonable measure, this a public safety crisis. The people of Surrey deserve the full attention and maximum effort of their government to stop this violence. Unfortunately, the response from Premier Christy Clark has been woefully inadequate. While the premier and her attorney general have been happy to drop in for photo opportunities, they have failed to take real action on the most urgent issue this region faces.
- I have repeatedly called on Premier Clark to act. She should immediately request that the RCMP redeploy its officers into Surrey to restore safety, set up a task force to address the city's gang violence, and finally deliver on the often-repeated, still-unfulfilled promise of putting 100 more officers on the streets.
- These are immediate steps that the premier could take today. But that's just a start. Ever since Julie Paskall's shocking murder outside Newton Arena, New Democrat MLAs in Surrey Sue Hammell, Harry Bains and Bruce Ralston have been working to develop a long-term solution to street violence in

- Surrey. We have worked in collaboration with educators, police, community leaders and other levels of government. It's called the Surrey Accord, and we continue to reach out to Premier Clark and her colleagues to support it.
- Clearly the first priority must be to increase the number of police officers on our streets. But we also need to address crime prevention, and make sure that families and teachers have the resources and supports they need to intervene if they see a young person heading down the wrong path.
- The provincial government needs to move aggressively back into the regulation of recovery houses. Many facilities do important work in addictions recovery. However, unscrupulous and predatory operators continue to cause problems for Surrey neighbourhoods.
- Surrey needs an affordable housing strategy and a mental health. Everyone in Surrey knows that gangs prey on people trapped in poverty, often with untreated mental health. Helping these people is not only the right thing to do, it's an essential part of ending street violence.
- Federal, provincial, and local governments must work together. We must give the police and the
 courts the resources they need, but we cannot ask law enforcement to deal with complex social
 problems alone. These challenges require resources, cooperation, and above all, political will.
- Keeping people safe is the first and most important duty of government, and it's clear that today,
 Premier Clark's government is failing the people of Surrey.

Chinatown gentrification Sing Tao A2, World Journal B1

- Community organizers in Vancouver's Downtown Eastside will go to battle this week over plans for a gleaming 12-storey rental building in the impoverished neighbourhood.
- Wall Financial Corp. has proposed a 172-unit rental development at 288 East Hastings St.
- It sits in the Oppenheimer District, where new zoning rules require 60 per cent of units to be social housing and the remainder secured market rentals.
- Architect Endall Elliot Associates' design would bring 104 units of nonmarket rental units to the neighbourhood, all micro-suites averaging 255 square feet in size.
- The building's six top floors would be market rentals ranging from 360 square-foot studios to 840 squarefoot two-bedroom units.
- But the Carnegie Community Action Project fears the development would only push low-income residents out of the neighbourhood and gentrify the area.
- CCAP's Jean Swanson, a veteran housing activist, said a requirement for only one-third of the non-market units to be rented at the \$375 shelter rate equating to 20 per cent of the overall number of units does little to help all those struggling on a \$610 welfare cheque.

- (Sing Tao) In an interview with Sing Tao Daily, King-mong Chan, an organizer with the Chinatown Concern Group of Carnegie Community Action Project, said the project is changing Chinatown to a more trendy kind of neighbourhood similar to Yaletown and Chinatown will lose its characteristics.
- But Willie Chan of the Vancouver Chinatown Merchants' Association said his group is supportive of the project, noting the new development will bring in more high quality residents and benefits Chinatown's economy.

E-cigarette World Journal B3

- The rising popularity of e-cigs and vaporizers has spawned a new industry in BC but now the government is moving in.
- Health Minister Terry Lake said they are trying to protect particularly young people and they are essentially treating these products like tobacco.
- In draft regulations, scheduled to come into effect early next year, the government has told the vapour shops they will no longer be allowed to demonstrate their products in their stores.
- It's a move that will drive many shops out of business, predicts Dylan Godfrey, founder and vicepresident of the B.C. Vapour Alliance.
- Godfrey is another former hard-core smoker. He said he tried everything to quit smoking but the only thing that worked for him was the vaporizer.
- He said the government's proposed regulations will hurt people like him instead of helping them.

TPP privacy concern Fairchild Radio News 8 am

- Opponents of the Trans-Pacific Partnership came out swinging on Thursday after the full text of the trade agreement, negotiated in secrecy over five years, was finally released.
- Intellectual property and protection of Canadians' private information emerged as issues of widespread concern, and drew demands for further study and public input before the deal is ushered through Parliament.
- The language in the e-commerce chapter "fuels uncertainty" over Canadians' privacy, says Michael Geist, a University of Ottawa law.

- This is according to Leo Knight, a former police officer and media commentator who runs the website
 Prime Time Crime.
- In a Thursday blog post, Knight wrote the suspension was the result of an investigation launched after Sadlemyer showed up at the party wearing a Guy Fawkes mask.

- David Laing, who lives on the eighth floor of the SRO, said the lift has broken down 25 times since August 3.
- He said he has filed a complaint with the Residential Tenancy Branch hoping he would get a compensation of \$5 a day.
- Sing Tao reporter called the landlord of Balmoral Hotel Prakash Sahota on Sunday. Sahota just said "the lift has not broken down" and then hung up.
- Vancouver councillor Geoff Meggs urges the provincial government to put in more funding to upgrade and repair SROs.

- Thursday, 700 of 2,000 calls to the Compass card service desk required fare adjustments, with most coming from one-or two-zone monthly pass holders who had been charged too much because they didn't tap out at the end of their trip.
- Over the course of this week, TransLink made 2,960 adjustments for people who failed to tap out, refunding a total of \$7,094.

Missing women Fairchild Radio News 8 am, 9 am

- Members of BC's coalition on missing and murdered indigenous women and girls have called a news conference in Vancouver this morning to criticize the province for dragging its feet.
- The coalition says the province has failed to implement recommendations from the Missing Women Commission of Inquiry.
- Members will also call on the newly-elected federal government to act quickly on a pledge to launch a
 national inquiry on missing women and the coalition will offer several recommendations about what it
 would like to see included in the national probe.
- The BC coalition includes family members and more than 35 advocacy and support organizations working in Vancouver's Downtown Eastside Vancouver and around Highway 16, the Highway of Tears, between Prince George and Prince Rupert.

B.C. documents on Highway of Tears open wounds as missing women inquiry looms Sing Tao A4, World Journal B2

- At least 18 women went missing or were murdered along Highway 16 and the adjacent Highways 97 and 5 since the 1970s. Most cases remain unsolved, though investigators don't believe a single killer is responsible.
- The sorrow deepened recently with a damning report over deleted Transportation Ministry emails about the highway and its missing.
- Transportation Minister Todd Stone has said he agrees with the opinions of some locals that a shuttle bus service along the route isn't practical.
- However, the Opposition New Democrats say recently released documents contradict Stone and highlight the concerns of local officials who say a bus service should be considered.
- Stone said his ministry is holding a transportation symposium in Smithers Nov. 24 to discuss practical, affordable and sustainable solutions for communities along Highway 16.
- Opposition New Democrat Jennifer Rice, whose North Coast riding includes a section of Highway 16, said she has not been invited to the symposium but plans to attend.

Information we provided to Van Sun:

- Section 5 of the Offence Act does not apply to the new Information Management Act.
- This is common legislative practice; most, if not all, BC legislation drafted in the last 20 years has excluded the application of section 5 of the Offence Act due to the sweeping and serious nature of the penalties.
- It is important to reinforce that this does not in any way remove other legal remedies the ability to discipline an individual who has knowingly removed or destroyed documents, including those subject to an FOI request.
- These actions include disciplinary sanctions, contractual penalties and, in extreme cases, criminal proceedings.

Additional background information:

A 1985 Supreme Court of Canada ruling stated that it is unconstitutional to have a "no-fault offence" with a
penalty of imprisonment, which in this context means that it wouldn't be appropriate to have every technical
breach of the act be an offence that could result in such severe penalties.

- The Information Management Act will:

- Streamline approval processes for the retention and disposal of information.
- Move government towards a digital-only storage environment.
- Establish a Digital Archives to ensure the preservation of valuable government information and facilitate access by public (e.g., Open Data)
- Establish a Chief Records Officer with authority to approve schedules governing the retention and disposal of government information, manage the digital archives and provide oversight.
- Continue to govern the retention and disposal of court information as originally set out in the Document Disposal Act.
- Government consulted with the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner and strengthened the clarity and oversight of the new legislation.

Duty to Retain Records

- The Information Management Act clarifies that information that documents key decisions as well as
 information that documents or supports government's organization, policies, procedures, transactions
 and operations must be retained in accordance with information schedules approved by the Chief
 Records Officer.
- This will ensure that information is kept for an appropriate period of time for operational and accountability purposes and is available to the public, subject to limited exceptions, under freedom of information legislation.

Penalties

- There are no penalties in the Document Disposal Act.
- There have been no changes to the actions available to government in responding to the rare circumstance where an employee willfully disregards the requirements of the Act.
- These actions include disciplinary sanctions, contractual penalties and, in extreme cases, criminal proceedings.
- The new Information Management Act excludes coverage by section 5 of the Offence Act, which is common legislative practice. Most, if not all, legislation drafted in the last 20 years has excluded the application of the Offence Act.

•	In the rare circumstance where an employee willfully disregards the requirements of the Act, government actions may include disciplinary sanctions, contractual penalties and, in extreme cases, criminal proceedings.

Hello Everyone,

I am pleased to attach a copy of the Capasiti report for your attention. We would appreciate keeping the report's contents internal within government.

The Premier's Technology Council (PTC) has been concerned for some time that the value of exports from BC's tech sector (cleantech, life sciences, software, hardware, telecoms, mobile devices, digital media and gaming) is being undercounted. In part this can happen because many of the tech sector's revenues come from software and services, which can be difficult to track.

To address this issue, the PTC commissioned research from Capasiti Consulting. Capasiti received information from 266 BC companies, representing 3% of the 9,000 tech sector companies in BC, 37% of the tech sector's employees and 20% of the sector's revenues.

The research shows that:

- BC's tech sector revenues are largely service driven, with 71% of total revenues coming from software and software services;
- Data from BC Stats shows that export revenues of the tech sector amounted to \$4.4 billion in 2013. However, the Capasiti research for the PTC indicates that tech sector export revenues range between \$7 billion and \$11.7 billion.
- Export revenues of \$11.7 billion amount to 55.7% of tech sector revenues, suggesting that BC's tech sector export performance is comparable to the 53% of export revenues enjoyed by all of BC's manufacturing businesses.

Suggested Response:

- * Technology is responsible for 6.5% of B.C.'s GDP. Everyone uses technology, so in a sense technology is responsible for 100% of GDP. 

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FOI (UPDATED)

- We recognize the public's desire to fully understand what took place in regard to the issue of the health firings. That's why the matter was referred to the Ombudsperson for investigation.
- That investigation has begun, and given its broad scope, I expect all
 pertinent questions will be answered through that process on any
 issue the Ombudsperson feels is relevant to the matter at hand.
- As far as records management, it is an expectation that appropriate government documents and records be retained according to the appropriate retention schedule outlined in legislation.
- Government has asked David Loukidelis to advise government on how to address the recommendations from the most recent report of the Information and Privacy Commissioner, as well as FOI training for staff.
- We now need to let those processes unfold.

Secondary:

- In fact a large number of documents have been made available through the FOI process and are publicly available online.
 - In total more than 40 packages of information comprising more than 4,500 pages have been released under FOI.
 - OF THIS NUMBER: 28 packages consisting of more than 2,000 pages are posted publicly on Open Information.
 - For example, some of these packages may contain personal information, which cannot be posted online.
- In a review conducted last year, Ms McNeil reviewed thousands of pages of the records related to the investigation and termination process.
- Her review found that the documentation in the process didn't meet best practices from a labour relations and human resource management perspective and that better documentation is necessary. Government has addressed this finding to ensure the proper documentation of disciplinary decisions.
- The documents that Ms. McNeil reviewed, and a large volume of others, are being made available in their entirety to the Ombudsperson in support of the work he will undertake.
- Where we can make documents available through the FOI process, we have done so and will continue to do in accordance with the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act.

If asked why records have not been released already:

- We have released a large volume of records related to this matter already.
- I'm advised that government staff continue to process a substantial number of FOI requests – these are still underway.
- These are complex documents, reviewed by public servants to ensure government meets its obligations under the FOI Act.

- · We understand the public's desire for clarity on this matter.
- The Ombudsperson has been tasked with a comprehensive review, with the full authority of his office.
- · We are cooperating fully with that review.

If asked if coroner wiped s.22 computer:

- My understanding is that the BC Coroners Service never had access to the contents of s.22 laptop in electronic format.
- The only content they reviewed was provided to them in hard copy by the police technological crime unit.
- Going further, I'm informed that neither the Coroners Service nor police deleted any material from the laptop at any point.
