We are now developing our plans for our renewal of the site. My understanding, and please correct me if I'm wrong, is the following:

- 1. Posting "no overnight camping" signage on the site and being consistent in our request to the Victoria Police Department to enforce this direction should suffice to prevent camping and a possible re-occurrence of a "Tent City".
- 2. If we install a playground on the site (this is under consideration and we are consulting with the neighbours) we could post signage restricting all use from "dusk-to-dawn" and this can be enforced following the same consistent direction mentioned above.
- 3. Experience suggests playgrounds are less likely to be used during the day by adults for drug use (and related activities) or loitering by adults
- 4. Victoria Police Department can provide us with advice during the design stage to improve security.

The initial surface testing in September identified contaminants (Lead, Meth, Benzene) at 21 surface locations. The Lead level exceeds commercial standards by a relatively small margin. The full extent of contamination is being measured and delineated through additional samples of the affected test pits. These soil tests were gathered on October 11th and are with the lab now.

We await results and a recommended remediation strategy from our Environmental Consultant. Normal course of business would be three- four weeks. We have requested expedited lab work and reporting from the consultant. I think we'll here back next week.

(2) I am also wanting to follow up and inquire if there has there been any further dialogue on the restoration/remediation of the site? YES Have you received any follow up/input from MoE? YES.

To our knowledge there has been no Industrial and Commercial Purposes and Activities (Schedule 2 Activities) which would trigger a requirement for a Contaminated Site Profile. Peggy Evans, Manager, Risk Assessment and Remediation, Ministry of Environment, could not specifically identify a source contaminant that may originate from the encampment which would be considered a Schedule 2 Activity. Thus we will be embarking on a voluntary site remediation. We have engaged Pinchon Environmental to provide professional engineering services. Peggy at MOE previously provided a list of

potential environmental contaminants which may be associated with drug labs, though we have not identified cause to suspect such activities during site dismantling. In summary, there are no conventional APEC's to focus on, aside from the former fire pit. All of which helps focus the scope on soil testing for contaminants in a few generally representative locations, and the fire pit in particular. The standards adhered to will likely be Commercial, though we will be curious to see how far from Agricultural Standards we are. I am uncertain as to what their stance is on the site. I would like to bring to your attention that if indeed the site is deemed contaminated, under the *Contaminated Site Regulation*, there are requirements for the Office of the Medical Health Officer (and thereby mine) to be notified and involved. We will be happy to share the test results with you as they become known. Thank you.

Hello Denis,

As promised, some considerations for Abell in their service moving forward... and also, being that the site is now secured by fencing and patrolled to prevent the public from accessing it, it may now be prudent to:

- 1. Place bait directly into the burrow openings;
- 2. Snap traps could now be used in conjunction with the bait;

- 3. Cutting back any underbrush (to ~18 inches) could alleviate further areas of harbourage;
- 4. I would advise the Courthouse ramp up their pest control service as the food & water source for the rats/mice has now been removed from the site. There is a strong likelihood that the pests will go farther afield to find food.
- 5. Additional traps and bait stations could be extremely useful. As well, as per Abell's direction, strategic placement of the traps is key.
- 6. While rat/mice burrows are clearly evident throughout the site. The area adjacent to the parking lot, in the rocks next to the stairwell off of Courtney street; to the north of the 'old' entryway off of Quadra (northeast corner), and in the southwest corner the openings are most prominent. Those areas could use extra care and attention;
- 7. Even though right now the aim is to eliminate as many pests as possible, it may be quite valuable to employ strong record keeping in Abell's reports (as they have been doing), i.e. how many have been caught, the amount of bait being consumed in the traps, specific advice and recommendations after each visit;
- 8. With that being said, ramping up frequency of their visits to really get at the problem is integral. It is hard to say if 1, 2, 3, times / week is the ideal frequency. I would advise gauging the frequency on the need for bait to be replenished. Being the site is recently vacated and time is of the essence, possibly every day or two days for the next few weeks would be wise.

I can say from my site visit on Tuesday it appears that there is an infestation of Roof rats, (possibly also Norway rats), and mice. HL demolition claimed to have also found deer mice, which are typically more associated with rural environments, however the point being the infestation is significant (and extra workplace care is needed). I hope the above is helpful. I think it extremely wise to wait for soil removal/remediation until the pest issue is dealt with (prior to disturbance of their nests).

I greatly appreciate the opportunity to provide these recommendations. Please do not hesitate to contact me if you have any questions about the above or I may offer further assistance.

To our knowledge there has been no Industrial and Commercial Purposes and Activities (Schedule 2 Activities) which would trigger a requirement for a Contaminated Site Profile. Peggy Evans, Manager, Risk Assessment and Remediation, Ministry of Environment, could not specifically identify a source contaminant that may originate from the encampment which would be considered a Schedule 2 Activity. Thus we will be embarking on a voluntary site remediation. We have engaged Pinchon Environmental to provide professional engineering services. Peggy at MOE previously provided a list of potential environmental contaminants which may be associated with drug labs, though we have not identified cause to suspect such activities during site dismantling. In summary, there are no conventional APEC's to focus on, aside from the former fire pit. All of which helps focus the scope on soil testing for contaminants in a few generally representative locations, and the fire pit in particular. The standards adhered to will likely be Commercial, though we will be curious to see how far from Agricultural Standards we are. I am uncertain as to what their stance is on the site. - 5. Additional traps and bait stations could be extremely useful. As well, as per Abell's direction, strategic placement of the traps is key.
- 6. While rat/mice burrows are clearly evident throughout the site. The area adjacent to the parking lot, in the rocks next to the stairwell off of Courtney street; to the north of the 'old' entryway off of Quadra (northeast corner), and in the southwest corner the openings are most prominent. Those areas could use extra care and attention;
- 7. Even though right now the aim is to eliminate as many pests as possible, it may be quite valuable to employ strong record keeping in Abell's reports (as they have been doing), i.e. how many have been caught, the amount of bait being consumed in the traps, specific advice and recommendations after each visit;
- 8. With that being said, ramping up frequency of their visits to really get at the problem is integral. It is hard to say if 1, 2, 3, times / week is the ideal frequency. I would advise gauging the frequency on the need for bait to be replenished. Being the site is recently vacated and time is of the essence, possibly every day or two days for the next few weeks would be wise.

I can say from my site visit on Tuesday it appears that there is an infestation of Roof rats, (possibly also Norway rats), and mice. HL demolition claimed to have also found deer mice, which are typically more associated with rural environments, however the point being the infestation is significant (and extra workplace care is needed). I hope the above is helpful. I think it extremely wise to wait for soil removal/remediation until the pest issue is dealt with (prior to disturbance of their nests).

I greatly appreciate the opportunity to provide these recommendations. Please do not hesitate to contact me if you have any questions about the above or I may offer further assistance.

My summary:

Examination of trees and their surrounding environment was performed by ISA Certified Arborists. This was done through a comprehensive visual assessment. All affected trees were rated by: tree species, size (diameter at breast height), critical root zone (c.r.z.), crown spread, tree health, structural condition, and relative tolerance to construction impact (i.e. soil removal).

Trees were also inspected for evidence of disease and pest infestations. The Arborists employed by the Province are local experts with understanding of local climatic conditions and environmental factors. The City of Victoria Arborist has also reviewed the site and approves of the proposed work.

Ultimately it is **the soil condition** that is driving the tree removal. The soil cannot be separated from the critical root zone of the impacted trees. The Crimson King Maples have a shallow root structure located in the top layer of soil which is contaminated and being removed. The other trees have deeper roots that give them a better chance of survival.

The work performed by the Arborists is summarized in the attached report (which I think can be released?).

The Arborists will remain engaged and onsite during excavations to ensure steps are taken to preserve the remaining trees.

Attached is a Preliminary Update and Cost Estimate. Within this document I've included the previous preliminary shallow sample results (summarized within the background section) as well as an up-to-date figure of the sample locations.

We expect the next round of results from the lab any minute. I can access their draft results online (which is how I know they are almost ready) and it appears that the lead and BTEX issues go away with depth at all but one location, which is great news. Based on these initial results I suspect that we will need to remove the first 0.5 metres (or 1.65 ft) across the Site. That being said I do not have access to the PAH results yet and they may still end up being a problem. Once we have the formal final results I will be able to be more precise with my recommendations and disposal options.

Hopefully you find this helpful. I will update you again the moment the results come in.

Yes a productive meeting. We were happy with the thoughts expressed by Pinchin. They feel that sampling the stockpiles will actually reduce the volume of soil that needs to be removed. For example, the Meth will naturally disperse during excavation.

We originally tested for a laundry list of potential substances. Initial results indicate 4 substances of concern. We're having further digging/testing done next week to determine the depth of contamination. Then we'll get a plan on how to remediate, which will likely include some soil removal, plan to be received in 2-3 weeks.

Methamphetamine was found in two small spots, which will be removed, but no other illicit drugs.

Human poop, though present, will naturally degrade and is not a substance requiring remediation (consider it compost). For more details, please see below.

Good morning everyone. Pinchin West as per below has provided preliminary findings on the samples taken in 6 locations. They are right now working on an Exposure Control Plan and will also forward lab resulting and findings and analytical tables detailing exact levels.
But, as per below you can see that we have lead in the soil – leachable levels which means it has to be sent to Alberta for proper waste. – more on that to come once we have exact levels.
We also have methamphetamines/human feces/urine/gasoline/propane and other normally seen contaminants. With the methamphetamines it means again that we have to ensure we have a nailed down Exposure Control Plan on all of the proper waste procedures – again we will know more once we get the exact levels.
I wanted everyone to see this right now so we all understand the issues ahead of us. If we have to ship to Alberta – based on levels – this is extremely expense but we must ensure proper procedure.
Stay tuned I will follow up with the complete lab results.

As discussed the preliminary results have indicated that there are several problems with the soil on-Site as follows:

- Lead exceedances of the applicable Contaminated Site Regulation (CSR) commercial land use (CL) standard in a majority (15/21) of the samples;
- Benzene exceedances of the CSR CL standard in two samples;
- Polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbon exceedances of the CSR Urban Park (PL) standard in eleven samples
- Elevated E.coli and fecal coliform concentrations in several samples; and
- Detectable concentrations of methamphetamine in two of the samples.

As mentioned we are actively developing a health and safety plan to address the concerns mentioned above as well as recommendations with regards to disposal options for the soil. Feel free to let me know if you have any follow-up questions regarding these preliminary findings. I will be in touch shortly with more details including figures and analytical tables.

How much soil is being removed (or how much has been removed to date)?

- A majority of the soil has been removed from the Victoria Courthouse site and we expect any
 remaining soil will be removed by the end of this week.
- It's estimated that about 120 dump truck loads of soil has been removed (2,000 lbs).

What is the remediation estimated to cost?

 We estimate that the remediation will cost approximately \$350,000, however, we won't know for certain until remediation is completed.

Why there is a need to do the remediation?

- The testing of soil samples determined the presence of residual contaminants, including lead, gasoline, diesel and trace amounts of methamphetamines, following the existence of a homeless camp.
- Soil remediation will remove these contaminants from the ground and restore the landscape into a safe public space and playground for everyone to enjoy.

Where is the soil is being treated?

- The Ministry of Technology, Innovation and Citizens' Services has contracted the services of Pinchin, one of Canada's largest environmental, engineering, health and safety consulting firms.
- Pinchin has subcontracted Tervita to remove and dispose of the soil appropriately; it will be taken to Tervita's Highwest facility in the District of Highlands.
- Tervita is certified by the Ministry of Environment and satisfies the requirements set out by both the Province and the Capital Regional District.

I think there are a few KM's directly related to soil remediation that we'd want to stick to:

- We want to have complete confidence that the site is safe for everyone and removing the contaminated dirt is the only way.
- Testing of soil samples determined several contaminants, including lead, gasoline, diesel and trace amounts of methamphetamines.
- As a result of these findings, the top 1.5 feet of soil will be removed and disposed of through appropriate waste disposal facilities.
- New soil will be brought in following.
- Budget cost for soil removal is in the range of \$350,000
- The soil remediation could take several weeks, depending on what is unearthed (dinosaur bones)
- The Ministry has retained the services of Pinchin, one of Canada's largest environmental, engineering, health and safety consulting firms.
- Pinchin and its subcontracts will be responsible for removing and disposing of the soil appropriately.

If the media want more specific details about the testing methodology, lab work, findings, rationale, etc. we can provide. It gets rather technical at this point. I might start with:

- The Environmental Consultant (Pinchin) conducted testing for a wide array (hundreds) of potential contaminants
- 28 hand samples were gathered from potential areas of concern
- The soil quality was assessed based on the BC Ministry of Environment Contaminated Sites Regulation (CSR) standards for commercial land use (CL) and urban park land use (PL)
 - This high standard of cleanliness helps protect soil invertebrate, plants and groundwater used for drinking water (well water)
- Initial samples identified five primary contaminants of concern (lead, benzene, zinc, polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons, and methamphetamine)
- Subsequently, 7 deeper test pits (3m) were used to better characterize the extent of contamination and soil conditions. These test pits were successful in establishing vertical delineation of contaminants
- The overall site characterization suggests
 - presence of low levels of lead across the majority of site at a shallow depth
 - o presence of low levels of benzene, PAH's and Zinc at a few isolated locations
 - o presence of methamphetamine in one location
- Soil stockpiling and removal will separate the most contaminated soil from the least
 - Each soil stockpile is tested to confirm appropriate disposal facility
 - o This saves money and adheres to regulations
- In the majority of the site, there is no clear separation between contaminated soil and tree roots

- The Arborist has confirmed that for 9 specific trees, removal of soil in the critical root zone will irreparably harm these trees
- To leave these 9 trees standing would create a public risk in the likely scenario that the trees die

If they want more detail beyond the above, we could turn to Peggy Evans at the Ministry of Environment, or we could release the Pinchin report.

To this end, she does support testing for *E. coli, fecal coliforms, total coliforms;*. However, she was ambivalent about testing for recreational drugs in the soil, due to a lack of case experience and no available papers or studies on this topic. Jade was unable to cite any examples of recreational drugs contaminating soil and becoming a public health risk.

I think we should test for the full gamut of substances proposed by Pinchin, even though we have no clear direction on the recreational drug subset from either governing body (VIHA or MOE). Does anyone else on the team have a comment about this approach?

Here's the complete list of substances:

Benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene, xylene (BTEX), butanone, ethyl ether, acetic and formic acid, chloroform and dichloromethane, Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs), light extractable petroleum hydrocarbons (LEPH), heavy extractable petroleum hydrocarbons (HEPH), volatile petroleum hydrocarbons (VPH), polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), metals, acetone, ammonia, ether, pH, iodine, methanol, pseudoephedrine, phosphorous, amphetamine, cocaine, heroin, LSD, MDMA, methamphetamine, E. coli, fecal coliforms, total coliforms, and a partridge in a pear tree.

Hi Nikki

I have tried to connect with Jade Yahia and await her response, regarding the health concerns. Testing for recreational drugs may or may not be requested by VIHA. These substances are not covered under the MOE Contaminated Site Regulation or Hazardous Materials Regulation (Sharps are covered under Biomedical waste in the Hazardous Materials Regulation). Whether Recreational Drugs & chemicals are environmentally persistent or dissipate is an important consideration, and I remember Jade had some insight.

Peggy Evans at MOE specified testing for: "Benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene, xylene (BTEX), Volatile Petroleum Hydrocarbons (VPH), and Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs) including acetone, butanone, ethanol, ethyl ether and methanol, acetic and formic acid, ammonia, chloroform and dichloromethane." The bolded substances appear to be missing from the proposal.

I note that Pinchin specifies testing for: "(VOCs), light extractable petroleum hydrocarbons (LEPH), heavy extractable petroleum hydrocarbons (HEPH), volatile petroleum hydrocarbons (VPH), polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), metals, acetone, ammonia, ether, pH, iodine, methanol, pseudoephedrine, phosphorous, amphetamine, cocaine, heroin, LSD, MDMA, methamphetamine, E. coli, fecal coliforms, total coliforms;" We should have VIHA's opinion on testing for these last 11 substances before proceeding.

Additionally, these proposals often specify what level of staff conducts the work and specifies their charge out rate. For example, a EIT or Technologist might be charged out at \$100/hr while a P.Eng would be \$250/hr. This starts to matter if the testing scope increases (a common occurrence in remediation projects). We end up being billed P.Eng rates while the EIT does all the work. I'd like to see the charge out rates specified.

Dear Neighbour of the Victoria Courthouse:

Beginning January 13, if you find yourself near the lawn at Victoria's courthouse, you will notice that remediation work is underway to transform the space into a new playground.

A playground emerged as the most popular choice for the block wide site during discussions with neighbours. Remediation work will remove contaminated soil and begin the process of creating a safe public space and playground.

The testing of soil samples determined the presence of residual contaminants, including lead, gasoline, diesel and trace amounts of methamphetamines, following the existence of a homeless camp. Soil remediation will remove these contaminants from the ground and restore the landscape into a safe public space and playground for everyone to enjoy.

Two arborists have been involved in reviewing the condition of the landscape and the trees on the site and surrounding area. Of the 20 trees at the courthouse site, 11 are healthy and will be preserved. Every effort will be made to preserve as many of the established trees as is safe.

Nine trees have been identified as having shallow roots making them unsafe and unlikely to survive the soil remediation. These include seven Norway Maples, one Tree of Heaven and one Rubinia. These trees will be removed and new trees will be planted to improve sightlines and increase public safety. Crime prevention through environmental design approach will be taken.

Transformation of the site is still in the early planning stages. The remediation work is expected to be completed in February. As part of the remediation, tree removal will begin first. The most vulnerable trees will be cut down, chipped and cut into manageable sizes for removal. After that work is done, the top 1.5 feet of soil will be dug up, removed by truck and replaced with new top soil. Every consideration has been made to minimize the noise for the neighbouring area; however, there will be considerable noise on Friday and Saturday, January 13-14, to allow for the on-site cutting and chipping.

A finalized redevelopment plan will also be completed in the coming weeks. The public space and playground is scheduled to be ready for use by spring.

Hi Jade and Nikki

I spoke with Peggy Evans at MOE yesterday. She will be providing me with a list of potential contaminants commonly associated with drug labs. If there is any discovery of areas at tent city that have potentially been used for drug production, then we would have an obligation to test for these specified contaminants.

In Peggy's expert opinion, it is unlikely that the site would be subject to contamination by other substances of significance. That said, as a precautionary measure, it is recommended that the Province conduct limited soil testing in areas such as the fire pit. Dependent on the outcomes of soil samples and the delineation of affected areas, there may or may not be a need to remediate soils. Peggy thinks it unlikely that 30cm of soil be removed from the entire site and disposed in a controlled facility. Rather, there may be a need to dispose of smaller affected areas. Ultimately an Environmental Engineering firm will need to be engaged.

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Questions and Answers

Victoria Courthouse Park Remediation

October 27, 2016

1. What is being announced today?

- Design plans are underway to transform the Victoria courthouse site into a new playground that will enhance family fun in Victoria's downtown core.
- A playground on the site emerged as the most popular choice during discussions with neighbours.
- The playground will be accessible to children of all ages and abilities.
- The site will also include components geared towards adults and seniors, including chess tables, benches and tai chi exercise equipment.

2. Is the remediation of the site complete?

- Removal of garbage and rodent control are complete and soil collection and testing are underway.
- A finalized remediation and redevelopment plan is expected in the coming weeks.
- Lawn, pathways, benches and play structures are being designed cohesively, with every effort being made to retain existing trees.

3. What contaminants did you find in the soil?

- Testing of soil samples identified residual contaminants, including benzene, lead and hydrocarbons consistent with minor gas spills and trace amounts of methamphetamines.
- A finalized remediation and redevelopment plan is expected in the coming weeks.
 Ultimately the contaminants will be removed and the landscape restored to a welcoming public space.

4. Who will be removing the soil?

- The Ministry has retained the services of Pinchin West to provide environmental engineering oversight and recommendations.
- Pinchin and its subcontractors will be responsible for removing and disposing of the soil appropriately.

5. What can you tell me about pest control on the site?

- Pest control is complete with good results.
- The rat population appears to be eradicated, allowing us to move into the remediation phase.

If asked if there are still rats on the site:

- We haven't seen any rats since September, which tells us that their eradication has been a
- It's important to keep in mind that rats exist all over downtown Victoria and will never be completely eradicated.

6. Who was consulted on building a playground on the site?

- Four separate discussions were held with various neighbours of the site.
- Discussions have also been held with the YMCA, the Christ Church Cathedral and the Christ Church Cathedral School.
- There was overwhelming agreement to use the site for a playground.
- In addition, ministry staff will seek design input from students who attend schools in the neighbourhood.

If asked which schools will be consulted:

 The schools likely to be consulted include: South Park Elementary, Sir James Douglas Elementary, George Jay Elementary, Central Middle School and Christ Church Cathedral School

7. How is the playground being funded?

• My ministry will be funding the playground.

8. How much will it cost to build the playground?

- The design of the playground is still in early stages, and final costs have not yet been determined.
- My ministry is continuing design discussions with the community, including students who attend schools in the neighbourhood.
- These discussions will help finalize the design, and therefore the cost, of the playground.
- My ministry will be funding the playground.

9. Is a courthouse really the best place for a playground?

- The courthouse site is in a nice centralized downtown location surrounded by a neighbourhood, schools, and a community YMCA.
- This playground will create a play space for families in the city centre that doesn't already exist.
- We are working with the Victoria Police Department to ensure the playground is designed with security in mind – with clear sightlines and good lighting.
- There are many courthouses in the province that are near community facilities and we are confident in the security mechanisms in place at the courthouse.

10. Who will be responsible for maintaining the property?

My ministry will retain ownership of the site.

If pressed:

Maintenance of the property is in discussion with the City of Victoria.

11. Can you give me a timeline on when all of this stuff will be done – remediation and construction of the playground?

• The remediation and construction of the playground is expected to be complete by Spring 2017.

- By the end of November, we expect consultations on the playground to be complete and the final design to be approved.
- By the end of January, we expect site remediation and off-site construction of the play structure to be complete.
- By the end of February, we expect the site to be finalized.

12. What other uses were suggested for the site?

- There was overwhelming agreement to use the site for a playground.
- A few other suggestions included returning the space to a lawn, or paving the space to create a parking lot.

13. Why not just return the space to its former state?

- The courthouse site is in a nice centralized downtown location surrounded by a neighbourhood, schools, and a community YMCA.
- This playground will create a play space for families in the city centre that doesn't already
 exist.
- It will also bring vitality and energy to the site, and a playground was deemed the best way to encourage mixed use.

14. Will the homeless be able to camp there?

- No, there will be no overnight camping allowed on the site.
- The city of Victoria has a bylaw against overnight camping in playgrounds.
- In addition, the playground will be closed from dusk until dawn, with signage stating this.

15. Did you choose a playground to keep the homeless away?

- Discussions with neighbours showed that there was overwhelming interest in turning the space into a playground.
- The courthouse site is in a nice centralized downtown location surrounded by a neighbourhood, schools, and a community YMCA.
- This playground will create a play space for families in the city centre that doesn't already exist.
- It will also bring vitality and energy to the site, and a playground was deemed the best way to encourage mixed use.

16. Why not build social housing for the homeless in this space?

- Just last week, Premier Clark announced a \$45 million provincial investment in 500 new units of affordable housing in Victoria for individuals, seniors and families.
- We can generate more housing by reusing existing buildings for this purpose. We can also generate housing more quickly when we reuse existing buildings. That's what we did though the purchase of the former Central Care Home and the former Super 8 hotel.
- Since November 2015, the Province has invested approximately \$26 million to create more than 400 new units of shelter and transitional housing (includes 51 units at the former Super 8 hotel, which has not yet opened).
- That's in addition to the \$13 million that was provided in the community last year to support close to 990 housing units for the homeless.

17. Will you be dedicating the site to the homeless?

- This site has been used as a park for many years and is now being transformed into an amenity that offers enjoyment to all segments of society, including the homeless.
- We support an approach that is inclusive.

18. Will you consider putting a plaque on the site to commemorate the homeless that lived there?

- We always look to support those who are homeless through providing housing and services.
- Housing was provided for all of the homeless that were living on the site.
- In addition, just last week, Premier Clark announced a \$45 million provincial investment in 500 new units of affordable housing in Victoria for individuals, seniors and families.

19. How much money has the Province spent on this site since the homeless camp went up?

- In addition to providing housing, provincial costs associated with managing the
 encampment site were allocated for things such as security, garbage collection, port-apotties and upkeep, fire extinguishers, gravel, water hookup/service, power pole
 installation, BC Hydro service, fencing and site demolition. These costs totalled
 approximately \$1.3 million between December 2015 and October 2016.
- In 2015/16, the B.C. government spent close to \$5 million to provide housing and shelter for residents of the Victoria courthouse encampment.
- In 2016/17, the Province will spend approximately \$27 million in Victoria, which includes capital costs for the Central Care Home, as well as the Super 8 hotel, scheduled to open in late fall. This includes \$373,000 to PHS Community Services for support and outreach services at the encampment site between April and August 2016.
