The authority to identify and destroy transitory records is delegated to government employees under the transitory records schedule. The routine destruction of transitory records is necessary to reduce the volume of government records and the cost of managing records.” (Elizabeth Denham, Oct 22, 2015)
- “In the course of this investigation, we uncovered negligent searches for records, a failure to keep adequate email records, a failure to document searches, and the willful destruction of records responsive to an access request. Taken together, these practices threaten the integrity of access to information in British Columbia.” (OIPC News Release, Oct. 22, 2015)
