Hi Okenge Yumamorisho, and whoever else receives this,

The previous email (forwarded copy below) stated (in part):

"3) City of Vancouver voters should be asked (via plebiscite) whether they prefer:

*"a) A "Bus Rapid Transit" system (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Bus_rapid_transit) to be deployed (extending the Millennium Line SkyTrain line westward from **Broadway and Clarke** all the way to UBC), and which would be much cheaper to build than a subway."*

It should have read:

"3) City of Vancouver voters should be asked (via plebiscite) whether they prefer:

*"a) A "Bus Rapid Transit" system (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Bus_rapid_transit) to be deployed (extending the Millennium Line SkyTrain line westward from **Broadway and Commercial** all the way to UBC), and which would be much cheaper to build than a subway;"*

Time is running out for both the BC govt, and for individual Metro Vancouver member cities, to plan for putting plebiscite questions before cities' voters as part of the province's upcoming (October-2018) municipal elections...

Whether city of Vancouver voters are or are not provided a plebiscite avenue (during the upcoming municipal elections) to express their views re 3a, above, in my opinion it would be in the public interest for all decisions regarding the proposed \$3 million+ dollars Millennium Line SkyTrain Extension (aka "Broadway Subway") to be deferred until after there has been a 2-year (or longer) trial of a "Bus Rapid Transit" system westward from **Broadway and Commercial** (in the city of Vancouver) all the way to UBC...

Such a BRT system could be up and running in a matter of months, for a small fraction of the costs of Translink's proposed "Broadway Subway"...

All that would be required for a 2-year BRT trial (in city of Vancouver) is a very small amount of dispassionate political effort by municipal and BC govt politicians...

BRT worked well along the city of Richmond's Number 3 Road in the early 2000s, previous to its replacement with the under-built, lacking in capacity Canada Line...

Done right, and with sufficient pragmatic ambition- and open, transparent public communications- city of Vancouver BRT would act to ensure that planning for new and expanded commuter rail lines in Metro Vancouver is done competently, and based on current and future (projected) needs, instead of being driven by political agendas of some civic politicians (a few of which are not running for re-election this year)...

Related to the above, and previous-today email's SOF commuter rail projects issues-

As stated in previous emails, in my opinion the BC govt should publicly commit to moving the BNSF rail route off of the South Surrey/White Rock waterfront areas within 2 years- And, within 60-days from today... establish a partnership with the cities of Surrey and White Rock to plan for and conduct the (proposed) study to identify BNSF rail route re-location options;

If the above recommendation was adopted, in my view the BC Govt should simultaneously publicly commit to conducting a feasibility study of building a bi-directional heavy rail* commuter rail line (rapid transit) from South Surrey (perhaps from the *South Surrey Park and Ride*) to the city of Richmond- to terminate at one of the city's *Canada Line* rapid transit stations;
