Dear Brian Jonker,

We are sorry for the late response.

On April 28, we sent out the email to BC certified teachers to sign their resignation report so that we are able to report their final tax and the National Pension Service in Korea.

We were waiting their sign on their resignation report until May 2nd, but no one stopped by the school and no one signed their resignation report.

It causes many tax issues if we don't report the teacher's resignation to the Tax Service Center and the National Pension Service before they leave.

That is the reason we couldn't send out their salary and flight ticket on May 2nd before we calculate their tax and the national pension in a right way.

Thus, our account manager contacted the tax officer, Bank officer, and the National Pension Service officer to make it a right calculation even teachers didn't turn in their resignation report. Our account manager met and explained them our situation and received their approval to send out their May, June, and flight ticket after tax and their national pension on May 2nd late afternoon. Thus, we were not able to send out the teacher's total amount of May, June, and flight ticket because the transaction closed at 4:00 pm. Further, since May 3rd is a national holiday in Korea, we were not able to make any official transaction.

Mr. Kim again contacted and met the Bank officer on May 3rd individually and explained him about our situation. And he approved to make it available on May 3rd.

We apologize our latest work and please excuse us for not having answered your letter sooner.

INTRODUCTION

On April 3-5, 2017, a Certification Inspection was completed on Canada B.C. International Studies (CBIS) in Seoul, Gangdon-gu, Republic of Korea, termed the School in this report. The purpose of this inspection was to determine whether the requirements for the British Columbia (B.C.) education program have been met, according to the B.C. Global Education Program – Offshore Schools Certification Agreement. The inspector, appointed by the Executive Director of International Education (the Director), British Columbia Ministry of Education (MoE) in accordance with the B.C. Global Education Program – Offshore Schools Certification Agreement (the Agreement), was Mr. Doug Lauson.

The School's B.C. Program has an enrolment of 154 students, in Grades 1 to 10.

During his visit to the School, the Inspector reviewed all standards required in the *B.C. Global Education Program – Offshore Schools Certification Agreement* and *Operating Manual* and met with the School's Owner/Operator Representative, B.C. Principal, who also acts as the Offshore School Representative, B.C. Teachers and support staff.

The Owner/Operator, Mr. Jong Hee Han, is responsible for the B.C. Program. CBIS also operates a Korean Kindergarten program on the second floor of the CBIS building. This program has an English language component that prepares students for entry into Grade 1 of the B.C. program.

The B.C. Program's philosophy, objectives and special features include a Mission statement that is "to provide an English-speaking learning environment that strives for excellence, so that all students acquire the skills, the knowledge, and the work ethic to become responsible and successful future leaders of our global society". The School lives this mission statement through its day-to-day activities that does include an English-speaking environment, not only in the classroom but also before, during recess and lunch, and after school. The classroom instruction of the teaching staff is creative, innovative and collaborative to help all students develop their individual skill set, knowledge and work ethic.

Due to delays in travelling to Korea and other factors, the new Principal arrived at the School on January 9, 2017, midway through the school year. Since then, he has been working to address the four concerns in the last inspection of October 2016. Two of the concerns address developing a graduation plan for the next two years, when grades 11 and 12 are added, including a school policy for Equivalency and Challenge of graduation courses. These requirements have been partially addressed; the Inspector reviewed the developed materials and is satisfied that the is being worked on and is nearing completion. The third concern of the previous inspection report concerns the B.C. teacher certification of the new Principal and that is also being currently addressed. The last concern required the review of the job description of the Principal to include the responsibilities usually performed by the Offshore School Representative (OSR). The current Principal's job description is a one-page document with four main topic headings. This requirement has not been addressed.

Commendations:

Given the short timeframe since his arrival, the Principal has almost completed the development of the graduation program implementation plan. The partially completed work is comprehensive and is presented in a three-ring binder, containing seven chapters:

- 1. The CBIS Implementation Plan for Secondary Studies
- 2. Graduation Plan Course Selection Handbook (Draft)
- 3. Action Plans
- 4. Proposed Timetable
- 5. CBIS Growth Pathways PowerPoint (General)
- 6. CBIS the New Gross for a Redesign (2015 18) PowerPoint (for Staff)
- 7. Research Studies: <u>Canadian Offshore Schools in China</u> and <u>Supporting Teachers to</u> Increase Retention and B.C. Offshore Schools

The Principal is commended on the thoroughness of this plan.

Requirements:

- The Owner/Operator must hire an experienced and approved Offshore School Representative (OSR) to act as the primary liaison with the Ministry of Education and perform the defined duties of the OSR in the Agreement.
- The Principal must keep a log of the steps he takes to provide the missing documentation to the Teacher Regulation Branch (TRB) for the processing of his

Certificate of Qualification (COQ). If he requests an extension of his exemption, this log must be submitted to the Ministry of Education with the request.

Comment: The Business Plan examined by the Inspector was the same as the one that was included in the Annual Report submitted to the Ministry of Education in October 2016. However, the number of students has decreased from 162 (October 2016) to 154 (April 2017). One of the items in the plan was to update and renew contracts early and this was completed in January 2017. Most teachers have indicated that they will be returning to the School for the 2017-18 school year. This will provide the needed consistency in the teaching staff.

The Inspector asked to see the current licence that certifies that the B.C. School is operating with the permission of the local Office of Education. The Principal informed the Inspector that he, the Principal, had been told by the previous Director of Academic Affairs that the Hagwon licences do not have expiry dates. Accepting this statement, the Inspector examined the same licence that was given to the previous inspection team in October 2016. These included the Business Registration/License of the CBIS Corporation by the Gang Dong District Tax Office (updated October 31, 2016) and the operating registration document (No. 6345) issued by the Seoul Gangdong Songpa Regional Education Office (September 1, 2014) to the CBIS Foreign Language Institute to open a Hagwon (Learning Institution) to offer specialized programs described as "School Curriculum/Foreign Language" in accordance with the No. 6 Hagwon Establishment Operating law. The first registration of this operating license document was May

29, 2012.

Upon closer scrutiny, the operating licence presented specifically states that the location of the authorized foreign language program is on the 1st and 2nd floors of the CBIS building. The B.C. Program is taught on the 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th floors of the building. The 1st and 2nd floors are a CBIS local Korean Pre-school and Kindergarten program that is not part of the B.C. offshore program.

After the onsite inspection was completed, it has been revealed that the School terminated the B.C. Offshore Hagwon licence and is the process of applying for an International School license for the B.C. program. This means that the B.C. Offshore School program is currently not licensed to operate.

Requirement:

The Owner/Operator must submit the appropriate licence to operate the B.C. Offshore program to the Ministry of Education as soon as possible.

Comment

The School operates in a 7^{th} floor building with classrooms on the 3^{rd} 4^{th} and 5^{th} floors. The small gymnasium is located on the 6^{th} floor with a dance studio. The cafeteria is located in the 1^{st} basement with the 2^{nd} basement containing a Auditorium, mini gym and music room. The 1^{st} floor main lobby leads up to the 2^{nd} floor that contains the administration offices, Principal's office, and the non-B.C. program kindergarten.

The Inspector examined several reports including:

- Electrical/facility Inspection Report by EM Electrical Safety, September 26, 2016,
- Fire Facility Inspection Report by SMENG, May 2016,
- Elevator Inspection Report by Otis, September 29, 2016,
- Cafeteria Certification for the catering firm, Green Meal, by the Korea Dietitian Association, June 14, 2016.

The School passed all these inspections of the facility and its services.

Commendation:

The School facility is well-maintained and clean, including the boys' and girls' washrooms and cafeteria.

ADMINISTRATION 3.0

3.2 Offshore School Representative (OSR) - The Owner/Operator may appoint an individual to
act as Offshore School Representative. This individual must be confirmed by the Province
and must meet all of the requirements set out in Section 14 of the Agreement.

Comment:

The Owner/Operator has not appointed an individual to act as the Offshore School Representative, but has conferred these duties on the School Principal, as outlined in the Certification Agreement, Schedule B, Part II 4. The new Principal arrived at the School in January 2017, halfway through the school year. His contract makes no mention of being appointed the Offshore School Representative and he is still in the steep learning curve of understanding all the nuances of the operations of the School as well as the required role and responsibilities of the OSR. In the Annual Report (September 29, 2016), the Director of Academic Studies stated that the Principal is appointed to be the primary liaison and legal representative of CBIS. However, the Director does not respond to the question that asks if the Principal actually carries out the duties as required in Part II(9-10) of Schedule B of the Agreement. The Director of Academic Studies was also required to act as the OSR and attend the information and professional development sessions held by the Ministry of Education in July 2016, as is required in Part II (9-10) of Schedule B of the Agreement. \$.22 \$.22

Commendation:

For the first half of the school year, one of the teachers was appointed Interim Principal. He, together with the three Head Teachers (Primary, Middle and High School) have done an admirable job of running the School in the absence of the new Principal.

Suggestion:

Over the last two years, the School personnel have undergone very significant changes in the School's leadership and administration resulting $^{\rm s.17}$

Comment:

Examination of the Teacher Regulation Branch Verification File dated October 31, 2016 indicates that all teachers employed in the B.C. program (except the Principal, as noted 3.3 above and the local national Chinese language teacher) are in possession of valid and current certification under the TRB. Except for the Principal, the staff has not changed since the time of the printout of the TRB Verification File. As mentioned previously, the Principal's certification is in process and he has an exemption issued by the International Education Branch that allows him to teach while his application is processed. The exemption expires April 25, 2017.

The local national Chinese language teacher holds a Chinese teaching certificate from the Minister of Education and Human Resources Development, Kook Min University, dated February 22, 2004. The School records also show a criminal record check and a letter from the B.C. Director International Education (June 30, 2015) permitting the School to teach 4 credits of Mandarin, to a maximum of 12 credits, as well as 4 credits of local History courses and 4 credits of local culture courses.

The Inspector examined teacher personnel files and confirms that they contain pertinent documents including the employee's individual contracts. The Principal's file contains his Principal contract, complete with his salary and terms of employment. His contract does not mention any role as the primary liaison with the Ministry nor being the legal representative of the School. After the onsite inspection was completed, in a subsequent telephone conversation, the Principal informed me that he had become aware of another contract that supposes to be his employment contract. This "other" contract appeared to be more similar to a teacher's contract rather than a Principal's contract.

Requirements:

The Principal must obtain his TRB Certificate of Qualification (COQ) prior to April 25, 2017, or at a minimum must apply for an extension of his exemption, which may or may not be granted.

The Owner/Operator must clarify the two Principal's contract, verifying the correct contract and destroying the other.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM 4.0

4.1 The School meets the requirements for curriculum implementation as outlined in Section
4.1 of the Inspection Catalogue for Offshore Schools.

Comment: The Inspector visited classrooms, talked with teachers and students and had one-on-one interviews with the Head Teachers of the Primary, Intermediate and High School units and ELL Coordinator. The Inspector also met with the teacher who was the interim Principal for the first half of the school year. Throughout the three-day visit, the Inspector also observed student interactions and behaviour in and outside classrooms. The walls and hallways display excellent student work that is relevant to the curriculum taught in the classrooms. Evidence of the implementation of the redesigned curriculum methodologies and strategies is also evident in the classrooms. Blended learning, Inquiry learning and Project-based learning examples are visible in the displayed student work.
Commendation: Teachers are working well together as a professional learning community, sharing and implementing ideas and concepts. Students are benefitting from an excellent education program at CBIS that is preparing them for success in secondary school and at Western universities. The skills being taught and learned will support the students' success in their future education.
Suggestion: The greatest resource of innovative ideas and tools for teaching are the teachers themselves. The Inspector noted several simple tools used by individuals that should be shared with the whole staff for school-wide implementation. The Inspector suggests that a period of time at each staff meeting be dedicated to sharing successful strategies, i.e., bring and brag strategy as sometimes used with elementary students.
4.2 The School meets the requirements for English Language Assessment and Acquisition as outlined in Section 4.2 of the Inspection Catalogue for Offshore Schools.

Comment: The Inspector interviewed the new English Language Learner (ELL) teacher who developed the English Language Assessment instrument. This position is a new part-time position dedicated to focus on helping the students master the English language. The assessment is grade levelled and is administered by the homeroom teacher. There are detailed instructions for the administration and marking of the assessment. The results are forwarded to the Principal who

makes the final decision of admittance and placement.

In addition, the ELL teacher supports students by servicing their individual learning needs as assessed by the classroom teacher.

Commendation:

The School Owner/Operator is commended for providing the financial resources to hire a part-time ELL teacher to support those students who require additional help in acquiring the English language.

4.3 The School meets the Course Credit requirements (equivalency, challenge, exemptions
and BAA courses) as outlined in Section 4.3 of the Inspection Catalogue for Offshore Schools.

Comment:

The School has not completed the development of Equivalency and Challenge policies noted in the previous two inspections. This delay is partially attributed to the significant changes in the positions of Principal and Director of Academic Affairs of the School. The new Principal has been made aware of this issue and is incorporating the policy into the comprehensive plan for the implementation of graduation program. The Inspector has examined the draft copy of the implementation plan and is satisfied that the Equivalency and Challenge policies will be finalized as part of the new implementation plan.

The School currently has a small class of Grade 10 students who have progressed through the middle school, so there are no current equivalency or challenge issues.

Requirement:

The School is required to complete the development of the Equivalency and Challenge policies.

4.4 The School meets the course overview / course planning requirements as outlined in Schedule B Part I (d) of the Agreement; namely, that all B.C. Program courses offered in the School meet or exceed the Ministry learning outcomes / learning standards identified in the Educational Program Guides for each course.

Comment:

The School has now completed the full implementation of the *Atlas Rubicon* software. This is a tool used by teachers to develop and track the implementation of the course overviews of the redesigned curriculum. It is an open platform that holds teachers accountable for their teaching by allowing other teachers and parents to follow the implementation of the



curriculum in individual grades. Integration among subjects and courses are also identified and tracked by the software.

Technology is widely used by the teachers to collaborate teaching and learning. The *Google suite* is extensively used by staff and students, as is *ClassDojo*, a communications app for students, parents and teachers. The middle school students use CANVA, a web-design software package that enhances project-based learning.

School-wide activities such as the Career Fair and Science Fair challenge students to develop their skills of research, writing and speaking.

Blended, Inquiry and Project-based learning strategies are used throughout the School, especially in the high school grades where the displayed student work illustrates the contemporary learning and teaching strategies used. The three Head teachers work with teams of teachers within their Primary, Intermediate and High School units to develop ideas and implement the redesigned curriculum. The implementation of the redesigned curriculum is progressing very well.

Commendation:

The addition of *Atlas Rubicon* has contributed greatly to the smooth planning and implementation of the redesigned curriculum. The School is to be commended for the initiation and completion of this valuable project. Further, the teachers are to be commended for their willingness and acceptance of the new program, and its smooth integration into the School's daily work flow.

4.5 The School meets the Instructional Time Allotments requirements as outlined in Section 4.5 of the Inspection Catalogue for Offshore Schools, including the requirements set out in sections 1.1 to 6, with the exception of s. 4(5)(b), of Ministerial Order 41/91, the Educational Standards Order, enacted under the Independent School Act.

Comment:

The school timetable consists of seven 45 minute periods with an ACA (After Class Activities) as the last block of each day. On the average, there are 5.25 hours instruction per school day, totaling 939.75 instructional hours per year, for Grade 1 to 10. This is above the minimum required 850 hours of instruction.

Within each class, teachers are cognizant of their role to help students acquire the English language. Teachers plan a variety of in-class activities to assist students in their listening, writing, reading and speaking skills. Throughout the school students converse in English during class and in recreational times. The ELL teacher assists classroom teachers identifying students

who require extra help and she supports them through small group interactions or on a one-to-one basis.
The ACA program provides the students with afterschool activities and a multitude of areas including leadership club, music, fitness, basketball, volleyball, badminton, debating, board games, book club, and various forms of dance.
Commendation: The teachers are to be commended for coordinating and supervising the extra- and co- curricular activities of the ACA program.
4.6 The School meets the Assessment Methods requirements as outlined in Section 4.6 of the Inspection Catalogue for Offshore Schools.

Comment: The School is very cognizant of using the British Columbia rubrics and performance standards to assess student achievement. With this deliberation, the students are able to proceed to another B.C. school with the confidence that the grading practises and assessments will be similar. The School participated in the Foundation Skills and Assessments (FSA), but have not participated in Provincial examinations. The results of the FSA assessments are analyzed and used to improve instruction and teaching/learning strategies.
Classroom assessments are diverse to collect data of students' achievements through the term (formative) and for the purposes of reporting to parents (summative). The report cards are issued at the end of each term and they are a combination of letter grades, achievement indicators and anecdotal comments for each subject. Parents are well informed of their children's progress through the reporting process.
Commendation: Assessment strategies are diversified to provide a well-rounded perspective of the child's achievements.
4.7 The School meets the Learning Resources requirements as outlined in Section 4.7 of the Inspection Catalogue for Offshore Schools.

Comment:
The School has satisfactory learning resources for each student and for the programs it provides. In addition to the textbooks, the School uses online resources to provide students



with additional information and to develop the technology skills of research and filtering online data. The library has PC desktop computers placed around the periphery of the room and there is also a battery of Chromebook laptops for individual use.

This year, the School acquired a grade-levelled *Scholastic Reading program* which has enhanced the reading capacity of students. In speaking to individual teachers, the positive effect of the reading program has been noticeable.

In addition, the School uses technology to collaborate well in both the educational and administrative areas. The *Google suite* of programs is well used by each teacher on staff to collaborate as well as the extensive use of *Slack*, a communications application.

Commendation:

The staff has adopted technology tools well into the day-to-day operation of the School, resulting in a strong professional community that works as a single unit.

4.8 The School meets the Student Progress Report requirements as outlined in Section 4.8 of	of
the Inspection Catalogue for Offshore Schools.	

Comment:

Formal report cards are sent home to parents at the end of each of the three terms. Parent-Teacher conferences are held after the first two reporting periods (December and March). The procedure of parent-teacher conference is the student-led model, where the student hosts the meeting, informing his/her parents of his/her progress using the portfolio collection of his/her work as evidence of learning. The multi-page report cards are extensive, providing parents with comprehensive information of their child's progress, including letter grades, work habit rubrics and anecdotal comments.

Commendation:

Teachers are commended for communicating well with parents about their child's learning, using a variety of communication modes.

POLICY DEVELOPMENT 5.0

5.1 The School meets the Parent / Student Handbook requirements as outlined in Section 5.1 of the Inspection Catalogue for Offshore Schools.

Comment: The Inspector examined the 2016-17 Student and Parent handbook and confirms that it meets the requirements of the Inspection Catalogue. It is a 16-page document that covers a multitude of items that are important to parents and students. This includes detailed information about grading procedures, extra-curricular activities, attendance, student support services, discipline policies and consequences, communications, uniforms, etc. There is also an important section on dispute resolution.
CBIS strives to educate the whole student in academics, personal well-being, and physical activity and the academic program is "dedicated to achieving academic success and beginning the preparation of students for post-secondary education at a university or college in Canada or others English speaking countries". Personal well-being is achieved through "mandatory physical education and mandatory health and career education (HACE) that provides students with the knowledge, skills and attitudes necessary to be informed decision makers and to make healthy and safe choices".
Commendation: The student and parent handbook is well organized, clear and easy to follow.
Suggestion: In the future, the School may wish to include a Korean language version of the Student and Parent handbook for the parents who are unable to read English.
5.2 The School meets the Teacher Handbook requirements as outlined in Section 5.2 of the Inspection Catalogue for Offshore Schools.

Comment: The Teacher Handbook and Policy handbook are one document. The Policy Handbook is extensive, providing details of the School's 31 policies including policies on refunds of tuition, student/parent appeals and complaint resolution. The Policy handbook gives direction to teachers and staff on important issues such as incident reporting, student assessment, research studies, etc. It is available on the School's website at http://www.cbis.or.kr/

Comm	enc	dation	:

The policies are well written and easy to follow for both parents, teachers and support staff.

Suggestion:

The policies often refer to "the CBIS Head" or "the Head", conferring authority to this person. It is unclear as to whether this is the Principal or the Head Teacher(s). To prevent confusion, the policy should be reviewed for consistency of language.

Suggestions

INTRODUCTION

On April 3-5, 2017, a Certification Inspection was completed on Canada B.C. International Studies (CBIS) in Seoul, Gangdon-gu, Republic of Korea, termed the School in this report. The purpose of this inspection was to determine whether the requirements for the British Columbia (B.C.) education program have been met, according to the *B.C. Global Education Program – Offshore Schools Certification Agreement*. The inspector, appointed by the Director of International Education (the Director), British Columbia Ministry of Education (MoE) in accordance with the *B.C. Global Education Program – Offshore Schools Certification Agreement* (the Agreement), was Mr. Doug Lauson.

The School's B.C. Program has an enrolment of 154 students, in Grades 1 to 10.

During his visit to the School, the Inspector reviewed all standards required in the *B.C. Global Education Program – Offshore Schools Certification Agreement* and *Operating Manual* and met with the School's Owner/Operator Representative, B.C. Principal, who also acts as the Ministry Liaison, B.C. Teachers and support staff.

The Owner/Operator, Mr. Jong Hee Han, is responsible for the B.C. Program. CBIS also operates a Korean Kindergarten program on the second floor of the CBIS building. This program has an English language component that prepares students for entry into Grade 1 of the B.C. program.

The B.C. Program's philosophy, objectives and special features include a Mission statement that is "to provide an English-speaking learning environment that strives for excellence, so that all students acquire the skills, the knowledge, and the work ethic to become responsible and successful future leaders of our global society". The school lives this mission statement through its day-to-day activities that does include an English-speaking environment, not only in the classroom but also before, during recess and lunch, and after school. The classroom instruction



of the teaching staff is creative, innovative and collaborative to help all students develop their individual skill set, knowledge and work ethic.

The Inspector would like to thank CBIS principal and staff for their hospitality, cooperation and assistance in the inspection visit.

Comment:

Due to delays in travelling to Korea and other factors, the new principal arrived at the school on January 9, 2017, midway through the school year. Since then, he has been working to address the four concerns in the last inspection of October 2016. Two of the concerns address developing a graduation plan for the next two years, when grades 11 and 12 are added, including a school policy for Equivalency and Challenge of graduation courses. These requirements have been partially addressed; the Inspector reviewed the developed materials and is satisfied that the is being worked on and is nearing completion. The third concern of the previous inspection report concerns the B.C. teacher certification of the new Principal and that is also being currently addressed. The last concern required the review of the job description of the principal to include the responsibilities usually performed by the Offshore School Representative (OSR). The current principal's job description is a one-page document with four main topic headings. This requirement has not been addressed.

Commendations:

Given the short timeframe since his arrival, the principal has almost completed the development of the graduation program implementation plan. The partially completed work is comprehensive and is presented in a three-ring binder, containing seven chapters:

- 1. The CBIS Implementation Plan for Secondary Studies
- 2. Graduation Plan Course Selection Handbook (Draft)
- 3. Action Plans
- 4. Proposed Timetable
- 5. CBIS Growth Pathways PowerPoint (General)
- 6. CBIS the New Gross for a Redesign (2015 18) PowerPoint (for Staff)
- 7. Research Studies: Canadian Offshore Schools in China and Supporting Teachers to Increase Retention and B.C. Offshore Schools

The Principal is commended on the thoroughness of this plan.

Requirements:

The Owner/Operator must hire an experienced and approved Offshore School Representative (OSR) to act as the primary liaison with the Ministry of Education and perform the defined duties of the OSR in the Agreement.



- The principal must keep a log of the steps he takes to provide the missing documentation to the Teacher Regulation Branch (TRB) for the processing of his Certificate of Qualification (COQ). If he requests an extension of his Letter of Permission, this log must be submitted to the Ministry of Education with the request.
- The school is required to complete the development of the Equivalency and Challenge policies.
- The Graduation Plan for grades 10-12 must be completed.

Comment: The Business Plan examined by the Inspector was the same as the one that was included in the Annual Report submitted to the Ministry of Education in October 2016. However, the number of students has decreased from 162 (October 2016) to 154 (April 2017). One of the items in the plan was to update and renew contracts early and this was completed in January 2017. Most teachers have indicated that they will be returning to the school for the 2017-18 school year. This will provide the needed consistency in the teaching staff.

Comment:

The Inspector asked to see the current licence that certifies that the BC school is operating with the permission of the local Office of Education. The Principal informed the Inspector that he, the Principal, had been told by the previous Director of Academic Affairs that the Hagwon licences do not have expiry dates. Accepting this statement, the Inspector examined the same licence that was given to the previous inspection team in October 2016. These included the Business Registration/License of the CBIS Corporation by the Gang Dong District Tax Office (updated October 31, 2016) and the operating registration document (No. 6345) issued by the Seoul Gangdong Songpa Regional Education Office (September 1, 2014) to the CBIS Foreign Language Institute to open a Hagwon (Learning Institution) to offer specialized programs



described as "School Curriculum/Foreign Language" in accordance with the No. 6 Hagwon Establishment Operating law. The first registration of this operating license document was May 29, 2012.

Upon closer scrutiny, the operating licence presented specifically states that the location of the authorized foreign language program is on the $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ and $\mathbf{2}^{\text{nd}}$ floors of the CBIS building. The BC Program is taught on the $\mathbf{3}^{\text{rd}}$, $\mathbf{4}^{\text{th}}$, $\mathbf{5}^{\text{th}}$ and $\mathbf{6}^{\text{th}}$ floors of the building. The $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ and $\mathbf{2}^{\text{nd}}$ floors are a CBIS local Korean Pre-school and Kindergarten program that is not part of the BC offshore program.

After the onsite inspection was completed, it has been revealed that the school terminated the BC Offshore Hagwon licence and is the process of applying for an International School license for the BC program. This means that the BC Offshore school program is currently not licensed to operate.

Requirements:

The Owner/Operator must submit the appropriate licence to operate the BC Offshore program to the Ministry of Education as soon as possible.

Comment:

The School operates in a 7^{th} floor building with classrooms on the 3^{rd} 4^{th} and 5^{th} floors. The small gymnasium is located on the 6^{th} floor with a dance studio. The cafeteria is located in the 1^{st} basement with the 2^{nd} basement containing a Auditorium, mini gym and music room. The 1^{st} floor main lobby leads up to the 2^{nd} floor that contains the administration offices, principal's office, and the non-B.C. program kindergarten.

The Inspector examined several reports including:

- Electrical/facility Inspection Report by EM Electrical Safety, September 26, 2016,
- Fire Facility Inspection Report by SMENG, May 2016,
- Elevator Inspection Report by Otis, September 29, 2016,

The school passed all these inspections of the facility and its services.

The school facility is well-maintained and clean, including the boys' and girls' washrooms and cafeteria.

The Owner/Operator has not appointed an individual to act as the Offshore School Representative, but has conferred these duties on the School Principal, as outlined in the Certification Agreement, Schedule B, Part II 4. The new Principal arrived at the school in January 2017, halfway through the school year. His contract makes no mention of being appointed the Offshore School Representative and he is still in the steep learning curve of understanding all the nuances of the operations of the school as well as the required role and responsibilities of the OSR. In the Annual Report (September 29, 2016), the Director of Academic Studies stated that the Principal is appointed to be the primary liaison and legal representative of CBIS. However, the Director does not respond to the question that asks if the principal actually carries out the duties as required in Part II(9-10) of Schedule B of the Agreement. In the interview \$.22

The Director of Academic Studies was also required to act as the OSR and attend the information and professional development sessions held by the Ministry of Education in July 2016, as is required in Part II (9-10) of Schedule B of the Agreement. s.22 s.22

Commendations:

For the first half of the school year, one of the teachers was appointed Interim Principal. He, together with the three Head Teachers (Primary, Middle and High School) have done an admirable job of running the school in the absence of the new Principal.

Suggestions:

Over the last two years, the school personnel have undergone very significant changes in the school's leadership and administration s.17 s.17

not to replace that position in the school's administration hierarchy, and instead has created the new position of Assistant Principal/Business Services. The employee hired to fill this position will not supervise the Principal, but will instead work with and support the Principal.

Comment:

Examination of the Teacher Regulation Branch Verification File dated October 31, 2016 indicates that all teachers employed in the B.C. program (except the principal, as noted 3.3 above and the local national Chinese language teacher) are in possession of valid and current certification under the TRB. Except for the Principal, the staff has not changed since the time of the printout of the TRB Verification File. As mentioned previously, the Principal's certification is in process and he has a Letter of Permission issued by the International Branch that allows him to teach while his application is processed. The Letter of Permission expires April 25, 2017.

The local national Chinese language teacher holds a Chinese teaching certificate from the Minister of Education and Human Resources Development, Kook Min University, dated February 22, 2004. The school records also show a criminal record check and a letter from the B.C. Director International Education (June 30, 2015) permitting the school to teach 4 credits of Mandarin, to a maximum of 12 credits, as well as 4 credits of local History courses and 4 credits of local culture courses.

The Inspector examined teacher personnel files and confirms that they contain pertinent documents including the employee's individual contracts. The Principal's file contains his principal contract, complete with his salary and terms of employment. His contract does not mention any role as the primary liaison with the Ministry nor being the legal representative of the school. After the onsite inspection was completed, in a subsequent telephone conversation, the Principal informed me that he had become aware of another contract that supposes to be his employment contract. This "other" contract appeared to be more similar to a teacher's contract rather than a Principal's contract.

Requirements:

The Principal must obtain his TRB Certificate of Qualification (COQ) prior to April 25, 2017, or at a minimum must apply for an extension of his Letter of Permission, which may or may not be granted.

The Owner/Operator must clarify the two Principal's contract, verifying the correct contract and destroying the other.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM 4.0



4.1 The School meets the requirements for curriculum implementation as outlined in Section 4.1 of the Inspection Catalogue for Offshore Schools.

Comment: The Inspector visited classrooms, talked with teachers and students and had one-on-one interviews with the Head Teachers of the Primary, Intermediate and High School units and ELL Coordinator. The Inspector also met with the teacher who was the interim principal for the first half of the school year. Throughout the three-day visit, the Inspector also observed student interactions and behaviour in and outside classrooms. The walls and hallways display excellent student work that is relevant to the curriculum taught in the classrooms. Evidence of the implementation of the redesigned curriculum methodologies and strategies is also evident in the classrooms. Blended learning, Inquiry learning and Project-based learning examples are visible in the displayed student work.
Commendations: Teachers are working well together as a professional learning community, sharing and implementing ideas and concepts. Students are benefitting from an excellent education program at CBIS that is preparing them for success in secondary school and at Western universities. The skills being taught and learned will support the students' success in their future education.
Suggestions: The greatest resource of innovative ideas and tools for teaching are the teachers themselves. The Inspector noted several simple tools used by individuals that should be shared with the whole staff for school-wide implementation. The Inspector suggests that a period of time at each staff meeting be dedicated to sharing successful strategies, i.e., bring and brag strategy as sometimes used with elementary students.

4.2 The School meets the requirements for English Language Assessment and Acquisition as outlined in Section 4.2 of the Inspection Catalogue for Offshore Schools.

Comment:				

The Inspector interviewed the new English Language Learner (ELL) teacher who developed the English Language Assessment instrument. This position is a new part-time position dedicated to focus on helping the students master the English language. The assessment is grade levelled and is administered by the homeroom teacher. There are detailed instructions for the administration and marking of the assessment. The results are forwarded to the principal who makes the final decision of admittance and placement.

Commendations:

The school Owner/Operator is commended for providing the financial resources to hire a part-time ELL teacher to support those students who require additional help in acquiring the English language.

Comment:

The school has not completed the development of Equivalency and Challenge policies noted in the previous two inspections. This delay is partially attributed to the significant changes in the positions of principal and Director of Academic Affairs of the school. The new principal has been made aware of this issue and is incorporating the policy into the comprehensive plan for the implementation of graduation program. The Inspector has examined the draft copy of the implementation plan and is satisfied that the Equivalency and Challenge policies will be finalized as part of the new implementation plan.

The school currently has a small class of grade 10 students who have progressed through the middle school, so there are no current equivalency or challenge issues.

Requirements:

The school is required to complete the development of the Equivalency and Challenge policies.

4.4 The School meets the course overview / course planning requirements as outlined in Schedule B Part I (d) of the Agreement; namely, that all B.C. Program courses offered in the School meet or exceed the Ministry learning outcomes / learning standards identified in the Educational Program Guides for each course.

Comment:

The school has now completed the full implementation of the *Atlas Rubicon* software. This is a tool used by teachers to develop and track the implementation of the course overviews of the redesigned curriculum. It is an open platform that holds teachers accountable for their teaching by allowing other teachers and parents to follow the implementation of the curriculum in individual grades. Integration among subjects and courses are also identified and



tracked by the software.

Technology is widely used by the teachers to collaborate teaching and learning. The *Google suite* is extensively used by staff and students, as is *ClassDojo*, a communications app for students, parents and teachers. The middle school students use CANVA, a web-design software package that enhances project-based learning.

School-wide activities such as the Career Fair and Science Fair challenge students to develop their skills of research, writing and speaking.

Blended, Inquiry and Project-based learning strategies are used throughout the school, especially in the high school grades where the displayed student work illustrates the contemporary learning and teaching strategies used. The three Head teachers work with teams of teachers within their Primary, Intermediate and High School units to develop ideas and implement the redesigned curriculum. The implementation of the redesigned curriculum is progressing very well.

Commendations:

The addition of *Atlas Rubicon* has contributed greatly to the smooth planning and implementation of the redesigned curriculum. The school is to be commended for the initiation and completion of this valuable project. Further, the teachers are to be commended for their willingness and acceptance of the new program, and its smooth integration into the school's daily work flow.

4.5 The School meets the Instructional Time Allotments requirements as outlined in Section 4.5 of the Inspection Catalogue for Offshore Schools, including the requirements set out in sections 1.1 to 6, with the exception of s. 4(5)(b), of Ministerial Order 41/91, the Educational Standards Order, enacted under the Independent School Act.

Comment:

The school timetable consists of seven 45 minute periods with an ACA (After Class Activities) as the last block of each day. On the average, there are 5.25 hours instruction per school day, totaling 939.75 instructional hours per year, for Grade 1 to 10. This is above the minimum required 850 hours of instruction.

Within each class, teachers are cognizant of their role to help students acquire the English language. Teachers plan a variety of in-class activities to assist students in their listening, writing, reading and speaking skills. Throughout the school students converse in English during class and in recreational times. The ELL teacher assists classroom teachers identifying students who require extra help and she supports them through small group interactions or on a one-to-



one basis.
The ACA program provides the students with afterschool activities and a multitude of areas including leadership club, music, fitness, basketball, volleyball, badminton, debating, board games, book club, and various forms of dance.
Commendations: The teachers are to be commended for coordinating and supervising the extra- and co- curricular activities of the ACA program.
4.6 The School meets the Assessment Methods requirements as outlined in Section 4.6 of the Inspection Catalogue for Offshore Schools.

Comment: The school is very cognizant of using the British Columbia rubrics and performance standards to assess student achievement. With this deliberation, the students are able to proceed to another B.C. school with the confidence that the grading practises and assessments will be similar. The school participated in the Foundation Skills and Assessments (FSA), but have not participated in Provincial examinations. The results of the FSA assessments are analyzed and used to improve instruction and teaching/learning strategies.
Classroom assessments are diverse to collect data of students' achievements through the term (formative) and for the purposes of reporting to parents (summative). The report cards are issued at the end of each term and they are a combination of letter grades, achievement indicators and anecdotal comments for each subject. Parents are well informed of their children's progress through the reporting process.
Commendations: Assessment strategies are diversified to provide a well-rounded perspective of the child's achievements.
4.7 The School meets the Learning Resources requirements as outlined in Section 4.7 of the
Inspection Catalogue for Offshore Schools.

Comment: The school has satisfactory learning resources for each student and for the programs it
provides. In addition to the textbooks, the school uses online resources to provide students



with additional information and to develop the technology skills of research and filtering online data. The library has PC desktop computers placed around the periphery of the room and there is also a battery of Chromebook laptops for individual use.

This year, the school acquired a grade-levelled *Scholastic Reading program* which has enhanced the reading capacity of students. In speaking to individual teachers, the positive effect of the reading program has been noticeable.

In addition, the school uses technology to collaborate well in both the educational and administrative areas. The *Google suite* of programs is well used by each teacher on staff to collaborate as well as the extensive use of *Slack*, a communications application.

Commendations:

The staff has adopted technology tools well into the day-to-day operation of the school, resulting in a strong professional community that works as a single unit.

Comment:

Formal report cards are sent home to parents at the end of each of the three terms. Parent-Teacher conferences are held after the first two reporting periods (December and March). The procedure of parent-teacher conference is the student-led model, where the student hosts the meeting, informing his/her parents of his/her progress using the portfolio collection of his/her work as evidence of learning. The multi-page report cards are extensive, providing parents with comprehensive information of their child's progress, including letter grades, work habit rubrics and anecdotal comments.

Commendations:

Teachers are commended for communicating well with parents about their child's learning, using a variety of communication modes.

The Inspector examined the 2016-17 Student and Parent handbook and confirms that it meets the requirements of the Inspection Catalogue. It is a 16-page document that covers a multitude of items that are important to parents and students. This includes detailed information about grading procedures, extra-curricular activities, attendance, student support services, discipline policies and consequences, communications, uniforms, etc. There is also an important section on dispute resolution.

CBIS strives to educate the whole student in academics, personal well-being, and physical activity and the academic program is "dedicated to achieving academic success and beginning the preparation of students for post secondary education at a university or college in Canada or others English speaking countries". Personal well-being is achieved through "mandatory physical education and mandatory health and career education (HACE) that provides students with the knowledge, skills and attitudes necessary to be informed decision makers and to make healthy and safe choices".

Commendations:

The student and parent handbook is well organized, clear and easy to follow.

Suggestions:

In the future, the school may wish to include a Korean language version of the Student and Parent handbook for the parents who are unable to read English.

The Teacher Handbook and Policy handbook are one document. The Policy handbook gives direction to teachers and staff on important issues such as incident reporting, student assessment, research studies, etc. It is available on the school's website at http://www.cbis.or.kr/			
Commendations:			
The policies are well written and easy to follow for both parents, teachers and support staff.			
Suggestions:			
The policies often refer to "the CBIS Head" or "the Head", conferring authority to this person. It is unclear as to whether this is the Principal or the Head Teacher(s). To prevent confusion,			

the policy should be reviewed for consistency of language.

The Inspection Inspector encourages the Owner/Operator and School to consider:

- Developing a program of implementation to specifically teach and assess the Core Competencies of Communication, Thinking and Personal/Social Well Being.
- Organizing inter-grade meetings to discuss the skill sets and knowledge that students require to complete in the preceding grade before progressing to the next grade.
- The Inspector suggests that a period of time at each staff meeting be dedicated to sharing successful strategies, i.e., bring and brag strategy as sometimes used with elementary students.

SUMMATIVE RECOMMENDATION

The Offshore Inspector recommends to the Director of International Education that, contingent on acquiring of the appropriate operating licence from the Korean Office of Education and responding to the above requirements to the satisfaction of the Director of International Education, the British Columbia Program offered at CBIS continue to be recognized as a British Columbia Certified Program, on Probationary status.

We have received information which indicates that there is a mis-interpretation of what Probationary status for the school means. I would like to take this opportunity to be very clear about the situation and for you to share this with the teachers.

The BC Ministry of Education has placed CBIS school on probation, this means that if all other issues were resolved the school would be able to continue to operate. Clearly, the VISA issues have not been resolved and the teachers have had their Visa's cancelled and been asked to leave the country within the 30 day timeframe. Our move to place the school on probation DOES NOT override the Visa cancellation issue and give permission for the school to operate in contravention of the directives of Korean national or local authorities, or without valid local licensing.

Only if the teacher Visa and local licensing issues are resolved would we expect the school to resume classes.

Subject: BC Certified Teachers in South Korea

The BC Teachers' Federation was distressed to hear the plight of BC certified teachers teaching at a BC offshore school who have faced immigration detention and orders to leave South Korca. They are teachers at the CBIS school and their problem may well be faced by BC certified teachers in other offshore schools in Korea.

The teachers received visas through applications by the employer. They were given E2 visas, which were not valid for teaching the BC curriculum, only for teaching in cram schools, but the teachers were not aware of this.

The teachers indicate that they were told by the Canadian Embassy in Seoul that since 2013 it had discouraged provinces from opening offshore schools because there is no basis for offering curriculum from Canada. The Ministry of Education has an obligation to ensure that offshore schools that it certifies operate in ways that are legal in the countries in which they operate.

I would like to acknowledge Deputy Minister David Byng for responding to the situation by ensuring the teachers' salary continues until the end of the school year, and that accommodation and return flights are paid for. This is to be commended. The Ministry of Education is encouraged to also assist these teachers with any immigration problems that may arise in the short or long term, and with any barriers this situation may create for future employment. Unfortunately, many of these teachers will now be forced away from loved ones and where they have established their lives.

We note that the web page about the CBIS school has been removed from the Make A Future site, but the pages referring to other BC-certified schools in South Korca continue to have job postings listed. The province should not continue to encourage BC teachers to take up employment in South Korca if their legal status is totally precarious and their jobs may be taken from them at a moment's notice.

We are aware that Mr. Jackie has left sooner than he expected for \$.22 and we have been in contact with him as recently as this morning. Mr. Jackie continues to provide the Ministry assistance in our efforts to support teachers.

The Ministry has now received confirmation that the final payments to teachers for May/June salaries and flight allowance have been set in motion, with evidence of the initiation of the bank transfer. I understand that there are national holidays in Korea this week which could potentially slow down processing.

With regard the report cards, we have written confirmation that the report cards were completed and verbal confirmation that they were sent by email to parents. We will continue to monitor this situation to ensure that parents have received the final report cards.

With regard to the immigration and the deportation order and the one year ban, the Ministry will continue to work on this issue in the coming days and weeks and we are committed to connecting with you regarding any developments.

The Ministry appreciates your careful consideration and reflection regarding possible improvements to the offshore school program and will take these points in consideration moving forward. As part of continuous improvement to strengthen the program I will reach out to you to discuss the ideas you have raised over the coming weeks.

At this time, I would request that you provide me the first and last names of all the teachers impacted by the deportation order and one year ban, and would also request that you provide the Ministry an alternate contact email address in case the email account you are currently using is deactivated. It may also be beneficial for me to have an email address for each teacher to ensure the Ministry is able to communicate as needed.

Attached please find the detailed chronology of events for CBIS school in Korea. Summary also provided below:

- 1. The initial complaints received in January were from an anonymous source. General practice is to establish the validity of an anonymous complaint before taking significant action. The chronology shows immediate engagement with the school principal to establish the validity of the schools local license.
- 2. After receiving an updated local license in March, the Ministry continued to receive emails from both the original anonymous writer as well as another \$5.22 expressing concerns about licensing and potential issues with teacher Visa's and possible action by Korean immigration.
- 3. At the requirement of the Ministry, in late March the ownership group confirmed in writing to the Ministry that the school had the appropriate local license.
- 4. The Ministry launched coordination of an unannounced inspection at CBIS to validate the concerns regarding local licensing. This inspection occurred during the first week of April and included meeting with the Trade Commissioner at the Canadian Embassy and the British Columbia Education Marketing Manager and Trade and Investment Representative to gain intelligence on the local licensing.
- 5. The unannounced inspection confirmed the school did not have the appropriate local license and the school was placed on probationary status immediately.

Ministry staff remain engaged with the EMM, the principal and the ownership group through the EMM and owners representative.

We have received information which indicates that there is a mis-interpretation of what Probationary status for the school means. I would like to take this opportunity to be very clear about the situation and for you to share this with the teachers.

The BC Ministry of Education has placed CBIS school on probation, this means that if all other issues were resolved the school would be able to continue to operate. Clearly, the VISA issues have not been resolved and the teachers have had their Visa's cancelled and been asked to leave the country within the 30 day timeframe. Our move to place the school on probation DOES NOT override the Visa cancellation issue and give permission for the school to operate in contravention of the directives of Korean national or local authorities, or without valid local licensing.

Only if the teacher Visa and local licensing issues are resolved would we expect the school to resume classes.

In your proposal, you state that students have received 845 hours of instruction which is short by five hours of the number of hours of instruction set out in the Educational Standards Order that states in s. 3 (2) that the school authority must provide no fewer than 850 hours of instruction to students in grades 1-12.

In order to verify the 845 hours, I ask that you forward the school's timetable, school calendar and any other supporting documentation to the ministry. If the documentation substantiates the 845 hours of instruction, the ministry is prepared to provide an exemption for the remaining five hours. Please provide the documentation to support an exemption as soon as possible.

You also propose providing report cards to all students using the current digital Grade Book recorded assessments for each student prepared by the Offshore School Representative. The ministry supports all efforts to provide each student and their parent(s) with report cards. The ministry also supports Lowell Jackie, Offshore School Representative, to make TRAX submissions for the two grade 10 students.

The ministry cannot support the other aspects of the proposal i.e., ELL instruction, a new location under a new agreement, a science and math fair or a humanities fair and Distributed Learning through the approved DL provider. These proposals fall outside of the Certification Agreement.

All B.C.-certified offshore schools are required to have a representative attend this annual meeting. CBIS was the only school that did not have representation at this meeting.

As you know, Owner/Operators may choose to hire an Offshore School Representative (OSR), who is usually based in B.C., to act as the primary liaison between the Ministry of Education and the Owner/Operator. The OSR is responsible for the following duties:

- acting as the primary contact to liaise and communicate with the Ministry in a timely manner
- effectively managing and resolving complaints to the satisfaction of the Ministry
- · participating in and supporting the inspection team in conducting school inspections or audits
- actively working with the Owner/Operator to ensure compliance with all agreement requirements, including
 working with the Principal and teachers to ensure that the Owner/Operator's accountabilities and timelines are
 clearly understood and fulfilled
- ensuring all annual reporting and data reporting requirements are met
- ensuring the Owner/Operator recruits and hires only qualified and competent personnel
- attending information sessions organized by the Ministry, and
- working with the Owner/Operator, Principal and teachers to address the Ministry's recommendations and requirements pertaining to the school

Since the start of the 2016/17 school year, CBIS has chosen to confer the OSR duties on the acting principal and now you as principal. Of the 46 certified schools in operation, there are only 4 schools that have chosen to confer the OSR duties on the Principal.

I hope that this information is useful and please let me know if you need any further clarification.

Following meetings today (April 14th, 2017) with the Assistant Principal for Business Affairs, Mr. Joseph Choi, it was indicated that the CBIS Board and Board Chair (Mr. Han as represented by Mr. Kim) would very much like to ensure the completion of the academic year for the CBIS students.

In a detailed review of the Hours of Instruction completed by the CBIS students as of April 5th, 2017, I have attached a series of tables for Grades 1-7, Grade 8 and 9, and Grade 10.

Upon review of the data, and upon examination of the current BC Calendar Regulations, I would like to make the following suggestions for your consideration should CBIS not re-open:

A. Regarding the Grade 1 through Grade 7 groups of students (87.5% of the student population):

These learners have completed 96.3% of the hours of instruction, with the ELL learning activities included in the tabulations. (See attached Table A)

- I would then propose that the students be given a FINAL REPORT CARD by the Acting Principal using the current digital Grade Book recorded assessments for each student.
- CBIS would then use the next 4 6 weeks as a Spring Academic Extension Program for ELL
 Activities offered by VISA F4 Korean/American (Fluent in English with University Degree and
 Teaching Experience) at a new location with a new interim license/agreement. I would
 suggest a Science and Math Fair given that their scheduled event was for late May. We
 could couple this with a Humanities Fair (on Heritage, Literature and Culture) for the upper,
 Middle School Grade Levels.

The rational for this is based on the fact that there is insufficient time to put BC Certified Teachers in place to finish the CBIS calendar year. Also, parents could be provided with

ongoing ELL instruction for the interim. Lastly, the year completion would be granted to this student population. Please note, that the parents have tried to enrol at the other BC Offshore Schools in Seoul to complete the year and have been refused entrance.

B. Regarding the Grade 8 and Grade 9 groups of students (11.25 % of the student population):

These learners have completed 88.8% of the hours of instruction, with the ELL learning activities included in the tabulations. (See attached Table B)

- I would then propose that the students be given a FINAL REPORT CARD by the Acting Principal using the current digital Grade Book recorded assessments for each student.
- If deemed necessary a final summative assessment could be issued by the Global Offshore School Representative, graded by a BC Certified Teacher, and included in the Final Report Card.
- CBIS would then use the next 4-6 weeks as a Spring Academic Extension Program for ELL
 Activities offered by VISA F4 Korean/American (Fluent in English with University Degree and
 Teaching Experience) at a new location. I would suggest a Science and Math Fair given that
 their scheduled event was for late May. We could couple this with a Humanities Fair (on
 Heritage, Literature and Culture).

The rational for this is based on the fact that there is insufficient time to put BC Certified Teachers in place to finish the CBIS calendar year. Also, parents could be provided with ongoing ELL instruction for the interim. Lastly, the year completion would be granted to this student population. Please note, that the parents have tried to enrol at the other BC Offshore Schools in Seoul to complete the year and have been refused entrance.

C. Regarding the two Grade 10 (see Table C) students at CBIS (1.25% of the student population):

These learners have essentially completed the required hours for seven courses:

Language Arts 10 - 90 minutes every other day = $130 / 2 \times 90 \text{ min} / 60 = 97.5 \text{ hours as of } 05/04/17$

Social Studies 10 - 90 minutes every other day = $130 / 2 \times 90 \text{ min} / 60 = 97.5 \text{ hours as of } 05/04/17$

Science 10 - 90 minutes every other day = $130 / 2 \times 90 \text{ min} / 60 = 97.5 \text{ hours as of } 05/04/17$

Mathematics 10 - 90 minutes every other day = $130 / 2 \times 90 \text{ min} / 60 = 97.5 \text{ hours as of } 05/04/17$

- I would then propose that the students be given a FINAL TRANSCRIPT GRADES by the Global Offshore School Representative using the current digital Grade Book recorded assessments for each student (given that 97.5% of the required hours for each course has been finished).
- Alternatively, a final summative assessment (project or exam) could be issued by the Global Offshore School Representative and then supervised / graded by a BC Certified Teacher (Ms. Lee), and included in the Final Report Card evaluation of each student.
- CBIS would then use the next 8 10 weeks as an opportunity for a Spring Academic Extension Program for DISTANCE LEARNING COURSES as made available by the CBIS sister campus from Kamloops (or an alternative BC site - e.g. http://bc.onlineschool.ca/summer-school.php). These could be supervised by the one remaining Korean National Teacher who is BC Certified at CBIS and is currently their senior high Mathematics Instructor (i.e. Ms. Grace Lee).

The rational for this is based on the fact that there is insufficient time to put specialized BC Certified Teachers in place to finish the CBIS calendar year. The timetable was developed in September with excess hours per secondary course. And finally, the parents have tried to enrol at the other BC Offshore Schools in Seoul to complete the year and have been refused entry.










BC Offshore Schools in Korea








- Of the five BC Offshore Schools in Korea
 - The three schools in Seoul are medium sized schools (160 250 students)
 - The two schools located in the provinces are small schools (less than 75)
- All schools have been inspected this school year and all schools inspections reports showed evidence of strong education programs
- The one concern identified in the fall inspections was with regard to the the ownership / governance of CBIS (the school in question) which did not seem aligned or effective. The education program at the school however was strong.
- Due to the Ministry's concerns re: CBIS a follow-up unannounced inspection was conducted in April 2017.
- The follow-up inspection at CBIS confirmed some issues with the school's governance and will lead to requirements that the school must implement in order to maintain certification.

- The Korea schools have strong academic programs.
- In the provincial exam columns, the blue parenthesis shows the provincial average and the red parenthesis shows the average of all other BC offshore schools.
- For Math 10, it is clear that the Korean schools were much higher than the provincial average and also consistently higher than the average of all other offshore schools.
- For English 12 this exam is a very high benchmark for international students to attain
 - The Korean schools were not at the level of students in B.C. (to be expected when comparing resident BC students to international ELL students
 - The Korean schools scored higher than the average exam results of other BC offshore schools.



Current Situation

- B.C. offshore schools have operated under a "hagwon" license, defined as Foreign Language Academies (cram schools) that are licensed to offer conversational language instruction after regular school hours.
- Immigration officials have interviewed all teachers at CBIS and determined that the E2 Visa is not appropriate for the type of program the school is offering and ordered them to leave the country within 30 days, by May 11, 2017.
 - E7 Visas would be required in order to delivery the BC program.
 - E7 Visa's are only issued to teachers at international schools in Korea located in the free economic zones.
 - BC offshore schools in Korea are not located in these zones and therefore do not qualify to be international schools.

GOVERNANCE MODEL IN KOREA:

- The Korean Ministry of Education (KMoE) is the central government body in charge of education, and oversees 16 elected metropolitan and Provincial Offices of Education
- These 16 Provincial Offices oversee 180 Regional Office of Education
- The KMoE provides general policy direction but leave the majority of budget planning and administrative decisions to the municipal and provincial education offices.
- Both private and public schools receive government funding and are subject to the same laws and restrictions on curriculum, schooling hours, etc.


- High school education is not compulsory and students attending both public and private general high schools must pay for their own tuition. The average tuition for general high school ranges between KRW 1.5 million to 2 million (approx. CAD 1,600 2,200, 1 CAD = KRW 900).
- Korean students pay over KRW 10 million (approx. CAD 11,000) to attend autonomous and foreign lanuguage high schools which reserve the right to select students and prepare them intensively to enter Korea's elite universities.
- Korean society places great emphasis on the value of education and parents often send their children to after-hours cram schools called "hagwons" where they learn the same subjects taught in schools.
- Many parents invest heavily to send their children to hagwons believing that public school education is not enough for their children to be accepted by the best institutions. English language education accounts for about 33% of this after-school private education market.
- Upon graduation, 80% of Korean high school students continue on to advanced education regardless of which type of high school they attended. Korean university entrance is highly competitive through a national exam and there is a strong preference to send children to elite universities. This preference for the university's high ranking or brand also applies to sending students to study overseas.
- Korea has traditionally had a small number of foreign, international schools established to educate the children of expats. Many Korean parents have wanted to enroll their children in these schools as they provide education in English and are believed to provide better access to Ivy League schools in the US. Recently the Korean government has encouraged the creation of more foreign schools to create a domestic alternative to overseas K-12 education at a more economical cost (30-50% of the cost of studying abroad). Other factors have been to capture demand for international education from neighboring countries, especially China, and to reduce social problems associated with broken families where the mother and children live abroad and the father stays to work in Korea.
- In 2009, two new laws were introduced to create "International Schools" which were licensed to operate in Free Economic Zones (FEZ) and Jeju Island. Two schools in FEZ are allowed to enroll Korean students up to 30% of the student body while three international schools in Jeju allowed Koreans to enroll 100% of the student body.
- There are no formal restrictions on the promotion of overseas education. However, under Korean law, Korean passport holders are not permitted to leave the Korean K-12 education system for long term

education. Nevertheless, there is no checking of whether Koreans attend school or not, until they try to enter or re-enter the school exam system at which time their record must be produced.

- The CBIS school in Seoul, Korea was operating in non-compliance with local licensing regulations, and that has impacted the teachers who worked there.

The head of the Seoul Immigration Office does not have any authority to take this action back; it is only the headquarter that the school should contact to make changes.

Therefore, CBIS will submit the petition and consistently file a complaint. With the lawyer, CBIS is making a rough draft for the petition with a main focus on how students outside of school need to be protected and educated.

CBIS will deliver the draft to the parent class representatives then to the headquarter.

As there are 11 other schools that are being investigated along with CBIS, it would be the most effective to have all the schools submit the petition and file complaints.

However, CBIS is the first to be investigated as of now; CBIS needs parents' support.

We know that you are waiting for the solution of this issue. We apologize that we couldn't give you the more positive news.

CBIS will try to do our best for students to come back to school.



We have received information which indicates that there is a mis-interpretation of what Probationary status for the school means. I would like to take this opportunity to be very clear about the situation and for you to share this with the teachers.

The BC Ministry of Education has placed CBIS school on probation, this means that if all other issues were resolved the school would be able to continue to operate. Clearly, the VISA issues have not been resolved and the teachers have had their Visa's cancelled and been asked to leave the country within the 30 day timeframe. Our move to place the school on probation DOES NOT override the Visa cancellation issue and give permission for the school to operate in contravention of the directives of Korean national or local authorities, or without valid local licensing.

Only if the teacher Visa and local licensing issues are resolved would we expect the school to resume classes.

I watched their Skype conversation with you and heard their pleas for help.

Can you tell me if there are in new developments and what the Ministry of Education is doing to support these teachers?

What responsibility does the Ministry have regarding it's BC-certified school?




GOVERNANCE MODEL IN KOREA: (Currently be verified by OSR's)

The BC Offshore School Inspection framework ensures that qualified and experienced inspectors verify all requirements in the Annual Certification Agreement including, but not limited to, ensuring that the school has: satisfactorily addressed requirements contained in the previous inspection report, that ownership has local licensing and agreements in place and that the building has appropriate local safety compliance and approvals, that appropriate administration is in place, that the BC curriculum is being delivered and that the school has a policy framework in place to support operations including ensuring that expectations are clear for students, parents and staff.

Attached please find the detailed chronology of events for CBIS school in Korea. Summary also provided below:

- 1. The initial complaints received in January were from an anonymous source. General practice is to establish the validity of an anonymous complaint before taking significant action. The chronology shows immediate engagement with the school principal to establish the validity of the schools local license.
- 2. After receiving an updated local license in March, the Ministry continued to receive emails from both the original anonymous writer as well as another s.22 expressing concerns about licensing and potential issues with teacher Visa's and possible action by Korean immigration.
- 3. At the requirement of the Ministry, the ownership group confirmed in writing to the Ministry that the school had the appropriate local license in late March.
- 4. The Ministry launched coordination of an unannounced inspection at CBIS to validate the concerns regarding local licensing. This inspection occurred during the first week of April and included meeting with the Trade Commissioner at the Canadian Embassy and the British Columbia Education Marketing Manager and Trade and Investment Representative to gain intelligence on the local licensing.
- 5. The unannounced inspection confirmed the school did not have the appropriate local license and the school was placed on probationary status immediately.

Ministry staff remain engaged with the EMM, the principal and the ownership group through the EMM and owners representative.



What I would like to do is establish a schedule and plan as to how best to conduct the school inspection given the time allotted.

Historically, BC certified teachers have been working at BC Offshore schools in South Korea on a variety of Visa's (E2, F4 and F7) based on the schools local "Hagwon" license granted by the local education office in South Korea without issue.

- A "Hagwon" license permits offering Korean nationals additional English language support or test preparation (TOELF, SAT etc) instruction.
- Local education offices in South Korea have continued to renew/reissue "Hagwon" licenses to BC Offshore Schools.

BACKGROUND

- The Ministry of Education certifies 45 offshore schools in 8 countries which deliver the BC education program to 12,324 international students.
- BC Offshore schools are inspected annually or biennially to ensure that the school complies with the
 certification agreement with the Province of BC, including administrative, policy, operational and educational
 standards.
- The Ministry also conducts unannounced inspections to ensure compliance with the certification agreement.
- BC has certified five offshore schools in South Korea starting in 2009, with two schools certified as recently as
 2013
- Korean government officials have indicated that in order for BC teachers to be employed to deliver the type
 of program offered at BC Offshore Schools they would be required to hold an E7 or F-type Visa:
 - o E7 Visa's are only issued to teachers employed at a school licensed as an international school.
 - International schools are only authorized for establishment in specific Free Economic Zones (FEZ) in South Korea, these schools have additional requirements for operation.
 - Owners of BC Offshore Schools in South Korea are not interested in establishing an international school
 in the FEZ because of the additional investment and operational requirements/regulations.

- All BC Offshore Schools in Korea were inspected during the 2016/17 school year and all of the schools' educational programs were found to be sound and achieving or exceeding expectations.
- For all BC Offshore Schools, it is the responsibility of the local owner-operator to make sure the school's local license is consistent with local regulations and requirements.
- The first BC school to be affected by the Korean Department of Immigration review was CBIS School in Seoul.
 - CBIS failed to comply with local licensing regulations, and as a result, the Korean government revoked the visas of 14 teachers at the school and required them to leave Korea by May 11, 2017.
 - CBIS stopped operation as a BC offshore school on April 12, 2017 as they no longer had BC certified teachers to deliver the educational program or a local license to operate.
 - A CBC online journalist reported on the CBIS school situation on April 27, 2017. The article included skype clips from impacted teachers and claimed that teachers were caught in a 'bureaucratic nightmare'.
 Similar articles appeared in the Vancouver Observer (April 27) and the Tyee (April 28).
 - CBIS students received their final report cards by May 8, 2017; the ministry understands that these students have now transferred to other schools and educational programs.
 - $\circ~$ The Ministry of Education decertified CBIS as a BC Offshore School on June 1, 2017.
 - o As per CBIS school-teacher contracts, the employer:
 - paid CBIS teachers their full salaries until June 30, 2017
 - provided compensation for teacher flights or transportation out of the country
 - continued to provide accommodation for impacted teachers for the 30 day departure order period, until May 11, 2017.

On April 28, we sent out the email to BC certified teachers to sign their resignation report so that we are able to report their final tax and the National Pension Service in Korea.

We were waiting their sign on their resignation report until May 2nd, but no one stopped by the school and no one signed their resignation report.

It causes many tax issues if we don't report the teacher's resignation to the Tax Service Center and the National Pension Service before they leave.

That is the reason we couldn't send out their salary and flight ticket on May 2nd before we calculate their tax and the national pension in a right way.

Thus, our account manager contacted the tax officer, Bank officer, and the National Pension Service officer to make it a right calculation even teachers didn't turn in their resignation report. Our account manager met and explained them our situation and received their approval to send out their May, June, and flight ticket after tax and their national pension on May 2nd late afternoon. Thus, we were not able to send out the teacher's total amount of May, June, and flight ticket because the transaction closed at 4:00 pm. Further, since May 3rd is a national holiday in Korea, we were not able to make any official transaction.

Mr. Kim again contacted and met the Bank officer on May 3rd individually and explained him about our situation. And he approved to make it available on May 3rd.

Here are my questions:

Re CBIS school

- 1. Were you warned several moths ago that the Seoul Immigration office was having a dispute with "Mr Han" (the school owner) about the school?
- 2. Were you aware they were going to go after the teachers' visas?
- 3. If so, why didn't you warn the teachers or take action to assist, support and protect them?
- 4. I have copies of emails sent to you from s.22 to which you appear to have responded ion January 25, 2017, April 6, 2017 and April 14, 2017. In the emails s.22 says the school's registration for integrated curriculum was canceled in 2011 by a member of the investor group and that they only have license to operate a kindergarten. Korean administrators quit scared BC administrators will find out. Is this correct?
- 5. s.22 says "I can no longer ignore what is happening at CBIC and THE MINISTRY'S CONTINUAL REFUSAL TO INVESTIGATE OR HOLD ANYONE TO TASK (caps mine). Did you investigate or hold anyone accountable, or did you actually refuse.
- 6. s.22 says seven administrators left the school in the past year? Is that correct? Do you know why? Did this alarm or concern you? Did you take any action because of it?
- 7. s.22 says the inspection report was not accurate, is that true?
- 8. Is it correct that every BC-certified teacher working at BC certified offshore schools in SK is on "hawgwan" kindergarten teacher visa and technically working illegally in the country?
- 9. A spokesperson for the BC-certified CBIS teachers says that everything s.22 warned you about began to happen to them. Your emails say you have taken action. What action did you take? The teachers say they had zero communication with the Ministry from Jan 23 April 11, except for the Doug Lauson inspection in April. They say they feel they've been left to be held accountable for the actions and negligence of the BC Ministry of Education and the school's owners. What is your response to that?

I look forward to your response. These teachers clearly deserve some explanations, if not much more for what they've been put through.

Update on Vulnerable Sector Fingerprinting for BC Offshore School Teachers

Dear Offshore School Program Owner/Operators, Offshore School Program Consultants and Liaison

I am writing today to update you on the Vulnerable Sector Fingerprinting process. This update provides some information for teachers who are outside of Canada.

We spoke to staff at the Teacher Regulation Branch about teachers in BC Offshore Schools who may be asked to fulfil the Vulnerable Sector fingerprinting requirement. While they are still not able to complete the fingerprinting outside of Canada, the Criminal Record Review Program provides the following option for them:

Option for Certificate Holders currently residing offshore:

Vulnerable Sector fingerprinting is only available in Canada. As such, certificate holders who are flagged to undergo Vulnerable Sector fingerprinting and are outside of Canada have no mechanism to fulfil the fingerprinting requirement unless they travel to Canada. The Criminal Record Review Program has indicated that it will obtain written consent from those who are unable to travel to Canada to complete the process when they do enter Canada. The Criminal Record Review Program will also request from certificate holders confirmation of the timeframe for when they will be returning to the country and be able to be fingerprinted. The Criminal Record Review Program will monitor these times to ensure compliance. The Criminal Record Review Program will keep the Teacher Regulation Branch apprised of this process so that these certificate holders do not have their certificates suspended/cancelled.

Based on the information collected, the Director of the Criminal Record Review Program will make a decision on whether to tentatively clear the certificate holder prior to the fingerprints being submitted. Should a certificate holder return to Canada, submit fingerprints and be found to have a pardoned sex offence, under section 17.9 (2) of the *Criminal Record Review Act*, the Teacher Regulation Branch Director of Certification must require the person to provide an authorization for a further Criminal Record Check. This would also result in a different adjudication by the Criminal Record Review Program. The Teacher Regulation Branch Director of Certification would be notified in writing at the conclusion of the Criminal Record Review Program process.

We are sorry for the late response.

On April 28, we sent out the email to BC certified teachers to sign their resignation report so that we are able to report their final tax and the National Pension Service in Korea.

We were waiting their sign on their resignation report until May 2nd, but no one stopped by the school and no one signed their resignation report.

It causes many tax issues if we don't report the teacher's resignation to the Tax Service Center and the National Pension Service before they leave.

That is the reason we couldn't send out their salary and flight ticket on May 2nd before we calculate their tax and the national pension in a right way.

Thus, our account manager contacted the tax officer, Bank officer, and the National Pension Service officer to make it a right calculation even teachers didn't turn in their resignation report. Our account manager met and explained them our situation and received their approval to send out their May, June, and flight ticket after tax and their national pension on May 2nd late afternoon. Thus, we were not able to send out the teacher's total amount of May, June, and flight ticket because the transaction closed at 4:00 pm. Further, since May 3rd is a national holiday in Korea, we were not able to make any official transaction.

Mr. Kim again contacted and met the Bank officer on May 3rd individually and explained him about our situation. And he approved to make it available on May 3rd.

We apologize our latest work and please excuse us for not having answered your letter sooner.

We are aware that Mr. Jackie has left sooner than he expected for s.22 and we have been in contact with him as recently as this morning. Mr. Jackie continues to provide the Ministry assistance in our efforts to support teachers.

The Ministry has now received confirmation that the final payments to teachers for May/June salaries and flight allowance have been set in motion, with evidence of the initiation of the bank transfer. I understand that there are national holidays in Korea this week which could potentially slow down processing.

With regard the report cards, we have written confirmation that the report cards were completed and verbal confirmation that they were sent by email to parents. We will continue to monitor this situation to ensure that parents have received the final report cards.

With regard to the immigration and the deportation order and the one year ban, the Ministry will continue to work on this issue in the coming days and weeks and we are committed to connecting with you regarding any developments.

The Ministry appreciates your careful consideration and reflection regarding possible improvements to the offshore school program and will take these points in consideration moving forward. As part of continuous improvement to strengthen the program I will reach out to you to discuss the ideas you have raised over the coming weeks.

At this time, I would request that you provide me the first and last names of all the teachers impacted by the deportation order and one year ban, and would also request that you provide the Ministry an alternate contact email address in case the email account you are currently using is deactivated. It may also be beneficial for me to have an email address for each teacher to ensure the Ministry is able to communicate as needed.

Here is an update to what the Ministry of Education has posted on the "BC Certified Offshore Schools" website:

• In the meantime, over recent days, to help support teachers and students who are impacted, the ministry has acted in a facilitator and supportive role.

The Offshore School Representative, Lowell Jackie s.22 no liaison between the Ministry and the ownership of CBIS.

We now have

• The ministry has now confirmed with the school that teachers will be paid by the school for April, May, and June as per their contracts.

As of May 3rd, teachers have received their monthly salary for April in their bank accounts <u>without</u> the usual pay stub via email. Monthly salaries for May and June have not been distributed.

• The school will also pay for transportation/flight costs for teachers to leave the country as directed by the immigration deportation order.

As of May 3rd, teachers have not received any transportation/flight costs.

• The school will continue to provide accommodation to teachers until they depart.

So far, teachers can stay in their accommodations and have not been given any notice to leave.

• The school will support the principal in issuing final report cards to students/families by April 28.

Some students have received their final report cards from the CBIS administrative office, but many are still waiting.
