Most streams throughout the region have continued to recede following the November 13-15 atmospheric river event; those systems with lake or reservoir-fed watersheds are experiencing a slower recession as water continues to move through these systems. Areas close to the Sumas River continue to experience high water conditions.

Favourable weather conditions in the short term indicate that rivers and streams will continue to recede and recover from this historic event.

The public is advised to stay clear of the fast-flowing rivers and potentially unstable riverbanks during the high-streamflow period.

KEY PROVINCIAL INFORMATION

- The Southwest PREOC is activated to support communities affected by flooding and landslides caused by the Atmospheric River
- 1. On 2021NOV17 the BC government declared a provincial state of emergency to mitigate impacts on transportation networks and movement of essential goods and supplies, and to support the provincewide response and recovery from the widespread damage caused by severe flooding and landslides in British Columbia
- 2. Search & Rescue (SAR) Task Force 1 has been deployed to assist with the rescue of stranded evacuees of the Sumas Prairie region of Abbotsford

- 5. The Southwest PREOC is assisting the District of Hope in accessing critical supplies. Hope estimates they are supporting 1100 evacuees for meals and lodging

The atmospheric river that impacted southern British Columbia over the weekend and Monday has now moved out of the region. Throughout the region river levels have reached their peak levels and have receded overnight Monday and early on Tuesday. Flows and water levels remain high in lake and reservoir-fed watersheds along the Fraser Valley, including the Allouette River and Harrison River. Low-lying terrain around the Sumas River drainage are also expected to have persistent high-water. Generally dry conditions are expected over the next few days. River levels are expected to continue to recede on Tuesday and through the week

Fraser River Debris Trap Update

ADVISORY

An increase in logs and large woody debris may be experienced on the Lower Fraser River, downstream of Agassiz through Saturday 2021NOV20

Recreational boaters, marine traffic and infrastructure operators should be aware that more logs than normal may be floating downstream due to decreased performance of the Fraser River Debris Trap. Based on new aerial images today, 2021NOV17, high debris volumes have misaligned the booms that direct debris into the Trap. Contractors are inspecting and attempting to realign the booms today, but repairs are expected to take longer

Normally, the Fraser River Debris Trap diverts up to 70% of the woody debris coming downstream near Agassiz before it flows into the lower reaches of the Fraser. Although there is always some volume of logs and floating debris in the River, an increase in the number of floating logs getting past the Debris Trap is anticipated

The atmospheric river that impacted southern British Columbia over the weekend and Monday has now moved out of the region. Throughout the region river levels have reached their peak levels and have receded overnight Monday and early on Tuesday. Flows and water levels remain high in lake and reservoir-fed watersheds along the Fraser Valley, including the Allouette River and Harrison River. Low-lying terrain around the Sumas River drainage are also expected to have persistent high-water. Generally dry conditions are expected over the next few days. River levels are expected to continue to recede on Tuesday and through the week

Fraser River Debris Trap Update

ADVISORY

An increase in logs and large woody debris may be experienced on the Lower Fraser River, downstream of Agassiz through Saturday 2021NOV20

Recreational boaters, marine traffic and infrastructure operators should be aware that more logs than normal may be floating downstream due to decreased performance of the Fraser River Debris Trap. Based on new aerial images today, 2021NOV17, high debris volumes have misaligned the booms that direct debris into the Trap. Contractors are inspecting and attempting to realign the booms today, but repairs are expected to take longer

Normally, the Fraser River Debris Trap diverts up to 70% of the woody debris coming downstream near Agassiz before it flows into the lower reaches of the Fraser. Although there is always some volume of logs and floating debris in the River, an increase in the number of floating logs getting past the Debris Trap is anticipated



Most streams throughout the region have continued to recede following the 2021Nov13-15 atmospheric river event; those systems with lake or reservoir-fed watersheds are experiencing a slower recession as water continues to move through these systems. Areas close to the Sumas River continue to experience high water conditions. Favourable weather conditions in the short term indicate that rivers and streams will continue to recede and recover from this historic event

Fraser River Debris Trap Update

ADVISORY

An increase in logs and large woody debris may be experienced on the Lower Fraser River, downstream of Agassiz through Saturday 2021NOV20

Recreational boaters, marine traffic and infrastructure operators should be aware that more logs than normal may be floating downstream due to decreased performance of the Fraser River Debris Trap. Based on new aerial images today, 2021NOV17, high debris volumes have misaligned the booms that direct debris into the Trap. Contractors are inspecting and attempting to realign the booms today, but repairs are expected to take longer

Normally, the Fraser River Debris Trap diverts up to 70% of the woody debris coming downstream near Agassiz before it flows into the lower reaches of the Fraser. Although there is always some volume of logs and floating debris in the River, an increase in the number of floating logs getting past the Debris Trap is anticipated

- On 2021NOV15 Pemberton Fire Rescue Service advised the SLRD EOC that a mudslide occurred in the vicinity of 1773 Reid Road, inundating the road approx. 1m deep due to a steep creek debris flow
 - MoTI and contractor attended the road washout 2021NOV16, cleared debris, and report that there is now
 approximatEly an 8 foot trench in the road. The culvert will likely need to be removed and replaced due to age
 and damage

Favourable weather conditions in the short term indicate that rivers and streams will continue to recede and recover from this historic event

Fraser River Debris Trap Update

ADVISORY

An increase in logs and large woody debris may be experienced on the Lower Fraser River, downstream of Agassiz through Saturday 2021NOV20

Recreational boaters, marine traffic and infrastructure operators should be aware that more logs than normal may be floating downstream due to decreased performance of the Fraser River Debris Trap. Based on new aerial images today, 2021NOV17, high debris volumes have misaligned the booms that direct debris into the Trap. Contractors are inspecting and attempting to realign the booms today, but repairs are expected to take longer

Normally, the Fraser River Debris Trap diverts up to 70% of the woody debris coming downstream near Agassiz before it flows into the lower reaches of the Fraser. Although there is always some volume of logs and floating debris in the River, an increase in the number of floating logs getting past the Debris Trap is anticipated

- Rainfall caused wide spread flooding on public and private property, as well as parks and trails, and sewer lift stations
- Multiple roads impacted due to flooding

- EOC activated due to localized flooding and to provide mutual aid to Abbotsford

- EOC activated 2021NOV15 due to flood activity
- Stranded travellers from the Hwy 99/Duffy Lake Road mudslide in the Pemberton area continue to be impacted by highway closures. The Pemberton and District Community Centre has seen an influx in those requiring use of shower facilities. Lil'wat Nation has also seen a significant number of travellers sleeping in their vehicles at the Chevron Gas Station and camping in multiple different locations
- Connection has been made with additional travellers requiring ESS and other services
- 11 individuals have been provided lodging, food and other referral supports
- As localized flooding is taking some time to drain, damage and impacts to trails and infrastructure is still unknown

Pitt Meadows, City of

- Incident: Heavy rainfall has resulted in multiple roads flooding
- EOC stood down on 2021NOV17
- The City has progressed to a routine clean up stage following the event
- Localized flooding was experienced in the Bordertown area, however 224th is open and water appears to be subsiding

- The evacuation alert issued on 2021NOV15 for Tunnel Station/Upper Paradise Valley Electoral Area D was rescinded 2021NOV16
- A geotechnical engineer will be in the Jason Creek area again 2021NOV18, continuing their survey of the creek system in the Reid Road and Walkerville areas where damage has been observed. As the area is heavily treed and the upper reaches are inaccessible by foot, the plan is for a drone flight to the upper reaches of the two creeks. Initial findings from 2021NOV17 is that there is further debris available to come downstream in the next heavy rain event, and at the furthest point able to be surveyed on foot today, the creek is still running black, indicating further debris available upstream of this point
- The SLRD is working with MFLNRORD and MoTI for urgent access improvements to the McKenzie FSR and Reid Road
- The EOC has requested advice from the SWE PREOC as to how to mitigate the risk upstream of the Reid Road washout. Terrain is steep, treed, and heavy machinery access may not be possible or with specialized machinery only
- On 2021NOV15 Pemberton Fire Rescue Service advised the SLRD EOC that a mudslide occurred in the vicinity of 1773 Reid Road, inundating the road approx. 1m deep due to a steep creek debris flow
 - MoTI and contractor attended the road washout 2021NOV16, cleared debris, and report that there is now
 approximatEly an 8 foot trench in the road. The culvert will likely need to be removed and replaced due to age
 and damage
 - MFLNRORD conducted an aerial survey of the S2S area 2021NOV16
- The continued closure of the Duffy Lake Road / Hwy 99 and other closures are constraining access around the regional district, and there are a number of stranded travellers in the S2S member municipalities who are unable to get home at this time
- EOC Information Officers continue to receive a volume of media and public enquiries, and to publish regular updates

Squamish District

- Incident: Localized flooding due to heavy rainfall. Waste Treatment Plant overflowing



 - **0.** Non-essential vehicles, including the general public, will still have access to fuel available through retail gas stations. People will be limited to 30 litres per trip to the gas station
 - 1. Non-essential travel along severely affected highways is prohibited by an order for:
 - Highway 99: from the junction of Highway 99 and Lillooet River Road to the BC Hydro Seton Lake Campsite access in Lillooet. Only passenger vehicles and commercial vehicles up to 14,500 kilograms will be permitted.
 - Highway 3: from the junction of Highway 5 and Highway 3 in Hope to the west entrance to Princeton from Highway 3
 - Highway 7: from the junction of Highway 7 and Highway 9 in Agassiz to the junction of Highway 7 and Highway 1 in Hope

The River Forecast Centre is maintaining the following advisory:

Sumas River including Sumas Prairie and surround areas – Flood Warning (MAINTAINED)

The following advisories are ended:

Fraser Valley, including the Chilliwack River – High Streamflow Advisory (ENDED)

River levels on tributary rivers through the region have receded to pre-event levels. Flows in lake-fed watersheds are slower to recede but have dropped below levels of concern. Flooding persists in the Sumas River and Sumas Prairie areas. Showers over the next few days are expected to be light, with limited contribution to flood level expected. Longer range rainfall is possible into next week and is continuing to be monitored for potential impacts to flood level. Overflow from the Nooksack River is not expected to contribute to the Sumas River drainage over the coming days, and the Nooksack River has dropped below flood level

Fraser River Debris Trap Update

ADVISORY

An increase in logs and large woody debris may be experienced on the Lower Fraser River, downstream of Agassiz through Saturday 2021NOV20

Recreational boaters, marine traffic and infrastructure operators should be aware that more logs than normal may be floating downstream due to decreased performance of the Fraser River Debris Trap. Based on new aerial images from 2021NOV17, high debris volumes have misaligned the booms that direct debris into the Trap. Contractors are inspecting and attempting to realign the booms, but repairs are expected to take longer

Normally, the Fraser River Debris Trap diverts up to 70% of the woody debris coming downstream near Agassiz before it flows into the lower reaches of the Fraser. Although there is always some volume of logs and floating debris in the River, an increase in the number of floating logs getting past the Debris Trap is anticipated

 - Highway 99: from the junction of Highway 99 and Lillooet River Road to the BC Hydro Seton Lake Campsite access in Lillooet. Only passenger vehicles and commercial vehicles up to 14,500 kilograms will be permitted.
 - Highway 3: from the junction of Highway 5 and Highway 3 in Hope to the west entrance to Princeton from Highway 3
 - Highway 7: from the junction of Highway 7 and Highway 9 in Agassiz to the junction of Highway 7 and Highway 1 in Hope

The River Forecast Centre is maintaining the following advisory:

Sumas River including Sumas Prairie and surround areas – Flood Warning (MAINTAINED)

The following advisories are ended:

Fraser Valley, including the Chilliwack River – High Streamflow Advisory (ENDED)

River levels on tributary rivers through the region have receded to pre-event levels. Flows in lake-fed watersheds are slower to recede but have dropped below levels of concern. Flooding persists in the Sumas River and Sumas Prairie areas. Showers over the next few days are expected to be light, with limited contribution to flood level expected. Longer range rainfall is possible into next week and is continuing to be monitored for potential impacts to flood level. Overflow from the Nooksack River is not expected to contribute to the Sumas River drainage over the coming days, and the Nooksack River has dropped below flood level

Fraser River Debris Trap Update

ADVISORY

An increase in logs and large woody debris may be experienced on the Lower Fraser River, downstream of Agassiz through Saturday 2021NOV20

Recreational boaters, marine traffic and infrastructure operators should be aware that more logs than normal may be floating downstream due to decreased performance of the Fraser River Debris Trap. Based on new aerial images from 2021NOV17, high debris volumes have misaligned the booms that direct debris into the Trap. Contractors are inspecting and attempting to realign the booms, but repairs are expected to take longer

Normally, the Fraser River Debris Trap diverts up to 70% of the woody debris coming downstream near Agassiz before it flows into the lower reaches of the Fraser. Although there is always some volume of logs and floating debris in the River, an increase in the number of floating logs getting past the Debris Trap is anticipated

- The evacuation alert issued on 2021NOV15 for Tunnel Station/Upper Paradise Valley Electoral Area D was rescinded 2021NOV16
- The Red Cross continues to provide emergency support services to stranded travellers throughout the SLRD
- A geotechnical engineer will be in the Jason Creek area again 2021NOV18, continuing their survey of the creek system in the Reid Road and Walkerville areas where damage has been observed. As the area is heavily treed and the upper reaches are inaccessible by foot, the plan is for a drone flight to the upper reaches of the two creeks. Initial

findings from 2021NOV17 is that there is further debris available to come downstream in the next heavy rain event, and at the furthest point able to be surveyed on foot today, the creek is still running black, indicating further debris available upstream of this point. Further erosion will likely compromise the foundation of two to three residential structures, and such erosion is assessed as likely given that additional upstream debris is available to come down in the next heavy rain event. Geotechnical report currently being completed after further ground and drone survey work on 2021NOV18

- The SLRD is working with MFLNRORD and MoTI for urgent access improvements to the McKenzie FSR and Reid Road
- The EOC has requested advice from the SWE PREOC as to how to mitigate the risk upstream of the Reid Road washout. Terrain is steep, treed, and heavy machinery access may not be possible or with specialized machinery only

Squamish District

- Incident: Localized flooding due to heavy rainfall. Waste Treatment Plant overflowing
- EOC activated 2021NOV15 due to localized flooding concerns
- A task force has been formed for the Mamquam Ring Creek Rd damage. As of 2021NOV17, the fracture is approximately 500m long



I hope this answers your question. Please let me know if you need more information. The following was pulled from the attached Orange Weather Notification sent to us by ECCC.

The inner South Coast will receive 20-40 mm of precipitation between Monday and Tuesday (November 22-23, 2021). Prior to the precipitation arriving, on Sunday night freezing levels will rise to 2600 m causing initial precipitation to fall as rain to mountaintop. Freezing levels fall throughout the event and finish near 1000 m by Tuesday morning.

- There may be some windy condition on Monday and Tuesday in the Fraser Valley. Southeasterly winds on Monday will turn southwesterly by Tuesday in the 20-50 km/h range.
- A new AR for the BC coast is likely on Thursday, November 25th, though details on location, duration and intensity remain uncertain. We will provide more details on Monday

 - Highway 99: from the junction of Highway 99 and Lillooet River Road to the BC Hydro Seton Lake Campsite access in Lillooet. Only passenger vehicles and commercial vehicles up to 14,500 kilograms will be permitted.
 - Highway 3: from the junction of Highway 5 and Highway 3 in Hope to the west entrance to Princeton from Highway 3
 - Highway 7: from the junction of Highway 7 and Highway 9 in Agassiz to the junction of Highway 7 and Highway 1 in Hope

As the area is heavily treed and the upper reaches are inaccessible by foot, the plan is for a drone flight to the upper reaches of the two creeks. Initial

findings from 2021NOV17 is that there is further debris available to come downstream in the next heavy rain event, and at the furthest point able to be surveyed on foot today, the creek is still running black, indicating further debris available upstream of this point. Further erosion will likely compromise the foundation of two to three residential structures, and such erosion is assessed as likely given that additional upstream debris is available to come down in the next heavy rain event. Geotechnical report currently being completed after further ground and drone survey work on 2021NOV18

- The SLRD is working with MFLNRORD and MoTI for urgent access improvements to the McKenzie FSR and Reid Road
- The EOC has requested advice from the SWE PREOC as to how to mitigate the risk upstream of the Reid Road washout. Terrain is steep, treed, and heavy machinery access may not be possible or with specialized machinery only
- Reid Road is open as of 2021NOV19, one lane only as a temporary repair until upstream debris is addressed
- Geotechnical survey and initial risk assessment of affected creeks and properties has been completed. Written report is expected early next week.
- MoTI contractor Miller Capilano may be able to remove the most readily available debris upstream of Reid Road because it directly threatens the viability of the road, any culvert replacement and full road repair. EOC will continue to liaise with MoTI to confirm next steps.
- Stranded travellers in the SLRD currently receiving ESS include approximately: 19 households in Lillooet, 9 households in Whistler, 5 households in Pemberton.
- Coordinated travel advisory messaging across all jurisdictions in the regional boundaries has been completed in anticipation of Highway 99 / Duffey Lake Road reopening on Sunday November 21. Purpose is to reinforce essential only travel and being prepared for challenging conditions on this stretch of road if travel is undertaken.
- Search and Rescue work is continuing in the Hwy 99 / Duffey Lake Road area.



UPDATE: 2021NOV19 at 0745 hrs

The River Forecast Centre is maintaining the following advisory:

Sumas River including Sumas Prairie and surround areas – Flood Warning (MAINTAINED)

The following advisories are ended:

Fraser Valley, including the Chilliwack River – High Streamflow Advisory (ENDED)

River levels on tributary rivers through the region have receded to pre-event levels. Flows in lake-fed watersheds are slower to recede but have dropped below levels of concern. Flooding persists in the Sumas River and Sumas Prairie areas. Showers over the next few days are expected to be light, with limited contribution to flood level expected. Longer range rainfall is possible into next week and is continuing to be monitored for potential impacts to flood level. Overflow from the Nooksack River is not expected to contribute to the Sumas River drainage over the coming days, and the Nooksack River has dropped below flood level

Fraser River Debris Trap Update

ADVISORY - Update 2021NOV21 1200hrs

An increase in logs and large woody debris may be experienced on the Lower Fraser River, downstream of Agassiz through Friday November 26. Recreational boaters, marine traffic and infrastructure operators should be aware that more logs than normal may be floating downstream due to decreased performance of the Fraser River Debris Trap

High debris volumes misaligned the booms that direct debris into the Trap following the rainfall event. An assessment and repairs are underway. With a return to more seasonal lower flow levels along the Fraser River, the volume of woody debris entering the Trap is lower than during spring freshet periods

Normally, the Fraser River Debris Trap diverts up to 70% of the woody debris coming downstream near Agassiz before it flows into the lower reaches of the Fraser. Although there is always some volume of logs and floating debris in the River, an increase in the number of floating logs getting past the Debris Trap is anticipated

KEY PROVINCIAL INFORMATION

- The Southwest PREOC is activated to support communities affected by flooding and landslides caused by the Atmospheric River 2021NOV14
- On 2021NOV17 the BC government declared a Provincial State of Emergency to mitigate impacts on transportation networks and movement of essential goods and supplies, and to support the provincewide response and recovery from the widespread damage caused by severe flooding and landslides in British Columbia
- Search & Rescue (SAR) Task Force 1 was deployed on 2021NOV17. They are currently set up in the field to do rapid damage assessment for the west side of Sumas Prairie
- As a result of the severe weather events, EMBC has approved Disaster Financial Assistance (DFA) for flooding in the Vancouver Island, Southwest and Central regions of the province, including First Nation communities, electoral areas and municipal areas within these regions
- On November 19, 2021, the Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General announced two new Orders under the Emergency Program Act prioritizing fuel for essential vehicles, limiting fuel purchases to 30 litres per trip for the general public, and restricting non-essential travel through impacted areas.
 - This order applies to all fuel suppliers in the Lower Mainland-to-Hope region, the Sea-to-Sky region, Sunshine Coast, the Gulf Islands and Vancouver Island

River Forecast Centre

UPDATE: 2021NOV19 at 0745 hrs

The River Forecast Centre is maintaining the following advisory:

Sumas River including Sumas Prairie and surround areas - Flood Warning (MAINTAINED)

The following advisories are ended:

Fraser Valley, including the Chilliwack River – High Streamflow Advisory (ENDED)

River levels on tributary rivers through the region have receded to pre-event levels. Flows in lake-fed watersheds are slower to recede but have dropped below levels of concern. Flooding persists in the Sumas River and Sumas Prairie areas. Showers over the next few days are expected to be light, with limited contribution to flood level expected. Longer range rainfall is possible into next week and is continuing to be monitored for potential impacts to flood level. Overflow from the Nooksack River is not expected to contribute to the Sumas River drainage over the coming days, and the Nooksack River has dropped below flood level

Fraser River Debris Trap Update

ADVISORY - Update 2021NOV21 1200hrs

An increase in logs and large woody debris may be experienced on the Lower Fraser River, downstream of Agassiz through Friday November 26. Recreational boaters, marine traffic and infrastructure operators should be aware that more logs than normal may be floating downstream due to decreased performance of the Fraser River Debris Trap

High debris volumes misaligned the booms that direct debris into the Trap following the rainfall event. An assessment and repairs are underway. With a return to more seasonal lower flow levels along the Fraser River, the volume of woody debris entering the Trap is lower than during spring freshet periods

Normally, the Fraser River Debris Trap diverts up to 70% of the woody debris coming downstream near Agassiz before it flows into the lower reaches of the Fraser. Although there is always some volume of logs and floating debris in the River, an increase in the number of floating logs getting past the Debris Trap is anticipated



Hi Stella.

Please find the Excel file attached, which includes:

- The estimated hourly water levels for Fraser River at Mission from Nov. 19 to 28, 2021 using our hydraulic model. The model inflows were obtained from the RFC's CLEVER forecast today.
 The model boundary conditions downstream were based on the tidal levels from Canadian Hydrographic Services' website.
- The estimated water levels at Barrowtown Pump Station by simply adding 1.2 m to the Mission water levels.

Please be aware that the estimated water levels at Mission could be at low accuracy because 1) our hydraulic model is generally applicable at the Mission level > 4 m, but it is about 2.5 m now; 2) the uncertanities about rain and flow forecasting have significant impact on the water level forecasting. Please let me know if you have any questions and need additional supports.







The River Forecast Centre is **upgrading** to a **Flood Watch**:

The River Forecast Centre is **issuing or maintaining** a **High Streamflow Advisory** for:

- Fraser Canyon tributaries, including tributaries around Hope (NEW)
- Central Vancouver Island including tributaries around Port Alberni (NEW)
- Howe Sound
- Sunshine Coast
- Sea-to-Sky
- North Shore Mountains
- Metro Vancouver
- Fraser Valley including the Chilliwack River and surrounding tributaries
- South Vancouver Island
- West Vancouver Island
- East Vancouver Island

A significant atmospheric river has made landfall across southern coastal regions of British Columbia. Observed rainfall amounts since yesterday have been in the 50-75mm range through Howe Sound, North Shore Mountains, and Sunshine Coast; 30-50mm in the Fraser Valley – East, Fraser Canyon and areas around Hope and Harrison Lake; 40-115mm around Southern Vancouver Island; 20-40 mm around Eastern Vancouver Island; 80-130mm around Western Vancouver Island.

Environment and Climate Change Canada have continued rainfall warnings in effect across the region. Forecasted rainfall on Sunday through Monday is expected to be in the 50-75 mm range across East and South Vancouver Island; up to 100mm across Western and Inland Vancouver Island; up to 75mm around Metro Vancouver; up to 100mm across North Shore Mountains and western Fraser Valley around Abbotsford; up to 150mm across Howe Sound and eastern Fraser Valley around Chilliwack to Hope; and up to 80mm across areas of the Fraser Canyon.

Temperatures have been rising, with temperatures in the 5-7°C range being observed at automated snow weather stations across the region. Snowmelt is being observed at midelevations and is expected to add additional runoff to rivers.

Rivers have risen rapidly from rainfall since yesterday. Additional rises are expected through Sunday in response to forecasted rainfall today, and ease on Monday as the heaviest rainfall passes. Current modelling is indicating the potential for flows in the 2-year to 5-year range. On the Englishman River, flows are already high and additional rainfall forecasted for today is indicating the potential for the river to reach or exceed flood stage (approximately 280 m³/s at the Water Survey of Canada gauge 08HB002 Englishman River near Parksville).

The public is advised to stay clear of the fast-flowing rivers and potentially unstable riverbanks during the high-streamflow period.

The <u>River Forecast Centre</u> continues to monitor the conditions and will provide updates as conditions warrant.

The River Forecast Centre is **issuing or maintaining** a **High Streamflow Advisory** for:

- Sea-to-Sky
- North Shore Mountains
- Metro Vancouver
- Fraser Valley including the Chilliwack River and surrounding tributaries
- South Vancouver Island
- West Vancouver Island
- East Vancouver Island

A significant atmospheric river has made landfall across southern coastal regions of British Columbia. Observed rainfall amounts since yesterday have been in the 50-75mm range through Howe Sound, North Shore Mountains, and Sunshine Coast; 30-50mm in the Fraser Valley – East, Fraser Canyon and areas around Hope and Harrison Lake; 40-115mm around Southern Vancouver Island; 20-40 mm around Eastern Vancouver Island; 80-130mm around Western Vancouver Island.

Environment and Climate Change Canada have continued rainfall warnings in effect across the region. Forecasted rainfall on Sunday through Monday is expected to be in the 50-75 mm range across East and South Vancouver Island; up to 100mm across Western and Inland Vancouver Island; up to 75mm around Metro Vancouver; up to 100mm across North Shore Mountains and western Fraser Valley around Abbotsford; up to 150mm across Howe Sound and eastern Fraser Valley around Chilliwack to Hope; and up to 80mm across areas of the Fraser Canyon.

Temperatures have been rising, with temperatures in the 5-7°C range being observed at automated snow weather stations across the region. Snowmelt is being observed at midelevations and is expected to add additional runoff to rivers.

Rivers have risen rapidly from rainfall since yesterday. Additional rises are expected through Sunday in response to forecasted rainfall today, and ease on Monday as the heaviest rainfall passes. Current modelling is indicating the potential for flows in the 2-year to 5-year range. On the Englishman River, flows are already high and additional rainfall forecasted for today is indicating the potential for the river to reach or exceed flood stage (approximately 280 m³/s at the Water Survey of Canada gauge 08HB002 Englishman River near Parksville). Flows on the Chilliwack River above Slesse Creek (08MH103) have reached 260 m3/s (5-year flow) and are expected to continue to rise throughout Sunday.

The River Forecast Centre is **upgrading or maintaining** a **Flood Watch**:

- Fraser Valley including surrounding tributaries (NEW)
- Fraser Canyon tributaries, including tributaries around Hope (NEW)
- Chilliwack River
- Englishman River

The River Forecast Centre is **maintaining** a **High Streamflow Advisory** for:

- Central Vancouver Island including tributaries around Port Alberni
- Howe Sound
- Sunshine Coast
- Sea-to-Sky
- North Shore Mountains
- Metro Vancouver
- South Vancouver Island
- West Vancouver Island
- East Vancouver Island

A significant atmospheric river has made landfall across southern coastal regions of British Columbia. Observed rainfall amounts since yesterday have been in the 50-100mm range through Howe Sound, North Shore Mountains, and Sunshine Coast; 45-85mm in the Fraser Valley — East, Fraser Canyon and areas around Hope and Harrison Lake; 60-140mm around Southern Vancouver Island; 30-60 mm around Eastern Vancouver Island; 100-145mm around Western Vancouver Island.

Environment and Climate Change Canada have continued rainfall warnings in effect across the region. Forecasted rainfall on Sunday through Monday is expected to be in the 50-75 mm range across East and South Vancouver Island; up to 100mm across Western and Inland Vancouver Island; up to 75mm around Metro Vancouver; up to 100mm across North Shore Mountains and western Fraser Valley around Abbotsford; up to 150mm across Howe Sound and eastern Fraser Valley around Chilliwack to Hope; and up to 80mm across areas of the Fraser Canyon.

Temperatures have been rising, with temperatures in the 5-7°C range being observed at automated snow weather stations across the region. Snowmelt is being observed at mid-elevations and is expected to add additional runoff to rivers.

Rivers have risen rapidly from rainfall since yesterday. Additional rises are expected through Sunday in response to forecasted rainfall today, and ease on Monday as the heaviest rainfall passes. Current modelling is indicating the potential for flows in the 2-year to 5-year range. On the Englishman River, flows are already high and additional rainfall forecasted for today is indicating the potential for the river to reach or exceed flood stage (approximately 280 m³/s at the Water Survey of Canada gauge 08HB002 Englishman River near Parksville). Flows on the Chilliwack River above Slesse Creek (08MH103) have reached 260 m3/s (5-year flow) and are expected to continue to rise overnight

The public is advised to stay clear of the fast-flowing rivers and potentially unstable riverbanks during the high-streamflow period.

The <u>River Forecast Centre</u> continues to monitor the conditions and will provide updates as conditions warrant.

A *Flood Warning* means that river levels have exceeded bankfull or will exceed bankfull imminently, and that flooding of areas adjacent to the rivers affected will result.
