PROVINCIAL SITUATION

The EMBC Provincial Emergency Coordination Centre (PECC) is activated to Level 2 in support of the Central and Southeast Provincial Regional Emergency Operations Centres (PREOCs) that are activated for wildfire response.

The interface fire situation in the province is ongoing. There are now 643 properties on Evacuation Order and 943 properties on Evacuation Alert.

Campfire bans have been put in place in the Coastal, Kamloops and Southeast Fire Centres.

The PECC continues to monitor the situation and work with the activated PREOCs, Provincial Ministries, and Federal Partners to ensure that the appropriate response and recovery support is being provided to all necessary parties.

Weather Outlooks and Alerts

A Pacific frontal system will move into northern B.C. today spreading precipitation to the Yukon, the northern interior and the North Coast. A ridge of high pressure will build over central and southern B.C. bringing sunny skies to these regions. The ridge will persist Sunday and into the beginning of next week. Temperatures will be on the rise again in southern B.C., whereas showers are forecast for the northern interior and the North Coast.

There are currently no weather alerts in effect for BC.

The Salvation Army

- The Salvation Army was asked by the Lytton Unmet Needs Committee to provide bottled water to Lytton First Nation and Westside residents
- They delivered 4 skids of 1.5 litre bottles of water; and are on standby to provide more water if needed
- Continuing wildfire planning across the province

BC Wildfire Service (BCWS)

Keremeos Creek K50863

- Fire is estimated at [6712ha](#) and classified as Out of Control. Decrease in perimeter size is due to more accurate track on the northern portion of the fire by ground crews.
- Structure Protection Branch continues to protect properties in all areas of concern at fire's edge.
- The Olalla Creek Forest Service Road is closed in support of the suppression efforts

Watching Creek Wildfire K20872

- Fire is estimated at 270ha and is now considered Being Held
- The last update on this fire will be tomorrow, August 11, 2022

Maria Creek K70927

- Fire is estimated at 1004ha and classified as Out of Control
- The weather forecast is for isolated to scattered thunderstorms with possible dry lightning today. Cloud over the region will moderate the warm and dry conditions. There is potential for increased fire behaviour with winds from thunderstorm passage.
- The Veasy FSR is closed for the safety of the public and firefighters

Fire Bans and Restrictions

- Effective August 4, 2022, campfires, are prohibited throughout the Kamloops Fire Centre and will remain in effect until noon on October 15, 2022, or until the orders are rescinded
- An Area Restriction Order is in place north of Heffley Creek in the area of Evergreen. This area restriction came into effect on June 17, 2022, for the purpose of limiting the risk of human caused wildfires in the area

Emergency Support Services (ESS)

- There are multiple Group Lodging facilities on standby within the region
- RDOS is providing virtual Reception Centre services as needed

First Nations' Emergency Services Society (FNESS)

- A two-person team is conducting wildfire assessment in Ts'kw'aylaxw First Nation near Lillooet
