As I recall, there is an underlying \$/MW assumption based on the taxes payable by a gas-fired generator that results in the amount payable per facility, and then those amounts are allocated based on both host and impacted local governments (the amounts in the OICs), then escalated based on increases in local government taxation.

If Johnny wants the underlying \$/MW assumption, you will need to go to tax policy for that (you could try Duncan Jillings or Chris Dawkins).

An OIC setting out amounts for BC Hydro grants in lieu to municipalities and regional districts was put in place in 2011. See OIC 268/2011 here:

It has been amended several times to update the grant amounts and the years that they are applicable to. This includes via OIC 21/2103, OIC 265/2016 and OIC 533/2017, which appears to be the latest update. OIC 533/2017 can be viewed here:

In 2016, via OIC 266/2016, the Hydro and Power Authority Annual Grants Order was made. It sets out how grants to treaty First Nations are calculated and also includes further details on the various taxes used to calculate BC Hydro grant payments to municipalities and regional districts. It can be

Hi Shannon,

You are correct, in that the calculations are based on the generation capacity of the facilities – the underlying idea is to have the facilities pay a similar amount of property taxes (via a grant in lieu) that a gas fired plant with similar MW capacity would pay.

There is also an inflationary factor built into the calculations based on municipal property taxes (these are found in Schedule 703 here - <a href="https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/governments/local-governments/facts-framework/statistics/tax-rates-tax-burden">https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/governments/local-governments/facts-framework/statistics/tax-rates-tax-burden</a>). Essentially, payments rise with total municipal taxes collected, but with a few years' lag. The calculation is laid out in OIC 268/211.

Then as you mentioned, those amounts are allocated based on the impact to host and neighboring jurisdictions. The exact details of how the grants were distributed are unfortunately lost to time – much of it goes back to 1989 when the scheme was originally implemented. I could possibly share a little more detail with you if you are interested. Feel free to give me a call.
