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Joint BC/CAN Guidance Document: Sec 11 Revisions

This document is intended to guide discussion at the Joint BC/ADM Section 11 meeting on July 27, 8:30 AM – 9:30 AM PST; 11:30 AM – 12:30 PM EST.

The document is organized to review:

- 1. What we heard: direction from ADMs to the drafting team from June 19, 2017;
- 2. What we did: how the BC/CAN drafting team addressed those comments in the draft of Parts 2 4 of the Agreement presented here;
- 3. What we need: direction required from BC and Canada ADMs;
- 4. What we will do next: listing our intended immediate next steps.

1. What we heard: Direction from ADMs, June 19, 2017

The drafting team focussed on the following key takeaways from the ADMs discussion on June 19th:

- ECCC needs to see specific, strong commitments that lead to outcomes linked to the federal recovery strategy (RS) to support the agreement being an alternative to an order.
- Planning for strong commitments requires meaningful engagement, so the process elements are important.
- A successful agreement should: map out a positive trajectory for SMC in the Central Group, supported by actions to protect from immediate and ultimate risks to the recovery of SMC; set out an approach to coordination between BC/CAN and the science that supports the decisions behind these commitments; and allow space for the actions to be reviewed and refined through the appropriate planning processes and engagement with First Nations.
- Recognizing that BC is committed to undertaking extensive caribou recovery planning
 over the next two years (notably the revision of the Peace Northern Caribou Plan), to
 ensure the outcomes of that work are reflected, options were presented to re-draft the
 agreement as a shorter-term agreement or a longer term agreement with a review
 milestone (e.g., two years) with a commitment to review and include refined
 quantification of recovery actions in a subsequent Agreement.
- There is a limit to what BC can commit to during the interregnum / caretaker period; a
 balance is required between moving fast on an agreement with only existing
 commitments or moving more slowly to seek the direction and mandate from the
 incoming government.
- Timing of First Nations' engagement is important, and the first step is a solid document we can share with First Nations to support the conversation.

ADMs directed the Sec 11 Drafting Team to consider a number of additional elements to strengthen the agreement outline. These include:

- Quantification of recovery measure outcomes;
- Connection and coordination with provincial and federal planning processes; and
- Duration of the agreement, and milestones for review of the agreement outcomes.

2. What we did: how the BC/CAN drafting team addressed those comments in the draft of Parts 2 – 4 of the Agreement presented here presented here

Based on the direction provided by the ADMs, the BC and Canada drafting team have held several discussion meetings and BC has had an internal ADM check-in to prepare the attached, revised document for BC and Canada ADM review – this document includes Part 2 (Purpose), Part 3 (Coordination), and Part 4 (Recovery Measures) of a draft Section 11 Agreement.

The following changes are highlighted for ADMs discussion:

- The term of the Agreement is five years with a two-year review milestone: the draft identifies what will be implemented over the next two years both in the form of actions to support recovery and recovery planning, what will come (actions or commitments) through BC's planning process at the end of the two years, and commitments to higher level outcomes that will endure beyond the two-year timeframe.
- Where possible, quantifiable targets are now included for each commitment in Part 4 (Recovery Measures) to explain the contribution of each action to the recovery goals and to help make process elements more tangible.
- Where possible, options for federal funding have been identified next to possible enhanced target commitments in Part 4 (Recovery Measures).
- The Agreement now specifically outlines population and distribution targets that are
 consistent with the desired outcomes for self-sustaining populations in the SMC 2014
 Recovery Strategy; the specific goals and actions are outlined in the Recovery Measures
 section (Part 4).
- The Agreement proposes a mechanism to collaborate on the science required to resolve differences of opinion with respect to caribou habitat and recovery.

3. What we need: Key questions for direction from BC and Canada ADMs

I. <u>Recovery Measures and Commitments:</u> Acknowledging that the targets as outlined <u>are interim goals</u> of a five-year Agreement with a two-year review milestone, some of these targets recognize short-term actions necessary for protection and recovery of SMC (e.g. maternity penning and predator control), and outline longer-term commitments for self-sustaining populations.

Are these goals ambitious enough, as written, to support a narrative on "turning the corner for collaboration on, and recovery of, SMC and a viable alternative to a Protection Order?" If not, what are the implications for the Sec 11?

Alternative Option: If the goals are not ambitious enough in ECCC's view, CWS staff will take the draft back and define what would be acceptable for BC's review. If BC cannot accept these changes, there is no path forward for a Sec 11 Agreement.

- II. Federal funding: In several of the commitments outlined in Part 4 (Recovery Measures), BC has proposed "stretch" goals/targets that could be met with federal funding support. Does Canada support the inclusion of this text? If not, what tangible, short-term commitments will the federal government propose for support on recovery?
- III. <u>Engagement timelines:</u> the best available option for First Nations engagement, as it stands, is for a draft agreement to be provided to First Nations via email at the end of August following a mandate from BC's incoming government, and initial discussion meetings held in September, 2017 (pending interest and availability of First Nations.)

The timelines for engaging First Nations communities means that we will not have received feedback on the draft Agreement by the end of August.

An effective Agreement will require First Nations engagement, and a signal from First Nations that the measures and commitments outlined are a step in the right direction. This will require effective engagement – the September timelines are not optimal for fulsome engagement.

In addition to engagement with First Nations, it is important for BC that BC and Canada jointly engage with affected industry stakeholders – these stakeholders are part of the recovery picture, and the success of the Agreement will depend in part on support from these sectors.

For direction of ADMs:

- 1) Do we want to proceed with a public statement about the Agreement before we have definitive engagement with First Nations?
- 2) What are the objectives of engagement with First Nations?

4. What we will do next: Proposed Immediate Next Steps

- If Parts 2-4 are approved in principle with comments and further direction from ADMs, the drafting team will complete revisions to the remainder of the Agreement to bring inline with these parts and return for ADM review by the week of August 14.
- The drafting team will seek initial legal review of the Agreement before the next ADM review.
- Once legal review is complete and BC and Canada accept the draft as ready for engagement, the draft Agreement would be shared with FNs at the end of August along with a request to meet in early September.
- In addition, BC will begin arranging stakeholder updates in consultation with Canada.
- Canada is working on revising the 2014 Recovery Strategy for SMC for fall, 2017. BC has begun initial discussions with CWS to consider elements of a mechanism for collaboration on science and revisions to the recovery strategy. However, these initial discussions are likely to be outpaced by CWS's interest to release a revised RS for SMC; this timing is of concern for BC given the concurrent discussions around the Sec 11 and the Protection Assessment for SMC.

- Initial BC/CAN political announcement of Sec 11 draft
- Continued refinement of Agreement based on legal and engagement feedback

Finalization and signing of Sec 11
