CBC BC Almanac called. They are doing a segment today from noon to 12:30 on affordability in BC. CBC wants to talk to MMM before the broadcast to find out what's happening with BCH rates.

Recommendation: Schedule time for the Minister to pre-tape (key messages below) or provide statement.

- Government is disappointed the BCUC did not approved BC Hydro's request for a one-year rate freeze.
- A 3% rate increase means the average residential customer's electricity costs will increase by around \$23 per year. This is about \$2 more per month. Small commercial customers like small offices and restaurants will pay about \$5 more per month.
- We completely understand the affordability crisis so many families face, and will be taking action quickly to address the need to reduce electricity costs for those who need it most.

Lifeline Rate:

Government will work with BC Hydro and customer groups on a lifeline rate program. The program
could mean that people who have demonstrated need would have access to a lower rate for their
electricity.

Other affordability measures:

- In addition, starting in May, BC Hydro residential customers who find themselves in an emergency such as loss of employment, unanticipated medical expenses or pending eviction for example will be eligible for a grant toward their outstanding BC Hydro bill. The grant is up to \$600 and does not need to be repaid.
- In February, BC Hydro announced enhanced measures to help customers manage higher winter bills, including a winter payment plan giving customers the option to spread bill payments over a six-month period, and increased funding for low-income energy conservation programs.
- To lower electricity costs for B.C. businesses and industries, we are phasing out the PST on electricity. Following the 50% reduction that started on Jan. 1, 2018, government will completely eliminate the PST on non-residential electricity on April 1, 2019. Residential use of electricity is already PST-exempt.

 Eliminating the PST on electricity will translate into savings of more than \$150 million annually for B.C. businesses. This will help them create more jobs for British Columbians, expand into new markets, and reinvest in new technologies.

BC Hydro review:

- Our government will also undertake a comprehensive review of BC Hydro to make it work for people.
- The review will identify changes and cost savings to keep rates low while ensuring BC Hydro has the resources it needs to continue to provide clean, safe and reliable electricity.

- Minister Heyman has accepted a meeting with Stuart Galloway, CEO of the Energy Services Association of Canada, and has inquired whether Minister Mungall would be interested in attending. Minister Heyman is targeting the week of April 16th for the meeting.
- The Energy Services Association of Canada represents energy service companies (ESCOs) including Ameresco, Honeywell, Johnson Controls, Siemens, etc.
- The Energy Services Association of Canada's primary mission is to advocate for government policies, regulations and programs that support or enable greater use of energy service performance contracts (ESPCs).
- ESPCs use anticipated future energy savings from a retrofit project to finance the capital costs of energy efficiency projects.
- An ESPC is a contract between an energy user (typically a building owner) and an ESCO for evaluation,
 recommendation, implementation and measurement/verification of one or more energy efficiency measures.
- There are two types of ESPCs: (1) contracts are structured such that energy savings are guaranteed by the ESCO to meet or exceed total annual contract payments; and (2) contracts are structured so costs are shared with payments based on energy savings and a stipulated maximum energy consumption level over the life of the contract.

- The Energy Services Association of Canada estimates that contracts worth about \$300 million are signed every year in Canada with about 85-90% of these with public sector organizations (governments at all levels, universities/colleges, schools and hospitals). Projects typically range in size from \$1-50 million.
- ESPCs have had the most traction in the public sector as they can offer a compelling business case at the building portfolio-level scale.
- The Energy Services Association of Canada is likely seeking provincial government recognition of EPSCs as a financing tool for public sector energy efficiency retrofits.
- Energy Efficiency Branch staff advise the Ministry of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources can play a role in working with the Ministry of Citizens' Services and Climate Action Secretariat to better understand barriers and potential applications of ESPCs in the core and broader public sector.

Dear Mr. Donaldson,

I am writing to you on behalf of Rivers Without Borders to formally request a meeting with you regarding the controversial Tulsequah Chief mine. We recently had a positive meeting with MLA Sonia Furstenau, and she suggested we reach out to you to seek advice on best next steps for resolving this decades long issue.

As you know, the abandoned Tulsequah Chief mine located on a tributary of the Taku River, in your constituency, continues to be of great concern to folks on both sides of the border. For 60 years the mine has been pouring toxic, heavy metal laden mine drainage into the Taku watershed, the region's most productive salmon river. This is in violation of the Canadian Fisheries Act, BC mine permits and water quality standards, and an agreement with the Taku River Tlingit First Nation. As you may know, an Aquatic Ecological Risk Assessment released by the BC government in July 2017 documents "unacceptable risks" from the ongoing acid mine drainage from Tulsequah Chief.

Now is the best opportunity in two decades to ensure the cleanup of the mine site and its proper closure. This will be good for Taku salmon and for the communities that depend on this resource. Developing a cleanup plan and permanently closing the site will also be good for BC- Alaska relations and will help improve trust in BC's mine regulatory system.

If needed, to bring you further up to date on the issue, I have attached a short memo including several informative articles. We would be pleased to meet with you while you're here in Victoria to further discuss this crucial and time sensitive matter, and to explore ways in which we could work together to solve this problem.

Please note that I will be out of the office until April 13th, so please direct any correspondence to our Executive Director, Will Patric, and our Alaska Campaign Director, Chris Zimmer, both cc'd on this email.

Thank you for your consideration, Mr. Donaldson, and for the good work that you're doing. We look forward to hearing from you and hopefully meeting you in person.

I heard from the Minister's scheduler today that her calendar is still too full to meet with us. Honestly, with everything going on in the energy world in BC these

days, I was surprised to even get a call from her office. I realize that your team is exceptionally busy right now as well.

I would have liked to personally provide a project brief now that NRCan has decided to promote the project and invite the Minister to participate in the upcoming media opportunities. However, I know that your team continues to provide updates to the Minister and I thank you for that.

If I had been able to speak with the Minister, I would have wanted her to see the new website that NRCan has created. Project photos will be added shortly. When the time is ready for you to advise that the BC gov't/BC Hydro could be listed as a Project Partner, we would all welcome that. This is a good news energy story, at a time when it may be helpful to have one. We hope that our project can be of use to the Ministry in addition to the Simpcw First Nation and those in the Valemount area. You won't see any mention of Kinder Morgan on our website or from us and we have treated the infographic you saw as confidential and aspirational, to the extent the opportunity presents itself.

I'm not sure if you also know of the significant assistance and input we receive from the other Ministries as well - Forestry for a great deal of our permits, Environment for the discussion about an Environmental Assessment and carbon credits that may be created at the project, and Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation who are a good sounding board for us with our relationship with the 4 First Nations. All of this speaks directly to one of the NRCan objectives of the project:

 enhance geothermal protocols aimed at reducing the costs associated with geothermal development.

I hope that all of this activity is not lost on NRCan and I'll do my best to ensure that they are aware of the great effort that the Province has put into this project and industry by providing us with internal resources.

I'm attaching our socio-economic summary that we have recently completed for the NRCan proposal due next week. While we believe that commercial power can be developed, even wells that are not good enough for power can be used in a heat park for myriad applications, including reducing the electrical heating load in the area and thus further freeing up the electrical grid.

An application has been submitted to initiate exploratory gold mining processes above 49 Creek, accessed via May & Jenny Rd, in the community of Blewett BC. There are over 70 water licenses issued on 49 Creek and many other community users dependent on surface wells to provide safe drinking water to their families. Blewett residents are concerned for Aquifer 511 as corporate greed, drought, and climate change have already put increased pressure on its supply. This permit will negatively impact our community in the following ways:

- Cutting down trees, digging trenches and drilling holes on steep slopes, contribute to increased landslide susceptibility with our historical heavy rainfalls. The slope stability in the proposed area was rated as Potentially Unstable, Level IV. Request: I need to talk to someone about the permitting and public consultation process for mining exploration. In this case a company intends to do exploration work in a watershed, and the water users don't want this. I need to know what the process is. When the ministry of mines approves something like this, what criteria do they look at? Do the residents' opinions hold any weight at all, and if so, through what process or channel? If you could find me someone to talk to about this that would be great. I do not expect to them to comment on any specific project.

This is a mining exploration permit granted to Kelly Funk, the owner of some claims at 49 Creek near Nelson. A Ministry of Mines period for public consultation just ended this week. I am not asking for comment on Mr. Funk's plans or the status of them, but rather my question is about process:

Once the ministry has received such an application, like the one from Mr. Funk, and received feedback from other levels of government and the public, which it has done, what are the ministry's options? Can it refuse the application altogether? Can it suggest changes to what the proponent intends to do, and to what degree? Are there limits to what changes it can ask for?

Again, I am not asking for comment on the merits of Mr. Funk's plans but about how much power the ministry has in a situation like this. Once its comment period has ended, which it did this week, what are its options?

Recommendation: Have GCPE provide information on background by email.

- Following a thorough review, statutory decision makers may authorize a permit, reject the application, or authorize the permit subject to site-specific conditions – specific requirements the proponent must undertake prior to, during and/or after any and all work authorized under the terms of the permit.

As an update to the quarry permit issue, despite RDN opposition, the Inspector of Mines approved the attached permit G-8-358 under the *Mines Act*, which allows "blasting and crushing of quarry rock material". The permit places limitations on the volume of extraction (10,000 tonnes per year), hours of operation (7:30 am to 6:00 pm Monday through Friday), and limits on hydraulic rock breaking (max 2 hours per day, not more than 30 minutes uninterrupted without a 15 minute break). While these conditions are not likely to fully address neighbour's concerns, they do limit some of the activities that are causing concern and put the onus of compliance enforcement on these terms with the province. Staff can communicate these conditions to complainants and ensure they have appropriate contact to follow-up with at the province regarding any concerns about violations of these conditions.

While the property has rural residential zoning, generally speaking, mineral extraction approved under the *Mines Act* overrides local governments regulatory authority. We will need to factor the issuance of this permit into consideration of enforcement action with regard to the use of the property. We will also need to seek advice on the extent of our authority to address rock crushing, which would be considered "primary processing" under Bylaw 500. We would assert that "primary processing" should be subject to our regulatory authority, however, we would need advice based on the specifics of this permit and the activities on this property.

Surely the RDN must be a party to any such application, and liaise with Mines & Resources where their jurisdiction is involved? The secondary concern we have, more serious than the simple-to-fix noise pollution issue, is the drastic effect such activity has on adjacent (albeit across the highway) property values, assessments and taxation.

An application has been submitted to initiate exploratory gold mining processes above 49 Creek, accessed via May & Jenny Rd, in the community of Blewett BC. There are over 70 water licenses issued on 49 Creek and many other community users dependent on surface wells to provide safe drinking water to their families.

Blewett residents are concerned for Aquifer 511 as corporate greed, drought, and climate change have already put increased pressure on its supply. This permit will negatively impact our community in the following ways:

- Cutting down trees, digging trenches and drilling holes on steep slopes, contribute to increased landslide susceptibility with our historical heavy rainfalls. The slope stability in the proposed area was rated as Potentially Unstable, Level IV. This rating indicates it is not recommended to excavate this site without having an engineer preform an on-site assessment. The permit has been submitted without a site visit being performed.
- Unearthing rock can result in acid rock drainage which contributes to increased acidity and ability of water to hold dissolved metals. The process can create hostile conditions in our creek which will endanger fish and aquatic life. Noise pollution, vibrations, physical and chemical contaminants, would affect animals that live or travel through this untamed corridor.
- Property value decreases on parcels near work-site and along access road. In the event of water contamination, there would be a drastic drop in value of all property dependent on the watershed, and hefty costs would ensue for cleanup or restoration efforts.

As per our previous correspondence we have not had any direct action by the Regional District of Central Kootenay or Teck to address the concerns afflictings .22 The failure of the Province to follow up on its promises regarding investigation and remediation by the polluters only exasperates the situation and allows continued damage tos .22 We are seeking a reply to our letters, an outline as to the plans the Province has to ensure the numerous promises provided towards investigation and remediation of \$.22 by the polluters are fulfilled and confirmation that the planned closure works of the HB Mine tailings impoundment will prevent further offsite migration of contamination from the RDCK site reaching \$.22

Our family is extremely disappointed that a party professing environmental credentials will not even in all reasonableness reply to our concerns. We find ourselves excluded as a stakeholder in discussions between the Province, RDCK and Teck regarding water quality from the RDCK site even though it directly affects \$.22 Salmo River. Rather than a transparent and shared environment we are forced to seek information through the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* and sidelined, left to interject our comments without solicitation. Too many times we have had to raise issues of obvious errors and failures by the RDCK and Province in following policies and procedures. We had expected and requested to be included in the discourse, unfortunately this continues to not be the case.

While we wait to see the final plan that the RDCK outlays for closure of the HB Mine tailings impoundment and whether it will be funded, we have concerns that it may not prevent the further migration of contaminants offsite from both the landfill and tailings impoundment to \$.22 s.22 Unless the RDCK stops polluting \$.22 Please confirm that the Province will ensure the prevention of offsite migration of contamination onto \$.22 from the RDCK site will be a requirement of the closure plan. Other assurances and actions that the Province provided us have still not been complied with by the RDCK and they include:

-assurances that the RDCK would complete a proper Detailed Site Investigation as per Section 59 of the CSR to include offsite migration;

-that the RDCK would implement consultant's recommendations including measures to mitigate or prevent contamination of by leachate or mine tailings. -failure of the RDCK to comply with its Operating Certificate. Landfill leachate migrates beyond the boundary of the permitted landfill area and enters the tailings pond and aquifer. -the investigation and remediation of the damage caused by the unpermitted pumping of the millions of liters of contaminated effluent ontc^{\$.22} during the dam failure event in 2012 would be the responsibility of the RDCK.

Your ministries have provided numerous assurances and promises that the RDCK and/or Teck would cease polluting \$.22 and investigate and remediate any contamination caused by their activities. We've been stalled for decades by both parties and see no sincere interest by either to reach a solution. The Province advised that should remediation not take place that it would address the high-risk contamination on \$.22 . As there has been no progress made by the RDCK or Teck in remediating the contamination we request that discussions begin on actioning remediation by the Province.

Protection of air and water should be a basic tenant of good governance. As farming continues to grow in the Salmo Valleys.22 due to the contamination from the RDCK site. The Province allows for the contamination to continue and allows the well-funded polluters (Teck and the RDCK) to argue over who is responsible without any progress towards actually tackling the contamination. To answer the questions from Mr. Pelkey below:

Overview

- The Province's electricity supply is highly reliable, low cost and currently 98.4% of electricity generation comes from large hydro-electric facilities and other clean, renewable resources, namely wind, solar, run-of-river and storage hydro-electricity, biomass and other alternative resources. Therefore, installing a solar energy system would have limited greenhouse gas emissions benefits.
- As such, neither the Province, nor the utilities, offer incentives, grants or discounts for the purchase and/or installation of other types of alternative energy generation, such as solar panels.
- Both Fortis BC and BC Hydro offer net metering programs whereby if the consumer invests in their own electricity generation equipment (e.g., solar panels), any excess power is purchased from you by the utility. Both programs require that you notify the utility in advance and apply for approval.
- However, energy efficiency projects are often more cost effective for homeowners than net metering, as the payback period for installing solar panels is approximately 20 years, depending how much electricity is generated.
- BC does provide a provincial sales tax exemption on certain renewable energy equipment, including solar energy equipment.

If the consumer still has an excess credit at the anniversary date of joining the program, BC Hydro will pay for the electricity at the rate of 9.99 cents per kilowatt hour (kWh).

We are writing once more to seek a reply to our letters of 14 August and 11 November, 2017. Mine waste affecting not only s.22 a large area of the Salmo Valley degrades water and air quality as well as preventing the use of hectares of agricultural land. As per our previous correspondence we have not had any direct action by the Regional District of Central Kootenay or Teck to address the concerns afflictings.22 The failure of the Province to follow up on its promises regarding investigation and remediation by the polluters only exasperates the situation and allows continued damage to s.22 We are seeking a reply to our letters, an outline as to the plans the Province has to ensure the numerous promises provided towards investigation and remediation of s.22 by the polluters

are fulfilled and confirmation that the planned closure works of the HB Mine tailings impoundment will prevent further offsite migration of contamination from the RDCK site reaching^{5,22}

Our family is extremely disappointed that a party professing environmental credentials will not even in all reasonableness reply to our concerns. We find ourselves excluded as a stakeholder in discussions between the Province, RDCK and Teck regarding water quality from the RDCK site even though it directly affectss.22 Salmo River. Rather than a transparent and shared environment we are forced to seek information through the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* and sidelined, left to interject our comments without solicitation. Too many times we have had to raise issues of obvious errors and failures by the RDCK and Province in following policies and procedures. We had expected and requested to be included in the discourse, unfortunately this continues to not be the case.

While we wait to see the final plan that the RDCK outlays for closure of the HB Mine tailings impoundment and whether it will be funded, we have concerns that it may not prevent the further migration of contaminants offsite from both the landfill and tailings impoundment to \$.22

Unless the RDCK stops polluting \$.22

s.2 Please confirm that the Province will ensure the prevention of offsite migration of contamination onto s.22 from the RDCK site will be a requirement of the closure plan. Other assurances and actions that the Province provided us have still not been complied with by the RDCK and they include:

-assurances that the RDCK would complete a proper Detailed Site Investigation as per Section 59 of the CSR to include offsite migration;

-that the RDCK would implement consultant's recommendations including measures to mitigate or prevent contamination of by leachate or mine tailings. These include a riparian area between the landfill and TSF, discontinue septage disposal, improve landfill surface water outflow to prevent TSF erosion, a tailings impoundment perimeter ditch, stilling pool at the base of the spillway and a settling pond situated above Highway 3/6;

-failure of the RDCK to comply with its Operating Certificate. Landfill leachate migrates beyond the boundary of the permitted landfill area and enters the tailings pond and aquifer. Surface water contaminated by leachate erodes the tailings surface and contributes to the pollution finding its way to \$22

-the investigation and remediation of the damage caused by the unpermitted pumping of the millions of liters of contaminated effluent onto during the dam failure event in 2012 would be the responsibility of the RDCK.

Your ministries have provided numerous assurances and promises that the RDCK and/or Teck would cease polluting \$.22 s.22 and investigate and remediate any contamination caused by their activities. We've been stalled for decades by both parties and see no sincere interest by either to reach a solution. The Province advised that should remediation not take place that it would address the high-risk contamination on \$.22 . As there has been no progress made by the RDCK or Teck in remediating the contamination we request that discussions begin on actioning remediation by the Province.

Protection of air and water should be a basic tenant of good governance. As farming continues to grow in the Salmo Valleys. 22 due to the contamination from the RDCK site. The Province allows for the contamination to continue and allows the well-funded polluters (Teck and the RDCK) to argue over who is responsible without any progress towards actually tackling the contamination. That this has gone on for over 20 years is inexcusable. We look forward to a fulsome response from both ministries.
