
LNG Canada

Clearing work underway

Coastal GasLink

- East sections: early works underway – site clearing primarily
- West sections: site preparation in Kitimat area

Camp 9A site – company cleared to resume work





Regulatory Roles and Responsibilities

Multiple agencies involved - authorities based on legislation. The two primary agencies are the BC Environmental Assessment Office and the BC Oil and Gas Commission.

BC Environmental Assessment Office (EAO)

- Technical assessment of whether the project should proceed includes assessment of environmental, social, economic, health and heritage effects.
 - Environmental Assessment Certificates granted for both Projects.
- Compliance and Enforcement Branch is responsible for compliance verification, enforcement, and compliance promotion.

BC Oil and Gas Commission

- Technical assessment of how the project should proceed.
- Post EAO approval, conduct major permitting and provides "single window" oversight.
 - Oversight authorized under many statutes, including the Heritage Conservation Act.
- Compliance and Enforcement Branch responsible for compliance oversight and enforcement of OGC permits and authorizations



Communications Goals

In March, Deputy Ministers approved a phased communication plan to be developed by the Secretariat.

Goals:


- Provincial communications are appropriate, comprehensive, transparent, and timely.
- Provincial communications and engagement is focused on providing information to the public that is fact-based, informative, comprehensive, and timely.
- Processes and roles/responsibilities for the development and approval of communications materials, the dissemination of information, and provincial response is systematic, clear and timely.

Initial Products include an 'online hub' to provide accurate and factual government information.



Strategic Themes

- Primary areas of focus for all proactive/reactive communications.
- Themes link to 4 conditions for LNG development.

Engagement

Status:

 Direct, government-led engagement with communities and First Nations (beyond consultation) diminished after 2014 due to a lack of a final investment decision.

Next steps:

- The Secretariat will start engaging with key influencers to seek advice on how to provide information and engage.
- Design a long-term structure that keeps stakeholders informed and engaged – supports communications plan.



Summary

Summary:

- Early construction activities are underway.
- Regulators are providing oversight, compliance & enforcement procedures are being followed.
- The LNG Canada Implementation Secretariat is leading government communications and engagement related to LNG Canada and the Coastal GasLink pipeline.
- The communications plan is underway includes a phased approach, strategic themes, and the development of an online hub.
- Engagement activities are starting soon with more to follow.

Compliance and Enforcement Tools

Notice of Compliance	Issued by an inspector when all parameters of an inspection are found in compliance
Advisory	Advise of the potential for non-compliance (or pointing out what must be done to achieve compliance)
Warning	Warns of a possible escalated enforcement response
Order	Issued to address non-compliance (and/or manage risks)
Administrative Penalty	Financial penalty
Community Environmental Justice Forum	Dispute resolution process
Violation Ticket	Means of dealing effectively and quickly with minor offences
Court Prosecution	Legal proceeding recommended by designated officers and initiated by Crown Counsel



OGC "Single Window" authority

Land Act	Lease of Crown Land, License of Occupation, Right of Way
Water Sustainability Act	Water Permits and Licenses, change in and about a stream, Permits over crown land
Forest Act	Master License to Cut, Cutting Permits, Road Use Permits
Heritage Conservation Act	Site Alteration Permits, Archaeology
Environmental Management Act	Hazardous Waste storage and disposal, Permits and approvals
