Hi Melissa: FYI, on May 20 or June 3, the draft decision for the World Heritage Committee (WHC) will be released on the Action Plan to protect Wood Buffalo National Park (WBNP).

You will recall the federal government submitted its completed Action Plan for WBNP to the WHC on Feb. 1, 2019. The Action Plan was developed in response to the WHC's Reactive Monitoring Mission to WBNP in 2016, which made 17 recommendations for the Government of Canada to address to protect the site.

Canada accepted the report's recommendations with the exception of a recommendation which called for "an environmental and social impact assessment of the Site C project." Canada rejected this recommendation as it relates to Site C.

The Government of Canada developed the Action Plan in collaboration with provincial and territorial governments, Indigenous communities, and stakeholders. It includes more than 140 actions responding to all the recommendations of the WHC (with the exception of the recommendation related to Site C as referenced above). The Government of Canada is investing \$27.5 million to support the development of the Action Plan and its early implementation, which is already underway.

In advance of the release of the draft decision on the Action Plan, Parks Canada has developed a high level Ministerial Statement and Twitter posts. Their standard backgrounder on all the actions that have been taken to preserve Wood Buffalo, and their Q&As have also been updated.

Parks Canada has shared these materials with us to ensure we're comfortable with them. The only reference in the materials to Site C is on page 7/8 of the QA, and I don't see any reference to the WAC Bennett dam. I have also shared the materials with BC Hydro and Les.

The date of release and content of the draft decision will not be known until the decision is publicly released. Whether s.16

While the draft decision is expected on May 20 or June 3, the WHC's formal response to the Action Plan will be announced during the 43rd session of the World Heritage Committee that will be held in Baku, Azerbaijan from 30 June to 10 July 2019.

Request:

I am working on a commentary for The Vancouver Sun on the use of administrative monetary penalties to try to encourage compliance with provincial laws. Could you tell me whether the Ministry of Energy and Mines has issued any such penalties to Placer Mining companies in the last while, and if so what the penalty amount(s) was, which company(its) were issued the penalties and for what offences.

Suggested Response:

The Ministry of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources issued an Administrative Monetary Penalty (AMP) in the amount of \$28,000 to placer miner Pinegreen Gold Mining (Canada) on March 4, 2019. This penalty was issued for operating without a Mines Act permit, in contravention of Mines Act s.10(1), near Quesnel British Columbia. The penalty has been paid in full, money goes into general revenue.

This was the first AMP issued under the new regulation which came into effect in 2017 through amendments to the Mines Act. There are a number of AMPs awaiting decision but as they are currently in front of the Statutory Decision Maker (SDM), we are not able to share specifics about these ongoing enforcement processes.

Another Compliance & Enforcement tool for placer titles is under the Mineral Tenure Act. Last year (Fiscal 2018-2019), there was one Section 40 complaint which was upheld and the claim ordered cancelled. Under Section 10, there were 18 notices actioned (12 of which were placer) and 6 Free Miner Certificates cancelled or suspended (5 of which were placer).

EMPR recently announced an additional \$20 million investment over the next three years to facilitate the implementation of the Mines Competitiveness and Authorizations Division, making it completely independent of Mines Health, Safety and Enforcement Division within EMPR. This ensures clear separation that aligns with other provincial regulators including the Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy.

The Mines Health, Safety and Enforcement Division will include a greater number of mines inspectors and a new auditing function to increase industry safety. The division's priorities will be focused on increased health, safety, compliance management and enforcement activities. A new compliance auditing and effectiveness monitoring team within the division will function as an independent oversight unit.

The constituency assistant has provided the additional following information for this case file.

Regarding the part - "Applicants that had placed deposits on vehicles that were removed from the eligibility list prior to September 21, 2018 had their applications honoured and received the incentive. Applicants who did not place deposits or complete a vehicle sale prior to September 21, 2018 are not eligible to receive the SUVI program incentive. The applicant was denied the SUVI incentive in this case as the invoice was dated January 18, 2019 which is beyond the September 21, 2018 requirement"

On June 1, Mason Lift wrote up the terms and conditions of the order, also stating that the balance would be due on delivery of the vehicle. s.22 signed this form on July 19, 2018 and created a Purchase Order (PO) on July 26, 2018 It stated on the terms and conditions that delivery would be between 21-23 weeks; however, it was delivered at 31 weeks and s.22 were officially invoiced at 33 weeks – January 18, 2019.

It stated on the terms and conditions proposal that signing it constitutes as an order. I am just curious if this signed proposal would constitute as confirmation of an order, even though mason lift did not officially invoice them until after the vehicles were delivered?

s.22 purchased two units from Masonlift Ltd. to build for them. The two units at the time were listed as an eligible vehicle under the SUVI program (Toyota 8HBW23). They received approval and Plug in BC emailed them requiring that they would just need the VIN and proof of payment. When s.22 did submit the required information after the two machines were built, their application was denied and they were told that the vehicle was no longer eligible for the SUVI program.

In September 2018, the Ministry reviewed the Specialty-Use Vehicle Incentive (SUVI) Program vehicle eligibility list as the intent of the program is to support the adoption of hydrogen fuel cell and plug-in electric vehicles in sectors that have not fully shifted to electrification. As a result of this review, the forklift category of the program was adjusted on September 21, 2018 to only include vehicles that are four-wheel sit-down counterbalance forklifts or three wheel sit down counterbalance forklifts. This resulted in several models being removed from the program. This program change was communicated to vehicle dealers and manufacturers, so they could inform their customers regarding orders that were no longer eligible.

Applicants that had placed deposits on vehicles that were removed from the eligibility list prior to September 21, 2018 had their applications honoured and received the incentive. Applicants who did not place deposits or complete a vehicle sale prior to September 21, 2018 are not eligible to receive the SUVI program incentive.

The applicant was denied the SUVI incentive in this case as the invoice was dated January 18, 2019 which is well beyond the September 21, 2018 requirement.

Hi Melissa: FYI - Please find attached the press release and end-of-visit statement from the United Nations Special Rapporteur (SR) on the implications for human rights of the environmentally sound management and disposal of hazardous substances and wastes.

As I had communicated earlier, the SR conducted a tour of Canada recently which included a stop in Vancouver. When in Vancouver he participated in a conference call with representatives from ENV, EMPR, and the OCG and had private meetings with other interest groups and stakeholders.

There's not a lot about B.C. specifically. I have highlighted references in the statement to the Trans Mountain Pipeline (pg. 5), coal mining in the Elk Valley (pg. 6) and Mount Polley (pg. 8/9).

Generally:

- There is a big focus on Indigenous Peoples and rights. He did mention there has been important progress made on UNDRIP but he feels the FPIC was not adequate yet.
- He felt those impacted by industry development are in areas in which individuals are unable protect their rights and do not have the resources, which could possibly be seen as discrimination. He said that he will look at this issue more closely and the access to justice.

These are only preliminary observations from the SR. A full report which will contain a more comprehensive analysis of the situation and recommendations from a human rights perspective, will be prepared and presented to the September 2020 session of the Human Rights Council.

Good morning

On September 21, 2018, FortisBC Energy Inc. filed with the BCUC an application for acceptance of a Biogas Purchase Agreement between FEI and the City of Vancouver.

Under the BPA, FEI intends to:

- purchase raw biogas (such as landfill gas) from the City of Vancouver;
- construct and operate facilities to upgrade landfill gas to biomethane; and
- construct interconnection facilities including a 500 metre pipeline to connect to FEI's existing natural gas distribution system.

Section 3.8 of the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Regulation allows utilities to

- (3.8) The public utility acquires renewable natural gas
- (a) for which the public utility pays no more than \$30 per GJ, and
- (b) that, subject to subsection (3.9), in a calendar year, does not exceed 5% of the total volume of natural gas provided by the public utility to its non-bypass customers in 2015.

Definition of "acquire"

Given the accepted principles of statutory interpretation and these broad definitions, the Panel is satisfied that, when considered together, the process of purchasing and taking possession of raw landfill gas from the COV and upgrading it to RNG satisfies the meaning of "acquires renewable natural gas" in section 2(3.8) of the GGRR.

\$30 price cap

If this were an application to acquire finished RNG supply at a contract price of, say \$30.50 per GJ, our decision would be much more straightforward. A contract price of \$30.50 per GJ is above the cost cap provided by the GGRR and therefore the acquisition of RNG would not be a prescribed undertaking. Conversely, if the contract price were \$29.50 per GJ, the acquisition of RNG could be a prescribed undertaking, if the other relevant conditions were met. In this proceeding though, we are asked to approve, as a prescribed undertaking, a contract with a levelized cost that is "significantly below" \$30 per GJ and is "unlikely" to exceed that cap.

The Panel finds that FEI has not provided a certain, fixed cost for the acquired RNG during the term of the contract. As such, the Panel is unable to determine with any degree of certainty whether the cost is below, at or above the \$30 per GJ threshold and therefore cannot find this Project to be a prescribed undertaking.

The Ministry's intention was such that should project costs exceed the \$30 cap, the project would no longer be a prescribed undertaking under the GGRR.

Contracted volumes

The Panel is satisfied that given FEI's current contracted maximum supply of RNG is 639,000 GJ annually, the projected RNG volume for the Project remains well within the maximum annual RNG acquisition volume of 8,900,000 GJ that would qualify under section 2(3.8)(b) of the GGRR.

Panel Determination

The Panel declines to make any determination with regard to FEI's request for acceptance of the COV BPA in its current form under section 71 of the UCA.

The Panel finds that FEI has adduced sufficient evidence to demonstrate that the Project amounts to an acquisition of RNG within the volumes stipulated under section 2(3.8)(b) of the GGRR but has failed to satisfy the Panel that FEI would be paying no more than \$30 per GJ of RNG throughout the life of the Project, even on a conservative levelized cost basis. Accordingly, the Panel finds that the Project does not meet the requirements as a prescribed undertaking under the GGRR, and hence section 18(3) of the CEA does not apply.

Section 18 (3) stipulates that the commission must not exercise a power under the Utilities Commission Act in a way that would directly or indirectly prevent a public utility referred to in subsection (2) from carrying out a prescribed undertaking.

The Panel adjourns this proceeding for 60 days to allow FEI, should it so choose, to restructure and resubmit the Project and its BPA with the COV in a way that provides the required certainty to FEI's acquisition cost of the RNG so as to qualify as a prescribed undertaking within the specified cost threshold. Alternatively, FEI may withdraw this application and file a new application for approval of a CPCN for the Project should it wish to do so.

I am working on a commentary for The Vancouver Sun on the use of administrative monetary penalties to try to encourage compliance with provincial laws. Could you tell me whether the Ministry of Energy and Mines has issued any such penalties to Placer Mining companies in the last while, and if so what the penalty amount(s) was, which company(its) were issued the penalties and for what offences.

Suggested Response:

The Ministry of Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources issued an Administrative Monetary Penalty (AMP) in the amount of \$28,000 to placer miner Pinegreen Gold Mining (Canada) on March 4, 2019. This penalty was issued for operating without a *Mines Act* permit, in contravention of *Mines Act* s.10(1), near Quesnel British Columbia. The penalty has been paid in full, money goes into general revenue.

This was the first AMP issued under the new regulation which came into effect in 2017 through amendments to the Mines Act. There are a number of AMPs awaiting decision

but as they are currently in front of the Statutory Decision Maker (SDM), we are not able to share specifics about these ongoing enforcement processes.

Another Compliance & Enforcement tool for placer titles is under the <u>Mineral Tenure</u> <u>Act</u>. Last year (Fiscal 2018-2019), there was one Section 40 complaint which was upheld and the claim ordered cancelled. Under Section 10, there were 18 notices actioned (12 of which were placer) and 6 Free Miner Certificates cancelled or suspended (5 of which were placer).

Impairment Policy Updates

Non-medical cannabis became legal in Canada on October 17, 2018. At that time, the BC Public Service updated:

- The Standards of Conduct
- HR Policy 4 Workplace Health and Safety

The policy updates clarified and confirmed our existing approach to workplace impairment. These updates were communicated in an executive message in October 2018.

BC Public Service employees are responsible for their own workplace conduct. They must follow all applicable laws, by-laws, policies, and guidelines governing cannabis.

Consistent with these changes, employees are not permitted to consume non-medical cannabis products in any BC Public Service workplace.

Your Role

Supervisors are key players in setting and managing expectations about workplace impairment and health and safety in the workplace.

As a supervisor, it's important you know your role and responsibilities related to workplace impairment. If you don't feel confident in dealing with these issues, talk to your supervisor.

What is Impairment?

Workplace impairment can be caused by many substances and conditions.

Substances include legal drugs, like cannabis and alcohol, illegal drugs like cocaine and ecstasy, prescription drugs like painkillers and over-the-counter drugs like decongestants and sleep aids.

Conditions that can cause impairment include fatigue, insomnia, disability and chronic health conditions.

Impairment at work is not safe or acceptable. It poses a risk to employees, their colleagues, the public and the environment.

The BC Public Service expects employees to:

- Be fit for work
- Effectively perform their job duties
- Conduct themselves in a manner that upholds public trust
- Conduct themselves in a manner that supports the integrity of the BC Public Service

Resources

Supervisors and managers said they needed more support in dealing with workplace impairment.

In response to this, new tools for employees and supervisors are available on MyHR.

GCPE provided information on background

1. All new light duty trucks and cars sold in the province will be ZEV by 2040. Does that mean only electric vehicles or are some also fuel-cell vehicles?

In this legislation, a CEV is a motor vehicle that:

- never emits tailpipe emissions (i.e. battery-electric vehicles (BEVs) and hydrogen fuel cell electric vehicles (HCFVs)); and
- does not emit tailpipe emissions at least some of the time while being operated (i.e. plug-in hybrid electric vehicles (PHEV) and extended range electric vehicles (EREV)).

2. Does light duty mean vehicles used for personal transportation but not delivery vans and trucks?

Forthcoming regulations will determine the vehicle class that ZEV Act applies to. However, it is anticipated that it would apply only to on-road light-duty vehicles, with weight ratings of less than 3,856 kilograms. This would include cars,

crossovers, SUVs and light pick-up trucks (e.g. Ford F150), but not heavier, medium- and heavy-duty trucks (e.g. Ford F250, buses, transport trucks and medium-duty delivery vans). Crossovers and SUVs like the Honda CR-V and Chevrolet Tahoe would be included.

The legislation has been written to be able to, by regulation, exclude certain vehicles like motorcycles or farm equipment, as well as, set targets for other vehicle classes.

3. How many ZEVs are on the roads in the province currently?

There are currently more than 20,000 electric vehicles on the road – with 350,000 expected on the roads by 2030. (battery electric, plug-in hybrid electric, and hydrogen fuel cell electric).

4. Are most of them electric?

The majority of CEVs on the road are plug-in vehicles. (We don't have a breakdown between BEV/PHEV currently). There are less than 15 FCEVs in B.C. with more expected in the near future.

5. Can you provide some details about how the CEVforBC rebate program works?

Information on how the program works can be found HERE. Other FAQ's can be found HERE.

6. In your release it says,"British Columbians who purchase electric vehicles typically save about 75% on their fuel and maintenance costs, which currently add up to about \$1,500 per year." That's a lot of money to save every year...is the public aware yet of how much they could save?

B.C. is a leader in clean energy vehicles (CEVs) with one of the largest public charging infrastructure networks in Canada (over 1,700 charging stations), the first public hydrogen fuelling station in Canada with plans to build out more, and the highest per capita adoption of CEVs in the country (4% of new light-duty vehicle sales in 2018, and over 6% of new light-duty vehicle sales in the first quarter of 2019).

Media attention on CEVs from both provincial and federal incentives to increased public demand and the number of CEVs on the road has been widespread. Government has also held two annual 'CEV Day at the Legislature' events to draw attention to the benefits of CEV ownership, which has garnered both public and media attention. Word-of-mouth among the public can also not be overlooked, and has helped to bring awareness to the money you can save by owning a CEV.

7. With all the new ZEVs on the roads and the greater number that is coming, are you also increasing the number of public charging stations?

Funding will support a range of initiatives, including supporting the creation of new public fast-charging and hydrogen fueling stations.

The CEVforBC program is also offering advisor and consultation services for the installation of electric vehicle charging in multi-unit residential buildings and workplaces. Information on the advisor and consultation services available is located at https://pluginbc.ca/incentives/charging-solutions-incentives/. The provincial "Plug-In BC EV Advisor" can provide services to help find charging solutions for a site, including onsite presentations and education and general site consultations; these consultations are primarily an introductory overview and are not a substitute for an electrician.

8. Does the government promote EVs with outreach events?

Yes. As mentioned above, the provincial government has held two annual CEV Day events at the B.C. Legislature to highlight the vehicles and incentives available. Government has also been active in promoting the available incentives, details of which are available at CEVforBC.ca.

OTTAWA _ The country's largest oil-and-gas lobby group is urging political parties to ensure their campaign platforms include support for major pipeline and LNG projects and a regulatory regime that would allow projects to be completed faster.

The Canadian Association of Petroleum Producers released its election wish list on Monday, outlining the issues facing the industry and ways the federal government can create better conditions for growth in the sector.

CEO Tim McMillan said Canada has lost its competitive edge as a result of regulatory and policy changes that have scared investors away.

He said it should be a priority for government to ensure major pipeline projects like Trans Mountain are completed to allow oil producers to sell to global markets where energy demand is growing.

"With global demand at an all-time high and with global demand increasing at near-record rates and global investment following, it is incumbent on the next government to create conditions necessary for Canada's oil and natural gas industry to succeed and play a key role on the world stage," McMillan said at a morning press conference.

Suggested Response:

1. All new light duty trucks and cars sold in the province will be ZEV by 2040. Does that mean only electric vehicles or are some also fuel-cell vehicles?

In this legislation, a CEV is a motor vehicle that:

- never emits tailpipe emissions (i.e. battery-electric vehicles (BEVs) and hydrogen fuel cell electric vehicles (HCFVs)); and
- does not emit tailpipe emissions at least some of the time while being operated (i.e. plug-in hybrid electric vehicles (PHEV) and extended range electric vehicles (EREV)).

2. Does light duty mean vehicles used for personal transportation but not delivery vans and trucks?

Forthcoming regulations will determine the vehicle class that ZEV Act applies to. However, it is anticipated that it would apply only to on-road light-duty vehicles, with weight ratings of less than 3,856 kilograms. This would include cars, crossovers, SUVs and light pick-up trucks (e.g. Ford F150), but not heavier, medium- and heavy-duty trucks (e.g. Ford

F250, buses, transport trucks and medium-duty delivery vans). Crossovers and SUVs like the Honda CR-V and Chevrolet Tahoe would be included.

The legislation has been written to be able to, by regulation, exclude certain vehicles like motorcycles or farm equipment, as well as, set targets for other vehicle classes.

3. How many ZEVs are on the roads in the province currently?

There are currently more than 20,000 electric vehicles on the road – with 350,000 expected on the roads by 2030. (battery electric, plug-in hybrid electric, and hydrogen fuel cell electric).

4. Are most of them electric?

The majority of CEVs on the road are plug-in vehicles. (We don't have a breakdown between BEV/PHEV currently). There are less than 15 FCEVs in B.C. with more expected in the near future.

5. Can you provide some details about how the CEVforBC rebate program works?

Information on how the program works can be found HERE. Other FAQ's can be found HERE.

6. In your release it says, "British Columbians who purchase electric vehicles typically save about 75% on their fuel and maintenance costs, which currently add up to about \$1,500 per year." That's a lot of money to save every year...is the public aware yet of how much they could save?

B.C. is a leader in clean energy vehicles (CEVs) with one of the largest public charging infrastructure networks in Canada (over 1,700 charging stations), the first public hydrogen fuelling station in Canada with plans to build out more, and the highest per capita adoption of CEVs in the country (4% of new light-duty vehicle sales in 2018, and over 6% of new light-duty vehicle sales in the first quarter of 2019).

Media attention on CEVs from both provincial and federal incentives to increased public demand and the number of CEVs on the road has been widespread. Government has also held two annual 'CEV Day at the Legislature' events to draw attention to the benefits of CEV ownership, which has garnered both public and media attention. Word-of-mouth among the public can also not be overlooked, and has helped to bring awareness to the money you can save by owning a CEV.

7. With all the new ZEVs on the roads and the greater number that is coming, are you also increasing the number of public charging stations?

Funding will support a range of initiatives, including supporting the creation of new public fast-charging and hydrogen fueling stations.

The CEVforBC program is also offering advisor and consultation services for the installation of electric vehicle charging in multi-unit residential buildings and workplaces. Information on the advisor and consultation services available is located at https://pluginbc.ca/incentives/charging-solutions-incentives/. The provincial "Plug-In BC EV Advisor" can provide services to help find charging solutions for a site, including onsite presentations and education and general site consultations; these consultations are primarily an introductory overview and are not a substitute for an electrician.

8. Does the government promote EVs with outreach events?

Yes. As mentioned above, the provincial government has held two annual CEV Day events at the B.C. Legislature to highlight the vehicles and incentives available. Government has also been active in promoting the available incentives, details of which are available at CEVforBC.ca.

Hi Melissa and Andrew,

I wanted to flag that approx 50 people are on mandatory leave at Quinsam coal due to the sudden departure of the mine manager. We are working on getting further details and understanding the company's plans going forward.

Background:

- On April 10th we received notice that the certified mine manager at Quinsam had resigned and would be leaving the mine on May 2nd. After some delay the mine's general manager wrote his certificate and EMPR expedited the process to get him certified.
- On May 31 the Chief Inspector received an email from Quinsam's general manager that he was leaving Quinsam with immediate effect. Later that day we received notification from the mine that s.22 (the current fireboss) had been appointed mine manager and that no more than 9 people would be underground per day. This is in line with his level of certification under the Health, Safety and Reclamation Code.
- The Chief Inspector then received an email from the Steelworkers Union, voicing their concern about the financial wellbeing of the company and notified Herman that all their members have been placed on forced leave.
- Quinsam has 53 hourly and 18 staff employees. We have confirmed with the company that all employees with the exception of the first-aid/security (24/7 coverage) and \$5.22 (daily UG and pump checks) are on mandatory vacation. There is also a minimal amount of administration activity at the mine as well (finance, payroll).
- We are following up with company executives to understand their plans going forward.

We'll work with GCPE to do an issues note and will provide more info as it's available.

Note that all general FOI request records that are released to an applicant should be published on the Open Information website unless the exemption criteria apply. The exemption criteria can be found on page 11 of the Open Information and Open Data Policy. Consultations from outside provincial public bodies are not published on the Open Information website.

Exercise of Discretion:

The Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FOIPPA) contains both mandatory and discretionary exceptions to disclosure. Sections 13 to 20 are the discretionary exceptions. Where Information Access Operations (IAO) has advised the head that a discretionary exception may apply, it is important that the head consider the possibility of releasing the information despite the fact that an exception may apply.

Factors relevant to the exercise of discretion include:

- the general purposes of the legislation: public bodies should make information available to the public; individuals should have access to personal information about themselves;
- the wording of the discretionary exception and the interests which the section attempts to balance;
- whether the individual's request could be satisfied by severing the record and by providing the applicant
- with as much information as is reasonably practicable;
- the historical practice of the public body with respect to the release of similar types of documents;
- the nature of the record and the extent to which the document is significant and/or sensitive to the public body;
- whether the disclosure of the information will increase public confidence in the operation of the public body;
- the age of the record;
- whether there is a sympathetic or compelling need to release materials;
- whether previous orders of the Commissioner have ruled that similar types of records or information should or should not be subject to disclosure; and
- when the policy advice exception is claimed, whether the decision to which the advice or recommendations relates has already been made.
