





The Vancouver Sun and other outlets report that a long-running dispute over Taseko Mines's New Prosperity mine proposal came to the forefront again Tuesday at a road junction some 55 kilometres southwest of Williams Lake. Work crews that were headed to begin geotechnical testing at the proposal site, about 125 kilometres from the town, were met by chiefs and members of the Tsilhqot'in First Nations assembled for a "peaceful action" to stop them. "It's a blockade to turn Taseko Mines around and I have got reports they have turned around," said Chief Jimmy Lulua of the Xeni Gwet'in First Nation, one of six First Nations in the Tsilhqot'in National Government.

Petroleum Resources:

StarMetro and other outlets report that as British Columba touts its commitment to lowering carbon emissions, the province is also a leader in liquified natural gas. A new Global Energy Monitor report has called that a contradiction undermining global efforts to stop climate change. Responding to the report's conclusions, the regional director of the Pembina Institute in B.C. - a non-profit that supports **clean energy** - agreed that Canada cannot compromise its future with a so-called mad dash to gas.
