PCC attended official opening of the new \$1.8M trades training building at the Nicola Valley Institute of Technology – Castanet (Sun). PCC: "We need more tradespeople in the province. We want to make sure aboriginal tradespeople are a big part of that. This is the premiere aboriginal training institution in the country. I hope that we'll see this...double or triple in size over time" – CFIC (Fri).

'The B.C. and Belgian gov't are expected to sign an agreement on Monday to increase trade' – CKNW (Sat). 'Belgium's trade mission to B.C. all about diversity' – TC-B03 (Sat).

TRAN opens full-service rest area on Hwy 97 near Coldstream – the mayor says the project 'was a very worthwhile investment and the lookout has historical and economic value' – CKNW (Sat).

'BC Ferries experiments with vehicle fare discounts' – VS-A05 (Sat). Greater Victoria Chamber of Commerce welcomes the promotion – Carter: "ideally, approaches like this will result in greater efficiencies in the system and a reduction in fares on the day-to-day travel" – CFAX (Fri).

Wide coverage of VCHA's pop-up flu clinic in the DTES – says bringing that service to the area is crucial as marginalized people often can't or don't access healthcare – CKNW (Sun), Global (Sun), Prov-A07.

# Ongoing / Emerging / Potential Issues:

Denham report – Extensive coverage continues on Denham report and PCC's response – all major media. 'PCC is breaking her silence more than 24 hours after the release of the damning report'; premier made a 'pre-emptive strike' by issuing letter; it 'doesn't answer the question about why now', given previous warnings from commissioner; while PCC says B.C. responds to more FOI requests than most other provinces, the reporter notes it's a "moot point" if the documents you want have been deleted – Global (Fri). 'PCC responds to growing scandal over allegations her gov't is deliberately hiding and even erasing important information' – CTV (Fri). 'Report has left gov't scrambling in the hot seat' – CFJC (Fri). 'Don't delete emails, premier tells staff' – CP, Prov-A06 (Sun). 'PCC has laid down the law today' – CKFR (Fri); 'has ordered all of her cabinet and their political staff to save their emails' – CKNW (Fri), TC-A01 (Sat). 'PCC says deputy chief of staff will not be punished for mass deleting her emails' – CBC (Fri); CBC-TV mentions a BC NDP FOI for all of PCC's emails and 'they got back nothing.' Hume: 'Deletion of government e-mails raises questions' – Recaps issue in Q&A format, ending with this question: "Why didn't gov't follow up on the (2014) meetings with substantive action? That question remains unanswered, and the e-mails that might have shed some light on the topic have been erased" – G&M-A09. Quoted:

- PCC: 'we thought everything was being done properly'; 'no change in the way things have been done for a
  decade' CP, Prov-A06 (Sun), TC-A01 (Sat); "We've been doing things that way for a long time and
  (Denham) has said her interpretation of the Act is different" CBC (Fri), similar CTV (Fri); "I don't send a
  ton of email because I meet with staff and talk to staff and colleagues every single day, often weekends
  included"; "the decisions I make are mostly made in cabinet meetings and cabinet committee meetings, and
  that's all evident to the public because all of that is recorded and, to the extent we're allowed, released" VS-A04 (Sat).
- MTS: "I adhere 100% to the requirements of the act"; expect everyone who works for me to follow the act;
   "whole world of FOI is evolving very quickly"; "whole notion of 'triple delete' is a bit of a misnomer. There's always a remnant of the data that remains on computers and servers" CFJC (Fri).
- Horgan: "what surprised me" about PCC remarks is her claim "that there's been no change in behaviour in a decade"; means BC Liberals "have been breaking the law for a decade"; "don't know how you can say 'everything's the same' in one breath and 'we're evolving' in the next"; questions why PCC seems surprised given Denham's previous findings BC-1 (Fri), similar VS-A04 (Sat); "they've been breaking the law for at least the past two years, probably a decade, according to the premier"; "not good enough"; for PCC to say 'we're not going to delete the emails anymore', "you weren't supposed to be deleting them yesterday" Global (Fri); "concerned gov't doesn't seem to understand that this information does not belong to them" CP, Prov-A06 (Sun), TC-A01 (Sat), CBC radio/TV (Fri); "this gov't often sounds like they just arrived yesterday. They've been here for 15 years" CTV (Fri).
- Karagianis: when Duncan received FOI request, he searched his computer and "thousands of emails were returned"; he mentioned it to Gretes, who deleted them all; Duncan says there is an "endemic culture" of

deleting emails; Karagianis questions rationale behind deleting "hundreds and hundreds of documents" re: Hwy 16; PCC is accountable; "to see that gov't was cavalierly and callously deleting every email to do with (Highway of Tears) when they were asked what was going on...sends a very chilling message"; a transportation system is needed; gov't is taking royalties out of this area but 'there is no social contract for those communities' – CFAX talk radio (Fri); 'if MTS has got so much time and initiative to just run around deleting emails, why don't they look at ways to put a bus system on Highway of Tears'; 'not an expensive endeavour'; 'perhaps a million dollars a year'; 'peanuts' – CFAX (Fri).

- Gogolek, BC FIPA: In 2013, Denham report found premier's deputy chief of staff was routinely deleting
  emails; current report shows gov't is committed to making no record gets out; there need to be penalties
  for people who deliberately flout the act; problem is nobody faces consequences; says gov't would rather
  delete records than have to justify withholding them for the legitimate reasons set out in the act CBC talk
  radio (Fri).
- Teegee, Carrier Sekani: report has eroded confidence in gov't; very interested to know what was in the
  deleted emails re: Highway of Tears CKPG (Fri).
- Pahan, Coldwater Indian Band: "what are they trying to hide?"; "If they're supposed be gov't officials, then that transparency should be there"; 'would be interesting to find out why they did that and what information was deleted' CFJC (Fri).
- Editorial: 'Gov't by Post-It' PCC's letter sounds good on the surface but 'there's no good reason to think anything will change soon in the disturbing culture of "oral gov't" that's become a trademark of Clark's regime'; Denham report makes it clear that 'bureaucrats spend far more time figuring out how they can avoid handing over any records than they ever do searching for them' NSN-A06 (Sun).
- Editorial: 'End the culture of deception' "A sweeping review is needed to dispel the culture of deception and secrecy that permeates the B.C. gov't"; welcomes better training and clearer rules, but notes the actions of gov't employees "were not errors in judgment, they were deliberate and scandalous attempts to withhold information..."; a massive shift in attitude is required; "Clark has said the right words; we hope those words will be followed by action"; gov't needs "a tsunami of honesty and a whirlwind of accountability, not trickles of grudging compliance..." TC-A12 (Sat).
- Zussman: 'Triple deleted emails shed light on troubling political culture' B.C. gov't appears to be operating by Losmaney's credo: "Never write if you can speak; never speak if you can nod; never nod if you can wink"; Martyn Brown says the most important advice to cabinet ministers is still delivered orally; PCC promised new era of accountability, so why are staff triple-deleting emails etc.?; 'Just as alarming, it's becoming clear the gov't didn't think it was doing anything wrong'; quotes PCC letter; result is loss of information, loss of faith in politics; quotes Horgan ('concerned that gov't doesn't seem to understand that this information does not belong to them') CBC online (Sat).
- Leyne: 'Denham report vindicates whistleblower' recaps Duncan's complaint that Gretes triple-deleted
  his emails ("It's like locating all the documents someone requested on a sensitive topic and setting fire to
  them, then flushing the ashes. You couldn't devise a more suspicious response if you tried"), and Denham's
  findings; Duncan feels relieved says the civil service treats FOI properly, but the political side 'just feel
  like it's a joke'; PCC has ordered an end to deleting any emails pending a review; concludes Duncan
  deserves some credit 'for the big reset that's coming on gov't's "freedom from freedom of information"
  approach' TC-A12 (Sat).
- Mason: 'B.C. Premier's promise of open government is a complete sham' Denham report was mostly met 'by shrugs and smirks initially' points to MTS response in particular (suggested he won't stop triple-deleting emails and Denham has different interpretation of FOI law); has sympathy for Gretes "Political staffers do what they're told or do as they're taught"; PCC's campaign promise has proven to be a sham gov't record on openness and transparency is "a disgrace"; notes other gov'ts have similar problem, but "the degree to which Ms. Clark's gov't avoided keeping records of discussions around important decisions seems to be without equal"; PCC said she expects those in gov't to do their best to follow FOI law "I'm not holding my breath on that one"; concludes, "So far, being transparent and open is a campaign promise PCC has been unable to keep" G&M-SO1 (Sat).
- Hutchinson: 'Still waiting for openness in B.C.' quotes PCC's 2011 promise on open gov't it hasn't
  materialized; worse, FOI requests "are sometimes ignored, or deleted, or improperly denied"; now there's
  potential RCMP involvement; 'sources tell the National Post that the opposition has found "more examples"

- of gov't information misdirection" and plans to raise them in QP this week; recaps Denham report NP-A06.
- Baldrey: "those of us who deal with trying to get information out of this gov't have every reason to be very skeptical whether anything is really going to profoundly change here"; not sure issue goes back as far as ten years, as Horgan suggests; "the last few years has been marked by a political culture...that is very partisan, very resistant to handing out information except on its own terms, and a political staff that does not seem to want to follow the rules as laid out in the FOI laws"; "It's one thing for PCC to say no more deletions. It's quite another to change this political culture that's taken hold of this gov't"; 'will take legislation and some time but I'm skeptical we're going to see a lot of progress on this front at least for the next few months' Global (Fri).

Wolf cull – 'Documents indicate wolf cull linked to forest industry concerns' – FOI'd briefing notes prepared for MMP and forest industry reps suggest gov't was prompted by industry to launch the wolf cull 'because of fears a federal recovery plan for caribou would demand more logging areas be set aside' (BNs quoted). Barlee, Wilderness Committee: 'alarmed by how closely gov't and the forest industry appear to have been working' – "Are we having the B.C. gov't write recovery strategies for species at risk, or are we having logging companies writing recovery strategies for species at risk?"; strategy is supposed to be a document "created by science" – now "becoming polluted with the economic interests of logging companies." Nixon, Ecojustice: 'also found the BNs disturbing' – "looks like the forest industry in B.C. is either directing gov't's policy on species at risk where that might affect timber harvesting, or at a minimum the provincial gov't is running the policy by the forest industry to make sure that it's okay with them. Either is troubling." Story notes if a province doesn't effectively protect an endangered species, Ottawa can impose regulations on provincial land, and concludes, "Given B.C.'s approach so far, which seems more concerned about logging interests than the needs of caribou, the federal gov't may have to do just that" – G&M-S01.

Violence against nurses – 'Horgan says the ongoing violent incidents involving nurses is very troubling and more needs to be done' – **Horgan**: "MTL came forward with some initiatives. Clearly they are insufficient. If we still have nurses being put at risk and exposed to violence, then clearly we are not meeting the test and more needs to be done" – CHNL (Sat). Duteil is happy with BCNU's new 24-hour hotline – good to have the line in place, but bad that it's needed – CHBC (Fri).

JP case – JP filed a petition to halt a gov't-ordered review of her case – CTV (Fri). Her lawyer, Jack Hittrich, says government's review is 'a bid to spin the story'; is asking BCSC to alter the review's terms of reference so that Plecas isn't allowed to challenge the judge's factual or legal conclusions – CKNW (Fri); wants judge to fix the "one-sided, less-than-objective" gov't review – "This gov't can't be trusted and this process is fundamentally flawed" – CP, Prov-A17 (Sun), VS-A23 (Sat), TC-A02 (Sat).

Paige report – Feature-length program on Paige's life and death as recounted in RCY report – MSC, METL and Dickson clipped – Global 16x9 (Sat). "In the tragic case of a troubled B.C. teen... now gov't is responding to charges that she was the victim of professional indifference" – Dickson, outreach worker: "Paige is one of probably a couple hundred girls...that have passed away down here"; says priority must be to keep kids away from DTES; "Down here, there is no safe housing for kids." METL: her file was "rife with observations by social workers and others saying, 'we know the path that this child is headed on. This child is heading toward this outcome.' Why wouldn't we intervene to support that person?" 'Stunned by the criticism, the B.C. gov't says it's upgrading its child protection system' – MSC: "We've prioritized who is in the greatest risk. And we have put in place a rapid response team model who will track and monitor the highest risk youth so that they can be there when they're ready to accept help" – BC-1 (Fri).

School closures – 'Aboriginal program at risk as school closures loom' – With its special aboriginal program, Sir William Macdonald Community school in east Van could be a "poster child for the new aboriginal focus in education" but it's also a "perfect example of a school that could be slated for closure" due to low enrolment and seismic risk. School trustees will be making that decision tonight; they're "faced with the decision after a special adviser, hired by the provincial gov't, recommended VSB close as many as 19 schools to save money." Buckman, parent and member of Ktunaxa Nation, wants the school to stay open, but "How can we ask parents to send their

children to a school that's not safe and that isn't even guaranteed to stay open? If this school was upgraded and beautiful, it would attract other parents"; says by protecting the school, VSB could show its commitment to aboriginal learning. In several motions, Bacchus has proposed the school stay open until at least 2020 and its seismic upgrade be made a priority - VS-A01.

Container truckers – "There are signs of easing tensions in a long-running labour dispute at PMV's Container Trucking Commissioner's office" – Unifor says it's seeing encouraging signs; McGarrigle says Ready and Bell says have already earned some trust by bringing truckers in on a key advisory committee – CKNW (Sat). 'Trucking companies ignore legislation on wage rates' – Audits show at least two companies continue to disregard provincially legislated wage rates established for container truckers; 'Although MTS is talking tough... names of the companies have not been released and there have been no sanctions yet' (recaps MTS letter to Smith, and Smith's resignation) – 'It has left truckers wondering whether the B.C. gov't is serious about enforcing its own legislation.' McGarrigle says appointing Ready and Bell was a good move, but drivers remain skeptical – "Until some of these rogue companies are really hit hard with penalties and the worst offenders are kicked right out of the port, they are just going to continue to get away with it." MTS says sanctions are coming; needs to be done carefully; "Any company that hasn't paid what they should have paid by now is playing with fire." Singh, UTA: 'said retroactive pay is still an issue and a complaint line set up by the commissioner's office has not helped at all' – VS-C01 (Sat). Other Issues:

## Environment:

Climate change – Hunter: 'Province could follow Norway's map on road to going green' – Gov't needs 'a bright new attraction for its aging climate change show'; needs new ways to encourage consumers to switch from fossil fuels to renewable power – "will take something big if the province is to meet its targets to reduce GHGs"; suspects PCC won't increase carbon tax; recaps Pacific Institute for Climate Solutions report, which says an incentive program in Norway led to a significant shit to EVs and the model could be replicated in B.C. Pedersen, PICS: "tremendous opportunity here for PCC to renew B.C.'s climate leadership." Flannery, global warming activist/scientist: "Everyone wants to be the clean-tech leader, to attract all of that capital that is going to flow. You need the reputation to do that. If you develop an LNG industry, you are going to be working three times as hard to maintain that overall leadership." Story notes B.C. expects to unveil CAP 2.0 in the next few weeks; concludes, "Canada needs climate champions now. PCC has an opportunity to step to the front of the national stage – although she'd best leave her LNG hard hat back in Victoria" – G&M-SO1.

#### Education/Health/Social Services:

Inquest urges detox centre after woman's cell death' – A coroner's jury has made 16 recommendations after inquest concludes into the in-custody death of a 25-year-old Terrace woman; one recommendation is that NHA and FNHA begin discussions with the province about building a substance abuse and detox centre for the Terrace area – Prov-A16 (Sun), VS-A12 (Sat).

Affordable housing – Letter to editor: 'Act on housing crisis' – "All three levels of gov't have failed in their duty to provide Canadians with affordable housing"; the deterioration of our low income housing stock is becoming a crisis and will result in serious social problems unless action is taken; 'province needs to increase funding for construction and operation of new projects while continuing efforts to become more efficient in day to day operations' – VS-E04 (Sat).

Editorial, Geoff Johnson: 'Local school boards shouldn't be irrelevant' - Bemoans the centralization of the public education system - it seems gov't has 'lost confidence in the significance and usefulness of community school trustees and hobbled their effectiveness' - TC-A10 (Sun).

#### Resource Development/Forestry/Agriculture:

Beyond the Market - Community Futures receives requests from organizations across the province for its 'hugely popular' Beyond the Market program, "but funding for the program is hit-and-miss - something the provincial

gov't is well aware of "- PS Morris: "A lot of these farmers have been in the business for decades. They've put their whole heart and soul into it...But the returns just aren't there and that's something that needs to be looked at federally and provincially"; says the Select Standing Committee on Finance has been travelling around B.C., listening to requests for funding from various organizations, including Community Futures – "we're going to take that all into consideration"; "We're deliberating right now and there's billions of dollars on the table that have been requested, so we'll have to look at all the programs and feel which ones deserve priority consideration for us" – CKPG (Fri).

Trans Canada pipeline – 'LNG line eyes new route over aboriginal concerns' – After extensive consultation with FNs, Trans Canada says it will apply in November for an alternative route for part of its pipeline. Wet'suwet'en chief Karen Ogen says they have no issue with the alternative route; says number one priority in LNG development is the protection of the environment; notes an existing natural gas pipeline, in place since 1968, hasn't caused harm; touts potential economic benefit of LNG – VS-A01.

'Haida firm guilty of destructive logging' - VS-A15 (Sat). 'Haida forest firm one of 3 convicted of destroying fish habitat' - TC-A05 (Sat).

#### <u>Instice/Public Safety:</u>

Wide coverage of the whale-watching boat that sunk off Tofino Sunday with 27 people on board. BC Coroner's Service confirms five people are dead and one missing. Tofino's mayor has activated the city's Emergency Operations Centre. TSB investigating – CKNW online.

Fatal police shootings – Editorial: "To serve and protect includes the mentally ill' – concerned by number of fatal police shootings, particularly involving those experiencing a mental health crisis; clearly there's a problem with how police respond to such crises; "2015's spike in fatal police shootings of mentally ill people" occurred although 95% of all frontline officers and supervisors in B.C. completed new training on how to defuse situations with mentally distraught people – "seems obvious the training and procedures... are not working effectively"; matter must be addressed urgently and swiftly – VS-A27 (Sat).

## Other:

Syrian refugees – 'Province braces for refugee influx' – Story discusses impact of Trudeau's promise to bring 25,000 Syrian refugees to Canada by the end of the year; would mean an almost threefold increase in the annual number of refugees to B.C.; housing is identified as a 'major concern.' MSB: "Right now, the province is working with settlement agencies, community groups and private sponsors to make sure the funds are used to get the best outcomes for refugees." Hepner is particularly concerned about school capacity – VS-A14 (Sat), TC-A05 (Sat).

#### Local Government:

B.C. rolls out civic election spending plan' – Mayor Helps welcomed the spending limits, provided they don't include in-kind contributions. Mayor Jensen welcomes the limits, but wonders if they're a bit high – "There's far too much overspending that has gone on throughout the province, and I think this brings a bit of reason and sanity to the whole process." UVic prof Michael Prince says the limits seem reasonable; both Prince and Helps suggested greater transparency could be achieved if donations had to be made public as they came in. UVic prof Norman Ruff says donor contribution limits are "sorely missing" from the legislation; already have them federally, "so what's the obstacle?"; says they would lessen the influence of special interests – TC-A03 (Sun).

#### Transportation:

SkyTrain delays - Power surge blamed for two-hour shutdown on the Expo Line, which left thousands of passengers stranded - Global (Sun), CTV (Sat, Sun). TransLink is happy with its response, with extra staff, drivers and bus bridges put in place as soon as they realized there was a problem - CKNW (Sun).

#### **Government/Politics:**

Background: Reporter seeking responses to the questions below as a follow-up to the OIPC's report issued yesterday.

Suggested Response:

Does government intend to end the practice of triple-deleting by, as Denham recommended, barring employees from access to the 'recover' folder in their email program? And if so, when will this change be implemented? Does government intend to change the automatic delete time of the the recover folder to 30 days before it is automatically emptied, thereby allowing the monthly government backup system to backup the contents of the recovery folder? And if so, when will this change be implemented?

Does the government agree with Commissioner Denham's description of triple-delete, in that if it is done quickly enough it can permanently erase an email from the government system before it can be backed up by monthly government backup procedures? Or, is there another way government technicians have found to recover emails that are triple-deleted even if they aren't backed up? I've had some computer people email me to say that hard drives could in fact be analyzed and emails recovered using other forensic techniques on individual computers.

What other technological solutions is government exploring to prevent people from deleting their emails? To clarify part of the commissioner's report, is it government's understanding that the emails that were triple-deleted by Mr. Gretes have not been recovered and can't be recovered? They are permanently erased? They didn't show up in any other FOIs, or on any other computers, or anywhere else – they are gone? And does the ministry know what those records were, contained, or involved?

Why did the ability for staff to access their recover deleted email folder exist in the first place? For what purpose did government expect staff would want to access that folder?

# 2. Is the government paying the legal fees for \$.22

- We don't discuss the provision of indemnities indemnification is available to employees as

#### **TRANSPORTATION**

#### 3. Will you release the 36 pages of transportation records as recommended by the Commissioner?

 Yes we are retrieving these records and will run through the appropriate process for release, and documents will be released in accordance to the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act.

- 4. What actions has the ministry taken since this issue came to light?
  - Ms. Denham's report demonstrates that there is already a rigorous process in place around how the Ministry of Transportation handles FOIs.
  - Still, the ministry recognized in the spring that there was more the ministry could do to improve our processes, and we've taken a number of steps, including:
    - The MoTI Deputy held meetings with executive to reinforce processing, handling and decision making related to FOIs and to ensure that the ministry has the right number of staff in place to handle FOI volumes.
    - The ministry has hired additional staff and is in the process of changing organizational structures to strengthen FOI capacity.
    - The ministry has started a number of education and training activities for ministry employees. For example, ministry staff have been encouraged to participate in a corporate government training day that will be held on October 28, and we are planning and delivering more focused and targeted FOI education sessions within the ministry.
    - The ministry is also conducting a Lean project on FOI to ensure our processes are as reliable and efficient as possible.
- 5. The Information and Privacy Commissioner has referred the actions of the Ministerial Assistant in the Transportation Ministers Office to the RCMP..... how seriously does government take this referral? Is the individual still employed by the government?
  - If you read the Commissioner's report, you will see that her recommendations provide remedies appropriate to the findings, and we are acting on them.
  - As this is a personnel matter, I can't go into further details. However, I can tell you that we take all workplace complaints seriously and act quickly to look into allegations.
  - In personnel matters, we're limited in what we can say due to privacy considerations. Even in circumstances where an employee has engaged in serious misconduct, the employee's or former employee's right to privacy is respected.
  - The Public Service Agency takes great care to make sure that an employee's personal details aren't disclosed without compelling reason.
  - The information may enter the public domain if the employee later commences litigation or a grievance proceeds to arbitration.
  - We need to both respect the concerns of the people bringing forward concerns, and due process for the person against whom the allegations are made.
- 6. Will the ADM at Transportation receive any discipline for her failure to abide by the Act? Have you taken any steps to ensure this senior official of government is clear on her obligations under the Act?
  - If you read the Commissioner's report, you will see that her recommendations provide remedies appropriate to the findings, and we are acting on them.
  - Senior officials with the government are hardworking and dedicated people who make a number of challenging decisions each day.

- I understand that in this case, they made the decision to narrow the scope based on the information they had at the time.
- The government, however, agrees with the commissioner that the interpretation was ultimately too narrow and that we have a duty to clarify the request with the applicant.
- In fact, upon further review of the request in February, we agreed that we interpreted it too

- The Ministry of Technology, Innovation and Citizens' Services has directed the service provider to conduct daily backups during data migrations and to ensure there is a monitoring function in place.

#### 16.What will government do to ensure that applicants get the records that they are asking for?

- As per the direction of the Premier, David Loukidelis, the former Information and Privacy
  Commissioner of British Columbia, was asked and has agreed to advise government on how to
  address the recommendations.
- Mr. Loukidelis will also provide advice and direction on how we can enhance Freedom of Information training for staff.
- FOI requests are processed by trusted professional public servants, whose decisions and actions are guided by the Freedom of Information and Privacy Protection Act.
- It is more common that an applicant will be contacted to narrow a request in order to ensure they are receiving the information they need in a timely manner and/or reduce potential fees, as part of clarifying the request.
- Government will continue to implement its practice of contacting the applicant to better understand their request.
- Clearly outlined in FOIPPA legislation, is a duty to assist all applicants, to ensure that they receive the records that they are requesting. (Sec. 6.1)

- If someone disagrees with a decision about the release of information, the procedure is to ask the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner to conduct a review of the decision to withhold information.
- It's important to note that over the past two years, the rate of no-record responses has been reduced from 25 to 17 per cent of responses.

#### 17. What is the current level of FOI training - what's included?

#### Political Staff

- Political staff are provided training on the FOI process, and we expect that every record that needs to be kept is kept in accordance with the legislation.
- Training includes what to do when an FOI request is received; records management; the use of email and which records are transitory and which must filed and saved according to the Act.
- A transitory records guide is provided to all political staff who receive the training and is available online for all government employees.
- Government provides training that includes reasonable search on all smart phones, laptops and desktop computers and hard copy records.
- We will ensure our training reflects the limitations on search from devices such as iPad and other mobile devices.

#### Public Servants

- FOI training is available to all public servants.
- A transitory records guide is available online for all government employees.

# 18. Will you move to discipline employees who fail to turn over responsive records or who deliberately delete records?

- The new Information Management Act does not change the actions available to government in responding to the rare circumstance where an employee wilfully disregards the requirements of the Act.
- These actions include disciplinary sanctions, contractual penalties and, in extreme cases, criminal proceedings.
- Although the new Act specifically excludes coverage by the Offence Act, it is important to
  recognize that this is common legislative practice. Most, if not all, legislation drafted in the last
  20 years has excluded the application of the Offence Act.
- Almost 400 B.C. statutes contain a requirement or authority to create records, which is over 80 per cent of all B.C. legislation.

#### 19. Why wasn't 'duty to document' included in the Act?

- The Act does not include a specific requirement to create records as these requirements are already set out in program specific legislation and supporting policy.
- In fact, almost 400 B.C. statutes contain a requirement or authority to create records, which is over 80 per cent of all B.C. legislation.

- Our government remains committed to being as open and transparent as possible.
- Over the last five years government has responded to over 43,000 Freedom of Information requests.
- Government also has almost 1 million boxes of securely stored records in its possession and an additional 40,000 boxes are added per year.

# 20.How do you explain the discrepancy in responsive records between yourself (MAV) and your Chief of Staff?

- My expectation is that all records that need to be kept are kept in accordance to the legislation. We have clear policy and training and I expect it to be followed.
- Most emails are considered transitory in nature and are not considered a final decision record.
- Transitory records include routine and duplicate e-mails, drafts and may be deleted when they have no further business value to the employee who has them.
- If emails are kept and are requested through FOI, they would be included as a responsive record regardless of whether or not they are transitory.
- This often explains why FOI requests for records from different individuals can result in different responses.

#### Minister responds to Information and Privacy Commissioner's report

VICTORIA – Technology, Innovation and Citizens' Services Minister Amrik Virk made the following statement in response to the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner's latest Report.

"On behalf of the government of British Columbia, I would like to thank the Information and Privacy Commissioner for the report.

All government employees have a responsibility to ensure they are properly responding to freedom of information requests. The Commissioner has made a number of important findings that we take seriously and government is committed to acting on her recommendations.

At the direction of the Premier, I have asked the former B.C. Information and Privacy Commissioner David Loukidelis to advise government on how to address the recommendations. Mr. Loukidelis will also provide advice and direction on how we can enhance Freedom of Information training for staff.

Government is already addressing a number of the recommendations. This includes the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure's agreement to provide the additional 36 pages of information and the Ministry of Advanced Education's commitment to provide the requested 20 email records. Both information releases will be in accordance with the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act.

We intend to address outstanding recommendations as swiftly as possible. For example, the Office of the Premier has confirmed they will strengthen their process of documenting and tracking Freedom of Information requests. The Office will also assign responsibility for Freedom of Information coordination to the Deputy Minister's Office. A number of other recommendations that require both policy and operational considerations will require more time for review.

Two of the Commissioner's recommendations also involve changes to existing legislation. Government will refer these recommendations to the all-party Special Committee reviewing the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*. This referral will include a request to look at the practices of other provinces and jurisdictions.

Aspects of the report touch on personnel and legal matters. Given our obligations to protect the privacy of employees and respect for due process, we will not be commenting on these elements.

Earlier this year government passed the *Information Management Act* and created a Chief Records Officer. This position helps ensure the retention and management of important government records so they are available for operational use and for freedom of information requests.

Our government remains committed to being as open and transparent as possible. Over the last five years government has responded to over 43,000 Freedom of Information requests. Government also has almost 1 million boxes of securely stored records in its possession and an additional 40,000 boxes are added per year.

#### **GOVERNMENT RECORDS SERVICE GUIDE**

#### TRANSITORY RECORDS

Many records do not need to be retained. The <u>Transitory Records Schedule</u> authorizes you to dispose of records of temporary value as soon as their business use ends. This guide will help you identify these records.

# What is a transitory record?

Transitory records are records of temporary usefulness that are needed only for a limited period of time in order to complete a routine action or prepare a final record.

As with all records, they can exist in **any format or medium** (paper or electronic), and can be created and shared using a variety of technologies (e.g., email, social media, Live Meeting, SharePoint, wikis).

Transitory records are not required for financial, legal, audit or statutory purposes and are not regularly filed in the <u>office recordkeeping system</u>.

They do not need to be filed using the Administrative Records Classification System (ARCS) or your office's Operational Records Classification System (ORCS).

#### Examples of transitory records:

- advertising material
- announcements of social events
- o cc copies (unless you are the main staff member responsible for the matter)
- copies created for convenience/reference purposes
- o email conveying an attachment (providing it doesn't add value to the attachment)
- meeting arrangements
- personal messages
- simple messages reflecting commonplace interactions (e.g., a request to call someone)
- outlines, calculations, preliminary notes and other rough content used to prepare a final record
- drafts and revisions that are not needed to document decisions and associated approvals
- o routine correspondence about drafts and revisions

# Who can apply this schedule?

You can! You simply need to use your judgment to determine whether a record is, or is not, transitory. The authority to identify transitory records is delegated to each BC government employee.

However: DO NOT destroy any transitory records that are relevant to a FOIPPA request or legal discovery.

# What isn't a transitory record?

A record's content and context determines whether it is transitory, not its format or storage medium. If an email, significant draft, or other record is essential to understanding government business, e.g., how a particular decision was reached, then the record is non-transitory and must be kept.

Non-transitory records need to be filed and saved in accordance with the appropriate government records schedule (i.e., ARCS/ORCS classification).

#### Examples of non-transitory records:

- o work unit activities documentation (e.g., work schedules, assignments, etc.)
- useful information that helps explain the history of a relationship, decision or project
- drafts or revisions with information about a decision or associated approvals that is unavailable elsewhere (e.g., directions to change a proposal and recommend a different course of action)
- o a final report with recommendations
- o formal communication about official business
- o policies and directives
- o decision records, instructions, and advice
- o meeting agendas and minutes
- documentation of a policy matter or how a case was managed
- documentation of initiation, authorization, or completion of business transactions
- documentation that is evidence of a significant action (e.g., verification or approval to proceed)

# Why Managing Transitory Records Is Important

By promptly removing transitory records, employees are better able to identify and file key records into their office recordkeeping system, where they can be easily found. As well, government avoids unnecessary costs for storing and processing transitory records.


# OFFICIAL RECORDS



# Any of the following would be considered official records:

- Briefing notes, directives, policies, final reports and recommendations.
- Workplans, schedules, assignments and performance results.
- Materials that document a business decision, a business transaction or the position of the department.
- Business deliverables.
- Materials of historical or research importance.
- Information and deliverables from outside sources.

- Agendas and meeting minutes.
- Documents that result in a decision, or that result in the implementation of a policy or activity.
- Documents that require a signature (must be printed and filed as hard copy).
- Materials that would allow for the reconstruction of the evolution of policy and program decisions.
- Materials that would be required to support a financial, administrative, or legal audit.



# TRANSITORY RECORD: DEFINITION



Transitory records are information sources that are only required for a limited period of time, in order to complete a routine action or to prepare a subsequent record.

You must dispose of or delete transitory records once they have served their purpose and no longer have value to the organization.

# TRANSITORY RECORDS:



# Any of the following would be considered transitory records:

- Duplicate copies used for convenience or reference (originally maintained by somebody else)
- Information received as part of a distribution list
- Miscellaneous, "FYI" notices or memoranda on meetings, holidays, charitable campaigns, boardroom reservations etc.

- Casual communications and personal messages
- Photocopies of departmental publications
- Draft documents where all critical content changes have been incorporated into a subsequent document
- Working versions not communicated outside of your office


# TRANSITORY RECORDS AND ATIP



"It is unlawful to delete any transitory record (email or document), once a formal ATI or Privacy request is received or anticipated by the Department, relating to the subject."




- All documents/records both official and transitory are subject to ATIP legislation
- It is illegal to delete transitory records that are required for an active or anticipated ATIP request, litigation or official investigation.
- Personal comments in documentary materials cannot be removed when providing records in response to an ATIP request.




# VOLUME AND ATIP ARE KEY ISSUES



- The sheer volume of transitory records that exist can impede a department's ability to manage official records.
- The greater the number of files that have to be managed, the harder it becomes to find the important information.
- The greater the number of files that have to be managed, the greater the stress on departmental storage services (such as email servers and network drives).
- If kept, transitory records, and not just official records, must be provided under Access to Information and Privacy requests.
- Transitory records are more likely to contain embarrassing and personal information.
- If included in an ATIP request, transitory records must then be held for an additional 2 years.





# HOW AND WHERE SHOULD YOU SAVE AN OFFICIAL RECORD?



# **Paper**

- Records can be kept where they are created/required as long as they are being organized and maintained.
- Paper records can be transferred to off-site storage if dormant (not used often). Contact the Records Office for advice and assistance.
- Originals of financial and legal agreements, and typically any other documents that require a signature, must be filed with the OIC Records Office.

# HOW AND WHERE SHOULD YOU SAVE AN OFFICIAL RECORD?



# **Electronic**

- Electronic records should ideally be saved to a central repository such as an electronic document and records management system (RDIMS). In the absence of such a repository, then shared network drives are an advisable location for saving and sharing records.
- Specific tools, guidelines, and how-to information to support employees in the correct processes and locations for saving electronic records are available. Contact the IM / IT Division for such information.
- Sensitive records should be saved and stored in a manner suitable to their sensitivity (e.g. documents with a designation of Protected C or above cannot be saved on the OIC networks nor sent via standard email).



- Identifying and saving official records is a very important part of your IM responsibility.
  - Official records document or provide evidence of a department's business activities.
- Identifying and deleting transitory records is another important part of your IM responsibility.
  - Transitory records are only required for a limited period of time in order to complete a routine action or to prepare a subsequent record.

VICTORIA - B.C.'s privacy commissioner has released a scathing report aimed at Premier Christy Clark's office and two of her government's ministries.

Elizabeth Denham says it's likely that Transport Ministry assistant George Gretes deleted emails, didn't completely respond to freedom of information requests and then lied about it under oath.

Denham says she has referred the matter to the RCMP for investigation of possible offences.

The commissioner says her investigation uncovered negligent searches for records, failure to keep adequate email records, a failure to document searches and the willful destruction of records in response to FOI requests.

The issue came to light when Tim Duncan, a former executive assistant in the Transport Minister's office, submitted a complaint alleging Gretes "triple deleted" computer records that would have been needed for an FOI request.

The commissioner also examined additional access requests directed at the Ministry of Advanced Education and the Premier's office which were brought forward after the initial complaint.



### RECOMMENDATION 1:

The Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure should release the 36 pages of records initially identified as responsive to the applicant's access request, with severing as allowed under FIPPA, made on November 19, 2014 for:

"... all government records that make reference to the issue of missing women along Highway 16 / the Highway of Tears and specifically including records related to meetings held by the ministry on this issue. The time frame for my request is May 15 to November 19, 2014."

### **RECOMMENDATION 2:**

Government should develop a policy for all future data migrations that requires at

#### a minimum:

- 1. Hourly, daily and monthly backup of data;
- 2. Written directions to government's service provider with respect to these backups; and
- 3. Government monitoring of the directions to ensure their compliance.

#### **RECOMMENDATION 3:**

The Ministry of Advanced Education should release the approximately 20 email records identified as responsive to the applicant's access request, with severing as allowed under FIPPA, made on July 21, 2014 for:

"Any emails sent by Nick Facey, Chief of Staff to Minister Amrik Virk. Timeframe is February 1, 2014 to July 16, 2014."

The Investigations and Forensics Unit will retrieve the emails and provide them to the Ministry.

### **RECOMMENDATION 4:**

The Executive Branch of the Office of the Premier should change its access to information processes to ensure that requests for records are communicated by email in a timely manner and properly documented

#### RECOMMENDATION 5:

Government should clarify access requests with applicants where necessary to ensure it does not interpret the request too narrowly and to maximize the likelihood of producing records that are responsive to the applicant's request.

#### RECOMMENDATION 6:

Government should create clear guidance for employees on how to conduct a thorough search for potentially responsive records to an access request. This guidance should be incorporated into government's access to information training and should specifically include that employees should conduct searches from their desktop or laptop and not from mobile devices.

#### RECOMMENDATION 7:

Government should provide mandatory records management training to all employees, that includes the identification of transitory and non-transitory records and the process for retaining and destroying records. This training should describe employees' responsibilities for records management and provide the basis for understanding an office's record keeping system.

#### **RECOMMENDATION 8:**

Government should legislate independent oversight of information management requirements, such as the destruction of records, including sanctions when those requirements are not met.

### **RECOMMENDATION 9:**

Government should configure the settings in Microsoft Outlook to prevent employees from removing items from the Recover Deleted Items folder.

### **RECOMMENDATION 10:**

Government should configure the settings in Microsoft Outlook so that it preserves items in the Recover Deleted Items folder for just over one month. This

would ensure all government emails are captured in monthly backups

## **RECOMMENDATION 11:**

Government should create a legislative duty to document within FIPPA as a clear indication that it does not endorse "oral government" and that it is committed to be accountable to citizens by creating an accurate record of its key decisions and actions.
