Expanded program builds Aboriginal learners' future

PENTICTON - Aboriginal learners in British Columbia will have more opportunities to access skills training programs to help them on their career paths, thanks to a further investment of \$1.8 million in the Aboriginal Training for Employment Program (ATEP).

This latest investment means an additional 12 service providers are delivering job-related training in essential skills and introductory trades training, along with mentoring, coaching and support through partnerships with public, private and Aboriginal-controlled training organizations throughout B.C.

"We are working to ensure Aboriginal people in British Columbia get the post-secondary education and training that will enable them to access good jobs and fulfil B.C.'s labour needs of

the future," said John Yap, Minister of Advanced Education, Innovation and Technology. "The skills that learners develop in the ATEP programs will be the key that opens doors to employment and creates success for individuals, their families and their communities."

ATEP was introduced in 2010 with an investment of \$4 million through the Canada-British Columbia Labour Market Agreement (LMA). By January 2012, more than 500 Aboriginal people had graduated from ATEP programs offered by 17 Aboriginal organizations. Earlier this year, contracts for 11 service providers were renewed and another \$2.9 million was invested.

"Since starting at BCIT, my skills have developed more than I ever thought possible. If there was anything I would say to somebody who was thinking of joining a trades program through ACCESS (Aboriginal Community Career Employment Services Society) is to just do it," said BCIT student Dylan Clifton. "It is the most rewarding program I have ever been in. When I finished high school and didn't graduate, I never imagined I could end up with such a great career. Thank you for the great opportunity."

As a direct result of federal LMA funding, thousands of British Columbians are receiving training that will advance their careers, assist in securing new employment and ultimately improve the economic outcomes of individuals in B.C. and Canada. The current agreement expires on March 31, 2014, and B.C. is preparing to enter discussions with the federal government to renew this important agreement and ensure our province has the skilled workforce required to support long-term labour market needs and economic growth.

"Through the LMA funding, students are experiencing incredible success in trades' foundation programs. Trainees are gaining the skills to successfully enter into first-year apprenticeships with our employer partners," said Helen Boyce, director of ACCESS Trades at BCIT. "Trainees in the current LMA-funded boilermakers program will be going to work after graduation as first-year, boilermaker apprentices. Programs like this not only change the lives of the individuals in these programs, but the community they live and work in."

Under the BC Jobs Plan, government is committed to providing funding for community-based delivery of programs that meet Aboriginal learners' needs. In the summer, a third request for proposals was posted on BC Bid seeking more service providers to bring training and employment opportunities to Aboriginal individuals throughout the province.

#### Key messages:

- B.C.'s Aboriginal population is both young and our fastest-growing population. Ensuring they can access post-secondary education and skills training is key to meeting B.C.'s labour market needs and is an important part of the B.C. Jobs Plan.
- We want to ensure that Aboriginal people get the training and education they want and need.
- By improving access to education, skills and trades training through community-based delivery, we can help to position Aboriginal communities to take advantage of economic opportunities.
- Our vision is an integrated system where Aboriginal institutes and public post-secondary institutions work together to meet the needs of Aboriginal students and communities, along with increasing the focus on transitions from the K-12 system.

#### ATEP funding overview:

- ATEP service providers deliver job-related training in essential skills and introductory trades training, along with mentoring, coaching and support through partnerships with public, private and Aboriginalcontrolled training organizations around B.C.
- The program was introduced in 2010 with an investment of \$4M through the Canada-BC Labour Market Agreement. By January 2012, more than 500 Aboriginal people had graduated from ATEP programs offered by 17 Aboriginal organizations. Earlier this year, 11 service providers' contracts were renewed with another \$2.9M invested.
- In summer 2012, a third RFP was posted on BC Bid for more service providers. The bid has closed and the Ministry is in the process of finalizing the evaluation of the request for proposal submissions and notifying proponents of the decision.

#### **Canada-BC Labour Market Agreement**

- As a direct result of federal LMA funding, thousands of British Columbians are receiving training that will advance their careers, assist in securing new employment, and ultimately improve the economic outcomes of individuals, B.C. and Canada.
- The current agreement will expire on March 31, 2014, and B.C. is preparing to enter discussions with the federal government to renew this important agreement and ensure our province has the skilled workforce required to support long term labour market needs and economic growth.

- It encompasses all post-secondary education and training programs, including adult basic education, vocational, career, business, trades, undergraduate and graduate degree programs, —
- And it addresses our B.C. Jobs Plan commitment to provide funding for additional partnerships between post-secondary institutions and Aboriginal

- communities, -
- Such as investments through the Canada-British Columbia Labour Market Agreement, —
- For formal agreements under the Aboriginal Training for Employment Program, or "ATEP" [aay tep] as it's often known.
- Today I'm pleased to tell you that government is providing ATEP with a total funding of \$1.8 million for 12 organizations to deliver job-related training for Aboriginal British Columbians.

## **Expanded program builds Aboriginal learners' future**

PENTICTON – Aboriginal learners in British Columbia will have more opportunities to access skills training programs to help them on their career paths, thanks to a further investment of \$1.8 million in the Aboriginal Training for Employment Program (ATEP).

This latest investment means an additional 12 service providers are delivering job-related training in essential skills and introductory trades training, along with mentoring, coaching and support through partnerships with public, private and Aboriginal-controlled training organizations throughout B.C.

"We are working to ensure Aboriginal people in British Columbia get the post-secondary education and training that will enable them to access good jobs and fulfil B.C.'s labour needs of the future," said John Yap, Minister of Advanced Education, Innovation and Technology. "The skills that learners develop in the ATEP programs will be the key that opens doors to employment and creates success for individuals, their families and their communities."

- The current agreement will expire on March 31, 2014, and B.C. is preparing to enter discussions with the federal government to renew this important agreement an ensure our province has the skilled workforce required to support long term labour market needs and economic growth.

## MINISTER YAP SPEAKING NOTES

- Thank Haven Hill organizers for hosting event.
- I'm honoured to be here with you today on the traditional territory of the Okanagan Nation and the Penticton Indian Band.
- On my way here this morning, I was thinking about how learning is not a finite thing – we can learn something new every day.
- For instance, I'm pretty new as Minister of Advanced
   Education, Innovation and Technology so I'm learning a LOT
   every single day, and it's a steep learning curve.
- But I'm enjoying it, and excited to be involved in helping British Columbians reach their educational and career goals.
- B.C.'s Aboriginal population is dynamic and growing; filled with bright minds and terrific potential.
- Finding ways and means of engaging, nurturing, and encouraging that potential will play an important role in their success and that of their families and communities.
- To meet their needs as learners, we are focusing on creating an integrated system – one where Aboriginal institutes, postsecondary institutions, and the business community work together.
- Our goal is to enhance Aboriginal people's participation in the social, cultural and economic life of their communities, the province, and global society.

- To meet this goal, we have worked closely with our Aboriginal post-secondary education and training partners to develop an education framework and action plan for the future.
- The framework and action plan will help to guide and inform the direction of post-secondary education and training for Aboriginal learners in B.C., along with their transition into the labour market.
- It encompasses all post-secondary education and training programs, including adult basic education, vocational, career, business, trades, undergraduate and graduate degree programs, –
- And it addresses our B.C. Jobs Plan commitment to provide funding for additional partnerships between post-secondary institutions and Aboriginal communities, –
- Such as investments through the Canada-British Columbia Labour Market Agreement, –
- For formal agreements under the Aboriginal Training for Employment Program, or "ATEP" [aay tep] as it's often known.
- Today I'm pleased to tell you that government is providing ATEP with a total funding of \$1.8 million for 12 organizations to deliver job-related training for Aboriginal British Columbians.
- This training will provide essential skills and job-related training, like introductory trades training, along with mentoring, coaching and workplace supports.
- Through partnerships with public, private and Aboriginalcontrolled training organizations around B.C., organizations like the Penticton Indian Band and their Footprints to Employment

program, which provides training in career and personal development, and assists learners to understand wellness for work, and how to achieve life balance and improve selfesteem.

- ATEP programs are helping learners explore skills and training they need to secure jobs in a variety of occupations, –
- For example, in the health care field, which s22 [student speaker] will tell you about in a minute.
- And that's not all.
- My ministry is working on new agreements with more service providers to ensure Aboriginal learners have opportunities that will give them the skills they need to get training and jobs.
- Strengthening our communities and helping to create a workforce that can compete in the new global economy is important because, –
- Forecasts tell us that B.C. is expected to have more than one million job openings in the next ten years.
- But it also presents us with a challenge because we need to ensure we have enough workers, with the right skills, in every region of the province to maximize B.C.'s economic potential.
- That's what our new Skills and Training Plan is about getting British Columbians the right skills, in the right regions at the right time.
- Today, B.C. is benefiting from a number of major projects that are under development and construction – projects that need highly skilled workers with specialized, as well as general skills.

- We believe post-secondary education and skills development will enable British Columbians to secure the kinds of jobs needed to support their families, and help B.C. compete successfully in the global economy.
- Initiatives like ATEP help to support the BC Jobs Plan and enable Aboriginal British Columbians to gain the knowledge and skills they need to take care of their families, build their communities and be successful in their work and personal lives.
- Let's keep working together to ensure that Aboriginal people are ready and able to take full advantage of the opportunities that are there now, and in the future.

## **PROJECT OVERVIEW:**

ATEP service providers deliver job-related training in essential skills and introductory trades training, along with mentoring, coaching and support through partnerships with public, private and Aboriginal-controlled training organizations around B.C.

The program was introduced in 2010 with an investment of \$4M through the Canada-BC Labour Market Agreement. By January 2012, more than 500 Aboriginal people had graduated from ATEP programs offered by 17 Aboriginal organizations. Earlier this year, 11 service providers' contracts were renewed with another \$2.9M invested.
