

Qualifying Logging truck Configuration:

Tridem drive truck guad trailer hauling short log bundles.



Hitch offset

- Maximum 4.5 m for rear overhang on the tridem drive truck to reduce the stress on the truck's tail frame and provide better vehicle handling.
- Minimum drawbar length 5 M maximum 6 M.
- Overall length for vehicle configuration will remain the same Max 25m
- The max hitch offset of 3 m applies to tridem drive truck and quad axie trailer with Letter of Authorization (LOA) for 2.9m wide bunks and 27.5m overall load length on approved wide bunk routes (as per the T-60 Form) for hauling beetle killed wood from Mountain Pine Beetle stands.

Bunk Height:

- 4.3 m max when hauling empty trailer (piggyback) with variance according to public safety and the route selection while cognizant of the need to protect infrastructure (overpasses, lamp standards etc).

We continue to receive complaints from the logging industry with regard to enforcement action taken in the field by our CVSE staff and the RCMP. There is a feeling that the enforcement action our officers are taking is not linked to safety and that they are being treated poorly. I have asked the Central Interior Logging Association through MaryAnne Arcand to assist us in setting up a stakeholder working group to see if we can collectively resolve this issue.

We will be setting up a meeting/working group at a central location and your participation is essential, once I have a better idea when and where we will be meeting with the association I will send out meeting invites to you all.

Memorandum Of Understanding

For Reducing Logging Truck Overloads

This Memorandum Of Understanding has been written with the input of all the Stakeholders concerned to address the problem of log truck overloads.

It is the consensus of the undersigned that the log truck owners, log truck drivers, mills, Dept of Transportation and Highways, R.C.M.P. and Dept. of Transport will work together to find solutions to this problem.

It is the consensus of the undersigned that we are concerned about the affects of overloads on roads and truck safety. However, our proposal for reducing overloads will focus primarily on addressing these 2 issues and to a lesser extent on strict compliance with the regulations. We feel that it is the job of the Regulatory Agencies to deal with the compliance issue.

Non-payment For Overweight Loads

It is the consensus of the undersigned that a system of payment to the trucking contractors will be put into place that will result in the payments for loads over a specified weight to be paid into a Trucking Overload Fund. This Fund will be used to make charitable contributions within the Williams Lake Community and will be controlled by the Trucking Committees of each mill.

This system of payment will apply to all loads coming into a mill, including private wood.

The specified weights will be set at a weight that includes legal loading, tolerance as per the regulations and mill tolerance. The system will be based on the G.V.W. for various truck types, not payload.

The mill tolerance will vary during the hauling season depending on the pavement strength. Under no circumstances will the mill tolerance be set at a weight that would cause a load to be unsafe. The mill tolerance will range from 0 - 2000 KGs.

The intent of the mill tolerance is not to include it as part of the average load size, rather, it is recognition of the variability of the cargo and the conditions that the trucks must operate in, with the intent that the trucks are able to average a legal load.

Monitoring

It is the consensus of the undersigned that each mill will, on a monthly basis, report the percent of loads that are at or under legal load weights. Also, each mill will report the percent of loads that are at or under legal load weight plus 500 KGs.

All the Stakeholders will meet every 3 months, or more frequently if required, to monitor progress and discuss any problems or concerns.

Enforcement at Mill Weigh Scales.

It is the consensus of the undersigned that the Department Of Transport Officials will be welcome in the mill weigh scales for monitoring purposes only, with the following exception: if the D.O.T. Official is in persuit of a truck which ends up at the mill's weigh scale, the Official is welcome to use information from the scale for enforcement purposes.

Re: System of payment for overloaded trucks.

- * This memo describes how the logtruck overload policy will be implemented.
- * The policy applies to all loads crossing Lignum's scale, including private wood.
- * All 5 mills in Williams Lake have the same program. The only difference is some of the mills have a slightly lower mill tolerance. If you are hauling Lignum logs to the other mills, the Lignum tolerance will apply.
- * For the system to work, and for you to be paid correctly, it is essential the scalers enter the correct truck type on the load slip. The truck code is used for both the overweight program as well as for paying underweights.
- * It would be in your best interest to have the truck code clearly identified on the side of the truck that is viewed from the scale. However, if you have a standard configuration, that is: L, T, S, B, T, X, writing the code on your truck is optional. Any other truck types must have the truck code clearly identified on the truck for the scalers to see.
- * Overload payment system and mill tolerance:
 - Attached is a list of allowable weights (legal axle weights plus seasonal tolerance) by truck type.
 - A truck can haul up to 2000 kg. over these weights without penalty, that is they will be paid for the extra weight hauled.
 - If a truck hauls 2001 kg. or more over the allowable weight, the truck will only be paid for the allowable weight and the penalty portion will be paid into the Truckers' Overload Fund.
 - The intent is for the trucks not to use the Mill Tolerance as part of the average, that is, they should be hauling at their allowable weight.
