

#### Appendix: Addressing Homelessness in Vancouver

 In 2014/2015 the provincial and federal governments invested over \$123.4 million dollars in emergency shelter and housing for the homeless, assisting more than 6,400 individuals who are homeless or at risk of homelessness in Vancouver.

#### Emergency Shelters and Outreach

- As of December 31, 2015 there are approximately 740 emergency shelter spaces.
- Last year homeless outreach teams in Vancouver helped to connect almost 800 homeless people to stable housing and supports through the Homeless Outreach and Aboriginal Homeless Outreach Programs.

#### Homeless Prevention Program (HPP)

 As of December 31, 2015 more than 750 rent supplements have been allocated to service providers to assist those who are homeless or at risk of homelessness.

#### Homeless Emergency Action Team (HEAT) Shelters in Vancouver

- In 2015/16 the provincial government provided approximately \$2.8 million dollars to fund two HEAT shelters in Vancouver, creating more than 150 additional emergency shelter spaces in the city.
- The reduction in the number of spaces from the previous year is because The First United HEAT shelter recently became a permanent homeless shelter.

#### Winter Response Strategy for Vancouver

• In 2015/16 the Province – in partnership with the City of Vancouver – provided approximately \$1.5 million dollars for an additional 190 Temporary Winter Response Shelter spaces, as well as rent supplements for people who were homeless.

#### Extreme Weather Response (EWR) Program

- The EWR program funds time-limited, temporary shelter beds for individuals who are homeless during extreme weather conditions from November through March.
- Approximately 225 spaces were available across Vancouver during the 2015/16 season.

### Supportive Housing – Local Government Partnerships (Memoranda of Understanding)

- In partnership with the City of Vancouver and Streetohome we are building more than 1,500 new supportive apartments.
- The majority of the developments are now open. The last few developments are under construction or in development and will be completed within the next year.

#### SRO Renewal Initiative (SRI)

- The Province is investing \$143.3 million dollars into the SRO Renewal Initiative to renovate 13 SROs under a public-private partnership. This includes \$29.1 million dollars from the Government of Canada through the P3 Canada Fund.
- The SRI will deliver long-term supportive housing and improved quality of life for nearly 900 residents living in the Downtown Eastside.
- Renovations on five of these buildings are now complete. Construction is expected to be completed on the remaining eight by end of August 2016.
- No tenants have been displaced as a result of the initiative.

#### **Homeless Counts**

- The 2015 City of Vancouver Homeless Count found there were 1,746 individuals, including 1,258 sheltered and 488 sheltered homeless.
- The homeless population in Vancouver continues to be disproportionately male, Aboriginal, middle-aged, and in poor health.
- Overall, the number of unsheltered homeless individuals declined by 40 percent from 2008 to 2011.

#### **BACKGROUND**:

Premier Clark announced that there would be a meeting to:

"discuss ways that we can work together to increase supply, beginning in the Vancouver market but growing also that conversation out across municipalities in the province. They'll be talking about how we can work together to increase supply; how we can work together...to increase the supply of affordable housing; what we can do increase the number of rental units that are on the market; and what we can do to discourage irresponsible speculation in the market."

#### **ISSUES:**

#### Funding for 3,500 New Affordable Units

- According to his office, Mayor Robertson is attempting to persuade the Trudeau government to commit \$500 million over five years to build social housing on 20 city properties. The British Columbia government would also be asked to commit cash to the projects. The plan would create up to 3,500 affordable housing units.
- This could fit with the new Provincial Investment in Affordable Housing Program announced by the Province in the Budget in February 2016.
  - Over the next five years the Province is committing a total of \$355 million dollars to construct and renovate more than 2,000 units of affordable housing for people with low to moderate incomes across the province.
  - This investment uses the proceeds from the Non-Profit Asset Transfer Program.
  - A proposal call was issued by BC Housing this week. Applicants may be nonprofits, not local governments.

#### **Housing Affordability**

- Creating new housing supply is critical to improving housing affordability in the real estate market. The provincial government is acting to help the housing market respond to high demand for homes.
- Between June 1, 2001 and December 31, 2015, BC Housing initiated more than 26,000 new units of affordable housing throughout the province. More than 22,600 are complete. The remainder are in development stage or under construction.
- The New Housing Exemption from the property transfer tax will save a purchaser up to \$13,000 dollars and provide an estimated \$75 million dollars in property transfer tax relief for new construction in 2016-17.
  - Newly built homes, including condominiums, priced up to \$750,000 dollars will be fully exempt from the property transfer tax when bought by Canadian citizens or permanent residents as a principal residence and lived in for a full year. Partial exemptions are available for new housing valued up to \$800,000.
  - The new exemption is expected to benefit owners of about 22,000 new homes in 2016, many of which will be in the Vancouver area.
  - This will be funded by increasing the property transfer tax rate to 3 percent from 2 percent on the portion of fair market value over \$2 million dollars.
- Through BC Housing's Community Partnerships Initiatives Program, we increase
  affordable housing options by offering low-cost development financing for housing
  units and lending for mixed-market developments.
- To date, the Community Partnership Initiatives program has contributed to over 3,300 new units of affordable housing, accessible to low to moderate income households.
- The Province mandates exemptions from local development cost charges and levies for very small-unit housing projects (under 280 square feet) and allows waivers for private sector affordable rental housing in an effort to assist affordability.
- Municipal leaders who are responsible for planning, zoning and development regulation can use the broader tools at their disposal to support efforts and further the creation of new housing supply.
- Important tools include temporary property tax reductions and allowing for complete, compact community development including densification, laneway housing and secondary suites. Developers say that faster approvals are also critical.

#### Vacancies, Speculation and Foreign Investment

- BC Housing is leading a research initiative that will examine a range of factors potentially affecting home prices throughout the province.
- Findings from the research will inform policy analysis in British Columbia and assist in
  evaluating the merits of various policy proposals across all levels of government. The
  research is expected to take about four more months.

- Many factors influence housing prices, including land supply, economic conditions, municipal approval processes, interest rates, fees and taxes, household income, and financing regulations. Foreign ownership is only one of many potential factors that this research initiative will examine.
- There are no definitive numbers on foreign buyers in Metro Vancouver. However, available data and analysis in the region suggests that foreign ownership of housing is less than 5 percent of the housing stock and not more than 5 percent of sales activity.

#### **Little Mountain Progress**

- The remaining social housing to be built includes 181 family units, which the City says are desperately needed.
- However, despite the City's agreement to expedite it, rezoning has been a protracted process. A public hearing before Council's summer break is desirable.

#### Request to change Vancouver Charter

- The City may be preparing to request amendments to the Vancouver Charter related to housing, possibly to allow housing agreements to be registered on title for affordable home ownership projects, in addition to rental projects.
- This would need to go through the Ministry of Community, Sport and Cultural Development, but staff there are unaware of any proposal.

#### False Creek South Leasehold Stratas

- All parties agreed that negotiated lease renewals and some additional density are the desired outcomes, and that further work is needed before any provincial legislative or regulatory action occurs.

**ISSUE:** City of Vancouver March 8, 2016 report on Housing Occupancy

#### **BACKGROUND:**

On Tuesday March 8, 2016 a report by Ecotagious on unoccupied housing in Vancouver was presented to Vancouver City Council by Matt Bourke, a housing planner with the city, and Bruce Townson, CEO of Ecotagious, a company that analyzes home energy use based on Hydro data.

Besides the Ecotagious authors, other research team members acknowledged in the report include staff from BC Hydro, BC Housing, Metro Vancouver, and the Vancouver Affordable Housing Agency.

There was immediate media coverage including a live blog on CBC BC's website.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

The following findings were widely reported in the media:

- The percentage of unoccupied homes in Vancouver has remained flat over the last 14 years despite longstanding complaints that investors are buying homes and leaving them empty.
- The report said that Vancouver's non-occupancy rate was 4.9 per cent in 2002 compared with 4.8 per cent in 2014 and is comparable to other major cities.
- Although the non-occupancy rate hasn't changed much in the last 14 years, the authors said the total number of empty homes has increased because the size of Vancouver's housing stock has grown too.
- Of the 10,800 empty housing units in Vancouver in 2014, more than 90 per cent were apartments. In this report, "apartments" includes both purpose-built rentals and condominiums, perhaps because of limits in BC Hydro's data.

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#### **Caveats and Methodology**

The term non-occupancy is used instead of the more traditional 'vacancy' to include both housing that is empty of personal belongings (vacancy) and housing that is not being used (non-occupancy) but may hold someone's significant personal belongings.

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#### **SUMMARY**:

The report downplays Vancouver's vacant housing "problem" but is unlikely to change public opinion as it does not reflect personal experience.
