Ministry: Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations (FLNR)

Issue: A1-6: Wildfire Act - Statutory Spending

Background:

- At UBCM in September 2015, government announced that FLNR would be developing a Forest Enhancement Program to undertake forest rehabilitation, wildfire prevention, and wildlife habitat restoration. At the same time, government announced a \$10M top-up to the Strategic Wildfire Prevention Initiative.
- > The Direct Fire Vote of \$63M is generally exhausted each year for direct fire control costs. This provides FLNR with limited ability within existing budget allocations to engage in activities like wildfire prevention and the rehabilitation of Crown land damaged by fire.
- FLNR is requesting approval to increase statutory spending under the Wildfire Act by up to \$95M in 2015/16 to support these government commitments.
- The current statutory spending authority under the Wildfire Act is limited to direct fire control expenditures and does not cover expenditures for wildfire prevention and mitigation (e.g. fuel management to reduce potential fire intensity and spread) or rehabilitation activities (e.g. reforestation, habitat restoration).
- Budget 2016 legislation will expand the existing statutory appropriation to allow for expenditures related to wildfire prevention, preparedness, and mitigation as well as rehabilitation. The proposed scope is activities that are not in response to imminent or existing fires, but are intended to prevent or mitigate the impact of future wildfires. Out of scope activities would include reforestation of low-value forests on high productivity sites on the coast and wildlife habitat restoration when there is no risk of or damage from wildfire.
