ISSUE: Persons With Disability Rates and Transportation Allowances

BACKGROUND:

Assistance rates in British Columbia (B.C.) reflect individual and family needs including nutrition, shelter and clothing. In recognition that Persons With Disabilites (PWD) face more barriers to employment their rates are higher. Advocates typically criticize the adequacy of B.C.'s assistance rates. They believe the rates do not meet a person's long-term basic needs and often refer to a study ranking BC fifth in the country for PWD rates (appendix 1).

One of the reasons that BC's PWD rate appears to be lower is due to some of the supplementary programs our clients receive which are not included the rate calculations. In particular, the ministry currently has two basic transportation supplements for PWD clients — an annual bus pass and the Special Transportation Subsidy (STS). These supplements aren't generally captured in cross-jurisdictional rate comparisons because they are not available to all PWD clients.

Annual bus passes are provided to PWD clients where public transit is available. Cost to the client is \$45 annually for the annual pass. The ministry pays the subsidized costs monthly to BC Transit and Translink for an equivalent benefit of \$52/month. An annual application/renewal process is used to confirm eligibility, collect the \$45 payment, and mail passes to clients.

The STS is provided to PWDs who reside in an area where public transit is available, but are unable to use public transit due to their disability. The STS rate is \$790/year, \$66/month (equivalent to the highest bus pass subsidy in the province), and is paid directly to clients in a lump sum each April (prorated if required). STS costs have been steadily increasing by over \$1 million each fiscal year. In total, the ministry pays an additional \$34 million in benefits to PWD clients annually.

DISCUSSION:

Currently transportation assistance provided to clients is inequitable because almost half of PWD clients do not receive either an annual bus pass or the STS. In addition, because the STS is a cash benefit to clients, it is often preferred to a bus pass and as a result, the STS cost has been rising steadily by over 10% annually.

There is building public pressure to increase income assistance rates. The last PWD rate increase occurred in 2007 and was for \$50.00/month. The current PWD rate for a single individual is \$906/month.

The ministry has considered various rate increase options and the cost impacts, which are outlined in appendix 2. s.13

That is why *Budget 2016* provides an extra \$250 million over the next three years to the Ministry of Social Development and Social Innovation for individuals and families in need, addressing caseload pressure for temporary income assistance, disability assistance and related supplementary benefits.

An additional \$36 million over three years is being provided to Community Living BC to support services for individuals with developmental disabilities and their families, and to address continued caseload growth and demand for services.

Yesterday the 2016/17 Provincial Budget was tabled. This is government's direction for the coming year.

Effective September 2016, all Persons with Disability (PWD) clients will receive a rate increase of up to \$77 a month.

The rate increase includes changes to realign transportation supports and provides greater equity and choice for all PWD clients.

There are approximately 100,000 people with the PWD designation. About 55,000 receive funding for transportation costs, through either a subsidized bus pass or a Special Transportation Subsidy. About another 45,000 people do not receive transportation assistance, many because they do not live in communities served by public transit.

Starting September 1, 2016, the rate increase will come into effect and PWD clients will be able to choose how they receive transportation support.

- PWD clients who do not have a BC Bus Pass or Special Transportation Supplement will receive a \$77 per month increase to their support allowance.
- PWD clients who access the BC Bus Pass Program will receive a \$25 per month increase to their support allowance
 plus the subsidized bus pass. After September 1, clients will have the option to turn in their bus pass at any time and
 receive the full \$77 in the following months.
- PWD clients receiving the Special Transportation Subsidy (which is equivalent to \$66 a month) will see this included within the monthly \$77 rate increase effective September 1; this provides an additional \$11 per month to their support allowance. The 2016 lump-sum payment for STS that will be included with April's Disability Assistance payment will be pro-rated for 5 months (April August).

The BC Bus Pass program remains in place. Currently, BC Bus Pass holders receive \$52 in value a month in the form of a bus pass. Once the changes are effective, all people with the PWD designation will receive up to \$77 cash per month, and they can decide how to spend it.

People on disability assistance will still have access to a subsidized bus pass for \$52 per month per month plus the annual \$45 administration fee. However, in some communities, a bus pass costs less than \$52 a month and people may be better off purchasing a pass directly from BC Transit.

There is no change to the BC Bus Pass Program for low-income seniors. The ministry will continue to provide a subsidized pass to eligible seniors for the annual \$45 administration fee.

In summary, Budget 2016 provides an extra \$170 million over the next three years to support rate increase and an additional \$250 million over the next three years to address caseload pressure for temporary income assistance, disability assistance and related supplementary benefits.



ISSUE: Persons With Disability Rates and Transportation Allowances

BACKGROUND:

Assistance rates in British Columbia (B.C.) reflect individual and family needs including nutrition, shelter and clothing. In recognition that Persons With Disabilites (PWD) face more barriers to employment their rates are higher. Advocates typically criticize the adequacy of B.C.'s assistance rates. They believe the rates do not meet a person's long-term basic needs and often refer to a study ranking BC fifth in the country for PWD rates (appendix 1).

One of the reasons BC's PWD rates appear so low is that many of the supplementary programs available to our clients area not included in rate calculations. In particular, the ministry currently has two basic transportation supplements for PWD clients – an annual bus pass and the Special Transportation Subsidy (STS). These supplements aren't generally captured in cross-jurisdictional rate comparisons because they are not available to all PWD clients.

Annual bus passes are provided to PWD clients where public transit is available. The cost to the client is \$45 annually for the annual pass. The ministry pays the subsidized costs monthly to BC Transit and Translink for an equivalent benefit of \$52/month. An annual application/renewal process is used to confirm eligibility, collect the \$45 payment, and mail passes to clients.

The STS is provided to PWDs who reside in an area where public transit is available, but are unable to use public transit due to their disability. The STS rate is \$790/year, \$66/month (equivalent to the highest bus pass subsidy in the province), and is paid directly to clients in a lump sum each April (prorated if required). STS costs have been steadily increasing by over \$1 million each fiscal year. In total, the ministry pays an additional \$34 million in benefits to PWD clients annually.

DISCUSSION:

The current transportation assistance provided to clients is inequitable because almost half of the PWD clients do not receive either an annual bus pass or the STS. In addition, because the STS is a cash benefit to clients, it is often preferred to a bus pass and as a result, the STS cost has been rising steadily by over 10% annually.



Monthly rate increase for people on Disability Assistance

VICTORIA – Beginning Sept. 1, 2016, all Persons with Disability (PWD) clients will receive a rate increase of up to \$77 a month – providing extra support to 100,000 people in B.C.

The increase provides fairness in the system and more choice for people on disability assistance.

There are currently two transportation supports available to people on disability assistance:

- · A subsidized bus pass if they live in communities served by Translink and BC Transit; or
- A Special Transportation Subsidy, which is paid annually and equates to \$66 a month.

About 45,000 people on disability assistance, particularly those living in smaller communities, do not receive any form of transportation-related subsidy.

Another, 55,000 people with the Person with Disabilities (PWD) designation receive a subsidized bus pass or the special transportation subsidy. These benefits are in addition to their monthly rates.

Bus Pass

- Clients with an existing bus pass will continue to be able to use their bus pass and will get a \$25 monthly rate increase starting in September.
- The annual, subsidized bus pass will continue for PWD clients and the application process will not change.
- Existing bus pass clients will receive their 2017 bus pass renewal notification from the ministry starting this summer, as they did last year.
- Those who do not want to renew their annual bus pass can just do nothing. They will automatically receive the full \$77 monthly rate increase beginning with the January 2017 payment.
- The subsidized bus pass is a significant savings to people in communities such as Victoria
 or Vancouver where a monthly pass can cost anywhere from \$85 to \$170 per month.
- In some communities, where a bus pass costs less than the annual subsidized pass, people may be better off not renewing their annual pass and instead purchasing a bus pass directly from BC Transit with the monthly rate increase of \$77. (For example, a bus pass currently costs \$40 a month in Fort. St. John, \$35 in Quesnel and \$44 in Chilliwack).
- There is no change to the BC Bus Pass Program for low income seniors.

Special Transportation Subsidy

- PWD clients receiving the Special Transportation Subsidy (STS), worth \$66 per month, will still receive that support, plus an additional \$11 per month rate increase starting Sept. 1, 2016.
- Traditionally STS recipients receive a one-time payment for the year in April. Existing STS

recipients will receive a prorated check on April 1, 2016 of \$329. This represents five months of STS April 1 to Aug. 31. Starting in September, their STS amount will be included in their monthly rate of \$77.

Overview of the Rate Increases in September for Different Groups:

- The 45,000 people who do not receive transportation supports will realize the full \$77 increase to their monthly cheque.
- People on disability assistance who access a subsidized annual bus pass will see an increase of \$25 per month.
- Those who get the Special Transportation Subsidy will still receive that financial support
 on a monthly basis rather than as an annual payment, plus an additional \$11 per month,
 totalling \$77 per month.





VICTORIA - To create equity in the system the Province is investing \$170 million over the next three years to ensure about 100,000 people on disability assistance in B.C. will receive a rate increase of up to \$77 a month as of Sept. 1, 2016.

Included in this, the B.C. government is also providing people on disability assistance with more choice in how they receive transportation supports.

Currently, around half of the people with the Person with Disabilities (PWD) designation receive either a subsidized BC Bus Pass at a cost to the ministry of \$52 a month, or a special transportation subsidy equivalent to \$66 a month. The rest, particularly those living in smaller communities, receive no transportation support at all.

There is an inequity in the current system, and this change will bring fairness to the ministry's transportation supports.

Once the changes are in effect, all people with the PWD designation will receive up to \$77 cash per month, and they can decide how to spend it - they can purchase a subsidized bus pass - or use it for something else.

People on disability assistance can still access a subsidized bus pass through the ministry for \$52 per month plus the annual \$45 administration fee. However, in some communities, a bus pass costs less than that, and people may be better off purchasing a pass directly from BC Transit.

There are other initiatives in Budget 2016 that will help low-income families. The senior's \$1,000 Home Renovation Tax Credit has been extended to people with a disability. And with changes to MSP, an additional 335,000 people will see their premiums reduced, including 70,000 single parent families - and an additional 45,000 people will no longer pay MSP premiums at all.

The increase in disability assistance rates and the increased flexibility in transportation options build on Accessibility 2024 - government's ongoing commitment to make B.C. the most progressive jurisdiction in Canada for people with disabilities.

The rate increase also builds on a number of significant changes government has made to help people on income and disability assistance.

In 2015, government increased asset limits for people receiving disability assistance from \$5,000 to \$100,000 for individuals, and from \$10,000 to \$200,000 for couples.

People receiving disability assistance can also receive unlimited cash gifts with no impact on their assistance as long as it is within the asset limit.

B.C. was the first province to annualize earnings exemptions for people with disabilities, whose ability to work may fluctuate. They can now earn up to \$9,600 per year.

The Single Parent Employment Initiative was launched in September 2015, giving single parents on income or disability assistance the supports they need to overcome barriers to employment and build a better future for their families. Nearly 2,000 single parents are taking part in the initiative.

Child-support payments are now fully exempt for 3,200 families on income and disability assistance - and monthly income exemptions have doubled from \$200 to \$400 a month for families with children, and increased from \$300 to \$500 a month for families who have a child with a disability.

That's why I'm pleased to see that in Budget 2016 we are able to provide an increase in our rates for people with disabilities while creating equity in our system of transportation supports. This increase also allows people to make their own choice on how to meet their transportation needs."

Quick Facts:

- * People on disability assistance also receive free Pharmacare, premium-free MSP, medical equipment and supplies, and annualized earnings exemptions.
- * B.C. is the only province to offer a subsidized bus pass to low-income seniors and persons with disabilities. About 90,000 people receive a B.C. Bus Pass each year, at a cost to government of about \$50 million.
- * There is no change to the BC Bus Pass Program for low-income seniors. The ministry will continue to provide a subsidized pass to eligible seniors for the annual \$45 administration fee.
- * Budget 2016 provides the ministry with an overall increase of \$456 million over three years to address caseload pressure, increase disability assistance rates and other supplementary benefits, and provide more funds to Community Living B.C.
