

Nature of Issue and Procedural Background

On April 30, 2018, the Union filed a policy grievance alleging the Employer had violated Article 28.07 of the Collective Agreement by its purported unilateral dispensation of Medical Services Plan ("MSP") premiums contrary to that provision.

The grievance raised two issues. First, was there a reduction of premiums? Second, if so, how should its dispensation occur?

On March 15, 2019, I issued an award (the "First Award") dealing with the first issue, granting the Union's grievance in part, concluding that Article 28.07 had been engaged. The second issue was left to the parties; however they were unable to resolve the issue and accordingly this decision involves the amount of any reduction of MSP premiums and its dispensation.

The Collective Agreement expires on June 30, 2019. Given the parties are now or will very soon be engaged in bargaining to negotiate a renewal collective agreement, this issue requires an expeditious answer. In that context, while I have carefully considered all the evidence and the parties' submissions, only those necessary for my decision are canvassed below.

Factual Background

The factual and historical background to this issue is extensively reviewed in the First Award and will not be repeated here. Only the facts necessary for this decision are set out below

Effective January 01, 2018 the provincial government amended the *Medical and Health* Services Regulation to reduce MSP premiums paid by B.C. residents by 50% until January 01, 2020 when monthly MSP premiums are to be eliminated.

Under Article 28.03 of the Collective Agreement, the Employer is required to pay 100% of medical insurance premiums on behalf of all eligible CUPE members.

MSP premiums paid by B.C. employers are to be replaced by an Employer Health Tax (the "EHT"). Effective January 01, 2019 the Employer began paying the EHT in a phased manner. In 2019, the Employer is required to pay 50% of MSP premiums and 50% of the EHT. The EHT will replace MSP premiums in 2020, and the Employer will be required to pay 100% of the EHT at that time.

The First Award found both that the intended purpose of the EHT was to replace MSP premiums (para 83) and effective January 01, 2019, the Employer was required to pay both MSP premiums (at 50%) and the EHT (at 50%).

EHT is a payroll tax of 1.95% of total remuneration paid by the Employer to replace lost MSP premium revenue and to fund the MSP (para 88 First Award). MSP premiums are now funded by EHT contributions through the EHT (para 89 First Award).

The First Award also found it was not clear if, as of January 01, 2019, the Employer's EHT contributions would be precisely the same, more or less than the previous MSP premium payments.

Article 28.07 reads as follows:

28.07 Legislation

If during the life of the agreement, the premium paid by the employer for employee benefits under the benefit plans is reduced as a result of any legislation, the dispensation of such reduction shall be discussed by the parties and, failing settlement within thirty (30) days or such longer time as may be agreed upon by the parties, shall be resolved pursuant to the arbitration procedure.

The Evidence

The *viva voce* evidence at the hearing was limited to that provided by Jason Reid, the Secretary Treasurer of School District No. 63. In his evidence, Mr. Reid acknowledged in 2018 the Employer's liability for MSP premiums for CUPE members had decreased by \$ 251, 912.50. He went on to testify that while over the life of the current Collective Agreement (which began in 2014) the cost of MSP premiums had increased in some categories while decreasing in others, there had been an overall increase in the Employer's MSP premium cost between 2014 and 2018. Mr. Reid calculated that, using 2014 as the baseline, if the Employer's increased MSP premium costs for CUPE members were considered, the actual "savings" for the Employer over that period was \$ 6, 048.96.

Mr. Reid acknowledged the provincial government had agreed to provide funding through a grant to offset the Employer's EHT cost. However, he said that funding did not cover the entire EHT cost to the Employer.

Mr. Reid testified the Employer's total MSP premium cost for all of its employees for the 2016/2017 fiscal year was approximately one million dollars and the combined MSP and EHT cost for the 2018/2019 fiscal year was estimated to be \$ 1.22 million, or \$220,000.00 more than the Employer's 2017 MSP liability. He said the estimated Employer's EHT cost for CUPE members for the first six months of 2019 was \$159,500.00. He went on to testify the grant of \$ 177,761.00 provided by the provincial government to the Employer was for all employees, not only CUPE members, for the first six months of 2019 and was intended to partially offset the EHT cost. Mr. Reid testified the government grant only funded the difference between the Employer's MSP premium costs in 2017 and the combined cost of MSP premiums and the EHT in the first six months of 2019 (the "Incremental Amount").

Mr. Reid also noted that a Ministry official had advised B.C. School District Secretary Treasurers in a meeting that the government grants would not likely fund the entire Incremental Amount as a result of the savings in MSP premiums by School Districts in 2018 flowing from the 50% premium reduction that year.

Positions of the Parties

The Union

The Union submits this is an interest arbitration and, in that regard, the relevant applicable principles are succinctly reviewed in *Thompson Rivers University v Thompson Rivers University Open Learning Faculty Association* 2012 CarswellBC 1430 (Hall). The Union says the first principle is that interest arbitrators replicate the result that would have occurred had the parties concluded collective bargaining, analyzing objective data and not on a subjective or speculative basis: *Beacon Hill Lodges of Canada and H.E.U.* (1985) 19 L.A.C. (3d) 288 (Hope) ("Beacon Hill"). The Union goes on to say interest arbitration decisions are based on evidence of patterns in comparable circumstances.

The Union submits the second relevant principle involves having regard to what is fair and reasonable, based on a reasonable range of comparators, even if one of the parties could have imposed more extreme terms.

Third, interest arbitration is a conservative process which is intended to supplement and assist the bargaining relationship. In that context, interest arbitrators follow bargaining trends and do not set them.

Finally, as a result of that reluctance to innovate, interest arbitrators generally rely on historical patterns of negotiated settlements.

The Union notes that in his evidence Mr. Reid referred to "savings" over the life of this Collective Agreement; however, Article 28.07 uses the term "reduction", not "savings". The Union says that while Mr. Reid and the tables compiled and relied upon by the Employer are based on 2014 as providing the baseline, the only "reduction" to MSP premiums occurred in 2018 as a result of legislative action.

The Union submits that Mr. Reid agreed the government grant is intended to offset the cost of the EHT to the Employer

The Union says the actual reduction in 2018 MSP premium costs to the Employer was \$251,912.50 and that is the amount for dispensation in respect to 2018.

The Union submits the Employer has or will receive a grant of \$584,971.00 as of March 2019 from the provincial government to offset the cost of the EHT in 2019, which means the cost of the EHT is not being paid by the Employer.

The Union goes to say for the first six months of 2019, the calculation for the amount for dispensation is straightforward. It is one-half of the 2018 premium reduction; i.e. \$125,956.25. That means the total figure for dispensation during this Collective Agreement is \$ 377,868.75.

The Union submits that, based on the Employer's documents, the Employer has received considerable additional government funding, has an operating surplus of over \$ 4 million and clearly has the ability to pay the dispensation.

The Union argues that in applying the relevant interest arbitration principles, the parties would not have agreed to dispense the reduction on the basis now advocated by the Employer. The

Union says the Employer's calculation of the reduction is not within the reasonable range of comparators and there are no bargaining trends reflecting this Collective Agreement language. Consequently, the amount of the dispensation should be that advocated by the Union. The Union goes on to say those monies should be paid directly to the Union which intends to submit the method of dispensation to a vote by CUPE members.

Finally, while acknowledging this Collective Agreement expires June 30, 2019, the Union says the MSP premium reduction is ongoing beyond that date. Consequently, the Union seeks a declaration that CUPE members are entitled to recover MSP premium reductions from January 01, 2018 and continuing beyond the expiry of the current Collective Agreement.

The Employer

The Employer submits Article 28.07 refers to a "reduction". The amount of a reduction as a result of changes to MSP premiums, is a matter of collective agreement interpretation. The Employer goes on to argue the issue of the dispensation of the reduction is a matter of interest arbitration.

Amount of Reduction

The Employer submits the applicable arbitral interpretive principles are well-established: see for example *Pacific Press v Graphic Communications International Union, Local 25-C* (1995) B.C.C.A.A.A. No. 637 (Bird) at para 27.

The Employer goes on to say several additional interpretive principles are also well-established and uncontroversial. First, parties are presumed not to intend anomalous and unreasonable results. Interpretation of the language of a collective agreement is to be rational and within the parameters of reasonable expectations: see for example *TBC Teletheatre British Columbia v Office and Professional Employees' International Union*, Local 378 (2002) B.C.C.A.A. No. 68 (Foley) at para 25; *Health Employers' Association of B.C. (Beacon Hill Lodge) v Hospital Employees' Union (1998) B.C.C.A.A. No. 15* (Gordon) at para 36.

Second, parties to a collective agreement are presumed to only provide for significant obligations or benefits through clear language: *C.H. Cates and Sons Ltd. v Office and Technical Employees' Union, Local 15* (1994) B.C.C.A.A.A. No. 157 (Germaine) at para 30; *Lake District Maintenance Ltd (LDM) v B.C. Government and Service Employees' Union* (2012) B.C.C.A.A.A. No. 91 (Keras) at para 36-40.

The Employer submits that based on the express findings in the First Award, including that the EHT is intended to replace MSP premium, it is a relevant factor in determining both whether there has been an actual reduction and its nature, (paras 87 and 98) as well as that the purpose of Article 28.07 is to prevent a "windfall" as a result of legislative change, the first issue to be determined in this case is whether or not there has been a "reduction" requiring dispensation for the purposes of Article 28.07. That in turn requires a determination of the period over which the reduction is to be measured; i.e. is the reduction to be measured only having regard to MSP premiums payable on December 31, 2017 or having regard to the premiums at the time of the commencement of the Collective Agreement (i.e. 2014)?

The Employer's position is that, based on the language of Article 28.07, the reduction is to be measured having regard to the premiums existing at the commencement of this Collective Agreement. The Employer submits the trigger for the operation of Article 28.07 is whether,

during the life of the Collective Agreement, the premium is reduced. The Employer says that necessarily invites a comparison between rates during the life of the Collective Agreement to determine if legislative change has resulted in an actual reduction.

The Employer argues that if the premiums increase over the life of the Collective Agreement, as they have, the Employer will not have enjoyed a windfall by a reduction because at the time of the legislative action the Employer was paying more for premiums than was originally bargained in 2014.

The Employer submits the parties did not intend for MSP premium increases to be ignored during the life of the Collective Agreement because each increase would become the new "floor". That would not be consistent with the express language of Article 28.07 that the reduction is to be considered ..."during the life of the agreement...."

The Employer posits several hypothetical examples to illustrate its position. In that regard it says it is possible MSP premiums could be increased then subsequently decreased somewhat as a result of legislative action. The Employer says on the Union's analysis, the decrease would constitute a "reduction" even though the MSP premium rates had actually been increased.

The Employer poses another hypothetical example where MSP premiums are increased for a period of time, then decreased resulting in the Employer paying the same rate during the life of the Collective Agreement. The Employer goes on to say that on the Union's analysis, the latter decrease would constitute a "reduction" for dispensation.

The Employer argues the amount of the reduction must, based on the language of Article 28.07, reflect the MSP premiums paid during the life of the Collective Agreement and not at a particular point in time during the Collective Agreement. The Employer says that view is supported by the practical reality that the Employer's MSP premium costs vary depending on factors such as changes in the number of employees or in categories of coverage (for example changes from individual to family).

The Employer says, on the evidence, the MSP premiums in 2015, 2016 and 2017 were all higher than at the commencement of the Collective Agreement in 2014. As well, the combined MSP premium and EHT costs for the first six months of 2019 were higher than the MSP premium costs in 2014. The only year the MSP premium costs were lower than 2014 was in 2018.

The Employer argues, if the MSP premiums paid during the Collective Agreement are considered, as it says the Collective Agreement contemplates, the actual reduction the Employer will enjoy will be \$ 6,408.96, which is the proper amount for dispensation for 2018.

The Employer acknowledges the provincial government has provided a grant to offset the cost of the EHT to the Employer. However, the Employer submits the figure of \$584,971.00 relied upon by the Union is for the 2019/2020 fiscal year. It therefore relates to the period after the expiry of the Collective Agreement and has no bearing on this arbitration. The Employer also notes that figure is in respect to all employees and not only CUPE members.

The Employer says that the EHT government grant began in 2019 and only partially funds the Incremental Amount. More specifically, the EHT cost to the Employer for 2018/2019 will be about \$ 720,000.00 for all employees. The Employer says its EHT cost for CUPE members for the first six months of 2019 is \$159,500. The government grant for the first six months of 2019

to offset the EHT is \$ 177, 761.00 for the entire workforce; however CUPE members are a minority of the total workforce which illustrates the grant is only intended to partially offset the Incremental Amount.

The Employer submits that, in the alternative, if the incremental funding of the EHT is considered relevant to the calculation of the amount of the reduction for 2019, at most that amount would be \$69,107.00. Taken together with the \$6,408.96, the maximum possible amount for dispensation would be \$75,515.96, not the \$377,868.75 asserted by the Union.

The Employer says the Union essentially seeks to have the Employer's EHT liability ignored; however, it clearly remains an additional liability for the Employer. The Employer goes on to say The Union's position is also contrary to the finding in the First Award to the effect the EHT is a relevant factor in determining if there has been a reduction, and if so, its amount. The Employer says the EHT is simply the MSP premium by another name. It is an obligation borne by the Employer to contribute money to the government to fund health care.

The Employer submits my remedial authority does not extend beyond the term of the current Collective Agreement (June 30, 2019) to consider the issue of savings or reduction beyond that time. The Employer says Article 28.07 expressly contemplates unanticipated legislative change during the life of the Collective Agreement. At the end of this Collective Agreement, the parties will have an opportunity to address the legislative change and negotiate what should happen as a result.

Finally, the Employer says arbitral jurisdiction arises from this Collective Agreement and any potential reductions that might occur in future are outside that jurisdiction. In any event, the issue of future reductions and dispensation would be entirely speculative.

Dispensation

The Employer argues the manner of dispensation is a matter of interest arbitration which is guided by four well-known basic principles. First, an arbitrator is to replicate what the parties themselves would have likely negotiated had they been able: Beacon Hill; Western Canadian Coal Corp v Construction Allied Workers' Union, Local 68 (2010) B.C.C.A.A.A. No. 127 (Ready) at para 8 ("Western Canadian Coal"); Nelson (City) v Nelson Professional Fire Fighters Association (2010) B.C.C.A.A.A. No. 174 (McPhillips) ("Nelson").

Second the interest arbitration process must be done on the basis of objective evidence: Beacon Hill at p. 304.

Third, interest arbitration is a conservative exercise where historical patterns of negotiated settlements carry considerable weight. Breakthroughs are to be avoided: *Nelson* at para 8; *Ontario v Ontario Public Service Employees' Union, Correctional Services Bargaining Unit* (2016) O.L.A.A. No. 337 (Burkett) at para 22.

Fourth, an arbitrator's sense of social justice or fairness is not to be substituted for market and economic realities: Surrey (City) v Surrey Fire Fighters Assn. (2011) B.C.C.A.A.A. No. 50 (McPhillips) at para 15; Board of School Trustees, School District No. 1 (Fernie) v Fernie Teachers' Association (1983) 8 L.A.C. (3d) 157 (Dorsey); Okanagan Mainline Municipal Labour Relations Association and International Assn. of Firefighters, Locals 953, 1399,1746 (1989) 6 L.A.C. (4th) 323 (Hope) at p. 331.

The Employer submits in determining the outcome parties would have reached, arbitrators consider relevant objective factors such as the economic climate in which bargaining occurs, comparable collective agreements in the same industry, comparable collective agreements in the same geographic region, the financial circumstances and viability of the employer: see *Western Canadian Coal* at para 12.

The Employer submits that while interest arbitration principles are usually applied as an alternative to collective bargaining, they can also apply where parties agree to have a particular issue determined by arbitration where the parties are unable to reach an agreement themselves: B.C. Public School Employers' Assn. v B.C. Teachers Federation (2005) B.C.C.A.A.A. No. 199 (Kinzie) at para 33-34.

The Employer says, as is reflected in the arbitral jurisprudence, there are two primary types of dispensations of reductions in premiums during the life of a collective agreement. The most common is for the reduction to be applied to increase other collective agreement benefits: *P.S.A.C. and Alliance Employees' Union, Units I, II, & X (Re),* (2002) O.L.A.A. No. 953 (Devlin); *Canadian Union of Labour Employees v Public Service Alliance of Canada* (2005) C.L.A.D. No. 430 (Chapman); *Alberta and Northwest Territories (District McKenzie) Regional Council of Carpenters and Allied Workers, Local 2010 v Atco Structures & Logistics Ltd.* (2015) A.G.A.A. No. 19 (Wallace); *Bell Canada v Communications & Electrical Workers of Canada (Re)* (1993) C.L.A.D. No. 1202 (Picher). The Employer also points to several collective agreement examples in the B.C education sector: 2014-2019 Collective Agreement between School District No. 59 (Peace River South) and B.C. Government and Service Employees Union, Local 710; 2014-2019 Collective Agreement between School District No. 81 (Fort Nelson) and B.C. Government and Service Employees Union, Local 710.

The Employer submits the second primary method of dispensation is for monies arising from a reduction in premiums to be made directly to the employees: *Re Borough of York Hydro Union, Canadian Union of Public Employees, Local 208 and Borough of York* (1970) O.L.A.A. No. 18 (Weiler); *Daily Racing Form of Canada Ltd. v Toronto Typographical Union* (1991) 22 C.L.A.S. 127 (Fisher); *University of Calgary v University of Calgary Faculty Assn.* (2010) A.G.A.A. No. 40 (Tettensor); *United Nurses of Alberta, Locals 32,33, 62, 85, 196 and 301 v Capital Health Authority* (2004) A.G.A.A. No. 64 (Tettensor).

The Employer also points to a number of examples of this method in the following education sector collective agreements: 2014-2019 Collective Agreement between School District No. 35 (Langley) and Canadian Union of Public Employees, Local 1260; 2014-2019 Collective Agreement between School District No. 35 (Langley) and Canadian Union of Public Employees, Local 1851.

The Employer says it is unaware, and the Union has not pointed to, any examples of payments relating to premium reductions being made directly to a union. The Employer goes on to say the pattern is that monies arising from premium reductions are used to either increase other collective agreement benefits or are paid directly to employees.

The Employer submits that in this case, neither party sought to have any reduction applied to other existing benefit plans. The Employer argues that the Union's position that the funds be paid directly to it would constitute a type of breakthrough, which would be inconsistent with interest arbitration principles.

The Employer says under this Collective Agreement, the Employer pays MSP premiums on behalf of employees and not on behalf of the Union. The Employer submits that, but for Article 28.03, employees would be responsible to pay MSP premiums out of their own pockets. That obligation has nothing to do with the Union.

Finally, the Employer submits that a proper application of the interest arbitration principles must result in the dispensation of any reduction being made directly to employees employed as of the date of this award.

Analysis and Decision

The First Award reached the following conclusions at paragraphs 86-91 which provide guidance to the issue at hand in this case:

- 86 The introduction of the Regulation relieved the Employer of the obligation to pay MSP premiums on behalf of eligible CUPE members.
- 87 I find the EHT is intended to replace MSP premiums. MSP continues to be provided, funded 100% by the Employer, on behalf of eligible CUPE members. Effective January 1, 2019, the Employer is obliged to pay both MSP premiums and the EHT.
- 88 The focus of Article 28.07 is on a potential windfall. I am satisfied the government introduced the EHT, a payroll tax of 1.95% of total remuneration paid by the Employer, to replace the lost MSP premium revenue and to fund the MSP.....
- 89 While the medical services contract payments contemplated under Article 28.03 are no longer in the form of premiums, MSP is now funded by contributions by the Employer through the EHT. There can be little doubt or controversy those contributions are employee-related and made in respect to eligible CUPE members. I find the purpose of the EHT is to fund the MSP and the Employer in this case continues to be required to pay the cost of MSP, albeit now through the EHT.
- 90 On the evidence before me, beyond the circumstances for 2018 where the MSP premiums were reduced by 50% and the EHT was not yet in place, it is not entirely clear if, effective January 1, 2019, the EHT contributions will be precisely the same, more or less than the previous MSP contributions; however that is immaterial for the purposes of this decision.
- **91** While the Union argues there are public reports the EHT costs may be at least partially offset through some government assistance that is only speculative a this point and is not therefore a relevant consideration for the purposes of this decision.

The First Award concluded Article 28.07 was engaged and the EHT was a relevant factor in determining the extent and nature of the reduction of MSP premiums.

The remaining issue involves determining the amount of the reduction and its proper dispensation. The issue raised in that regard relates to the meaning of the language of Article

28.07. More specifically, in agreeing to the language of Article 28.07 and in particular the phrase "during the life of the agreement", did the parties intend for any reduction of benefit premiums, in this case medical insurance premiums, to be considered or calculated over the life of the Collective Agreement, at least up to the time of legislative change, as asserted by the Employer? I find the issue of the amount of the reduction involves the interpretation and application of the Collective Agreement.

The well-known applicable principles of collective agreement interpretation were reviewed in the First Award (para 63-66) and will not be repeated here.

It is useful to bear in mind the context within which the language was originally negotiated. As noted in the First Award, the original language was agreed to in anticipation of possible government action in respect to medical care insurance. What was unknown was the timing and precise nature of potential legislative action. The purpose of the provision is to prevent a windfall to the Employer by providing a measure of protection against a possible reduction of medical insurance premiums occurring during the life of the collective agreement as a result of legislative action, which would mean the parties would be unable to deal with the issue through collective bargaining.

The interpretation advocated by the Employer based on the phrase "during the life of the agreement" would mean concluding the parties intended for the reduction in premiums resulting from legislative action be calculated over the life of the Collective Agreement, using 2014 as the base line.

Article 28.03 provides the Employer is responsible for paying medical insurance premiums on behalf of all employees. It says nothing about a cap or limitation on the Employer's liability in that regard. It therefore contemplates the obligation exists irrespective of increases in premium costs.

Article 28.07 deals with possible reductions in premiums as a result of legislative change. It is reasonable to assume that when the language was negotiated the parties would have been aware that premium costs may increase or decrease over the life of the Collective Agreement. In fact, during the life of this Collective Agreement there have been changes (including decreases) to premiums in different MSP categories; however, there was an overall increase in MSP premiums between 2014 and 2018.

Article 28.07 provides the Union with a right to be consulted about the dispensation of a premium reduction and if the dispensation cannot be agreed upon, to have that issue resolved through arbitration. There is no express language providing how any reduction is to be calculated, and certainly no language indicating the date of the execution of the Collective Agreement is to provide a base line in that regard.

In my view, the position advanced by the Employer would constitute an important promise or limitation which it would be reasonable to assume would have been express if that had been the parties' actual intention.

In addition, the fact Article 28.07 only contemplates discussion and arbitration in respect to a dispensation is indicative of the parties' understanding that the fact of a reduction of premiums would likely be self-evident, with the resulting focus of the provision being on the process for its dispensation.

Under all the circumstances, I find the parties' most likely intention to have been that the provision is to provide protection against a premium reduction as a result of legislative change at any point during the life of the Collective Agreement. In the context of Article 28.03, which at least inferentially contemplates premiums may increase or decrease, I find Article 28.07 to be triggered by legislative action and that the parties most likely intended the matter of whether or not there has been a reduction is to be determined based on the relatively straightforward basis of the premiums being paid at that time.

I find the intended timeframe for the application of Article 28.07 to be when the MSP premiums were reduced by 50% by legislative action; i.e. 2018. I find the amount of the reduction to be \$ 251,912.50 for 2018. I note early in the process, the Employer indicated that amount should be reduced by \$7,000.00. However, the basis for that amount is not clear.

2019

In the 2019-2020 fiscal year, the Employer is required to pay 50% of MSP premiums and 50% of the EHT, which is calculated at a rate of 1.95% of the Employer's total payroll. In 2020, the EHT will replace MSP premiums entirely.

Turning to the issue of the amount of any reduction for the first six months of 2019, while the Union asserts the reduction for the purposes of Article 28.07 is simply one-half of the MSP premiums that the Employer would have otherwise been obliged to pay, that does not reflect the fact the EHT is replacing the MSP.

I accept the Employer's total cost for MSP premiums for the 2016/ 2017 fiscal year was approximately one million dollars for all employees. I also accept the projected combined cost for MSP premiums and the EHT in the 2018/ 2019 fiscal year for all employees will be 1.22 million dollars, an increase of \$ 220,000. The total cost for MSP premiums for all employees will be approximately \$ 500,000.00 and about \$ 720,000.00 for the EHT.

I find the reduction in the MSP premium cost to the Employer for CUPE members in 2018 as a result of legislative action was \$ 251,912.50. The reduction of MSP premiums for the first half of 2019 would be one-half of that amount. However, the EHT replaces the MSP premiums and the combined total of the two of them is more than the Employer's MSP liability at the time of the legislative action. There is therefore no reduction. However, the government provided a temporary grant to the Employer to offset the cost of the EHT. While the Union contends the government grant will be \$584,971.00 for all employees, that amount is for the 2019/2020 fiscal year. The estimated grant for the first half of 2019 for all employees is \$177,761.00. The amount attributable to CUPE members is a portion of that amount.

On the evidence available, I find the government grant, at least for the first half of 2019 is not intended to cover the entire cost of the EHT to the Employer. Rather, it is only intended to cover the difference between the amount the Employer would have been obliged to pay for MSP premiums and the combined amount of the MSP premiums and EHT for the first six months of 2019.

The amount of the reduction for the purposes of Article 28.07 could only be at most, the amount the grant reduces the combined MSP premiums and EHT for the first half of 2019 below what the Employer would have otherwise paid as MSP premiums for CUPE members during that

period. The amount of any such reduction is not entirely clear on the evidence and the parties are best situated to determine its amount (if any).

Turning to the issue of the dispensation of the reduction, while this is not a typical interest arbitration, I find the interest arbitration principles provide some guidance in the circumstances of this case.

Neither party advocates that any reduction is to be applied to increase other Collective Agreement benefits.

I accept a common method for dispensation of reductions of premium payments in collective agreements, including in comparable collective agreements, is they are made directly to employees.

In this case, but for Article 28.03, every eligible CUPE member would pay their own MSP premiums. That is a liability personal to each employee. Under Article 28.03, the Employer assumes that liability on behalf of each eligible CUPE member. The Union has no role in that other than to negotiate and administer the provision.

In my view, absent a cogent, compelling basis to do otherwise, which I do not find here, I find the most appropriate course is that the reduction be paid directly to each CUPE member.

Bearing in mind all the circumstances, the applicable arbitration principles as well as efficiency and certainty considerations, I find the reduction should be paid directly to CUPE members employed as of the date of this award.

Finally, turning to the Union's position there should be a declaration regarding a reduction beyond the term of this Collective Agreement, I begin by noting that arbitration is the mechanism to resolve disputes during the life of a collective agreement. It is axiomatic an arbitrator's jurisdiction flows from a particular collective agreement. That is reflected in Section 82 (1) of the B.C. Labour Relations Code (the "Code"), which says the purpose of arbitration is to provide a mechanism for resolving disputes under the terms of a collective agreement.

Section 82 (2) of the *Code* provides arbitrators are to have regard to the real issue in dispute and Section 89 provides arbitrators have the authority necessary to resolve disputes arising under a collective agreement.

I have provided an answer to the issues relating to the interpretation and application of Article 28.07 of this Collective Agreement. That agreement ends on June 30, 2019 and the parties will negotiate a renewal agreement. They are aware of the elimination of MSP premiums and the introduction of the EHT and will be able to deal with any potential ramifications of that in bargaining.

To the extent to which I may arguably have jurisdiction to make a finding beyond the end of this Collective Agreement, I decline to do so as I find the issue is properly a matter for collective bargaining.

Conclusion

For the reasons provided, I find the MSP premiums paid by the Employer on behalf of CUPE members were reduced by \$ 251,912.50 for 2018 as a result of legislative change. That is the amount for dispensation in respect to 2018.

For the first six months of 2019, the dispensation is the amount the government grant paid to the Employer to offset the cost of the EHT reduces the combined cost of MSP premiums and the EHT below the cost the Employer would have otherwise paid for MSP premiums (based on the 2017 figure). On the evidence I am not certain what that amount may be and the parties are best situated to determine the amount of the reduction (if any).

For the reasons provided, I find the dispensation should be paid directly to CUPE members employed as of the date of this award.

Finally, for the reasons provided, to the extent to which I arguably have jurisdiction to make a finding regarding a premium reduction beyond the end of this Collective Agreement, I decline to do so as that is properly a matter for collective bargaining, which if it has not already begun, will commence shortly.



We regret the disruption that job action will cause for you, your children, and their educational programs, but we want to assure you that the Board is determined to continue to work towards a resolution to this dispute, to provide our valued support staff with a fair settlement within the required provincial mandate.

The employer has tabled an offer that applies the maximum funding available for this round of local bargaining, and that reflects our shared priority to address wage disparity to the fullest extent possible under the provincial bargaining mandate. The reality is that the funding allocation for bargaining will not be increased, and the Board will not be granted authority to allocate further funds to bargaining regardless of the source of those funds.

As you know, if a collective agreement is not ratified before **November 30, 2019**, many of the provisions within the Provincial Framework Agreement will no longer be available to the parties in local bargaining. These include, but are not limited to, funding for local bargaining<sup>1</sup>, and the benefits and funding associated with the Provincial Job Evaluation process currently underway.

Dear colleagues,

We know it is incredibly tough to be out on the picket lines as CUPE 441 continues its strike action. We want to assure you that the BC Teachers' Federation and the Saanich Teachers' Association are doing everything we can to support you and help bring this dispute to an end.

The BCTF has sent a grant of \$500,000 to our Saanich local to help you and your members during this difficult time. Other teacher locals across the province also have donations pouring in. The BCTF has also made a donation to CUPE 441 to help their members as well.

Picket line solidarity is a cornerstone of union power and we're so grateful to all of you for respecting CUPE's pickets, just as our CUPE colleagues have done for us several times over the years. In 2006, for example, CUPE 441 supported our 2005 two-week illegal strike. Through that strike and the quick round of bargaining in 2006 that followed, we achieved harmonized pay grids that helped many teachers. In Saanich that meant a \$20 per day increase on top of the 17% wage increase over the five-year contract. Without harmonization, the amount that we would be paid less would be greater than \$20 a day as all our wage increases have been added to since we got harmonization.

Fourteen years later, CUPE 441 is still seeking wage parity with their counterparts in Victoria and Sooke. The employer has taken steps to address pay issues with administration, and the board has even given themselves a pay increase, in the last few years to address the need to attract quality people to the positions. However, they are still trying to hold their support staff down. It's not right.

CUPE's efforts in Saanich also tie into our bargaining goals to achieve salary grid adjustments in this round of bargaining beyond the government's 2%-2%-2% offer. We know that the government mandate allows for flexibility to address things like wage comparability and labour market adjustments. So, the government should stop pretending like they don't have any power and take action to end this strike. Without better wages for CUPE workers in Saanich, the Education Assistant (EA) shortage will only get worse and that will make meeting our students' needs harder than ever.

Thank you for being so strong and committed to public education. We know this job action negatively impacts you, our students, and the whole community. But letting this wage disparity continue will mean more kids lose out in the short and long term.

Thank you again for everything you're doing and we will continue to push hard with government and the employer to end this strike.

### CUPE 441 members ratify agreement, ending strike

SAANICH — CUPE Local 441 members voted to accept the tentative agreement at a ratification meeting on Sunday afternoon. CUPE members will be back in classrooms as schools reopen Monday morning.

The agreement includes general wage increases of two per cent in each year of the three-year contract as per the Provincial Framework Agreement (PFA).

The union and employer were able to bring CUPE 441 members to, or significantly closer to, wage parity within the region.

The Local and District will establish a recruitment and retention working group that will meet on a regular basis.

CUPE 441 President Dean Coates thanked the bargaining committee for their hard work and the community for their strong support.

"We could not have reached this agreement without the backing of this community," said Coates. "We commit to working with the School District to build a relationship of respect moving forward."

Coates said that members are excited to get back into classrooms and work with the students they support.

CUPE 441 members provide a wide variety of services in Saanich schools. Members include Education Assistants, Technical Support staff, Library Techs, Youth and Family Counsellors, Clerical, Custodial, Grounds, Maintenance, Transportation, Trades and District support staff. The local represents almost 500 K-12 support staff workers in SD63.
