#### **BACKGROUND:**

Section 51(2)(a) of the *Tobacco Tax Act* (TTA) empowers the director to seize and remove unlawful tobacco in certain circumstances. The director and their delegates, ministry inspectors, cannot seize more than the quantity prescribed in section 33 of the *Tobacco Tax Act Regulation* (TTAR), which was initially set at 4,000 grams in 1995.

The government enabled these administrative seizures to reduce demands on peace officers and to deter possession of small amounts of unlawful tobacco. The government last increased the limit in 2000, to 10,000 grams (50 cartons of cigarettes, or one case).

The Ministry of Finance's Consumer Taxation Audit Branch conducts TTA retail inspections. If inspectors find unlawful tobacco above the 10,000-gram limit, they may call on the ministry's Investigations Unit. Ministry investigators are classified as peace officers and can obtain a warrant to seize the tobacco as part of a criminal investigation.

#### DISCUSSION:

When the current seizure limit was set in 2000, the tobacco tax rate was \$0.11 per gram. Since that time it has nearly tripled, to \$0.325 per gram.
