2008

- Allowed a person other than a licensed guide outfitter to hold a guiding territory certificate.
- A Guiding Territory Certificate could be held by more than one person.
- Guides are no longer required to always be present when their assist guides are guiding

2012

 Increased the length of the guiding territory certificate from a maximum of 10 years to a maximum of 25 years.



Guide Certainty – Recent Changes

2014-15

- Introduced a five year guide outfitter licence in addition to the one year licence.
- Eliminated the assistant guide licence.
- Introduced amendments to allow corporations to hold guiding territory certificates.



Elimination of Assistant Guide Licence

As of April 1, 2015, to be an Assistant Hunting Guide, a person must:

- be eighteen (18) years of age or older;
- pass the assistant hunting guide qualification exam approved by the Director, Fish and Wildlife Branch;
- be employed by a licensed Guide Outfitter; and
- carry a written authorization issued by the employing Guide Outfitter.







Written Authorization



- An assistant guide is required to carry a written authorization at all times while guiding.
- The written authorization may be in any format e.g. letter format, hand written (must be legible), computer print-out or digital file on a hand-held device (e.g. smart phone).
- In electronic format the written authorization must be retrievable on the electronic device carried by the assistant guide if asked to produce the written authorization.

Corporations and Guiding Territory Certificates

As of June 12, 2015, a corporation may hold a guiding territory certificate.

Corporations and Changes to Control

Control of a corporation?

- Established in section 5 of the Guiding Territory Regulation
- A person, or group of persons not at arms length:
 - that holds sufficient voting rights to elect 50% of a corporations directors; or
 - To otherwise effectively control the operations and direction of the corporation.

Corporations and Changes to Control

Change to control of a corporation?

- Established in section 6 of the Guiding Territory Regulation
- A change in control occurs when:
 - A corporation amalgamates with another corporation;
 - Control of the corporation changes or is acquired or is disposed;
 or
 - Control of the corporation controlling of the corporation holding the GTC changes or is acquired or is disposed of.



Requirement to Notify the Regional Manager

Requirement:

 Notification must be provided to the Regional Manager within 30 days of the change to control

Additional information on the Requirement to Notify after a Change to the Control of a Corporation (to be Posted on the FCBC Website):

A corporation that holds an interest in a Guiding Territory Certificate must notify the Regional Manager of the Recreational Fisheries and Wildlife Programs of every change to the control of the corporation. The notice must be provided within 30 days after the change to the control of the corporation occurs.

To help ensure that all the requirements of section 7 of the <u>Wildlife Act Guiding Territory Certificate</u>

<u>Regulation</u> (the 'regulation') are satisfied, the Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations,

Fish and Wildlife Branch has prepared a Notice of Change to the Control of Corporation form <u>here</u>. A

corporation that holds an interest in a Guiding Territory Certificate <u>may elect</u> to use this form or prepare

its own notice. A notice <u>must</u> satisfy the requirements in section 7 of the regulation:

- Within 30 days after a change to the control of a corporation that holds an interest in a guiding territory certificate, the corporation must do both of the following:
 - send to a regional manager a written notice setting out the details of the change;
 - pay a reviewing fee of \$500.

The notice should contain the following information:

- o Name of corporation as it appears in the British Columbia Corporate Register;
- Incorporation or registration number;
- Guiding territory certificate number;
- Complete BC mailing address for the purpose of receiving notice under the Wildlife Act;
- Contact name (person who has authority to act on behalf of the corporation), position relative to the corporation, and phone number;
- Date change to the control occurred;
- Detailed description of change to the control:
- Shareholder information:
 - If natural person, name, date of birth; and % of voting shares held.
 - If corporation, incorporation or registration number and % of voting shares held.
 - Whether the voting shareholder is part of a group that has control of the corporation.
 - If any voting shareholder is a corporation that has control, or is part of a group that has control, of the corporate guiding territory certificate holder, the corporate applicant must described the voting rights of that corporation in a way that identifies every natural person who has a direct or indirect interest in voting shares in the corporation
