The effectiveness of these levers will be compared, with recommendations regarding which to pursue or abandon, or where there has been insufficient time or data or design to draw meaningful conclusions. Another key component will be to rank areas that have the best chance of recovery, with attention to which areas will require predator control in perpetuity vs areas where ecosystem management/ecosystem recovery can be used to reduce this need into the future.

A public presentation will be made with very preliminary findings, but with little or no "recommendation." A written document will be prepared that will address the above topics.
