This letter refers to the cut control position for Tree Farm Licence No. 39. The 5 year period beginning January 1, 2001, has been deemed the cut control period for this licence in accordance with Section 75.4 of the *Forest Act*. A cut control period under this licence may be terminated at the request of the holder in accordance with Section 75.4(4) of the *Forest Act*. If no termination is requested, the existing cut control period expires 5 years after it began, at which time a new cut control period of 5 years will begin.

In accordance with Section 75.41 of the *Forest Act*, you shall ensure that at the time of termination or expiry of a cut control period, the total volume of timber harvested during the cut control period does not exceed 110 % of the sum of the allowable annual cuts that were available to the holder under the licence during the cut control period.

Any volume of timber harvested during the cut control period in excess of the sum of the allowable annual cuts that were available to the holder under the licence will be treated as being timber harvested during the next cut control period.


Attached is the summary of scale segregated by timber mark for this licence.

This letter constitutes a draft statement for the purposes of the cut control provisions of this licence and the *Forest Act*. Note that starting with the 2006 cut control year, unbilled scale is now included in the volume of timber harvested. As a transition measure for the 2006 cut control year only, you may exclude the unbilled scale volume generated during the month of December 2006. Should you wish to exclude this volume, you must notify us as indicated below. This option will not be available for the 2007 or following cut control years.

A cut control period under this licence may be terminated at the request of the holder in accordance with Section 75.4(4) of the *Forest Act*. A termination may be requested between January 1 and June 30 of any year. If a termination is not requested, the cut control period expires 5 years after it began, at which time a new cut control period of 5 years will begin.

In addition, you may be eligible to transfer a portion of the volume of timber harvested with another licence under the provisions of section 75.95 of the *Forest Act*. Should you wish to take advantage of this ability, both licence holders must make a request in writing to the Regional Manager before the expiry of the thirty (30) day period outlined below. Your request must clearly explain how the transfer meets the requirements of section 18 of the Cut Control Regulation.

In accordance with Section 75.41 of the *Forest Act*, you shall ensure that at the time of termination or expiry of a cut control period, the total volume of timber harvested during the cut control period does not exceed 110 % of the sum of the allowable annual cuts that were available to the holder under the licence during the cut control period.

Any volume of timber harvested during the cut control period in excess of the sum of the the allowable annual cuts that were available to the holder under the licence will be treated as being timber harvested during the next cut control period.

This letter cancels and replaces our cut control letter of November 15, 2007. Timber licence volumes that had been omitted from the record are now included and a typographical error has been corrected.
