1. TERM

2. AGREEMENT AREA

The area over which the rights are granted is the Crown range within the area outlined in bold black on the attached Exhibit A map, less any of the following:

a) exclusions noted on the Exhibit A

b) exclusions arising from Exhibit B conditions

c) exclusions arising from the Range Use Plan or Range Stewardship Plan associated with this agreement.

("the Agreement Area")

3. AMOUNT OF FORAGE

Authorized Yearly Use is 250 animal unit months ("AUMs") on the Agreement Area.

4. RIGHTS

The Agreement Holder will have the right to graze livestock on the Agreement Area under the terms and conditions of this Agreement and its associated Range Use Plan or Range Stewardship Plan.

5. ASSOCIATED PRIVATE LAND

The Agreement Holder's associated private lands are listed in Exhibit C of this Agreement.

6. RANGE USE PLAN or RANGE STEWARDSHIP PLAN

The Agreement Holder will prepare and maintain a Range Use Plan or Range Stewardship Plan as required in the Range Act and the Forest and Range Practices Act.

7. PERIODIC REPORTS

The District Manager, acting reasonably, may request the Agreement Holder from time to time to prepare and send a report on specified matters associated with the Agreement. The Agreement Holder will comply with the request.

8. FINANCIAL

- (a) The Agreement Holder will pay ground rent, grazing fees, fines and any other financial assessments as required under the Range Act.
- (b) The Agreement Holder will pay the interest on overdue accounts and any other financial assessments provided for by law and arising from the use of Crown range.
- (c) Fees and all other financial assessments must be paid as specified on the Province's invoices or statements. The District Manager may require payment of fees in advance of livestock turnout.

9. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

The Agreement Holder will comply with all provisions of the following Acts and their regulations: the Range Act, the Forest and Range Practices Act, the Livestock Act, the Livestock Identification Act and the Animal Disease Control Act. Any breach of these Acts or their regulations will be considered to be a breach of this Agreement.

10. TEMPORARY REDUCTION IN GRAZING USE FOR ENVIRONMENTAL REASONS

- (a) The District Manager or Forest Officer may, by issuing a written order, require a temporary reduction or adjustment in grazing use because of the adverse effects of weather, fire, flood or other environmental factors.
- (b) If the District Manager or Forest Officer issues an order pursuant to (a) and the order results in a reduction of 10% or more of Net Authorized Yearly Use, the amount of fees will be reduced proportionately.

11. LIVESTOCK OWNERSHIP AND CONTROL

The Agreement Holder will graze on the Agreement Area only livestock, which the Agreement Holder owns or controls by lease. The District Manager must approve any livestock lease agreements. The District Manager may grant an exemption to the provisions of this paragraph.

12. INFECTIOUS OR CONTAGIOUS DISEASES

The Agreement Holder will not graze livestock, which has any infectious or contagious disease or other condition that is a material risk to other livestock, wildlife or humans, on the Agreement Arca or on any Private Land that is not separated from crown range by a fence or other barrier to livestock movement, or on any land subject to a Private Land Agreement.

13. COMPLIANCE WITH LIVESTOCK ASSOCIATION

Unless exempted by the District Manager, the Agreement Holder will comply with local Livestock Association's reasonable rules and fee assessments for the construction and maintenance of authorized range improvements on the Agreement Area, or for services on the Agreement Area.

14. <u>CLAIMS</u>

- (a) The Agreement Holder will reimburse the Province for any loss caused to the Province as a result of the Agreement Holder's negligent or wilful default in the use of the Agreement Area.
- (b) The Province will not be responsible for the death, injury, or theft of livestock, or theft or damage to property belonging to the Agreement Holder.
- (c) The Province will not be responsible for any damage to range developments, except damage wilfully done by the Province or resulting from activities specifically authorized by the Province.
- (d) The Agreement Holder will have no claim against the Province for reimbursement for loss arising from deficiencies in the quality or quantity of forage on the Agreement Area.

15. NOTICES

Any notices will be served in the manner provided in the Range Act.

16. SPECIAL CONDITIONS

Conditions set out on any Exhibit B will form part of this Agreement. If there is any contradiction between any such conditions and any other terms of this Agreement, the Special Conditions will prevail.

Notice to Agreement Holder on Obligations, Compliance and Enforcement

The obligations of the Agreement Holder in the use of Crown range arise both from this Agreement and from relevant legislation such as the Range Act and the Forest and Range Practices Act. Lack of compliance could subject the Agreement Holder to a variety of remedies such as administrative penalties, tickets, suspension and cancellation of this Agreement or prosecution for offences. Among the topics requiring attention is the maintenance responsibility of the Agreement Holder for range developments.



Special Conditions

January 1, 2010

- 1. The Ministry of Forests and Range may grant non-use in accordance with the Ministry of Forests and Range non-use Policy.
- 2. The Licensee will overwinter at least 90% of the authorised livestock on the appurtenant ranch properties during the preceding winter unless a written waiver of the overwintering requirement has been provided by the District Manager.
- 3. The Licensee will maintain the productive capacity of the commensurate base properties such that, within one year these associated private lands listed on Exhibit C are be able to sustain the tenured livestock during the period Crown range is not available.
- 4. This range agreement does not convey or imply exclusive land or resource use. The Licensee will make every reasonable effort to co-operate with other users of the land. This may include, but is not limited to, aboriginal peoples, timber tenure holders, water users, recreationists, trappers and adjacent landowners.
- 5. The Licensee will discuss, meet, and fulfil any reasonable planning request made by another Crown land tenure holder or Crown agency. The Licensee will supply tenure documents, maps, plans and any other reference materials that he could reasonably obtain, for the purposes of this planning. Such planning shall include, but may not be limited to, the preparation of Range Plantation Protection (RaPP) Plans and the review of Forest Stewardship Plans.
- 6. The Licensee will exhibit reasonable co-operation with fellow grazing tenure holder(s) with respect to the management of Crown range.
- 7. The Licensee will discuss, meet and fulfil other reasonable Crown range planning requests from members of the public if requested by the Ministry of Forests.



PLANT COMMUNITIES

KENTUCKY BLUEGRASS/BALTIC RUSH/ GRASSLAND

This community is an open grassland site:
Kentucky bluegrass, baltic rush, perennial ryegrass, foxtail barley, stiff needlegrass, junegrass and pasture sedge are all present in the grass layer. The area became a grassland community long ago due to homesteading. This area is in an early seral stage of succession. PNC would have some ponderosa pine as well as Douglas-fir. There would be less domestic grasses and we would see grass species such as bluebunch wheatgrass and pinegrass present.

PONDEROSA PINE/PINEGRASS

The overstory is made up of ponderosa pine, Douglas-fir and a minor amount of trembling aspen. Prickly rose, common snowberry, prairie rose and oregon grape are the primary shrubs. Pinegrass, stiff needlegrass, red top and bluebunch wheatgrass are the primary grasses. American vetch, early blue violet, tiger lily and yarrow make up the forb layer.

PINEGRASS/DOUGLAS-FIR CUTBLOCKS

This community is comprised of a number of selectively logged Douglas-fir sites. The logging took place in the early 90's. The overstory is made up of Douglas-fir, lodgepole pine and a minor amount of trembling aspen. Kinnikinnick, prickly rose and birch leaved spirea are the main shrubs. Pinegrass makes up the major portion of the grass layer with western fescue, kentucky bluegrass and spreading needlegrass also present. Wild strawberry, field pussytoes, early blue violet, fireweed, and silky lupine are present in the forb layer.

DOUGLAS-FIR/PINEGRASS

This community is made up of a large area that has had fire activity 80 to 100 years ago. The overstory is a mixture of Douglas-fir, ponderosa pine and lodgepole pine with Douglas-fir being the predominant species. The shrub component is comprised of kinnikinnick, birch leaved spirea, prickly rose, oregon grape, and soopolallie. Pinegrass is the primary grass species. There is a diverse forb layer which includes silky lupine, rosy pussytoes, slender hawkweed, racemose pussytoes, heart leaved arnica and wild strawberry.

PONDEROSA PINE/SNOWBERRY/ BLUEBUNCH WHEATGRASS

This semi open ponderosa pine community is situated on the south-westerly slopes overlooking Allenby Lake. The overstory is made up of ponderosa pine and Douglas-fir with an open canopy. Snowberry, kinnikinnick, spreading dogbane, birch leaved spirea, saskatoon, rocky mountain. juniper and soopolallie are present in the shrub layer. Bluebunch wheatgrass and pinegrass are the primary grass species with trace amounts of junegrass, red three awn and stiff needlegrass. Yarrow, slender hawkweed, umber pussytoes, wild strawberry and showy daisy make up the forb layer.

KINNIKINNICK/PINEGRASS

This community is situated on the height of land of this tenure area and comprises a major portion of this tenure. There are some signs of selective logging haven taken place many years ago. The overstory is a combination Douglas-fir and ponderosa pine; Douglas-fir tends to be dominant. Kinnikinnick, soopolallie, birch leaved spirea, nootka rose, prickly rose, ocean spray. saskatoon and raspberry are some of the shrubs present. Pinegrass, northwestern sedge, junegrass, western fescue and orchardgrass are in the grass layer. Racemose pussytoes, wild strawberry, yarrow, field pussytoes are present in the forb layer.

PINEGRASS/LODGEPOLE PINE CUTBLOCKS

This community is comprised of a number of clearcut blocks. These blocks were logged in the early 90's. Kinnikinnick, birch leaved spirea, soopolallie, Bebbs willow, grouseberry, twinflower and sitka alder make up the major shrub species. Pinegrass is the primary grass species with traces of bluejoint, Kentucky bluegrass, junegrass and northwestern sedge also present. Wild strawberry, fireweed, slender leaved hawkweed, yarrow, tiger lily and common red paintbrush are present in the forb layer.

BEAKED SEDGE/TREMBLING ASPEN MEADOWS

This plant community is made up of a number of small sedge meadows located on the upper portion of the Flattop Pasture. There is an overstory along the water's edge of trembling aspen. Bebbs willow makes up the shrub component and it is fairly well distributed along the waters edges and upland to some degree. Beaked sedge is the primary grasslike species and it covers up to 75% of the water's edge. Nutalls alkali grass and timothy are also present in trace amounts. Pond weed, sweet

scented bedstraw, sticky cinquefoil, purple willowherb and narrow leaved burr reed are present in the forb layer.

BLUEBUNCH WHEATGRASS/JUNIPER/ ARROW LEAVED BALSAMROOT

This community is comprised of a number of semi open steep hillside areas overlooking the Similkameen river. The sparse overstory is a combination of ponderosa pine and Douglas-fir. Juniper is the primary shrub with both common and rocky mountain juniper present. Bluebunch wheatgrass, pinegrass, and junegrass make up the grass species. Arrow leaved balsamroot, parsnip flowered buckwheat, silky Lupine yarrow and pasture sage are present in the forb layer.

LODGEPOLE PINE/PINEGRASS

This community type will make up the largest portion of the Flattop pasture. The overstory of mature lodgepole pine is the primary tree species with Douglas-fir also present but to a lesser degree. Soopolallie, grouseberry, twinflower and kinnikinnick make up the main shrub component. Pinegrass and western fescue are the grass species. heart leaved arnica, wild onion, wild strawberry, one sided wintergreen, and racemose pussytoes are present in the forb layer.
