Minister, as discussed, the following is a brief outline of progress on the Forest Policy work toward a "Revitalized Industry". I did it last night for you but noticed it was stuck in my outbox.

1. Economic analysis and policy foundation work underway since September. (Including Ministerial direction on Forest Fibre Working Group Recommendations)
2. Policy direction and focus meetings with Don Wright (3 meetings).
3. Log export and fibre supply reports prepared for MDD. Briefings to discuss same.
4. Minister leads trade mission to Asia and promotes Govt-Industry dialogue (Oct. 2017).
5. Minister initiates Coast Pulp Fibre Working Group. High priority, 3 month expedited process that began in mid-January.
6. Minister initiates meetings with Industry CEO's on an individual basis. Meetings undertaken with WFP, Coastland, Canfor.
7. Expedited 2 day review of coast pricing with licensees in late January. A number of options were identified to improve pricing and mitigate some impacts of the Dec 15 2017 update. This resulted in two minor amendments to coast appraisal manual.
8. Ministry wide team reviews and develops policy changes that will facilitate a rapid response to salvage of fire damaged timber and address short term log inventory needs of impacted mills. Policy changes included timber pricing improvements for fire damaged stands, and expedited processes to amend and/or surrender impacted cutting permits and TSLs. Additionally, impacted First Nations were provided \$100,000 in SFE funds to engage in the wildfire mitigation process.
9. Wood Secretariat (forum for independent, small to med sized value added and specialty wood manufacturers) has met twice since September to advance actions identified in the 2017 Value Added Action Plan, with an initial emphasis on fibre supply.
10. Direction from PO to undertake Coast policy work initially and hold a CEO meeting to discuss government objectives. Planning (Presentation and scheduling) is underway for a mid May meeting.
11. Forest Stewardship, FRPA amendment options developed and direction given by Minister.

12. Coast Pulp Fibre Working Group report submitted in mid-April, Minister briefed on April 27 and recommendations adopted.
13. Contractor Sustainability Report submitted, analyzed and will be shared with industry week of May 7. Rollout process and comms developed week of Apr 30.
14. Refined Forest Policy options presented to Minister, April 25. Focus on log export, fibre supply including pulp fibre strategy.
15. Ministry staff to meet again with Don Wright to advance Forest Policy work. May 7.

Summary of the imminent threat analysis for southern mountain caribou

The Minister of Environment and Climate Change has determined that Woodland Caribou, Southern Mountain population is facing

imminent threats to its recovery.

The Minister came to this opinion after a scientific assessment that considered the biological condition of southern mountain caribou, ongoing and expected threats, and mitigation measures. The assessment noted a particular concern in the following ten local population units: Central Kootenay, Southwest Kootenay, Southeast Kootenay, Kinbasket, South Monashee, Quintette, Narraway, Jasper-Banff, Redrock / Prairie Creek, Telkwa (Figure 1).

The Minister also considered whether there were imminent threats to survival of the species and concluded that such threats do not exist at this time.

The imminent threat analysis is based on the best available information, including information provided by the Governments of British Columbia and Alberta, petitioners, and information gathered by Environment and Climate Change Canada and Parks Canada. She found that the species is facing threats, which are imminent in the sense that immediate intervention is required to allow for eventual recovery.

Southern mountain caribou was listed as a threatened wildlife species on Schedule 1 of the Species at Risk Act in 2003. The federal recovery strategy was posted as final on the Species at Risk Public Registry on June 3, 2014.

As stated in the federal recovery strategy, the long-term recovery goal is to achieve self-sustaining populations in all local population units within their current distribution. Achieving this goal should allow for sufficiently large local populations to support traditional Indigenous harvest in the long-term.

The most significant and immediate threat to recovery is unsustainable predation. Broadly, these unsustainable levels of predation are the result of habitat changes, which have led to changes to predator and prey communities and direct disturbance and displacement of individual caribou.

Environment and Climate Change Canada officials found that there are 10 local population units with estimated population sizes of close to or below 100 animals for which long-term population trends are declining and threats are ongoing. While population management is having a positive short-term effect in some local population units, such measures are not currently complemented by the significant habitat protection or restoration measures necessary to improve the likelihood of recovery in the long term.

The complete imminent threat assessment prepared by Environment and Climate Change Canada that informed the Minister's opinion will be posted to the Species at Risk Public Registry in June.

The Minister also considered whether there were imminent threats to survival of the species and concluded that such threats do not exist at this time.

The imminent threat analysis is based on the best available information, including information provided by the Governments of British Columbia and Alberta, petitioners, and information gathered by Environment and Climate Change Canada and Parks Canada. She found that the species is facing threats, which are imminent in the sense that immediate intervention is required to allow for eventual recovery.

Southern mountain caribou was listed as a threatened wildlife species on Schedule 1 of the Species at Risk Act in 2003. The federal recovery strategy was posted as final on the Species at Risk Public Registry on June 3, 2014.

As stated in the federal recovery strategy, the long-term recovery goal is to achieve self-sustaining populations in all local population units within their current distribution. Achieving this goal should allow for sufficiently large local populations to support traditional Indigenous harvest in the long-term.

The most significant and immediate threat to recovery is unsustainable predation. Broadly, these unsustainable levels of predation are the result of habitat changes, which have led to changes to predator and prey communities and direct disturbance and displacement of individual caribou.

Environment and Climate Change Canada officials found that there are 10 local population units with estimated population sizes of close to or below 100 animals for which long-term population trends are declining and threats are ongoing. While population management is having a positive short-term effect in some local population units, such measures are not currently complemented by the significant habitat protection or restoration measures necessary to improve the likelihood of recovery in the long term.

The complete imminent threat assessment prepared by Environment and Climate Change Canada that informed the Minister's opinion will be posted to the Species at Risk Public Registry in June.

MLA Donaldson welcomes new playgrounds in Smithers and Atlin

CITY – Stikine MLA Doug Donaldson said students in Smithers and Atlin are getting new playgrounds, thanks to \$195,000 in provincial funding announced by the Premier and Minister of Education today.

“Families deserve a modern playground no matter where they live in B.C.”, said Donaldson, who is also the Minister of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development. “Under the previous government, parent groups had to come up with matching dollars in order to have a new playground, but now our government is freeing them of that burden. Children should have an up-to-date and safe place to play.”

Muhiem Elementary in Smithers is receiving \$105,000 for a new accessible playground and Atlin School in Atlin is receiving \$90,000 for a standard playground.

This funding is part of a new, ongoing Playground Equipment Program that will provide up to \$5 million each year to school districts to purchase new or replacement playgrounds, and fulfills a central NDP campaign promise. This year, 26 schools are receiving \$90,000 for a standard playground, and 25 schools are receiving \$105,000 for a universally-accessible playground.

Generally, schools’ Parent Advisory Councils have to fundraise large sums of money for new and replacement playground equipment, and schools without that capability are left without playgrounds. The new fund will ensure that kids don’t have to suffer for years with inadequate or unsafe playground equipment, and that parents can focus their energy on their children’s success.

Playgrounds are important for children’s development and learning. They encourage outdoor physical activity and help students learn how to share, work together, overcome challenges and be creative. Outdoor play can help students focus and learn more effectively in the classroom.

The wildfires this summer have taken a terrible toll on people around the province, and there's no question that the Cariboo has been hit the hardest. I've met with people who have lost everything, who saw flames rise up and were unable to stop them. Those stories were heartbreaking and they have stuck with me.

I understand that people want information. That's a natural reaction to any tragic event. My staff have been in constant contact with residents and have heard their repeated requests. Rest assured, I want them to have the information they are requesting, but at this point, patience is required. I know that's not what people want to hear, but there are investigations ongoing into all aspects of these fires. In some cases, those investigations include the RCMP. The investigations will be thorough, and unfortunately, that will take time.

On Thursday, August 17, representatives from the BC Wildfire Service met with local MLAs in Clinton (Donna Barnett and Jackie Tegart) and the Mayor of Clinton to discuss firefighting tactics. According to BCWS, the meeting went well and a lot of information was exchanged about firefighting strategies.

MLA Conference Call:

An overview of emergency and wildfire response was provided by an EMBC representative.

MLAs identified on the Conference Call:

Questions asked on the call:

1. MLA Jackie Tegart raised concerns that overhead digital highway signs were not updated in a timely manner when Highway 97 re-opened. The MLA asked that this be flagged for future major highway announcements.

Response: *Confirmed that this suggestion would be shared with Ministry of Transportation.*

Phone/Email Inquiries: 2 new email/phone inquiries. Also, one responses was sent regarding an outstanding issue.

1. MLA Jackie Tegart's office (Cariboo-Chilcotin) requested additional information for a family who is billeting an elderly couple who lost their home in the fires. The family would like additional help to support the couple (Red Cross registration and ESS registration info had previously been provided to them through the MLA Liaison desk).

Response: *Because Red Cross registration information and ESS registration process was already provided, it was recommended that they call the ESS Call Centre to explain the situation to see if any additional supports may be available.*

2. Member of Parliament Todd Doherty's office (Cariboo-Prince George) followed up about receiving the daily wildfire status report.

Response: *Reiterated protocols that they should make a request through the federal government to ensure information is appropriate to be shared and can be done in a consistent and coordinated manner. Office assistant also said they had been receiving a report via the regional district – she was encouraged to follow-up with her contact at the district to discuss.*

3. Outstanding request from Aug. 16: MLA for Kamloops North Thompson's office asked on behalf of a constituent: The individual sells camping supplies to tourists and is confused if charcoal stoves/briquettes are permitted during campfire ban.

Response: *Briquettes/charcoal are permitted as long as they are used in a camping stove. If briquettes are being used in a freestanding fireplace (or 'portable campfire apparatus') it needs to be CSA or ULC approved. See specific guidelines below. If you would like to discuss further, you can contact the Kamloops Fire Centre at 250 554-5500. Campfire ban prohibitions do not apply to cooking stoves that use gas, propane or briquettes, or to a portable campfire apparatus with a CSA or ULC rating that uses briquettes, liquid or gaseous fuel - so long as the height of the flame is less than 15 centimetres. The use of a campfire apparatus that does not meet these specifications is prohibited.*

Questions asked on the call:

1. The MLA for Cariboo-North raised concerns about the Swift River Fire, stating it was ~12 kilometers from Wells & Barkerville. Had questions about strategy to fight this fire, raised concerns that currently the fire is 'unmanned' and asked what is being done to save Barkerville.

Response: *Ian from the Wildfire Service gave update on status of fire, clarified that crews are currently evaluating the response and necessary resources and would provide a more detailed update on Wednesday's MLA call.*

2. MLA for Prince George-Valemount asked about resource requests – are more resources coming? Have all available resources been asked for?

Response: *Firefighting crews are being deployed from other jurisdictions, including from off-continent, as quickly as possible. Wildfire Service assured them they are doing everything they can to coordinate firefighting crews.*

3. Prince George-Valemount also asked about long-term situation – what are long-term weather forecasts, how long can we expect the situation to continue?

Response: *Weather patterns do not appear to be significantly different from current patterns for next 14 days. There are no predictions of weather patterns on the horizon to suggest the fires will suddenly end. It is difficult to predict longer term weather outlooks.*

4. Cariboo-North asked about containment lines – was fuel buried?

Response: *Fire containment strategy was outlined, crews working as quickly as they possibly can. Confirmed that always the goal is to bury or burn the fuel when containment lines are formed.*

5. MLA for Cariboo-Chilcotin asked for update about the Elephant Hill Fire

Response: *Update was provided on status of fire and firefighting efforts in the area, including that crews are in the process of trying to get into the areas where the fire expanded over the weekend.*

MLA Liaison Activity August 2, 2017

MLAs identified on the call: Jackie Tegart (Fraser-Nicola), Donna Barnett (Cariboo-Chilcotin), Peter Milabar (Kamloops-North Thompson), Coralee Oakes (Cariboo North) and Tom Shypipka (Kootenay East).

Summary: Number of calls and emails to the desk remain low (3) with the majority of requests relating to assistance in helping individual constituents with ESS/Red Cross matters. Several constituents in the Clinton area sent strongly worded criticism of a controlled burn done east of Clinton that apparently jumped the highway. This issue was also raised on the afternoon media availability with Wildfire ServicesBC

Criteria used to close park was the primary subject of the call as government experts Madeline Maley, Executive Director, BC Wildfire Service; John Hawkings, Director, Rec Sites and Trails; and Jeff Leahy, BC Parks Regional Director were specially invited to the call to address the questions. Requested the criteria list to be distributed.

Response: BC Parks provided criteria list to close parks along with message bullets to use when explaining park closures to public.

2) From August 1 call, closed loop on question related to billeting costs and dates on referrals.

Of course the best assurance is for an evacuee to get their form updated at the nearest Reception Centre. Or they can contact their local authority to get the paperwork through their local ESS Team. Decisions are made on a case by case basis.

Reception Centres cannot issue backdate referral forms. However if billet providers have not received a referral form or the referral form does not cover the dates that the evacuee(s) stayed, the billet provider can fill out the billeting invoice and attach an accompanying letter that explains:

- The number of people that stayed
- The length of time they stayed
- An explanation of the information on the billeting invoice, and
- Any other information that can confirm their claim.

Attach this letter to the original billeting invoice and mail it to EMBC using the address on the billeting invoice. Forms and letters must be mailed; they cannot be faxed or sent electronically. (Finance needs the originals for readability and auditing purposes.) Billeting providers should keep

a photocopy of all the documents they are sending for future reference.

Finance will consider such submissions on a case by case basis. Because of the volume to billeting submission, there will be delays in issuing cheques to cover billeting invoice.

Individual email or phone inquiries:

- 1) North Coast (Rice): Email on behalf of constituent who returned to Bella Coola via ferry after road was closed and heard that ferry costs were being waived.

Response: There has been no reimbursement for people as a result of road closures or detours. I also checked with our FN Branch to just to make that there was nothing FN specific.

In the early days of the road closure there were one or two individuals who were directed to register for ESS support as stranded tourists (lodging, etc. but not costs of getting home) as they could not even get back on BC Ferries at that point as it was completely booked.

- 2) Fraser-Nicola (Tegart): Two emails from Clinton area citizens criticizing Elephant Hill suppression efforts and in particular the control burn done the day before that jumped the highway.

Response: (Approved by FLNRO GCPE)

Yesterday controlled burning took place on the slopes east of Hwy 97 just north of the Loon Lake road intersection. Controlled burning is an often-used and an effective way to help contain a wildfire and prevent further growth

The burn went well for the first few hours. Unfortunately, there was an unforecasted and dramatic change in the wind direction, causing embers to cross over to west side of Hwy 97 south of Maiden Creek.

Wind has been the most influential factor in efforts to try to contain this wildfire.

The fire moved up the hillside and BC Wildfire Service immediately actioned this fire with helicopters bucketing water. No structures or infrastructure have been impacted.

The burn did achieve the objective of removing fuels and extending the fire guard above the east side of Hwy 97.

Response:
Further to your inquiry today about compensation from the elephant controlled burn.

Wildfire Services advises that they appreciate the concerns and sympathize with all those that have been affected by this year's wildfires. And they understand the frustrations, especially when personal or economic impacts are felt by residents. The top priority of Wildfire Services is always public safety first, followed by protection of infrastructure.

Each request for compensation is investigated by BC Wildfire Service – wildfire risk staff. With regard to the Elephant Hill fire, staff have reached out to the residents that issued the news release.

Under the Wildfire Act and regulation, people can be compensated for damage on private land for “avoidable damaged caused by fire control by government.”

The use of planned ignitions to try to contain larger fires is frequently used and generally successful. On a fire the size and scale of Elephant Hill, planned ignitions are one of the most effective tactics at our disposal.

The Elephant Hill wildfire has emerged to be one of the more complex and challenging wildfires that the province has experienced in years. Over 600 personnel, 22 helicopters and 105 pieces of heavy equipment are working to contain this fire, using any and all methods to stem it’s growth and protect properties and infrastructure.

The cause of the wildfire is under investigation.

4. (MLA Bond) How can people find the operating hours of ESS offices? Heard that evacuees showed up to Cloverdale only to find office closed on long weekend. Response:

- The operating hours for ESS offices are set by local authorities.
- Generally speaking, the opening hours are balanced with the current needs and the volume of evacuees, and ensuring that volunteers are getting rested so they can compassionately perform their duties during periods of high need.
- We are encouraging local authorities to post the hours of ESS operations and after hours contact numbers on facility doors.

Was Cloverdale closed on the weekend and why? (MLA says Williams Lake family drove to Cloverdale on the weekend but office was closed.)

- The local authority did close the Cloverdale office on the weekend to provide volunteers with some well-deserved rest during a lull.
- As we are expecting this wildfire season to be long and with many periods of high demand, it is important to provide volunteers rest whenever possible.
- We are encouraging local authorities to post hours and emergency contact information .

(MLA Barnett) If Anahiem Lake is evacuated why can’t an ESS office be set up in 100 Mile House so people don’t have to drive all the way to Prince George.

- The decisions on where to evacuate residents is based on many factors including available egress, safety of roads, and the capacity of receiving communities to help evacuees.
- While we can appreciate evacuees wanting to stay as close to home as possible, it is also important that the communities chosen to provide services to evacuees have the necessary supports in place.
- While 100 Mile House and Williams Lake are closer to Anaheim Lake, they are both still under evacuation alert and therefore not ideal locations for new evacuees. It would understandably be very distressing for evacuees to be evacuated from the very community they had taken refuge.
- As well, both 100 Mile House and Williams Lake are both recovering from their own emergencies and it is important to give those communities time to look after their own residents.

Other queries:

1. MLA Tegarts office had a constituent who chose not to evacuate needing to take her husband to a doctor’s appointment. Wanted assurance that she could return home after leaving.

Response: Connected constituent with Kamloops RCMP who arranged re-entry.

2. CA from North Thompson forwarded inquiry from constituent who is irate that the soldiers brought in to assist with security checkpoints are not doing anything to actually help with the fires.

We've been told that the Province is giving the soldiers their directives, but I was hoping that we could get a little bit of info regarding how they're directed.

- From a firefighting personnel perspective, the focus is on using trained and experienced firefighting personnel from across Canada before engaging the military in the on-the-ground response to the wildfires.
- That said, Canadian Forces assets, including helicopters and fixed-wing aircraft, have been getting into position to support provincial efforts.
- Notably, the Request for Federal Assistance was approved and announced on July 9, 2017.
- To be clear, military aircraft are in place to support non-firefighting needs.

Further to your inquiry today about compensation from the elephant controlled burn.

Wildfire Services advises that they appreciate the concerns and sympathize with all those that have been affected by this year's wildfires. And they understand the frustrations, especially when personal or economic impacts are felt by residents. The top priority of Wildfire Services is always public safety first, followed by protection of infrastructure.

Each request for compensation is investigated by BC Wildfire Service – wildfire risk staff. With regard to the Elephant Hill fire, staff have reached out to the residents that issued the news release.

Under the Wildfire Act and regulation, people can be compensated for damage on private land for “avoidable damaged caused by fire control by government.”

The use of planned ignitions to try to contain larger fires is frequently used and generally successful. On a fire the size and scale of Elephant Hill, planned ignitions are one of the most effective tactics at our disposal.

The Elephant Hill wildfire has emerged to be one of the more complex and challenging wildfires that the province has experienced in years. Over 600 personnel, 22 helicopters and 105 pieces of heavy equipment are working to contain this fire, using any and all methods to stem it’s growth and protect properties and infrastructure.

The cause of the wildfire is under investigation.

B.C. communities to benefit from more community forest opportunities

BURNS LAKE - The Government of British Columbia is making changes to give rural communities additional economic and land management opportunities, by allowing them to increase the size of their community forest.

Doug Donaldson, Minister of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development, made the announcement today at the BC Community Forest Association AGM in Burns Lake.

"We want to make sure we're providing a strong economic base for rural communities," said Donaldson. "This change will help to give community forest operators more options to create local employment opportunities, and also benefit First Nations."

A community forest is a long-term agreement to manage Crown land that may be held by a local government, community group, First Nation or community-held corporation. Rural communities and First Nations see community forests as a tool to manage the local Crown land base, to provide benefits to the residents and help support their local economies and provide long-term employment opportunities. There are 57 community forests in the province.

"We have been actively working with the provincial government to strengthen the role of people and communities in decisions around the resources they depend on for jobs and community well-being," said Erik Leslie, president of the BC Community Forest Association. "These are welcome amendments, and are being implemented after full consultation with those affected."

The change is as a result of amendments to the Forest Act and Community Tenures Regulation. With the change, the expansion of a community forest will be allowed, provided

there is available area. Expansions of less than 100 hectares will follow a simplified process, whereas expansions of greater than 100 hectares will require a thorough process, including a management plan and community engagement.

Minister Donaldson,

Thank you far on accepting my input on possible solutions to our province's most precious natural resource – Wildlife.

As I have not yet received any correspondence in response to my proposals I assume that you are considering them and perhaps implementing in one way or another. Therefore it would be great to hear from you if this is the case or not.

Although I have always suggested science driven policy making, I also realize that this data may take time as funding will be required, and I do not see that dedicated in your current budget. The funding model required and the involvement from stakeholders, First Nations and Industry will take some time to bring together. As this is a very time sensitive issue there are some temporary fixes that can be implemented immediately without any real cost to government This would be in the form of more restrictive hunting regulations.

This is a letter from a very avid hunter and conservationist. He is a well-respected wildlife author and has been in the Kootenay backcountry for at least 50 years. I submit his letter in part for your consideration.

"Tom, I can honestly tell you that almost every single hunter I have chatted with is prepared to accept some restrictions to help get ungulate populations back on the rails to recovery....These conservation minded hunters need to be praised and applauded for trying to do their part to help. Instead they are being criticized by some for "caving in" and admitting that overhunting of some species has contributed to population declines.

What I have garnered from interviews with hunters, guide-outfitters, CO's, butcher shops and sporting goods stores is this...People do recognize that hunting regulations are just one part of the equation, but having said that, going conservative with regs will without question help in the short term, and adjusting regs is a very viable low-cost option compared to some of the other longer term more costly remedies that need to happen as you related to.. There really is no downside to being more conservative when it comes to hunting regulations...perhaps less "opportunity" some would argue but If we reach ground zero for some species there will be almost 0 opportunity over the long run. You are right...the time to act is now...

I have put together a list of suggested and important changes to hunting regulations based on the information I have collected from all of the above mentioned sources...Here is the list and most certainly you can use some of this or all of it in your presentation to the Minister.

Elk.....Cancel the spike bull season effective this year...Over 25% of the animals harvested are

likely young spike bulls and with only 14 bulls per one hundred cows the number is dangerously low...A bench mark number given to me by several biologists is Anything less than 20 bulls per hundred cows is unacceptable and we are well below that benchmark.

Cancel all LEH cow/calf permits in the Trench and in the Elk Valley.....An exception might be on private ranches where they are still encountering some serious crop damage, but limit the number of permits to very low digit numbers.

Whitetails.....Stop the GOS on whitetail does effective immediately. As it is not compulsory reporting, biologists only have a vague guess as to what is being harvested. Numbers in many management units are way down and many veteran hunters have related that to me...They were preaching to the converted as I have kept counts from my tree stands for over 25 years and the numbers have plummeted since the advent of those general open seasons... Some LEH permits can be issued once populations start to re-build. With a success ratio easily determined, wildlife managers will know how many permits to issue and how many deer are being harvested each and every year...They will be pretty accurate numbers and they will have new numbers every year to work with, not 4 or 5 years apart as it is now.

Whitetail Bucks.....Current buck to doe ratio in some management units is less than 7-8 whitetail bucks per 100 does. The age class structure on bucks in the East Kootenay is pathetic...The butcher shops have told me that the average buck being harvested is less than 2 years old...The numbers from the various trophy competitions back that up as only very few mature bucks are being entered each year and the size of the bucks being entered has diminished every year for the past number of years...

People have proposed shortening the buck season to November 20th, from November 30th where it stands today...A high percentage of bucks are harvested in that last ten days due to the peak of the rut being in full swing and usually heavy snowfall the last week of November making the deer more vulnerable...This is nothing new...In the 90's and before that the season used to cease on November 20th to give more bucks a chance to advance in age class...and breed more does...

Moose....Last year the province instituted a moose recovery program for all of B.C. Yet here in the East Kootenay we have what is essentially a 75 day moose season..Starts with the bow/crossbow season in September and runs until Nov 15th when the rifle season ends for those that have an LEH permit for a mature bull, or anyone can buy a permit over the counter for a spike-fork bull...It makes little sense to shoot the young bulls when we have a moose recovery program on in the province...There was a legitimate reason that program was implemented of course...Not enough moose in some regions...The guide-outfitters Assoc. told me they proposed the bull moose season to start October 15th and end November 15th, when the bulls are almost completely out of the rut...Earlier they are very vulnerable because they are big targets that really are not all that hunter savvy at least when they are in the rut during September, and early October. They are one of the easiest animals to hunt with a bow or crossbow, in the early Fall as a result of that fact.

Bighorn Sheep....The Bull River herd for one is in serious trouble and this one is not because of overhunting as one can only shoot a full curl ram...Between you and I, a biologist here told me the season in the Bull needs to be cancelled, but the direction they are getting is that they will put that zone on LEH instead...With less than 50 left in the herd most hunters know and understand the herd cannot even afford to lose one or two rams...The outfitter in the area, if the season were to be cancelled wouldn't be happy and my guess is, that is the reason they are proposing LEH instead of doing what they should do, and cancel the season in that management unit altogether...

Predators....Continue to be tough on predators such as wolves, cougars and coyotes...Of course grizzly bears are in the mix here as well as they kill elk and moose calves by the hundreds each spring, BUT as you are aware we can't hunt those anymore in B.C. only adding to the predation

factor on ungulates...Predators do belong in our eco-systems for certain, but the numbers need to be carefully managed and are no different than ungulates in that regard.

A lot to digest here but the bottom line is...what we have been doing has not been effective at all...Again, the quickest way to implement a recovery program for ungulates is to start with adjusting regulations to more conservative seasons, and then after that is done, begin working on all the other components that dwell within the big picture, beginning with that new funding model you related to...Wildlife Managers simply CANNOT manage wildlife properly with old and outdated numbers or no population estimates at all...Then if we get a proper funding model in place, Regional Managers in each area of the province need to be entrusted with the authority to act and to implement plans based on scientific data from their own regions...

Good Luck with the Minister and keep up the good work...."

Minister, I send this to you in good faith. I appreciate your efforts, but as mentioned this issue in Kootenay East is time sensitive and desperate. I would like at the very least to consider any and all of my suggestions that I have previously sent. Hunting regulations could be limited to region 4 as a pilot project to examine the results for other regions as a temporary fix until we get the rest of my recommendations in place. This offering from the hunting community will convince others (industry, First Nations, other user groups and stakeholders) to buy in as well because we need all cylinders to be firing here to get real positive sustainable results.

Once again, this is a huge holistic plan and this email touches only on temporary relief from this issue.

Please let me know your response at your earliest convenience. Perhaps we can discuss before the break.
