
the exclusive privilege of guiding in the area (the "Area") described in Schedule A to this certificate, for the
period ending the 14th day of January, 2009.

This certificate is subject to the following conditions:

1. You must comply with, and ensure that your employees and persons you guide comply with, all applicable laws, including the Wildlife Act and its regulations. Some (not all) relevant portions are reproduced on the back of this certificate.
2. You must not block or damage, and must ensure that your employees and persons you guide do not block or damage, any road, trail, watercourse, or other property in the Area. You must remedy at your own expense any blocking or damage that occurs.
3. You must not construct or occupy permanent structures or graze animals in the Area without obtaining the required government permission, for example by obtaining a licence of occupation or grazing lease.
4. Nothing in this certificate authorizes you to interfere with the government's right of access to the Area or the right of any other person the government authorizes to enter, use, or occupy the Area.
5. You must perform all obligations to the government in contracts related to your use of the Area, for example by paying fees for use of land.
6. This certificate does not restrict the government's right to permit others to enter and use the Area, including, without limiting this, by granting title to land within the Area or rights to take resources from the Area.
7. If any portion of the Area is, or during the term of this certificate becomes,
 - (a) subject to an exclusive right of occupation by another, for example by a grant or lease from the government,
 - (b) a park, or
 - (c) the property of Canada, for example as an Indian reserve,

the rights granted in this certificate may not be exercised on that portion without the consent of a person who has an exclusive right to occupy that portion.

**Reproduced Below Are The Portions Of The Wildlife Act
Referred To Under Condition 1 on The Front Of This Certificate**

Definitions and interpretation

Be aware of and knowledgeable about definitions and interpretation in section 1 (1) of the Wildlife Act.

Compulsory guide outfitter licence

- 48 (1) A person commits an offence if the person acts as a guide for game, or offers to act as a guide for game, unless the person
- (a) holds a guide outfitter licence,
 - (b) holds an assistant guide licence,
 - (c) holds another licence to guide for game, or
 - (d) accompanies or assists a person to hunt game birds or small game on land other than Crown land.
- (2) A person who holds a guide outfitter licence commits an offence if the person employs another person to guide for game and that other person does not hold an assistant guide licence.
- (3) A guide outfitter must be present in his or her guide area during substantially all the times when his or her assistant guides are guiding for game.
- (4) If a guide outfitter fails to comply with subsection (3), a regional manager may take action under section 61.

Non use of area

- 58 If a guide outfitter or an angling guide does not guide or states that he or she does not intend to guide hunters or anglers in a year,
- (a) the guide outfitter or angling guide may apply to the regional manager for permission to temporarily discontinue or partially discontinue the use of his or her guiding area or the use of the waters or area authorized by his or her angling guide licence, as the case may be, or
 - (b) the regional manager must review the guide outfitter's or angling guide's operation and, after affording him or her an opportunity to be heard, the regional manager may suspend, cancel or refuse to renew the guide outfitter licence or certificate or both or the angling guide's licence.

Guide outfitter's certificate

- 59 (2) On each 5th anniversary of the date of issue of a guide outfitter's certificate, the regional manager may issue a new certificate, on application by the guide outfitter, for a period not exceeding 10 years.

Action if conditions of licence or certificate not fulfilled

- 61 (1) If a person who holds or applies to renew a guide outfitter's licence or guide outfitter's certificate, assistant guide licence or another licence to guide for game, angling guide licence, assistant angling guide licence, trapping licence or fur trader's licence is convicted of an offence under this Act or the regulations or does not comply with the conditions contained in his or her licence or certificate, or for another cause that the regional manager considers reasonable, the regional manager may conduct a hearing to determine whether the person should continue to enjoy the privileges afforded him or her by the licence or certificate and may do any one or more of the following:
- (a) suspend, cancel or refuse to renew the person's licence or certificate;
 - (b) amend the licence or certificate to specify a different area in which the person is authorized to operate;
 - (c) in the case of a guide outfitter, amend the licence to further limit the numbers, age and sex of game in respect of which the person may guide;
 - (d) amend the licence or certificate to require the person to meet other restrictions considered appropriate;
 - (e) in the case of an angling guide, reduce or cancel an angler day quota attached to that person's licence.
- (2) A person, in respect of whose licence or certificate a hearing is to be held, must be given reasonable notice of the time and place for the hearing.
- (2.1) Notice required by subsection (2) may be given in accordance with section 101 (3).
- (3) A hearing conducted under subsection (1) must be held in public unless the minister orders that the hearing be held in private.
- (4) If notice of a hearing is given to the holder of a licence or certificate and the licence or certificate expires before the regional manager makes a determination under subsection (1), the regional manager is not obliged to
- (a) renew the licence or certificate until the end of the 30 day period immediately after the licence or certificate expires, or
 - (b) consider renewing the licence or certificate until the regional manager makes the determination after the hearing is held,
- whichever occurs first.
- (5) Despite subsection (4), if the hearing is delayed at the request of the holder of the licence or certificate, the regional manager is not obliged to consider renewing the licence or certificate until the regional manager makes the determination after the hearing is held.

Transfers subject to approval

- 62 (1) The privileges conferred by a guide outfitter's licence or certificate may not be transferred without the authorization of the regional manager.
- (2) Guiding privileges in a portion of a guiding area held under a guide outfitter's licence or certificate may not be transferred without the authorization of the regional manager.

Cancellation of certificate

- 63 If a guide outfitter's licence is cancelled or if a guide outfitter fails to renew his or her licence or pay an annual fee for more than one year, his or her privileges in and to a guide outfitter's certificate terminate, and the guide outfitter must surrender the guide outfitter's certificate to the regional manager.

Certificate or licence is part of estate

- 64 (1) A guide outfitter's certificate is part of the estate of the guide outfitter and, subject to the approval of the regional manager, the heirs or administrators of a deceased guide outfitter may transfer, within 2 years after the guide outfitter's death, the privileges conferred by the certificate to a person who qualifies under section 51 for a guide outfitter licence.
- (2) An angling guide licence, including any angler day quota attached to it, is part of the estate of the angling guide and, subject to the regulations, the heirs or administrators of a deceased angling guide may transfer, within 2 years after the angling guide's death, the privileges conferred by the angling guide licence and any angler day quota attached to it.
- (3) If an annual fee for a guide outfitter licence or an angling guide licence becomes due in the interval between the death of the licence holder and the date of a transfer under this section, no annual fee is payable.
- (4) If privileges conferred by a guide outfitter's certificate or an angling guide licence are not transferred in accordance with this section, the heirs or administrators must surrender the guide outfitter's certificate or the angling guide licence, as the case may be, to the regional manager.

Single licence only

- 66 Only one guide outfitter's licence or certificate may be held by a person at one time.

No proprietary rights in wildlife

- 67 A guide outfitter's certificate or angling guide's licence does not
- a) give the holder any proprietary rights in wildlife or fish, or
 - b) restrict the rights of a resident to hunt or fish.

WITNESSES THAT:

1. The Government grants to the Guide the exclusive privilege of guiding (the "Grant") in the area described in Schedule A to this certificate (the "Area"), for the period ending December 22, 2009.
2. The Guide must comply with the following conditions:
 - a) to comply with the provisions of the *Wildlife Act* and its regulations;
 - b) not to block or damage any road, trail, airstrip, watercourse, or other property in the Area;
 - c) to ensure that the Guide's employees and the persons guided:
 - i) comply with the provisions of the *Wildlife Act* and its regulations;
 - ii) do not block or damage any road, trail, airstrip, watercourse, or other property in the Area;
 - d) to remedy at the Guide's own expense any such blockage or damage that occurs under b) or c)ii).
3. This Certificate is part of the estate of the Guide and, subject to the approval of the regional manager, the heirs or administrators of the deceased Guide may transfer, within 2 years after the Guide's death, the privileges conferred by the Certificate to a person who qualifies under section 51 for a guide outfitter licence.
4. At any time between the 5th anniversary of the date of issue of the certificate and its date of expiry, the Guide may apply to renew the Grant on the same terms and conditions, subject to the provisions of the *Wildlife Act* and regulations in effect at the time, for a period not exceeding 10 years.

thence in a westerly, northerly and westerly direction along said watershed boundaries to a point of intersection with the western watershed boundary of the Tahsish River;

thence in a general westerly and northerly direction along the eastern watershed boundary of the Tahsish River to a point of intersection with the southeastern watershed boundary of Raging River;

thence in a general southwesterly, westerly, southerly, westerly, and northwesterly direction along the southerly watershed boundaries of Raging River, Benson River, Teihsum River, Marble River, Cayeghle Creek and Utlah Creek to a point of intersection with the southwesterly watershed boundary of Colonial Creek;

thence in a general westerly direction along the southwesterly watershed boundary of the Klaskish River and a westerly prolongation thereof to a point of intersection with the midline of Klaskish Inlet;

thence in a general westerly direction to a point of intersection with 50°10' north latitude;

thence in a general southeasterly direction to the point of commencement and including all intervening territory except, and unless permission is granted, private land, Provincial and Federal Parks and Indian Reserves.



APPENDIX B ADVISORY

GUIDING TERRITORY CERTIFICATE 100672

GENERAL

- It is the holder's responsibility to be aware of all applicable laws and the limits of this certificate. For example,
 - Only a licenced guide may exercise the guiding privileges controlled by the holder.
 - This certificate does not authorize the use of land within a provincial park, conservancy or recreation area without a park use permit or the use of private land without the landowner's permission.
- If applicable, the holder is responsible for renewing his or her own certificate. The issuer is not obliged to send a reminder notice.

LEGISLATION

Here are some, but not all, relevant excerpts from the **Wildlife Act**:

Guiding territory certificate

- 59 (1) A regional manager may issue a guiding territory certificate to a person who, or to a group of persons each of whom,
- (a) is a citizen of Canada or a permanent resident of Canada,
 - (b) is 19 years of age or older, and
 - (c) has other qualifications prescribed by regulation
- (2) The director may specify the form of and conditions contained in a guiding territory certificate.
- (3) Subject to a permit issued under section 70 (1) (b), a guiding territory certificate grants to the holder the exclusive control over guiding privileges in the area described in the certificate for the period stated in the certificate, which may not exceed 10 years.
- (4) The issuance of a guiding territory certificate to more than one person creates a tenancy in common in the rights granted by the certificate.
- (5) If a guiding territory certificate is issued to more than one person, the guiding territory certificate must
- (a) identify a person as the agent of the holders of the certificate and
 - (b) specify the interest held in the certificate by each holder of the certificate
- (6) A regional manager may rely on information provided and an application or submission made by the agent identified in the guiding territory certificate as if that information were provided or that application or submission were made by all the holders of the certificate.
- (7) After the 5th anniversary of the date of issue of a guiding territory certificate, the regional manager may issue a new certificate, on application by the holder, for a period not exceeding 10 years.

Non-use of guiding territory

- 59.1 (1) On application by the holder of a guiding territory certificate who does not intend to consent to guiding in a year in the guiding territory described in the guiding territory certificate, the regional manager may give permission for the temporary or partial discontinuance of the use of that guiding territory for guiding.
- (2) If, in the opinion of the regional manager, there is no guiding in a year in a guiding territory described in a guiding territory certificate,
- (a) the regional manager may review the operation of the holder of the guiding territory certificate, and
 - (b) after affording the holder an opportunity to be heard, the regional manager may suspend, cancel or refuse to renew the guiding territory certificate.

APPENDIX B ADVISORY

GUIDING TERRITORY CERTIFICATE 100672

Certificate or licence is part of estate

64 (1) An interest in a guiding territory certificate is part of the estate of the holder of that interest and, subject to section 62, the heirs or administrators of a deceased holder may transfer, within 2 years of the holder's death, the holder's interest in the guiding territory certificate to a person who qualifies under section 59 (1).

(1.1) If an interest in a guiding territory certificate is not transferred in accordance with subsection (1) after the death of a holder, the deceased holder's interest in the guiding territory certificate is forfeited to the government.

(2) An angling guide licence, including any angler day quota attached to it, is part of the estate of the angling guide and, subject to the regulations, the heirs or administrators of a deceased angling guide may transfer, within 2 years after the angling guide's death, the privileges conferred by the angling guide licence and any angler day quota attached to it.

(3) If an annual fee for a guide outfitter licence or an angling guide licence becomes due in the interval between the death of the licence holder and the date of a transfer under this section, no annual fee is payable.

(4) If privileges conferred by a guide outfitter's certificate or an angling guide licence are not transferred in accordance with this section, the heirs or administrators must surrender the guide outfitter's certificate or the angling guide licence, as the case may be, to the regional manager.

No proprietary rights in wildlife

67 A guiding territory certificate or angling guide's licence does not
(a) give the holder any proprietary rights in wildlife or fish, or
(b) restrict the rights of a resident to hunt or fish.
