Public safety is BC Wildfire's number one priority and is currently being managed, in part, using campfire prohibitions; area closures; and access restrictions around our existing fires that have been identified as having potential to impact the safety of backcountry users. So far this year, the Southeast Fire Center has not confirmed one wildfire caused by an off-road vehicle in the backcountry. The public is also a valuable asset when it comes to reporting new fires in the backcountry. Local seasonal tourism and businesses rely on access to the backcountry and risks to the public is constantly evaluated relative to economic risks and stakeholder concerns when determining acceptable levels of access to the backcountry.

Our first priority is keeping people safe and every British Columbian needs to do his or her part to ensure the safety of their community; however, if conditions are elevated to an unacceptable level, a backcountry restriction will be considered as required.

- We issued an expression of interest in the spring for mass water delivery systems, and had 6 companies reply.
- We tested a large mass water delivery system on the Snowy Mountain, . It was very effective in establishing a wet line and protecting structures. However, at the same time, the equipment can take two to three days to fully set up.
- There are also environmental challenges that need to be considered in setting these systems up. The large volumes of water can cause slides when used on steep terrain and drawdown of water from a lake or river can also impact fish and fish habitat.
- We are currently working to deploy a smaller mass water delivery system within the Babine Complex. We hope to use this smaller system as a tactic to achieve important fireline objectives, and will be evaluating the efficacy of this system during its use.
- The BCWS continues to seek opportunities to deploy mass water delivery systems into active fireline situations and will be

The decision to implement a backcountry restriction is one that is not made lightly. Over the past weekend, portions of both the Regional District of East Kootenay and the Columbia Shuswap Regional District received precipitation, minimizing the risk of significant fire spread for the next several days in those areas. Risks are evaluated daily by the Southeast Fire Centre's experts, using a combination of weather forecasts; fire danger ratings; fuel moisture conditions; fire growth modelling; observed and forecast fire behaviour on local fires; and regional and provincial fire load. Public safety is BC Wildfire's number one priority and is currently being managed, in part, using campfire prohibitions; area closures; and access restrictions around our existing fires that have been identified as having potential to impact the safety of backcountry users. So far this year, the Southeast Fire Center has not confirmed one wildfire caused by an off-road vehicle in the backcountry. The public is also a valuable asset when it comes to reporting new fires in the backcountry. Local seasonal tourism and businesses rely on access to the backcountry and risks to the public is constantly evaluated relative to economic risks and stakeholder concerns when determining acceptable levels of access to the backcountry.

Our first priority is keeping people safe and every British Columbian needs to do his or her part to ensure the safety of their community; however, if conditions are elevated to an unacceptable level, a backcountry restriction will be considered as required.

I would like to thank you for your letter of reply dated Aug 12th, 2016.

Upon review of the letter, the Official Opposition have follow-up questions and urgent requests for the Government of British Columbia to consider.

I appreciate that you and your staff are very busy during this busy fire season. As such, I have itemized items below for ease of response.

Urgent Requests:

On behalf of the MLAs and their impacted constituents the Official Opposition is requesting the Province of BC to act on the following:

- 1. <u>Immediately declare a Provincial State of Emergency.</u> With hot and dry weather expected to continue and a significant number of new fires started in the past week, more support is needed now. Federal resources will be able to supplement first responder activities in the event of mass evacuations; provide heavy machinery assistance to assist with highway closures due to mudslides (hindering potential evacuations on Highways 97, 99 and 1) and provide approximately 100 further firefighters.
- 2. Immediately order the closure of provincial backcountry in the Regional District of East Kootenays and the Columbia Shuswap Regional District. Backcountry activity in the two regions stated above have the potential to spark new wildfires. With zero precipitation in recent weeks and none in the forecast, each additional human-caused fire has the potential to stretch our already limited resources further. The Government of Alberta has closed backcountry activities along the Rockies to mitigate fire activity, I request that the Government of BC do the same.
- 3. Ensure that local MLAs are included in EMBC/provincial calls. MLAs from the Official Opposition are fielding dozens of calls and requests for information from their constituents. It is their job to help their constituents and provide factual, up-to-date information to alleviate anxiety. At this time, most MLAs from the Official Opposition have not been included in calls with provincial representatives.
- 4. Second GCPE staff to high risk/interface fire zones. Local governments are strapped for resources in many circumstances. The Government of British Columbia has, on hand, dozens of public relations specialists that could complement communications activities in emergency situations if they were embedded with local governments during high profile fire events.

Instruct your staff to reassess their procurement strategy for fire services contractors that provide higher volume fire suppression units to protect structures and property. There are BC based companies that have significant resources and expertise to effectively fight these complex and large interface fires and more importantly, with the ability to save structures through the use of mass fire suppression systems. These companies have expressed their interest to support the Province's activities and to-date, have been declined.

Follow-up Questions:

- 6. Could the government provide a breakdown for the following:
 - a) Number of BC Wildfire Service personnel deployed in each fire centre as of August 12, 2018?
 - b) Number of BC Wilde Service personnel actively deployed to fire lines as of August 12, 2018
 - c) Number of contracted firefighters and support staff deployed in each fire centre as of August 12, 2018?
 - d) Number of heavy equipment and aerial support deployed in each fire centre as of August 12, 2018?
 - e) Number of out-of-province and international firefighters currently deployed in the province, or in transit to British Columbia?
 - f) Number of FLNRO or other provincial staff currently assisting the BC Wildfire Service on fire lines as of August 12, 2018?

In closing, I would like to acknowledge the work that you and your colleagues have done throughout this challenging fire season. The Official Opposition is acting in a constructive and proactive manner to support your efforts — so our constituents, dedicated firefighters, first responders and local governments can get through the remainder of the season as safely as possible.

In the urgent interest of public safety I look forward to a response by 5pm on August 13th.

- 6. Could the government provide a breakdown for the following:
 - a) Number of BC Wildfire Service personnel deployed in each fire centre as of August 12, 2018?
 - b) Number of BC Wilde Service personnel actively deployed to fire lines as of August 12, 2018
 - c) Number of contracted firefighters and support staff deployed in each fire centre as of August 12, 2018?
 - d) Number of heavy equipment and aerial support deployed in each fire centre as of August 12, 2018?
 - e) Number of out-of-province and international firefighters currently deployed in the province, or in transit to British Columbia?
 - f) Number of FLNRO or other provincial staff currently assisting the BC Wildfire Service on fire lines as of August 12, 2018?

In closing, I would like to acknowledge the work that you and your colleagues have done throughout this challenging fire season. The Official Opposition is acting in a constructive and proactive manner to support your efforts — so our constituents, dedicated firefighters, first responders and local governments can get through the remainder of the season as safely as possible.

In the urgent interest of public safety I look forward to a response by 5pm on August 13th.
