Here is the Ministry's response regarding s.22 issues.

I will call you as well.

- CEB received a report of violation from s.22 on September 13, 2017.
- The nature of the report was that her property had been damaged as a direct result of a seawall built on the foreshore in front of the neighbouring property.
- The subject seawall was built approximately 23 years ago and is in trespass as it is located on Crown land.
- CEB spoke with s.22 on September 22, 2017, September 28, 2017, and again in January 2018.
- CEB informed s.22 that her complaint had been received, and that the matter was being dealt with according to policy and procedure.
- CEB informed s.22 that she would be contacted if more information was needed but as the allegation was against a third party she will not be updated on the status of the matter.
- CEB provided s.22 with the information she required in order to do works to protect her property. Specifically she will require a *Land Act* authorization to do any works on the Crown Land in front of her property, or alternatively if she wanted to do the protection works on her property, a development permit from the Regional District would be required as a bylaw exists regulating that specific activity.
- No *Land Act* authorisations, nor development permits have been issued to s.22
- Shoreline protection work was done by s.22 in opposition of statutory requirements.

CEB is working with Land Tenures in accordance with the CEB Lands Procedure to resolve the initial complaint.

FLNRORD does not have jurisdiction on private land unless there is an emergency threatening adjacent crown land. Douglas Fir Beetle found naturally throughout the southern interior so this is considered part of the landowner's responsibility to look after trees on their own property. Having trees on your property does come with its own cost depending on whether or not you want to keep them alive or prevent the beetles from spreading to their neighbours property. FLNRORD can provide guidance and information on managing them but would not be is not in the position to provide funding

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1) How much funding is planned for wildlife management and conservation?

In past years, FLNRORD has committed approximately \$19 million to base program areas for wildlife conservation staff and operations. This is in addition to other agencies (e.g., Ministry of Environment Ecosystems and Conservation Officer Service) and the multiple initiatives and funds that are available through partnerships that are directed towards wildlife conservation (e.g., Habitat Conservation Trust Foundation, Forest Enhancement Society, Land Based Investment Strategy). Budgets for the next fiscal year are not confirmed. However, we are committed to improving wildlife management and habitat conservation for the province and a sufficient and sustainable funding model is part of that commitment.

2) The province recently experienced an exceptionally damaging fire season. The Province has restricted access for hunters in several fire affected areas. How much funding is the government committing to the scientific study of post-fire effects on wildlife?

We have reprioritized some of our existing priorities to better understand the impacts of the fire. This information will be used to inform research questions and budgeting decisions

3) Two particular decisions have been made recently, the grizzly bear trophy hunt ban and the restricted access to areas affected by fire.

How much funding has the government committed to educating ministry staff on the importance of committing to science based wildlife and conservation policy decisions as opposed to politically or socially motivated wildlife and conservation policy decisions?

There are no funds specifically dedicated to this subject, however formal training and education, focused on natural resource sciences, is an integral component to the hiring process for staff tasked with wildlife and habitat management. It is important to understand that modern wildlife management must take into consideration social, economic, environmental, and ecological variables and integrate them into the decision making process. Science, including social sciences, is a key, but not sole, component to inform wildlife management decisions.

A broader segment of the public is expressing interest in the management of wildlife in the province,

and a wider range of interests, values, and opinions are being presented; these human dimensions of wildlife management are an important component that cannot be ignored, avoided, or marginalized. As society changes, the value that the public places in wildlife evolves, and wildlife managers must adapt to ensure that wildlife is being managed in the public trust for the benefit of both current and future generations.

4) There are several species of plants and animals in BC that are actually threatened with imminent extinction, and yet these species do not appear in the public conservation. At the same time the grizzly bear, an iconic species that qualifies as charismatic mega fauna, dominates mainstream media and social media. How much funding has the government committed to a public awareness campaign about the serious threats of extinction and extirpation faced by BC species other than grizzly bears?

Government has made the commitment to enact legislation for British Columbia to address species at risk. Ministry staff are working towards this right now.

We will be embarking on public and stakeholder engagement in the New Year to gather input about elements of the future legislation and to raise awareness about species at risk. Legislation will enable species at risk to be specifically identified and listed for the purpose of providing them with legal protection.

Species at risk conservation cannot be achieved solely by legislation; voluntary stewardship programs are also important. The province helps support stewardship through partnerships with others. One example is the Species and Ecosystems at Risk Local Government Working Group. This is a collection of municipal, regional and provincial government workers who collaborate on species and ecosystems issues. This group works to protect species and ecosystems at risk on private and local government lands. Membership now includes over 95 local governments.

5) Many mountain caribou in BC are threatened with extirpation. Very few of these herds are subject to a resident hunt, but many are subject to habitat loss through resource extraction, and a concurrent expansion of competing ungulates and related predators (referred to by scientists as "apparent competition"). The Itcha Ilgachuz herd which resides in the Itcha Ilgachuz Provincial Park has previously been subject to a General Open Season hunt, but as of last year have been changed to a Limited Entry Hunt due to population concerns. This herd and this location is not subject to habitat destruction caused by resource extraction, but is exposed to the threats of apparent competition. How much funding has the government committed to the comparative study of the Itcha Ilgachuz herd and other mountain caribou herds in the province?

The Itcha-Ilgachuz subpopulation is one of the most southerly distributed populations within the distribution of southern mountain caribou. Their 9457 km² range lies in the northwestern Cariboo Region and encompasses the Chilcotin Plateau, the Itcha and Ilgachuz Mountains in the Fraser Plateau ecoregion. This area was heavily impacted by the Mountain Pine Beetle infestation starting in the late 90s resulting in large swathes of mature pine forests being largely dead. Subsequent salvage harvest of these forests has resulted in fragmentation of the landscape which was not typical prior to the MPB. More recently (2017), large wildfires have impacted this landscape as well and the complete effect of these on caribou habitat has not been completely assessed at this point.

The Itcha – Ilgachuz caribou population has been the subject of numerous research projects and monitoring efforts. These started in the late 1980s and have continued to date. Efforts have been focused on population size and composition, habitat use, food availability, and more recently predation effects and predator populations.

Four population surveys have been completed since 2009 (2009, 2010, 2014, 2017) as well as a wolf population survey in 2016. A Master's of Science thesis was written on the population dynamics of the herd. Research has and continues to be conducted into use of MPB impacted forests and the effect of MPB on food availability (lichen)

6) The Chilko River and Thompson River steelhead populations are severely threatened. It is thought that much of the mortality can be attributed to a federally approved chum salmon fishery in which the steelhead are caught as by catch. How much funding has the government committed to the study of this problem, and how much funding has been committed to engage with the

Federal Department of Fisheries and Oceans to resolve this conservation disagreement?

It is believed that the opening of non-selective commercial fisheries for chum in the lower Fraser River is the most immediate short-term threat to the continuing decline of Interior Fraser Steelhead. These commercial fisheries are under the federal responsibility of DFO and until we see a change to more selective based fisheries, steelhead will continue to be threatened.

- The BC government commits the staff time effort to addressing this problem equivalent to \$100,000 per year (Take this out but 210 days @ \$500 per day)
- The BC government does have money set aside for meetings between the province and DFO to discuss this issue and review of data from Albion test fishery to develop escapement predictions (Rob Bison)
- Support is also provided via HCTF & FFSBC to collect stock assessment information including, Steelhead Harvest Questionnaire \$25,000, Thompson River Guardian Program-\$25,000, Chilko Steelhead spawner escapement and Thompson stock assessment-\$76,000

7) Given the extent of unnecessary mortality across many species, but particularly in regard to grizzly bears as a result of highway and railway collisions, how much funding has the government committed to reducing this mortality through scientifically recommend measures such as traffic overpasses, exclusionary fencing and early warning devices?

The Zero Net Deforestation Act did not come into force, nor were any regulations passed to support it.

I have included some information below, in case you want to fill in some additional context and background in the response.. If a more specific question comes back, please let me know. I hope this helps.

- There have been no uplifts in Annual Allowable Cuts as a result of the 2017 fires.
- Existing harvest can be focused on the salvage of fire killed trees.
- All restriction on the land base to protect non-timber values remain in place unless an exemption is provided by government staff as permitted by statute.
- An exemption is provided when harvest and rehabilitation of the wildlife habitat area is considered more beneficial than leaving the area to recover naturally.
