Re: Authorities under the *Forest and Range Practices Act* and Regulations

In respect of your powers and duties under the *Forest and Range Practices Act* and its regulations, it is my expectation that:

Recreation Technicians and the Trails Specialist will only exercise their authority as a recreation officer under the Forest Recreation Regulation as it pertains to sections 8, 12 (2), 14, 15 (1) and (2), and 22 (8) (c).

The Trails Specialist will only exercise their authority as a recreation officer under the Forest Recreation Regulation when working directly with the Manager, Trails, or a Recreation Officer on trails that fall within their recreation district.

The Manager, Trails, will only exercise their authority as a recreation officer under the Forest Recreation Regulation as those powers and duties pertain to trails under their administration.

Recreation Officers will only carry out powers and duties for their assigned recreation district.

When a recreation district's Recreation Officer is unavailable, decisions will be referred to the recreation region's Regional Manager.

If a Recreation Technician is acting in the position of Recreation Officer, a Regional Manager will give written communication confirming the person in the acting position. The written communication will limit statutory authorities through restrictions on the person's general employment duties when appropriate.

Only the Director, Recreation Sites and Trails, Manager, Recreation, and Regional Managers will exercise their authority as a recreation officer under section 20 (5) of the Forest Recreation Regulation when the authorization is to a recreation site operator who is a Recreation Officer.

A Recreation Officer acting as a site operator under section 20 (5) of the Forest Recreation Regulation will ensure the public is informed of the closure, either by posting a notice of the closure at the site or on the Recreation Sites and Trails BC website.

If staff observe non-compliance on a recreation site or trail, they will ensure their safety first prior to deciding what course of action should be taken, whether or not they have the authority to respond.
