**ISSUE: OVERVIEW OF THE CONTRACTOR SUSTAINABILITY REVIEW AND NEXT STEPS** 

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Over the summer and fall of 2016 both forestry contractors and licensees voiced concerns regarding how their existing business relationships, structured under the Bill 13 Contractor Regulation, had been impacting their individual competitiveness. There was a growing sentiment that change was needed to address these issues. The decision was made to undertake a review and George Abbott and Circle Square were hired to facilitate the Contractor Sustainability Review process.

The objective of the Contractor Sustainability Review (Review) process is to bring forestry contractors and licensees together to help identify key issues facing the parties and collaboratively identify opportunities to improve the overall competitiveness of both sub-sectors. The Truck Loggers Association (TLA), Interior Logging Association (ILA), North West Logging Association (NWLA), the former Coast Forest Products Association (CFPA) and the Council of Forest Industries (COFI) have all supported the process moving forward.

The Review was designed around 3 phases: Phase 1 would develop an economic assessment and review of the contracting sector in order to identify the key economic drivers for the logging contractors. Phase 2 would undertake a verification of the Phase 1 findings and examine the value chain of the BC forest sector to identify how logging contractors and licensees' businesses interact. The third phase, which would run concurrently with the Phase 2, would utilize facilitated discussions with logging contractors and licensees to understand their respective concerns and develop workable solutions to the issues that were identified. The facilitator would utilize the information developed from the first and second phases to help explore workable solutions and develop a series of proposals designed to improve the overall competitiveness of both logging contractors and licensees.

The objective of Phase 1 was to develop a sound baseline understanding of the financial characteristics and the key economic drivers of the contracting sector. PNL Consulting Inc. (PNL) of Prince George was hired to undertake the review. Funding for the Phase 1 review was jointly provided by the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development (FLNRO) the TLA, ILA and NWLA.

The final report identified 13 recommendations that range from making better use of technology, improving communications, better information-sharing, to ensuring best practices for setting contractors rates of pay and dispute-resolution mechanisms.

The full report has not been publicly released however the contractor and licensee Associations under a strict non-disclosure agreement were allowed to review the full report. A summary of 13 recommendations was released in the Minister's announcement on May 17, 2018 and is provided in Appendix 1.

Although the Abbott report provided a range of options the report was not tasked with developing an implementation plan. A final facilitated phase is required to develop a joint implementation approach for the Minister's consideration.

# **Next Steps in the Contractor Sustainability Review**

Dan Miller, former BC Premier and MLA, has been hired to bring the contractor and licensee associations together to develop a joint implementation plan agreeable to all parties.

The role of the Independent Third Party Facilitator is to take *what* was recommended and determine *how* to implement the recommendations. The facilitation process will be critical in helping to explore the relationships between recommendations and identify potential impacts.

The final facilitation stage will be held with Associations only in order to remove the potential for company specific influences and interests in establishing the joint implementation plan.

The facilitator will individually and collectively work with the Associations to:

- 1) outline the recommendations and define the technical/operational components of each recommendation;
- 2) outline the linkages or structure among the recommendations from planning through proposed models and conflict resolution;
- 3) develop an agreed to set of tasks, steps, timelines and any other technical requirements that would be necessary to implement the recommendations; and
- 4) establish a set of milestones to achieve in a timely manner. A "timely manner" would be a definable term of the facilitated process.
- 5) where consensus is not achieved identify the differences and range of potential impacts.

An initial round of separate meetings with each of the Associations are being arranged for the week of August 13<sup>th</sup>. The purpose of the meetings is for the facilitator to listen to and discuss the perspectives of the individual Associations prior to holding group sessions. Group meetings will continue into September 2018.

Timelines - complete the facilitation process by the end of September and develop a joint implementation proposal for the Minister's consideration by mid-October 2018.

Teal-Jones has curtailed all harvesting operations on the BC Coast due to weak lumber markets and the high cost of fibre. The shutdown is effective immediately and includes Teal's Fraser Valley and its Honeymoon Bay – TFL46 operations.

Weak North American and global lumber demand has resulted in persistently weak lumber prices in 2019. As a vertically integrated producer of lumber and other wood products, Teal-Jones' economics have been further negatively impacted by high stumpage rates and higher harvesting costs on the BC Coast. Teal-Jones has curtailed all harvesting operations on the BC Coast due to weak lumber markets and the high cost of fibre. The shutdown is effective immediately and includes Teal's Fraser Valley and its Honeymoon Bay – TFL46 operations.

Weak North American and global lumber demand has resulted in persistently weak lumber prices in 2019. As a vertically integrated producer of lumber and other wood products, Teal-Jones' economics have been further negatively impacted by high stumpage rates and higher harvesting costs on the BC Coast. Current stumpage rates remain high relative to lumber prices, and harvesting costs have been adversely impacted by new regulations to bring out more residual waste fibre. These negative factors have made it impossible for the company to continue operating its forest licenses economically.

The curtailment will result in substantial loss of employment for the company's forestry employees and contractors. In addition, the reduction of fibre flowing to Teal's milling operations will result in downtime and lost wages at the company's lumber, shake and shingle mills in Surrey, BC.

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# FFT Update

**Issue:** Reforestation – Forests For Tomorrow (FFT) Program **Key Facts Regarding Issue:** 

The Forests for Tomorrow (FFT) program is a longstanding government funded program that contributes to reforestation, carbon sequestration, wildfire recovery and Mountain Pine Beetle (and other forest pests) recovery. FFT is a significant contributor to reliable employment in rural areas. FFT is in partnership with the provincial Forest Carbon Initiative and the Federal Low Carbon Economy Leadership Fund which also contribute millions onto the BC forested landscape.

**Purpose**: FFT was established by the Province of British Columbia in 2005 to respond to natural disasters impacting the forests. The initial focus was on mitigating impacts resulting from catastrophic wildfires that occurred in the southern and central interior, and impacts from the mountain pine beetle epidemic.

**Funding**. From 2005 to 2010, FFT received funding through two sources: the Forest Investment Account and a specific FFT fund. The funding was amalgamated in 2010 under the FFT program. Additional funding for resource investments was added, resulting in the FFT program being the primary program under the Land Based Investment Strategy (LBIS). In 2017 it is approximately \$48m of the \$74.8m total LBIS.

**Program**: FFT only applies to forests that are under Crown responsibility; no FFT investments can be made on lands that Forest Licensees are responsible for. The FFT program is divided into three categories: Current Reforestation, Timber-Supply Mitigation, and the *Forest and Range Practices Act* (FRPA) Section108 program.

<u>Current Reforestation</u>. Investments are aimed at re-establishing young forests, with the goal of mitigating risks to other forest values and improving future timber supply.

- In 2017/18, FFT planted over 27 million tree seedlings.
- In 2018/19 and 2019/2020, FFT will continue with an annual planting program of 25 million trees.

<u>Timber Supply Mitigation</u>. Investments in this category are focused on managing existing forests with stand-tending activities such as fertilization, brushing, and spacing.

- These activities can improve timber volume and production, which is key to balancing economic impacts that result from setting forested areas aside for non-timber values.
- FFT will fertilize approximately 20,000 hectares (ha) in 2017/18, and 17,000 ha in 2018/19. The program will coordinate the delivery of additional fertilization activities funded through the Forest Carbon Initiative (FCI).

<u>FRPA s108</u>. This program reinstates forests on plantations and second growth areas that have suffered damage during a catastrophic natural event such as a wildfire.

• In 2016 Section108 funds planted almost 3,000 ha of burnt plantations bringing the total treated since inception to 28,000 ha. 2017 and 2018 has seen

unprecedented amounts of wildfire and resulted in over 125,000 ha of burnt plantations which will need to be surveyed for replanting.

# Advice and Recommended Response:

Who plants seedlings in BC? The forest industry delivers approximately 65 – 75 percent of the total seedlings planted; the BCTS program plants approximately 10 – 15 percent of the total; and the remaining 10 – 15 percent is primarily delivered through government programs including FFT and FCI Programs. Recent investments in reforestation through the Forest Enhancement Society of BC (FESBC) and the Forest Carbon Initiative are expected to increase these reforestation numbers in the future.

### How many seedlings are planted?

The table below identifies the number of trees planted in the province from 2017- 2019, with 2020 being a projection based on last years sowing request.

The Province's overall reforestation program, which began in the 1930's, has now planted over 8.5 billion trees.

**Carbon sequestration**. BC Forests have traditionally been a carbon sink, but with natural disturbance and forestry; BC's forests are now in a state of flux between sink and source. Managing wildfire and Reforestation is key to returning the forests to being a regular carbon sink. For every one million trees planted approximately 125,000 tonnes of CO2 is stored (site index 18 Pli age 62 harvest age).

**Jobs**. FFT mitigates the impacts of the MPB and wildfire through restoring new forests and accelerating the growth of existing forests. FFT activities create immediate and long term employment opportunities, predominantly in rural communities.

**Program Delivery.** The FFT program is delivered across the Province. Provincial oversight and responsibility rests with the Office of the Chief Forester's Resource Practices Branch, while operational implementation is largely delivered by Regional

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Operations and BC Timber Sales. However, FFT also relies on a cross section of major licensees, small tenure holders, First Nations and consultants, particularily silviculture contractors to enable projects to be completed.

**Worker Safety.** Worker safety is non-negotiable. The FFT program works with the BC Forest Safety Council and WorkSafe BC to ensure worker safety is a priority.

# Recommend Response:

- To reforest the areas harvested throughout the province each year, an average
  of about 210 million trees per year are planted, while about 20 percent of the
  area regenerates naturally.
- In addition, naturally disturbed areas (wildfires, insects and disease) that have no legal reforestation obligations are reforested by several government programs including Forests for Tomorrow (FFT), Forest Enhancement Society of BC (FESBC), and the Forest Carbon Initiative (FCI).
- In the 2018 planting season, approximately 253 million seedlings were planted across the province. This is anticipated to increase to 265 million trees in 2019.
- There will be a substantial increase in 2020 when planting levels will exceed 300 million trees. The long-term goals are presently being evaluated to determine what level of planting can be sustained.

# Key Facts:

- The Timber Harvesting Land Base (THLB) is the portion of the Crown Land which is available for harvesting in contrast to parks and protected areas where no timber harvesting is allowed. The area of THLB harvested throughout the province's Crown Land is fairly constant from year-to-year and in 2017/18 it was 170,000 hectares (ha). This is less than 0.4 percent of the forested land in BC and less than 1 percent of the THLB.
- The 2017 and 2018, wildfire seasons have impacted over 1 million ha in the THLB. Including area previously impacted by Mountain Pine Beetle, there is now up to 2 million ha that needs to be surveyed to determine the actual amount of area not sufficiently restocked that will require planting.
- The Minister's mandate letter commits to "renew our forests by expanding investments in reforestation". The expanded investment will focus on areas of Crown land that have experienced large-scale natural disturbances, such as wildfires and insect outbreaks.

#### **Basic Reforestation**

- BC's forest legislation requires all harvested areas to be reforested. To reforest
  the areas harvested each year, an average of about 210 million trees per year
  are planted across the province, while about 20 percent of the area regenerates
  naturally.
- Natural regeneration is generally used in stands that are known to seed profusely such as lodgepole pine and Western hemlock. It is also used where partial harvesting retains overstory trees for shade and seed supply.

# **Reforestation Update**

# Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development

#### Forests for Tomorrow

- In 2005, the province established the Forests for Tomorrow (FFT) Program in response to the Mountain Pine Beetle epidemic and wildfires.
- FFT planted 25 million trees in 2019 and will plant 23 million in 2020 on a mixture of Mountain Pine beetle rehab sites and on wildfires.

#### Section 108

Section 108 of the Forest and Range Practice Act (FRPA) requires the
government to either relieve the licensee of their obligation or to pay them to
return the plantations to their pre-fire condition. The 2017 and 2018 fires have
impacted an area of approximately 190,000 ha of licensee silviculture obligation.
The actual liability will be determined by thorough field surveys which started in
the 2018 field season. It is anticipated that reforestation will take 5-10 years and
require about 150 million trees.

# Forest Carbon Initiative (FCI) and the Low Carbon Economy Fund (LCELF)

- FCI is aimed at sequestering carbon and reducing greenhouse gas emissions in BC through a range of forest management activities including: rehabilitation, fertilization and improved fibre utilization.
- FCI will be implemented through a combination of service delivery partners. In 2019, FCI planted 11 million trees while planning is underway to plant 25 million seedlings in 2020 and over 30 million in 2021.

#### Forest Enhancement Society of BC

- FESBC is carrying out a mix of forest rehabilitation and improved utilization projects across BC which will include some reforestation work
- In fall 2019, they expect to order over 3 million seedlings for planting in spring 2021.

#### Summary

- In the 2018 planting season, an estimated 253 million seedlings were planted.
   This is expected to increase to 265 million in 2019 with some input from the FCI.
- Planting will increase substantially in 2020 to over 300 million trees with a fully implemented FCI program and activities funded through Section 108.
- Long term planting levels are being evaluated to determine what is sustainable moving forward.

Congratulations on your appointment as the Parliamentary Secretary for the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development.

The Village of Port Alice council has read the media articles regarding your intent to travel to the Interior of BC and meet with communities who are being effected by recent mill closures.

The Village Council would like to remind you that Coastal BC communities have also been affected by mill closures. In particular the Neucel Specialty Cellulose Ltd mill went into curtailment in 2015 and sent home their last few workers in February of this year. Neucel has not paid their property taxes for 2018 and 2019 and currently owe the Village of Port Alice \$1,789,000. For a small community whose annual budget averages \$1,000,000 this is indeed a financial emergency.

The curtailment and subsequent closure has reduced the population Port Alice by 19%. Families have been split up as workers have found jobs in Alberta and now commute between two provinces. There are still laid off workers who have been unable to find employment elsewhere.

Local businesses have closed their doors including the hotel, coffee shop and restaurant. The only bank is leaving the community on October.

The Village of Port Alice Council would like to invite you to visit our community and see for yourself the challenges we are now facing and that we need as much support as the communities whose mills have recently closed.

Congratulations on your appointment as the Parliamentary Secretary for the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development.

The Village of Port Alice council has read the media articles regarding your intent to travel to the Interior of BC and meet with communities who are being effected by recent mill closures.

The Village Council would like to remind you that Coastal BC communities have also been affected by mill closures. In particular the Neucel Specialty Cellulose Ltd mill went into curtailment in 2015 and sent home their last few workers in February of this year. Neucel has not paid their property taxes for 2018 and 2019 and currently owe the Village of Port Alice \$1,789,000. For a small community whose annual budget averages \$1,000,000 this is indeed a financial emergency.

The curtailment and subsequent closure has reduced the population Port Alice by 19%. Families have been split up as workers have found jobs in Alberta and now commute between two provinces. There are still laid off workers who have been unable to find employment elsewhere.

Local businesses have closed their doors including the hotel, coffee shop and restaurant. The only bank is leaving the community on October.

The Village of Port Alice Council would like to invite you to visit our community and see for yourself the challenges we are now facing and that we need as much support as the communities whose mills have recently closed.

- Good morning, everybody,
- Respectfully, I want to acknowledge that we are on the traditional territory of the Lheidli T'enneh (clayt-clay den-ay) First Nations.
- All of you here today are unfortunately all to aware of the challenges facing our forestry sector.
- Those industry challenges have resulted in job losses for many workers in communities throughout the Interior.
- Our government has consistently said we are committed to supporting you and other Interior forestry workers dealing with job losses.
- Today, I'm here to let you know what that support looks like.
- We recognize the urgency of the situation, so our government is making more than \$69 million available to implement a new approach to worker, contractor and community transition.
- To do this, we are realigning our worker and community support programs and establishing capacity to ensure that workers like you have access to the services you need, from training to work placement to early retirement.
- Our new approach includes (1) job placement coordination, (2) cost shared support for incremental early retirement opportunities, (3) short-term work opportunity creation, (4) enhanced worker training and mental health support and (5) transition funding for communities to provide services to workers.

#### **Job Placement Coordination:**

 We have allocated \$2 million for a B.C. Interior Forest Industry Placement Coordination Office, which will:

- Provide fair and equitable treatment of workers impacted by permanent and indefinite closures, with a focus on individual worker needs and circumstances.
- Facilitate placement opportunities within and outside the forest sector.
- Ensure that workers are receiving needed support services ranging from employee and family assistance programs delivered by your companies, tuition support for training programs, job search assistance and support for resume-writing services where needed.
- We are also calling on the federal government to add to the available funding, to make it accessible to more workers.

#### **Early Retirement Bridging**

- We have allocated \$40 million over two years toward a B.C. Interior Forest Industry Adjustment Program.
- Based on the early retirement coverage your employers are offering, our government will establish an early retirement bridging opportunity program for age-eligible workers impacted by a permanent or indefinite mill closure or for age-eligible workers whose position could be filled by an impacted worker from another facility.

#### **Short-Term Work Opportunity Creation**

- We are providing \$15 million to establish a new short-term forest employment program, focused on fire prevention and community resiliency projects.
- My ministry is prioritizing forest enhancement and wildfire prevention initiatives that can offer interim employment for impacted workers and contractors.

#### **Enhanced Worker Training and Mental Health Support**

 A further \$12 million will be used to fund new worker training, and enhanced community mental health support programs.

#### **Support for Communities**

- We are also providing municipalities with funding to assist workers, families and businesses impacted by change.
- Municipalities impacted by a permanent closure will be eligible to receive immediate funds of \$100,000 and municipalities responding to a publicly-announced indefinite closure will be eligible to receive funds of \$75,000, where more than 1/3 of the workforce remains in need of permanent or temporary employment.
- Municipalities responding to a shift reduction will have access to a pool of funding to provide defined services for workers and families, based on identified need.
- Additional funding will be available, including through the \$10 million Labour Market Partnerships Fund which helps municipalities transition to new economic opportunities and the Cooperative Marketing Funding Program for communities looking to further develop the tourism industry.

#### WHAT WE'RE ASKING INDUSTRY TO DO

- We are asking industry to stand with us and step up to support the worker programming I've outlined here. We want industry to be partners in this.
- Company approaches to closures and curtailments have varied, and we need to work together to create a uniform, fair and organized response those impacted by closures.
- I'm standing here today and asking all Interior forest companies to step up and throw your support behind these initiatives.

#### Government outlines new forest worker support programs

VICTORIA –The provincial government has announced \$69 million to fund a new series of measures aimed at supporting British Columbia forest workers impacted by mill closures and shift reductions in several B.C. Interior communities. The Interior forest industry has been reducing production in an effort to adjust to the end of the mountain pine beetle harvest and the devastating 2017 and 2018 fire seasons.

"The previous government knew that the end of mountain pine beetle harvest would disrupt the lives of forest workers, contractors and communities, but they did little to prepare for this inevitable transition," said Premier John Horgan. "While the forest sector must reduce surplus milling capacity to remain competitive, it cannot do so at the expense of the workers who built the industry. Our government will ensure that forests workers impacted by mill closures are supported."

Horgan and Doug Donaldson, Minister of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development met with the chief executive officers of the major Interior forest companies to set out measures to support forest workers in the months and years ahead. Those measures include:

- \$40 million to establish a new cost-shared, early-retirement bridging program for older forest workers;
- \$15 million to establish a new short-term forest employment program, focused on fire prevention and community resiliency projects;
- \$12 million to fund new worker training, and enhanced community mental health support programs;
- \$2 million to establish a new job placement co-ordination office that will track the transition and employment of impacted forest workers on an individual basis; and
- Community support grants aimed at providing short-term assistance to communities more profoundly impacted by the closure of a major forest employer.

"The Province is committed to supporting the people impacted by this change, but we need the forest industry and the federal government to step up and do their part as well," said Donaldson. "I'm hopeful that the Interior forest sector recognizes that the new industry that will arise from this transition will need skilled, experienced workers to produce new forest products that can compete in global markets."

Donaldson called on the forest industry to increase supports for impacted workers, ensure key corporate leaders are working on the industry transition and ensure that it does a better job of communicating effectively with impacted workers and communities.

# **Objective:**

To ensure British Columbians, especially those in forest dependent communities, are aware of the \$69 million the provincial government is providing to support mill workers and contractors impacted by mill closures/curtailments.

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It is proposed that Minister Donaldson and Minister Bains announce the new programs with Parliamentary Secretary Ravi Kahlon.

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- There have been four permanent mill closures.
- More than 4,000 workers are currently affected across 23 communities

Mill closures and curtailments are primarily the result of impacts to timber supply as a result of the Mountain Pine Beetle (MPB) and related fire losses. The MPB outbreak in B.C. began in the early 2000's with impacts peaking in 2005. By 2012, MPB had killed 53% of merchantable pine forests in the B.C. Interior.

British Columbia's forest industry is facing difficult times. In the Interior, the end of the pine beetle cut, lower prices for lumber, and back-to-back catastrophic wildfire seasons have led to a number of sawmill closures. This has created hardship for workers and uncertainty for the

communities that depend on forestry for their livelihoods.

For more than a decade, industry experts predicted the mountain pine beetle epidemic would result in multiple mill closures. Despite this, the previous government failed to take the necessary action to help workers, industry and communities adapt. This failure to act has compounded the difficulties forest workers and communities are facing today.

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The approach will consist of pro-active/ reactive communications, stakeholder outreach, and issues management supported by earned media

# Funding to Support Mill Workers Impacted by Permanent and Indefinite Mill Closures Q & A Sept. 17, 2019 DRAFT

#### **Funding General:**

## 1. Is this new funding?

- We are reallocating funding from other areas to ensure urgently needed supports are in place for impacted workers and their families. Our government will ensure that forests workers impacted by mill closures are supported.
- 2. Why are you making this funding available to forestry workers when you haven't provided supports to workers in other sectors that have similarly faced job losses?
  - There has not been another industry in British Columbia where significant job loss of this nature has been experienced.
  - Job loss in the forest sector is unique, as forestry is the main source of employment for many Interior communities.
  - Given the scope of this issues, I'd really like to see additional support from the federal government. Earlier this year, the feds were quick to respond with support for aluminum and steel workers. B.C.'s Interior forestry sector needs that kind of federal response and the workers and their families need it now.
  - We appreciate the measures the federal government announced in 2017 as part of its Softwood Lumber Action Plan, but more needs to be done.

#### **Who Qualifies:**

- 3. What are the eligibility criteria for workers and contractors to access the funding?
  - Eligibility criteria and information about the application process will be made available to workers and companies next week
- 4. Will downstream businesses and workers that are indirectly impacted by permanent and indefinite mill closures, suppliers, etc., qualify for any of the funding?
  - The program will be available to eligible applicants that have been actively employed in the forest industry. This support will allow these workers to remain in the communities where live, reducing potential economic impacts to other businesses in their communities.
- 5. How many Interior forestry workers and are impacted?
  - We're currently looking at approximately 497 workers in 3 interior communities that have been impacted by permanent closure, 2547 workers in 13 interior communities

that have been impacted by indefinite curtailments or shift reductions, and 728 more that have experienced (are experiencing) some impact resulting from temporary curtailments.

 I should note, that of the indefinite curtailment numbers, 970 of the 2547 workers are being impacted indefinitely starting in the future (middle of September) and not impacted today.

#### **Early Retirement Bridging:**

- 6. Government is providing \$40 million to establish a new cost-shared early retirement bridging program. How much is industry providing for this program?
  - The split between government and industry contributions will vary from individual to
    individual as there are numerous factors that must be considered on a case by case
    basis. As there are multiple companies involved, it is not possible at this time to
    determine how much industry as a whole is providing. Industry and government are
    committed to working together to make the program as seamless as possible in
    providing support to workers.
- 7. Do you have a number for how many of the impacted forestry workers and contractors qualify for early-retirement bridging?
  - It's too early to say. Over the coming weeks we will work with the companies to get a
    better picture of how many employees may qualify.

#### Job Placement:

- 8. Will the new job placement coordination office be part of the WorkBC offices or will it be a stand-alone entity?
  - The job placement coordination office will be a standalone entity within the Ministry of Labour, but will align and coordinate with the programs and services provided by WorkBC. The job placement coordination office will have dedicated resources to support interior forest workers that are currently impacted, whereas WorkBC services could provide additional support where needed.

#### **Support for Communities:**

- 9. Given that a number of the mill closures are permanent, what are you doing to support impacted workers and communities over the long-term?
  - Funding is in place to provide community support grants aimed at providing short-term assistance to communities more profoundly impacted by the closure of a major forest employer.
  - Earlier this year, I asked industry, labour, Indigenous and non-Indigenous community leaders to work together to develop a new vision for the Interior forest industry at the regional level.
  - This is not a Victoria-imposed solution. It is a locally-developed vision for the future based on local timber supply areas.
  - Government will support communities and workers to find their place in the future of
    the forest industry. Value-added wood products are the future of B.C.'s forest industry.
    This period is difficult as the industry undergoes transition, but this is a time of
    transition as the industry moves towards generating higher-value, instead of highervolume production. We are moving ahead with taller wood building construction, and
    we're going to do more to encourage local companies, municipalities and Indigenous
    Nations to use engineered wood products for their projects.
  - The industry has renewed itself in the face of challenges before and will do so again.
     Together we can build a forest industry that creates thousands of good-paying jobs for local workers and Indigenous Nations and supports communities for generations to come.
  - Change is never easy. There are no quick fixes. If we're going to find solutions that work for everyone, we need to roll up our sleeves and face up to the challenges together.

<u>Event Context</u>: Government is providing \$69 million to support mill workers and contractors impacted by permanent and indefinite mill closures in the B.C. interior. The funds are aimed at addressing short-term challenges faced by impacted workers and the supports include:

- \$2M for a new job placement coordination office that will track the transition of and assist the re-employment of impacted forest workers on an individual basis;
- \$40M for a cost-shared early-retirement bridging program for older forest workers;
- \$15M for a short-term forest employment program focussed on fire prevention and community resiliency projects;
- \$10M for worker training and community mental health support programs; and
- Community support grants aimed at providing short term assistance to communities more profoundly impacted by the closure of a major forest employer.

### Mill Closure/Curtailment Summary

- Currently, there are 24 mills that have adjusted their output through indefinite or temporary curtailments and shift reductions.
- There have been four permanent mill closures.
- More than 6,000 workers are being affected across 23 communities.

Mill closures and curtailments are primarily the result of impacts to timber supply as a result of the Mountain Pine Beetle (MPB) and related fire losses. The MPB outbreak in B.C. began in the early 2000's with impacts peaking in 2005. By 2012, MPB had killed 53% of merchantable pine forests in the B.C. Interior.

British Columbia's forest industry is facing difficult times. In the Interior, the end of the pine beetle cut, lower prices for lumber, and back-to-back catastrophic wildfire seasons have led to a number of sawmill closures. This has created hardship for workers and uncertainty for the communities that depend on forestry for their livelihoods.

For more than a decade, industry experts predicted the mountain pine beetle epidemic would result in multiple mill closures. Despite this, the previous government failed to take the necessary action to help workers, industry and communities adapt. This failure to act has compounded the difficulties forest workers and communities are facing today.

### P.G. Mayor Lyn Hall (TBD)

Mayor Lyn Hall has been an active member of the Prince George community for over 30 years. He and his wife Lorrelle are the parents of twin daughters, both of whom graduated from UNBC.

Hall began his political career as a School Trustee on the Prince George School Board. He spent 10 years on the board holding various positions including vice-chair and chair. In 2011, he ran and won a seat on Prince George City Council. In 2014 and 2018, he ran successful campaigns for Mayor of Prince George.



### Mackenzie Mayor Joan Atkinson (TBD)

Joan moved to Mackenzie with her husband Jim and two sons in 1997; both sons and her husband work in the local forest industry. She professes to recognize the importance of maintaining a strong forest economy, said publicly that she is concerned with the current provincial forest model that puts her community's forest future at risk due to fibre supply and says her community is in crisis after three wood products operations closed in Mackenzie.

Joan, once recognized as Volunteer of the Year in her community, was acclaimed as mayor in 2018, but has been a member of council since 2007.



### West Fraser CEO Ray Ferris (TBD)

Ray is a professional engineer and holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Engineering from the University of New Brunswick. He assumed the role of Pres/CEO of West Fraser as of July 1, 2019. Ray joined the company in 1997 and has served in several executive positions since on both the Alberta and B.C. operations.

West Fraser has more than 50 locations throughout B.C. and Alberta in Canada, and in Texas, Arkansas, Louisiana, Tennessee, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Alabama and Florida in the United States. B.C.'s operations currently account for 34 per cent of the company's total lumber capacity – 7.2 billion board feet – with Alberta supplying 23 per cent and the USA 43 per cent.

### **SPEAKING NOTES**

- Thank you Mayor Hall.
- I want to begin by saying that behind every productive business and viable industry, in fact, driving their success and sustainability...
- Is a workforce that is also, at the same time, contributing to the social fabric of their communities...
  - Workers who coach hockey and lead girl guides or boy scouts;
  - Or that serve on school committees and volunteer in local service clubs like the Rotary.
- And let's not forget, it's workers that built B.C.'s forestry sector...
- That built an industry that has fueled our economy for decades.
- And now it's these same forestry workers who are suffering in the wake of historic job losses, particularly in B.C.'s Interior.
- Our communities, B.C. businesses and their workers are strong and resilient, innovative and industrious...
- But even still, they need a helping-hand sometimes.
  - And that's what today's announcement is about...
  - o It's about working with industry to provide a helping-hand.
- Because when an industry like forestry takes a downturn, family supporting jobs and wages become threatened.
- And in turn, communities like Prince George, Mackenzie and so many others with deep roots in forestry, also suffer.
  - Young workers need family supporting wages to make ends meet or they leave to find work elsewhere.

- Today's announcement helps prevent the hollowing-out of rural communities hardest hit by the curtailments and closings.
  - It supports impacted workers, their families and the communities that are their home.
  - It helps provide incentives for early retirement so that we can retain workers with a long career still ahead of them.
  - And it provides training, job placement assistance and mental health supports for those reeling from job losses.
- Because our government believes that our purpose is to make life better and easier for people in the province.
- And because it's not lost on us that forestry is an important economic driver in B.C. and our industry is in crisis.
  - That log costs and market conditions...
  - Trade sanctions and timber supply issues caused by things like wildfires and beetle infestations...
  - Has led to market uncertainty and instability...
  - As well as operational <u>slow</u>-downs and <u>shut</u>-downs...
  - And they are having real, tangible and personal impacts.
- It matters.
  - It matters to those working or benefiting from the forestry sector – and let's be clear – that's all of us in B.C.
  - This is not just a rural problem, it's merely where the impacts are most often, or most profoundly seen.

- I'm glad mayors like Lyn and Joan are here (TBC), because they see the direct impacts on friends and neighbours in their communities.
- And perhaps nowhere is it more greatly felt or recognized than in Joan's own family, since her husband and sons work in forestry.
- Let me add that I'm happy to be part of something that even the B.C. Council of Forest Industries president said is needed:
  - A systematic, collaborative approach to the industry's transition by industry, government, First Nations, communities and workers combined.
- And since Ray is here today (TBC), I'd like to say that I'm grateful too for the support of industry leaders like West Fraser.
  - He once said that their past and future success is built on the strengths of their people and that together, they're driven to deliver a better today than yesterday as a company.
- Lastly, I'd like to offer thanks to my cabinet colleague for allowing me to aid in his forest worker support plan; it is important work.
- I know Minister Donaldson shares my concern for the health and prosperity of the industry and its workers...
- Because like me, he has first-hand working experience in forestry.

- And maybe it's because of my forestry roots or that I began my career in sawmills, that I feel so proud of today's announcement...
  - But today we outlined how we'll help workers continue to participate and be proud of their forestry jobs;
  - And when they can't work, providing additional supports to help them get back on their feet and back to work;
  - So that like me, while working in a mill, they too can build a good and stable life, family and future in this province.
- Be assured that while standing up here, we're also standing along side our forest industry partners and shoulder-to-shoulder with the people working in forest industries who are worried or have been impacted by mill closures or curtailments.
- We understand how important these jobs are to you...
- To your families, your communities and to the province.
- They're important to us too.

- Good morning, everybody, and thank you Mayor Hall.
- Respectfully, I want to acknowledge that we are on the traditional territory of the Lheidli T'enneh (clayt-clay den-ay) First Nations.
- All of you here today are unfortunately all to aware of the challenges facing our Interior forestry sector.
- Those industry challenges have resulted in job losses for many workers in communities throughout the Interior.
- Our government has consistently said we are committed to supporting you and other Interior forestry workers dealing with job losses.
- Today, I'm here to let you know what that support looks like.
- We recognize the urgency of the situation, so our government is making more than \$69 million available to implement a new approach to worker, contractor and community transition.
- To do this, we are realigning our worker and community support programs and establishing capacity to ensure that workers like you have access to the services you need, from training to work placement to early retirement.
- Our new approach includes (1) job placement coordination, (2) cost shared support for incremental early retirement opportunities, (3) short-term work opportunity creation, (4) enhanced worker training and mental health support and (5) transition funding for communities to provide services to workers.
- This is for Interior forestry sector only, not the coastal sector.
- We are aware of the situation on the coast and are watching it closely, but for the time being these supports are for Interior mill workers only.

### Job Placement Coordination:

- We have allocated \$2 million for a B.C. Interior Forest Industry Placement Coordination Office, which will:
- Provide fair and equitable treatment of workers impacted by permanent and indefinite closures, with a focus on individual worker needs and circumstances.
- Facilitate placement opportunities within and outside the forest sector.
- Ensure that workers are receiving needed support services ranging from employee and family assistance programs delivered by your companies, tuition support for training programs, job search assistance and support for resume-writing services where needed.
- We are also calling on the federal government to add to the available funding, to make it accessible to more workers.

### **Early Retirement Bridging**

- We have allocated \$40 million over two years toward a B.C. Interior Forest Industry Adjustment Program.
- Based on the early retirement coverage your employers are offering, our government will establish an early retirement bridging opportunity program for age-eligible workers impacted by a permanent or indefinite mill closure or for age-eligible workers whose position could be filled by an impacted worker from another facility.

### **Short-Term Work Opportunity Creation**

- We are providing \$15 million to establish a new short-term forest employment program, focused on fire prevention and community resiliency projects.
- My ministry is prioritizing forest enhancement and wildfire prevention initiatives that can offer interim employment for impacted workers and contractors.

### **Enhanced Worker Training and Mental Health Support**

 A further \$12 million will be used to fund new worker training, and enhanced community mental health support programs.

### **Support for Communities**

- We are also providing municipalities with funding to assist workers, families and businesses impacted by change.
- Municipalities impacted by a permanent closure will be eligible to receive immediate funds of \$100,000 and municipalities responding to a publicly-announced indefinite closure will be eligible to receive funds of \$75,000, where more than 1/3 of the workforce remains in need of permanent or temporary employment.
- Municipalities responding to a shift reduction will have access to a pool of funding to provide defined services for workers and families, based on identified need.
- Additional funding will be available, including through the \$10 million Labour Market Partnerships Fund which helps municipalities transition to new economic opportunities and the Cooperative Marketing Funding Program for communities looking to further develop the tourism industry.

### WHAT WE'RE ASKING INDUSTRY TO DO

- We are asking industry to stand with us and step up to support the worker programming I've outlined here. We want industry to be partners in this.
- Company approaches to closures and curtailments have varied, and we need to work together to create a uniform, fair and organized response those impacted by closures.
- I'm standing here today and asking all Interior forest companies to step up and throw your support behind these initiatives.

- This is about doing the right thing for your employees through whose hard work your companies saw record profits they were there for you, now it's your turn to be there for them.
- Our government is committed to supporting the people impacted by this change, but we need to forest industry and the federal government to step-up and do their part as well.

#### Media Outreach:

Media outreach will focus primarily on regional outlets in communities affected by mill closures, curtailments and shift reductions. However, provincial outreach will also be made to the press gallery via the radio room, select outlets (CKNW) and radio talk shows (CBC, CHNL). We will be looking to proactively book MDD on various B.C. talk shows post-event from noon of Sept. 17 until noon of Sept. 18 (to be extended to print as well). Media will be invited to attend the event and call-arounds will be done to drum up the maximum amount of media attendance followed by targeted media outreach.

### **Announcement Summary:**

The provincial government is announcing \$69 million to fund a series of measures that will support British Columbia forest workers impacted by mill closures and shift reductions in B.C. communities. The funds are aimed at addressing short-term challenges faced by impacted workers/contractors and include:

- \$40 million to establish a new cost-shared early-retirement bridging program for older forest workers:
- \$15 million to establish a new short-term forest employment program, focused on fire prevention and community resiliency projects;
- \$12 million to fund new worker training, and enhanced community mental health support programs;
   and
- \$2 million to establish a new job placement co-ordination office that will track the transition and employment of impacted forest workers on an individual basis.

The announcement is being made by Ministers Donaldson and Bains, with support from Parliamentary Secretary for Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development Ravi Kahlon at CN Rail's Intermodal Terminal in Prince George.

#### Mill Closure/Curtailment Summary

- Currently there are **24 mills** that have adjusted their output through indefinite or temporary curtailments and shift reductions.
- There have been four permanent mill closures.
- More than 4,000 workers are currently affected across 23 communities

Mill closures and curtailments are primarily the result of impacts to timber supply as a result of the Mountain Pine Beetle (MPB) and related fire losses. The MPB outbreak in B.C. began in the early 2000's with impacts peaking in 2005. By 2012, MPB had killed 53% of merchantable pine forests in the B.C. Interior.

British Columbia's forest industry is facing difficult times. In the Interior, the end of the pine beetle cut, lower prices for lumber, and back-to-back catastrophic wildfire seasons have led to a number of sawmill closures. This has created hardship for workers and uncertainty for the

communities that depend on forestry for their livelihoods.

For more than a decade, industry experts predicted the mountain pine beetle epidemic would result in multiple mill closures. Despite this, the previous government failed to take the necessary action to help workers, industry and communities adapt. This failure to act has compounded the difficulties forest workers and communities are facing today.

#### **Strategic Approach:**

The approach will consist of pro-active/ reactive communications, stakeholder outreach, and issues management supported by earned media

#### **Tactics:**

#### **Earned Media**

- Minister of Forests, Lands, Natural Resources Operations and Rural Development Doug Donaldson, Minister of Labour Harry Bains and Parliamentary Secretary for Forests, Lands, Natural Resources Operations and Rural Development Ravi Kahlon will announce the funding at a mill (Prince George or Maple Ridge) where workers have been impacted by recent closures/curtailments.
- Parliamentary Secretary for Forests, Lands, Natural Resources Operations and Rural Development Ravi Kahlon will visit multiple locations impacted by the closures/curtailments, meet with workers, local government and First Nations to personally deliver the news.

- \$2M for a new job placement coordination office that will track the transition of and assist the re-employment of impacted forest workers on an individual basis;
- \$40M for a cost-shared early-retirement bridging program for older forest workers;
- \$15M for a short-term forest employment program focussed on fire prevention and community resiliency projects;
- \$10M for worker training and community mental health support programs; and
- Community support grants aimed at providing short term assistance to communities more profoundly impacted by the closure of a major forest employer.

#### Mill Closure/Curtailment Summary

- Currently, there are 24 mills that have adjusted their output through indefinite or temporary curtailments and shift reductions.
- There have been four permanent mill closures.
- More than 6,000 workers are being affected across 23 communities.

Mill closures and curtailments are primarily the result of impacts to timber supply as a result of the Mountain Pine Beetle (MPB) and related fire losses. The MPB outbreak in B.C. began in the early 2000's with impacts peaking in 2005. By 2012, MPB had killed 53% of merchantable pine forests in the B.C. Interior.

British Columbia's forest industry is facing difficult times. In the Interior, the end of the pine beetle cut, lower prices for lumber, and back-to-back catastrophic wildfire seasons have led to a number of sawmill closures. This has created hardship for workers and uncertainty for the communities that depend on forestry for their livelihoods.

Mayor Lyn Hall has been an active member of the Prince George community for over 30 years. He and his wife Lorrelle are the parents of twin daughters, both of whom graduated from UNBC.

Hall began his political career as a School Trustee on the Prince George School Board. He spent 10 years on the board holding various positions including vice-chair and chair. In 2011, he ran and won a seat on Prince George City Council. In 2014 and 2018, he ran successful campaigns for Mayor of Prince George.



#### Mackenzie Mayor Joan Atkinson (TBD)

Joan moved to Mackenzie with her husband Jim and two sons in 1997; both sons and her husband work in the local forest industry. She professes to recognize the importance of maintaining a strong forest economy, said publicly that she is concerned with the current provincial forest model that puts her community's forest future at risk due to fibre supply and says her community is in crisis after three wood products operations closed in Mackenzie.

Joan, once recognized as Volunteer of the Year in her community, was acclaimed as mayor in 2018, but has been a member of council since 2007.



#### West Fraser CEO Ray Ferris (TBD)

Ray is a professional engineer and holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Engineering from the University of New Brunswick. He assumed the role of Pres/CEO of West Fraser as of July 1, 2019. Ray joined the company in 1997 and has served in several executive positions since on both the Alberta and B.C. operations.

West Fraser has more than 50 locations throughout B.C. and Alberta in Canada, and in Texas, Arkansas, Louisiana, Tennessee, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Alabama and Florida in the United States. B.C.'s operations currently account for 34 per cent of the company's total lumber capacity – 7.2 billion board feet – with Alberta supplying 23 per cent and the USA 43 per cent.

- Thank you Mayor Hall.
- I want to begin by saying that behind every productive business and viable industry, in fact, driving their success and sustainability...
- Is a workforce that is also, at the same time, contributing to the social fabric of their communities...
  - Workers who coach hockey and lead girl guides or boy scouts;
  - Or that serve on school committees and volunteer in local service clubs like the Rotary.
- And let's not forget, it's workers that built B.C.'s forestry sector...
- That built an industry that has fueled our economy for decades.
- And now it's these same forestry workers who are suffering in the wake of historic job losses, particularly in B.C.'s Interior.
- Our communities, B.C. businesses and their workers are strong and resilient, innovative and industrious...
- But even still, they need a helping-hand sometimes.

  - o It's about working with industry to provide a helping-hand.

- Good morning, everybody, and thank you Mayor Hall.
- Respectfully, I want to acknowledge that we are on the traditional territory of the Lheidli T'enneh (clayt-clay den-ay) First Nations.
- All of you here today are unfortunately all to aware of the challenges facing our Interior forestry sector.
- Those industry challenges have resulted in job losses for many workers in communities throughout the Interior.
- Our government has consistently said we are committed to supporting you and other Interior forestry workers dealing with job losses.
- Today, I'm here to let you know what that support looks like.
- We recognize the urgency of the situation, so our government is making more than \$69 million available to implement a new approach to worker, contractor and community transition.
- To do this, we are realigning our worker and community support programs and establishing capacity to ensure that workers like you have access to the services you need, from training to work placement to early retirement.
- Our new approach includes (1) job placement coordination, (2) cost shared support for incremental early retirement opportunities, (3) short-term work opportunity creation, (4) enhanced worker training and mental health support and (5) transition funding for communities to provide services to workers.
- This is for Interior forestry sector only, not the coastal sector.
- We are aware of the situation on the coast and are watching it closely, but for the time being these supports are for Interior mill workers only.

# **Job Placement Coordination:**

- We have allocated \$2 million for a B.C. Interior Forest Industry Placement Coordination Office, which will:
- Provide fair and equitable treatment of workers impacted by permanent and indefinite closures, with a focus on individual worker needs and circumstances.
- Facilitate placement opportunities within and outside the forest sector.
- Ensure that workers are receiving needed support services ranging from employee and family assistance programs delivered by your companies, tuition support for training programs, job search assistance and support for resume-writing services where needed.
- We are also calling on the federal government to add to the available funding, to make it accessible to more workers.

# **Early Retirement Bridging**

- We have allocated \$40 million over two years toward a B.C. Interior Forest Industry Adjustment Program.
- Based on the early retirement coverage your employers are offering, our government will establish an early retirement bridging opportunity program for age-eligible workers impacted by a permanent or indefinite mill closure or for age-eligible workers whose position could be filled by an impacted worker from another facility.

# Short-Term Work Opportunity Creation

- We are providing \$15 million to establish a new short-term forest employment program, focused on fire prevention and community resiliency projects.
- My ministry is prioritizing forest enhancement and wildfire prevention initiatives that can offer interim employment for impacted workers and contractors.

# **Enhanced Worker Training and Mental Health Support**

• A further \$12 million will be used to fund new worker training, and enhanced community mental health support programs.

# **Support for Communities**

- We are also providing municipalities with funding to assist workers, families and businesses impacted by change.
- Municipalities impacted by a permanent closure will be eligible to receive immediate funds of \$100,000 and municipalities responding to a publicly-announced indefinite closure will be eligible to receive funds of \$75,000, where more than 1/3 of the workforce remains in need of permanent or temporary employment.
- Municipalities responding to a shift reduction will have access to a pool of funding to provide defined services for workers and families, based on identified need.
- Additional funding will be available, including through the \$10 million Labour Market Partnerships Fund which helps municipalities transition to new economic opportunities and the Cooperative Marketing Funding Program for communities looking to further develop the tourism industry.

# WHAT WE'RE ASKING INDUSTRY TO DO

- We are asking industry to stand with us and step up to support the worker programming I've outlined here. We want industry to be partners in this.
- Company approaches to closures and curtailments have varied, and we need to work together to create a uniform, fair and organized response those impacted by closures.
- I'm standing here today and asking all Interior forest companies to step up and throw your support behind these initiatives.

- This is about doing the right thing for your employees through whose hard work your companies saw record profits they were there for you, now it's your turn to be there for them.
- Our government is committed to supporting the people impacted by this change, but we need to forest industry and the federal government to step-up and do their part as well.

It is proposed that Minister Donaldson and Minister Bains announce the new programs with Parliamentary Secretary Ravi Kahlon.

# Mill Closure/Curtailment Summary

- Currently there are 24 mills that have adjusted their output through indefinite or temporary curtailments and shift reductions.
- There have been four permanent mill closures.
- More than 4,000 workers are currently affected across 23 communities

Mill closures and curtailments are primarily the result of impacts to timber supply as a result of the Mountain Pine Beetle (MPB) and related fire losses. The MPB outbreak in B.C. began in the early 2000's with impacts peaking in 2005. By 2012, MPB had killed 53% of merchantable pine forests in the B.C. Interior.

British Columbia's forest industry is facing difficult times. In the Interior, the end of the pine beetle cut, lower prices for lumber, and back-to-back catastrophic wildfire seasons have led to a number of sawmill closures. This has created hardship for workers and uncertainty for the

communities that depend on forestry for their livelihoods.

For more than a decade, industry experts predicted the mountain pine beetle epidemic would result in multiple mill closures. Despite this, the previous government failed to take the necessary action to help workers, industry and communities adapt. This failure to act has compounded the difficulties forest workers and communities are facing today.

# **Strategic Approach:**

The approach will consist of pro-active/ reactive communications, stakeholder outreach, and issues management supported by earned media

# **Tactics:**

# **Earned Media**

- Minister of Forests, Lands, Natural Resources Operations and Rural Development Doug Donaldson, Minister of Labour Harry Bains and Parliamentary Secretary for Forests, Lands, Natural Resources Operations and Rural Development Ravi Kahlon will announce the funding at a mill (Prince George or Maple Ridge) where workers have been impacted by recent closures/curtailments.

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

- Good morning, everybody, and thank you Mayor Hall.
- Respectfully, I want to acknowledge that we are on the traditional territory of the Lheidli T'enneh (clayt-clay den-ay) First Nations.
- All of you here today are unfortunately all to aware of the challenges facing our Interior forestry sector.
- Those industry challenges have resulted in job losses for many workers in communities throughout the Interior.
- Our government has consistently said we are committed to supporting you and other Interior forestry workers dealing with job losses.
- Today, I'm here to let you know what that support looks like.
- We recognize the urgency of the situation, so our government is making more than \$69 million available to implement a new approach to worker, contractor and community transition.
- To do this, we are realigning our worker and community support programs and establishing capacity to ensure that workers like you have access to the services you need, from training to work placement to early retirement.
- Our new approach includes (1) job placement coordination, (2) cost shared support for incremental early retirement opportunities, (3) short-term work opportunity creation, (4) enhanced worker training and mental health support and (5) transition funding for communities to provide services to workers.
- This is for Interior forestry sector only, not the coastal sector.
- We are aware of the situation on the coast and are watching it closely, but for the time being these supports are for Interior mill workers only.

#### **Job Placement Coordination:**

- We have allocated \$2 million for a B.C. Interior Forest Industry Placement Coordination Office, which will:
- Provide fair and equitable treatment of workers impacted by permanent and indefinite closures, with a focus on individual worker needs and circumstances.
- Facilitate placement opportunities within and outside the forest sector.
- Ensure that workers are receiving needed support services ranging from employee and family assistance programs delivered by your companies, tuition support for training programs, job search assistance and support for resume-writing services where needed.
- We are also calling on the federal government to add to the available funding, to make it accessible to more workers.

#### **Early Retirement Bridging**

- We have allocated \$40 million over two years toward a B.C. Interior Forest Industry Adjustment Program.
- Based on the early retirement coverage your employers are offering, our government will establish an early retirement bridging opportunity program for age-eligible workers impacted by a permanent or indefinite mill closure or for age-eligible workers whose position could be filled by an impacted worker from another facility.

#### Short-Term Work Opportunity Creation

- We are providing \$15 million to establish a new short-term forest employment program, focused on fire prevention and community resiliency projects.
- My ministry is prioritizing forest enhancement and wildfire prevention initiatives that can offer interim employment for impacted workers and contractors.

#### **Enhanced Worker Training and Mental Health Support**

• A further \$12 million will be used to fund new worker training, and enhanced community mental health support programs.

#### **Support for Communities**

- We are also providing municipalities with funding to assist workers, families and businesses impacted by change.
- Municipalities impacted by a permanent closure will be eligible to receive immediate funds of \$100,000 and municipalities responding to a publicly-announced indefinite closure will be eligible to receive funds of \$75,000, where more than 1/3 of the workforce remains in need of permanent or temporary employment.
- Municipalities responding to a shift reduction will have access to a pool of funding to provide defined services for workers and families, based on identified need.
- Additional funding will be available, including through the \$10 million Labour Market Partnerships Fund which helps municipalities transition to new economic opportunities and the Cooperative Marketing Funding Program for communities looking to further develop the tourism industry.

#### WHAT WE'RE ASKING INDUSTRY TO DO

- We are asking industry to stand with us and step up to support the worker programming I've outlined here. We want industry to be partners in this.
- Company approaches to closures and curtailments have varied, and we need to work together to create a uniform, fair and organized response those impacted by closures.
- I'm standing here today and asking all Interior forest companies to step up and throw your support behind these initiatives.

- Our government is committed to supporting the people impacted by this change, but we need to forest industry and the federal government to step-up and do their part as well.

<u>Event Context</u>: Government is providing \$69 million to support mill workers and contractors impacted by permanent and indefinite mill closures in the B.C. interior. The funds are aimed at addressing short-term challenges faced by impacted workers and the supports include:

- \$2M for a new job placement coordination office that will track the transition of and assist the re-employment of impacted forest workers on an individual basis;
- \$40M for a cost-shared early-retirement bridging program for older forest workers;
- \$15M for a short-term forest employment program focussed on fire prevention and community resiliency projects;
- \$10M for worker training and community mental health support programs; and
- Community support grants aimed at providing short term assistance to communities more profoundly impacted by the closure of a major forest employer.

#### Mill Closure/Curtailment Summary

- Currently, there are 24 mills that have adjusted their output through indefinite or temporary curtailments and shift reductions.
- There have been four permanent mill closures.
- More than 6,000 workers are being affected across 23 communities.

Mill closures and curtailments are primarily the result of impacts to timber supply as a result of the Mountain Pine Beetle (MPB) and related fire losses. The MPB outbreak in B.C. began in the early 2000's with impacts peaking in 2005. By 2012, MPB had killed 53% of merchantable pine forests in the B.C. Interior.

British Columbia's forest industry is facing difficult times. In the Interior, the end of the pine beetle cut, lower prices for lumber, and back-to-back catastrophic wildfire seasons have led to a number of sawmill closures. This has created hardship for workers and uncertainty for the communities that depend on forestry for their livelihoods.

For more than a decade, industry experts predicted the mountain pine beetle epidemic would result in multiple mill closures. Despite this, the previous government failed to take the necessary action to help workers, industry and communities adapt. This failure to act has compounded the difficulties forest workers and communities are facing today.

#### P.G. Mayor Lyn Hall (TBD)

Mayor Lyn Hall has been an active member of the Prince George community for over 30 years. He and his wife Lorrelle are the parents of twin daughters, both of whom graduated from UNBC.

Hall began his political career as a School Trustee on the Prince George School Board. He spent 10 years on the board holding various positions including vice-chair and chair. In 2011, he ran and won a seat on Prince George City Council. In 2014 and 2018, he ran successful campaigns for Mayor of Prince George.



#### Mackenzie Mayor Joan Atkinson (TBD)

Joan moved to Mackenzie with her husband Jim and two sons in 1997; both sons and her husband work in the local forest industry. She professes to recognize the importance of maintaining a strong forest economy, said publicly that she is concerned with the current provincial forest model that puts her community's forest future at risk due to fibre supply and says her community is in crisis after three wood products operations closed in Mackenzie.

Joan, once recognized as Volunteer of the Year in her community, was acclaimed as mayor in 2018, but has been a member of council since 2007.



#### West Fraser CEO Ray Ferris (TBD)

Ray is a professional engineer and holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Engineering from the University of New Brunswick. He assumed the role of Pres/CEO of West Fraser as of July 1, 2019. Ray joined the company in 1997 and has served in several executive positions since on both the Alberta and B.C. operations.

West Fraser has more than 50 locations throughout B.C. and Alberta in Canada, and in Texas, Arkansas, Louisiana, Tennessee, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Alabama and Florida in the United States. B.C.'s operations currently account for 34 per cent of the company's total lumber capacity – 7.2 billion board feet – with Alberta supplying 23 per cent and the USA 43 per cent.

- Thank you Mayor Hall.
- I want to begin by saying that behind every productive business and viable industry, in fact, driving their success and sustainability...
- Is a workforce that is also, at the same time, contributing to the social fabric of their communities...
  - Workers who coach hockey and lead girl guides or boy scouts;
  - Or that serve on school committees and volunteer in local service clubs like the Rotary.
- And let's not forget, it's workers that built B.C.'s forestry sector...

- And maybe it's because of my forestry roots or that I began my career in sawmills, that I feel so proud of today's announcement...
  - But today we outlined how we'll help workers continue to participate and be proud of their forestry jobs;
  - And when they can't work, providing additional supports to help them get back on their feet and back to work;
  - So that like me, while working in a mill, they too can build a good and stable life, family and future in this province.

- Good morning, everybody, and thank you Mayor Hall.
- Respectfully, I want to acknowledge that we are on the traditional territory of the Lheidli T'enneh (clayt-clay den-ay) First Nations.
- All of you here today are unfortunately all to aware of the challenges facing our Interior forestry sector.
- Those industry challenges have resulted in job losses for many workers in communities throughout the Interior.
- Our government has consistently said we are committed to supporting you and other Interior forestry workers dealing with job losses.
- Today, I'm here to let you know what that support looks like.
- We recognize the urgency of the situation, so our government is making more than \$69 million available to implement a new approach to worker, contractor and community transition.
- To do this, we are realigning our worker and community support programs and establishing capacity to ensure that workers like you have access to the services you need, from training to work placement to early retirement.
- Our new approach includes (1) job placement coordination, (2) cost shared support for incremental early retirement opportunities, (3) short-term work opportunity creation, (4) enhanced worker training and mental health support and (5) transition funding for communities to provide services to workers.
- This is for Interior forestry sector only, not the coastal sector.
- We are aware of the situation on the coast and are watching it closely, but for the time being these supports are for Interior mill workers only.

#### Job Placement Coordination:

- We have allocated \$2 million for a B.C. Interior Forest Industry Placement Coordination Office, which will:
- Provide fair and equitable treatment of workers impacted by permanent and indefinite closures, with a focus on individual worker needs and circumstances.
- Facilitate placement opportunities within and outside the forest sector.
- Ensure that workers are receiving needed support services ranging from employee and family assistance programs delivered by your companies, tuition support for training programs, job search assistance and support for resume-writing services where needed.
- We are also calling on the federal government to add to the available funding, to make it accessible to more workers.

#### **Early Retirement Bridging**

- We have allocated \$40 million over two years toward a B.C. Interior Forest Industry Adjustment Program.
- Based on the early retirement coverage your employers are offering, our government will establish an early retirement bridging opportunity program for age-eligible workers impacted by a permanent or indefinite mill closure or for age-eligible workers whose position could be filled by an impacted worker from another facility.

#### Short-Term Work Opportunity Creation

- We are providing \$15 million to establish a new short-term forest employment program, focused on fire prevention and community resiliency projects.
- My ministry is prioritizing forest enhancement and wildfire prevention initiatives that can offer interim employment for impacted workers and contractors.

#### **Enhanced Worker Training and Mental Health Support**

• A further \$12 million will be used to fund new worker training, and enhanced community mental health support programs.

#### **Support for Communities**

- We are also providing municipalities with funding to assist workers, families and businesses impacted by change.
- Municipalities impacted by a permanent closure will be eligible to receive immediate funds of \$100,000 and municipalities responding to a publicly-announced indefinite closure will be eligible to receive funds of \$75,000, where more than 1/3 of the workforce remains in need of permanent or temporary employment.
- Municipalities responding to a shift reduction will have access to a pool of funding to provide defined services for workers and families, based on identified need.
- Additional funding will be available, including through the \$10 million Labour Market Partnerships Fund which helps municipalities transition to new economic opportunities and the Cooperative Marketing Funding Program for communities looking to further develop the tourism industry.

#### WHAT WE'RE ASKING INDUSTRY TO DO

- We are asking industry to stand with us and step up to support the worker programming I've outlined here. We want industry to be partners in this.
- Company approaches to closures and curtailments have varied, and we need to work together to create a uniform, fair and organized response those impacted by closures.
- I'm standing here today and asking all Interior forest companies to step up and throw your support behind these initiatives.

- This is about doing the right thing for your employees through whose hard work your companies saw record profits they were there for you, now it's your turn to be there for them.
- Our government is committed to supporting the people impacted by this change, but we need to forest industry and the federal government to step-up and do their part as well.

#### **Objective:**

To ensure British Columbians, especially those in forest dependent communities, are aware of the \$69 million the provincial government is providing to support mill workers and contractors impacted by mill closures/curtailments.

#### **Overview:**

Government is providing \$69 million to support mill workers and contractors impacted by permanent and indefinite mill closures in the B.C. interior. The funds are aimed at addressing short-term challenges faced by impacted workers/contractors. Support for impacted workers will include:

- \$2 million to establish a new job placement coordination office that will track the transition of and assist the re-employment of impacted forest workers on an individual basis;
- \$40 million to establish a new cost-shared early-retirement bridging program for older forest workers;
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- Community support grants aimed at providing short term assistance to communities more profoundly impacted by the closure of a major forest employer.

It is proposed that Minister Donaldson and Minister Bains announce the new programs with Parliamentary Secretary Ravi Kahlon.

#### Mill Closure/Curtailment Summary

- Currently there are 24 mills that have adjusted their output through indefinite or temporary curtailments and shift reductions.
- There have been four permanent mill closures.
- More than 4,000 workers are currently affected across 23 communities

Mill closures and curtailments are primarily the result of impacts to timber supply as a result of the Mountain Pine Beetle (MPB) and related fire losses. The MPB outbreak in B.C. began in the early 2000's with impacts peaking in 2005. By 2012, MPB had killed 53% of merchantable pine forests in the B.C. Interior.

British Columbia's forest industry is facing difficult times. In the Interior, the end of the pine beetle cut, lower prices for lumber, and back-to-back catastrophic wildfire seasons have led to a number of sawmill closures. This has created hardship for workers and uncertainty for the

communities that depend on forestry for their livelihoods.

For more than a decade, industry experts predicted the mountain pine beetle epidemic would result in multiple mill closures. Despite this, the previous government failed to take the necessary action to help workers, industry and communities adapt. This failure to act has compounded the difficulties forest workers and communities are facing today.

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The approach will consist of pro-active/ reactive communications, stakeholder outreach, and issues management supported by earned media


