ISSUE: Funding Decisions for the Fifth Intake of the Rural Dividend Program

RECOMMENDED OPTION:

 Approve the Decision Record for the fifth intake applications, new special circumstances applications, and the proposed special circumstances funding hold back.

BACKGROUND:

The Rural Dividend Program (the program) provides a total of \$25 million in funding annually to assist rural communities to reinvigorate and diversify their local economies. The program's fifth intake took place from June 1 – July 31, 2018. A total of 341 applications were received, with a total funding request of \$37,133,894. The fifth intake is the only intake period for FY 18/19.

Eligible project applications have been assessed through a robust multi-stage process. Applications were reviewed against program criteria to determine their eligibility, with a total of 46 applications determined to be ineligible. Program staff completed an evaluation and due-diligence process. Applications were further reviewed by the ADM Rural Dividend Committee, with representation from the Ministries of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development; Municipal Affairs and Housing; and Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation.

In total, the ADM Rural Dividend Committee has recommended 151 single applicant and partnership projects for the Minister's approval, for a total funding of \$18,779,128. The distribution of recommended/not-recommended projects between applicant types, funding streams, and regions is summarized in Attachment 1. The program also includes a special circumstances funding stream, which enables the program to aid communities facing significant economic challenges resulting from the loss of a main employer or the impacts of a natural disaster. Through this stream, funding can be provided outside of the program's regular parameters, including outside of intake periods. To date, \$3,281,179 in special circumstances funding has been approved in FY 18/19.

An additional six projects, submitted in the fifth intake, have been identified for special circumstances funding, totalling \$520,115. These projects do not fit within the regular parameters of the program, but were submitted by communities impacted by the 2017 or 2018 wildfire seasons. As a result, these projects are recommended for approval under the special circumstances provision (see Attachment 4). This brings the total funding recommended for the Minister's approval to \$19,299,243. This total includes the 151 single applicants and partnerships, as well as the six special circumstances applications, recommended for approval at this time, as listed in the 157 projects in Attachment 2.

For applications in the project development funding stream, Dave Peterson ADM, Rural Development, Lands and Innovation (RDLI) Division serves as the final decision maker. In total, 68 project development applications were approved for \$674,124, see Attachment 8. A package of material is attached that provides detailed information regarding recommended, not-recommended, and ineligible/withdrawn applications (Attachments 3 -7).



A total of 43 applications have not been recommended for funding at this time; details are provided in Attachments 6 and 7. Attachment 6 lists the projects that fit within the scope of the program but received an evaluation score below the cut off of available funding. Attachment 7 includes projects that do not fit within the program scope, or the due diligence feedback has identified significant concerns.
