

# WOODLOT LICENCE W1770

### **CUTTING PERMIT DD**

PURSUANT TO Woodlot Licence W1770 (the "Licence"), this Cutting Permit is issued to:

### 1.00 PERMIT AREA AND TERM

- 1.01 Subject to the Licence and the forestry legislation, the Licensee is authorized to harvest the Crown timber from the areas of land shown on the attached Exhibit "A" map(s) (the "harvest area").
- 1.02 The term of this Cutting Permit is 4 years, beginning on February 1, 2016 and expiring on January 31, 2020.

## 2.00 SPECIAL CONDITIONS AND REQUIREMENTS

2.01 The Licensee must comply with the conditions and requirements set out in Schedule "A" to this Cutting Permit.

### 3.00 TIMBER MARK

- 3.01 The timber mark(s) for timber removed under this Cutting Permit from land identified as:
  - (a) Schedule "A" Land in the Agreement is:

(b) Schedule "B" Land in the Agreement is:

- 3.02 All timber must be marked in the prescribed manner prior to being transported from the harvest area.
- 3.03 If directed to do so by the District Manager, the Licensee must erect signs at all exits from areas of land referred to in paragraph 1.01, clearly showing the timber mark referred to in paragraph 3.01.

#### 4.00 SCALE-BASED STUMPAGE

- 4.01 For the purpose of determining the amount of stumpage payable in respect of timber removed from the areas of Schedule "B" Land that are authorized for removal under this Cutting Permit, the volume or quantity of timber removed will be determined using information provided in a scale of the timber.
- 4.02 The Licensee must ensure that:
  - (a) all timber removed from the harvest area is scaled; and
  - (b) the scale of the timber is conducted properly in accordance with the requirements of the *Forest Act* and the regulations made under that Act.

#### 5.00 ROADS

5.01 Subject to the Licence and the forestry legislation, the Licensee may use, construct, maintain or deactivate roads on the area covered by this Cutting Permit.

#### 6.00 TIMBER HARVEST AND WASTE ASSESSMENT

6.01 The timber described in Schedule "B" is specified as reserved timber and the Licensee must not fell standing timber, and must not buck or remove felled or dead and down timber, as the case may be, of the species and description set out in Schedule "B".

#### 7.00 MISCELLANEOUS

- 7.01 The Schedules and Exhibit "A" map(s) are deemed to be part of this Cutting Permit.
- 7.02 This Cutting Permit is deemed to be part of the Licence.
- 7.03 The Licence will govern the interpretation of this Cutting Permit.
- 7.04 The Licensee must notify the District Manager in writing in a form acceptable to the District Manager, when primary logging is complete and again when removal is complete.

## OTHER CONDITIONS AND REQUIREMENTS

### 1.0 Orderly Condition

1.01 The Licensee shall, concurrently with harvesting operations, leave all areas in an orderly and sanitary condition.

### 2.0 Other Occupiers of Land

- 2.01 The rights granted under this permit are subject to other rights of use and occupation, and the Licensee must not interfere with exercise of those rights.
- 2.02 The rights of use and occupation referred to in paragraph 2.01 are as follows:
  - 2.02.1 Registered trap line(s)
  - 2.02.2 Mineral Claim(s)
  - 2.02.3 Guide Outfitter (s)

## 3.0 Commencement and Completion Dates

- 3.01 Unless the Licensor specifies otherwise in writing, the Licensee must ensure that all reasonable steps are taken to:
- 3.02 (a) advise the Licensor in writing and in a form acceptable to the Licensor, of the date that the Licensee's activities will commence at least five days before commencement; and
- 3.03 (b) notify the Licensor in writing in a form acceptable to the Licensor, when all obligations under this Licence are complete.

### 4.0 Dangerous Trees

- 4.01 The Licensee may fell trees outside of the cut block boundary(s) on Crown land only identified on the attached Exhibit A map, for the purposes of tree felling to eliminate a safety hazard, if the person conducting tree felling or rigging tail hold/anchor trees determines that the tree is a dangerous tree according to Worksafe BC regulations and it is up to two (2) tree lengths beyond the cutting authority area.
- 4.02 The Licensee may buck and utilize a tree felled under paragraph 4.01.
- 4.03 Felled dangerous tree(s) shall be subject to Waste Assessment policies.

1.01 The following is reserved timber under this Cutting Permit: Reserved Timber will be as identified in the approved appraisal associated with this cutting permit.






Re: FRPA Forest Recreation Regulation Section 16(a)(ii) authorization for use of Recreation Trail REC31979 for an industrial activity associated with Woodlot License W1770

Authorization for use of a portion of the Kettle Valley Rail Trail (REC31979) is hereby approved under Section 16 of the *Forest Recreation Regulation* under the *Forest and Range Practices Act* subject to the following conditions. The specific location of this approval is outlined on the attached map.

### Conditions of Approval:

- Requirements of the licensee
  - Conspicuous and clear signage on the Trans Canada Trail / Kettle Valley Rail Trail / REC31979 (TCT) on both the North and South approaches at the intersection of the TCT and the hauling activities.
  - Notify the RSTBC program and Grand Forks Community Trail Society (GFCTS) upon commencement of all phases of primary forest activities including harvesting and log hauling. Notification must be made to <a href="mailto:daniel.scott@gov.bc.ca">daniel.scott@gov.bc.ca</a> and <a href="mailto:chris.moslin@gmail.com">chris.moslin@gmail.com</a>.
  - RSTBC encourages the Forest Licensee avoid peak trail use months (June through September) should it be possible. Should it not be possible then the Forest Licensee is encourages to operate during weekdays only when possible. They are also encouraged to work with GFCTS regarding any upcoming events scheduled for 2018 and coordinate accordingly to ensure both uses can be facilitated safely and effectively.
  - Notify the RSTBC program and GFCTS upon conclusion of harvesting and log hauling.
  - Standard maintenance of the section of TCT including:
    - During operations, integrity of the TCT must be maintained with all ditches and drainage structures cleared concurrent with works. Debris removed from ditch lines and culverts must be placed well outside the ditch line to prevent reintroduction. No organic debris may be allowed to blend with road surfacing materials.
    - All equipment must be in good working condition, and free from

- invasive species prior to commencement of work.
- The use and transport of heavy equipment and materials must not damage the structural integrity of the Trans Canada Trail, bridges, culverts and other structures.
- Drainage systems must be maintained so as to be fully functional. The replacement of any structures such as culverts or bridges requires notification to the District Recreation Officer.
- Any brushing of the Forest Service Road clearing width shall ensure all brush cutting material be removed from inlets of drainage structures and ditches.
- Grading of the road surface to restore and maintain the road's shape so water
  is shed off via crowning and shall not result in removal of surfacing material
  from the road or the creation of berms along the shoulders.
- A final grading of the Trans Canada Trail between the TCT is required upon completion of all log hauling.
- Include a safety consideration in the cutting permit documents which states that all
  industrial access and log hauling will occur on the Trans-Canada Trail. All drivers must
  proceed with caution to ensure the safety of recreational users on the roadway.
- o Ensure any in-block road access from TCT is removed post-harvest.
- The term of this authorization covers all required industrial access related to the layout, development, harvesting and re-forestation of blocks within the Lime Creek watershed of Woodlot License W1770.
- Recreation Sites and Trails BC and the license holder may agree to facilitate a joint inspection of the TCT with the GFCTS.
