Here are the bullets you requested.

David

Ministry compliance staff conducted site visits to both the Browns Bay Packing (Campbell River) and Lions Gate Fisheries (Tofino) facilities the week of December 4, 2017.

- · The facilities were inspected and samples collected.
- · Samples sent for lab analysis included many parameters such as settleable solids, total suspended solids, biological oxygen demand, coliform bacteria and others.
- · While there is no set limits for these parameters due to the older nature of the permits, these results will be used to inform the industry audit currently underway, and help set baselines for future requirements and permit conditions.
- · Lab results also showed the presence of PRV.
- · Given the high prevalence of PRV in farmed salmon populations it is expected that effluent containing blood water from farmed fish processing is likely to contain PRV.
- \cdot The Ministry will continue to monitor these facilities to ensure compliance with the regulations.
- · On December 20, the Province announced an immediate review of fish processing plants to ensure provincial regulations and permits governing waste discharge from fish processing are informed by the best available science and best practices in other jurisdictions, and fish processing discharge is free of contaminants and pathogens.

This audit is currently underway and will be complete by the end of May, 2018.

On sea lice and pesticide use:

- · With respect to sea lice, the Integrated Pest Management Act (IPMA) regulates the use of pesticides for farmed fish but does not have the authority to regulate fish farming practices that may reduce sea lice exposure to wild salmon.
- · ENV is conducting a review of science and best practises to determine if it is necessary to incorporate new language/requirements into permits/regulations to ensure the environment is protected.
