Hi Angela,

Thank you for your questions. Yes, I believe your understanding is correct. Wetlands are included under the WSA definition of a stream. Thus, any proposed works in and about stream/wetland will require authorization under the WSA (generally under Section 11 – application for Change Approval). Surface connectivity to downstream fish habitat is not necessarily required to be considered a wetland under the WSA. You are correct to turn applicants and their QEPs to the provincial document Land Management Handbook 52 (Wetlands of BC by McKenzie & Moran) if they require further guidance on how to identify and classify wetted areas as wetlands. They can also contact our office but, we do expect the QEPs to have done their due diligence checks prior to connecting with us. Regarding your question about compensation: Mitigation measures will regularly be required by the Statutory Decision Maker (per Section 16 of the WSA) for any projects that are likely to impact the water quality, quantity or aquatic ecosystem. If the effects of the project cannot be mitigated, the Decision Maker may require compensation. There may also be some circumstances where the Decision Maker may determine that the impacts cannot be adequately avoided, mitigated or compensated for and in those circumstances they may refuse the project. Each application will be reviewed on a case by case basis to make the appropriate determination for the location and project proposed.

I cannot formally comment on the RAR component so it is best to get in touch with the FLNRORD RAR team. I have cc'd <u>Andrew Appleton</u> here in hopes that he can provide clear direction – more specific to <u>wetlands that are not connected by surface flow to downstream fish habitat</u>.

Subject: Seasonal wetlands - WSA Approvals

Hi there Barbara,

Lately, I have been noticing many applications coming in to eliminate "low wet areas", "wet fields" and "perched water tables".

From my background, these descriptions are pretty good indicators of seasonal wetlands (such as reed canary grass marshes or red alder – skunk cabbage treed swamps, which are inundated in the winter and early spring, and completely dry in the summer).

Because these areas often do not have direct surface flow connection to downstream fish habitat, many environmental consultants have been dismissing them as 'low wet areas' instead of classifying them as isolated seasonal wetlands. It is my understanding that even these seasonal features should be critically assessed and classified as per the Land Management Handbook 52 (McKenzie & Moran). If they are found to be a 'stream' (which includes seasonal isolated wetlands, as per the definition of a stream under the WSA), then it is my current understanding that an Approval would need to be sought to eliminate the feature.

This has become a bit of an issue, as localized flooding potential to the public is a reality that I am concerned about. Do I have a correct understanding of the WSA? And, if an Approval is required, would compensation be something that the Qualified Environmental Professional would have to seek? Or would it be on a case-by-case basis? I very much appreciate any conversation we can have about this, as I am very interested in providing clear and consistent guidance to the QEPs who are working in Surrey.

Hi Barb,

I visited the site(s) again on Friday and did a full boundary traverse and a transects across the local slope breaks with respect to the contours and as dictated by a terrain/slope model I prepared.

I can appreciate the offsite wetland feature you highlighted in the graphic you provided, and visited the offsite area too. The historic palustrine feature appears to have been infilled based on review of the 2017 CoS orthos, and this appears to coincide with the sanitary main alignment associated with another WSA notification for which there is a record on imap (completed by others). I walked the area quickly and suspect there could still be seasonal hydrologic expression, but without formal permission to be on the land or to pursue soil pits or auger testing I cannot comment further.

In the vicinity, at the northeast corner of the subject properties but offsite on the same property as the aforementioned historical wetland feature there is a topographic low point in the field. This area is actively maintained/mowed up to the fenceline. It is concluded as a seasonal/ephemeral feature and exhibits no evidence of sustained saturation or obligate hydrophytes. It is generally a topographic low characterized by creeping buttercup (*Ranunculus repens*) The lands on the development side (south) of the fenceline is defined by a sharp rise and there is no potential for overland flow or conveyance onto the site.

I also visited the manmade ditch/dugout on the east boundary. It shows no appreciable standing water, and it's linearity is indicative of its anthropogenic origin. We again assert that this is a class C feature owing to its lack of surface connectivity and interpret this as a non-natural, artificial opening in the ground. This feature will be infilled/graded as part of the development. This is a feature that the City has asked that we clarify that its elimination is explicitly a pet of the Wsa section 11. It is our interpretation. That this artificial opening is not a feature that is formally regulated under the WSA, but nonetheless, we want to ensure we close the loop on its future treatment.

For the remainder of the site, I located 3 locations that exhibit some indications of localized saturation or seasonal expression of saturation. Each of these was mapped and soil samples taken to assess for the presence of gleysols indicative of wetland conditions. No evidence of greying or mottling was encountered, and the facultative hydrophytes were limited to common rush (*juncus effusus*). Each of these expressions is interpreted as a localized seasonal seepage feature and all appear on or around the 76m contour, which coincidentally is equivalent to the ditch/dugout noted above. The absence of obligate hydrophytes or wetland soil conditions is concluded to preclude any further consideration for wetland conditions.

One further feature that has always given me pause based on its expression in the hillshade models in the northeast was accessed and confirmed as an anthropogenic modification. It has compacted soils and may have been another dugout feature that was infilled. It is directly south from a local height of land and was likely associated with a historically developed site which I confirmed to have Japanese knotweed within a historically cleared area. The feature itself has mineral soils at surface, is largely bare with no obligate hydrophytes, and is characterized by a compacted surface.

In summary, the field reconnaissance completed Friday June 7 as a follow up to your email and our brief discussion concluded that no wetlands pursuant to the legal definitions of the WSA or as described in Land Management Handbook No. 52 were identified onsite or in the vicinity of the subject properties.

 the WSA application, and the modification to the existing culvert crossing of the channelized
 Fergus Creek headwaters within the 164th alignment at 20th Ave. (See Drawing No. 11)
- Phase 1 Development SWMP Drawings (161-04532-00_20190528_dwg_br_OnsiteLotsSTMWPlanforWSA.pdf): Presents the onsite stormwater management plan for the Phase 1 (Lot 4) development. Similar concepts/BMPs will be implemented on future phases.

The first phase of development will include the offsite servicing which includes the roadworks and civil servicing aspects. The widening of 20th and the construction of Oak Meadows Drive are what dictate the impacts to the anthropogenic Class B ditches which are the subject of the WSA. These ditches presently drain west and provide baseflow contributions to Carlson Creek (a major tributary to Fergus Creek).

The SWMP for all parcels will ultimately maintain the catchment areas and will be routed via a biofiltration pond in the SW corner. This biofiltration pond receives flows from the onsite stormwater services and BMPs which includes a significant infiltration trench network and a minimum 150mm of amended topsoil on pervious surfaces to address volume reduction objectives. Release rates from the biofiltration/detention facility are consistent with the specified rates from the Sunnyside NCP documents at 0.435L/s/ha which is the limit set to maintain a steady baseflow provision through the remaining 20th Ave. roadside ditch and through to Carlson Creek.

The general theme of the structural BMPs (infiltration trenches) as depicted for the Phase 1 development will be carried through all future stages of the multi-phase build-out of the project. For phase 1, the infiltration trenches provide underground detention capacity of 299.3 m³.

If you have any more technical engineering questions regarding the SWMP designs, I have cc'd Brian Rooney from WSP to this email.

I am forwarding your message to the Surface Water Approvals team for review, as they are the statutory decision-makers on such files.

FLNRO uses the Wetlands of British Columbia: A Guide to Identification in our assessments of wetlands.

Wetlands are subject to the Water Sustainability Act. Your description of the site indicates that the site comprises a seasonal wetland which would therefore require an Approval for infilling or alteration. It would be prudent to seek further guidance from the Surface Water team prior to submitting an application.

WSA definition:

"stream" means

(a) a natural watercourse, including a natural glacier course, or a natural body of water, whether or not the stream channel of the stream has been modified, or

(b)a natural source of water supply,

including, without limitation, a lake, pond, river, creek, spring, ravine, gulch, **wetland** or glacier, **whether or not usually containing water**, including ice, but does not include an aquifer;

Hello Monica,

I have a client who is proposing the redevelopment of a property in Surrey. During a field assessment in early April, we identified a seasonally saturated area with wetland characteristics including mottled soils and hydrophytes (sedges, Juncus, and Equisetum). No surface water/flows are present. While the site supports facultative hydrophytes, no obligate species are present. The area was dry during a follow up inspection in mid-May, confirming the seasonal nature of this feature.

The subject property is located near the base of a slope and has underlying clay soils. No groundwater sources were identified and the local topography suggests that the seasonally saturated conditions are a result of hillslope run-off and poorly drained clay soils.

We recently met on site with Angela Doiron from the City of Surrey to discuss the significance of this seasonally wetted area and characterization as a wetland feature. In light of the wetland characteristics of the site (mottled soils and hydrophytes) the City is requiring assurances that this feature is not regulated under the Water Sustainability Act.

Our client is proposing the construction of a new single-family dwelling on the property. The footprint of the house and some ancillary structures (driveway and septic field) are located with the seasonally saturated area. Would infilling/alteration of these seasonal features be subject to a Section 11 Approval under the Water Sustainbility Act? Angela suggested that you might be able to provide guidance with respect to this question. If there is a more appropriate person to contact, please let me know. A more detailed description of the site, including photographs, is provided in the attached document. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me. Also, I can be available to meet you at the site if you feel that a site visit would be useful.

ENKON was retained to conduct a watercourse assessment for the proposed construction of a single-family home at \$.22 in Surrey. The property is a brownfield site and has been historically modified by previous single family development, hydro and gas line right of ways and residential development in the surrounding area. In addition to two constructed ditches, the field assessment identified a seasonally saturated area with some wetland characteristics, including mottled soils and hydrophytic plants.

Review of the proposed development plans indicate that the footprint of the proposed house and ancillary structures including septic field and driveway encroaches into the seasonally saturated area. ENKON has reviewed the site conditions in the field with the City of Surrey and based on the presence of wetland characteristics, the City of Surrey requires assurances that infilling or installation of drains within the seasonally saturated areas meet any provincial requirements/approvals.

ENKON is requesting formal guidance from the province with respect to the management of this seasonal wetland area; specifically, if changes/alterations to this type of seasonally wetted areas are subject to Section 11 of the *Water Sustainability Act*. A description of the existing site conditions are provided below.

Habitat description

An initial site assessment was conducted on April 11, 2019. An existing house and fill pad are located at the southeast corner of the lot (Photograph 1). Two ditches are located within or near the site including a property line ditch on the north side of the lot and a roadside ditch adjacent to \$.22 . At the time of assessment the northern half of the property and the area to the west of the existing fill pad and house were saturated (Photograph 1; Figure 1). The terrain is hummocky and although ground conditions were saturated, no pools or other surface waters were observed.

Photograph 1 – North view of the subject property, showing the existing house and seasonally saturated area to the west (left) of the house fill pad.

Vegetation was predominately grasses with *Juncus* sp., sedges, *Equisetum* sp. and common hawthorn (*Crateagus monogyna*) (Photograph 2 and Photograph 3). While facultative hydrophytes were present, no obligate hydrophytes were observed.

During a follow-up inspection of May 13, 2019, soil pits were excavated to the west and north of the existing house. The wetland area was dry at the time of the May inspection. The excavation showed underlying clay with mottling within the B-horizon indicative of wetland features (Photograph 4).

The property is a brownfield site and has been modified. Review of historical imagery from 1949 suggests previous agricultural use of the local area prior to residential development. In additional to the current residential use, a hydro and gas line right-of-way intersect the northern portion of the property. The hydrodynamics of the area have likely be altered due these historical modifications and development within the surrounding area.

No evidence of groundwater inputs were observed during the assessments. The local topography suggest that saturated conditions are a result of surface runoff from the adjacent slope (Figure A) and poor infiltration of the underlying clay soils. The area drains as sheet flow to the adjacent s.22 ditch with the remaining saturation evaporating during the dry season.

Hi Malissa -

Yes, this one is very interesting. The west side of the property appears to be quite wet (gleysols / mottling present, v. poorly draining soils of primarily clay) but it is not very apparent until you start digging, because the vegetation has been so disturbed over the years. There is tons of pugging present (perhaps the previous owner many years ago had a horse or some other ungulate) and when Enkon (the QEP) did the first assessment, they did note that the area was saturated.

Vegetation on-site is a mix of rushes and non-native weeds (like buttercup) and black hawthorn. It's clear to me that if the area is filled, the water will be pushed to the neighbouring property.. the only reason why the existing house is not flooded during the winter and spring months is likely because it is built up on a fairly raised bed of fill material. Friday is all site visits for me so I'm happy to extend our field time to go out to this property with Barb & Monica if they have time!

Good afternoon Malissa,

I believe you might be out for the day – but wanted to provide the Ministry with an update of the City of Surrey's understanding of the project associated with a WSA Approval (Tracking # 2005354; Approval attached).

Early this year, I was able to review the Project's environmental report and determined that there was reason to believe that a large portion of the north half of the site is a seasonal swamp. Additionally, I found that the QEP had not provided adequate information to prove that the watercourses on the property were not fish-bearing (Class A or A/O).

I visited the property and confirmed that much of the north of the property is indeed a wetland, likely a Ws54 or something similar (didn't do a full wetland assessment). Discussions with the QEP on-site led to him hiring a qualified wetland ecologist to confirm that there is, in fact, a large wetland complex in this area.

We have no documentation of this information as of yet, however it would significantly change the project scope and what the City's understanding of setbacks would be. I wanted to give the Ministry a heads up that the compensation values associated with this WSA Approval will likely need to change as a result of these updated field assessments.

Please give me a call if you have any questions, and I am sure that the QEP (Sartori Environmental) will keep the Ministry updated as documentation becomes available.



Thanks for bringing this question forward. Take a look through Kym's response below. If the applicant wants to take additional water from an alternate source, they will need a new water licence (if long term diversion is being requested) or Short Term Use authorization (if only wanting water for short term, up to 24 months).

We currently have a substantial backlog on water licence application reviews (e.g. may be up to 4-5 years). Short Term Use applications can be processed quicker... (roughly within a year – 18 months). Either way, the applicant will require an Environmental Flow Needs Assessment by a Qualified Professional. If they want to pursue this request, I highly recommend they hire a QP to help with that EFN assessment ASAP!

The province is also working on a dugout policy/regulation... but its not in force yet. I also don't think it will really apply to this particular scenario.






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

We were hoping to amend the activities covered under Approval No 2007158.

The removal of the unauthorized instream structure was conducted on August 23, 2019 as per the Environmental Monitoring Report linked below.

As you can see from the photos, there is abundant structural fill that was placed in the channel during the unauthorized works. After the removal of the structure, it was evident that this non-native material will likely be washed into downstream fish habitat during the first few large rain events of the season. In consultation with Angela Doiron at the City of Surrey, we believe it would be best if the non-native fill be removed prior to the rainy season. This would be done using a small excavator and raking/shoveling to remove all non-native fill placed in the impacted reach of Hyland Creek.

We would like to have the Approval amended to cover the fill removal to significantly reduce the risk of abundant sediment mobilization during the rainy season.

Please contact our Surrey office to discuss the proposed changes further.

- We have sent a quote for nursery stock, but the client is resistant to submitting an order until the RC is settled. We are hesitant to order the stock without the client paying directly as we are having challenges getting paid for our recent work.
- The client will follow-up with the Surveyor to have the existing dwelling added to the plans. We will then add the proposed fence location.
- We have submitted a formal request for amendment of the WSA Approval.

To reiterate, the team of QEPs working on this file includes biologists, a hydrogeologist, and civil engineers (Aplin & Martin). It is our collective professional opinion that any potential impacts to the flow regime of the watercourse in question would be unmeasurable and insignificant. We expect the watercourse to remain dry in the summer and wet in the winter, as it is now. Therefore, we do not believe a Change Approval under the WSA is required. The City has asked that we confirm this conclusion with you.

Project Overview:

- Proposed townhome development on lands shown (see attached mark-up of COSMOS screen grab).
- Development lands are upslope of the headwaters of a Class B Fergus Ck tributary (also shown on attached mark-up).
- As per Surrey bylaws, the watercourse requires a 15m streamside protection area.
 - Closest point of development ~60m from watercourse.
- Watercourse is ephemeral dry in summer, wet in winter.
- Riparian environment is heavily disturbed due to historic construction of overhead transmission ROW and significant invasive plant populations.
- City has expressed concerns re: potential impacts from development to the flow regime of the Class B watercourse.
- There are no direct, surficial connections from the development lands to the watercourse.
 - As such, any potential impacts would be groundwater related.

 - Exceeding the minimal 15m streamside protection area, and therefore beating City and provincial RAR requirements;
 - Re-design of the project SWMP in order to maximize infiltration measures onsite (e.g., infiltration trenches paralleling main roads, use of onsite sub-grade retention tanks with permeable bottoms, use of permeable pavers and pervious concrete where feasible); and
 - Implementation of a monitoring program, including installation of a groundwater monitoring well with data logger.

Thank you for your email dated August 20, 2019 inquiring about the need for a *Water Sustainability Act* (WSA) Approval Application for your property (16558 – 18 Avenue, Surrey, BC PID: 030-195-039) near Fergus Creek. Based on the information provided to date, we understand there are no watercourses on the proposed development area of this property that, in our opinion, meet the definition of a stream under the WSA. Thus, no WSA Approval is required at this time.

A Stream, under the WSA is defined as:

(a) a natural watercourse, including a natural glacier course, or a natural body of water, whether or not the stream channel of the stream has been modified, or (b) a natural source of water supply, including, without limitation, a lake, pond, river, creek, spring, ravine, gulch, wetland or glacier, whether or not usually containing water, including ice, but does not include an aquifer.

However, it is our understanding that this property is adjacent to an unnamed watercourse that is the headwaters to Fergus Creek. Your property plays an important role in providing critical flows to the unnamed water course through overland flow and groundwater recharge. As the development of your property may result in a reduction of permeable surfaces it has the potential to change the timing, duration, and frequency of the natural supply of water to Fergus Creek. Therefore, we are concerned the development of your property will have significant effects to the quantity, quality and aquatic ecosystem of Fergus Creek. Per Section 16 of the WSA, we recommend you consider mitigation measures to avoid these environmental and hydrological impacts.

Stormwater outfalls do require notification to the Ministry under Section 39 of the Water Sustainability Regulation. We request that you notify our Water Authorizations team via email to WaterActReferrals.LowerMainland@gov.bc.ca when you have applied for any notification level

work for this property such that we have the opportunity to review your submission, in addition to the review by a Habitat Officer.

We recommend that appropriately qualified professionals are engaged to ensure the collection of these flows, that have historically entered the adjacent watercourse via overland flow, through the stormwater systems are managed such that the adjacent watercourse does not experience a reduction (or storm surge) of flows. If water is being diverted away from the stream channel, a water licence application may be required.

It is also our understanding that works in and about the ditch along 16th Avenue is not part of the proposed development of this site. If this changes, we invite you to submit an application to our office for a WSA Section 11 Change Approval.

Hi Malissa,

I hope you're well – I have a question that I'm sure you've heard before, but would appreciate a response so that we can refer back to it at the City in the future!

We often have applications that have 'scope creep', where what was proposed to the City and to the Ministry for a WSA Approval begins to change once the engineers realize constraints that were not recognized in the early stages of a project.

The City always recommends that the applicant / QEP discusses these changes with the Ministry and amends the Approval permit accordingly.

We have been getting some push-back from a QEP on a large project where compensation was proposed within a stormwater pond (not usually something the City would be on board with). The pond requires a large amount of fill that will encroach into our own streamside setbacks to the Little Campbell River.

The QEP is indicating that the works do not require any conversation with the Ministry, because no 'significant' changes have occurred, and any changes (such as a large slope of fill material into an otherwise forested area adjacent to the LCR) will not impact any instream proposed works. Therefore, they are hoping not to have to amend their permit information.

I do not have any confirmation that they have assessed the riparian area that they are proposing to fill, but that is something I am attempting to get separately. In the meantime, I am hoping to get some clarification:

- 1. If changes to the scope of work are not at or below the bank of the stream, does it need to be communicated in the permit?
- 2. Does the WSA Approval take into account the loss of riparian area to achieve instream habitat (which is required because more instream habitat was eliminated in the first place)?

Pinchin Ltd. (Pinchin) is pleased to provide the findings of the Watercourse Classification Assessment for the unnamed ditch located along the south side of 60 Avenue and immediately north of the property located at 13866 – 60th Avenue in Surrey, BC (the subject property).

1.0 BACKGROUND

Pinchin was retained on May 3, 2017 through an Authorization to Proceed signed bys.22 (Client) to conduct a watercourse classification assessment of the unnamed ditch (the Ditch) located along the north boundary of the subject property. Pinchin was advised by the Client that the purpose of the watercourse classification assessment was in relation to the potential development of the subject property.

Pinchin submitted an assessment dated May 24, 2017. In August 2019, the City of Surrey notified the Client and Pinchin that further assessment of the Ditch would be required to adequately address questions raised by City of Surrey staff.

Pinchin undertook this updated assessment to conclusively determine 1) what the classification of the Ditch would be with regard to the City of Surrey Zoning Bylaw (i.e., including prescribed streamside protection area); 2) if the Ditch would be considered a stream per the provincial *Water Sustainability Act* (WSA); and 3) if the provincial Riparian Areas Regulation (RAR) would apply to the Ditch.

2.0 METHODS

A desktop assessment was completed using mapping available on the City of Surrey Online Mapping (COSMOS), Community Mapping Network's Sensitive Habitat Inventory Mapping (SHIM), and iMapBC.

A field assessment was completed to ground-truth the results of the desktop assessment and to collect information with regard to the biophysical characteristics of the Ditch.

Physically identifiable features of streams (i.e., creeks and brooks) were defined per the Fish-stream Identification Guidebook, Version 2.1 (1998). Per the Fish-stream Identification Guidebook, watercourses were assessed for the presence of a continuous channel bed, whether or not portions were obscured by

bridging vegetation, with evidence of scour, rafted debris, and deposits of mineral alluvium. Scour had to be sufficient to erode at least some portion of the channel bed down to the mineral substrate. In lower energy systems where flows might not be sufficient to consistently erode surface soils, streams were identified by the presence of a continuous channel bed with evidence of regular inundation.

To be considered fish habitat, watercourses were assessed to determine 1) if they contained fish or 2) had a surface connection to fish bearing habitat and provided a significant contribution of base flow, food, and nutrients to fish habitat.

In order to be classified as streams under the WSA, watercourses had to show evidence of natural headwaters or springs (i.e., or other natural sources of water), and regular flows sufficient to mark on the soil of the bed of the stream a character distinct from that of its banks, in vegetation, as well as in the nature of the soil itself.

3.0 LEGISLATION

3.1 City of Surrey Bylaws

Per the City of Surrey Zoning By-law (By-law 12000) stream means any of the following that provides fish habitat:

- (a) a watercourse, whether it usually contains water or not;
- (b) a pond, lake, river, creek, brook, ravine, swamp, gulch or natural or channelized stream; or
- (c) a ditch, spring or wetland, that is connected by surface flow to any items referred to in
- (a) or (b) above.

Streams, as defined above typically receive a streamside setback area (i.e., Streamside Protection Area (SPA)) defined by a horizontal setback measured perpendicularly from the top of bank of the stream. The extent of the horizontal setback is defined by Part 7A, Section B.1 and B.2 of By-law 12000. The extent of the setback is determined by the physical character of the stream and the status of the stream with regard to fish habitat.

In addition, the Streamside Protection Development Permit (SPDP) area, included within the Sensitive Ecosystems Development Permit (SEDP) in the City of Surrey encompasses:

All properties, where any portion of the property, falls within 50 m of the top of bank of either one or both sides of a Class A, A/O, or B streams containing fish habitat, as generally shown in: Figure 68 of the OCP Implementation Section II (d) and/or City of Surrey COSMOS Map. (Should a stream not illustrated in Figure 68 be identified, it is the

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responsibility of the applicant to contact the City to determine whether or not the area in question falls with this SEDP).

Where the SPDP applies, proposed development activities are subject to the SEDP requirements. Please note that the full extent of SEDP requirements are not addressed by this report.

Per the SEDP, ditches were characterized as being manmade and straight with no significant headwaters or springs. They were constructed to drain property (they often form property boundaries) or roadways and while connected to natural streams they are not part of the natural historic drainage pattern.

3.2 Water Sustainability Act and Riparian Areas Regulation

Streams and associated riparian areas are protected on private land by the provincial WSA and RAR.

The WSA defines a stream as:

- (a) a natural watercourse, including a natural glacier course, or a natural body of water, whether or not the stream channel of the stream has been modified; or
- (b) a natural source of water supply including, without limitation, a lake, pond, river, creek, spring, ravine, gulch, wetland or glacier, whether or not usually containing water, including ice, but does not include an aquifer.

The WSA regulates changes in and about a stream which are defined as:

- (a) any modification to the nature of a stream, including any modification to the land, vegetation and natural environment of a stream or the flow of water in a stream; or
- (b) any activity or construction within a stream channel that has or may have an impact on a stream or a stream channel.

Per Section 11 of the WSA:

- (2) Changes in and about a stream may only be made in accordance with:
 - (a) the terms and conditions of a change approval;
 - (b) the regulations;
 - (c) the terms and conditions of an authorization; or
 - (d) an order.

Riparian habitat on private land within select areas and communities, including the City of Surrey, is also protected under the RAR through the prescription of Streamside Protection and Enhancement Area

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Page 61 of 171 FNR-2020-06386

(SPEA). The extent and configuration of the SPEA prescribed by the RAR is determined through application of the RAR Assessment Methods by a Qualified Environmental Professional (QEP).

In brief, the RAR establishes SPEA from streams, defined as:

"Stream" includes any of the following that provides fish habitat:

- (a) a watercourse, whether it usually contains water or not;
- (b) a pond, lake, river, creek or brook; and
- (c) a ditch, spring or wetland that is connected by surface flow to something referred to in paragraph (a) or (b).

The extent of the SPEA is determined by an assessment of zones of sensitivity associated with the specific values of riparian habitat include the provision of large woody debris, litter fall, insect drop and shading of watercourses. Three zones of sensitivity are typically considered and the most restrictive prescription of the three zones are used to do determine the boundaries of the SPEA.

4.0 RESULTS

The original field assessment was completed on May 4 and May 5, 2017 by Pinchin. Following the request from the City of Surrey for additional information, Pinchin conducted assessments on September 9, September 13, and September 18, 2019. Selected site photographs taken during the field assessment are located in Appendix I.

The May 4 field assessment occurred within 14 hours of a significant rainfall event (i.e., >25 mm within 24 hours), and the May 5 assessment occurred during a rain shower. The total precipitation was approximately 139.7 mm for the month of April 2017 as measured at the Surrey Municipal weather station (City of Surrey – Rainfall Monitoring).

The September 9, 2019 field assessment occurred following 10.3 mm of rainfall within 24 hours, the September 13, 2019 field assessment occurred following during a significant rainfall event, and the September 18, 2019 field assessment occurred following a significant rainfall event. The total precipitation was approximately 149.3 mm for the month of September 2019 as measured at the Surrey Municipal weather station (City of Surrey – Rainfall Monitoring).

The subject property is located within a predominantly urban area, with most of the land base consisting of residential land uses. COSMOS identified the Ditch as a Class-C, Green-coded watercourse (typically designed for conveyance of storm water and is dry 48 to 72 hours following a significant rainfall event). SHIM identified the Ditch as having unknown fish presence. The Ditch appeared to ultimately drain to an unnamed watercourse (Class B) on the north side of 60 Avenue. The unnamed watercourse ultimately discharges to Archibald Creek which is depicted as a fish bearing stream on COSMOS.

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The Ditch appeared to originate from stormwater drainage sourced from 60 Avenue and King George Boulevard. According to COSMOS, the Ditch commences west of the Site from a 450 mm diameter corrugated pipe which connects to stormwater drainage pipes on King George Boulevard. At the project location, the Ditch drained eastward into a pipe under 60 Avenue, and ultimately to an unnamed stream on the north side of 60 Avenue. The pipe under 60 Avenue was considered an obstacle to fish passage based on gradient (~10%).

At the time of the site assessments, the Ditch at the project location consisted of a grassed swale which conveyed minimal flows (<5 cm deep) with intermittent dry areas even during prolonged significant rain events. Within the Ditch, there was some evidence of infrequent inundation (muddy substrate). Vegetation within the Ditch was limited to maintained grass (i.e., mowed grass) and hydrophytes (e.g., skunk cabbage) were not observed. Rafted debris or alluvial deposits were not observed. At the time of the assessments, there was insufficient flow to create instream habitat features required to support fish (e.g. pools, glides).

Pinchin observed water within the Ditch to be entirely sourced from stormwater runoff from 60 Avenue as multiple asphalt stormwater conveyances were constructed to direct stormwater from the road into the Ditch. During the site inspections, a significant amount of water was observed flowing from 60 Avenue into the Ditch, however upstream of the stormwater conveyances, the Ditch was dry. Water was not observed coming from the 450 mm diameter corrugated pipe from King George Boulevard. Furthermore, the September 9 and 18 site assessments were conducted during dry weather but following rainfall. During these inspections, surface flows were not observed within the Ditch. As such, it was determined that flows within the Ditch are not sourced from a natural source of water (e.g., groundwater) as surface flows were only present when water was observed to directly flow from 60 Avenue to the Ditch.

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5.0 CONCLUSION

Based on the 1) minimal flows within the Ditch despite recent significant rainfall; 2) absence of scour or evidence of frequent inundation and hydrophytes; and 3) absence of natural headwaters (i.e., groundwater or another stream), the Ditch was not considered to be integral to a stream; to consist of a natural source of water; or to provide a significant source of base flows, food, and nutrients to fish habitat. Therefore, the Ditch was not considered to meet the definition of a stream per the City of Surrey Zoning Bylaw or Provincial WSA.

As the Ditch was connected by surface flows to an unnamed watercourse, which ultimately connects to a fish bearing stream, the Ditch is considered a stream under RAR.

It is Pinchin's understanding that if the Ditch is not considered a stream under the WSA, changes to the Ditch may be completed without the requirement for a Change Approval or Notification per the Provincial WSA.

We are in receipt of your undated letter (attached) with respect to our properties at 19007, 19025 and 19047 Fraser Highway. In reviewing the letter, I would like to respond to the assertions made:

- 1) The northern portion of the properties were indeed cleared however there was no requirement for a Tree Cutting Permit as the area was determined by an Arborist to contain only non Bylaw sized trees and the removal work was then supervised by the same Arborist.
- 2) A QEP was also hired before the removal work to confirm the prior classifications accepted by City of Surrey / Ministry of the Class C ditches as seen on Cosmos as well as to provide the appropriate setback zone to ensure no disturbance to McLennan Creek.
- 3) The tree removal work would definitely have impacted the ditches as many weren't clearly defined and were dry in many areas even though the work was carried out during the wet season in February.
- 4) I'm not sure how the ditches would impact fish habitat downstream as the slope of the property will continue to carry storm water toward McLennan Creek (which is non fish bearing) as the ditches were intended.
- 5) We absolutely did not disturb any City property and definitely did not remove any trees from City property.
- 6) Storm water from our properties is also not impacting any City infrastructure.

Any impact onto the property at s.22 is a result of inadequate drainage on the City's adjacent property which is to be the future 192 Street Diversion. That property is clearing not diverting storm water to the Detention Pond on 66 Avenue as intended. In any case, we've only heard of this concern very recently, even though the work was completed over six months ago, and are willing to undertake any work that may be necessary to our parcel at 19047 Fraser Highway adjacent to the City's in order to alleviate the drainage issue. It would be helpful to have a meeting onsite first however to determine a course of action. Representatives of our company will make ourselves available at your convenience next week in order to ensure we can meet your October 11th deadline to complete any required work.

Yes, this is a very important issue to us as well. I need to check in with my Managers, Cher and Bryan, to see how we want to proceed. But my initial thoughts/comments are as follows:

Longer term (e.g. by the end of 2020) I would like to put together a list of procedures we expect QPs to follow when making their determination about a WSA stream.

In the interim, our team has challenges providing review and responses to these questions in a timely manner which is why that email (below) recommends they submit an application with their professional rationale for why it isn't a WSA stream (if that's what the QP is suggesting). Then, when the file is picked up for technical review, our office has a dedicated person to oversee the report. If we agree to the QP's rationale, we will then provide a letter stating that no authorization is required.

So, I wouldn't say we are not reviewing these requests for determination, we are just changing our interim process in how we do so such that we can make sure the request doesn't get lost.

Happy to have further conversations on this subject. I believe some folks from a different department in the City of Surrey have requested a meeting with our Regional Executive Director this week? I believe the definition of a stream is one of the topics they wanted to discuss.

Below is an e-mail thread detailing response to a watercourse classification issue that we are having.

In October, City of Surrey staff met with MFLNRORD (Malissa & Barbara) to discuss the City's process for determining what a "Class C" feature is. We determined that the definition of a Class C is:

"A feature that is not considered a 'stream' under the definition of WSA and RAPR"

I receive 3-5 Classification letters each week to determine if a feature is a "Class C". Sometimes I can confirm that the QEP has provided adequate evidence that a feature is not a 'stream' and is therefore not protected by the Province or Municipality. However, in cases where QEPs are arguing with the City about that the definition of a "stream" is, I have been instructed by the Ministry to have the QEPs settle this matter with the Ministry.

Can you confirm with me that the Ministry is still open to providing good guidance to QEPs when it comes to Class Cs? This is very important to the City of Surrey, as we need to ensure that all "Class C" features **are not streams**, for our own Ops works but also to ensure that we do not take on liability when a QEP mistakenly calls a stream a 'class C'.

Hi Ron,

In regards to our project at 104A & 139<sup>th</sup> (Surrey File No. 19-0091) we submitted our reports on ditch classification to MFLNRORD as you recommended. The Ministry has refused to review the stream classification (see below). I reviewed the application process for the Water Sustainability Act, Section 11, Changes For Work in and About a Stream with our QEP. Our QEP advised the ditches clearly do not meet the definition of Stream outlined in the Act. In addition I am very hesitant to make the application as it will set the precedent suggesting every servicing agreement requiring a ditch enclosure in the City of Surrey will need to receive Provincial authorization. Authorizations are currently taking 12-24 months.

I suggest we use your earlier concept of getting a third party QEP to offer their opinion on the Ditch Classification and proceed with their recommendation.

Would this work for you? The current system puts our project into permanent limbo.

Good Afternoon Cameron, Stephen,

I would like to kindly thank you both for taking the time to talk to me recently about the subject site and its proposed works under Change Approval 2007237, as well as offering your direct assistance to help get the ball rolling again. It's understood that the primary issue that's related to the Advisory letter was that the proposed pond expansion (and its resulting new TOB / HWM) would apply an additional setback to the neighbouring private property to the North (outside of the existing setback of April creek that currently applies to that property). To address this, we are now proposing to expand southeast and southwest portions of the pond, as well as daylighting the creek in the northern area where a culvert is currently in place (as opposed to expanding the pond) to provide habitat compensation. The resulting habitat gains by completing the newly proposed pond expansions and day-lighting the creek are still able to offset the loss of habitat that occurred for infill of the pond that occurred under WSA Notification #100251449. Furthermore, under this new approach, resulting setbacks (both under RAPR, and the City's Streamside Bylaw) pose no additional setbacks to private properties. They are either within existing setbacks, or within Park Parcel (2959 165th Street).

Also, separate from the Advisory letter, there was a request to take a look at a potential tributary along the north PL above the pond. Phoenix reviewed this area of concern and did not observe a tributary or stream there. Sheet 5 of the attached represents the observations following a recent site inspection.

Please review the attached drawing package that I have put together that represents the above.

We understand the lack of easement in place for City maintenance of retaining walls on lots east and west of the pond is no longer of concern, as they are private retaining walls, and any potential homeowner maintenance of those walls would need to occur from within their property. Easements / Drainage Maintenance ROWs are in place for infrastructure maintenance, and Parks will have two maintenance gates to access the P-15 / Park area. However,

we do acknowledge that in future instances such as this (where Provincial RAPR setbacks closely mimic City Bylaw setbacks of a water feature, such as a pond), an additional 3 - 5m easement would likely need to be established in order to meet the intent and design of the City's Sensitive Ecosystem DPA.

If you both could review the attached mapping at your earliest convenience, and let us know if you are both satisfied with the general approach being presented to address the issue with Approval file 2007237. Following receipt of your general acceptance, we will revise the Engineering drawings and P-15 Planting Plan, and submit the updated plans so the Approval file's review can continue and finalize.

There have been further discussions between the City and the Ministry, and it is determined that it is best to proceed through their review process as opposed to a peer-review. The Ministry has indicated that they can still complete the review process, however due to a high level of work and deadlines associated with their end-of-year, the usual 1-2 week review time is not possible right now. To ensure that the review of your file is not get lost in the shuffle, the Ministry has indicated that it would be best to **apply for a WSA Approval** to eliminate the ditch. This will help to keep your spot in their review queue.

This sounds alarming, however the way that the approval process works is this:

- The approval application is sent in by your QEP
- 2. The approval application is put into a 3-5 week queue for **preliminary review** by Shawn Fitzsimons (MFLNRORD)

a. Based on this preliminary review, it will be determined if a WSA Approval application is required or not. In the case that this is indeed a "Class C" feature, then no approval to eliminate the ditches would be required.

The "12-18 month" wait time for an approval would only be relevant if the Ministry determines that this feature meets the definition of a "stream" as per the WSA. In your QEP's application, the City highly recommends adding a cover letter indicating the intent of the application, which is to determine if the project is exempt from the Water Sustainability Act based on the QEP's findings.

Good morning everyone,

In lieu of having to cancel our meeting yesterday, I wanted to reach out and give you some general guidance, to ensure that we have consistent measures and reporting coming in. We will still have a briefing later on (hopefully not too long from now) but in the meantime I didn't want to leave you high and dry (ha ha)

**Firstly**: I would like to encourage you to have any colleagues who also identify themselves as Wetland ecologists / specialists to get in touch with me so that I can add them to the list. I know you are all slammed and the demand for wetland specialists is only going to get more intense. Thank you for handling this influx of work so well, I very much appreciate your efforts!

**Secondly**: here are some good things to go into your review knowing:

- 1. When you are retained to complete a wetland peer review, please contact me directly via e-mail or over the phone to get a debrief of the history of the project.
- 2. When you are doing a wetland peer review, send your original reporting to the City of Surrey at the same time that you send it to the client.
  - a. The client should not have the ability to edit or change your reporting.
  - b. The client in this case **includes** the City of Surrey.
- 3. The primary QEP is expected to fully brief you on the scope of the project and give you any and all proposed drawings of the development.
- 4. You are not expected to 'only' look at wetlands. If you note that no wetlands are present, but that the headwaters for a watercourse have been inaccurately mapped (for example), it is your responsibility to provide your professional opinion.
  - a. If you are not comfortable with identifying watercourses etc., this is fine. However, your observations in the field are valuable and encouraged in the reporting.
- 5. If you find a wetland that has not been accurately mapped, it is your responsibility to flag it in the field.
- 6. It is important for you to understand the 'Water Sustainability Act'; a "natural source of water" includes interflow, seepages, and groundwater interaction and/or recharge.
- 7. It is not your responsibility as the peer reviewer to provide setback information. This is the responsibility of the primary QEP.
- 8. If you are tasked with looking at a disturbed wetland, it is the scope of work to determine if there is **rationale** to support the fact that a wetland was there prior to the disturbance.
  - a. This is particularly important when you are hired to investigate a potential violation of provincial and municipal regulations.
  - b. It is appropriate to include potential rationale for why a wetland may not have been present, however if a wetland was present the applicant will be required to manage this with the Province.

Good afternoon Malissa,

I believe you might be out for the day – but wanted to provide the Ministry with an update of the City of Surrey's understanding of the project associated with a WSA Approval (Tracking # 2005354; Approval attached).

Early this year, I was able to review the Project's environmental report and determined that there was reason to believe that a large portion of the north half of the site is a seasonal swamp. Additionally, I found that the QEP had not provided adequate information to prove that the watercourses on the property were not fish-bearing (Class A or A/O).

I visited the property and confirmed that much of the north of the property is indeed a wetland, likely a Ws54 or something similar (didn't do a full wetland assessment). Discussions with the QEP on-site led to him hiring a qualified wetland ecologist to confirm that there is, in fact, a large wetland complex in this area.

We have no documentation of this information as of yet, however it would significantly change the project scope and what the City's understanding of setbacks would be. I wanted to give the Ministry a heads up that the compensation values associated with this WSA Approval will likely need to change as a result of these updated field assessments.

Please give me a call if you have any questions, and I am sure that the QEP (Sartori Environmental) will keep the Ministry updated as documentation becomes available.





The WSA does not necessarily apply to ditches that are protected under the RAPR. This is because each regulation has slightly different definitions of what is a stream. I think this is a confusing point for a lot of people, and one day it would be nice to have the definitions consistent between the two. An application that would trigger a RAPR is any residential, commercial, or industrial development within 30m of a watercourse (as defined by RAPR). I believe developers/QEP's submit a notification to the RAPR team and then the RAPR team notifies the Municipality issuing the development permit.

It has been determined that this ditch *does not* meet the requirements of a stream, under the Water Sustainability Act, and nor do the dug-outs and ponds on the property. This decision was reached based on the lack of a natural waterway present from 1949 Aerial images. In addition, contour lines show no significant natural contour for water to flow in any direction in this location. It has been determined that the ditch was made for runoff from 24<sup>th</sup> Avenue when this road was constructed, and did not replace or alter any existing waterway.

Re: Notice of Requirement of a *Water Sustainability Act* Approval application for Unnamed Watercourse on s.22 Surrey, BC

Thank you for your inquiry regarding the proposed works on the Unnamed Watercourse generally located \$.22 on the south side of Bentley Road.

A stream under the Water Sustainability Act (WSA) is defined as:

- (a) A natural watercourse, including a natural glacier course, or a natural body of water, whether or not the stream channel of the stream has been modified, or
- (b) A natural source of water supply, including, without limitation, a lake, pond, river, creek, spring, ravine, gulch, wetland or glacier, whether or not usually containing water, including ice, but does not include an aquifer.

It is our understanding that this watercourse (unnamed tributary to Barker/Bolivar Creek, a fish bearing stream, as located in Figure 1 below) meets the definition of a WSA stream. You are hereby requested to submit a WSA Approval application to our office for any changes that you are proposing to this stream. Reasons for this determination are outlined below.

### Information provided to FLNRORD by Qualified Professionals:

- Envirowest identified sustained flow of water within the ditch after 3 days of dry weather in November 2019; Email from Rolf Sickmuller on February 20, 2020.
- Envirowest indicating the channel is capturing and conveying 'natural occurring water' to a downstream channel; Email from Rolf Sickmuller on November 21, 2019.
- A statement from Envirowest that flow is apparent in the ditch up to approximately five days after rainfall; Letter from Ian Whyte on April 20, 2020.
- Envirowest concluded in a letter from Ian Whyte on April 20, 2020 that the primary source of flow in the ditch is from drain-tiles originating at existing residential structures and that delayed flow is a result of 2 main characteristics:

Suite 200, 10428 - 153 St

Surrey BC V3R 1E1

- Soil compaction adjacent to the building slows the infiltration such that water that is transported from the rooftops is stored in soil and slowly released after rainfall ends.
- Lack of maintenance on the building drainage system results in clogged gutters and downspouts which hold back water that slowly sleeps to the adjacent ditch.
- The local drainage patterns and characterization of hydrologic flow from the site of interest to downstream streams including Barker Creek.

### Rationale provided by Stream Management Team:

Based on the information provided by the qualified professionals, the stream appears to hold and convey water originating upslope up to 5 days after rainfalls, thereby meeting the definition of natural source of water supply.

It is also likely that the subject "ditch" (along with most other ditches in the local area) replaces historical tributaries and stream channels that once conveyed flows to Barker Creek. Based on this understanding, the ditch would be considered a modified watercourse, which is also included in the definition of stream under the WSA.

Additionally, the unnamed watercourse also meets the definition of a stream as defined by the BC Riparian Areas Protection Regulation (RAPR):

- (a) a watercourse or body of water, whether or not usually containing water, and
- (b) any of the following that is connected by surface flow to a watercourse or body of water referred to in paragraph (a):
  - i) a ditch, whether or not usually containing water;
  - ii) a spring, whether or not usually containing water;
  - iii) a wetland.

If proposed works include infill or piping of a RAPR stream to facilitate development/road widening, this can also be another reason the WSA is triggered. We do not support works that will inadvertently impact the protection measures set out by another piece of Provincial legislation. Henceforth, a RAPR stream will be considered a WSA stream when the proposed impacts are to move, modify or infill that stream. However, if RAPR setbacks are adhered to per the local bylaws, then WSA authorization would likely not be required.

If you wish to further discuss the matter of jurisdiction of a stream under the WSA, please have an appropriately qualified professional respond to the questions outlined in the appendix to this letter. Please submit your responses to our general inbox (WaterActReferrals.LowerMainland@gov.bc.ca) for review and consideration.

In the interim, if you do wish to pursue development in and around this stream, I recommend you submit an application to our office as soon as possible to avoid delays in your project timelines while this determination question is being investigated.

At this time, you are reminded that no work in and about a stream shall proceed until such time as a WSA Approval is issued to you from this office.

   Describe their quality and provide explanation as to how the support your findings.
   Please include aerial photos in your response.
- Were there any historic features (streams) present that may have subsequently been modified or replaced by another feature?
- O Where does the stream originate?
- O Where does the stream flow into?
- What is the surrounding hydrology of the area like?
- When is this feature wet? Could climate change or natural process cause any changes?
- o How does water move through the soil during a heavy rainfall?
- What features are currently onsite that assist with managing water on site (e.g., ponds, drainage ditches, drainage outlet, buried drain lines, surface inlet with groundwater outlet) that may be on a modified landscape, indicative of a historical natural landscape with a variety of water features (i.e., groundwater depressions, springs, streams, oxbows, ponds, wetlands, etc.)?

Thank you for your recent inquiry regarding the application of Riparian Areas Protection Regulation (RAPR) standards in the City of Surrey. We understand that you are seeking confirmation on process to ensure that Surrey's review of RAPR subject projects continues to follow the standard of the regulation.

As a local government subject to the RAPR, Surrey is required to use their bylaw powers to protect habitat in accordance with the regulation. Surrey's Sensitive Ecosystems Development Permit Area (DPA) currently includes a Streamside Areas Protection component designed to meet or exceed the standards of the RAPR. Local governments subject to the regulation have the ability to implement such a scheme as provided for in the *Riparian Areas Protection Act*, specifically section 12(4)(b):

"[a local government must] ensure that its bylaws and permits under Part 14 of the Local Government Act... provide a level of protection that, in the opinion of the local government, is comparable to or exceeds that established by the directive."

Surrey's Streamside Areas Protection bylaw language was developed in consultation with our Ministry and was submitted to ministry staff for review and comment. The wording of this bylaw language combined with Surrey staff's demonstrated knowledge in applying RAPR standards provides a scheme that in the opinion of the Province clearly meets the standard of *meeting or exceeding* the regulation. We understand that the design of this DPA considered the significant volume of development projects that are subject to the RAPR within the City of Surrey. This DPA language creates an efficient way of ensuring regulatory compliance without the necessity of submitting each project for review and approval by the ministry. This approach is similar to those taken by the majority of lower mainland local governments subject to the RAPR; Surrey being the largest of these by a significant margin.

Surrey's bylaw standards provide pre-established setbacks from most watercourses that are supported by a Qualified Environmental Professionals (QEPs) developed comprehensive stream network map and accompanied by detailed requirements for streamside protection. In the majority of cases RAPR assessment reports prepared by QEPs are therefore not required for regulatory compliance. This process depends directly on staff review of applications to ensure that compliance with bylaws is maintained.

We understand that Surrey has recently directed that city staff suspend their review of development submissions and instead apply the standard of the RAPR directly, specifically by requiring the provision of RAPR assessment reports by QEPs to the Province. This is an option available to Surrey to meet RAPR requirements however you should be aware of the following:

- Each project that constitutes development as defined in the RAPR will require a RAPR assessment report prepared by a QEP be submitted to the ministry for review and approval. We are aware that Surrey's historical process (before the implementation of the current DPA) was to receive RAR assessment reports directly. This process is no longer supported by the revised regulation, nor is the historical practice of "third party" review of assessment reports.
- The RAPR was amended in November 2019 and now provides a more detailed standard for report review. The Ministry has the authority to reject any assessment report that fails to meet assessment standards and withhold notification to local government until the deficiencies are rectified. When following RAPR process directly, any development approved without this mandatory notification fails to meet regulatory requirements. Notifications are no longer issued automatically upon report submission.
- The Ministry will not review any permit materials forwarded by Surrey for compliance
  with regulatory standards (for example, development permit applications and supporting
  material that were previously reviewed by Surrey staff). Assessment reports must be
  submitted directly to the Ministry by the QEP using the online notification system.
  Materials that are not submitted through the notification system do not constitute
  assessment reports as required in the regulation.
- The recent amendments to the RAPR provide for increased oversight of the professional reliance model that supports the regulation. A significant change is that a QEP may no longer certify that a given development meets the standard of the regulation based on their professional opinion unless it specifically conforms with the language of the regulation.
- The Ministry currently reviews 100% of all assessment reports submitted in the order that they are received. The RAPR does not contain statutory requirements for time limitations with respect to report review. As the volume of submissions from Surrey is expected to be significant, report review timelines would be extended as a consequence.

In summary, to meet regulatory requirements, Surrey must either be in receipt of a notification from the Ministry for each subject development that a QEP RAPR report has been received, reviewed, and approved, or apply their existing DPA specifications and associated staff review to that development.

We appreciate your efforts to ensure that Surrey's development approvals process continues to meet provincial requirements. Please don't hesitate to contact our office if you have further questions or require clarification.



I was involved in some pre-app discussions on this project but it was mainly to do with their on-site stormwater management requirements (flow, volume, release) and off-site servicing. This is an awkward property where it is downhill sloping with no legal frontage on 60 Avenue, so they are proposing a private service connection from the existing golf-course site through the neighbouring strata and an emergency pumped connection to Fraser Hwy. Attached is the latest plan that I have seen showing the on-site ponds were going to stay. I seem to recall they were going to use the ponds as part of their onsite detention but they had not provided details of on-site yet. From COSMOS and as-builts, there is an existing 450mm storm connection to 60 Avenue, but don't have records of how it connects to the on-site system or how it services the existing Greenside Estates. Since it is on-site, Engineering does not typically have copies to these plans as they are reviewed and issued as part of the Building/Plumbing permit. I can try and look through Laserfische if you would like me too, otherwise Dave Orsetti can usually find background from past BP's I'm sure. Citiwest's attached plan does show connections from the existing ponds to the 450mm connection on 60 Avenue, but it's not clear whether this is survey of existing or proposed.

Can you provide a little background to us on this. John originally was in contact with our groundwater officer, Shirley, to ask if he could infill this southern pond, which is or used to be a storm water detention pond. Shirley forwarded the inquiry onto me and I did a little digging. It appears there are two detention ponds on this property, a northern one with water and a southern one that they say goes dry, that they want to infill. It seemed he was under the impression he could come into the office and just have us say "yes" go ahead and infill the pond.

- 1. Does this company have a rezoning application in for this lot? And if so, what stage is it at? The applicant does have 3<sup>rd</sup> reading for a rezoning / subdivision of this lot, to create townhomes in 2 phases. They were looking to go to Final adoption but cannot until the City sees that they have a WSA Approval in hand. This application was active in 2014 prior to the WSA including isolated ponds; unfortunately the QEP did not revisit this issue until I took a look at it a few weeks ago.
- 2. Was the stormwater ponds for the golf course or the development around it? The ponds were part of the existing golf course, created many years ago. It is my assumption that the deeper pond was meant to be a landscape feature, whereas the southern pond was meant to help reduce flooding in the golf course area. As you know, many golf courses were built on old flood channels / riparian systems, so it makes sense to me that the previous land use would have taken advantage of the southern area. It is possible that they "enhanced" the south pond area by excavating it to allow it to hold more water. It now appears to have fully naturalized.
- 3. Is there any common property around the golf course for that previous development (all the properties around the golf course)? Or was this property reserved as green space for the previous development? It is my understanding that this area was common green space for the surrounding neighbourhood.
- 4. It seems the report attached to the stormwater ponds indicate a Class B system. So I'm curious to know if these are Class B ponds, why an application for a Change Approval wouldn't have just come into us. Are you able to provide a little background on this project and developer? If these ponds are "Class B" then that would indicate that they are connected to pipes or ditches, and if that is the case then our full Ecosystem Development Permit would come into play. The QEP has told me that they think this area is "totally isolated" so .. if you're getting different information then we need to have a conversation with them for sure.

As for why a Change Approval would not have come to you in the first place, this application pre-dates the protection of isolated wetlands; and until I began working for the City in 2018, the Planners had no idea that ponds were protected by Provincial regulation. Luckily, I am looking at all files, regardless of what reading they are at, and was able to catch this one before it was finalized.



The streamside setback required under the Surrey Zoning Bylaw (which had not yet been adopted when the WSA application was submitted) is 25

metres. Extension of the 25 m setback onto adjacent City parkland is considered (by the City) to be an encumbrance that would require some form of compensation to the City. Alternatively, the setback from the approved/reconstructed stream could be addressed by a setback variance, a somewhat lengthy process requiring City Council approval. Rather than deal with either compensation or a variance application, it was decided to propose a modified design based on the approved plan, involving a shift of all new habitat to be at least 25 m from the park boundary.

- 3. **Specifics of the revised plan**. Realignment of the proposed channel (to maintain a 25 m offset from the park boundary) resulted in a reduction in channel and pond areas. The amended plan achieves the same extent of new wetted habitat (original: 262 m2 of new channel and 260 m2 of new pond; amended 163 m2 of new channel and 344 m2 of new pond). The approved and amended plans are shown in Drawing No. 1774-01-10 (attached). Below is a screenshot of our general observations. I've also attached 4 representative photos.

These are obviously very general lines that were not surveyed or flagged in the field. The City will require that the QEP employs a wetland specialist to help confirm the boundaries of the swamp on the property; it would be beneficial for s.16 site to the west to use the same wetland report, as it appears that the swamp also exists on that property as well. In an updated Ecosystem Development Plan, the City is going to require:

- 1. a full wetland assessment be completed, which will need to include mapping and photos of soil observations, as well as hydrologic and ecological rationale;
- 2. a hydrology report to support their development plans;
- 3. a full discussion with Parks regarding the P-15 agreement that will be required for the proposed pond works, which Parks was not privy to;
  - a. an understanding that the City will not accept compensation within an existing wetland habitat and Class A feature; and

4. an updated RAPR report, complete with a windthrow assessment.

I note in the initial letters you sent me that it appeared to be quite a different year from a precipitation and regulatory perspective, when Envirowest initially did a site assessment. I would also point out that the 'non-stream' drainage feature that is discussed in the letter seems to be the wetland area and unmapped Class B streams that we observed on-site.

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- 2. Rationale for changes. As proposed and approved, the realigned channel and pond would occur within approximately 10 metres of the property's east boundary (adjacent to City park). The streamside setback required under the Surrey Zoning Bylaw (which had not yet been adopted when the WSA application was submitted) is 25 metres. Extension of the 25 m setback onto adjacent City parkland is considered (by the City) to be an encumbrance that would require some form of compensation to the City. Alternatively, the setback from the approved/reconstructed stream could be addressed by a setback variance, a somewhat lengthy process requiring City Council approval. Rather than deal with either compensation or a variance application, it was decided to propose a modified design based on the approved plan, involving a shift of all new habitat to be at least 25 m from the park boundary.
- 3. **Specifics of the revised plan**. Realignment of the proposed channel (to maintain a 25 m offset from the park boundary) resulted in a reduction in channel and pond areas. The amended plan achieves the same extent of new wetted habitat (original: 262 m2 of new channel and 260 m2 of new pond; amended 163 m2 of new channel and 344 m2 of new pond). The approved and amended plans are shown in Drawing No. 1774-01-10 (attached). In order to achieve the habitat balance, the lower end of the unnamed tributary is also realigned to a pond that will be shared/contiguous with the Fergus Creek channel. Riparian enhancements will be to the same extent as approved.
- 4. **Other design amendments**. Several positive changes accompany the amended works. These include retention of approximately half of the Fergus Creek Tributary near the north end of the site (as approved, this was completely infilled), retention of more trees adjacent to Fergus Creek (in order to avoid a setback variance), and an increase of approximately 1,738 m2 of protected park area.
- 5. **Overall net benefits**. The amended plan widens the Fergus Creek setback adjacent to the development (originally designed to be RAR-compliant; now widened to comply with the City's Zoning Bylaw) by about 11.1 metres, and increases the total protected park/habitat area by 16.5%.

Please consider these proposed amendment and advise us of their acceptability. If you are agreeable there are design drawing changes that can be made fairly quickly. Also, if agreeable I can provide you with the detailed description of the changes to be made in and about the stream to aid in your processing of the request.

Surrey has stated that they will require that the QEP employs a wetland specialist to help confirm the boundaries of the swamp on the property, including the<sup>s.16</sup> site to the west.

In an updated Ecosystem Development Plan, the City is going to require:

- 1. a full wetland assessment be completed, which will need to include mapping and photos of soil observations, as well as hydrologic and ecological rationale;
- 2. a hydrology report to support their development plans;
- 3. a full discussion with Parks regarding the P-15 agreement that will be required for the proposed pond works, which Parks was not privy to;
  - a. an understanding that the City will not accept compensation within an existing wetland habitat and Class A feature; and
- 4. an updated RAPR report, complete with a windthrow assessment.
