DESCRIPTION OF THE Collaborative Stewardship Framework:

The Collaborative Stewardship Framework (CSF), "the Project", is intended to be a way of working with Indigenous governments and communities that supports the collaborative design and delivery of natural resource stewardship in the province. It seeks to advance both environmental sustainability and reconciliation, and in its initial three years, will involve five regionally based forums across the province.

Through this initial work, a forum governance structure based on consensus decision-making and one or more stewardship projects will be co-designed and implemented, building the groundwork for long-term collaborative stewardship work together.

Description of the Project:

The purpose of this Agreement is to provide financial support to the Organization to participate in the implementation of the Project as outlined in this Agreement and under the Memorandum of Understanding with the Nicola Bands dated March 23, 2018 The purpose of the Project is the Nicola Watershed Pilot.

The Nicola Watershed Pilot will focus on improving watershed governance and management by addressing key water related issues; building relationships with local First Nations, local governments and stakeholders; and, supporting innovative policy development. The pilot will be delivered through the above noted MOU. Partnership funds will be administered by the Scw'exmx Tribal Council (STA) as request by the Nicola Bands participating in the MOU. These funds specifically support First Nations capacity to engage in the Nicola Watershed Pilot. This funding will be used to hire more resources to support the project and support the staff already hired under previous agreements.

The Forum Lead for the Project is Tammy Caruso (FLNRORD) and Nadia Joe (Nicola First Nations).

#### 1.2 CONFIDENTIALITY

The Scw'exmx Tribal Council will treat as confidential all information and material supplied to or obtained by the Scw'exmx Tribal Council, or any third party, as a result of this Agreement and will not, without the prior written consent of the Province, except as required by applicable law, permit its disclosure except to the extent that such disclosure is necessary to enable the Recipient to fulfill its obligations under this Agreement.

#### 1.3 INSPECTION

The Scw'exmx Tribal Council will permit the Province's representatives at all reasonable times and with sufficient notice, access to review the work done by the Scw'exmx Tribal Council in connection with the Project, except for any material deemed culturally sensitive by the Scw'exmx Tribal Council.

#### 1.4 INDEMNITY

The Scw'exmx Tribal Council must indemnify and save harmless the Province, its employees and agents, from and against any and all losses, claims, damages, actions, causes of action, cost and expenses that the Province may sustain, incur, suffer or be put to at any time either before or after the expiration or termination of this Agreement, where the same or any of them are based upon, arise out of or occur, directly or indirectly, by reason of any act or omission of the Scw'exmx Tribal Council, or of any agent, employee, officer, director or sub-contractor of the Scw'exmx Tribal Council pursuant to this Agreement, excepting always liability arising out of the independent negligent acts of the Province.

#### 1.5 APPROPRIATION

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, the payment of money by the Province to the Scw'exmx Tribal Council pursuant to this Agreement is subject to:

(a) there being sufficient monies available in an appropriation, as defined in the <u>Financial Administration Act</u> (the <u>Financial</u>

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Administration Act and every amendment made thereto being collectively called the "Act"), to enable the Province, in any fiscal year or part thereof when any payment of money by the Province to the Scw'exmx Tribal Council falls due pursuant to this Agreement, to make that payment; and

(b) Treasury Board, as defined in the Act, not having controlled or limited, pursuant to the Act, expenditure under any appropriation referred to in the preceding subparagraph.

The Scw'exmx Tribal Council must make all reasonable efforts to respond to *ad hoc* requests by the Province for information on Project progress. The Recipient must also advise the Province immediately of any substantial events that could impact the Project timeline.

#### **Progress Reports**

The Scw'exmx Tribal Council will:

Provide yearly **Progress Reports**, in electronic format, no later than March 15, 2020, that includes project highlights and a description of outcomes with respect to results and deliverables set out in Schedule A. Include a description of the accomplishments / success of the Project, challenges faced and solutions found, information on results (negative or positive) that were not anticipated, and lessons learned.

A Progress Report template will be provided by the Province.

#### Financial Reporting:

Financial Reporting will be done in concert with progress reporting on an annual basis.

The Scw'exmx Tribal Council must no later than March 15, 2020, provide a yearly **Financial Report** in an electronic form of the reporting template provided by the Province, including:

- a Project income and expenditure summary which identifies all sources and use of the total Project funds until March 31, 2020; and,
- a statement detailing the use of the Province's Financial contribution provided over the duration of the year, including an explanation of any financial variances.

#### **SCHEDULE B - PAYMENT**

#### 1.1 UNUSED OR SURPLUS FUNDS

At the sole discretion of the Province, any unused or surplus funds from the Project may be forwarded to future aspects of the Project.

#### SCHEDULE C - ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

#### 1.1 INDEPENDENT RELATIONSHIP

The Scw'exmx Tribal Council will not be the servant, employee, or agent of the Province. The Scw'exmx Tribal Council will not in any manner whatsoever commit or purport to commit the Province to the payment of any money to any person, firm, or corporation.

#### 1.2 CONFIDENTIALITY

The Scw'exmx Tribal Council will treat as confidential all information and material supplied to or obtained by the Scw'exmx Tribal Council, or any third party, as a result of this Agreement and will not, without the prior written consent of the Province, except as required by applicable law, permit its disclosure except to the extent that such disclosure is necessary to enable the Recipient to fulfill its obligations under this Agreement.

#### 1.3 INSPECTION

The Scw'exmx Tribal Council will permit the Province's representatives at all reasonable times and with sufficient notice, access to review the work done by the Scw'exmx Tribal Council in connection with the Project, except for any material deemed culturally sensitive by the Scw'exmx Tribal Council.

#### 1.4 INDEMNITY

The Scw'exmx Tribal Council must indemnify and save harmless the Province, its employees and agents, from and against any and all losses, claims, damages, actions, causes of action, cost and expenses that the Province may sustain, incur, suffer or be put to at any time either before or after the expiration or termination of this Agreement, where the same or any of them are based upon, arise out of or occur, directly or indirectly, by reason of any act or omission of the Scw'exmx Tribal Council, or of any agent, employee, officer, director or sub-contractor of the Scw'exmx Tribal Council pursuant to this Agreement, excepting always liability arising out of the independent negligent acts of the Province.

#### 1.5 APPROPRIATION

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, the payment of money by the Province to the Scw'exmx Tribal Council pursuant to this Agreement is subject to:

- (a) there being sufficient monies available in an appropriation, as defined in the <u>Financial Administration Act</u> (the <u>Financial Administration Act</u> and every amendment made thereto being collectively called the "Act"), to enable the Province, in any fiscal year or part thereof when any payment of money by the Province to the Scw'exmx Tribal Council falls due pursuant to this Agreement, to make that payment; and
- (b) Treasury Board, as defined in the Act, not having controlled or limited, pursuant to the Act, expenditure under any appropriation referred to in the preceding subparagraph.

# Nicola Watershed Governance Project Memorandum of Understanding (the "MOU")

#### BETWEEN:

The Upper Nicola Band of the Okanagan (Syilx) Nation and the Lower Nicola, Coldwater, Nooaitch and Shackan Bands of the Nlaka'pamux Nation, (collectively the "Nicola Bands") as represented by their Chiefs and Councils ("Nicola Chiefs").

#### AND:

Her Majesty the Queen in right of the Province of British Columbia (the "Province"), as represented by the Minister of Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation, the Minister of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations, and Rural Development and the Minister of Environment and Climate Change Strategy.

(Each "the Party" and collectively "the Parties")

#### PREAMBLE:

- A. Whereas the Nlaka'pamux and Syilx peoples have never ceded or surrendered their Aboriginal rights and title within their traditional territories, as affirmed by their Nlaka'pamux and Syilx laws and customs and dictated through their oral histories;
- B. Whereas both Parties are committed to the implementation of the Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples Act, (the "Declaration Act");

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- C. Whereas the Nlaka'pamux and Syilx peoples have inherent rights to selfgovernment and self-determination;
- D. Whereas the Nicola Chiefs are the elected representatives of the Nicola Bands of Nlaka'pamux and Syilx peoples of the Nicola Valley;
- E. Whereas the Aboriginal title and rights of the Nlaka'pamux and Syilx peoples are protected through the Constitution Act, 1982, section 35 (1) which states, "The existing aboriginal and treaty rights of the aboriginal peoples of Canada are hereby recognized and affirmed";
- F. The Province has an ongoing duty to consult with the Nicola Bands in a manner consistent with the honour of the Crown and where appropriate, to accommodate the Nlaka'pamux and Syilx peoples and when contemplating conduct that could adversely impact their Aboriginal title or rights; and
- G. The Parties entered into the Nicola Watershed Pilot Memorandum of Understanding in March 2018 (the "Pilot MOU") and have been working together in a government to government partnership to develop and pilot governance structure to sustainably manage water resources within the Nicola Watershed:
- H. The Parties wish to extend and strengthen their commitments to the development and implementation of collaborative and sustainable governance structures for water resources in the Nicola Watershed by replacing the Pilot MOU with this MOU.
- The Parties recognize that sufficient, reliable, and sustainable funding is required for the goals, objectives, and obligations under this MOU to be fulfilled.
- J. The Province recognizes the leadership the Nicola Chiefs have demonstrated by securing significant funding commitments and other forms of support from third parties.

#### Therefore the Parties' mutual intentions are as follows:

#### 1.0 VISION

- 1.1 Recognizing the importance and interconnection of water to the health of human communities, ecosystems and the economy, the Province and the Nicola Chiefs will work in partnership, and through engagement of stakeholders, to sustainably govern water resources in the Nicola Watershed using collaboration, innovation, and creativity for the benefit of future generations.
- 1.2 In doing so, the Parties acknowledge the distinct perspectives each brings to the partnership, arising from their respective legal traditions and governance systems, including as follows:

## Nlaka'pamux and Syilx peoples of the Nicola Valley

The relationship and responsibility of the Nlaka'pamux and Syilx peoples to lands, territories and water is the fundamental physical, cultural, and spiritual basis for our existence. Our peoples recognize water as a sacred entity and relative that connects all life.

We thus have a duty and responsibility to ensure that the water can maintain all of its relationships, known and unknown, by using and stewarding the water according to Nlaka'pamux and Syilx law as dictated through our oral histories and creation stories. These stories are embedded in our

#### Province of British Columbia

The Water Sustainability Act is British Columbia's principal law for protecting, managing and using water efficiently throughout the province. Given the pressures of a growing population, a changing climate and expanding development, we must take steps to ensure our supply of fresh, clean water is sustainable – not just to meet our needs today, but for generations to come.

The Water Sustainability Act was brought into effect on February 29, 2016 to help ensure that British Columbia's water stays healthy and secure for future generations. It legislatively enables the development of unique, area-based

culture and language, and play a vital role in teachings about Nlaka'pamux and Syilx laws, customs, values, governance structures and principles that, together, define and inform Nlaka'pamux and Syilx rights and responsibilities to the land and to our culture.

Our laws include Nlaka'pamux and Syilx principles regarding the relationship of humans to the non-human world, procedural requirements, and substantive legal rights and responsibilities.

Just as water connects all life,
Nlaka'pamux and Syilx rights and
responsibilities extend to all aspects of
our territories and peoples.
New water collaborative governance
approaches in the Nicola Valley are
intended by the Nicola Chiefs to be a first
step toward broader recognition of
Nlaka'pamux and Syilx jurisdiction and
legal authority.

approaches to managing watersheds, expanding the potential for new leadership and approaches to watershed governance in BC. Key provisions in the act focus on protecting environmental flows; enabling objective setting to protect water quality, water quantity and aquatic ecosystems; planning at the watershed level; and managing during water shortage.

The Declaration Act was passed in November 2019. It requires that government, in consultation with indigenous peoples, prepare and implement an action plan and to ensure the laws of British Columbia are consistent with the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples. It also enables the Province to enter into agreements with an Indigenous governing body, including in relation to joint and consent-based statutory decision making.

1.3 The Parties' shared vision of collaborative water governance is one that embodies a government-to-government relationship between them, supports the implementation of UNDRIP, draws on the strengths of their respective laws and governance systems, and respects both Indigenous knowledge and best available science in planning and decision-making about water.

#### 2.0 PRINCIPLES

- 2.1 In seeking to achieve the goals and objectives expressed in the MOU, the Parties agree to be guided by the following principles:
  - a) The Parties will act in an open, good faith and transparent manner;
  - The Parties are committed to a respectful relationship that is focused on collaboration and negotiation as the preferable path to reconciliation;
  - c) The Parties will apply a joint solution-building approach that is cooperative, collaborative and strive for consensus-based decisions;
  - d) The Parties will prioritize the goals and objectives expressed in the MOU and dedicate time, expertise, key decision makers and technical support to achieve them; and
  - e) The Parties will explore decision-making processes and water sustainability measures that are consistent with the Parties' shared vision.

#### 3.0 GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

- 3.1 The goal of this MOU is to establish a government to government partnership to develop and recommend a governance approach to sustainably manage water resources within the Nicola Watershed, informed by Nlaka'pamux and Syilx law, and the relevant legislative framework, including the *Declaration Act* and the *Water Sustainability Act*. Tools under these laws include, but are not limited to:
  - Agreements under section 7 of the Declaration Act enabling statutory decisions to be made jointly by the Province and Indigenous governing bodies or with the consent of Indigenous governing bodies, subject to the requirements set out in that section;
  - Regulation under s. 126 of the Water Sustainability Act to recognizing the decision-making authority of a governance body

- developed through this partnership in relation to specified powers and duties;
- c) The development of a comprehensive Water Sustainability Plan under the Water Sustainability Act for the Nicola Watershed; and
- d) Establishment of mutually agreed-to water objectives for the Nicola Watershed under s. 43 of the Water Sustainability Act, including factors and criteria for evaluating the impacts of a land use or resource use proposal on objectives, and measures to address impacts of proposals on the objectives.
- 3.2 The Parties have established a Government to Government Forum to inform the development and recommendation of a governance structure or structures for the Nicola Watershed. The Parties, through the Government to Government Forum as appropriate, may:
  - a) identify issues and develop solutions that address specific water management concerns in the Nicola Watershed;
  - b) develop work plans, including timelines, for the development of relevant elements including, but not limited to:
    - Indigenous law and knowledge research and analysis by the Nicola Bands to inform their participation in the Government to Government Forum, and
    - processes for engagement of Nlaka'pamux and Syilx communities and individuals, the public and stakeholders;
  - identify the gaps, challenges and capacity development requirements
     with respect to the management water sources for all users;
  - d) establish a process for internal and external communications;
  - e) identify and recommend the implementation of appropriate legislative measures, informed by Nlaka'pamux and Syilx laws for managing water

#### resources;

- f) develop recommendations for new provincial policy, legislation and regulations and changes as it relates to the management of water resources; and
- g) establish and oversee technical working groups, subcommittees, or jointly retained experts.
- develop a dispute resolution procedure to address any concerns that may arise from this MOU;
- 3.3 The Government to Government Forum will consist of representatives designated by Nicola Chiefs and representatives designated by the Province. Third party members of the Government to Government Forum will be added with the consent of both Parties.
- 3.4 During the term of this MOU, the Parties will schedule discussions on a quarterly basis, or as otherwise agreed, between their respective senior representatives to discuss issues requiring leadership or guidance, including issues related to joint or consent-based decision-making, development of a Water Sustainability Plan, and revenue sharing.

#### 4.0 FUNDING

- 4.1 The Province acknowledges that the Province holds the primary responsibility for supplying funding to support the implementation of this MOU.
- 4.2 Despite any other provision of this MOU, any payment of money by the Province pursuant to this MOU is subject to:
  - (a) There being sufficient monies available in an appropriation, as defined in the Financial Administration Act, RSBC 1996, c 138, to enable the Province in any fiscal year or part thereof when such payment is required, to make such payment; and

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- (b) Treasury Board not having controlled or limited expenditure, pursuant to the *Financial Administration Act*, under any appropriation necessary in order to make such payment.
- 4.3 The Parties will continue to work together to identify and secure the funding needed to support the full implementation of this MOU and the governance structures and management measures the Parties intend to develop hereunder and implement within the Nicola Watershed.

#### 5.0 GENERAL PROVISIONS

#### 5.1 This MOU:

- Does not constitute a treaty or land claim agreement within the meaning of section 25 or section 35 of the Constitution Act, 1982;
- Does not create, define, limit, recognize, deny, limit, prejudice, amend, abrogate, or derogate from the Aboriginal title or rights or other rights or interests of the Nlaka'pamux and Syilx peoples or the Nicola Bands;
- Does not limit the Parties' position in any legal proceeding or participation in other discussions, negotiations or settlements;
- Does not interfere with, or fetter, the exercise of any authority of either Party;
- e) May not be construed as consultation or consent for any provincial statutory decision;
- f) Is an expression of the mutual intentions of the Parties and, except for section
   5.1, is not legally binding upon the Parties;
- g) May be amended in writing by mutual agreement of the Parties; and
- May be executed in two or more counterparts, each of which will be deemed to be an original and all of which will constitute one MOU.

#### 6.0 TERM

- 6.1 The MOU will take effect on the last date it is signed by all of the Parties.
- 6.2 The term of the MOU is one year. The Parties may extend the term of the MOU in writing no less than 60 days before the end of the term.
- 6.3 The provisions of this MOU may be amended with the written consent of all Parties.
- 6.4 The Parties may terminate this MOU with 30 days' written notice where either Party believes the goals and objectives are not being met in a satisfactory matter.
- 6.5 Prior to a Party exercising their right to terminate this MOU, the Parties will make good faith efforts to resolve any concern or dispute through dispute resolution procedures developed by the Government to Government Forum.
- 6.6 If a dispute resolution process has not yet been developed by the Government to Government Forum or if the matter cannot be resolved through such a process the Parties shall meet in-person with one or more Ministers of the Province and one or more of the Nicola Chiefs.

DESCRIPTION OF THE Collaborative Stewardship Framework:

The Collaborative Stewardship Framework (CSF), "the Project", is intended to be a way of working with Indigenous governments and communities that supports the collaborative design and delivery of natural resource stewardship in the province. It seeks to advance both environmental sustainability and reconciliation, and in its initial three years, will involve five regionally based forums across the province.

Through this initial work, a forum governance structure based on consensus decision-making and one or more stewardship projects will be co-designed and implemented, building the groundwork for long-term collaborative stewardship work together.

Description of the Project:

The purpose of this Agreement is to provide financial support to the Organization to participate in the implementation of the Project as outlined in this Agreement and under the Memorandum of Understanding with the Nicola Bands dated March 23, 2018 The purpose of the Project is the Nicola Watershed Pilot.

The Nicola Watershed Pilot will focus on improving watershed governance and management by addressing key water related issues; building relationships with local First Nations, local governments and stakeholders; and, supporting innovative policy development. The pilot will be delivered through the above noted MOU. Partnership funds will be administered by the Scw'exmx Tribal Council (STA) as request by the Nicola Bands participating in the MOU. These funds specifically support First Nations capacity to engage in the Nicola Watershed Pilot. This funding will be used to hire more resources to support the project and support the staff already hired under previous agreements.

The Forum Lead for the Project is Tammy Caruso (FLNRORD) and Naida Joe (Nicola First Nations).
