Good afternoon,

Yesterday was one of B.C.'s busiest wildfire days in recent memory. We had 141 confirmed wildfire starts across the province, primarily in the central interior. Lightning, high temperatures, and strong winds were contributing factors where these conditions are expected to persist over the coming week. Many of these wildfires are demonstrating aggressive wildfire behaviour. The BC Wildfire Service and local emergency services are responding to wildfire and working to keep the public and our communities safe.

In light of the above, a <u>Provincial state of emergency</u> has been declared as of yesterday at 9:30pm. The Province is taking this extraordinary measure given the current wildfire situation and the expected increase in wildfire activity. The state of emergency gives agencies such as Emergency Management BC, the Office of the Fire Commissioner, the Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations, and the RCMP authority under <u>Section 9(1)</u> of the <u>Emergency Program Act</u> to take every action necessary to fight these wildfires and protect residents and their communities. The situation is very dynamic and requires that we have every tool available to best quickly address needs as they arise. It is critical to ensure that government has the ability to access resources that may be needed to assist with wildfire fighting efforts.

The BC Wildfire Service (BCWS) has a process in place to manage this emerging situation, on top of fully utilizing our TEAMS model (Tier 1/2 access), the BCWS is engaging with local governments, agencies, fire departments, and regional management teams to ensure the Province is responding to this unique situation. A resource request through the Canadian Interagency Forest Fire Centre (CIFFC) has been made that will bring in 260 personnel and 5 aircraft from out-of-province and will be in BC on Monday and Tuesday. While the BCWS has a process to respond effectively through this unique Provincial state of emergency, I ask that we 'stand at the ready' and support the BCWS as needed. **As such, I am also cancelling the all staff call planned for Tuesday to allow us all to focus on the support needed for the emerging fire situation, as well as our other ongoing priorities.**

For our first responders and those immediately impacted by the wildfires, I want to reiterate the need to be safe. It is critical that we take the time to evaluate the situation, look out for one another

and ensure that safety remains paramount.

On behalf of FLNRO Executive, the Province and, by extension, the residents of the affected fire areas, I'd like to thank the BC Wildfire Service and the ministry staff that support them in the work they do.

Relay Tanks

1500 and 2500 Imperial Gallon Relay Tank Specifications

The BC Wildfire program utilizes self-supporting relay tanks for providing portable water supplies that can be filled by helicopter bucket, hose line or tanker truck. Relay tanks are also often used as a source of water for helicopter bucketing operations, when natural water sources are scarce.

SIZING

Capacity:

1500 Imperial gallons or 6800 litres 2500 Imperial gallons or 11350 litres

Outside Base Diameter:

1500 Imperial gallon = approximately 11 feet or 3.5 metres 2500 Imperial gallon = approximately 13 feet or 4.2 metres

Inside Collar Diameter:

1500 Imperial gallon = approximately 7 feet or 2.1 metres 2500 Imperial gallon = approximately 9 feet or 2.6 metres

Sidewall Height (filled):


