#### Issue:

FLNR's role in reducing greenhouse gas-emissions and adapting to a changing climate

## Background:

- Climate change is irreversible. Most aspects of climate change will persist for centuries even if emissions of greenhouse gases are greatly reduced.
- Reducing greenhouse gas emissions and preparing for the unavoidable effects of climate change are both necessary.
- Adaptation:
  - B.C. has completed a Preliminary Strategic Climate Risk Assessment evaluating 15 climate related risks to the province. A severe wildfire season and a seasonal water shortage are the two highest-ranked risks facing the province overall. Additional risks most likely to impact FLNR include long-term water shortages, reduction in ecosystem connectivity, loss of forest resources, increase in invasive species, nuisance flooding, severe riverine flooding, and extreme precipitation and landslides.
  - Investing in resilience makes economic sense. Analysis suggests benefit-cost rations of 38:1 to 9:1.

#### Mitigation

- Our global strategy of reducing fossil fuel emissions will not be sufficient to reach our mitigation targets. Using nature to remove and sequester carbon dioxide from the atmosphere is essential.
- Forests can be enhanced as "carbon sinks" through actions such as planting more trees and fertilizing stands, reducing slash-pile burning, minimizing losses from fires, restoring forests that have been affected by natural disturbances and increasing forests' resilience to fire and pests.
- Forest products also sequester carbon and can substitute for other materials that generate more emissions during their production and are an important part of the solution.
- Conserving old growth forests as carbon banks is a strategy within a portfolio of forest-based climate change mitigation options. Not all conservation projects optimize potential carbon benefits. Choosing conservation or managed forest harvesting requires economic and job impacts to be considered along with the benefits for carbon or conservation.
- FLNR has a long history of working successfully with provincial, federal and Indigenous
  partners to reduce climate change impacts to British Columbia's natural resources and
  leverage the opportunities in forests and the forest sector to reduce greenhouse gas
  emissions.

## Issue/Opportunity:

- The CleanBC plan commitments to a climate preparedness strategy in 2020. The Ministry
  of Environment and Climate Change Strategy (ENV) is the lead ministry. FLNR supports this
  work through the Climate Change and Integrated Planning Branch, in the Office of the Chief
  Forester.
- The ministry has a Climate Change Strategy for 2015-2020, a Forest Carbon Strategy for

2016-2020 and Climate Action Plans for major program areas developed between 2013-2018. Updating these documents for 2020-2025 reflects that preparing for a changing climate is a ministry priority and complements ENVs efforts to develop a government wide strategy.

- The federal throne speech re-affirmed the Government of Canada's intention to plant 2 billion trees. B.C. can leverage our successful government reforestation program which contributed to a record of over 300M trees planted in 2020. The Office of the Chief Foster is the point of contact with the federal government and is leading a provincial team that includes Agriculture, ENV and Municipal Affairs and Housing.
- The Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC) is leading initiatives
  focused on conservation, biodiversity preservation and climate change resiliency that have
  implications for Crown land management in B.C. and for the forest sector. FLNR engages
  with ECCC on these items, notably the Clean Fuel Standard Land Use and Biodiversity
  criteria, which has implications for efforts to reduce emissions from slash-pile burning.
- ENV is revising the B.C. Greenhouse Gas Offset Protocol: Forest Carbon (FCOPv2.0), to
  enable forest carbon offset projects under the *Greenhouse Gas Industrial Reporting and*Control Act. FLNR staff and legal counsel have identified important policy considerations
  related to the development of forest carbon offset projects on Crown land that require
  further analysis before government releases an FCOPv2.0 for public consultation.
- There is an ongoing opportunity for Sustainable Forest Management to support solutions
  for climate and the economy. We are working to ensure that B.C. practices reduce
  emissions, sequester more carbon and reduce risks to ensure a steady flow of forest based
  products that provide more economic and climate value than they did in the past.

Subject: For Action: Letter to federal ministers re. partnership on climate adaptation

Good afternoon, ED Steering Committee and IGR colleagues,

The Climate Action Secretariat has drafted the attached letter for Minister Heyman to send to his federal colleagues to open discussions on a provincial-federal partnership on climate adaptation. The letter is addressed to the federal ministers who are responsible for delivering the National Adaptation Strategy, as per the January 21, 2021 federal supplemental mandate letters (Jonathan Wilkinson, Seamus O'Regan, Bill Blair, Catherine McKenna). We have identified three areas for discussion:

- 1. developing a bilateral funding partnership between the Government of Canada and the Government of B.C. to support B.C.'s climate adaptation initiatives;
- 2. placing reconciliation and Indigenous-led development of priorities and programming at the centre of the approach; and
- 3. identifying areas where additional integration and coordination between our governments will bolster our resilience across B.C. communities, sectors, and ecosystems.

We are keenly interested in ensuring this letter and the ensuing discussions are coordinated with our ministry partners and, where there are opportunities, reinforce messaging across F/P touch points. We welcome your input and feedback on the letter including any additional content on F/P program coordination and integration that would benefit climate adaptation. As we did with CleanBC, our goal is to present a strong federal/provincial partnership on climate adaptation when the Climate Preparedness and Adaptation Strategy is released next year.

- Please share this letter with the appropriate IGR contacts in your ministry to ensure they are aware of this initiative and can provide input and advice regarding coordination. Note that I have included IGR contacts where I had them – thanks to those who provided that information.
- Review the letter and respond with your input/feedback by EOD Feb. 22<sup>nd</sup>.
