We continue to engage in educational-outreach, (Camp Squeah, etc.), however our primary focus remains performance for the film & television industry, (ie: "passive education" through various

Age limitations in-place for all hands-on interactions in courses or "meet-and-greet" venues, (where public interactions are concerned), veterinary certification to be renewed May 2019, will - hopefully - be renewed again in July should COVID-19 situation allow us to pursue scheduled work on Vancouver Island at that time. Otherwise, veterinary exams scheduled for mid-December 2020.

Our Golden eagle will not arrive before the Fall of 2021, given current world events, and provided the breeder is able to produce a male, (the males are generally more amenable to working with human stewards).

I have included a Golden eagle (provisionally) in accordance with instructions received from Sean Pendergast in 2015 which among other things noted I need not acquire any special amendment to my existing permit. His specific instructions were that I simply acquire the eagle and include it in my annual report in the appropriate year of its arrival.

We continue to practice the highest obtainable standards for raptor-stewardship, inclusive of high-end housing, diet (Fircrest Farms-bred quail, grass-fed beef, lab-bred mice & rats).

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APPENDIX A TERMS OF PERMIT

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

- 1. The permit holder must maintain an accurate up to date record of the wildlife held under the permit that shows all additions and deletions from the record and that includes the following information:
 - a) the common name of the wildlife;
 - b) the number, sex, maturity and condition of the wildlife;
 - c) the name and address of the person or organization who provided the wildlife;
 - d) the name and address of the person or organization to whom the wildlife was provided, if any;
 - e) the number of the permit under which the wildlife was captured, transported or imported (if applicable); and
 - f) the manner, form, locations and date of marking of wildlife taken from the wild and the number and date of the official receipt for the capture fee
- When a bird is acquired, sold, traded, loaned or given away, the permit holder must maintain an accurate up to date record of the following, as applicable date of transaction, capture permit number, band number, CITES permit number and the permit or licence number of the person acquiring the bird.
- The permit holder must produce a copy of the records referred to in the paragraph's above on the demand of an officer under the Wildlife Act.
- 4. Within 21 days after the expiry date of the permit, the permit holder must submit to FrontCounter BC, Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development a completed Raptor Possession Report in the form attached as Appendix D.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. The permit holder must comply with all laws applicable to the activities carried out under this permit.
- 2. The permit holder must carry this permit on their person when conducting the activities authorized by this permit.
- 3. The permit holder **must** ensure that no other person uses this permit for any recreational or commercial falconry activity. Other persons need their own permit to engage in these activities.
- 4. All raptors held under the authority of this permit must be banded with bands supplied or approved by the Fish and Wildlife Branch. Bands must not to be removed from any bird, alive or dead. Bands are not required for wild caught Sharp-shinned Hawks, Merlins or American Kestrels, but are available and will be supplied upon request.
- 5. The permit holder must take all reasonably necessary steps to ensure that public safety is not jeopardized and fish or wildlife habitat is not damaged by any action taken under authority of the permit.
- 6. The permit holder must ensure that the wildlife are treated in a humane manner, and are not subjected to any unnecessary harm or suffering.
- The permit holder's interest in a Class I or Class II raptor may only be loaned to, transported to or from, given to or received from a holder of a valid possession or capture permit for the appropriate class of raptor.
- 8. The permit holder's interest in a Class I or Class II raptor may only be sold to, bought from, bartered or traded with a holder of a valid trafficking permit for the appropriate class of raptor.

- (j) Hybrids of any of the above (a to i)

GENERAL

 - (b) an animal that escapes or is released from captivity or is abandoned

in British Columbia

Import and export of wildlife

- 21 (1) Except as authorized by a permit issued under this Act or under the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora, a person commits an offence if the person
 - (a) imports into British Columbia live wildlife, or the egg of a wildlife species, or
 - (b) exports out of British Columbia wildlife or parts of them, or the egg of a wildlife species.

Possession of wildlife

- **33** (1) A person commits an offence if the person has live wildlife in his or her personal possession except as authorized under a licence or permit or as provided by regulation.
 - (2) A person commits an offence if the person has dead wildlife or a part of any wildlife in his or her possession except as authorized under a licence or permit or as provided by regulation.

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Failure to provide information

38 A person who fails, on the request of an officer, to state correctly the locality where and the date on which wildlife or fish in the person's possession was killed, taken or caught by the person or came into his or her possession, commits an offence.

Documents not transferable

- **81** Except as authorized by regulation or as otherwise provided under this Act, a licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization is not transferable, and a person commits an offence if the person
 - (a) allows his or her licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization to be used by another person, or
 - (b) uses another person's licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization.

Failure to pay fine

- 85 (1) This section applies if a person

 - (b.1) the person must not apply for employment as an assistant guide,
 - (b.2) the person must not guide as an assistant guide, and
 - (c) the person commits an offence if, before that fine is paid, the person
 - (i) applies for, or in any way obtains, a licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization under this Act,
 - (ii) does anything for which a licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization under this Act is required,
 - (iii) applies for employment as an assistant guide, or
 - (iv) guides as an assistant guide.

Entering premises

- 89 (1) For the purpose of ensuring that this Act and the regulations are being complied with, an officer may enter and inspect any premises or enclosure in which live wildlife or live fish is kept but, at the request of the owner or occupier, the officer must produce proof of identity.
 - (2) Despite the *Trespass Act*, an officer exercising duties under this Act may enter any land, whether enclosed or not but, at the request of the owner or occupier of the land, the officer must produce proof of identity.

Proof of identity and authorization

- 97 (1) In this section, "authorization" means a licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization issued under this Act.
 - (2) Subject to subsection (5), a person who is required to hold an authorization must, on the request of an officer,
 - (a) state the person's name and address,
 - (b) produce prescribed photo identification, and
 - (c) demonstrate in accordance with subsection (3) that the person holds the authorization.
 - (3) A person may demonstrate that the person holds an authorization by
 - (a) producing the authorization, or
 - (b) unless the regulations require that the original authorization be produced,
 - (i) producing a legible copy of the authorization, or
 - (ii) if authorized by the regulations, stating a number assigned to the person by the director as an identification number for the person.
 - (4) Subject to subsection (5), a person who would be required to hold a licence or permit issued under this Act were the person not exempt under section 11 (9) or 12 (b) must, on the request of an officer,
 - (a) state the person's name and address, and
 - (b) produce prescribed photo identification.
 - (5) Subsections (2) (b) and (4) (b) do not apply to a person in a prescribed class of persons.
 - (6) A person who contravenes subsection (2) or (4) commits an offence.

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Permit Regulation

No permit to import certain wildlife

- 7 (1) For the purpose of section 21 of the Act and section 4 (b) of this regulation, a permit must not be issued to authorize the importation of a species of wildlife listed in Schedule 1. Schedule 1 includes
 - (a) all species of eagles that are not indigenous to British Columbia
 - (b) African and Eurasian Eagle-owls

General offence - failure to comply with permit

8 A person who holds a permit under the Act or the Permit Regulation commits an offence if he or she fails to comply with a term of the permit.

Wildlife Act General Regulation

Proof of identity

20.04 (1) For the purposes of section 97 (2)(b) and (4)(b) of the Act, the following photo identification is prescribed:

- (a) valid photo identification issued to a person by any of the following:
 - (i) the government of Canada;
 - (ii) the government of a province or territory, or an agent of the government of a province or territory, in which the person has a current address;
 - (iii) the Nisga'a Lisims Government, if the person is a Nisga'a citizen;
 - (iv) a treaty first nation, if the person is a treaty first nation member of the treaty first nation;
- (b) in the case of a person who is a non-resident alien, valid photo identification in the form of
 - (i) a passport, or
 - (ii) a driver's licence issued to the person by a foreign jurisdiction in which the person has a current address;
- (c) in any case, a valid NEXUS card.
- (2) For the purposes of section 97 (5) of the Act, persons under 16 years of age are prescribed as exempt from the requirement to produce photo identification.

 - c) the name and address of the person or organization who provided the wildlife;
 - d) the name and address of the person or organization to whom the wildlife was provided, if any;
 - e) the number of the permit under which the wildlife was captured, transported or imported (if applicable); and
 - f) the manner, form, locations and date of marking of wildlife taken from the wild and the number and date of the official receipt for the capture fee
- When a bird is acquired, sold, traded, loaned or given away, the permit holder must maintain an accurate up to date record of the following, as applicable date of transaction, capture permit number, band number, CITES permit number and the permit or licence number of the person acquiring the bird.
- The permit holder must produce a copy of the records referred to in the paragraph's above on the demand of an officer under the Wildlife Act.
- 4. Within 21 days after the expiry date of the permit, the permit holder must submit to FrontCounter BC, Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development a completed Raptor Possession Report in the form attached as Appendix D.

- 8. The permit holder's interest in a Class I or Class II raptor may only be sold to, bought from, bartered or traded with a holder of a valid trafficking permit for the appropriate class of raptor.

 - (2) A person commits an offence if the person has dead wildlife or a part of any wildlife in his or her possession except as authorized under a licence or permit or as provided by regulation.

Failure to provide information

38 A person who fails, on the request of an officer, to state correctly the locality where and the date on which wildlife or fish in the person's possession was killed, taken or caught by the person or came into his or her possession, commits an offence.

Documents not transferable

 - (a) allows his or her licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization to be used by another person, or
 - (b) uses another person's licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization.

Failure to pay fine

- 85 (1) This section applies if a person

 - (b.1) the person must not apply for employment as an assistant guide,
 - (b.2) the person must not guide as an assistant guide, and
 - (c) the person commits an offence if, before that fine is paid, the person
 - (i) applies for, or in any way obtains, a licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization under this Act,
 - (ii) does anything for which a licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization under this Act is required,
 - (iii) applies for employment as an assistant guide, or
 - (iv) guides as an assistant guide.

Entering premises

- 89 (1) For the purpose of ensuring that this Act and the regulations are being complied with, an officer may enter and inspect any premises or enclosure in which live wildlife or live fish is kept but, at the request of the owner or occupier, the officer must produce proof of identity.
 - (2) Despite the *Trespass Act*, an officer exercising duties under this Act may enter any land, whether enclosed or not but, at the request of the owner or occupier of the land, the officer must produce proof of identity.

Proof of identity and authorization

- 97 (1) In this section, "authorization" means a licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization issued under this Act.
 - (2) Subject to subsection (5), a person who is required to hold an authorization must, on the request of an officer,
 - (a) state the person's name and address,
 - (b) produce prescribed photo identification, and
 - (c) demonstrate in accordance with subsection (3) that the person holds the authorization.
 - (3) A person may demonstrate that the person holds an authorization by
 - (a) producing the authorization, or
 - (b) unless the regulations require that the original authorization be produced,
 - (i) producing a legible copy of the authorization, or
 - (ii) if authorized by the regulations, stating a number assigned to the person by the director as an identification number for the person.
 - (4) Subject to subsection (5), a person who would be required to hold a licence or permit issued under this Act were the person not exempt under section 11 (9) or 12 (b) must, on the request of an officer,
 - (a) state the person's name and address, and
 - (b) produce prescribed photo identification.
 - (5) Subsections (2) (b) and (4) (b) do not apply to a person in a prescribed class of persons.
 - (6) A person who contravenes subsection (2) or (4) commits an offence.

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Permit Regulation

No permit to import certain wildlife

- 7 (1) For the purpose of section 21 of the Act and section 4 (b) of this regulation, a permit must not be issued to authorize the importation of a species of wildlife listed in Schedule 1. Schedule 1 includes
 - (a) all species of eagles that are not indigenous to British Columbia

General offence - failure to comply with permit

 - (i) a passport, or
 - (ii) a driver's licence issued to the person by a foreign jurisdiction in which the person has a current address;
- (c) in any case, a valid NEXUS card.
- (2) For the purposes of section 97 (5) of the Act, persons under 16 years of age are prescribed as exempt from the requirement to produce photo identification.



APPENDIX A TERMS OF PERMIT

PERMIT WL20-604746

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

- 1. The permit holder must maintain an accurate up to date record of the wildlife held under the permit that shows all additions and deletions from the record and that includes the following information:
 - a) the common name of the wildlife;
 - b) the number, sex, maturity and condition of the wildlife;
 - c) the name and address of the person or organization who provided the wildlife;
 - d) the name and address of the person or organization to whom the wildlife was provided, if any;
 - e) the number of the permit under which the wildlife was captured, transported or imported (if applicable); and
 - f) the manner, form, locations and date of marking of wildlife taken from the wild and the number and date of the official receipt for the capture fee
- When a bird is acquired, sold, traded, loaned or given away, the permit holder must maintain an accurate up to date record of the following, as applicable date of transaction, capture permit number, band number, CITES permit number and the permit or licence number of the person acquiring the bird.
- The permit holder must produce a copy of the records referred to in the paragraph's above on the demand of an officer under the Wildlife Act.
- 4. Within 21 days after the expiry date of the permit, the permit holder must submit to FrontCounter BC, Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development a completed Raptor Possession Report in the form attached as Appendix D.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. The permit holder must comply with all laws applicable to the activities carried out under this permit.
- 2. The permit holder must carry this permit on their person when conducting the activities authorized by this permit.
- 3. The permit holder **must** ensure that no other person uses this permit for any recreational or commercial falconry activity. Other persons need their own permit to engage in these activities.
- 4. All raptors held under the authority of this permit must be banded with bands supplied or approved by the Fish and Wildlife Branch. Bands must not to be removed from any bird, alive or dead. Bands are not required for wild caught Sharp-shinned Hawks, Merlins or American Kestrels, but are available and will be supplied upon request.
- 5. The permit holder must take all reasonably necessary steps to ensure that public safety is not jeopardized and fish or wildlife habitat is not damaged by any action taken under authority of the permit.
- 6. The permit holder must ensure that the wildlife are treated in a humane manner, and are not subjected to any unnecessary harm or suffering.
- The permit holder's interest in a Class I or Class II raptor may only be loaned to, transported to or from, given to or received from a holder of a valid possession or capture permit for the appropriate class of raptor.
- 8. The permit holder's interest in a Class I or Class II raptor may only be sold to, bought from, bartered or traded with a holder of a valid trafficking permit for the appropriate class of raptor.

APPENDIX C ADVISORY

PERMIT WL20-604746

GENERAL

> It is the permit holder's responsibility to be aware of all applicable laws and the limits of this permit

For example:

- This permit does not authorize the importing or exporting of raptors or their eggs into or from Canada.
- . This permit is NOT authority from another province or territory to import or transport into that other province or territory.
- This permit is **NOT** authority from another province of territory to export or transport from any other province or territory. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to obtain proper authorization.
- No wild-caught raptor, or its egg, captured under a falconry capture permit in British Columbia is to be exported from the province without an export permit.
- > No wild-caught raptor, or its egg, captured in another jurisdiction, is to be imported into the province without an import permit.
- > The Province is not liable for any illness contracted through wildlife handling. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to inform themselves of possible health hazards, and to ensure that all reasonably necessary safety measures are undertaken.
- > If applicable, the permit holder is responsible for renewing his or her own permit. The issuer is not obliged to send a reminder notice
- To assist in complying with federal law requiring humane treatment of animals, please be aware that international standards for the humane transport of animals exist and are available at

LEGISLATION

Below is a non-exhaustive list of provisions under the *Wildlife Act* and regulations that are relevant to this permit. It is the permit holder's responsibility to be aware of any provisions under the Act or regulations that may apply to this permit.

Wildlife Act

Property in Wildlife

- 2 (1) Ownership in all wildlife in British Columbia is vested in the government.
 - (5) Despite anything in this Act, no right of action lies, and no right of compensation exists, against the government for death, personal injury or property damage caused by
 - (a) wildlife, or
 - (b) an animal that escapes or is released from captivity or is abandoned

in British Columbia

Import and export of wildlife

- 21 (1) Except as authorized by a permit issued under this Act or under the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora, a person commits an offence if the person
 - (a) imports into British Columbia live wildlife, or the egg of a wildlife species, or
 - (b) exports out of British Columbia wildlife or parts of them, or the egg of a wildlife species.

Possession of wildlife

- **33** (1) A person commits an offence if the person has live wildlife in his or her personal possession except as authorized under a licence or permit or as provided by regulation.
 - (2) A person commits an offence if the person has dead wildlife or a part of any wildlife in his or her possession except as authorized under a licence or permit or as provided by regulation.

Failure to provide information

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38 A person who fails, on the request of an officer, to state correctly the locality where and the date on which wildlife or fish in the person's possession was killed, taken or caught by the person or came into his or her possession, commits an offence.

Documents not transferable

- 81 Except as authorized by regulation or as otherwise provided under this Act, a licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization is not transferable, and a person commits an offence if the person
 - (a) allows his or her licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization to be used by another person, or
 - (b) uses another person's licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization.

Failure to pay fine

- 85 (1) This section applies if a person
 - (a) fails to pay, within the time required by law, a fine imposed as a result of the person's conviction for an offence under this Act or the *Firearm Act*, and
 - (b) has been served with notice of this section.
 - (2) In the circumstances referred to in subsection (1),
 - (a) the person's right to apply for or obtain a licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization under this Act is suspended immediately and automatically on the failure to pay the fine,
 - (b) all licences, permits and limited entry hunting authorizations issued to that person under this Act are cancelled immediately and automatically on the failure to pay the fine.
 - (b.1) the person must not apply for employment as an assistant guide,
 - (b.2) the person must not guide as an assistant guide, and
 - (c) the person commits an offence if, before that fine is paid, the person
 - (i) applies for, or in any way obtains, a licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization under this Act,
 - (ii) does anything for which a licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization under this Act is required,
 - (iii) applies for employment as an assistant guide, or
 - (iv) guides as an assistant guide.

Entering premises

- 89 (1) For the purpose of ensuring that this Act and the regulations are being complied with, an officer may enter and inspect any premises or enclosure in which live wildlife or live fish is kept but, at the request of the owner or occupier, the officer must produce proof of identity.
 - (2) Despite the *Trespass Act*, an officer exercising duties under this Act may enter any land, whether enclosed or not but, at the request of the owner or occupier of the land, the officer must produce proof of identity.

Proof of identity and authorization

- 97 (1) In this section, "authorization" means a licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization issued under this Act.
 - (2) Subject to subsection (5), a person who is required to hold an authorization must, on the request of an officer,
 - (a) state the person's name and address,
 - (b) produce prescribed photo identification, and
 - (c) demonstrate in accordance with subsection (3) that the person holds the authorization.
 - (3) A person may demonstrate that the person holds an authorization by
 - (a) producing the authorization, or
 - (b) unless the regulations require that the original authorization be produced,
 - (i) producing a legible copy of the authorization, or
 - (ii) if authorized by the regulations, stating a number assigned to the person by the director as an identification number for the person.
 - (4) Subject to subsection (5), a person who would be required to hold a licence or permit issued under this Act were the person not exempt under section 11 (9) or 12 (b) must, on the request of an officer,
 - (a) state the person's name and address, and
 - (b) produce prescribed photo identification.
 - (5) Subsections (2) (b) and (4) (b) do not apply to a person in a prescribed class of persons.
 - (6) A person who contravenes subsection (2) or (4) commits an offence.

No permit to import certain wildlife

- 7 (1) For the purpose of section 21 of the Act and section 4 (b) of this regulation, a permit must not be issued to authorize the importation of a species of wildlife listed in Schedule 1. Schedule 1 includes
 - (a) all species of eagles that are not indigenous to British Columbia
 - (b) African and Eurasian Eagle-owls

General offence - failure to comply with permit

8 A person who holds a permit under the Act or the Permit Regulation commits an offence if he or she fails to comply with a term of the permit.

Wildlife Act General Regulation

Proof of identity

20.04 (1) For the purposes of section 97 (2)(b) and (4)(b) of the Act, the following photo identification is prescribed:

- (a) valid photo identification issued to a person by any of the following:
 - (i) the government of Canada;
 - (ii) the government of a province or territory, or an agent of the government of a province or territory, in which the person has a current address;
 - (iii) the Nisga'a Lisims Government, if the person is a Nisga'a citizen;
 - (iv) a treaty first nation, if the person is a treaty first nation member of the treaty first nation;
- (b) in the case of a person who is a non-resident alien, valid photo identification in the form of
 - (i) a passport, or
 - (ii) a driver's licence issued to the person by a foreign jurisdiction in which the person has a current address;
- (c) in any case, a valid NEXUS card.
- (2) For the purposes of section 97 (5) of the Act, persons under 16 years of age are prescribed as exempt from the requirement to produce photo identification.

APPENDIX A TERMS OF PERMIT

PERMIT VI21-621291

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

- 1. The permit holder must maintain an accurate up to date record of the wildlife held under the permit that shows all additions and deletions from the record and that includes the following information:
 - a) the common name of the wildlife:
 - b) the number, sex, maturity and condition of the wildlife:
 - c) the name and address of the person or organization who provided the wildlife;
 - d) the name and address of the person or organization to whom the wildlife was provided, if any;
 - e) the number of the permit under which the wildlife was captured, transported or imported (if applicable); and
 - f) the manner, form, locations and date of marking of wildlife taken from the wild and the number and date of the official receipt for the capture fee
- 2. When a bird is acquired, sold, traded, loaned or given away, the permit holder must maintain an accurate up to date record of the following, as applicable date of transaction, capture permit number, band number, CITES permit number and the permit or licence number of the person acquiring the bird.
- The permit holder must produce a copy of the records referred to in the paragraph's above on the demand of an officer under the Wildlife Act.
- 4. Within 21 days after the expiry date of the permit, the permit holder must submit to FrontCounter BC, Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development a completed Raptor Possession Report in the form attached as Appendix D.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

- The permit holder must comply with all laws applicable to the activities carried out under this permit.
- 2. The permit holder must carry this permit on their person when conducting the activities authorized by this permit.
- 3. The permit holder **must** ensure that no other person uses this permit for any recreational or commercial falconry activity. Other persons need their own permit to engage in these activities.
- 4. All raptors held under the authority of this permit must be banded with bands supplied or approved by the Fish and Wildlife Branch. Bands must not to be removed from any bird, alive or dead. Bands are not required for wild caught Sharp-shinned Hawks, Merlins or American Kestrels, but are available and will be supplied upon request.
- 5. The permit holder must take all reasonably necessary steps to ensure that public safety is not jeopardized, and fish or wildlife habitat is not damaged by any action taken under authority of the permit.
- 6. The permit holder must ensure that the wildlife are treated in a humane manner and are not subjected to any unnecessary harm or suffering.
- The permit holder's interest in a Class I or Class II raptor may only be loaned to, transported to or from, given to or received from a holder of a valid possession or capture permit for the appropriate class of raptor.
- 8. The permit holder's interest in a Class I or Class II raptor may only be sold to, bought from, bartered or traded with a holder of a valid trafficking permit for the appropriate class of raptor.

APPENDIX C ADVISORY

PERMIT VI21-621291

GENERAL

> It is the permit holder's responsibility to be aware of all applicable laws and the limits of this permit

For example:

- This permit does not authorize the importing or exporting of raptors or their eggs into or from Canada.
- This permit is **NOT** authority from another province or territory to import or transport into that other province or territory.
- This permit is **NOT** authority from another province of territory to export or transport from any other province or territory.

It is the responsibility of the permit holder to obtain proper authorization.

- No wild-caught raptor, or its egg, captured under a falconry capture permit in British Columbia is to be exported from the province without an export permit.
- > No wild-caught raptor, or its egg, captured in another jurisdiction, is to be imported into the province without an import permit.
- The Province is not liable for any illness contracted through wildlife handling. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to inform themselves of possible health hazards, and to ensure that all reasonably necessary safety measures are undertaken.
- > If applicable, the permit holder is responsible for renewing his or her own permit. The issuer is not obliged to send a reminder notice.
- > To assist in complying with federal law requiring humane treatment of animals, please be aware that international standards for the humane transport of animals exist and are available at

LEGISLATION

Below is a non-exhaustive list of provisions under the *Wildlife Act* and regulations that are relevant to this permit. It is the permit holder's responsibility to be aware of any provisions under the Act or regulations that may apply to this permit.

Wildlife Act

Property in Wildlife

- 2 (1) Ownership in all wildlife in British Columbia is vested in the government.
 - (5) Despite anything in this Act, no right of action lies, and no right of compensation exists, against the government for death, personal injury or property damage caused by
 - (a) wildlife, or
 - (b) an animal that escapes or is released from captivity or is abandoned

in British Columbia

Import and export of wildlife

- 21 (1) Except as authorized by a permit issued under this Act or under the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora, a person commits an offence if the person
 - (a) imports into British Columbia live wildlife, or the egg of a wildlife species, or
 - (b) exports out of British Columbia wildlife or parts of them, or the egg of a wildlife species.

Possession of wildlife

- **33** (1) A person commits an offence if the person has live wildlife in his or her personal possession except as authorized under a licence or permit or as provided by regulation.
 - (2) A person commits an offence if the person has dead wildlife or a part of any wildlife in his or her possession except as authorized under a licence or permit or as provided by regulation.

Failure to provide information

38 A person who fails, on the request of an officer, to state correctly the locality where and the date on which wildlife or fish in the person's possession was killed, taken or caught by the person or came into his or her possession, commits an offence.

Documents not transferable

- **81** Except as authorized by regulation or as otherwise provided under this Act, a licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization is not transferable, and a person commits an offence if the person
 - (a) allows his or her licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization to be used by another person, or
 - (b) uses another person's licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization.

Failure to pay fine

- 85 (1) This section applies if a person
 - (a) fails to pay, within the time required by law, a fine imposed as a result of the person's conviction for an offence under this Act or the *Firearm Act*, and
 - (b) has been served with notice of this section.
 - (2) In the circumstances referred to in subsection (1),
 - (a) the person's right to apply for or obtain a licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization under this Act is suspended immediately and automatically on the failure to pay the fine,
 - (b) all licences, permits and limited entry hunting authorizations issued to that person under this Act are cancelled immediately and automatically on the failure to pay the fine,
 - (b.1) the person must not apply for employment as an assistant guide,
 - (b.2) the person must not guide as an assistant guide, and
 - (c) the person commits an offence if, before that fine is paid, the person
 - (i) applies for, or in any way obtains, a licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization under this Act,
 - (ii) does anything for which a licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization under this Act is required,
 - (iii) applies for employment as an assistant guide, or
 - (iv) guides as an assistant guide.

Entering premises

- 89 (1) For the purpose of ensuring that this Act and the regulations are being complied with, an officer may enter and inspect any premises or enclosure in which live wildlife or live fish is kept but, at the request of the owner or occupier, the officer must produce proof of identity.
 - (2) Despite the *Trespass Act*, an officer exercising duties under this Act may enter any land, whether enclosed or not but, at the request of the owner or occupier of the land, the officer must produce proof of identity.

Proof of identity and authorization

- 97 (1) In this section, "authorization" means a licence, permit or limited entry hunting authorization issued under this Act.
 - (2) Subject to subsection (5), a person who is required to hold an authorization must, on the request of an officer,
 - (a) state the person's name and address,
 - (b) produce prescribed photo identification, and
 - (c) demonstrate in accordance with subsection (3) that the person holds the authorization.
 - (3) A person may demonstrate that the person holds an authorization by
 - (a) producing the authorization, or
 - (b) unless the regulations require that the original authorization be produced,
 - (i) producing a legible copy of the authorization, or
 - (ii) if authorized by the regulations, stating a number assigned to the person by the director as an identification number for the person.
 - (4) Subject to subsection (5), a person who would be required to hold a licence or permit issued under this Act were the person not exempt under section 11 (9) or 12 (b) must, on the request of an officer,
 - (a) state the person's name and address, and
 - (b) produce prescribed photo identification.
 - (5) Subsections (2) (b) and (4) (b) do not apply to a person in a prescribed class of persons.
 - (6) A person who contravenes subsection (2) or (4) commits an offence.

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Permit Regulation

No permit to import certain wildlife

- 7 (1) For the purpose of section 21 of the Act and section 4 (b) of this regulation, a permit must not be issued to authorize the importation of a species of wildlife listed in Schedule 1. Schedule 1 includes
 - (a) all species of eagles that are not indigenous to British Columbia
 - (b) African and Eurasian Eagle-owls

General offence - failure to comply with permit

8 A person who holds a permit under the Act or the Permit Regulation commits an offence if he or she fails to comply with a term of the permit.

Wildlife Act General Regulation

Proof of identity

21.01 (1) For the purposes of section 97 (2)(b) and (4)(b) of the Act, the following photo identification is prescribed:

- (a) valid photo identification issued to a person by any of the following:
 - (i) the government of Canada;
 - (ii) the government of a province or territory, or an agent of the government of a province or territory, in which the person has a current address;
 - (iii) the Nisga'a Lisims Government, if the person is a Nisga'a citizen;
 - (iv) a treaty first nation, if the person is a treaty first nation member of the treaty first nation;
- (b) in the case of a person who is a non-resident alien, valid photo identification in the form of
 - (i) a passport, or
 - (ii) a driver's licence issued to the person by a foreign jurisdiction in which the person has a current address;
- (c) in any case, a valid NEXUS card.
- (2) For the purposes of section 97 (5) of the Act, persons under 16 years of age are prescribed as exempt from the requirement to produce photo identification.
