Thank you for your call on May 27, 2014, requesting a copy of the 1966 (current) registration form, the registration history for this trapline and a map showing the boundary of trapline TR0620T001.

I have enclosed a photocopy of the 1966 registration form. There have been no additions or removals since that time. From the 1966 registration, there are 45 individuals registered to this line. I have provided this list below for you, which is the same list as seen on the photocopy of the 1966 registration enclosed. Several names have (DEC'D) beside them, this indicates this person as deceased according to our records. I have also enclosed a copy of the registration when s.22 Pete Tashoots, was registered to the line in 1928, and a copy of the cancellation of that in 1932. You spoke of the 1944 registration, and I have enclosed a copy of the 1944 registration where other Tashoots members were registered and they remained on the line until 1945, until a new registration form was completed and signed by the Manager. For the rest of the history, please refer to the list of the historical registrations that I have included for you.

Just to help you understand the registration process a little more, looking at the history file, you will see that the registration history has two dates, a start and an end. Each time a new registration is completed for a trapline, the previous one is not longer the registered list because a registration only remains valid until a new one is completed and signed off by the Regional Manager. As a result, s.22 is no longer on the current registration, because he was removed in 1932 when the cancellation form was signed.



I hope the above information helps clear your confusion and explains to you why this trapline is no longer in s.22 Pete Tashoots', name. During our phone call you mentioned that you did not agree with the current registration and that you felt your s.22 Pete Tashoots, should still be the main holder of this line and only his direct descendants. From my review of the file history which I have enclosed for you, and the cancellation form signed in 1932, I can confirm that as of 1932, Pete Tashoots was no longer registered to this trapline. Based on the review of the file and history and reviewing the extensive records of consultation from the 1960's, it is accepted that the current 1966 registration (above) is correct. Please refer to the enclosed photocopies for some of the historic registrations/cancellations that I thought would be of value to you.

If you still have disagreements or changes that you want to see made to the registration, my advice would be to discuss this with current living holders. Your best bet in having a successful registration change would be to come to an agreement amongst the current living trapline holders. If you did come to agreement, it would be a matter of filling in a new registration form and the appropriate transfer forms. If you think this is an option, please phone me and I can explain this process. We would require the agreement and signatures from all the current holders for this to occur. Your second option could be to write a letter to the Regional Manager, Dana Atagi, explaining why you disagree and outlining the changes you would like to see. This is not the route I would recommend. Ultimately, any decisions regarding the change of trapline registrations are made by the Regional Manager, so my recommendation would be to have agreement amongst the remaining living holders.

As you requested, I am enclosing copies of correspondence from the files for the Iskut Lake Company (ILC) group trapline. As we discussed, two letters from A.E. Fry, Indian Superintendent, Indian Affairs Branch to W.A.H. Gill, Game Division indicate that the original intent of the group trapping area was to provide the opportunity for residents of Iskut to trap in areas held by individuals that were not actively trapping.

I have also enclosed a photocopy of a letter from A.E. Fry to W.A.H. Gill in which Mr. Fry suggests that the Tashoots Company line not be included in the group line. As you know, the Tashoots line was amalgamated into the ILC line in 1966. I have also enclosed copies of the registration cards for the Tashoots family from 1932 and 1944.

In regards to your question about changes to the boundary of trapline 621T020 currently registered to Sidney Creyke, I reviewed the file and have the following information.

Records show that the original J.C. Dennis line was amalgamated with the ILC line in 1966. J.C. Dennis trapped in the area until his death in 1969. In 1983, Sidney Creyke received informal approval from the Iskut Band Council to trap on the ILC line. The Iskut Band Council position at that time was that Sidney Creyke's brothers and sons were not to be allowed to trap on the ILC line. Therefore Sidney Creyke requested sole trapping authorization on his father's former line.

In 1985, the Regional Manager of Fish and Wildlife examined the records, and interviewed Sidney Creyke and a representative of the Iskut Band Council (Pat Edzerza) and concluded that original John Creyke Dennis trapline had been improperly included in the ILC line. Due to a lack of agreement between Sidney Creyke and the Iskut Band Council in

regards to trapping rights for Sidney Creyke's brothers and sons, the Regional Manager gave the original J.C. Dennis line to Sidney Creyke.

Boundaries for the original J.C. Dennis line were drawn on a map by Sidney Creyke in 1985. Final boundaries were determined based on a compromise reached between Sidney Creyke and the Iskut Band Council. Authorization to trap on 621T020 was issued to Sidney Creyke in 1986.

Charette/Louis Boundary

It is apparent that there is a considerable degree of confusion and emotion regarding the boundary in the upper Tsaybahe Creek area. It is recommended that a meeting of all parties be set up to determine exactly what the problems are, which ones are easily solvable and which are not. If you were to agree to this approach I would be pleased to contact Mr. Charette and determine whether he too would be agreeable to a meeting.

Creyke/Iskut Band

Mr. S. Willett is adamant that sufficient time and effort were spent in finalizing this issue. He supports the contention by Mr. Creyke that the boundary and registration has been finalized and no further amendments are deemed necessary.

Reid Trapline

Mr. Willett is amenable to the amalgamation of the Reid line with the Iskut trapline. Please be aware however that a formal relinquishment is required from the Reids and that a Trapline Registration Form will be required to be signed by the members of the Iskut Band. I am sure that you are aware of our Ministry's position on the registration of traplines. The Wildlife Act requires that a trapline be registered to a specific person or persons (not a band or company).

Willett explained that we are only interested in resolving the matter as fairly as possible and don't look upon the situation as being adversarial. Edzerza agreed that a resolution is in everyone's interest. Willett brought up the question of J.C. Dennis's s.22

Edzerza brought up the question of how the line went from his uncle Charlie Edzerza to the Creykes rather than his aunt. We indicated that there is nothing on file to explain the procedure at that time, but after Charlie Edzerza's death it was legally registered to Sydney Creyke.

Willett asked Edzerza the normal practice on the band line regarding families of the original holders. Edzerza said that all family members are allowed to trap and they cooperate amongst the families as to who goes where at a particular time. Willett pointed out that this should also apply to the family of the J.C. Dennis line.

Edzerza informed us that the position of the band was that Sydney Creyke and his sons could trap but they objected to the other Creyke brothers. Willett pointed out that this seems contrary to the normal practice regarding company line members. Perhaps a complicating factor is that the Creykes and their father J.C. Dennis, are s.22

Willett suggested that no one really knows how the line in question was originally given to the Creykes rather than the Edzerzas. However, we also can't say for sure that J.C. Dennis did or did not wish to join the company line.

Willett suggested, in the absence of contrary evidence, that we have to consider the old J.C. Dennis line was properly included in the amalgamation. There is nothing to show Mr. Dennis ever complained. Thus the area should remain part of company line, but by the same token, the Creykes have trapping privileges the same as any other members. If

either party wishes to dispute, then they may appeal or go to court.

The band is not agreeable to giving exclusive trapping rights in the area to the Creykes. The band has made improvements in the area as well. Willett then explained the requirement under the new Act to have "band" lines registered under a person's name. Mr. Edzerza seemed to feel an arrangement similar to the Fort Nelson band approach should be workable, have the line registered to the councillor with an internal mechanism to require relinquishment upon council changes.

Unfortunately, all the old documents had been lost in a house fire.

Mr. Creyke contends that his father never agreed to the amalgamation. Indeed his father was holding the line for Sydney who was working in the Yukon for a period of time. J.C. Dennis was s.22

s.22 The first they heard of it was when they tried to obtain licences and were told it was part of the band line.

Mr. Creyke also says that others have indicated to him that they were never consulted i.e. Roy and Freddie Quock. He suggested that a lot of this probably arose from political rivalry between the Telegraph Creek people and the original Caribou Hide group of natives.

He also pointed out that his father, s.22
s.22 would have gained nothing from joining the band line.

We read part of the March 17, 1964 letter of Fry (Indian Affairs Superintendent) to Game Branch which indicates that he had not actually spoken to J.C. Dennis to obtain his approval.

Creyke confirmed that the band had offered to allow him and his sons to trap, but would not allow the other brothers to trap. He was going to trap the area but found too much competition from band members and thus wants the area excluded from the band line.

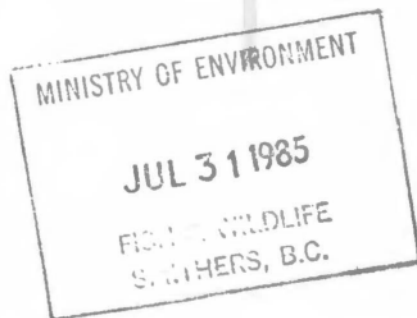




Willett explained to Edzerza that the crux of the problem seems to be the exclusion of the Creyke brothers when other families are not so treated.

Since then we have obtained the files from the Cassiar office and there are two additional documents relevant to the case (enclosed); one from D.J. Spalding to Creyke's lawyers in 1980, and a review of the Archives by A.L. Hoover in 1983. Hoover's analysis of the events fits with ours.

Spalding's letter is of significance as it represents the Branch's position as of 1980. He differs in his view of the question as to whether John Creyke Dennis (the father) was fairly treated. He makes the assumption in the absence of other evidence that he was; I am not so sure. I believe Mr. Dennis was ^{s.22} and he may not have received a fair shake from the Indian Agent who organized everything (who knows?). Spalding also neglects the point that although Sydney Creyke only officially pursued the matter in 1979, Bruce Creyke (the other son) was raising the issue in 1969. Bruce has since acquired another line and is no longer involved.

A few other points to complete the story. Sydney Creyke originally gave up the line to his father because he left the area to work elsewhere. He claims his father intended him and Bruce to have the line when he returned. For the past several years Sydney has been trapping in the area with the informal okay of the Iskut Band, but apparently they won't officially recognize his claim. 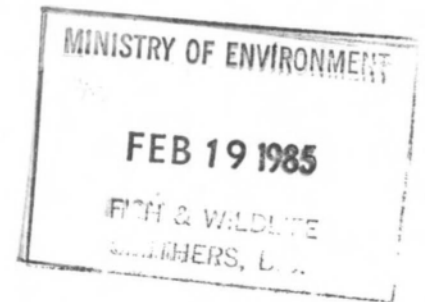

Some pondering points:


Sidney relinquished to his father as Sidney did not wish to utilize the trapline at that time - as witnessed by his refusal to renew licencing and subsequent relinquishment of trapline. Usually father passes line to son rather than the reverse - may not be relevant to the arguement.

If indeed when the lines of the Iskut Band were to be amalgamated all trappers were notified where is evidence of John's agreement to such a procedure? The lines were individual at the time and in keeping with the principle of fair play John (the father) had a very good reason to not wish to become part of the Company line then perhaps it shouldn't have happened. That situation differs markedly from the current one where the legislation requires a natural person be a registrant. However, a company line is then only required to have each member sign as a registrant so the actual field situation doesn't change.

It is my inclination that if the original boundaries of John's trapline can be reasonably determined and mapped (the old registrations may be satisfactory for this) then the line should be registered to Sidney if we can establish that he is John's son. If the Iskut band object, it may go to appeal and then possibly to a court of the land.

Mr. Creyke has written this office and spoken with me personally regarding an ongoing conflict over a portion of the Iskut Band trapline which he believes should be available to himself and his brother. He has asked that the matter be considered further by yourself.

Essentially the dispute centers around an amalgamation of several traplines in 1967 to form the Iskut Band line. One of the lines involved belonged to Mr. Creyke's father, John Creyke Dennis (deceased), who he claims never intended to surrender the line. The amalgamation was organized at the time by (federal) Indian Affairs. Fish and Game approved the proposal based on the deposition by Indian Affairs that all the trappers were in agreement or no longer actively trapping. John Creyke Dennis was listed as a member of the Iskut trapline at amalgamation and held licences up to s.22. Since 1970, his sons have been attempting to regain control of that portion of the Iskut line. Apparently the Iskut Band has informally allowed Sidney Creyke to trap on that portion of the line but will not permit the other brothers or Sidney Creyke's sons on the area. It is of some relevance to note that at the time of the amalgamation John Creyke Dennis, and now his sons, s.22. The Iskut Band and Indian Affairs have over the years maintained that the Creyke's cannot have a claim to an "Indian line".

I have enclosed copies of our files on the Iskut line. These provide greater detail than I can outline here. I would request that you review the question of whether or not Sidney Creyke has an interest in the portion of the Iskut line finally held by his father. It is apparent that the persons involved have to date been unable to resolve the issue themselves. Mr. Creyke is anxious to settle this.

I will be in the Iskut area next month and will ask the band for their views on the matter.

If you need further information on this file, let me know.

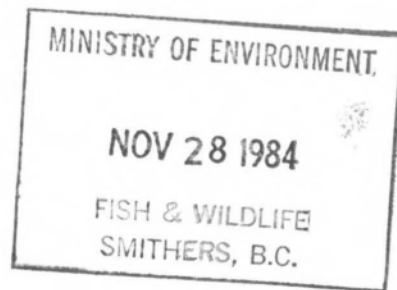



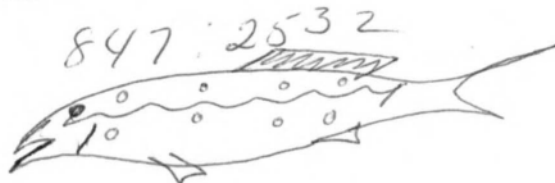

Please find enclosed all the relevant documents that I could locate that relate to the history of the registered traplines that were held by John Creyke Dennis.

In 1938 (Feb. 24) an "Application for Registration of a Trap-Line" was made by John Creig (sic) Dennis located on east side of Klappan River at mouth of Spratt Creek. An "Application for Relinquishment of Registered Trap-Line" dated November 17, 1960, approved Jan. 10, 1961 was made for the same trapline that was registered in 1938.

The letter from C. J. Walker to "D" Game Division dated December 28, 1960 notes the enclosure of the above "Relinquishment" changing the line "to open line". The same letter states that John Creyke Dennis is applying for the line that was held by Sidney Creyke Dennis.

The Sidney Creyke Dennis trapline referred to above is apparently the same line referred to in the letter from Walker to "D" Game Division dated February 3, 1959. Perhaps this is the same line that was registered to John Creyke Dennis dated November 17, 1960, approved for cancellation January 6, 1967 located on Kakiddi Creek, 2 miles north of Nut-tlu-de Lake.

The November 17, 1960 date is the same for John Creyke Dennis' cancellation of Klappan River trapline as the registration for the Kakiddi Creek trapline.

Now to the inclusion of John Creyke Dennis' traplines in the Iskut Lake Company trapline. The letter from Gill to Fry, dated September 11, 1964 lists the traplines that were included in the Iskut Co. line including "J.C. Dennis" and "the open lines formerly held by Adrl(?) Browner and J. C. Dennis". Presumably the J. C. Dennis open line is the Klappan River-Spratt Creek line and the other J. C. Dennis line would have been the Kakiddi Creek line.

It is interesting to note that although the Application for Registration of the Iskut Lake Company is dated September 11, 1964, John Creyke Dennis' Kakiddi Creek line was not officially cancelled until January 6, 1967. Perhaps this difference in dates doesn't mean anything, but interesting at least.

The other point is that although John Creyke Dennis' line was included in Iskut Co. line, he was not a member of that group.

As I mentioned to you on the phone the information that Ron Carlick provided you on the John Creyke Dennis line was taken (xeroxed) from my notes that I took in 1978 at the Fish & Game Office in Prince George. The original is in the trapline correspondence for 1970 which was not transferred to the Provincial Archives but must still be in Prince George or was transferred to Smithers. My note reads as follows:

(Dennis, John Creyke TL-8D-70)

"Memo from LeRoy W. Ward (May 6/70) re: John Creyke Dennis (deceased) - line registered to Dennis in 1961 (portion of R.M. 106) - 1966 Iskut Lake Company formed and they were registered over area assigned to Dennis - he trapped in area until death in 1967. John's son Bruce has applied for line."

"Memo from R. J. Guay (June 11/70) noting that D.I.A. carried out formation of trapline and that presumably Dennis was informed, suggests Bruce Dennis be included in Iskut Lake Company rather than split Company area."

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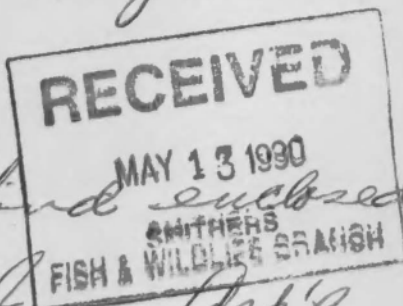

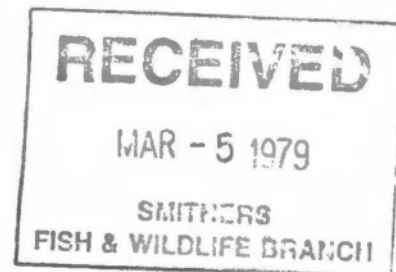

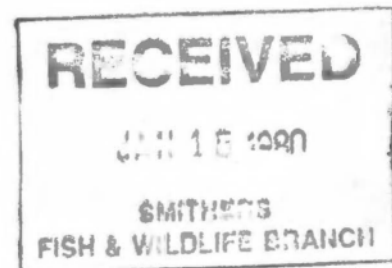

With reference to your memo dated May 6, 1970, regarding the trap-line formerly held by John C. Dennis.

Perhaps you are aware that during the period 1964 to 1966, negotiations between this Branch and the Indian Affairs Dept. were carried out which resulted in the amalgamation of a number of Indian trap-lines into what is now known as the Iskut Lake Co. A great deal of correspondence and a considerable amount of work went into the forming of this Indian Company trap-line. All active Indian trappers who held trap-lines within the proposed amalgamation were contacted and their approval obtained. In cases of the inactive trappers within the proposed Company area, the Indian Affairs Branch forwarded a letter to each trapper advising them that because their trap-lines were not being actively trapped they were being cancelled to form the new company trap-line. In other words all negotiations with the Indians concerned were carried out by the Indian Affairs Branch and the formation of this company line was at their request. It might be mentioned however, that all active as well as inactive Indian trappers were included on the list of Iskut Lake Co. members.

In a letter addressed to this office, Mr. R.E. Fry, Indian Superintendent at Whitehorse, Y.T., advised that John Creyke Dennis was among the inactive Indian trap-line holders, and that his would be one of the lines to be cancelled for inclusion in the Iskut Lake Co. I have nothing on file to show whether or not J.C. Dennis was actively trapping at the time (in 1964) so I can only assume that the matter was looked into either by Mr. A. E. Fry or his Development Officer, D. J. McIntosh. (It was Mr. McIntosh who did much of the work in arranging these transfers).

Because of the tremendous amount of work that went into the formation of the Iskut Lake trap-line, not to mention the time involved in its eventual completion, this office is much opposed to any requests by its members for ~~that~~ a division of the Company trapping area. My suggestion is that Bruce Creyke be included as a member of the company which would allow him to trap on the grounds trapped previously by his father if he so desired.

In any event, before any transfer of Indian trapping territory can be made by this Branch, we would require the sanction of the Indian Superintendent at Whitehorse.

Your comments on the above would be appreciated.



I have your letter of March 4th, 1964 and I think we can work out something that will be in the interests of everybody and in the interests of the fur resource.

I'm a little reluctant for a couple of reasons to begin approaching the people who own traplines in the area but who are not trapping them and have not trapped them for sometime.

First I know some of these people well enough to know that they will take a 'dog in the manger' attitude if it is intimated to them that they have any say in the matter at all and I think it would be wiser to firmly apply the principle that if a man is not using his trapline, he's not entitled to continue holding it.

The other reason that I am reluctant to begin approaching people is that if I approach one, I should approach everybody and I am stretched too far with too little staff to get in touch with all the people concerned.

What I suggest and what I think is workable is that we leave the Techoota Company line as it is. You will see that the settlement of Iskut which is now becoming fairly substantial is situated just a little above the central area of this trapline. Two active trappers of this company are resident at the settlement at Iskut. If we leave this trapline as is and it is trapped by only these two men, we will ensure that all other trappers have to go beyond the boundaries of this line to begin trapping. This will avoid an extreme pressure around the settlement with only light trapping in the outlying areas.

This will acknowledge your letter of April 14, 1965.

There are, as you point out, more than the 19 trappers who took out Special Firearms Licences, eligible to trap in the registered Iskut Lake Company Line. These additional people however, are not trapping this year because they are away or are otherwise employed. All of the Indian trappers eligible to trap in this registered trap line have agreed to pay \$2.50 annually for a Special Firearms Licence if they intend to go trapping as was done this year by the 19 active trappers.

It is hoped that all of the Indian trappers who have registered trap lines in B.C. will in the future take out Special Firearms Licences each year.

For your information, I might mention that the people of Iskut Lake have really responded to the meetings we have had and they have put the teachings to the test. Besides being actively engaged in trapping all winter, their trapping methods and fur handling have improved immensely. Three of the trappers received the highest sale prices of \$29.00 for lynx and \$24.50 for beaver on the Edmonton Fur Sale in February 1965.



Mr. Fry has suggested that a number of Indian trap-lines in the Inland lake area be grouped together to form Company lines. At present many of these lines remain untrapped or are being trapped very little. We feel that perhaps Mr. Fry's suggestion has some merit as all the trap-lines concerned are adjoining.

Would you please let me have your views on the above suggestion.

Re: Trap-lines - Iskut Lake.

With reference to your letter dated February 27/64, regarding certain Indian trap-lines in the Iskut Lake area which are not being trapped at present. I agree that something should be done to have these lines actively trapped. It is noted that all the trap-lines mentioned in your letter are adjacent to one another and if necessary could be joined into one or more Company lines. Perhaps you could approach as many as the Indians holding these trap-lines to find out what their feeling are regarding such a proposal, especially those who are still trapping their Registrations.

As mentioned above this Department's main interest is that the fur-bearers on these trap-lines are properly harvested, and it is felt that the matter of registering Indians on Indian Trap-lines in your area could be left mainly in your discretion. Therefore, if you favor Company lines over single Registrations, I would be pleased to have your suggestions as to which of the trap-line mentioned in your letter should be grouped into a Company line. In view of the number of trap-lines involved perhaps it would be advisable to form three or four Company Trap-lines from these.

At any rate I feel that the Indians involved should be approached so that some kind of an agreement can be reached regarding these proposed trap-line amendments and transfers.

I might mention that there is one more trap-line that you did not mention. This is the line that was formerly held by John Greyke Dennis which is presently lying vacant and is open to registration by any of your present Indian Applicants.

I would be please to hear from you further in this matter.

With reference to the suggestion contained in your letter dated September 14th, that the Ned Brooks line be registered in the name of the Iskut Lake Company but as a separate registration. According to our Trapping Regulations no trapper or group of trappers may own or trap on more than one trapping territory, therefore we can not register two separate areas in the name of the Iskut Lake Company.

The main area of the Iskut Lake Company is separated from the Ned Brooks line by a narrow strip of territory which comprises the most westerly portion of the trap-line registered in the name of William Campbell of Telegraph Creek, B.C. Mr. Campbell is a white trapper whose trap-line is in good standing therefore there is nothing we can do ~~now~~ to eliminate the barrier separating the Ned Brooks and Iskut Lake Co. lines, unless an agreement could be reached with Mr. Campbell wherein a few miles of his territory on the Stikine River could be traded in exchange for a portion of the Ned Brooks trap-line. If you still wish to have the two a/m areas joined into one trapping area I would suggest you approach Mr. Campbell to see if he would be willing to make some kind of a deal where trapping territory could be exchanged, thereby allowing access between the present Ned Brooks trap-line and the newly formed Iskut Lake Co. line.

It is noted that in some cases you have listed Indians whose names appear to be similar to Indians who hold registered trap-lines, or who are members of Company trap-lines, in your list of suggested new members for the Iskut Lake Company. You list an ^{s.22} called Alec Dennis. Is this the same person who is holder of a registered trap-line in the name of Alec Dennis & Family? Another ^{s.22} on your list is Tom Dennis. Is it possible that this ^{s.22} proper name is Thomas L. Dennis or Thomas Hyland Dennis, both of these latter ^{s.22} hold registered lines. Could Alec Jack be the same person who is registered with the Caribou Hide Band under the name of Alex Jack? Is Louie Louie the same person as the Louis Louie who is registered in the trap-line of Antoine Louie and Family. From the above you will note that it is extremely important in all matters pertaining to Indian Trap-lines that the ^{s.22} proper name be used. So many ^{s.22} have names that are similar that the use of nick-names, variations in the spelling of names, omission of a second initial from an ^{s.22} name when officially such initial should be included, can result in much confusion.



Re: Traplines - Iskut Lake area

There are a number of traplines in the Iskut Lake area which we know cannot possibly be used by those who appear to be the holders of the traplines. For example Ned Brooks is living at s.22 B.C. and has done for sometime and is never seen back in the area. Guy Reid lives at s.22 and we know that he does not go down and trap the line north of Iskut. I do not know about the R.D. Campbell line but I would be very interested to know. Freddy Quock lives up at s.22 trapline to my knowledge in the last several years. Some members of the Tashoots Company are actually living at Iskut and of course are trapping their line but several members of the Company are not there at all. Paul Reid is over in s.22 and does not make any trips to his trapline and has not done for a number of years. The four Dennis lines, that is A.M. Dennis, T.L. Dennis, Alex Dennis and family and Jimmy Billy Dennis do have family members at the Iskut settlement and these lines could be worked.

It would be in the vital economic interests of the Iskut Lake settlement if a large trapping area comprised mainly of those lines I have enumerated could be set aside for communal trapping use. Now I do realize the problem of the company line system but it does have one distinct advantage and that is it creates a competitive situation in which men will get out and trap, realizing that if they don't someone else will.

I then suggest that we establish a company area to be trapped by the resident trappers of Iskut through the amalgamation of all the following lines:

Paul Reid, James Hawkins, Roy Quock, J.C. Dennis, Fred Quock,
Guy Reid, Ned Brooks, A.M. Dennis, Alec Dennis and Family,
A.B. Dennis, I.L. Dennis and the area south of Paul Reid and
T.L. Dennis if available and the Adri A. Brawner if available.

Alec Dennis and J.B. Dennis and T.L. Dennis are in s.22 but you will notice that these are fairly distant lines from the village. These men I think would prefer the company area arrangement because it would let them share with the other men in the more accessible trapping and would apply to the other men to share in the more inaccessible trapping with them.

Paul Reid, James Hawkins, Roy Quock, J.C. Dennis, Fred Quock, Guy Reid, Ned Brooks and A.M. Dennis are all out of the area and have not trapped for some considerable time and indicated no intention to go into the area and trap this year. It is my intention that if you can agree to my idea of amalgamating these many lines into one large company trapping area, that should any of the men now holding a trapline in the area but not using it return to trap their lines that we restore the registrations to them, or give them company membership whichever is agreed by all concerned.

I would expect this large company area plan to function fairly well but I work toward individual or limited company registrations within a few years as the established trapping patterns developed. These are a co-operative and reasonable group of men at Iskut and I think that as long as we make clear to them the area that is available, they will agree among themselves as to how best to utilize the total area.

I am also in favour at the moment of the company line system because of the competitiveness which will be created. There has been too great a tendency in this area for men to hold lines and not use them and if ground is only held by virtue of actively trapping it, I think we can expect considerably more trapping.

My Assistant, Mr. Frankish, has discussed this with s.22
the Oblate Missionary who is one of the strengths of this village,
and s.22 agrees that the plan should work out and should
restore to these people the economic opportunity which for so many
years at Telegraph Creek they lacked.

I recognize that if any of these men hold traplines elsewhere they
will of course have to give them up in order to be members of the
Iskut Lake Company but this would be no problem and I am sure
that anyone of them would be willing.

If you go along with this plan, of course, I will accept responsibility
for advising each of the trappers whose lines we are taking away
just what we are doing and why we are doing it. I would explain
to them of course also that if they wish to get back into the area
and trap their lines that their lines will be restored to them
but in many cases I know that there is no possibility of this
because the line holders are older men and resident now in far
parts of the country much removed from the Iskut and Telegraph Creek
territory.

You can gather from all this that I am in favour of a very strong
and firm position being taken on any trapline which has fallen
into disuse and I am very reluctant to imply to a man that he has
any say in the matter at all if he has not trapped his line for



There is a good co-operative spirit in the Iskut Lake settlement and I think it quite possible that a company line consisting of all the able bodied men in the settlement could work out quite well.


On the other hand you might prefer to stay in individual registrations and re-allot the areas which are not presently being used by those who hold them.

It is vital in the economic interests of this community and in the proper use of the fur resource in the area that we re-organize these registrations prior to the next trapping season. Would you advise me as to my best first steps and particularly would you make clear to me with whom I should negotiate on this subject. We have been dealing in some matters with the Conservation Officer, Prince Rupert and in others with the Conservation Officer at Fort Nelson. We obviously need to have this clarified.

Regrettably I have very little staff at my disposal but it is my ambition to ensure that every able bodied Indian who needs a trapline will have a place to trap and that no trapline will be held down by someone who I know perfectly well is not trapping and is not likely ever to trap again. I'm sure that these sentiments are in accord with your own.

Dear Mr. Gill:

A number of the old Bear Lake group of Indians have moved back from Telegraph Creek to their old home at Iskut, near the north end of Kinaskan. These people are still possessed of good skills in the bush and they have made this move with a view to returning in some measure to a more direct dependency on the bush and hence a less dependency on government help.

We plan a fairly active program of encouragement and "help you help yourself" with this group. One of the first steps I must take is to secure for every able-bodied man who wants to trap, the opportunity to do so within reasonable reach of the new camp.

There are traplines in the area which are not being used. I find my information on specific locations and extents of lines not quite as up to date as I would like to have it.

Could you have prepared for me a map or maps of the Territory outlined on the attached sheet showing thereon the extent and location of every trapline, Indian and Non-Indian? Choose whatever scale is most practical to use and charge the Agency if there is any cost involved for the maps. I presume you would use whatever series best suits the purpose, tracing each line on in red.


Perhaps an index could be supplied, showing the present status of each line.

Referring to your letter of the 8th instant, I beg to advise that in a recent letter from this office a reply was made to your query concerning the s.22 MIKE McCLUSKY, to the effect that there are two s.22 of this name in the Stikine Indian Agency.

In the matter of Willie and Howard DEASE, the Indian Agent wishes to further amend this line. He has acquired the line which formerly belonged to George Adsit, and wishes to add this line to the other ground for these two s.22 I enclose copy of a map submitted by the Indian Agent, but I would point out that Adsit's line was not registered in the usual manner but merely shown on the map as a line along Thibert Creek to Sharpe Mt. The neighbouring line in the name of E. Asp was similarly shown as a line, and in submitting his map Mr. Reed seems to have applied for a considerable portion of what rightfully belongs to Asp. I may say that Mr. Reed expects his application map to be altered in favour of Asp, but submitted application for the maximum as a "try-on".

Applications in the names of Mrs. Frank Jackson, James McDonald and John Evert Williams will be returned as soon as completed, but as all reside some distance from Telegraph Creek, this will take time.

TAHLTAN TRAPPERS ASSOCIATION

GROUP TRAPLINES

Group Traplines are a large plus for four main reasons:

1. With all the traplines in a group, no person of Tahltan Ancestry will ever lose their traplines.
2. When progress puts a road or a dam on the traplines, the Trappers Association can lobby for just compensation, much more effectively as a group than as an individual trapper.
3. There is money available for programs such as Special ARDA, to help build up these businesses. The Government Agencies will be more willing to assist trappers if they know that they will not be able to sell their traplines to persons of non-Tahltan Ancestry.
4. There will also be spin-off businesses from this group such as; Ski-doo Dealerships and repair shops, Student programs - Trail cutting, Cabin building, Trappers training programs, Proper firearms handling, etc.

But from studies I have made of other group traplines, I have come to the conclusion that they cannot be administered fairly by any organization. It has been proven at Ross River, when there are no individual boundaries, the people all want to trap close to the main roads and settlements. Also when cabins are built or trapping trails cut, everybody that traps wants to use them. Arguments such as these are something I am sure our Association can do without.

So, for Group Traplines to be effective, the individual trapline boundaries must be maintained and the individual trapper must have the exclusive rights to say who traps his line and who doesn't.

Also individual trappers must retain the rights to sell their traplines to other persons of Tahltan Ancestry, or pass them on to persons of Tahltan Ancestry.

These stipulations must be inserted in the agreement for Group Traplines before the Tahltan Trappers Association will work.

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

This will acknowledge your letter of April 14, 1965.

There are, as you point out, more than the 19 trappers who took out Special Firearms Licences, eligible to trap in the registered Iskut Lake Company Line. These additional people however, are not trapping this year because they are away or are otherwise employed. All of the Indian trappers eligible to trap in this registered trap line have agreed to pay \$2.50 annually for a Special Firearms Licence if they intend to go trapping as was done this year by the 19 active trappers.

It is hoped that all of the Indian trappers who have registered trap-lines in B.C. will in the future take out Special Firearms Licences each year.

For your information, I might mention that the people of Iskut Lake have really responded to the meetings we have had and they have put the teachings to the test. Besides being actively engaged in trapping all winter, their trapping methods and fur handling have improved immensely. Three of the trappers received the highest sale prices of \$29.00 for lynx and \$26.50 for beaver on the Edmonton Fur Sales in February 1965.





With reference to the suggestion contained in your letter dated September 14th, that the Ned Brooks line be registered in the name of the Iskut Lake Company but as a separate registration. According to our Trapping Regulations no trapper or group of trappers may own or trap on more than one trapping territory, therefore we can not register two separate areas in the name of the Iskut Lake Company.

The main area of the Iskut Lake Company is separated from the Ned Brooks line by a narrow strip of territory which comprises the most westerly portion of the trap-line registered in the name of William Campbell of Telegraph Creek, B.C. Mr. Campbell is a white trapper whose trap-line is in good standing therefore there is nothing we can do ~~knows~~ to eliminate the barrier separating the Ned Brooks and Iskut Lake Co. lines, unless an agreement could be reached with Mr. Campbell wherein a few miles of his territory on the Stikine River could be traded in exchange for a portion of the Ned Brooks trap-line. If you still wish to have the two a/m areas joined into one trapping area I would suggest you approach Mr. Campbell to see if he would be willing to make some kind of a deal where trapping territory could be exchanged, thereby allowing access between the present Ned Brooks trap-line and the newly formed Iskut Lake Co. line.

It is noted that in some cases you have listed ^{s.22} whose names appear to be similar to ^{s.22} who hold registered trap-lines, or who are members of Company trap-lines, in your list of suggested new members for the Iskut Lake Company. You list an ^{s.22} called Alec Dennis. Is this the same person who is holder of a registered trap-line in the name of Alec Denniss & Family? Another ^{s.22} on your list is Tom Dennis. Is it possible that this ^{s.22} proper name is Thomas L. Dennis or Thomas Hyland Dennis, both of these latter ^{s.22} hold registered lines. Could Alec Jack be the same person who is registered with the Caribou Hide Band under the name of Alex Jack? Is Louie Louie the same person as the Louis Louie who is registered in the trap-line of Anthene Louie and Family. From the above you will note that it is extremely important in all matters pertaining to Indian Trap-lines that the ^{s.22} proper name be used. So many ^{s.22} have names that are similar that the use of nick-names, variations in the spelling of names, omission of a second initial from an ^{s.22} name when officially such initial should be included, can result in much confusion.

Dear Mr. Gill:

Further to my letter of May 21st, I have personally had a long discussion with the men at Iskut Lake about the trapping situation in their area and they are very much in agreement with my proposal for a company area as outlined in my previous correspondence to you.

I just thought I would pass this on to you and I am anxious of course to hear from you on the subject when you get time to deal with it.

If you like, I would come to Prince George to see you to personally discuss the whole matter.

I attach tremendous importance to this particular problem because we have a number of able bodied men in this village, anxious to stand on their own feet economically, who are currently prevented from doing this by lack of a place to trap and conversely we have traplines held in the area by men who have not been into the area to trap for several years and indicate no intention at the present time of doing so in the immediate future.

Dear Mr. Gill:

I have your letter of March 4th, 1964 and I think we can work out something that will be in the interests of everybody and in the interests of the fur resource.

I'm a little reluctant for a couple of reasons to begin approaching the people who own traplines in the area but who are not trapping them and have not trapped them for sometime.

First I know some of these people well enough to know that they will take a 'dog in the manger' attitude if it is intimated to them that they have any say in the matter at all and I think it would be wiser to firmly apply the principle that if a man is not using his trapline, he's not entitled to continue holding it.

The other reason that I am reluctant to begin approaching people is that if I approach one, I should approach everybody and I am stretched too far with too little staff to get in touch with all the people concerned.

What I suggest and what I think is workable is that we leave the Tashoots Company line as it is. You will see that the settlement of Iskut which is now becoming fairly substantial is situated just a little above the central area of this trapline. Two active trappers of this company are resident at the settlement at Iskut. If we leave this trapline as is and it is trapped by only these two men, we will ensure that all other trappers have to go beyond the boundaries of this line to begin trapping. This will avoid an extreme pressure around the settlement with only light trapping in the outlying areas.

I then suggest that we establish a company area to be trapped by the resident trappers of Iskut through the amalgamation of all the following lines:

Paul Reid, James Hawkins, Roy Quock, J.C. Dennis, Fred Quock, Guy Reid, Ned Brooks, A.M. Dennis, Alec Dennis and family, J.B. Dennis, T.L. Dennis and the area south of Paul Reid and T.L. Dennis if available and the Adri A. Brawner if available.

Alec Dennis and J.B. Dennis and T.L. Dennis are in Iskut but you will notice that these are fairly distant lines from the village. These men I think would prefer the company area arrangement because it would let them share with the other men in the more accessible trapping and would apply to the other men to share in the more inaccessible trapping with them.

Paul Reid, James Hawkins, Roy Quock, J.C. Dennis, Fred Quock, Guy Reid, Ned Brooks and A.M. Dennis are all out of the area and have not trapped for some considerable time and indicated no intention to go into the area and trap this year. It is my intention that if you can agree to my idea of amalgamating these many lines into one large company trapping area, that should any of the men now holding a trapline in the area but not using it return to trap their lines that we restore the registrations to them, or give them company membership whichever is agreed by all concerned.

I would expect this large company area plan to function fairly well but I work toward individual or limited company registrations within a few years as the established trapping patterns developed. These are a co-operative and reasonable group of men at Iskut and I think that as long as we make clear to them the area that is available, they will agree among themselves as to how best to utilize the total area.

I am also in favour at the moment of the company line system because of the competitiveness which will be created. There has been too great a tendency in this area for men to hold lines and not use them and if ground is only held by virtue of actively trapping it, I think we can expect considerably more trapping.

My Assistant, Mr. Frankish, has discussed this with Father Doetzel, the Oblate Missionary who is one of the strengths of this village, and Father Doetzel agrees that the plan should work out and should restore to these people the economic opportunity which for so many years at Telegraph Creek they lacked.

I recognize that if any of these men hold traplines elsewhere they will of course have to give them up in order to be members of the Iskut Lake Company but this would be no problem and I am sure that anyone of them would be willing.

If you go along with this plan, of course, I will accept responsibility for advising each of the trappers whose lines we are taking away just what we are doing and why we are doing it. I would explain to them of course also that if they wish to get back into the area and trap their lines that their lines will be restored to them but in many cases I know that there is no possibility of this because the line holders are older men and resident now in far parts of the country much removed from the Iskut and Telegraph Creek territory.

You can gather from all this that I am in favour of a very strong and firm position being taken on any trapline which has fallen into disuse and I am very reluctant to imply to a man that he has any say in the matter at all if he has not trapped his line for


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a number of years. The right to trap a piece of country in my estimation can only be maintained by proper utilization and in no other way.

Let me know what you think of all this.

You will recall my letter of March 17th and following my letter of March 17th, I received a copy of ^{s.22} letter to you of April 3rd on the subject of my trapline proposals at Iskut Lake.

I wonder if you have given further thought to this and whether or not we are in a position to set up a new registration on the basis of a Company trapline area.

Mr. Frankish has just returned from Iskut and finds quite a favourable reaction there to the general proposal.

I have no doubt at all that there will be some small wrinkles to iron out in the actual operation of this trapping undertaking and undoubtedly there will be some ruffled feelings from time to time but the general impression I have is that these people are anxious to have some arrangement whereby they can get out and trap and the idea of a Company area at present appears to meet the need both from their point of view and from ours.

I would certainly like to hear from you when you have a chance to take some further steps.

Dear Sir:

Re: Trap-lines - Iskut Lake.

With reference to your letter dated February 27/64, regarding certain Indian trap-lines in the Iskut Lake area which are not being trapped at present. I agree that something should be done to have these lines actively trapped. It is noted that all the trap-lines mentioned in your letter are adjacent to one another and if necessary could be joined into one or more Company lines. Perhaps you could approach as many as the Indians holding these trap-lines to find out what their feeling are regarding such a proposal, especially those who are still trapping their Registrations.

As mentioned above this Department's main interest is that the fur-bearers on these trap-lines are properly harvested, and it is felt that the matter of registering Indians on Indian Trap-lines in your area could be left mainly in your discretion. Therefore, if you favor Company lines over single Registrations, I would be pleased to have your suggestions as to which of the trap-line mentioned in your letter should be grouped into a Company line. In view of the number of trap-lines involved perhaps it would be advisable to form three or four Company Trap-lines from these.

At any rate I feel that the Indians involved should be approached so that some kind of an agreement can be reached regarding these proposed trap-line amendments and transfers.

I might mention that there is one more trap-line that you did not mention. This is the line that was formerly held by John Greyke Dennis which is presently lying vacant and is open to registration by any of your present Indian Applicants.

I would be please to hear from you further in this matter.

Re: Traplines - Iskut Lake area

There are a number of traplines in the Iskut Lake area which we know cannot possibly be used by those who appear to be the holders of the traplines. For example Ned Brooks is living at s.22 B.C. and has done for sometime and is never seen back in the area. Guy Reid lives at s.22 and we know that he does not go down and trap the line north of Iskut. I do not know about the R.D. Campbell line but I would be very interested to know. Freddy Quock lives up at s.22 his trapline to my knowledge in the last several years. Some members of the Tashoots Company are actually living at Iskut and of course are trapping their line but several members of the Company are not there at all. Paul Reid is over in s.22 and does not make any trips to his trapline and has not done for a number of years. The four Dennis lines, that is A.M. Dennis, T.L. Dennis, Alex Dennis and family and Jimmy Billy Dennis do have family members at the s.22 and these lines could be worked.

It would be in the vital economic interests of the Iskut Lake settlement if a large trapping area comprised mainly of those lines I have enumerated could be set aside for communal trapping use. Now I do realize the problem of the company line system but it does have one distinct advantage and that is it creates a competitive situation in which men will get out and trap, realizing that if they don't someone else will.

There is a good co-operative spirit in the Iskut Lake settlement and I think it quite possible that a company line consisting of all the able bodied men in the settlement could work out quite well.


On the other hand you might prefer to stay in individual registrations and re-allot the areas which are not presently being used by those who hold them.

It is vital in the economic interests of this community and in the proper use of the fur resource in the area that we re-organize these registrations prior to the next trapping season. Would you advise me as to my best first steps and particularly would you make clear to me with whom I should negotiate on this subject. We have been dealing in some matters with the Conservation Officer, Prince Rupert and in others with the Conservation Officer at Fort Nelson. We obviously need to have this clarified.

Regrettably I have very little staff at my disposal but it is my ambition to ensure that every able bodied Indian who needs a trapline will have a place to trap and that no trapline will be held down by someone who I know perfectly well is not trapping and is not likely ever to trap again. I'm sure that these sentiments are in accord with your own.

I shall be glad to hear from you.

Dear Mr. Gill:

A number of the old Bear Lake group of Indians have moved back from Telegraph Creek to their old home at Iskut, near the north end of Kinaskan. These people are still possessed of good skills in the bush and they have made this move with a view to returning in some measure to a more direct dependency on the bush and hence a less dependency on government help.

We plan a fairly active program of encouragement and "help you help yourself" with this group. One of the first steps I must take is to secure for every able-bodied man who wants to trap, the opportunity to do so within reasonable reach of the new camp.

There are traplines in the area which are not being used. I find my information on specific locations and extents of lines not quite as up to date as I would like to have it.

Could you have prepared for me a map or maps of the Territory outlined on the attached sheet showing thereon the extent and location of every trapline, Indian and Non-Indian? Choose whatever scale is most practical to use and charge the Agency if there is any cost involved for the maps. I presume you would use whatever series best suits the purpose, tracing each line on in red.


Perhaps an index could be supplied, showing the present status of each line.
