



ACCESS AGREEMENT

This Agreement dated for reference July 18, 2007, is made:

BETWEEN:

Union Bar First Nation

P.O. Box 788, Hope, British Columbia, V0X 1L0

("Union Bar")

OF THE FIRST PART

AND:

HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN IN RIGHT OF THE PROVINCE OF BRITISH COLUMBIA, AS REPRESENTED BY THE MINISTER OF FORESTS AND RANGE, c/o RESOURCE TENURES AND ENGINEERING BRANCH, REAL ESTATE OPERATIONS, 1675 Dougas Street, 2nd floor, P.O. Box 9510, Station Provincial Government, Victoria, British Columbia, V8W 9C2

(the "Forest Service")

OF THE SECOND PART

WHEREAS:

A. Union Bar occupies the land legally described as:

Puckatholetchin Indian Reserve No. 11

Legal Description:

Yale District in Sections 33 & 34, Township 5, Range 26, Sections 3, 4, 9, & 10, Range 26, West of the 6th Meridian, Right Bank of Fraser River, 4 Miles North of Hope

(the "Lands")

- **B.** Union Bar has agreed to grant to the Forest Service on the terms and conditions set out in this Agreement access over the roads which exist within the Lands at the date of this Agreement.
- C. Access is necessary for the operation and maintenance of an undertaking of the Forest Service.

UNION BAR AND THE FOREST SERVICE NOW AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. Grant of Access

Now therefore, in consideration of the amount described below and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, Union Bar and the Forest Service now agree as follows:

Union Bar grants to the Forest Service and to the Forest Service's employees, agents, invitees, licensees, permittees and contractors, a non-exclusive right-of-way in common with Union Bar and Union Bar's employees, agents, invitees, licensees, permittees and contractors to pass and repass along, and over the roads, together with the right to upgrade and maintain roads within the Lands for the purpose of transporting logs from forest tenures and for all purposes necessarily ancillary to the harvesting of logs from forest tenures (but not for the purpose of parking vehicles or placing any vehicle or equipment so as to block any cross-road, driveway or entrance or exit ramp).

Terms of Agreement

- a) This Agreement is for forest management activites associated with Blocks AM101 and AM102 of Timber Sale Licence A79883, and the term of this Agreement is 15 years, commencing July 18, 2007, and ending on January 31, 2023, unless earlier terminated in accordance with this Agreement.
- b) The parties agree that the area to be used will be restricted to that part of the Lands shown approximated on sketch plan attached hereto as **Schedule A**.
- c) The Forest Service, at its sole discretion, may terminate this Agreement by giving Union Bar 2 months written notice.

3. Payment:

The Forest Service will ensure that a fee of \$2.00 per cubic metre for volume harvested under TSL A79883 is paid to Union Bar as follows:

- a) Within two weeks of awarding TSL A79883, the Forest Service will pay Union Bar \$16,500, which represents 75% (8,250m3) of the total estimated cruise volume of 11,000m3 at \$2.00 per cubic metre.
- b) After 8,250 cubic metres of timber has been harvested from TSL A79883, the Forest Service will ensure that the fee of \$2.00 per cubic metre for any volumes over 8,250 cubic meters, based on scale returns associated with TSL A79883 associated with this road, is paid to Union Bar.
- c) Despite a) and b) above, if less than 8,250m3 is harvested under TSL A79883, Union Bar will pay the Forest Service the difference between \$16,500 and \$2.00 per cubic metre for what was actually harvested from TSL A79883 immediately after termination of the TSL.

4. Promises

a) The Forest Service will:

- use, and permit the use of, the roads only for the purposes set out in section 1 and for no other purpose without the express written consent of Union Bar, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld;
- use, and permit the use of, the roads so as not to cause any damage or disturbance to the road or the Lands and in particular, but without limitation, to the natural drainage pattern of the Lands;
- (iii) use its best efforts to prevent, control and extinguish any fire on the Lands or any lands adjacent to the Lands which the Forest Service, its employees, agents, invitees, licensees, permittees or contractors may cause, and will conform to and observe the provisions of the Forest and Range Practices Act (as amended or replaced from time to time) and any other applicable statutes and regulations that are in force or may in the future be enacted or made regarding the prevention of fires. The Forest Service will reimburse Union Bar for any costs or expenses Union Bar incurs to fight fires for which the Forest Service is responsible under this subsection on an actual cost basis and not on the Forest Service scale;
- (iv) indemnify and save harmless Union Bar from and against any and all losses, claims, damages, actions, causes of actions, costs and expenses that Union Bar may sustain, incur, suffer or be put to arising out of the use of the roads by the Forest Service, its employees, agents, invitees, licensees, permittees or contractors, excepting always liability arising out of the acts or omissions of Union Bar, its employees, agents, invitees, licensees, permittees or contractors;
- (v) comply with any applicable laws, regulations, bylaws, standards, policies, directions, permits or orders of any duly constituted authority governing, affecting, or in any way related to the use of the roads;
- ensure that the use of the roads by the Forest Service, its employees, agents, invitees, licensees, permittees or contractors does not impair or obstruct the condition of the roads for an unreasonable length of time;
- (vii) ensure that the roads remain in an environmentally sound, clean, safe and orderly condition, and free from all waste, including, without limitation, wood waste relating to the use of the roads by the Forest Service, its employees, agents, invitees, licensees, permittees or contractors; and
- (viii) not claim any indemnity or compensation from Union Bar for any loss, damage, injury or expense (including, without limitation, in respect of bodily injury or death of any person or loss or damage to any property) caused by the condition of the roads, except to the extent that such loss, damage, injury or expense arises from the negligent acts or omissions of Union Bar or any of their employees, agents, invitees or contractors.

b) Union Bar will:

 not do or knowingly permit to be done any act or thing which will interfere with or injure the use, construction or maintenance of the roads.

or at such other addresses as the parties hereto may from time to time designate in writing.

6. Defaults

If the Forest Service, its employees, agents, invitees, licensees, permittees and contractors default in the observance and performance of any material term and condition contained in this Agreement and such default is not remedied within a reasonable period of time after Union Bar has given notice to the Forest Service specifying the default and requesting it be cured, Union Bar may, suspend all rights of the Forest Service under this Agreement while this default continues. While its rights under this Agreement are suspended, the Forest Service will have no right to enter upon the roads or to exercise any of the rights granted to it under this Agreement, except as required to cure the default. Any failure by Union Bar to exercise its rights with respect to any particular default of the Forest Service shall not operate as a waiver of its rights with respect to any continuing subsequent default.

7. **Entire Agreement**

This Agreement does not address or affect any claims by Union Bar regarding infringement of its aboriginal rights and title.

8. Enurement

This Agreement will enure to the benefit of and be binding upon Union Bar and the Forest Service and their respective successors and permitted assignees.

9. **Governing Law**

This Agreement will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws in force from time to time in British Columbia.



Protocol Agreement

Between

Union Bar First Nation

And

BC Timber Sales - Chinook Business Area

This Protocol Agreement serves to outline the operational terms and conditions for access through Union Bar First Nation's Puckatholetchin Indian Reserve No. 11 ("the Lands") related to forest management activities associated with Blocks AM101 and AM102 of Timber Sale Licence A79883.

The Timber Sales Manager of the Chinook Timber Sales Office ("BCTS") and the Union Bar First Nation ("Union Bar") agree to the following terms and conditions:

 The timelines for the sales and operational activities for Blocks AM101 and AM102 are:

Activity	<u>Dates</u>	Access Required Through the Lands
Layout & Development Work	July 19, 2007 to Oct 31, 2007	Mon to Fri
Advertising of Timber Sale	January 1, 2008 to March 31, 2008	Two week viewing period, possibly in Oct/Nov, 2007.
Timber Sale Licensee Harvesting	January 1, 2008 to March 31, 2009	Mon to Fri
Silviculture Activities	March 31, 2009 to March 31, 2023	1-5 times per year

- Union Bar and BCTS agree that the operating hours for the conduct of activities are from daylight to daybreak. Outside of these hours, BCTS or the Licensee will contact the Union Bar Chief.
- 3) If the timelines or access required in (1) changes, BCTS will inform Union Bar of the changes.
- BCTS will inform Union Bar when the sales of Blocks AM101 and AM102 are advertised.

- 6) Union Bar will provide BCTS with two keys to access the locked gate on the Lands. BCTS will utilize one key and BCTS will provide the Licensee with the other key.
- 7) The two keys will not be duplicated.
- 8) BCTS will use reasonable diligence to ensure that the gate and lock are maintained and only opened for periods necessary for forest management activities and for emergency purposes.
- BCTS will provide Union Bar with a sign for the gate within two months after this Protocol Agreement is signed.
- 10) Union Bar will provide BCTS with the wording for the sign mentioned in clause 9.
- 11) BCTS will deliver two inter-locking blocks to upgrade the Union Bar gate within two months after this Protocol Agreement is signed.
- 12) BCTS will ask the Licensee to assist in Union Bar's firewood production.
- 13) BCTS will inform Union Bar when the waste surveys are complete.
- 14) BCTS will share the scale slips and timber marks with Union Bar.
- 15) BCTS agrees to use its best efforts to ensure that all concerns of the Union Bar with respect to access activities are reasonably and expeditiously addressed.
- 16) During the term of Timber Sale Licence A79883, BCTS and Union Bar agree to meet quarterly to ensure that all of the concerns and expectations of all parties with respect to access activities are addressed in a rail and reasonable manner.
- 17) Prior to harvesting, BCTS will invite the Licensee and its sub-contractors to attend a meeting with the Union Bar to discuss communication and operational issues.
- 18) The intent of clauses 2, 6, 7, and 8 will be included in the Timber Sale Licence A79883.

The above listed terms and conditions, by which BCTS is provided access through the Lands are hereby agreed to by the undersigned.

Dear Chief Andy Alex:

During annual bridge inspections, the Chilliwack Resource District of the Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resources (FLNR) has identified four (4) bridges along the Squeah Forest Service Road (FSR) whose respective load ratings have been determined to be inadequate for safe public access.

(For your reference please find an attached map identifying the following structures).

Tamihi Logging has subsequently relocated the Squeah FSR around CK-2253 installing a new bridge upstream from the down rated CK-2253 structure and has removed and replaced structure CK-2254.

To address public safety on the remaining structures, FLNR is proposing to remove the crown structures CK-2255 and CK-2256 under a contract to Tamihi Logging and where practicable (subject to current legislation regarding streams bearing fish) establish a ford or wet crossing by September 30, 2014.

FLNR is also prepared to assist with measures to address safety concerns associated with the down ratedCK-2253 structure located within the Trafalgar Flat 13 IR by removing that structure.

It is proposed that; the removal of the down rated CK-2253 structure from within the Trafalgar Flat 13 IR will be without prejudice, in-kind and in lieu of any fees associated with a short term access agreement through Trafalgar Flat 13, Swahliseah 14, and Aywawwis 15 IRs. The short term access agreement will commence concurrent with the aforementioned bridge removal works proposed and will conclude on December 31, 2019. The short term access agreement will be for Ministry personnel only for the purpose of conducting forestry or other resource related activities.



OF THE SECOND PART

WHEREAS:

A. The Grantor is the registered owner of land legally described as:

Union Bar First Nation: Trafalgar Flat 13 Indian Reserve, Swahliseah 14 Indian Reserve, and Aywawwis 15 Indian Reserve

(the "Lands")

- B. The Grantor owns private industrial roads constructed on a portion of the Lands.
- C. The Grantor has agreed to grant to the Grantee on the terms and conditions set out in this Agreement a right-of-way (the "right-of-way") over the roads which exist within the Lands at the date of this Agreement and to construct certain works on, over and under portions of the Lands.
- D. The right-of-way is necessary for the operation and maintenance of an undertaking of the Grantee.

THE GRANTOR AND THE GRANTEE NOW AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

Grant of Right-of-Way

Now therefore, in consideration of the amount described below and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Grantor and the Grantee now agree as follows:

The Grantor grants to the Grantee and to the Grantee's employees, agents, invitees and contractors, a non-exclusive right-of-way in common with the Grantor and the Grantor's employees, agents, invitees and contractors to pass and repass along, and over the right-of-way, together with the right to upgrade and maintain roads within the right-of-way, including relocating or constructing roads, for the purpose of conducting forestry or other resource related activities.

2. Grantee Expenditures

Should any of the existing roads within the said right-of-way become a Forest Service Road by acquisition under Section 121 of the Forest Act:

a. the Grantee will not use the foregoing expenditures for the purposes of claiming the existing road through the Lands as a public or Forest Service Road.

3. Payment

For the term of this Agreement, the Grantee will pay the Grantor a fee of \$1.00, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, for the rights herein granted. The Grantee will compensate the Grantor by removing the down rated CK-2253 structure from within the Trafalgar Flat 13 IR. This work will be without prejudice, in-kind and in lieu of any fees associated with this short term access agreement through Trafalgar Flat 13, Swahliseah 14, and Aywawwis 15 IRs.

4. Terms of Agreement

- a) The term of this Agreement is for five(5) years, commencing August 28th, 2014, and ending on December 31st, 2019, unless sooner terminated or extended in accordance with this agreement.
- b) It is agreed that, without derogating from the fact that the statutory right-of-way granted herein is granted over all the Lands, the Grantee agrees, as a personal covenant rather than a modification of the statutory right-of-way granted herein, that the exercise of the right to pass and repass along, and over Lands granted hereby shall only be exercised by it and by its employees, agents and contractors along and over those portions of the Lands containing the roads approximately shown on the sketch plan attached hereto as Schedule "A", and having a width of twenty (20) metres, centred on the centre line of each such road.
- c) The Grantee, at its sole discretion, may terminate this agreement by giving the Grantor six (6) months written notice.

5. Promises

a) The Grantee will:

- use, and permit the use of, the right-of-way only for the purposes set out in section 1 and for no other purpose without the express written consent of the Grantor, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld;
- use, and permit the use of, the right-of-way so as not to cause any damage or disturbance to the right-of-way or the Lands and in particular, but without limitation, to the natural drainage pattern of the Lands;
- (iii) use its best efforts to prevent, control and extinguish any fire on the Lands which the Grantee, its employees, agents, invitees and contractors may cause, and will conform to and observe the provisions of the Wildfire Act (as amended or replaced from time to time) and any other statutes and regulations that are in force or may in the future be enacted or made regarding the prevention of fires. The Grantee will reimburse the Grantor for any costs or expenses the Grantor incurs to fight fires for which the Grantee is responsible under this subsection on an actual cost basis and not on the Grantee scale:
- (iv) comply with any laws, regulations, bylaws, standards, policies, directions, permits or orders of any duly constituted authority governing, affecting, or in any way related to the use of the right-of-way;
- ensure that the use of the right-of-way by the Grantee, its employees, agents, invitees, or contractors does not impair or obstruct the condition of the right-of-way;
- ensure that the right-of-way remains in an environmentally sound, clean, safe and orderly condition, and free from all waste, including, without limitation, wood waste relating to the use of the right-of-way by the Grantee, its employees, agents, invitees, or contractors;
- (vii) indemnify and save harmless the Grantor from and against any and all losses, claims, damages, actions, causes of actions, costs and expenses that the Grantor may sustain, incur, suffer or be put to arising out of the use of the right-of-way by the Grantee, its employees, agents, invitees or contractors, excepting always liability arising out of the acts or omissions of the Grantor, its employees, agents, invitees or contractors;
- (viii) not claim any indemnity or compensation from the Grantor for any loss, damage, injury or expense (including, without limitation, in respect of bodily injury or death of any person or loss or damage to any property) caused by the condition of the right-of-way, except to the extent that such loss, damage, injury or expense arises from the negligent acts or omissions of the Grantor or any party for whom they are responsible.

b) The Grantor will:

 not do or knowingly permit to be done any act or thing which will interfere with or injure the use, construction or maintenance of the right-of-way.

6. Notice

Any notice, document or communication required or permitted to be given under this agreement must be in writing and will be deemed to have been given if delivered by hand, courier, or double-registered mail to the party to whom it is to be given as follows:

a. To the Province:

b. To the Grantor:

7. Defaults

If the Grantee, its employees, agents, invitees and contractors default in the observance and performance of any material term and condition contained in this Agreement and such default is not remedied within a reasonable period of time after the Grantor has given notice to the Grantee specifying the default and requesting it be cured, the Transferor may suspend all rights of the Grantee under this Agreement while this default continues. While its rights under this Agreement are suspended, the Grantee will have no right to enter upon the right-of-way or to exercise any of the rights granted to it under this Agreement, except as required to cure the default. Any failure by the Grantor to exercise its rights with respect to any particular default of the Grantee shall not operate as a waiver of its rights with respect to any continuing subsequent default.

8. Entire Agreement

This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Grantor and the Grantee regarding the right-of-way and supersedes all prior agreements and understandings between them. There are no representations, promises, agreements or understandings between the Grantor and the Grantee concerning the right-of-way that are not expressly set out in this Agreement.

9. Enurement

This Agreement will enure to the benefit of and be binding upon the Grantor and the Grantee and their respective successors and permitted assigns. The word *Grantor* is deemed to include the heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, wherever the context so admits.

10. Governing Law

This Agreement will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws in force from time to time in British Columbia.

11. Arbitration







Similar to access across private property, the Province, members of the public and industrial users requiring access through an IR will need to secure approval with the land owner which in the case of the IRs listed above is the First Nation and Federal Government. 



During annual bridge inspections, the Chilliwack Resource District of the Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resources (FLNR) has identified four (4) bridges along the Squeah Forest Service Road (FSR) whose respective load ratings have been determined to be inadequate for safe public access.

(For your reference please find an attached map identifying the following structures).

Tamihi Logging has subsequently relocated the Squeah FSR around CK-2253 installing a new bridge upstream from the down rated CK-2253 structure and has removed and replaced structure CK-2254.

To address public safety on the remaining structures, FLNR is proposing to remove the crown structures CK-2255 and CK-2256 under a contract to Tamihi Logging and where practicable (subject to current legislation regarding streams bearing fish) establish a ford or wet crossing by September 30, 2014.

FLNR is also prepared to assist with measures to address safety concerns associated with the down rated CK-2253 structure located within the Trafalgar Flat 13 IR by removing that structure.

It is proposed that; the removal of the down rated CK-2253 structure from within the Trafalgar Flat 13 IR will be without prejudice, in-kind and in lieu of any fees associated with a short term access agreement through Trafalgar Flat 13, Swahliseah 14, and Aywawwis 15 IRs. The short term access agreement will commence concurrent with the aforementioned bridge removal works proposed and will conclude on December 31, 2019. The short term access agreement will be for Ministry personnel only for the purpose of conducting forestry or other resource related activities.

1.00 GRANT OF RIGHTS AND TERM

- 1.01 Subject to any applicable legislation in force at the time of the work, and as amended from time to time, the District Manager grants to the Permittee the non-exclusive right, during the term of this Permit, to use the road or road section(s) listed on the Schedule "A" or shown on attached map.
- 1.02 The term of this Permit shall begin on the effective date shown above, and shall terminate when the District Manager is satisfied the Permittee's use of the Forest Service Road (FSR) is finished, and that there are no outstanding obligations with respect to the permit.
- 1.03 The Schedule(s) forms an integral part of the Road Use Permit.

2.00 CONDITIONS OF USE

- 2.01 As provided for in regulation, the Permittee is hereby required to carry out all maintenance activities for those roads identified as such on the Schedule "A" or attached map.
- 2.02 The permittee referred to in paragraph 2.01 as being required to maintain a road shall give the District Manager at least 30 days notice before building a bridge or installing a major culvert or fish stream culvert. The District Manager may specify conditions regarding those proposed works.
- 2.03 Upon termination of this Permit, title to all improvements that are located on the FSR will vest in the Crown without compensation to the Permittee, unless otherwise permitted by prior written consent of the District Manager.

- 2.04 Notwithstanding the vehicle size authorized for use in Schedule "A", the Permittee may use a vehicle on an FSR under this permit that exceeds the allowable dimensions without exceeding the GVW described in the Schedule "A". When such oversize vehicle is used, the Permittee must arrange for a pilot car with appropriate roof-mounted warning sign or two flashing amber lights, to precede the oversize vehicle at a distance of not less than 100 metres nor more than 500 metres.
- 2.05 Where there are posted signs indicating a two-way radio system for use on the road, the permittee shall use the posted frequency in the prescribed manner while using the road.

3.00 MISCELLANEOUS

- 3.01 This Permit shall enure to the benefit of, and be binding on, the parties and their respective heirs, executors, successors and permitted assigns.







As a result of public comment received in the Fall of 2020 and subsequent helicopter reconnaissance in the Spring of 2021 regarding the condition of the Squeah Forest Service Road (FSR), the Chilliwack Natural Resource District of the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development, (FLNRORD) has been made aware of at least (2) areas of concern along the Squeah FSR that pose serious safety and environmental risks.

(For your reference please find an attached map identifying the areas of concern).

11.0 km Squeah FSR		Non-certified crossing (Homemade structure), Structure is considered unsafe for users and should be removed. Ground assessment is required to determine the extent of fill-slope stabilization and water management works. Install temp barrier until ground works can be completed

To address road user safety issues related to the road prism failure at 9.0 km and 11.0 km of the Squeah FSR, inclusive of the safe use of railway infrastructure immediately downslope, and to mitigate the potential for further environmental degradation, FLNRORD is proposing to re-establish a functional ditch-line and install cross-dich(s) at 9.0 km. The proposed works also include the removal of the non-certified structure and installation of a temporary barricade at 11.0 km. The barricade would remain in place until a geotechnical assessment is completed and prescriptions to address the unstable terrain issues have been developed.

FLNRORD will share the technical memo generated by the professional assessment and consult with the Union Bar First Nations prior to the commencement of any proposed works to restore access beyond 11.0 kms of the FSR.

In support of ongoing consultation with SRRMC/PRRO/STSA regarding the issuance of Woodlot W2103 and the concern that the area is potentially within a sanctuary zone (part of the S'olh Temexw Use Plan cultural areas), FLNRORD is prepared to complete a Cultural Heritage Overview Assessment (CHOA) for the area. It is anticipated that the completion of this assessment will satisfy the identified concerns and fill some of the cultural information gaps in the area.

It is proposed that; the reparation of the drainage structures at 9.0 kms, the removal of the non-certified unsafe structure at 11.0 kms, associated road stabilization works, installation of a temporary barricade inclusive of both the geotechnical assessment and CHOA will be completed without prejudice and in lieu of any fees associated with a short term access agreement through Trafalgar Flat 13, Swahliseah 14, and Aywawwis 15 IRs.

The short-term access agreement will commence concurrent with the road works proposed at 9.0 kms of the Squeah FSR and will conclude on December 31, 2026. The short-term access agreement will be for Ministry personnel only for the purpose of conducting forestry or other natural resource related activities.

A.	The Grantor is the registere? owner of land legally described as:

- B. The Grantor owns private industrial roads constructed on a portion of the Lands.
- C. The Grantor has agreed to grant to the Grantee on the terms and conditions set out in this Agreement a right-of-way (the "right-of-way") over the roads which exist within the Lands at the date of this Agreement and to construct certain works on, over and under portions of the Lands.
- D. The right-of-way is necessary for the operation and maintenance of an undertaking of the Grantee.

THE GRANTOR AND THE GRANTEE NOW AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. Grant of Right-of-Way

Now therefore, in consideration of the amount described below and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Granter and the Grantee now agree as follows:

The Granter grants to the Grantee and to the Grantee's employees, agents, invitees and contractors, a non-exclusive right-of-way in common with the Granter and the Grantor's employees, agents, invitees and contractors to pass and repass along, and over the right-of-way, together with the right to upgrade and maintain roads within the right-of-way, including relocating or constructing roads, for the purpose of conducting forestry or other resource related activities.

2. Grantee Expenditures

Should any of the existing roads within the said right-of-way become a Forest Service Road by acquisition under Section 121 of the *Forest Act:*

a. the Grantee will not use the foregoing expenditures for the purposes of claiming the existing road through the Lands as a public or Forest Service Road.

3. Payment

For the term of this Agreement, the Grantee will pay the Granter a fee of \$1.00, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, for the rights herein granted. The Grantee will compensate the Granter by removing the down rated CK-2253 structure from within the Trafalgar Flat 13 IR. This work will be without prejudice, in-kind and in lieu of any fees associated with this short term access agreement through Trafalgar Flat 13, Swahliseah 14, and Aywawwis 15 IRs.

4. Terms of Agreement

- a) The term of this Agreement is for five(5) years, commencing _______, 2021 and ending on Dec 31, 2026, unless sooner terminated or extended in accordance with this agreement.
- b) It is agreed that, without derogating from the fact that the statutory right-of-way granted herein is granted over all the Lands, the Grantee agrees, as a personal covenant rather than a modification of the statutory right-of-way granted herein, that the exercise of the right to pass and repass along, and over Lands granted hereby shall only be exercised by it and by its employees, agents and contractors along and over those portions of the Lands containing the roads approximately shown on the sketch plan attached hereto as Schedule "A", and having a width of twenty (20) metres, centred on the centre line of each such road.
- The Grantee, at its sole discretion, may terminate this agreement by giving the Granter six
 (6) months written notice.

5. Promises

a) The Grantee will:

- use, and permit the use of, the right-of-way only for the purposes set out in section 1 and for no other purpose without the express written consent of the Grantor, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld;
- (ii) use, and permit the use of, the right-of-way so as not to cause any damage or disturbance to the right-of-way or the Lands and in particular, but without limitation, to the natural drainage pattern of the Lands;
- (iii) use its best efforts to prevent, control and extinguish any fire on the Lands which the Grantee, its employees, agents, invitees and contractors may cause, and will conform to and observe the provisions of the Wildfire Act (as amended or replaced from time to time) and any other statutes and regulations that are in force or may in the future be enacted or made regarding the prevention of fires. The Grantee will reimburse the Grantor for any costs or expenses the Grantor incurs to fight fires for which the Grantee is responsible under this subsection on an actual cost basis and not on the Grantee scale;
- (iv) comply with any laws, regulations, bylaws, standards, policies, directions, permits or orders of any duly constituted authority governing, affecting, or in any way related to the use of the right-of-way;
- (v) ensure that the use of the right-of-way by the Grantee, its employees, agents, invitees, or contractors does not impair or obstruct the condition of the right-of-way;
- (vi) ensure that the right-of-way remains in an environmentally sound, clean, safe and orderly condition, and free from all waste, including, without limitation, wood waste relating to the use of the right-of-way by the Grantee, its employees, agents, invitees, or contractors;
- (vii) indemnify and save harmless the Grantor from and against any and all losses, claims, damages, actions, causes of actions, costs and expenses that the Grantor may sustain, incur, suffer or be put to arising out of the use of the right-of-way by the Grantee, its employees, agents, invitees or contractors, excepting always liability arising out of the acts or omissions of the Grantor, its employees, agents, invitees or contractors;
- (viii) not claim any indemnity or compensation from the Grantor for any loss, damage, injury or expense (including, without limitation, in respect of bodily injury or death of any person or loss or damage to any property) caused by the condition of the right-of-way, except to the extent that such loss, damage, injury or expense arises from the negligent acts or omissions of the Grantor or any party for whom they are responsible.

b) The Grantor will:

 not do or knowingly permit to be done any act or thing which will interfere with or injure the use, construction or maintenance of the right-of-way.

6, Notice

Any notice, document or communication required or permitted to be given under this agreement must be in writing and will be deemed to have been given if delivered by hand, courier, or double- registered mail to the party to whom it is to be given as follows:

7. Defaults

If the Grantee, its employees, agents, invitees and contractors default in the observance and performance of any material term and condition contained in this Agreement and such default is not remedied within a reasonable period of time after the Grantor has given notice to the Grantee specifying the default and requesting it be cured, the Transferor may suspend all rights of the Grantee under this Agreement while this default continues. While its rights under this Agreement are suspended, the Grantee will have no right to enter upon the right-of-way or to exercise any of the rights granted to it under this Agreement, except as required to cure the default. Any failure by the Grantor to exercise its rights with respect to any particular default of the Grantee shall not operate as a waiver of its rights with respect to any continuing subsequent default.

8. Entire Agreement

This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Grantor and the Grantee regarding the right-of-way and supersedes all prior agreements and understandings between them. There are no representations, promises, agreements or understandings between the Grantor and the Grantee concerning the right-of-way that are not expressly set out in this Agreement.

9. Enurement

This Agreement will enure to the benefit of and be binding upon the Grantor and the Grantee and their respective successors and permitted assigns. The word *Gran/or* is deemed to include the heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, wherever the context so admits.

10. Governing Law

This Agreement will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws in force from time to time in British Columbia.

11. Arbitration

If any dispute shall arise between the parties concerning the rights and obligations contained in this Agreement created herein, which dispute cannot be resolved by agreement, then the dispute shall be resolved pursuant to the *Commercial Arbitration Act* of the Province of British Columbia.



As a result of public comment received in the Fall of 2020 and subsequent helicopter reconnaissance in the Spring of 2021 regarding the condition of the Squeah Forest Service Road (FSR), the Chilliwack Natural Resource District of the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development, (FLNRORD) has been made aware of at least (2) areas of concern along the Squeah FSR that pose serious safety and environmental risks.

The proposed works also include the removal of the non-certified structure and installation of a temporary barricade at 11.0 km. The barricade would remain in place until a geotechnical assessment is completed and prescriptions to address the unstable terrain issues have been developed.

FLNRORD will share the technical memo generated by the professional assessment and consult with the Union Bar First Nations prior to the commencement of any proposed works to restore access beyond 11.0 kms of the FSR.

In support of ongoing consultation with SRRMC/PRRO/STSA regarding the issuance of Woodlot W2103 and the concern that the area is potentially within a sanctuary zone (part of the S'olh Temexw Use Plan cultural areas), FLNRORD is prepared to complete a Cultural Heritage Overview Assessment (CHOA) for the area. It is anticipated that the completion of this assessment will satisfy the identified concerns and fill some of the cultural information gaps in the area.

It is proposed that; the reparation of the drainage structures at 9.0 kms, the removal of the non-certified unsafe structure at 11.0 kms, associated road stabilization works, installation of a temporary barricade inclusive of both the geotechnical assessment and CHOA will be completed without prejudice and in lieu of any fees associated with a short term access agreement through Trafalgar Flat 13, Swahliseah 14, and Aywawwis 15 IRs.

The short-term access agreement will commence concurrent with the road works proposed at 9.0 kms of the Squeah FSR and will conclude on December 31, 2026. As a result of public comment received in the Fall of 2020 and subsequent helicopter reconnaissance in the Spring of 2021 regarding the condition of the Squeah Forest Service Road (FSR), the Chilliwack Natural Resource District of the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development, (FLNRORD) has been made aware of at least (2) areas of concern along the Squeah FSR that pose serious safety and environmental risks.

(For your reference please find an attached map identifying the areas of concern).

To address road user safety issues related to the road prism failure at 9.0 km and 11.0 km of the Squeah FSR, inclusive of the safe use of railway infrastructure immediately downslope, and to mitigate the potential for further environmental degradation, FLNRORD is proposing to re-establish a functional ditch-line and install cross-dich(s) at 9.0 km. The proposed works also include the removal of the non-certified structure and installation of a temporary barricade at 11.0 km. The barricade would remain in place until a geotechnical assessment is completed and prescriptions to address the unstable terrain issues have been developed.

FLNRORD will share the technical memo generated by the professional assessment and consult with the Union Bar First Nations prior to the commencement of any proposed works to restore access beyond 11.0 kms of the FSR.

In support of ongoing consultation with SRRMC/PRRO/STSA regarding the issuance of Woodlot W2103 and the concern that the area is potentially within a sanctuary zone (part of the S'olh Temexw Use Plan cultural areas), FLNRORD is prepared to complete a Cultural Heritage Overview Assessment (CHOA) for the area. It is anticipated that the completion of this assessment will satisfy the identified concerns and fill some of the cultural information gaps in the area.

It is proposed that; the reparation of the drainage structures at 9.0 kms, the removal of the non-certified unsafe structure at 11.0 kms, associated road stabilization works, installation of a temporary barricade inclusive of both the geotechnical assessment and CHOA will be completed without prejudice and in lieu of any fees associated with a short term access agreement through Trafalgar Flat 13, Swahliseah 14, and Aywawwis 15 IRs.

The short-term access agreement will commence concurrent with the road works proposed at 9.0 kms of the Squeah FSR and will conclude on December 31, 2026. The short-term access agreement will be for Ministry personnel only for the purpose of conducting forestry or other natural resource related activities.



The Grantee will reimburse the Grantor for any costs or expenses the Grantor incurs to fight fires for which the Grantee is responsible under this subsection on an actual cost basis and not on the Grantee scale;
- (iv) comply with any laws, regulations, bylaws, standards, policies, directions, permits or orders of any duly constituted authority governing, affecting, or in any way related to the use of the right-of-way;
- ensure that the use of the right-of-way by the Grantee, its employees, agents, invitees, or contractors does not impair or obstruct the condition of the right-of-way;
- (vi) ensure that the right-of-way remains in an environmentally sound, clean, safe and orderly condition, and free from all waste, including, without limitation, wood waste relating to the use of the right-of-way by the Grantee, its employees, agents, invitees, or contractors;
- (vii) indemnify and save harmless the Grantor from and against any and all losses, claims, damages, actions, causes of actions, costs and expenses that the Grantor may sustain, incur, suffer or be put to arising out of the use of the right-of-way by the Grantee, its employees, agents, invitees or contractors, excepting always liability arising out of the acts or omissions of the Grantor, its employees, agents, invitees or contractors;
- (viii) not claim any indemnity or compensation from the Grantor for any loss, damage, injury or expense (including, without limitation, in respect of bodily injury or death of any person or loss or damage to any property) caused by the condition of the right-of-way, except to the extent that such loss, damage, injury or expense arises from the negligent acts or omissions of the Grantor or any party for whom they are responsible.

b) The Grantor will:

 not do or knowingly permit to be done any act or thing which will interfere with or injure the use, construction or maintenance of the right-of-way.

7. Defaults

If the Grantee, its employees, agents, invitees and contractors default in the observance and performance of any material term and condition contained in this Agreement and such default is not remedied within a reasonable period of time after the Grantor has given notice to the Grantee specifying the default and requesting it be cured, the Transferor may suspend all rights of the Grantee under this Agreement while this default continues. While its rights under this Agreement are suspended, the Grantee will have no right to enter upon the right-of-way or to exercise any of the rights granted to it under this Agreement, except as required to cure the default. Any failure by the Grantor to exercise its rights with respect to any particular default of the Grantee shall not operate as a waiver of its rights with respect to any continuing subsequent default.

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This Agreement will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws in force from time to time in British Columbia.


