Mass Timber – Organizational Alignment

ADVICE AND RECOMMENDED RESPONSE:

- The Organizational Alignment policy was about ensuring that there
 was a forum where questions and concerns could be raised and
 resolved before local government's volunteered to be early adopters of
 the expanded mass timber code provisions.
- It's no longer in place, as mainstream building codes have now caught up – including at the national level.
- It's very important that people have the opportunity to speak about any issues that they have. We welcome that.
- We're going to continue to work closely with fire safety professionals, local governments and all our partners as we expand the use of this important building material in B.C.

IF ASKED ABOUT FIRE SAFETY:

- Fire testing has demonstrated that the performance of a mass timber structure is similar to that of non-combustible construction.
- And new, real-world research is highlighting the safety of new tall wood buildings as interest in timber construction continues to grow across Canada and the globe.
- This ongoing research bolsters the case that modern construction techniques and protective systems have neutralized the fire risk traditionally associated with combustible building materials.

BACKGROUND

A <u>CBC</u> story was published on May 1, with the headline of 'B.C. policy stifled fire safety concerns to promote mass timber highrises, documents show'.

ADVICE TO MINISTER

The story cited a briefing note that said cities needed 'organizational alignment' from fire officials to put up tall wood buildings.

The reporter cites a fire chief from Alberta who states that fire testing and research of tall wood buildings lags behind approvals – specifically mentioning floor performance requirements that are still being developed in Canada.

OMTI notes the reporter did not obtain quotes from any of the communities who participated in the early adopter program.

OMTI also emphasizes that any technical comparison between light-weight wood frame construction and mass timber construction are like comparing apples and oranges.
