ISSUE: Utilize major licensee unharvested volume to support BC Timber Sales Market

Pricing System and Category Value-added

RECOMMENDED OPTION:

Develop a strategy with Tenures Branch tcs.13; s.17 s.13

BACKGROUND:

- Over time, BC Timber Sales (BCTS)^{s.13}
 s.13
- To generate statistically sound cost and price data to support the Market Pricing System (MPS), 20 percent of the total provincial Allowable Annual Cut (AAC) is needed. s.13; s.13; s.17
- Furthermore, BCTS is developing the Category Value-added program to meet government's commitment to strengthen the value-added sector. This will replace the existing Category 2 program.
- BCTS currently commits 10 percent of its annual rationalized apportionment¹ to Category 2 which is s.13; s.17

 This additional volume should be incremental to the volume supporting MPS.
- The following highlights the shortfall of timber volume experienced by BCTS for MPS and the required Category Value-added volume in the three natural resource areas:

 A potential opportunity has been identified to utilize major licensee unharvested volume to augment BCTS volume for MPS and Category Value-added.

DISCUSSION:


Section 75.8 of the *Forest Act* provides authority for unharvested volume associated with both Replaceable Forest Licences and Non-Replaceable Forest Licences (NRFL) to be disposed of through a timber sale licence, forestry licence to cut, or a NRFL.

Unharvested volume represents an opportunity to potentially augment BCTS' share of Crown volume. This is a short-term, temporary opportunity that does not permanently address current volume shortfalls in both BCTS core MPS volume and the Category Value Added program which will need to be addressed through other means of acquiring volume outlined in the *Forest Act*. Detailed analysis is needed to determine the total unharvested volumes and the circumstances regarding these volumes in the Coast, South and North Natural Resource Areas.

If major licensees did not harvest this volume because it is uneconomical or heavily constrained, then it may also be challenging for BCTS to develop and sell this volume. Furthermore, the pause of BCTS development in old growth technical advisory panel areas where First Nations agreed to these deferrals may create additional challenges for BCTS to access this volume. With further investigation BCTS can confirm the actual volume available for harvest within each TSA.

Any unharvested volume made available to BCTS would be considered short-term incremental volume (vs. core apportionment) and is not sufficient in the long-term to support MPS and the new Category Value-added program. It may, however, be a solution to augment BCTS' volume in the short-term.
